REPORT PURSUANT TO SCR 216(5) AND 220.5

Pursuant to Supreme Court Rules 216(5)<sup>1</sup> and 220.5<sup>2</sup>, the Nevada Bar Foundation (NBF) hereby submits its annual report of activities and grant recipients.

Effective August 31, 2014, the NBF became the designated SCR 216 IOLTA foundation responsible for managing the IOLTA program and distributing IOLTA grants.

In preparation for the IOLTA program management, the NBF:

- Established a Board of Trustees appointed by the State Bar of Nevada Board of Governors and the Court in accordance with SCR 216;
- Filed its Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation with the Secretary of State's Office

5. The bar foundation shall provide, at least annually, to the board of governors and to the court, a report of its activities.

<sup>2</sup> Rule 220.5. Annual statements.

1. The bar foundation shall submit annually to the supreme court an audited financial statement in sufficient detail to analyze expenditures, and shall cause the financial statement to be published annually in the state bar publication.
2. The bar foundation shall provide the supreme court with an annual statement concerning the performance of the recipients of grants, including a declaration of how the recipients have expended the funds.

1 - Amended its Bylaws, to among other things, carry out its duties as the SCR  
2 216 designated IOLTA foundation, including filing with the Internal Revenue  
3 Service a notice to terminate its private foundation status as of December 31, 2014  
4 and operate as a Section 509(a)(2) public charity for a 60-month period beginning  
5 January 1, 2015;

6 - Accepted transfer of the IOLTA program assets and responsibilities from  
7 the Nevada Law Foundation dba Justice League of Nevada; and

8 - Implemented policies and procedures for program management and  
9 operation.

### 10 **2015 IOLTA Grant Recipients**

11 In September 2014, the NBF solicited IOLTA grant applications from those  
12 organizations that received funding over the past three years. Notice of the grant  
13 application process was also posted on the NBF website.

14 The NBF Board of Trustees distributed 2015 IOLTA grants totaling  
15 \$2,942,055 to the following organizations deemed eligible to receive IOLTA  
16 funds under SCR 216 in the amounts indicated:
