

Re: Follow up on ADKT 0581



On June 19, 2021, I filed comment expressing concerns that certain judges and lawyers were confused as to the applicability and necessity of a news reporter requesting permission consistent with SCR 230(1) on the issue of providing electronic coverage of a virtual hearing. I would like to bring to this Court's attention actual examples at this juncture. First, Chief Judge Michael Gibbons, entered an order in docket no. 82444 on February 18, 2022, expressing that no SCR 230(1) request was required, except to deploy a camera in-person. Later, on June 9, 2022, off record and prior to conducting a hearing in A-21-831880-B, District Court Judge Joanna Kishner noted the presence of Our Nevada Judges and ordered that no recording of the virtual hearing could occur because no SCR 230(1) request had been filed<sup>1</sup>.

I believe it would be helpful to clarify this issue through the rules. Ultimately, it is the public that suffers from the interruption of coverage, and it continues to be the objective of the Our Nevada Judges organization to educate and inform.

In this instance, the proceedings are coordinated across 10 different docket numbers. The 9 other District Court Judges granted the media request, but District Court Judge Joanna Kishner noted no such request was filed in her case specifically. The public's interest in a case involving the sale of tainted water remains high.
