*ORDER CREATING COMMISSION TO STUDY THE STATUTES AND  
RULES OF THE COMMISSION ON JUDICIAL DISCIPLINE AND  
UPDATE THE NEVADA CODE OF JUDICIAL CONDUCT*

On May 19, 2021, James W. Hardesty, Chief Justice of the Nevada Supreme Court, filed a petition seeking to create a Commission to Study the Statutes and Rules of the Commission on Judicial Discipline and Update the Nevada Code of Judicial Conduct.

This court solicited public comment on the petition and a public hearing was held in this matter on June 28, 2021.

Having considered the petition and public comment, we conclude that such a Commission should be created. The Commission shall conduct all hearings in public and post all meeting minutes and documents considered by the Commission on the Supreme Court's website.

Associate Chief Justice Ron Parraguirre is hereby appointed as chair of the Commission. Pursuant to NRAD 7.1, the Chief Justice will enter an order appointing members to the Commission.

The Commission shall file a report with this court on its findings and recommendations no later than October 31, 2022.
