UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE REPLY BRIEF (SECOND REQUEST)

Appellants Governor Steve Sisolak, Attorney General Aaron D. Ford, Director George Togliatti and Administrator Mindy McKay move under Nevada Rule of Appellate Procedure 31(b)(3) for a 14-day extension of time to file their reply brief in this matter. The reply brief was originally due September 6, 2022. This Court granted the parties' stipulation extending the deadline by 30 days, making the current due date October 6, 2022. This second request would extend the deadline 14 days, to October 20, 2022.

Good cause exists for the extension. See Aug. 30, 2022 Order (permitting further extensions "upon motion clearly demonstrating good cause"). Deputy Solicitor General Kiel B. Ireland is drafting the reply brief. In addition to day-to-day tasks on about a dozen active cases, he is responsible for managing discovery in Lincoln County Water District v. Nevada, No. 2:20-cv-1891 (D. Nev. filed Oct. 19, 2020), and Coyote Springs Investment, LLC v. State, No. A-20-820384-B (Nev. 8th Jud. Dist. Ct. filed Aug. 28, 2020), two cases involving hundreds of millions of dollars of alleged liability and a massive number of documents. Managing the State's discovery obligations has absorbed an unexpected amount of time in the last several weeks, necessitating a short second extension of time to file the reply brief in this case.

Moreover, the reply brief will be subject to internal review in the Office of the Solicitor General. In the next three weeks, the solicitor general will be assisting with and presenting oral argument in the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit and this Court, respectively, which will limit the Office's ability to review the reply brief.
