ORDER DIRECTING SUPPLEMENTAL BRIEFING

This is an appeal from an order granting summary judgment in an action challenging the constitutionality of statutes created or amended in 2021 as part of AB 286.

This court has determined that supplemental briefing will be of assistance in resolving the appeal. Accordingly, we direct the parties to supplement the appellate briefing on the question of whether it is appropriate to use federal law, including 27 C.F.R. § 478.12 (2022), to clarify the purportedly vague terms in the challenged statutes and whether the use of federal law clarifies the terms.

Appellants shall have 21 days from the date of this order within which to file a supplemental brief addressing the issues set forth above; respondent shall have 14 days from the date appellants' supplemental brief
