



ORDER DENYING MOTION


Petitioner has filed a “petition for excess pages in writs of mandamus for the enforcement of the Nevada judicial and professional codes of conduct,” which this court construes as a motion to exceed the page limitation on her petition for writs of mandamus.

The submitted petition for writ relief exceeds the length allowed. *See* NRAP 21(d). This court “looks with disfavor on motions to exceed the applicable page limit or type-volume limitation, and therefore, permission to exceed the page limit or type-volume limitation will not be routinely granted.” NRAP 32(a)(7)(D)(i). Having considered the motion and the submitted petition, this court is not convinced that petitioner has demonstrated diligence and good cause to exceed the applicable page limit. *See id.* (“A motion to file a brief that exceeds the applicable page limit or

type-volume limitation will be granted only upon a showing of diligence and good cause.”). Accordingly, the motion is denied.

The clerk shall strike the petition filed on March 15, 2022. Petitioner shall have 21 days from the date of this order to file a petition that complies with NRAP 21(d) and presents the facts and issues in a more concise manner.

It is so ORDERED.
