Dear Ms. Lindeman:

Pursuant to ADKT 424, The Adoption of a Uniform Rule Governing Telephonic and Audiovisual Participation in Civil, Criminal and Family Law Cases in all Courts in the State of Nevada, and for the Judges at Reno Justice Court, I am reporting the court's capability of conducting courtroom teleconferences and/or videoconferences.

Currently, three of the five courtrooms at Reno Justice Court meet the minimum requirements for teleconferencing. Videoconferencing is not available anywhere in the courthouse. The three courtrooms mentioned above are equipped with Poly Com conference phones that were furnished by CourtCall, a private, teleconference provider. Reno Justice Court has an agreement with CourtCall, which mirrors the Supreme Court's agreement, to provide court-approved teleconference services payable by the participating parties.

Recording teleconference calls for the court's records is somewhat cumbersome. Conference calls are not routed through the courtroom's recording system, therefore the Poly Com phones need to be placed next to the recording system's microphones to pick up the conversation.

Later in this fiscal year, once the court's budget is stable, Reno Justice Court is planning to submit a request for a USJR grant to upgrade at least two courtrooms' audio recording systems to include videoconferencing capability.
