

REPORT

Pursuant to the Supreme Court's July 30, 2009, Order, the Ninth Judicial District Court, by and through the Honorable David R. Gamble and the Honorable Michael P. Gibbons, hereby files its report informing the Supreme Court of the arrangements and/or equipment installed to ensure compliance with the December 18, 2008 Order Adopting Part IX of the Supreme Court Rules.

The Ninth Judicial District Court has two departments.

Both departments have been equipped with telephone conferencing abilities since at least 2005. Counsel or a party may appear telephonically. They are heard over speakers in the courtroom.

the witness stand, and the bench, to speak to any party appearing telephonically. The court reporter is able to hear and understand all parties, and transcribe the proceedings as appropriate.

Additionally, conferencing may be done with multiple parties through the judge's chamber.

To the Ninth Judicial District Court's knowledge, no party has requested to appear pursuant to ADKT 424 specifically.

However, the court regularly grants informal requests (by facsimile or letter) requesting to appear telephonically.

Audiovisual proceedings are not available at this time.
