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TIMBERS BAR ROBBERY - LVMPD EVENT # 091113-0506:

On 11-13-09, at approximately 0343 hours, the LVMPD received an emergency phone call regarding a robbery that had just occurred at the Timbers Bar located at 7240 W. Azure, Las Vegas, NV 89130. Several officers responded to the robbery under event # 091113-0506, to include Officer J. Larosa, P# 13448. Upon arrival, the officers made contact with the victim/bartender, identified as Aaron Parduhm, DOB: 05-03-74, and one witness (off duty bartender), identified as Jennifer Favier, DOB: 03-03-83. The following is a summation of the crime based on victim/witness statements, video surveillance, and officer observations.

Mr. Parduhm was working inside the bar while talking with an off duty bartender, Mrs. Favier. A Black male suspect entered the bar and walked directly up to Mr. Parduhm and Mrs. Favier with a black semi-automatic pistol in his hand. The suspect worked the action on the firearm (loading the weapon) and then pointed it at Mr. Parduhm and Mrs. Favier while demanding money from the cash registers. Mr. Parduhm complied and opened the cash drawers. The suspect then removed approximately \$1550.00 (U.S. currency) and forced Mr. Parduhm and Mrs. Favier to go to the men's bathroom and lie down on the floor. Mr. Parduhm and Mrs. Favier waited a few minutes and then exited the bathroom to find the suspect gone. The suspect was described as a Black male, approximately 40 to 45 years old, 5'10", 230 Lbs, and wearing prescription eye glasses.

A crime report was completed to document the incident, and voluntary statements were written by Mr. Parduhm and Mrs. Favier. Crime Scene Analyst D. Ford, P# 4244, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. A copy of the video surveillance was ultimately obtained and is with Det. Dave Miller's case file. The quality of the video surveillance is relatively good, showing pictures of the suspect and his actions.

TENAYA LODGE BAR ROBBERY - LVMPD EVENT # 091114-0728:

On 11-14-09, at approximately 0545 hours, the LVMPD received an emergency phone call regarding a robbery that had just occurred at the Tenaya Lodge located at 5717 Sky Pointe Dr., Las Vegas, NV 89136. Several officers responded to the robbery under event # 091114-0728, to include Officer H. Crosby, P# 6827, and Officer A. Hubbard, P# 13980. Upon arrival, the officers made contact with the victim/bartender, identified as Joshua Kiehl, DOB: 08-13-77. There were also two witnesses identified as Sofia Lozano, DOB: 09-03-83, and Alan Daniels, DOB: 10-11-65. The following is a summation of the crime based on victim/witness statements and officer observations.

Mr. Kiehl was working in the bar serving customers Sofia Lozano and Alan Daniels around the time of the crime. Mr. Daniels got up and went to the restroom leaving Mr. Kiehl alone with Mrs. Lozano. At that time, a Black male suspect entered the bar and worked the action on a pistol which he had in his hand (loading the weapon). The suspect pointed the handgun at Mr. Kiehl and Mrs. Lozano while demanding money from the cash registers. Mr. Kiehl complied and opened the cash drawers. The suspect then forced Mr. Kiehl down on the floor and stole approximately \$1000.00 from the register before fleeing from the business. After the robbery was over, Mr. Daniels came out of the bathroom and acted like he didn't know what happened. The suspect was described as a Black male, 30-35 years old, with a heavy build.

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A crime report was completed to document the incident, and Mr. Kiehl wrote a voluntary statement. Mrs. Lozano appeared to be slightly intoxicated and was not entirely cooperative with the arriving officers. After Mrs. Lozano provided a verbal statement, she left the business. Det. Dave Miller, P# 6627, responded to assist with the investigation. Det. Miller conducted a digitally recorded interview with Mr. Daniels. For further details about the interview with Mr. Daniels, please see the section of this report below, titled, "Investigation." Crime Scene Analyst D. Carvouniaris, P# 12712, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. The Tenaya Lodge did not have a functioning video surveillance system at the time of the robbery.

INVESTIGATION

SUSPECTS IDENTIFIED:

As briefly mentioned in the synopsis portion of this report, the eight robberies were determined to be related for several reasons. Out of all the victims to choose from, the suspects selected <u>businesses</u> to victimize, and more specifically <u>bars/pubs</u>. The suspects would often enter the businesses and act like customers, ordering drinks and playing the slots. The suspects, particularly during the early stages of the series, would often wait patiently for other patrons to leave the business before committing the crime.

There are many manners in which to commit a robbery, but these suspects used handguns every time. They pointed their weapons at employees and sometimes patrons, controlling everyone's actions and often inquiring about the whereabouts of personal cell phones. Once the suspects obtained the money from the bartender, they would often herd the victims to the rear of the business, or the bathroom, where they were told to lie down and wait. The suspects often made efforts to eliminate evidence by wiping down the things they touched or even taking them out of the bar. For instance, in several cases, the suspects would actually have the presence of mind to take cups, bottles, and spoons that they'd touched or drank from.

The suspects never wore any masks or gloves, likely because they would not have been permitted entrance into most bars while wearing such disguises. All eight of the described robberies occurred between 0300 and 0700, a time in which most bars are locked up and customers must be "buzzed" in. The two suspects had distinct appearances. One was an overweight Black male, in his 30's or 40's, with a receding hairline (balding), with a gap(s) in his teeth, and he wore prescription eyeglasses during the commission of nearly every crime. The second suspect was a taller Black male that appeared to be fit, possibly balding, and he frequently wore some sort of hat during the commission of the crimes (basebail caps, top hats, etc.). The suspects committed some of the robberies alone, and others together (they may have even been assisting each other when it appeared that they were alone, i.e. - getaway driver, etc.). In at least four of the eight robberies, the suspect(s) used a white sedan as a getaway vehicle during the commission of the crimes. In some cases, the vehicle was more accurately described as a white, four door, Nissan Altima.

Based on their distinct descriptions, it was relatively easy to determine which suspect(s) robbed each business. There was video surveillance in at seven of the eight robberies, which confirmed that the incidents were related and committed by the same suspects.

For these reasons, from an investigative standpoint, <u>Det. Miller felt that if he were to identify the suspect(s)</u> from even one of the eight robberies, then he would likely have the key to solving all the others.

The real break in the case occurred on 11-14-09. Det. Miller responded to the Tenaya Lodge robbery to assist with the investigation. Based on the details of the call, Det. Miller felt that it was possibly related to the described robbery series. It in fact ultimately turned out to be the eighth, and final, robbery in the series, for reasons which will be discussed in a moment.

After arriving at the Tenaya Lodge, Det. Miller was introduced to the victim and two witnesses who were customers inside the bar at the time of the robbery. One of the alleged witnesses was Alan Daniels. Det. Miller was immediately interested in Mr. Daniels because he looked like one of the suspects in the other bar robberies being

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investigated, specifically the taller, thinner, fit looking suspect (frequently wore a hat). The suspect that robbed the Tenaya Lodge sounded like the heavier set Black male that often wore prescription eye glasses.

A witness, Sofia Lozano, was sitting next to Mr. Daniels prior to the crime, and she saw him using his cell phone (possibly texting). Mr. Daniels then suddenly got up and went to the bathroom. Once Mr. Daniels was in the bathroom, the heavy set suspect entered the business and robbed the bartender. After the robbery was over and the suspect left, Mr. Daniels came back out of the bathroom acting surprised that the crime ever occurred. His behavior was simply suspicious. Det. Miller felt that Mr. Daniels was possibly the co-conspirator involved in the entire robbery series.

From the Tenaya Lodge bartender (and later from Mr. Daniels himself), Det. Miller learned that Mr. Daniels was a regular customer of the business and only lived a couple streets over. This being the case, Mr. Daniels would not be able to enter "his local bar" and do a robbery without being recognized. So Det. Miller's theory, at the time, was that Mr. Daniels helped plan and coordinated the robbery from the inside while acting like a customer. Det. Miller considered the idea that Mr. Daniels' job in the robbery was to communicate, via cell phone, with the heavier set suspect who was waiting outside.

Mr. Daniels agreed to sit down with Det. Miller to conduct an interview. Det. Miller conducted the interview inside his unmarked police vehicle where it was quiet and well lit. Det. Miller was wearing plain clothes without weapons, cuffs, etc, visible. Mr. Daniels was not under arrest, was not in handcuffs, and was free to leave or stop answering questions at any time. Det. Miller advised Mr. Daniels of his Miranda rights to which he stated that he understood. Mr. Daniels agreed to speak with Det. Miller. The interview was surreptitiously recorded and will be transcribed and made available to the court when necessary.

In summary, Mr. Daniels denied all knowledge or involvement in any robberies. He told Det. Miller that he was still on parole for a robbery that he'd already been to prison for. Mr. Daniels gave Det. Miller permission to search the content of his cell phone. It was Det. Miller's theory that there would be records on Mr. Daniels' phone showing that he'd called or texted the heavier set suspect right before he got up to go to the bathroom. The theory was that the text message would suggest to the other suspect that it was a good time to enter the business to do the robbery (maybe because there weren't many customers, etc). However, upon inspecting the phone, Det. Miller found that all call and text history had been deleted. Mr. Daniels indicated that having no history simply meant that he hadn't received or made any calls that day. This seemed very suspicious.

Det. Miller told Mr. Daniels that he fit the description of the suspect that had been robbing the other bars in the valley along with the heavier set Black male. Det. Miller even showed Mr. Daniels pictures from the other robberies to see how he would react. He continued to deny involvement in any robberies. Det. Miller asked Mr. Daniels for permission to take a sample of his DNA via buccal swabs. Mr. Daniels was made aware of the fact that he could refuse to give the sample and that it was completely up to him. Mr. Daniels was very willing to provide the sample which was collected via buccal swabs. Det. Miller impounded the buccal swabs as evidence that day.

During the interview, Mr. Daniels showed Det. Miller the vehicle he'd been driving that day. Parked outside the bar was a white four door 2006 Nissan Altima that looked just like the vehicle used in four of the eight described robberies. The vehicle had Nevada license plates 557-VSY, and was registered to Mr. Daniels' mother, Isabell Daniels. Mr. Daniels gave detectives permission to search the vehicle but nothing of interest was found. Crime Scene Analyst D. Carvouniaris took a photograph of Mr. Daniels' vehicle before he departed.

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A records check on Mr. Daniels revealed some additional suspicious factors. In 1996 and 1997, Mr. Daniels was an alleged witness in two other bar robberies (event # 961012-0315 and event # 971223-0235). From a robbery detective's point of view, being a victim/witness in three bar robberies is unlikely and suspicious. Furthermore, in 1998, Mr. Daniels was arrested after robbing the cashier's cage at the Ellis Island Casino located 4178 Koval Lane, Las Vegas, NV 89109 (armed robbery). In 1999, Mr. Daniels was arrested after robbing Pepe Muldoon's Bar located at 4341 N. Rancho Dr., Las Vegas, NV 89108. During the Pepe Muldoon's robbery, Mr. Daniels entered the bar and ordered a cup of coffee. After receiving the coffee, Mr. Daniels pulled out a gun and robbed the bartender. Mr. Daniels then made the bartender go to the bathroom and wait (sound familiar?). Mr. Daniels ultimately spent approximately eight years in prison for these robberies, and as of 11-14-09, he was still on parole (NV Parole and Probation Officer O'Connell). In all, Mr. Daniels was a registered felon for Robbery with a Deadly Weapon - five counts (NV / 2000), Burglary with a Deadly Weapon (NV / 2000), Robbery with a Deadly Weapon (NV / 2000), Robbery with a Deadly Weapon - two counts (NV / 2000), Robbery (NV / 2002), and Burglary with a Deadly Weapon (NV / 2002). Attached to this arrest package are certified copies of Mr. Daniels' Judgements of Conviction (JOC's).

Based on the totality of these described facts and circumstances, it appeared as though Mr. Daniels was a likely suspect in the entire robbery series. He fit the description (based on statements and video surveillance), his car fit the description (based on statements and video surveillance), and he was on parole for committing similar crimes, to include a bar where he used the exact same modus operandi (ordered coffee, then robbed, then made victim wait in bathroom). For these reasons, Det. Miller requested that the LVMPD ROP (Repeat Offenders Program) unit follow Mr. Daniels for two reasons: To prevent or catch him in the act of committing similar crimes, and to see if he would lead the police to his co-conspirator (the heavier set suspect with prescription glasses).

The ROP unit, to include Det. Joe Giannone, P# 6225, began following Mr. Daniels around 11-17-09. On that date, the detectives observed Mr. Daniels meet with a Black male that they identified as Cary Pickett, ID# 0725059. Mr. Pickett was a Black male, 44 years old, 5'8", 205 Lbs, with a receding hairline, and listed as having corrective lenses per the Nevada Department of Motor Vehicles as of 07-2009. Mr. Pickett looked just like the heavier set suspect that Det. Miller had been looking for. The ROP detectives began following Mr. Pickett as well, and at one point, Det. Giannone observed Mr. Pickett wearing what appeared to be the exact same jacket that he wore during the Timbers Bar robbery. Det. Giannone, having observed the surveillance pictures from the described robberies, felt certain that Mr. Pickett was the heavier set suspect involved.

A records check on Mr. Pickett revealed that he was a registered felon for Attempt Concealed Weapon (NV / 1989), Attempt Grand Larceny (NV / 1991), Burglary (NV / 1992), Attempt Grand Larceny (NV / 1993), Escape of a Prisoner (NV / 1994), Grand Larceny (NV / 1997), Burglary (NV / 1997), and Transport of Controlled Substance (NV / 2007). Attached to this arrest package are certified copies of Mr. Pickett's Judgements of Conviction (JOC's).

In summary, the ROP unit tracked/followed Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett until mid January, 2010. They didn't catch them committing any additional crimes. In fact, to Det. Miller's knowledge, there hasn't been one other similar bar robbery in Clark County since the date of Mr. Daniels' interview on 11-14-09. Det. Miller showed Mr. Daniels the video surveillance on 11-14-09, and accused him of the crimes. It is believed that Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett were frightened after the interview and have been laying low ever since.

VIDEO SURVEILLANCE:

In short, as already mentioned, surveillance from seven of the eight described robberies was obtained. Based on the video surveillance and surrounding facts and circumstances, it was apparent that Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett were the suspects involved in the following incidents:

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PHONE RECORDS:

The investigation into Alan Daniels' and Cary Pickett's cell phone history is still on-going. However, the results so far would indicate that Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett were in contact with one another around the dates and times of several of the robberies. The Tenaya Lodge robbery was of particular interest, since Mr. Daniels would have one believe that he was simply a witness to the crime and not a principle suspect. As previously mentioned, Mr. Daniels allowed Det. Miller to look at his cell phone after the robbery, but his call history was suspiciously deleted. In fact, he indicated that a blank history simply meant that he hadn't made or received any calls that day (11-14-09). A witness, Sofia Lozano, observed Mr. Daniels messing around with his phone just prior to the robbery (possibly texting). A records check on Mr. Daniels' cell phone would indicate that he did contact Mr. Pickett via cell phone approximately two minutes before, and six minutes after, the robbery occurred at the Tenaya Lodge. In fact, he used his cell phone for multiple calls/texts on the morning of 11-14-09 (per records), but the cell history had been deleted. The following chart is a summary of Mr. Daniels' call history in relation to several of the described robberies (the investigation is on-going):

FORENSICS:

The crime scenes were processed for evidence in all eight of the robberies. Many of the robberies were committed in the same manner: The suspects would enter, act like customers, order drinks, and then commit the crimes. Mugs and bottles that the suspects drank from were located in at least at least four of the eight robberies. The following chart demonstrates the forensic results as they currently are, but the investigation is far from complete:

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For further details, please refer to the Crime Scene Reports, the Forensic Lab Requests, and the Forensic Lab Results (attached to the arrest package). It should be noted that a sample of Cary Pickett's DNA will need to be obtained for comparison purposes. Also, latent print comparisons are still pending.

ALAN DANIELS INTERVIEW:

As previously mentioned, Det. Miller first interviewed Alan Daniels on 11-14-09. Mr. Daniels denied involvement in all robberies. On 02-08-10, Alan Daniels was arrested for "Parole Violation" at the Nevada Parole and Probation Offices located at 628 Belrose St., Las Vegas, NV 89107 (partially because Officer O'Connell and Lt. Webb were aware of the fact that there was probable cause to believe Mr. Daniels had been committing these described robberies, therefore, violating his parole). On 02-10-10, Det. Miller conducted an interview with Mr. Daniels while he was still in custody at CCDC. The interview was surreptitiously recorded and will be transcribed and made available to the court when necessary. Det. Miller advised Mr. Daniels of his Miranda rights to which he stated that he understood. Mr. Daniels agreed to speak with Det. Miller "for a few minutes." After Det. Miller explained that Mr. Daniels was a suspect in at least seven business robberies, he (Daniels) asked for a lawyer. The interview was stopped at that time.

CARY PICKETT INTERVIEW:

Det. Miller felt that there was probable cause to believe that Cary Pickett was the heavier set suspect involved in these described robberies (based on matching suspect descriptions, video surveillance, photo line-ups, phone records, and other circumstantial factors). On 02-11-10, Det. Miller provided a briefing on the incident to Det. Rory Neslund, P# 4373, from the Career Apprehension Team (CAT's). At approximately 1100 hours, Det. Neslund, along with other detectives in his unit, found Mr. Pickett eating lunch in his car (Ford Mustang) at 3025 W. Sahara, Las Vegas, NV 89102. Det. Neslund took Mr. Pickett into custody and transported him to the LVMPD robbery office where he was handed over to Det. Dave Miller.

Det. Miller conducted a digitally recorded interview with Mr. Pickett. Det. Miller advised Mr. Pickett of his Miranda rights to which he stated that he understood. Mr. Pickett agreed to speak with Det. Miller. Det. Miller told Mr. Pickett that he was under arrest for involvement in a bar robbery series. Det. Miller explained that the co-defendant (Alan Daniels) was already in custody for the crimes. Mr. Pickett denied any involvement in the bar robberies and claimed to be completely innocent. Mr. Pickett said that he would be willing to voluntarily participate in a polygraph examination.

Det. Miller transported Mr. Pickett to the LVMPD personnel office where Polygraph Examiner G. Flohr, P# 12912, gave Mr. Pickett a polygraph examination (Concealed Information Test). While speaking with Examiner Flohr, Mr. Pickett admitted that he knew Alan Daniels (the co-defendant). Mr. Pickett said that he'd known Mr. Daniels since they were about 12 years old, and that they'd even been to prison together. For investigative purposes, the questioning during the polygraph examination was focused primarily on the Rae's Bar robbery reported under Henderson event # 09-23087. Part way into the examination, Mr. Picket said that he didn't want to continue. The polygraph was immediately stopped, but Mr. Pickett said that he was still willing to talk to detectives. Enough of the polygraph had already been completed for Examiner Flohr to conclude that Mr. Picket had failed. The examination results showed that Mr. Pickett did have intimate knowledge about the robbery that only an actual suspect would. Examiner Flohr told Mr. Pickett that he'd failed the exam and that there was no doubt that he (Pickett) had intimate involvement/knowledge about the robberies (Rae's Bar). Mr. Pickett asked for an attorney at that time and the interview was concluded.

For the complete details regarding the polygraph examination/interview, please refer to the report which will be completed by Polygraph Examiner G. Flohr.

Two additional things of interest regarding Cary Pickett's arrest: First, his physical description, including the prescription eye glasses fit perfectly to the heavier set suspect involved in these robberies. Mr. Pickett even had a gap in his upper teeth as described by some victims. Second, Mr. Pickett said that he and Alan Daniels have known each other since they were 12 years old (over 30 years). Det. Miller previously interviewed Alan Daniels and showed him surveillance pictures of Cary Pickett. Mr. Daniels said that he didn't recognize the male pictured. If Mr. Daniels and Mr.

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Pickett have known each other for 30 years, they would likely recognize one another. It was apparent that Mr. Daniels was dishonest during the interview.

CONCLUSION

Based on the totality of the above described facts and circumstances, there is probable cause to believe that Alan Daniels and Cary Pickett are the two principle suspects involved with the described robbery series.

In these described incidents, the suspects entered occupied structures (bars/pubs) with concealed firearms and then pointed their weapons at customers and employees while demanding money and cell phones. In each of these incidents, the victims complied with the suspects' orders and provided money (and cell phones in some cases). The suspects then frequently forced the victims and customers to lie down on the ground in the back of the businesses (frequently the bathroom). The victim's complied in each of these incidents because the suspects placed them in fear for their lives. The suspects were ultimately identified as Alan Daniels and Cary Pickett. Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett are convicted felons, each registered for multiple offenses. For further details on their conviction records, please refer to the section of this report titled, "Suspects Identified." Also, attached to this arrest package are the Judgements of Conviction for each defendant.

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Based on the totality of these described facts and circumstances, there is also probable cause to believe that Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett conspired to commit these crimes, intending to enter the businesses and ultimately rob the victims. One might argue that Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett entered the bars and ordered drinks like normal customers, and only decided to commit the crimes as almost an afterthought (no conspiracy or premeditated intent). If only one bar robbery had occurred in this manner, it might be a reasonable explanation. However, eight robberies occurred, nearly all of them carried out by the suspects in the same exact manner (ex-felons entered the bars with concealed firearms, acted like customers, drank, gambled, and then robbed). It would appear that the suspects did conspire, plan, and carry out the crimes in unison. As previously stated, this isn't the first time that Alan Daniels has committed a robbery in this manner. He robbed another bar back in 1999 in the exact same manner (convicted and sent to prison).

The actions of Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett meet the criminal elements of Robbery with a Deadly Weapon (multiple counts), Burglary with a Deadly Weapon (multiple counts), Ex-Felon Possession of a Firearm (multiple counts - JOC's attached to arrest report), Conspiracy to Commit Robbery (multiple counts), and Conspiracy to Commit Burglary (multiple counts). It should be noted that this arrest package is only regarding Cary Pickett. Alan Daniels' parole was violated (as a result of these robberies) and he was booked at CCDC on 02-08-10 (for parole violation). Det. Miller re-booked Mr. Daniels for these described robbery charges on 02-10-10.

FORENSICS:

The crime scenes were processed for evidence in all eight of the robberies. Many of the robberies were committed in the same manner: The suspects would enter, act like customers, order drinks, and then commit the crimes. Mugs and bottles that the suspects drank from were located in at least at least four of the eight robberies. The following chart demonstrates the forensic results as they currently are, but the investigation is far from complete:

It should be noted that a sample of Cary Pickett's DNA will need to be obtained for comparison purposes. Also, latent print comparisons are still pending.

ALAN DANIELS INTERVIEW:

As previously mentioned, Det. Miller first interviewed Alan Daniels on 11-14-09. Mr. Daniels denied involvement in all robberies. On 02-08-10, Alan Daniels was arrested for "Parole Violation" at the Nevada Parole and Probation Offices located at 628 Belrose St., Las Vegas, NV 89107 (partially because Officer O'Connell and Lt. Webb were aware of the fact that there was probable cause to believe Mr. Daniels had been committing these described robberies, therefore, violating his parole). On 02-10-10, Det. Miller conducted an interview with Mr. Daniels while he was still in custody at CCDC. The interview was surreptitiously recorded and will be transcribed and made available to the court when necessary. Det. Miller advised Mr. Daniels of his Miranda rights to which he stated that he understood. Mr. Daniels agreed to speak with Det. Miller "for a few minutes." After Det. Miller explained that Mr. Daniels was a suspect in at least seven business robberies, he (Daniels) asked for a lawyer. The interview was stopped at that time.

CARY PICKETT INTERVIEW:

Det. Miller felt that there was probable cause to believe that Cary Pickett was the heavier set suspect involved in these described robberies (based on matching suspect descriptions, video surveillance, photo line-ups, phone records, and other circumstantial factors). On 02-11-10, Det. Miller provided a briefing on the incident to Det. Rory Neslund, P# 4373, from the Career Apprehension Team (CAT's). At approximately 1100 hours, Det. Neslund, along with other detectives in his unit, found Mr. Pickett eating lunch in his car (Ford Mustang) at 3025 W. Sahara, Las Vegas, NV 89102. Det. Neslund took Mr. Pickett into custody and transported him to the LVMPD robbery office where he was handed over to Det. Dave Miller.

Det. Miller conducted a digitally recorded interview with Mr. Pickett. Det. Miller advised Mr. Pickett of his Miranda rights to which he stated that he understood. Mr. Pickett agreed to speak with Det. Miller. Det. Miller told Mr. Pickett that he was under arrest for involvement in a bar robbery series. Det. Miller explained that the co-defendant (Alan Daniels) was already in custody for the crimes. Mr. Pickett denied any involvement in the bar robberies and claimed to be completely innocent. Mr. Pickett said that he would be willing to voluntarily participate in a polygraph examination.

Det. Miller transported Mr. Pickett to the LVMPD personnel office where Polygraph Examiner G. Flohr, P# 12912, gave Mr. Pickett a polygraph examination (Concealed Information Test). While speaking with Examiner Flohr, Mr. Pickett admitted that he knew Alan Daniels (the co-defendant). Mr. Pickett said that he'd known Mr. Daniels since they were about 12 years old, and that they'd even been to prison together. For investigative purposes, the questioning during the polygraph examination was focused primarily on the Rae's Bar robbery reported under Henderson event # 09-23087. Part way into the examination, Mr. Picket said that he didn't want to continue. The polygraph was immediately stopped, but Mr. Pickett said that he was still willing to talk to detectives. Enough of the polygraph had already been completed for Examiner Flohr to conclude that Mr. Picket had failed. The examination results showed that Mr. Pickett did have intimate knowledge about the robbery that only an actual suspect would. Examiner Flohr told Mr. Pickett that he'd failed the exam and that there was no doubt that he (Pickett) had intimate involvement/knowledge about the robberes (Rae's Bar). Mr. Pickett asked for an attorney at that time and the interview was concluded.

For the complete details regarding the polygraph examination/interview, please refer to the report which will be completed by Polygraph Examiner G. Flohr.

Two additional things of interest regarding Cary Pickett's arrest: First, his physical description, including the prescription eye glasses fit perfectly to the heavier set suspect involved in these robberies. Mr. Pickett even had a gap in his upper teeth as described by some victims. Second, Mr. Pickett said that he and Alan Daniels have known each other since they were 12 years old (over 30 years). Det. Miller previously interviewed Alan Daniels and showed him surveillance pictures of Cary Pickett. Mr. Daniels said that he didn't recognize the male pictured. If Mr. Daniels and Mr.



Pickett have known each other for 30 years, they would likely recognize one another. It was apparent that Mr. Daniels was dishonest during the interview.

In these described incidents, the suspects entered occupied structures (bars/pubs) with concealed firearms and then pointed their weapons at customers and employees while demanding money and cell phones. In each of these incidents, the victims compiled with the suspects' orders and provided money (and cell phones in some cases). The suspects then frequently forced the victims and customers to lie down on the ground in the back of the businesses (frequently the bathroom). The victim's complied in each of these incidents because the suspects placed them in fear for their lives. The suspects were ultimately identified as Alan Daniels and Cary Pickett. Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett are convicted felons, each registered for multiple offenses. For further details on their conviction records, please refer to the section of this report titled, "Suspects Identified." Also, attached to this arrest package are the Judgements of Conviction for each defendant.

Based on the totality of these described facts and circumstances, there is also probable cause to believe that Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett conspired to commit these crimes, intending to enter the businesses and ultimately rob the victims. One might argue that Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett entered the bars and ordered drinks like normal customers, and only decided to commit the crimes as almost an afterthought (no conspiracy or premeditated intent). If only one bar robbery had occurred in this manner, it might be a reasonable explanation. However, eight robberies occurred, nearly all of them carried out by the suspects in the same exact manner (ex-felons entered the bars with concealed lirearms, acted like customers, drank, gambled, and then robbed). It would appear that the suspects did conspire, plan, and carry out the crimes in unison. As previously stated, this isn't the first time that Alan Daniels has committed a robbery in this manner. He robbed another bar back in 1999 in the exact same manner (convicted and sent to prison).

The actions of Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett meet the criminal elements of Robbery with a Deadly Weapon (multiple counts), Burglary with a Deadly Weapon (multiple counts), Ex-Felon Possession of a Firearm (multiple counts - JOC's attached to arrest report), Conspiracy to Commit Robbery (multiple counts), and Conspiracy to Commit Burglary (multiple counts). It should be noted that this arrest package is only regarding Cary Pickett. Alan Daniels' parole was violated (as a result of these robberies) and he was booked at CCDC on 02-08-10 (for parole violation). Det. Miller re-booked Mr. Daniels for these described robbery charges on 02-10-10.

Rancho Dr., Las Vegas, NV 89130. Several officers responded to the robbery under event # 090704-0926, to include Officer S. Fox, P# 9485. Upon arrival, officers made contact with the victim/bartender, identified as David Edwards, DOB: 08-07-70. The following is a summation of the crime based on Mr. Edwards' statements, video surveillance, and officer observations.

Mr. Edwards was working inside the bar alone when the suspect arrived in what appeared to be a White Sedan. The suspect backed the vehicle into a stall which Mr. Edwards thought was a bit suspicious. The suspect entered the business, sat down, and ordered a couple beers. The suspect drank his beers and played video poker for approximately fifteen minutes before he stood up and pulled out a black semi-automatic handgun that he'd concealed in his waistband. The suspect pointed the gun at Mr. Edwards, worked the action (put a bullet in the chamber) and then said, "Let's do it." At the suspect's request, Mr. Edwards opened the cash registers. The suspect stole approximately \$2200.00 (U.S. currency) before making Mr. Edwards go the bathroom and wait. After several minutes, Mr. Edwards looked out of the bathroom to discover that the suspect had already fled. Mr. Edwards described the suspect as a Black male, 30-35 years old, approximately 5'10", 165 Lbs, wearing a red baseball cap.

A crime report was completed to document the incident, and Mr. Edwards wrote a voluntary statement. Crime Scene Analyst Robbie Dahn, P# 5947, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. Of particular interest, CSA Dahn recovered the two beer bottles that the suspect drank from prior to the robbery. A copy of the video surveillance was ultimately obtained and is with the case file (still shots only). The quality of the video is extremely poor, but does show a picture of the suspect wearing a baseball styled hat.

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INN ZONE BAR ROBBERY - LYMPD EVENT # 09831-0560:

On 08-31-09, at approximately 0416 hours, the LVMPD received an emergency phone call regarding a robbery that had just occurred at the Inn Zone Bar located at 238 S. Rainbow Blvd., Las Vegas, NV 89128. Several officers responded to the robbery under event # 090831-0560, to include Officer B. Fortner, P# 13152. Upon arrival, the officers made contact with the victim/bartender, identified as Crystal Earhart, DOB: 05-18-64. The following is a summation of the crime based on Mrs. Earhart's statements, video surveillance, and officer observations.

Mrs. Earhart was working inside the bar alone when the suspect arrived, sat down, and ordered a beer. The suspect drank the beer as well a water (from a bottle) that he'd brought with him. After a couple hours went by, the suspect pulled out a black handgun, hit a surveillance camera (to change the view) and then pointed the weapon at Mrs. Earhart's back while demanding money from the registers. Mrs. Earhart complied and the suspect stole approximately \$630.00 (U.S. currency) from two cash registers before forcing Mrs. Earhart to wait in the bathroom. Using a rag from the bar, the suspect made an attempt to wipe off his fingerprints from the beer bottle he'd been drinking from. The suspect then left the bar. Mrs. Earhart described the suspect as a Black male, 30-39 years old, approximately 5'10" to 6'0", 170 Lbs, bald, wearing a black Reebok baseball cap.

A crime report was completed to document the incident, and Mrs. Earhart wrote a voluntary statement. Crime Scene Analyst Shelly Shrum, P# 7917, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. Of particular interest, CSA Shrum recovered swabs of possible DNA from the mouths of the "Niagra" water bottle and "Budweiser" beer bottle that the suspect drank from prior to the robbery. A copy of the video surveillance was ultimately obtained and is with the case file. The quality of the video surveillance is relatively good, showing pictures of the suspect and his actions.

BEANO'S BAR ROBBERY - LVMPD EVENT # 091011-0978:

On 10-11-09, at approximately 0645 hours, the LVMPD received an emergency phone call regarding a robbery that had just occurred at the Beano's Bar located at 7200 W. Lake Mead, Las Vegas, NV 89149. Several officers responded to the robbery under event # 091011-0978, to include Officer J. Bledsoe, P# 8300. Upon arrival, the officers made contact with two employees/victims, identified as Michael Cosgrove, DOB: 02-17-52, and Gregory Shealian, DOB: 01-22-63. There was also one witness that was identified as Darion Cook, DOB: 04-16-88. The following is a summation of the crime based on victim/witness statements, video surveillance, and officer observations.

Mr. Cosgrove and Mr. Shealian were working inside the bar when two Black male suspects entered, sat down, and ordered a coffee and beer (Heineken). One suspect was tall and thin (6'1", 180 Lbs), wearing a baseball cap, while the other was shorter and heavyset (5'10", 200 Lbs), with gaps in his teeth, and wearing gold wire prescription eye glasses. The suspects ordered some chips and salsa, but then complained that the chips were stale. Mr. Cosgrove took the chips to the back of the business to ask the cook, Mr. Shealian, about the problem. The suspect with the glasses followed Mr. Cosgrove to the back of the business and pulled out a black semi-automatic handgun. The suspect pointed the weapon at Mr. Cosgrove and Mr. Shealian and forced them to lie down on the ground. The suspect then stole Mr. Cosgrove's money clip containing his identification and miscellaneous credit cards

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The two suspects then stole approximately \$7250.00 (U.S. currency) from the cash registers and tip jar before fleeing from the business. There were two customers inside the business at the time of the crime: Darion Cook and his cousin who was not identified. Mr. Cook saw the suspects and thought they looked suspicious, but he didn't know that they'd actually robbed the business until after they were already gone. Mr. Cook remembered the suspects arriving in a white Nissan Altima styled vehicle.

A crime report was completed to document the incident, and voluntary statements were written by Mr. Cosgrove, Mr. Shealian, and Mr. Cook. Crime Scene Analyst E. Taylor, P# 9619, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. Of particular interest, CSA Shrum recovered a swab of possible DNA from a coffee mug that one of the suspects drank from prior to the robbery. A copy of the video surveillance was ultimately obtained and impounded as evidence. The quality of the video surveillance is relatively good, showing pictures of the suspects and their actions.



Beeno's Bar Robbery Suspects

ROADRUNNER SALOON ROBBERY - LVMPD EVENT # 091023-0605:

On 10-23-09, at approximately 0500 hours, the LVMPD received an emergency phone call regarding a robbery that had just occurred at the Roadrunner Saloon located at 5990 Centennial Center Blvd., Las Vegas, NV 89149. Several officers responded to the robbery under event # 091023-0605, to include Officer J. Larosa, P# 13448. Upon arrival, the of the crime based on Mr. Sanchez's statements, video surveillance, and officer observations.

Mr. Sanchez was working alone when two Black male suspects entered the bar, sat down, and ordered coffee. The suspects began playing the slots until everyone else in the bar left (cleaning crew). One suspect was described as tall and thin (6'4", 195 Lbs), wearing a baseball cap, while the other was described as shorter and heavyset (5'8", 225 Lbs), wearing prescription eye glasses. One of the suspects cashed out on his slot machine which required Mr. Sanchez to open the cash register to provide change. While doing so, the suspect with the glasses walked behind the counter with a gun pointed at Mr. Sanchez. The suspect ordered Mr. Sanchez to leave the cash drawer open and he directed him around the bar to the second suspect. The second suspect (the taller one) then pointed a gun at Mr. Sanchez and forced him to lie down in the bathroom. The taller suspect also stole Mr. Sanchez's Palm Pre cell phone.

The suspects stole approximately \$3900.00 (U.S. currency) before using a green rag to wipe down the areas where they'd touched (bar, slots, etc.). The suspects stole the coffee mugs and spoons they drank from before fleeing from the business.

A crime report was completed to document the incident, and Mr. Sanchez wrote a voluntary statement. Crime Scene Analysts D. Brotherson, P# 4931, and J. Maldonado, P# 6920, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. Det. Dave Miller, P# 6627, responded to assist with the investigation. Det. Miller considered the possibility that the suspects may have discarded the stolen coffee mugs, spoons, etc. a short time after the robbery. It seemed apparent that the items were only taken so as to prevent the police from gathering additional evidence (DNA, latent prints, etc.). Det. Miller searched the immediate areas around the Roadrunner Saloon but found nothing of interest. Det. Miller tried to determine the streets the suspects may have fled on after the crime. From the business. Det. Miller drove north on Centennal Center, then east on Azure. Between 7 145 Azure and 7485 Azure, on the south side of the street, Det. Miller located a green rag, two glass mugs (broken), a metal spoon, a grey box cutter, and Mr. Sanchez's stolen Palm Pre (cell phone). The Roadrunner Saloon manager, Shawn Olsen, positively identified the coffee mugs and spoon as items belonging to their

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business. Det. Miller took digital photographs of all the items and recovered them while wearing latex gloves. The items were impounded as evidence. Det. Miller ultimately obtained a sample of Mr. Sanchez's DNA, via buccal swabs, for comparisons/eliminations. A copy of the video surveillance was ultimately obtained and is with the case file. The quality of the video surveillance is relatively good, showing pictures of the suspects and their actions.







Roadrunner Saloon Robbery Suspects

TRIPLE BAR ROBBERY - NORTH LAS VEGAS EVENT # 09-026503:

On 11-07-09, at approximately 0618 hours, the North Las Vegas Police Department received an emergency phone call regarding a robbery that had just occurred at the Triple Bar located at 4420 N. Decatur Blvd., North Las Vegas, NV, 89030. Several officers responded to the robbery under event # 09-026503, to include Officer S. Noahr, P# 1861. Upon arrival, the officers made contact with the victim/barlender, identified as George Mattie, DOB: 03-13-69, and one witness identified as Joe Berens, DOB: 05-29-47. The following is a summation of the crime based on victim/witness statements, video surveillance, and officer observations.

The two Black male suspects arrived at the bar in a white, newer modeled, Nissan Altima styled vehicle (per video surveillance). They backed the vehicle into a parking stall near the front of the business. Mr. Mattie was working alone when the suspects entered the bar. The first suspect was described as tall and skinny (6'0", 170 Lbs), wearing a baseball cap, while the other suspect was described as shorter and heavy set (5'10", 215 Lbs) wearing prescription eye glasses. The suspects sat down and began playing the slots. The taller suspect ordered a Heineken beer while the suspect wearing glasses ordered a coffee. After about fifteen minutes, the suspects stood up and pulled out small framed handguns. The suspects demanded money from the cash register, and Mr. Mattie complied, handing them approximately \$4200.00 (U.S. currency). The two suspects then forced Mr. Mattie and a customer, Mr. Berens, to wait in the bathroom. The suspects then fled from the bar in the same white Nissan sedan.

A crime report was completed to document the incident, and voluntary statements were written by Mr. Mattie and Mr. Berens. Crime Scene Analysts R. Wanta, P# 1694, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. A copy of the video surveillance was ultimately obtained and is currently in the possession of the North Las Vegas Police Department. The quality of the video surveillance is relatively good, showing pictures of the suspects and their actions.







Friple Bar Robbery Suspects and Vehicle

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RAE'S BAR ROBBERY - HENDERSON EVENT # 09-23087:

On 11-11-09, at approximately 0313 hours, the LVMPD received an emergency phone call regarding a robbery that had just occurred at the Rae's Bar located at 2531 Wigwam Pkwy., Henderson, NV 89012. Several officers responded to the robbery under event # 09-23087, to include Officer B. Hyde, P# 1734. Upon arrival, the officers made contact with the victim/bartender, identified as Delton Lema, DOB: 02-20-76, and several other witnesses identified as Raymond Ficklin, DOB: 04-30-78, Teresa Titus, DOB: 01-23-78, William McDaniels, DOB: 06-09-77, Stephanie McKay, DOB; 08-26-83, and Joan Morris, DOB: 06-18-35. The following is a summation of the crime based on victim/witness statements, video surveillance, and officer observations.

On 11-09-09, around 0400 hours, the two suspects arrived at the bar and parked a white Nissan styled sedan in the parking lot. The suspects tried to enter the business but found the doors locked. The bartender didn't buzz them in because he thought that they were suspicious. The suspects finally departed in their vehicle.

On 11-11-09, at approximately 0313 hours, the same suspects returned to the bar, in the same vehicle, but a White female accompanied them as well. The bartender, Delton Lema, checked the female's identification and remembered that it was issued in California, and that the female's year of birth was 1987. The three suspects sat down at the bar, ordered three beers, and began playing the slots. The first Black male suspect was described as tall and thin (6'0", 185 Lbs) wearing a baseball cap, while the second Black male suspect was described as shorter and heavy set (5'8", 210 Lbs) with a gap in his teeth and wearing prescription eye glasses. The female suspect was described as 22 years old, 5'3", with long brown/black hair, wearing a black fedora styled hat.

About 45 minutes went by before the taller suspect pulled out a semi-automatic handgun and pointed it at Mr. Lema while demanding money from the cash registers. At the same time, the suspect wearing glasses pointed a handgun at all the other witnesses and forced them into the bathroom. Mr. Lema complied with the suspect's request and provided them with approximately \$1550.00 (U.S. currency). The suspect then forced Mr. Lema to wait in the bathroom with all the other customers/witnesses. The suspects took the beer bottles they'd used and fled from the bar in the same white Nissan styled sedan.

A crime report was completed to document the incident, and voluntary statements were written by Mr. Lema, Mrs. Titus, Mr. McDaniels, Mrs. McKay, and Mr. Ficklin. Crime Scene Analysts J. Self, P# 1370, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. A copy of the video surveillance was ultimately obtained and is currently in the possession of the Henderson Police Department (LVMPD Det. Dave Miller also has a copy with the case file). The quality of the video surveillance is relatively good, showing pictures of the suspects and their actions.

Rae 4 Bar Robbery Suspects (11-11-09)

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TIMBERS BAR ROBBERY - LVMPD EVENT # 091113-0506:

On 11-13-09, at approximately 0343 hours, the LVMPD received an emergency phone call regarding a robbery that had just occurred at the Timbers Bar located at 7240 W. Azure, Las Vegas, NV 89130. Several officers responded to the robbery under event # 091113-0506, to include Officer J. Larosa, P# 13448. Upon arrival, the officers made contact with the victim/bartender, identified as Aaron Parduhm, DOB: 05-03-74, and one witness (off duty bartender), identified as Jennifer Favier, DOB: 03-03-83. The following is a summation of the crime based on victim/witness statements, video surveillance, and officer observations.

Mr. Parduhm was working inside the bar while talking with an off duty bartender, Mrs. Favier. A Black male suspect entered the bar and walked directly up to Mr. Parduhm and Mrs. Favier with a black semi-automatic pistol in his hand. The suspect worked the action on the firearm (loading the weapon) and then pointed it at Mr. Parduhm and Mrs. Favier while demanding money from the cash registers. Mr. Parduhm complied and opened the cash drawers. The suspect then removed approximately \$1550.00 (U.S. currency) and forced Mr. Parduhm and Mrs. Favier to go to the men's bathroom and lie down on the floor. Mr. Parduhm and Mrs. Favier waited a few minutes and then exited the bathroom to find the suspect gone. The suspect was described as a Black male, approximately 40 to 45 years old, 5'10", 230 Lbs, and wearing prescription eye glasses.

A crime report was completed to document the incident, and voluntary statements were written by Mr. Parduhm and Mrs. Favier. Crime Scene Analyst D. Ford, P# 4244, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. A copy of the video surveillance was ultimately obtained and is with Det. Dave Miller's case file. The quality of the video surveillance is relatively good, showing pictures of the suspect and his actions.







Timbers Bar Robbery Suspect

TENAYA LODGE BAR ROBBERY - LVMPD EVENT # 091114-0728:

On 11-14-09, at approximately 0545 hours, the LVMPD received an emergency phone call regarding a robbery that had just occurred at the Tenaya Lodge located at 5717 Sky Pointe Dr., Las Vegas, NV 89136. Several officers responded to the robbery under event # 091114-0728, to include Officer H. Crosby, P# 6827, and Officer A. Hubbard, P# 13980. Upon arrival, the officers made contact with the victim/bartender, identified as Joshua Kiehl, DOB: 08-13-77. There were also the crime based on victim/witness statements and officer observations.

Mr. Kiehl was working in the bar serving customers Sofia Lozano and Alan Daniels around the time of the crime. Mr. Daniels got up and went to the restroom leaving Mr. Kiehl alone with Mrs. Lozano. At that time, a Black male suspect entered the bar and worked the action on a pistol which he had in his hand (loading the weapon). The suspect pointed the handgun at Mr. Kiehl and Mrs. Lozano while demanding money from the cash registers. Mr. Kiehl complied and opened the cash drawers. The suspect then forced Mr. Kiehl down on the floor and stole approximately \$1000.00 from the register before fleeing from the business. After the robbery was over, Mr. Daniels came out of the bathroom and acted like he didn't know what happened. The suspect was described as a Black male, 30.35 years old, with a heavy build

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A crime report was completed to document the incident, and Mr. Kiehl wrote a voluntary statement. Mrs. Lozano appeared to be slightly intoxicated and was not entirely cooperative with the arriving officers. After Mrs. Lozano provided a verbal statement, she left the business. Det. Dave Miller, P# 6627, responded to assist with the investigation. Det. Miller conducted a digitally recorded interview with Mr. Daniels. For further details about the interview with Mr. Daniels, please see the section of this report below, titled, "Investigation." Crime Scene Analyst D. Carvouniaris, P# 12712, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. The Tenaya Lodge did not have a functioning video surveillance system at the time of the robbery.

INVESTIGATION

SUSPECTS IDENTIFIED:

As briefly mentioned in the synopsis portion of this report, the eight robberies were determined to be related for several reasons. Out of all the victims to choose from, the suspects selected <u>businesses</u> to victimize, and more specifically <u>bars/pubs</u>. The suspects would often enter the businesses and act like customers, ordering drinks and playing the slots. The suspects, particularly during the early stages of the series, would often wait patiently for other patrons to leave the business before committing the crime.

There are many manners in which to commit a robbery, but these suspects used handguns every time. They pointed their weapons at employees and sometimes patrons, controlling everyone's actions and often inquiring about the whereabouts of personal cell phones. Once the suspects obtained the money from the bartender, they would often herd the victims to the rear of the business, or the bathroom, where they were told to lie down and wait. The suspects often made efforts to eliminate evidence by wiping down the things they touched or even taking them out of the bar. For instance, in several cases, the suspects would actually have the presence of mind to take cups, bottles, and spoons that they'd touched or drank from.

The suspects never wore any masks or gloves, likely because they would not have been permitted entrance into most bars while wearing such disguises. All eight of the described robberies occurred between 0300 and 0700, a time in which most bars are locked up and customers must be "buzzed" in. The two suspects had distinct appearances. One was an overweight Black male, in his 30's or 40's, with a receding hairline (balding), with a gap(s) in his teeth, and he wore prescription eyeglasses during the commission of nearly every crime. The second suspect was a taller Black male that appeared to be fit, possibly balding, and he frequently wore some sort of hat during the commission of the crimes (baseball caps, top hats, etc.). The suspects committed some of the robberies alone, and others together (they may have even been assisting each other when it appeared that they were alone, i.e. - getaway driver, etc.). In at least four of the eight robberies, the suspect(s) used a white sedan as a getaway vehicle during the commission of the crimes. In some cases, the vehicle was more accurately described as a white, four door, Nissan Altima.

Based on their distinct descriptions, it was relatively easy to determine which suspect(s) robbed each business. There was video surveillance in at seven of the eight robberies, which confirmed that the incidents were related and committed by the same suspects.

For these reasons, from an investigative standpoint, <u>Det. Miller felt that if he were to identify the suspect(s)</u> from even one of the eight robberies, then he would likely have the key to solving all the others.

The real break in the case occurred on 11-14-09. Det. Miller responded to the Tenaya Lodge robbery to assist with the investigation. Based on the details of the call, Det. Miller felt that it was possibly related to the described robbery series. It in fact ultimately turned out to be the eighth, and final, robbery in the series, for reasons which will be discussed in a moment.

After arriving at the Tenaya Lodge, Det Miller was introduced to the victim and two witnesses who were customers inside the bar at the time of the robbery. One of the alleged witnesses was Alan Daniels. Det Miller was immediately interested in Mr. Daniels because he looked like one of the suspects in the other bar robberies being

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investigated, specifically the taller, thinner, fit looking suspect (frequently wore a hat). The suspect that robbed the Tenaya Lodge sounded like the heavier set Black male that often wore prescription eye glasses.

A witness, Sofia Lozano, was sitting next to Mr. Daniels prior to the crime, and she saw him using his cell phone (possibly texting). Mr. Daniels then suddenly got up and went to the bathroom. Once Mr. Daniels was in the bathroom, the heavy set suspect entered the business and robbed the bartender. After the robbery was over and the suspect left, Mr. Daniels came back out of the bathroom acting surprised that the crime ever occurred. His behavior was simply suspicious. Det. Miller felt that Mr. Daniels was possibly the co-conspirator involved in the entire robbery series.

From the Tenaya Lodge bartender (and later from Mr. Daniels himself), Det. Miller learned that Mr. Daniels was a regular customer of the business and only lived a couple streets over. This being the case, Mr. Daniels would not be able to enter "his local bar" and do a robbery without being recognized. So Det. Miller's theory, at the time, was that Mr. Daniels helped plan and coordinated the robbery from the inside while acting like a customer. Det. Miller considered the idea that Mr. Daniels' job in the robbery was to communicate, via cell phone, with the heavier set suspect who was waiting outside.

Mr. Daniels agreed to sit down with Det. Miller to conduct an interview. Det. Miller conducted the interview inside his unmarked police vehicle where it was quiet and well lit. Det. Miller was wearing plain clothes without weapons, cuffs, etc, visible. Mr. Daniels was not under arrest, was not in handcuffs, and was free to leave or stop answering questions at any time. Det. Miller advised Mr. Daniels of his Miranda rights to which he stated that he understood. Mr. Daniels agreed to speak with Det. Miller. The interview was surreptitiously recorded and will be transcribed and made available to the court when necessary.

In summary, Mr. Daniels denied all knowledge or involvement in any robberies. He told Det. Miller that he was still on parole for a robbery that he'd already been to prison for. Mr. Daniels gave Det. Miller permission to search the content of his cell phone. It was Det. Miller's theory that there would be records on Mr. Daniels' phone showing that he'd called or texted the heavier set suspect right before he got up to go to the bathroom. The theory was that the text message would suggest to the other suspect that it was a good time to enter the business to do the robbery (maybe because there weren't many customers, etc). However, upon inspecting the phone, Det. Miller found that all call and text history had been deleted. Mr. Daniels indicated that having no history simply meant that he hadn't received or made any calls that day. This seemed very suspicious.

Det. Miller told Mr. Daniels that he fit the description of the suspect that had been robbing the other bars in the valley along with the heavier set Black male. Det. Miller even showed Mr. Daniels pictures from the other robberies to see how he would react. He continued to deny involvement in any robberies. Det. Miller asked Mr. Daniels for permission to take a sample of his DNA via buccal swabs. Mr. Daniels was made aware of the fact that he could refuse to give the sample and that it was completely up to him. Mr. Daniels was very willing to provide the sample which was collected via buccal swabs. Det. Miller impounded the buccal swabs as evidence that day.

During the interview, Mr. Daniels showed Det. Miller the vehicle he'd been driving that day. Parked outside the bar was a white four door 2006 Nissan Altima that looked just like the vehicle used in four of the eight described robberies. The vehicle had Nevada license plates 557-VSY, and was registered to Mr. Daniels' mother, Isabell Daniels. Mr. Daniels gave detectives permission to search the vehicle but nothing of interest was found. Crime Scene Analyst D. Carvouniaris took a photograph of Mr. Daniels' vehicle before he departed.

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A records check on Mr. Daniels revealed some additional suspicious factors. In 1996 and 1997, Mr. Daniels was an alleged witness in two other bar robberies (event # 961012-0315 and event # 971223-0235). From a robbery detective's point of view, being a victim/witness in three bar robberies is unlikely and suspicious. Furthermore, in 1998, Mr. Daniels was arrested after robbing the cashier's cage at the Ellis Island Casino located 4178 Koval Lane, Las Vegas, NV 89109 (armed robbery). In 1999, Mr. Daniels was arrested after robbing Pepe Muldoon's Bar located at 4341 N. Rancho Dr., Las Vegas, NV 89108. During the Pepe Muldoon's robbery, Mr. Daniels entered the bar and ordered a cup of coffee. After receiving the coffee, Mr. Daniels pulled out a gun and robbed the bartender. Mr. Daniels then made the bartender go to the bathroom and wait (sound familiar?). Mr. Daniels ultimately spent approximately eight years in prison for these robberies, and as of 11-14-09, he was still on parole (NV Parole and Probation Officer O'Connell). In ail, Mr. Daniels was a registered felon for Robbery with a Deadly Weapon - five counts (NV /2000), Burglary with a Deadly Weapon (NV / 2000), Robbery with a Deadly Weapon (NV / 2000), Robbery with a Deadly Weapon (NV / 2000), Robbery with a Deadly Weapon (NV / 2000). Attached to this arrest package are certified copies of Mr. Daniels' Judgements of Conviction (JOC's).

Based on the totality of these described facts and circumstances, it appeared as though Mr. Daniels was a likely suspect in the entire robbery series. He fit the description (based on statements and video surveillance), his car fit the description (based on statements and video surveillance), and he was on parole for committing similar crimes, to include a bar where he used the exact same modus operandi (ordered coffee, then robbed, then made victim wait in bathroom). For these reasons, Det. Miller requested that the LVMPD ROP (Repeat Offenders Program) unit follow Mr. Daniels for two reasons: To prevent or catch him in the act of committing similar crimes, and to see if he would lead the police to his co-conspirator (the heavier set suspect with prescription glasses).

The ROP unit, to include Det. Joe Giannone, P# 6225, began following Mr. Daniels around 11-17-09. On that date, the detectives observed Mr. Daniels meet with a Black male that they identified as Cary Pickett, ID# 0725059. Mr. Pickett was a Black male, 44 years old, 5'8", 205 Lbs, with a receding hairline, and listed as having corrective lenses per the Nevada Department of Motor Vehicles as of 07-2009. Mr. Pickett looked just like the heavier set suspect that Det. Miller had been looking for. The ROP detectives began following Mr. Pickett as well, and at one point, Det. Giannone observed Mr. Pickett wearing what appeared to be the exact same jacket that he wore during the Timbers Bar robbery. Det. Giannone, having observed the surveillance pictures from the described robberies, felt certain that Mr. Pickett was the heavier set suspect involved.

A records check on Mr. Pickett revealed that he was a registered felon for Attempt Concealed Weapon (NV / 1989), Attempt Grand Larceny (NV / 1991), Burglary (NV / 1992), Attempt Grand Larceny (NV / 1993), Escape of a Prisoner (NV / 1994), Grand Larceny (NV / 1997), Burglary (NV / 1997), and Transport of Controlled Substance (NV / 2007). Attached to this arrest package are certified copies of Mr. Pickett's Judgements of Conviction (JOC's).

In summary, the ROP unit tracked/followed Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett until mid January, 2010. They didn't catch them committing any additional crimes. In fact, to Det. Miller's knowledge, there hasn't been one other similar bar robbery in Clark County since the date of Mr. Daniels' interview on 11-14-09. Det. Miller showed Mr. Daniels the video surveillance on 11-14-09, and accused him of the crimes. It is believed that Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett were frightened after the interview and have been laying low ever since.

VIDEO SURVEILLANCE:

In short, as already mentioned, surveillance from seven of the eight described robberies was obtained. Based on the video surveillance and surrounding facts and circumstances, it was apparent that Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett were the suspects involved in the following incidents:

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PHONE RECORDS:

The investigation into Alan Daniels' and Cary Pickett's cell phone history is still on-going. However, the results so far would indicate that Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett were in contact with one another around the dates and times of several of the robberies. The Tenaya Lodge robbery was of particular interest, since Mr. Daniels would have one believe that he was simply a witness to the crime and not a principle suspect. As previously mentioned, Mr. Daniels allowed Det. Miller to look at his cell phone after the robbery, but his call history was suspiciously deleted. In fact, he indicated that a blank history simply meant that he hadn't made or received any calls that day (11-14-09). A witness, Sofia Lozano, observed Mr. Daniels messing around with his phone just prior to the robbery (possibly texting). A records check on Mr. Daniels' cell phone would indicate that he did contact Mr. Pickett via cell phone approximately two minutes before, and six minutes after, the robbery occurred at the Tenaya Lodge. In fact, he used his cell phone for multiple calls/texts on the morning of 11-14-09 (per records), but the cell history had been deleted. The following chart is a summary of Mr. Daniels' call history in relation to several of the described robberies (the investigation is on-going):

FORENSICS:

The crime scenes were processed for evidence in all eight of the robberies. Many of the robberies were committed in the same manner: The suspects would enter, act like customers, order drinks, and then commit the crimes. Mugs and bottles that the suspects drank from were located in at least at least four of the eight robberies. The following chart demonstrates the forensic results as they currently are, but the investigation is far from complete:

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For further details, please refer to the Crime Scene Reports, the Forensic Lab Requests, and the Forensic Lab Results (attached to the arrest package). It should be noted that a sample of Cary Pickett's DNA will need to be obtained for comparison purposes. Also, latent print comparisons are still pending.

ALAN DANIELS INTERVIEW:

As previously mentioned, Det. Miller first interviewed Alan Daniels on 11-14-09. Mr. Daniels denied involvement in all robberies. On 02-08-10, Alan Daniels was arrested for "Parole Violation" at the Nevada Parole and Probation Offices located at 628 Belrose St., Las Vegas, NV 89107 (partially because Officer O'Connell and Lt. Webb were aware of the fact that there was probable cause to believe Mr. Daniels had been committing these described robberies, therefore, violating his parole). On 02-10-10, Det. Miller conducted an interview with Mr. Daniels while he was still in custody at CCDC. The interview was surreptitiously recorded and will be transcribed and made available to the court when necessary. Det. Miller advised Mr. Daniels of his Miranda rights to which he stated that he understood. Mr. Daniels agreed to speak with Det. Miller "for a few minutes." After Det. Miller explained that Mr. Daniels was a suspect in at least seven business robberies, he (Daniels) asked for a lawyer. The interview was stopped at that time.

CARY PICKETT INTERVIEW:

Det. Miller felt that there was probable cause to believe that Cary Pickett was the heavier set suspect involved in these described robberies (based on matching suspect descriptions, video surveillance, photo line-ups, phone records, and other circumstantial factors). On 02-11-10, Det. Miller provided a briefing on the incident to Det. Rory Neslund, P# 4373, from the Career Apprehension Team (CAT's). At approximately 1100 hours, Det. Neslund, along with other detectives in his unit, found Mr. Pickett eating lunch in his car (Ford Mustang) at 3025 W. Sahara, Las Vegas, NV 89102. Det. Neslund took Mr. Pickett into custody and transported him to the LVMPD robbery office where he was handed over to Det. Dave Miller.

Det. Miller conducted a digitally recorded interview with Mr. Pickett. Det. Miller advised Mr. Pickett of his Miranda rights to which he stated that he understood. Mr. Pickett agreed to speak with Det. Miller. Det. Miller told Mr. Pickett that he was under arrest for involvement in a bar robbery series. Det. Miller explained that the co-defendant (Alan Daniels) was already in custody for the crimes. Mr. Pickett denied any involvement in the bar robberies and claimed to be completely innocent. Mr. Pickett said that he would be willing to voluntarily participate in a polygraph examination.

Det. Miller transported Mr. Pickett to the LVMPD personnel office where Polygraph Examiner G. Flohr, P# 12912, gave Mr. Pickett a polygraph examination (Concealed Information Test). While speaking with Examiner Flohr, Mr. Pickett admitted that he knew Alan Daniels (the co-defendant). Mr. Pickett said that he'd known Mr. Daniels since they were about 12 years old, and that they'd even been to prison together. For investigative purposes, the questioning during the polygraph examination was focused primarily on the Rae's Bar robbery reported under Henderson event # 09-23087. Part way into the examination, Mr. Picket said that he didn't want to continue. The polygraph was immediately stopped, but Mr. Pickett said that he was still willing to talk to detectives. Enough of the polygraph had already been completed for Examiner Flohr to conclude that Mr. Picket had failed. The examination results showed that Mr. Pickett did have intimate knowledge about the robbery that only an actual suspect would. Examiner Flohr told Mr. Pickett that he'd failed the exam and that there was no doubt that he (Pickett) had intimate involvement/knowledge about the robberies (Rae's Bar). Mr. Pickett asked for an attorney at that time and the interview was concluded.

For the complete details regarding the polygraph examination/interview, please refer to the report which will be completed by Polygraph Examiner G. Flohr.

Two additional things of interest regarding Cary Pickett's arrest. First, his physical description, including the prescription eye glasses fit perfectly to the heavier set suspect involved in these robberies. Mr. Pickett even had a gap in his upper teeth as described by some victims. Second, Mr. Pickett said that he and Alan Daniels have known each other since they were 12 years old (over 30 years). Det. Miller previously interviewed Alan Daniels and showed him surveillance pictures of Cary Pickett. Mr. Daniels said that he didn't recognize the male pictured. If Mr. Daniels and Mr.

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Pickett have known each other for 30 years, they would likely recognize one another. It was apparent that Mr. Daniels was dishonest during the interview.

CONCLUSION

Based on the totality of the above described facts and circumstances, there is probable cause to believe that Alan Daniels and Cary Pickett are the two principle suspects involved with the described robbery series.

In these described incidents, the suspects entered occupied structures (bars/pubs) with concealed firearms and then pointed their weapons at customers and employees while demanding money and cell phones. In each of these incidents, the victims complied with the suspects' orders and provided money (and cell phones in some cases). The suspects then frequently forced the victims and customers to lie down on the ground in the back of the businesses (frequently the bathroom). The victim's complied in each of these incidents because the suspects placed them in fear for their lives. The suspects were ultimately identified as Alan Daniels and Cary Pickett. Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett are convicted felons, each registered for multiple offenses. For further details on their conviction records, please refer to the section of this report titled, "Suspects Identified." Also, attached to this arrest package are the Judgements of Conviction for each defendant.

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
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Based on the totality of these described facts and circumstances, there is also probable cause to believe that Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett conspired to commit these crimes, intending to enter the businesses and ultimately rob the victims. One might argue that Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett entered the bars and ordered drinks like normal customers, and only decided to commit the crimes as almost an afterthought (no conspiracy or premeditated intent). If only one bar robbery had occurred in this manner, it might be a reasonable explanation. However, eight robberies occurred, nearly all of them carried out by the suspects in the same exact manner (ex-felons entered the bars with concealed firearms, acted like customers, drank, gambled, and then robbed). It would appear that the suspects did conspire, plan, and carry out the crimes in unison. As previously stated, this isn't the first time that Alan Daniels has committed a robbery in this manner. He robbed another bar back in 1999 in the exact same manner (convicted and sent to prison).

The actions of Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett meet the criminal elements of Robbery with a Deadly Weapon (multiple counts), Burglary with a Deadly Weapon (multiple counts), Ex-Felon Possession of a Firearm (multiple counts - JOC's attached to arrest report), Conspiracy to Commit Robbery (multiple counts), and Conspiracy to Commit Burglary (multiple counts). It should be noted that this arrest package is only regarding Cary Pickett. Alan Daniels' parole was violated (as a result of these robberies) and he was booked at CCDC on 02-08-10 (for parole violation). Det. Miller re-booked Mr. Daniels for these described robbery charges on 02-10-10.

BAR ROBBERY SERIES SYNOPSIS:

Between 07-04-09 and 11-14-09, there were eight bar robberies throughout Clark County, Nevada, that were determined to be related based on similar suspect descriptions, modus operandi, video surveillance, forensic evidence, and circumstantial evidence (trier of facts). The primary two suspects involved in the robberies were identified as Alan Daniels, ID# 747918, and Cary Pickett, ID# 725059. The following chart serves as a summary/synopsis of the eight robberies in question:

BAILEY'S BAR ROBBERY - LVMPD EVENT # 090704-0926:

On 07-04-09, at approximately 0610 hours, the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department (LVMPD) received an emergency phone call regarding a robbery that had just occurred at the Bailey's Sports Bar located at 4341 N. Rancho Dr., Las Vegas, NV 89130. Several officers responded to the robbery under event # 090704-0926, to include Officer S. Fox, P# 9485. Upon arrival, officers made contact with the victim/bartender, identified as David Edwards, DOB: 08-07-70. The following is a summation of the crime based on Mr. Edwards' statements, video surveillance, and officer observations.

Mr. Edwards was working inside the bar alone when the suspect arrived in what appeared to be a White Sedan. The suspect backed the vehicle into a stall which Mr. Edwards thought was a bit suspicious. The suspect entered the business, sat down, and ordered a couple beers. The suspect drank his beers and played video poker for approximately fifteen minutes before he stood up and pulled out a black semi-automatic handgun that he'd concealed in his waistband. The suspect pointed the gun at Mr. Edwards, worked the action (put a bullet in the chamber) and then said, "Let's do it." At the suspect's request, Mr. Edwards opened the cash registers. The suspect stole approximately \$2200.00 (U.S. currency) before making Mr. Edwards go the bathroom and wait. After several minutes, Mr. Edwards looked out of the bathroom to discover that the suspect had already fled. Mr. Edwards described the suspect as a Black male, 30-35 years old, approximately 5'10", 165 Lbs, wearing a red baseball cap.

A crime report was completed to document the incident, and Mr. Edwards wrote a voluntary statement. Crime Scene Analyst Robbie Dahn, P# 5947, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. Of particular interest, CSA Dahn recovered the two beer bottles that the suspect drank from prior to the robbery. A copy of the video surveillance was ultimately obtained and is with the case file (still shots only). The quality of the video is extremely poor, but does show a picture of the suspect wearing a baseball styled hat.

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INN ZONE BAR ROBBERY - LVMPD EVENT # 09831-0560:

On 08-31-09, at approximately 0416 hours, the LVMPD received an emergency phone call regarding a robbery that had just occurred at the Inn Zone Bar located at 238 S. Rainbow Blvd., Las Vegas, NV 89128. Several officers responded to the robbery under event # 090831-0560, to include Officer B. Fortner, P# 13152. Upon arrival, the officers made contact with the victim/bartender, identified as Crystal Earhart, DOB: 05-18-64. The following is a summation of the crime based on Mrs. Earhart's statements, video surveillance, and officer observations.

Mrs. Earhart was working inside the bar alone when the suspect arrived, sat down, and ordered a beer. The suspect drank the beer as well a water (from a bottle) that he'd brought with him. After a couple hours went by, the suspect pulled out a black handgun, hit a surveillance camera (to change the view) and then pointed the weapon at Mrs. Earhart's back while demanding money from the registers. Mrs. Earhart complied and the suspect stole approximately \$630.00 (U.S. currency) from two cash registers before forcing Mrs. Earhart to wait in the bathroom. Using a rag from the bar, the suspect made an attempt to wipe off his fingerprints from the beer bottle he'd been drinking from. The suspect then left the bar. Mrs. Earhart described the suspect as a Black male, 30-39 years old, approximately 5'10" to 6'0", 170 Lbs, bald, wearing a black Reebok baseball cap.

A crime report was completed to document the incident, and Mrs. Earhart wrote a voluntary statement. Crime Scene Analyst Shelly Shrum, P# 7917, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. Of particular interest, CSA Shrum recovered swabs of possible DNA from the mouths of the "Niagra" water bottle and "Budweiser" beer bottle that the suspect drank from prior to the robbery. A copy of the video surveillance was ultimately obtained and is with the case file. The quality of the video surveillance is relatively good, showing pictures of the suspect and his actions.

BEANO'S BAR ROBBERY - LVMPD EVENT # 091011-0978:

On 10-11-09, at approximately 0645 hours, the LVMPD received an emergency phone call regarding a robbery that had just occurred at the Beano's Bar located at 7200 W. Lake Mead, Las Vegas, NV 89149. Several officers responded to the robbery under event # 091011-0978, to include Officer J. Bledsoe, P# 8300. Upon arrival, the officers made contact with two employees/victims, identified as Michael Cosgrove, DOB: 02-17-52, and Gregory Shealian, DOB: 01-22-63. There was also one witness that was identified as Darion Cook, DOB: 04-16-88. The following is a summation of the crime based on victim/witness statements, video surveillance, and officer observations.

Mr. Cosgrove and Mr. Shealian were working inside the bar when two Black male suspects entered, sat down, and ordered a coffee and beer (Heineken). One suspect was tall and thin (6'1", 180 Lbs), wearing a baseball cap, while the other was shorter and heavyset (5'10", 200 Lbs), with gaps in his teeth, and wearing gold wire prescription eye glasses. The suspects ordered some chips and salsa, but then complained that the chips were stale. Mr. Cosgrove took the chips to the back of the business to ask the cook, Mr. Shealian, about the problem. The suspect with the glasses followed Mr. Cosgrove to the back of the business and pulled out a black semi-automatic handgun. The suspect pointed the weapon at Mr. Cosgrove and Mr. Shealian and forced them to lie down on the ground. The suspect then stole Mr. Cosgrove's money clip containing his identification and miscellaneous credit cards.

The two suspects then stole approximately \$7250.00 (U.S. currency) from the cash registers and tip jar before fleeing from the business. There were two customers inside the business at the time of the crime: Darion Cook and his cousin who was not identified. Mr. Cook saw the suspects and thought they looked suspicious, but he didn't know that they'd actually robbed the business until after they were already gone. Mr. Cook remembered the suspects arriving in a white Nissan Altima styled vehicle.

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A crime report was completed to document the incident, and voluntary statements were written by Mr. Cosgrove, Mr. Shealian, and Mr. Cook. Crime Scene Analyst E. Taylor, P# 9619, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. Of particular interest, CSA Shrum recovered a swab of possible DNA from a coffee mug that one of the suspects drank from prior to the robbery. A copy of the video surveillance was ultimately obtained and impounded as evidence. The quality of the video surveillance is relatively good, showing pictures of the suspects and their actions.

ROADRUNNER SALOON ROBBERY - LVMPD EVENT # 091023-0605:

On 10-23-09, at approximately 0500 hours, the LVMPD received an emergency phone call regarding a robbery that had just occurred at the Roadrunner Saloon located at 5990 Centennial Center Blvd., Las Vegas, NV 89149. Several officers responded to the robbery under event # 091023-0605, to include Officer J. Larosa, P# 13448. Upon arrival, the officers made contact with the victim/bartender, identified as Justin Sanchez, DOB: 11-27-80. The following is a summation of the crime based on Mr. Sanchez's statements, video surveillance, and officer observations.

Mr. Sanchez was working alone when two Black male suspects entered the bar, sat down, and ordered coffee. The suspects began playing the slots until everyone else in the bar left (cleaning crew). One suspect was described as tall and thin (6'4", 195 Lbs), wearing a baseball cap, while the other was described as shorter and heavyset (5'8", 225 Lbs), wearing prescription eye glasses. One of the suspects cashed out on his slot machine which required Mr. Sanchez to open the cash register to provide change. While doing so, the suspect with the glasses walked behind the counter with a gun pointed at Mr. Sanchez. The suspect ordered Mr. Sanchez to leave the cash drawer open and he directed him around the bar to the second suspect. The second suspect (the taller one) then pointed a gun at Mr. Sanchez and forced him to lie down in the bathroom. The taller suspect also stole Mr. Sanchez's Palm Pre cell phone.

The suspects stole approximately \$3900.00 (U.S. currency) before using a green rag to wipe down the areas where they'd touched (bar, slots, etc.). The suspects stole the coffee mugs and spoons they drank from before fleeing from the business.

A crime report was completed to document the incident, and Mr. Sanchez wrote a voluntary statement. Crime Scene Analysts D. Brotherson, P# 4931, and J. Maldonado, P# 6920, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. Det. Dave Miller, P# 6627, responded to assist with the investigation. Det. Miller considered the possibility that the suspects may have discarded the stolen coffee mugs, spoons, etc. a short time after the robbery. It seemed apparent that the items were only taken so as to prevent the police from gathering additional evidence (DNA, latent prints, etc.). Det. Miller searched the immediate areas around the Roadrunner Saloon but found nothing of interest. Det. Miller tried to determine the streets the suspects may have fled on after the crime. From the business, Det. Miller drove north on Centennial Center, then east on Azure. Between 7445 Azure and 7485 Azure, on the south side of the street, Det. Miller located a green rag, two glass mugs (broken), a metal spoon, a grey box cutter, and Mr. Sanchez's stolen Palm Pre (cell phone). The Roadrunner Saloon manager, Shawn Olsen, positively identified the coffee mugs and spoon as items belonging to their

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business. Det. Miller took digital photographs of all the items and recovered them while wearing latex gloves. The items were impounded as evidence. Det. Miller ultimately obtained a sample of Mr. Sanchez's DNA, via buccal swabs, for comparisons/eliminations. A copy of the video surveillance was ultimately obtained and is with the case file. The quality of the video surveillance is relatively good, showing pictures of the suspects and their actions.







Roadrunner Saloon Robbery Suspects

TRIPLE BAR ROBBERY - NORTH LAS VEGAS EVENT # 09-026503:

On 11-07-09, at approximately 0618 hours, the North Las Vegas Police Department received an emergency phone call regarding a robbery that had just occurred at the Triple Bar located at 4420 N. Decatur Blvd., North Las Vegas, NV, 89030. Several officers responded to the robbery under event # 09-026503, to include Officer S. Noahr, P# 1861. Upon arrival, the officers made contact with the victim/bartender, identified as George Mattie, DOB: 03-13-69, and one witness identified as Joe Berens, DOB: 05-29-47. The following is a summation of the crime based on victim/witness statements, video surveillance, and officer observations.

The two Black male suspects arrived at the bar in a white, newer modeled, Nissan Altima styled vehicle (per video surveillance). They backed the vehicle into a parking stall near the front of the business. Mr. Mattie was working alone when the suspects entered the bar. The first suspect was described as tall and skinny (6'0", 170 Lbs), wearing a baseball cap, while the other suspect was described as shorter and heavy set (5'10", 215 Lbs) wearing prescription eye glasses. The suspects sat down and began playing the slots. The taller suspect ordered a Heineken beer while the suspect wearing glasses ordered a coffee. After about fifteen minutes, the suspects stood up and pulled out small framed handguns. The suspects demanded money from the cash register, and Mr. Mattie complied, handing them approximately \$4200.00 (U.S. currency). The two suspects then forced Mr. Mattie and a customer, Mr. Berens, to wait in the bathroom. The suspects then fled from the bar in the same white Nissan sedan.

A crime report was completed to document the incident, and voluntary statements were written by Mr. Mattie and Mr. Berens. Crime Scene Analysts R. Wanta, P# 1694, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. A copy of the video surveillance was ultimately obtained and is currently in the possession of the North Las Vegas Police Department. The quality of the video surveillance is relatively good, showing pictures of the suspects and their actions.

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RAE'S BAR ROBBERY - HENDERSON EVENT # 09-23087:

On 11-11-09, at approximately 0313 hours, the LVMPD received an emergency phone call regarding a robbery that had just occurred at the Rae's Bar located at 2531 Wigwam Pkwy., Henderson, NV 89012. Several officers responded to the robbery under event # 09-23087, to include Officer B. Hyde, P# 1734. Upon arrival, the officers made contact with the victim/bartender, identified as Delton Lema, DOB: 02-20-76, and several other witnesses identified as Raymond Ficklin, DOB: 04-30-78, Teresa Titus, DOB: 01-23-78, William McDaniels, DOB: 06-09-77, Stephanie McKay, DOB; 08-26-83, and Joan Morris, DOB: 06-18-35. The following is a summation of the crime based on victim/witness statements, video surveillance, and officer observations.

On 11-09-09, around 0400 hours, the two suspects arrived at the bar and parked a white Nissan styled sedan in the parking lot. The suspects tried to enter the business but found the doors locked. The bartender didn't buzz them in because he thought that they were suspicious. The suspects finally departed in their vehicle.

On 11-11-09, at approximately 0313 hours, the same suspects returned to the bar, in the same vehicle, but a White female accompanied them as well. The bartender, Delton Lema, checked the female's identification and remembered that it was issued in California, and that the female's year of birth was 1987. The three suspects sat down at the bar, ordered three beers, and began playing the slots. The first Black male suspect was described as tall and thin (6'0", 185 Lbs) wearing a baseball cap, while the second Black male suspect was described as shorter and heavy set (5'8", 210 Lbs) with a gap in his teeth and wearing prescription eye glasses. The female suspect was described as 22 years old, 5'3", with long brown/black hair, wearing a black fedora styled hat.

About 45 minutes went by before the taller suspect pulled out a semi-automatic handgun and pointed it at Mr. Lema while demanding money from the cash registers. At the same time, the suspect wearing glasses pointed a handgun at all the other witnesses and forced them into the bathroom. Mr. Lema complied with the suspect's request and provided them with approximately \$1550.00 (U.S. currency). The suspect then forced Mr. Lema to wait in the bathroom with all the other customers/witnesses. The suspects took the beer bottles they'd used and fled from the bar in the same white Nissan styled sedan.

A crime report was completed to document the incident, and voluntary statements were written by Mr. Lema, Mrs. Titus, Mr. McDaniels, Mrs. McKay, and Mr. Ficklin. Crime Scene Analysts J. Self, P# 1370, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. A copy of the video surveillance was ultimately obtained and is currently in the possession of the Henderson Police Department (LVMPD Det. Dave Miller also has a copy with the case file). The quality of the video surveillance is relatively good, showing pictures of the suspects and their actions.

BAR ROBBERY SERIES SYNOPSIS:

Between 07-04-09 and 11-14-09, there were eight bar robberies throughout Clark County, Nevada, that were determined to be related based on similar suspect descriptions, modus operandi, video surveillance, forensic evidence, and circumstantial evidence (trier of facts). The primary two suspects involved in the robberies were identified as Alan Daniels, ID# 747918, and Cary Pickett, ID# 725059. The following chart serves as a summary/synopsis of the eight robberies in question:

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BAILEY'S BAR ROBBERY - LVMPD EVENT # 090704-0926:

On 07-04-09, at approximately 0610 hours, the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department (LVMPD) received an emergency phone call regarding a robbery that had just occurred at the Bailey's Sports Bar located at 4341 N. Rancho Dr., Las Vegas, NV 89130. Several officers responded to the robbery under event # 090704-0926, to include Officer S. Fox, P# 9485. Upon arrival, officers made contact with the victim/bartender, identified as David Edwards, DOB: 08-07-70. The following is a summation of the crime based on Mr. Edwards' statements, video surveillance, and officer observations.

Mr. Edwards was working inside the bar alone when the suspect arrived in what appeared to be a White Sedan. The suspect backed the vehicle into a stall which Mr. Edwards thought was a bit suspicious. The suspect entered the business, sat down, and ordered a couple beers. The suspect drank his beers and played video poker for approximately fifteen minutes before he stood up and pulled out a black semi-automatic handgun that he'd concealed in his waistband. The suspect pointed the gun at Mr. Edwards, worked the action (put a bullet in the chamber) and then said, "Let's do it." At the suspect's request, Mr. Edwards opened the cash registers. The suspect stole approximately \$2200.00 (U.S. currency) before making Mr. Edwards go the bathroom and wait. After several minutes, Mr. Edwards looked out of the bathroom to discover that the suspect had already fled. Mr. Edwards described the suspect as a Black male, 30-35 years old, approximately 5'10", 165 Lbs, wearing a red baseball cap.

A crime report was completed to document the incident, and Mr. Edwards wrote a voluntary statement. Crime Scene Analyst Robbie Dahn, P# 5947, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. Of particular interest, CSA Dahn recovered the two beer bottles that the suspect drank from prior to the robbery. The incident was recorded on a video surveillance system, however, the surveillance tape was never recovered apparently, and as of 02-10-10, its whereabouts is still unknown.

INN ZONE BAR ROBBERY - LVMPD EVENT # 09831-0560:

On 08-31-09, at approximately 0416 hours, the LVMPD received an emergency phone call regarding a robbery that had just occurred at the Inn Zone Bar located at 238 S. Rainbow Blvd., Las Vegas, NV 89128. Several officers responded to the robbery under event # 090831-0560, to include Officer B. Fortner, P# 13152. Upon arrival, the officers made contact with the victim/bartender, identified as Crystal Earhart, DOB: 05-18-64. The following is a summation of the crime based on Mrs. Earhart's statements, video surveillance, and officer observations.

Mrs. Earhart was working inside the bar alone when the suspect arrived, sat down, and ordered a beer. The suspect drank the beer as well a water (from a bottle) that he'd brought with him. After a couple hours went by, the suspect back while demanding money from the registers. Mrs. Earhart complied and the suspect stole approximately \$630.00 (U.S. currency) from two cash registers before forcing Mrs. Earhart to wait in the bathroom. Using a rag from the bar, the suspect made an attempt to wipe off his fingerprints from the beer bottle he'd been drinking from. The suspect then left the bar. Mrs. Earhart described the suspect as a Black male, 30-39 years old, approximately 5'10" to 6'0", 170 Lbs, bald, wearing a black Reebok baseball cap.

A crime report was completed to document the incident, and Mrs. Earhart wrote a voluntary statement. Crime Scene Analyst Shelly Shrum, P# 7917, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. Of particular interest, CSA Shrum recovered swabs of possible DNA from the mouths of the "Niagra" water bottle and "Budweiser" beer bottle that the suspect drank from prior to the robbery. A copy of the video surveillance was ultimately obtained and is with the case file. The quality of the video surveillance is relatively good, showing pictures of the suspect and his actions.

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BEANO'S BAR ROBBERY - LVMPD EVENT # 091011-0978:

On 10-11-09, at approximately 0645 hours, the LVMPD received an emergency phone call regarding a robbery that had just occurred at the Beano's Bar located at 7200 W. Lake Mead, Las Vegas, NV 89149. Several officers responded to the robbery under event # 091011-0978, to include Officer J. Bledsoe, P# 8300. Upon arrival, the officers made contact with two employees/victims, identified as Michael Cosgrove, DOB: 02-17-52, and Gregory Shealian, DOB: 01-22-63. There was also one witness that was identified as Darion Cook, DOB: 04-16-88. The following is a summation of the crime based on victim/witness statements, video surveillance, and officer observations.

Mr. Cosgrove and Mr. Shealian were working inside the bar when two Black male suspects entered, sat down, and ordered a coffee and beer (Heineken). One suspect was tall and thin (6'1", 180 Lbs), wearing a baseball cap, while the other was shorter and heavyset (5'10", 200 Lbs), with gaps in his teeth, and wearing gold wire prescription eye glasses. The suspects ordered some chips and salsa, but then complained that the chips were stale. Mr. Cosgrove took the chips to the back of the business to ask the cook, Mr. Shealian, about the problem. The suspect with the glasses followed Mr. Cosgrove to the back of the business and pulled out a black semi-automatic handgun. The suspect pointed the weapon at Mr. Cosgrove and Mr. Shealian and forced them to lie down on the ground. The suspect then stole Mr. Cosgrove's money clip containing his identification and miscellaneous credit cards. The two suspects then stole approximately \$7250.00 (U.S. currency) from the cash registers and tip jar before fleeing from the business. There were two customers inside the business at the time of the crime: Darion Cook and his cousin who was not identified. Mr. Cook saw the suspects and thought they looked suspicious, but he didn't know that they'd actually robbed the business until after they were already gone. Mr. Cook remembered the suspects arriving in a white Nissan Altima styled vehicle.

A crime report was completed to document the incident, and voluntary statements were written by Mr. Cosgrove, Mr. Shealian, and Mr. Cook. Crime Scene Analyst E. Taylor, P# 9619, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. Of particular interest, CSA Shrum recovered a swab of possible DNA from a coffee mug that one of the suspects drank from prior to the robbery. A copy of the video surveillance was ultimately obtained and impounded as evidence. The quality of the video surveillance is relatively good, showing pictures of the suspects and their actions.

ROADRUNNER SALOON ROBBERY - LVMPD EVENT # 091023-0605:

On 10-23-09, at approximately 0500 hours, the LVMPD received an emergency phone call regarding a robbery that had just occurred at the Roadrunner Saloon located at 5990 Centennial Center Blvd., Las Vegas, NV 89149. Several officers responded to the robbery under event # 091023-0605, to include Officer J. Larosa, P# 13448. Upon arrival, the officers made contact with the victim/bartender, identified as Justin Sanchez, DOB: 11-27-80. The following is a summation of the crime based on Mr. Sanchez's statements, video surveillance, and officer observations.

Mr. Sanchez was working alone when two Black male suspects entered the bar, sat down, and ordered coffee. The suspects began playing the slots until everyone else in the bar left (cleaning crew). One suspect was described as tall and thin (6'4", 195 Lbs), wearing a baseball cap, while the other was described as shorter and heavyset (5'8", 225 Lbs), wearing prescription eye glasses. One of the suspects cashed out on his slot machine which required Mr. Sanchez to open the cash register to provide change. While doing so, the suspect with the glasses walked behind the counter with a guir.

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pointed at Mr. Sanchez. The suspect ordered Mr. Sanchez to leave the cash drawer open and he directed him around the bar to the second suspect. The second suspect (the taller one) then pointed a gun at Mr. Sanchez and forced him to lie down in the bathroom. The taller suspect also stole Mr. Sanchez's Palm Pre cell phone.

The suspects stole approximately \$3900.00 (U.S. currency) before using a green rag to wipe down the areas where they'd touched (bar, slots, etc.). The suspects stole the coffee mugs and spoons they drank from before fleeing from the business.

A crime report was completed to document the incident, and Mr. Sanchez wrote a voluntary statement. Crime Scene Analysts D. Brotherson, P# 4931, and J. Maldonado, P# 6920, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. Det. Dave Miller, P# 6627, responded to assist with the investigation. Det. Miller considered the possibility that the suspects may have discarded the stolen coffee mugs, spoons, etc. a short time after the robbery. It seemed apparent that the items were only taken so as to prevent the police from gathering additional evidence (DNA, latent prints, etc.). Det. Miller searched the immediate areas around the Roadrunner Saloon but found nothing of interest. Det. Miller tried to determine the streets the suspects may have fled on after the crime. From the business, Det. Miller drove north on Centennial Center, two glass mugs (broken), a metal spoon, a grey box cutter, and Mr. Sanchez's stolen Palm Pre (cell phone). The Roadrunner Saloon manager, Shawn Olsen, positively identified the coffee mugs and spoon as items belonging to their business. Det. Miller took digital photographs of all the items and recovered them while wearing latex gloves. The items were impounded as evidence. Det. Miller ultimately obtained a sample of Mr. Sanchez's DNA, via buccal swabs, for comparisons/eliminations. A copy of the video surveillance was ultimately obtained and is with the case file. The quality of the video surveillance is relatively good, showing pictures of the suspects and their actions.







Roadrunner Saloon Robbery Suspects

TRIPLE BAR ROBBERY - NORTH LAS VEGAS EVENT # 09-026503:

On 11-07-09, at approximately 0618 hours, the North Las Vegas Police Department received an emergency phone call regarding a robbery that had just occurred at the Triple Bar located at 4420 N. Decatur Blvd., North Las Vegas, NV, 89030. Several officers responded to the robbery under event # 09-026503, to include Officer S. Noahr, P# 1861. Upon arrival, the officers made contact with the victim/bartender, identified as George Mattie, DOB: 03-13-69, and one witness video surveillance, and officer observations.

The two Black male suspects arrived at the bar in a white, newer modeled, Nissan Altima styled vehicle (per video surveillance). They backed the vehicle into a parking stall near the front of the business. Mr. Mattie was working alone when the suspects entered the bar. The first suspect was described as tall and skinny (6'0", 170 Lbs), wearing a baseball cap, while the other suspect was described as shorter and heavy set (5'10", 215 Lbs) wearing prescription eye glasses. The suspects sat down and began playing the slots. The taller suspect ordered a Heineken beer while the suspect wearing glasses ordered a coffee. After about fifteen minutes, the suspects stood up and pulled out small framed handguns. The suspects demanded money from the cash register, and Mr. Mattie complied, handing them approximately \$4200.00 (U.S. currency). The two suspects then forced Mr. Mattie and a customer, Mr. Berens, to wait in the bathroom. The suspects then fled from the bar in the same white Nissan sedan.

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A crime report was completed to document the incident, and voluntary statements were written by Mr. Mattie and Mr. Berens. Crime Scene Analysts R. Wanta, P# 1694, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. A copy of the video surveillance was ultimately obtained and is currently in the possession of the North Las Vegas Police Department. The quality of the video surveillance is relatively good, showing pictures of the suspects and their actions.

Upon arrival, the officers made contact with the victim/bartender, identified as Delton Lema, DOB: 02-20-76, and several other witnesses identified as Raymond Ficklin, DOB: 04-30-78, Teresa Titus, DOB: 01-23-78, William McDaniels, DOB: 06-09-77, Stephanie McKay, DOB; 08-26-83, and Joan Morris, DOB: 06-18-35. The following is a summation of the crime based on victim/witness statements, video surveillance, and officer observations.

On 11-09-09, around 0400 hours, the two suspects arrived at the bar and parked a white Nissan styled sedan in the parking lot. The suspects tried to enter the business but found the doors locked. The bartender didn't buzz them in because he thought that they were suspicious. The suspects finally departed in their vehicle.

On 11-11-09, at approximately 0313 hours, the same suspects returned to the bar, in the same vehicle, but a White female accompanied them as well. The bartender, Delton Lema, checked the female's identification and remembered that it was issued in California, and that the female's year of birth was 1987. The three suspects sat down at the bar, ordered three beers, and began playing the slots. The first Black male suspect was described as tall and thin (6'0", 185 Lbs) wearing a baseball cap, while the second Black male suspect was described as shorter and heavy set (5'8", 210 Lbs) with a gap in his teeth and wearing prescription eye glasses. The female suspect was described as 22 years old, 5'3", with long brown/black hair, wearing a black fedora styled hat.

About 45 minutes went by before the taller suspect pulled out a semi-automatic handgun and pointed it at Mr. Lema while demanding money from the cash registers. At the same time, the suspect wearing glasses pointed a handgun at all the other witnesses and forced them into the bathroom. Mr. Lema complied with the suspect's request and provided them with approximately \$1550.00 (U.S. currency). The suspect then forced Mr. Lema to wait in the bathroom with all the other customers/witnesses. The suspects took the beer bottles they'd used and fled from the bar in the same white Nissan styled sedan.

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A crime report was completed to document the incident, and voluntary statements were written by Mr. Lema, Mrs. Titus, Mr. McDaniels, Mrs. McKay, and Mr. Ficklin. Crime Scene Analysts J. Self, P# 1370, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. A copy of the video surveillance was ultimately obtained and is currently in the possession of the Henderson Police Department (LVMPD Det. Dave Miller also has a copy with the case file). The quality of the video surveillance is relatively good, showing pictures of the suspects and their actions.

TIMBER'S BAR ROBBERY - LVMPD EVENT # 091113-0506:

On 11-13-09, at approximately 0343 hours, the LVMPD received an emergency phone call regarding a robbery that had just occurred at the Timbers Bar located at 7240 W. Azure, Las Vegas, NV 89130. Several officers responded to the robbery under event # 091113-0506, to include Officer J. Larosa, P# 13448. Upon arrival, the officers made contact with the victim/bartender, identified as Aaron Parduhm, DOB: 05-03-74, and one witness (off duty bartender), identified as Jennifer Favier, DOB: 03-03-83. The following is a summation of the crime based on victim/witness statements, video surveillance, and officer observations.

Mr. Parduhm was working inside the bar while talking with an off duty bartender, Mrs. Favier. A Black male suspect entered the bar and walked directly up to Mr. Parduhm and Mrs. Favier with a black semi-automatic pistol in his hand. The suspect worked the action on the firearm (loading the weapon) and then pointed it at Mr. Parduhm and Mrs. Favier while removed approximately \$1550.00 (U.S. currency) and forced Mr. Parduhm and Mrs. Favier to go to the men's bathroom and lie down on the floor. Mr. Parduhm and Mrs. Favier waited a few minutes and then exited the bathroom to find the suspect gone. The suspect was described as a Black male, approximately 40 to 45 years old, 5'10", 230 Lbs, and wearing prescription eye glasses.

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A crime report was completed to document the incident, and voluntary statements were written by Mr. Parduhm and Mrs. Favier. Crime Scene Analyst D. Ford, P# 4244, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. A copy of the video surveillance was ultimately obtained and is with Det. Dave Miller's case file. The quality of the video surveillance is relatively good, showing pictures of the suspect and his actions.

TENAYA LODGE BAR ROBBERY - LVMPD EVENT # 091114-0728:

On 11-14-09, at approximately 0545 hours, the LVMPD received an emergency phone call regarding a robbery that had just occurred at the Tenaya Lodge located at 5717 Sky Pointe Dr., Las Vegas, NV 89136. Several officers responded to the robbery under event # 091114-0728, to include Officer H. Crosby, P# 6827, and Officer A. Hubbard, P# 13980. Upon arrival, the officers made contact with the victim/bartender, identified as Joshua Kiehl, DOB: 08-13-77. There were also the total contact with the victim/bartender, and Alan Daniels, DOB: 10-11-65. The following is a summation of the crime based on victim/witness statements and officer observations.

Mr. Kiehl was working in the bar serving customers Sofia Lozano and Alan Daniels around the time of the crime. Mr. Daniels got up and went to the restroom leaving Mr. Kiehl alone with Mrs. Lozano. At that time, a Black male suspect entered the bar and worked the action on a pistol which he had in his hand (loading the weapon). The suspect pointed the handgun at Mr. Kiehl and Mrs. Lozano while demanding money from the cash registers. Mr. Kiehl complied and opened the cash drawers. The suspect then forced Mr. Kiehl down on the floor and stole approximately \$1000.00 from the register before fleeing from the business. After the robbery was over, Mr. Daniels came out of the bathroom and acted like he didn't know what happened. The suspect was described as a Black male, 30-35 years old, with a heavy build.

A crime report was completed to document the incident, and Mr. Kiehl wrote a voluntary statement. Mrs. Lozano appeared to be slightly intoxicated and was not entirely cooperative with the arriving officers. After Mrs. Lozano provided a verbal statement, she left the business. Det. Dave Miller, P# 6627, responded to assist with the investigation. Det. Miller conducted a digitally recorded interview with Mr. Daniels. For further details about the interview with Mr. Daniels, please see the section of this report below, titled, "Investigation." Crime Scene Analyst D. Carvouniaris, P# 12712, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. The Tenaya Lodge did not have a functioning video surveillance system at the time of the robbery.

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INVESTIGATION

SUSPECTS IDENTIFIED:

As briefly mentioned in the synopsis portion of this report, the eight robberies were determined to be related for several reasons. Out of all the victims to choose from, the suspects selected <u>businesses</u> to victimize, and more specifically <u>bars/pubs</u>. The suspects would often enter the businesses and act like customers, ordering drinks and playing the slots. The suspects, particularly during the early stages of the series, would often wait patiently for other patrons to leave the business before committing the crime.

There are many manners in which to commit a robbery, but these suspects used handguns every time. They pointed their weapons at employees and sometimes patrons, controlling everyone's actions and often inquiring about the whereabouts of personal cell phones. Once the suspects obtained the money from the bartender, they would often herd the victims to the rear of the business, or the bathroom, where they were told to lie down and wait. The suspects often made efforts to eliminate evidence by wiping down the things they touched or even taking them out of the bar. For instance, in several cases, the suspects would actually have the presence of mind to take cups, bottles, and spoons that they touched or drank from.

The suspects never wore any masks or gloves, likely because they would not have been permitted entrance into most bars while wearing such disguises. All eight of the described robberies occurred between 0300 and 0700, a time in which most bars are locked up and customers must be "buzzed" in. The two suspects had distinct appearances. One was an overweight Black male, in his 30's or 40's, with a receding hairline (balding), with a gap(s) in his teeth, and he wore prescription eyeglasses during the commission of nearly every crime. The second suspect was a taller Black male that appeared to be fit, possibly balding, and he frequently wore some sort of hat during the commission of the crimes (baseball caps, top hats, etc.). The suspects committed some of the robberies alone, and others together (they may have even been assisting each other when it appeared that they were alone, i.e. - getaway driver, etc.). In at least four of the eight robberies, the suspect(s) used a white sedan as a getaway vehicle during the commission of the crimes. In some cases, the vehicle was more accurately described as a white, four door, Nissan Altima.

Based on their distinct descriptions, it was relatively easy to determine which suspect(s) robbed each business. There was video surveillance in at least six of the eight robbenes, which confirmed that the incidents were related and committed by the same suspects.

For these reasons, from an investigative standpoint, <u>Det. Miller felt that if he were to identify the suspect(s)</u> from even one of the eight robberies, then he would likely have the key to solving all the others.

The real break in the case occurred on 11-14-09. Det. Miller responded to the Tenaya Lodge robbery to assist with the investigation. Based on the details of the call, Det. Miller felt that it was possibly related to the described robbery series. It in fact ultimately turned out to be the eighth, and final, robbery in the series, for reasons which will be discussed in a moment.

After arriving at the Tenaya Lodge, Det. Miller was introduced to the victim and two witnesses who were customers inside the bar at the time of the robbery. One of the alleged witnesses was Alan Daniels. Det. Miller was immediately interested in Mr. Daniels because he looked like one of the suspects in the other bar robberies being investigated, specifically the taller, thinner, fit looking suspect (frequently wore a hat). The suspect that robbed the Tenaya Lodge sounded like the heavier set Black male that often wore prescription eye glasses.

A witness, Sofia Lozano, was sitting next to Mr. Daniels prior to the crime, and she saw him using his cell phone (possibly texting). Mr. Daniels then suddenly got up and went to the bathroom. Once Mr. Daniels was in the bathroom, the heavy set suspect entered the business and robbed the bartender. After the robbery was over and the suspect left, Mr. Daniels came back out of the bathroom acting surprised that the crime ever occurred. His behavior was simply suspicious. Det. Miller felt that Mr. Daniels was possibly the co-conspirator involved in the entire robbery series.

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From the Tenaya Lodge bartender (and later from Mr. Daniels himself), Det. Miller learned that Mr. Daniels was a regular customer of the business and only lived a couple streets over. This being the case, Mr. Daniels would

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not be able to enter "his local bar" and do a robbery without being recognized. So Det. Miller's theory, at the time, was that Mr. Daniels helped plan and coordinated the robbery from the inside while acting like a customer. Det. Miller considered the idea that Mr. Daniels' job in the robbery was to communicate, via cell phone, with the heavier set suspect who was waiting outside.

Mr. Daniels agreed to sit down with Det. Miller to conduct an interview. Det. Miller conducted the interview inside his unmarked police vehicle where it was quiet and well lit. Det. Miller was wearing plain clothes without weapons, cuffs, etc, visible. Mr. Daniels was not under arrest, was not in handcuffs, and was free to leave or stop answering questions at any time. Det. Miller advised Mr. Daniels of his Miranda rights to which he stated that he understood. Mr. Daniels agreed to speak with Det. Miller. The interview was surreptitiously recorded and will be transcribed and made available to the court when necessary.

In summary, Mr. Daniels denied all knowledge or involvement in any robberies. He told Det. Miller that he was still on parole for a robbery that he'd already been to prison for. Mr. Daniels gave Det. Miller permission to search the content of his cell phone. It was Det. Miller's theory that there would be records on Mr. Daniels' phone showing that he'd called or texted the heavier set suspect right before he got up to go to the bathroom. The theory was that the text message would suggest to the other suspect that it was a good time to enter the business to do the robbery (maybe because there weren't many customers, etc). However, upon inspecting the phone, Det. Miller found that all call and text history had been deleted. This seemed very suspicious.

Det. Miller told Mr. Daniels that he fit the description of the suspect that had been robbing the other bars in the valley along with the heavier set Black male. Det. Miller even showed Mr. Daniels pictures from the other robberies to see how he would react. He denied involvement in any robberies. Det. Miller asked Mr. Daniels for permission to take a sample of his DNA via buccal swabs. Mr. Daniels was made aware of the fact that he could refuse to give the sample and that it was completely up to him. Mr. Daniels was very willing to provide the sample which was collected via buccal swabs. Det. Miller impounded the buccal swabs as evidence that day.

During the interview, Mr. Daniels showed Det. Miller the vehicle he'd been driving that day. Parked outside the bar was a white four door 2006 Nissan Altima that tooked just like the vehicle used in four of the eight described robberies. The vehicle had Nevada license plates 557-VSY, and was registered to Mr. Daniels' mother, Isabell Daniels. Mr. Daniels gave detectives permission to search the vehicle but nothing of interest was found. Crime Scene Analyst D. Carvouniaris took a photograph of Mr. Daniels' vehicle before he departed.

A records check on Mr. Daniels revealed some additional suspicious factors. In 1996 and 1997, Mr. Daniels was an alleged witness in two other bar robberies (event # 961012-0315 and event # 971223-0235). From a robbery detective's point of view, being a victim/witness in three bar robberies is unlikely and suspicious. Furthermore, in 1998, Mr. Daniels was arrested after robbing the cashier's cage at the Ellis Island Casino located 4178 Koval Lane, Las Vegas, NV 89109 (armed robbery). In 1999, Mr. Daniels was arrested after robbing Pepe Muldoon's Bar located at 4341 N. Rancho Dr., Las Vegas, NV 89108. During the Pepe Muldoon's robbery, Mr. Daniels entered the bar and ordered a cup of coffee. After receiving the coffee, Mr. Daniels pulled out a gun and robbed the bartender. Mr. Daniels eight years in prison for these robberies, and as of 11-14-09, he was still on parole (NV Parole and Probation Officer O'Connell). In all, Mr. Daniels was a registered felon for Robbery with a Deadly Weapon - five counts (NV /2000),

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Burglary with a Deadly Weapon - four counts (NV / 2000), Burglary with a Deadly Weapon (NV / 2000), Robbery with a Deadly Weapon - two counts (NV / 2000), Robbery (NV / 2002), and Burglary with a Deadly Weapon (NV / 2002). Attached to this arrest package are certified copies of Mr. Daniels' Judgements of Conviction (JOC's).

Based on the totality of these described facts and circumstances, it appeared as though Mr. Daniels was a likely suspect in the entire robbery series. He fit the description (based on statements and video surveillance), his car fit the description (based on statements and video surveillance), and he was on parole for committing similar crimes, to include a bar where he used the exact same modus operandi (ordered coffee, then robbed, then made victim wait in bathroom). For these reasons, Det. Miller requested that the LVMPD ROP (Repeat Offenders Program) unit follow Mr. Daniels for two reasons: To prevent or catch him in the act of committing similar crimes, and to see if he would lead the police to his co-conspirator (the heavier set suspect with prescription glasses).

The ROP unit, to include Det. Joe Giannone, P# 6225, began following Mr. Daniels around 11-17-09. On that date, the detectives observed Mr. Daniels meet with a Black male that they identified as Cary Pickett, ID# 0725059. Mr. Pickett was a Black male, 44 years old, 5'8", 205 Lbs, with a receding hairline, and listed as having corrective lenses per the Nevada Department of Motor Vehicles as of 07-2009. Mr. Pickett looked just like the heavier set suspect that Det. Miller had been looking for. The ROP detectives began following Mr. Pickett as well, and at one point, Det. Giannone observed Mr. Pickett wearing what appeared to be the exact same jacket that he wore during the

A records check on Mr. Pickett revealed that he was a registered felon for Attempt Concealed Weapon (NV / 1989), Attempt Grand Larceny (NV / 1991), Burglary (NV / 1992), Attempt Grand Larceny (NV / 1993), Escape of a Prisoner (NV / 1994), Grand Larceny (NV / 1997), Burglary (NV / 1997), and Transport of Controlled Substance (NV / 2007). Attached to this arrest package are certified copies of Mr. Pickett's Judgements of Conviction (JOC's).

In summary, the ROP unit tracked/followed Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett until mid January, 2010. They didn't catch them committing any additional crimes. In fact, to Det. Miller's knowledge, there hasn't been one other similar bar robbery in Clark County since the date of Mr. Daniels' interview on 11-14-09. Det. Miller showed Mr. Daniels the video surveillance on 11-14-09, and accused him of the crimes. It is believed that Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett were frightened after the interview and have been laying low ever since.

VIDEO SURVEILLANCE:

In short, as already mentioned, surveillance from at least six of the eight described robberies was obtained. Based on the video surveillance and surrounding facts and circumstances, it was apparent that Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett were the suspects involved:

PHONE RECORDS:

The investigation into Alan Daniels' and Cary Pickett's cell phone history is still on-going. However, the results so far would indicate that Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett were in contact with one another around the dates and times of several of the robberies. The Tenaya Lodge robbery was of particular interest, since Mr. Daniels would have one believe that he was simply a witness to the crime and not a principle suspect. As previously mentioned, Mr. Daniels allowed Det. Miller to look at his cell phone after the robbery, but his call history was suspiciously deleted. A witness, Sofia Lozano, observed Mr. Daniels messing around with his phone just prior to the robbery (possibly texting). A records check on Mr. Daniels' cell phone would indicate that he did contact Mr. Pickett via cell phone approximately two minutes before, and six minutes after, the robbery occurred at the Tenaya Lodge. The following chart is a summary of Mr. Daniels' call history in relation to several of the described robberies (the investigation is on-going):

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FORENSICS:

The crime scenes were processed for evidence in at least eight of the eight robberies. Many of the robberies were committed in the same manner: The suspects would enter, act like customers, order drinks, and then commit the crimes. Mugs and bottles that the suspects drank from were located in at least at least four of the eight robberies. The following chart demonstrates the forensic results as they currently are, but the investigation is far from complete:

For further details, please refer to the Crime Scene Reports, the Forensic Lab Requests, and the Forensic Lab Results (attached to the arrest package). It should be noted that a sample of Cary Pickett's DNA will need to be obtained for comparison purposes. Also, latent print comparisons are still pending.

ALAN DANIELS INTERVIEW:

As previously mentioned, Det. Miller first interviewed Alan Daniels on 11-14-09. Mr. Daniels denied involvement in all robberies. On 02-08-10, Alan Daniels was arrested for "Parole Violation" at the Nevada Parole and Probation Offices located at 628 Belrose St., Las Vegas, NV 89107 (partially because Officer O'Connell and Lt. Webb were aware of the fact that there was probable cause to believe Mr. Daniels had been committing these described robberies, therefore, violating his parole). On 02-10-10, Det. Miller conducted an interview with Mr. Daniels while he was still in custody at CCDC. The interview was surreptitiously recorded and will be transcribed and made available to the court when necessary. Det. Miller advised Mr. Daniels of his Miranda rights to which he stated that he understood. Mr. Daniels agreed to speak with Det. Miller "for a few minutes." After Det. Miller explained that Mr. Daniels was a suspect in at least seven business robberies, he (Daniels) asked for a lawyer. The interview was stopped at that time.

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CONCLUSION

Based on the totality of the above described facts and circumstances, there is probable cause to believe that Alan Daniels and Cary Pickett are the two principle suspects involved with the described robbery series.

In these described incidents, the suspects entered occupied structures (bars/pubs) with concealed firearms and then pointed their weapons at customers and employees while demanding money and cell phones. In each of these incidents, the victims complied with the suspects' orders and provided money (and cell phones in some cases). The suspects then frequently forced the victims and customers to lie down on the ground in the back of the business (frequently the bathroom). The victim's complied in each of these incidents because the suspects placed them in fear for their lives. The suspects were ultimately identified as Alan Daniels and Cary Pickett. Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett are convicted felons, each registered for multiple offenses. For further details on their conviction records, please refer to the section of this report titled, "Suspects Identified." Also, attached to this arrest package are the Judgements of Conviction for each defendant.

Based on the totality of these described facts and circumstances, there is also probable cause to believe that Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett conspired to commit these crimes with the full intention of robbing the victims after entering the businesses. One might argue that Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett entered the bars and ordered drinks like normal customers, and only decided to commit the crimes as almost an afterthought (no conspiracy or premeditated intent). If only one bar robbery had occurred in this manner, it might be a reasonable explanation. However, eight robberies occurred, nearly all of them carried out by the suspects in the same exact manner (ex-felons entered the bars with conspire, plan, and carry out the crimes in unison.

The actions of Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett meet the criminal elements of Robbery with a Deadly Weapon (multiple counts), Burglary with a Deadly Weapon (multiple counts), Ex-Felon Possession of a Firearm (multiple counts – JOC's attached to arrest report), Conspiracy to Commit Robbery (multiple counts), and Conspiracy to Commit Burglary (multiple counts). It should be noted that this arrest package is only regarding Mr. Daniels. Mr. Pickett's arrest is forthcoming (he is not in custody at this time).

Cary Pickett was arrested for charges of Conspiracy to Commit Robbery, Robbery With Use of a Deadly Weapon, and Burglary While in Possession of a Deadly Weapon under several different events. His case was assigned case number 10F02860X and randomly tracked to Justice Court Department 10. He currently has a preliminary hearing scheduled for March 3, 2010.

CASE 10F02742X

Alan Daniels was also arrested for charges of Conspiracy to Commit Robbery, Robbery With Use of a Deadly Weapon, and Burglary While in Possession of a Deadly Weapon under several different events. His case was assigned case number 10F02742X and randomly tracked to Justice Court Department 7. He currently has a preliminary hearing scheduled for March 2, 2010.

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STATEMENT OF THE FACTS

The State has attached a twenty-three (23) page arrest report written by Detective David Miller to the instant motion. In it, Detective Miller details several bar robberies that were committed within the valley between October 11, 2009 and November 14, 2009. In each of the robberies, both Defendant Pickett and Defendant Daniels conspired together to commit the robberies and the other attendant crimes. Currently, Defendant Daniels is charged in a twenty-seven (27) count Criminal Complaint. Should this Court grant the instant motion, the State anticipates consolidating Defendant Pickett's Criminal Complaint and he will be charged in Counts seven (7) through (27) of Defendant Daniels' Criminal Complaint.

ARGUMENT

NRS 173.135 provides:

Two or more defendants may be charged in the same indictment or information if they are alleged to have participated in the same act or transaction or in the same series of acts or transactions constituting an offense or offenses. Such defendants may be charged in one or more counts together or separately and all of the defendants need not be charged in each count.

The general rule favoring joinder has evolved for a specific reason—there is a substantial public interest in joint trials of persons charged together because of judicial economy. <u>Jones v. State</u>, 111 Nev. 848, 854, 899 P.2d 544, 547 (1995). Joint trials of persons charged with committing the same offense expedites the administration of justice, relieves trial docket congestion, conserves judicial time, lessens the burden on citizens called to sacrifice time and money while serving as jurors, and avoids the necessity of calling witnesses more than one time. <u>Id.</u> at 853-54, 899 P.2d at 547, <u>see also United States v. Brady</u>, 579 F.2d 1121 (9th Cir. 1978), <u>cert. denied</u>, 439 U.S. 1074, 99 S. Ct. 849 (1979). Therefore, the legal presumption is in favor of a joint trial among co-defendants.

Although, of course, both of these cases are still at the preliminary hearing stage, the same principles of judicial economy, the intent of the legislature in NRS 173.135 strongly supports consolidating the two cases so that only one preliminary hearing can be heard. The same witnesses will be testifying at both preliminary hearings. The State will call

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approximately fifteen (15) to twenty (20) witnesses including the victim bartenders, crime scene analysts, and police officers in order to establish probable cause that the Defendants committed the instant offenses. Additionally, the Court's time would not be wasted by two preliminary hearings being heard. It also makes sense for one judge to make the probable cause determination in hearing the evidence against both defendants. The general rule followed by the courts is that the cases should be consolidated into the lower case number, which in this instance is case number 10F02742X.

CONCLUSION

Based on all of the above reasons, the State respectfully requests the Court grant its motion to consolidate.

BAR ROBBERY SERIES SYNOPSIS:

Between 07-04-09 and 11-14-09, there were eight bar robberies throughout Clark County, Nevada, that were determined to be related based on similar suspect descriptions, modus operandi, video surveillance, forensic evidence, and circumstantial evidence (trier of facts). A crime report was completed to document the incident, and Mr. Edwards wrote a voluntary statement. Crime Scene Analyst Robbie Dahn, P# 5947, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. Of particular interest, CSA Dahn recovered the two beer bottles that the suspect drank from prior to the robbery. A copy of the video surveillance was ultimately obtained and is with the case file (still shots only). A crime report was completed to document the incident, and Mrs. Earhart wrote a voluntary statement. Crime Scene Analyst Shelly Shrum, P#7917, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. Of particular interest, CSA Shrum recovered swabs of possible DNA from the mouths of the "Niagra" water bottle and "Budweiser" beer bottle that the suspect drank from prior to the robbery. A copy of the video surveillance was ultimately obtained and is with the case file. The quality of the video surveillance is relatively good, showing pictures of the suspect and his actions.

Several officers responded to the robbery under event # 091011-0978, to include Officer J. Bledsoe, P# 8300. Upon arrival, the officers made contact with two employees/victims, identified as Michael Cosgrove, DOB: 02-17-52, and Gregory Shealian, DOB: 01-22-63. There was also one witness that was identified as Darion Cook, DOB: 04-16-88. The following is a summation of the crime based on victim/witness statements, video surveillance, and officer observations.

Mr. Cosgrove and Mr. Shealian were working inside the bar when two Black male suspects entered, sat down, and ordered a coffee and beer (Heineken). One suspect was tall and thin (6'1", 180 Lbs), wearing a baseball cap, while the other was shorter and heavyset (5'10", 200 Lbs), with gaps in his teeth, and wearing gold wire prescription eye glasses. The suspects ordered some chips and salsa, but then complained that the chips were stale. Mr. Cosgrove took the chips to the back of the business to ask the cook, Mr. Shealian, about the problem. The suspect with the glasses followed Mr. Cosgrove to the back of the business and pulled out a black semi-automatic handgun. The suspect pointed the weapon at Mr. Cosgrove and Mr. Shealian and forced them to lie down on the ground. The suspect then stole Mr. Cosgrove's money clip containing his identification and miscellaneous credit cards.

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The two suspects then stole approximately \$7250.00 (U.S. currency) from the cash registers and tip jar before fleeing from the business. There were two customers inside the business at the time of the crime: Darion Cook and his cousin who was not identified. Mr. Cook saw the suspects and thought they looked suspicious, but he didn't know that they'd actually robbed the business until after they were already gone. Mr. Cook remembered the suspects arriving in a white Nissan Altima styled vehicle.

A crime report was completed to document the incident, and voluntary statements were written by Mr. Cosgrove, Mr. Shealian, and Mr. Cook. Crime Scene Analyst E. Taylor, P# 9619, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. Of particular interest, CSA Shrum recovered a swab of possible DNA from a coffee mug that one of the suspects drank from prior to the robbery. A copy of the video surveillance was ultimately obtained and impounded as evidence. The quality of the video surveillance is relatively good, showing pictures of the suspects and their actions.

On 10-23-09, at approximately 0500 hours, the LVMPD received an emergency phone call regarding a robbery that had just occurred at the Roadrunner Saloon located at 5990 Centennial Center Blvd., Las Vegas, NV 89149. Several officers responded to the robbery under event # 091023-0605, to include Officer J. Larosa, P# 13448. Upon arrival, the officers made contact with the victim/bartender, identified as Justin Sanchez, DOB: 11-27-80. The following is a summation of the crime based on Mr. Sanchez's statements, video surveillance, and officer observations.

Mr. Sanchez was working alone when two Black male suspects entered the bar, sat down, and ordered coffee. The suspects began playing the slots until everyone else in the bar left (cleaning crew). One suspect was described as tall and thin (6'4", 195 Lbs), wearing a baseball cap, while the other was described as shorter and heavyset (5'8", 225 Lbs), wearing prescription eye glasses. One of the suspects cashed out on his slot machine which required Mr. Sanchez to open the cash register to provide change. While doing so, the suspect with the glasses walked behind the counter with a gun pointed at Mr. Sanchez. The suspect ordered Mr. Sanchez to leave the cash drawer open and he directed him around the bar to the second suspect. The second suspect (the taller one) then pointed a gun at Mr. Sanchez and forced him to lie down in the bathroom. The taller suspect also stole Mr. Sanchez's Palm Pre cell phone.

The suspects stole approximately \$3900.00 (U.S. currency) before using a green rag to wipe down the areas where they'd touched (bar, slots, etc.). The suspects stole the coffee mugs and spoons they drank from before fleeing from the business.

A crime report was completed to document the incident, and Mr. Sanchez wrote a voluntary statement. Crime Scene Analysts D. Brotherson, P# 4931, and J. Maldonado, P# 6920, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. Det. Dave Miller, P# 6627, responded to assist with the investigation. Det. Miller considered the possibility that the suspects may have discarded the stolen coffee mugs, spoons, etc. a short time after the robbery. It seemed apparent that the items were only taken so as to prevent the police from gathering additional evidence (DNA, latent prints, etc.). Det. Miller searched the immediate areas around the Roadrunner Saloon but found nothing of interest. Det. Miller tried to determine the streets the suspects may have fled on after the crime. From the business, Det. Miller drove north on Centennial Center, then east on Azure. Between 7445 Azure and 7485 Azure, on the south side of the street, Det. Miller located a green rag? two glass mugs (broken), a metal spoon, a grey box cutter, and Mr. Sanchez's stolen Palm Pre (cell phone). The Roadrunner Saloon manager, Shawn Olsen, positively identified the coffee mugs and spoon as items belonging to their

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business. Det. Miller took digital photographs of all the items and recovered them while wearing latex gloves. The items were impounded as evidence. Det. Miller ultimately obtained a sample of Mr. Sanchez's DNA, via buccal swabs, for comparisons/eliminations. A copy of the video surveillance was ultimately obtained and is with the case file. The quality of the video surveillance is relatively good, showing pictures of the suspects and their actions.

The suspects demanded money from the cash register, and Mr. Mattie complied, handing them approximately \$4200.00 (U.S. currency). The two suspects then forced Mr. Mattie and a customer, Mr. Berens, to wait in the bathroom. The suspects then fled from the bar in the same white Nissan sedan.

A crime report was completed to document the incident, and voluntary statements were written by Mr. Mattie and Mr. Berens. Crime Scene Analysts R. Wanta, P# 1694, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. A copy of the video surveillance was ultimately obtained and is currently in the possession of the North Las Vegas Police Department. The quality of the video surveillance is relatively good, showing pictures of the suspects and their actions.

Mrs. Lozano appeared to be slightly intoxicated and was not entirely cooperative with the arriving officers. After Mrs. Lozano provided a verbal statement, she left the business. Det. Dave Miller, P# 6627, responded to assist with the investigation. Det. Miller conducted a digitally recorded interview with Mr. Daniels. For further details about the interview with Mr. Daniels, please see the section of this report below, titled, "Investigation." Crime Scene Analyst D. Carvouniaris, P# 12712, processed the entire crime scene for evidence. The Tenaya Lodge did not have a functioning video surveillance system at the time of the robbery.

INVESTIGATION

SUSPECTS IDENTIFIED:

As briefly mentioned in the synopsis portion of this report, the eight robbenes were determined to be related for several reasons. Out of all the victims to choose from, the suspects selected <u>businesses</u> to victimize, and more specifically <u>bars/pubs</u>. The suspects would often enter the businesses and act like customers, ordering drinks and playing the slots. The suspects, particularly during the early stages of the series, would often wait patiently for other patrons to leave the business before committing the crime.

There are many manners in which to commit a robbery, but these suspects used handguns every time. They pointed their weapons at employees and sometimes patrons, controlling everyone's actions and often inquiring about the whereabouts of personal cell phones. Once the suspects obtained the money from the bartender, they would often herd the victims to the rear of the business, or the bathroom, where they were told to lie down and wait. The suspects often made efforts to eliminate evidence by wiping down the things they touched or even taking them out of the bar. For instance, in several cases, the suspects would actually have the presence of mind to take cups, bottles, and spoons that they'd touched or drank from.

The suspects never wore any masks or gloves, likely because they would not have been permitted entrance into most bars while wearing such disguises. All eight of the described robberies occurred between 0300 and 0700, a time in which most bars are locked up and customers must be "buzzed" in. The two suspects had distinct appearances. One was an overweight Black male, in his 30's or 40's, with a receding hairline (balding), with a gap(s) in his teeth, and he wore prescription eyeglasses during the commission of nearly every crime. The second suspect was a taller Black male that appeared to be fit, possibly balding, and he frequently wore some sort of hat during the commission of the crimes (baseball caps, top hats, etc.). The suspects committed some of the robberies alone, and others together (they may have even been assisting each other when it appeared that they were alone, i.e. - getaway driver, etc.). In at least four of the eight robberies, the suspect(s) used a white sedan as a getaway vehicle during the commission of the crimes. In some cases, the vehicle was more accurately described as a white, four door, Nissan Altima.

Based on their distinct descriptions, it was relatively easy to determine which suspect(s) robbed each business. There was video surveillance in at seven of the eight robberies, which confirmed that the incidents were related and committed by the same suspects.

For these reasons, from an investigative standpoint, <u>Det. Miller felt that if he were to identify the suspect(s)</u> from even one of the eight robberies, then he would likely have the key to solving all the others.

The real break in the case occurred on 11-14-09. Det. Miller responded to the Tenaya Lodge robbery to assist with the investigation. Based on the details of the call, Det. Miller felt that it was possibly related to the described robbery series. It in fact ultimately turned out to be the eighth, and final, robbery in the series, for reasons which will be discussed in a moment.

After arriving at the Tenaya Lodge, Det. Miller was introduced to the victim and two witnesses who were customers inside the bar at the time of the robbery. One of the alleged witnesses was Alan Daniels. Det. Miller was immediately interested in Mr. Daniels because he looked like one of the suspects in the other bar robberies being

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investigated, specifically the taller, thinner, fit looking suspect (frequently wore a hat). The suspect that robbed the Tenaya Lodge sounded like the heavier set Black male that often wore prescription eye glasses.

A witness, Sofia Lozano, was sitting next to Mr. Daniels prior to the crime, and she saw him using his cell phone (possibly texting). Mr. Daniels then suddenly got up and went to the bathroom. Once Mr. Daniels was in the bathroom, the heavy set suspect entered the business and robbed the bartender. After the robbery was over and the suspect left, Mr. Daniels came back out of the bathroom acting surprised that the crime ever occurred. His behavior was simply suspicious. Det. Miller felt that Mr. Daniels was possibly the co-conspirator involved in the entire robbery series.

From the Tenaya Lodge bartender (and later from Mr. Daniels himself), Det. Miller learned that Mr. Daniels was a regular customer of the business and only lived a couple streets over. This being the case, Mr. Daniels would not be able to enter "his local bar" and do a robbery without being recognized. So Det. Miller's theory, at the time, was that Mr. Daniels helped plan and coordinated the robbery from the inside while acting like a customer. Det. Miller considered the idea that Mr. Daniels' job in the robbery was to communicate, via cell phone, with the heavier set suspect who was waiting outside.

Mr. Daniels agreed to sit down with Det. Miller to conduct an interview. Det. Miller conducted the interview inside his unmarked police vehicle where it was quiet and well lit. Det. Miller was wearing plain clothes without weapons, cuffs, etc, visible. Mr. Daniels was not under arrest, was not in handcuffs, and was free to leave or stop answering questions at any time. Det. Miller advised Mr. Daniels of his Miranda rights to which he stated that he understood. Mr. Daniels agreed to speak with Det. Miller. The interview was surreptitiously recorded and will be transcribed and made available to the court when necessary.

In summary, Mr. Daniels denied all knowledge or involvement in any robberies. He told Det. Miller that he was still on parole for a robbery that he'd already been to prison for. Mr. Daniels gave Det. Miller permission to search the content of his cell phone. It was Det. Miller's theory that there would be records on Mr. Daniels' phone showing that he'd called or texted the heavier set suspect right before he got up to go to the bathroom. The theory was that the text message would suggest to the other suspect that it was a good time to enter the business to do the robbery (maybe because there weren't many customers, etc). However, upon inspecting the phone, Det. Miller found that all call and text history had been deleted. Mr. Daniels indicated that having no history simply meant that he hadn't received or made any calls that day. This seemed very suspicious.

Det. Miller told Mr. Daniels that he fit the description of the suspect that had been robbing the other bars in the valley along with the heavier set Black male. Det. Miller even showed Mr. Daniels pictures from the other robberies to see how he would react. He continued to deny involvement in any robberies. Det. Miller asked Mr. Daniels for permission to take a sample of his DNA via buccal swabs. Mr. Daniels was made aware of the fact that he could refuse to give the sample and that it was completely up to him. Mr. Daniels was very willing to provide the sample which was collected via buccal swabs. Det. Miller impounded the buccal swabs as evidence that day.

During the interview, Mr. Daniels showed Det. Miller the vehicle he'd been driving that day. Parked outside the bar was a white four door 2006 Nissan Altima that looked just like the vehicle used in four of the eight described robberies. The vehicle had Nevada license plates 557-VSY, and was registered to Mr. Daniels' mother, Isabell Daniels. Mr. Daniels gave detectives permission to search the vehicle but nothing of interest was found. Crime Scene Analyst D. Carvouniaris took a photograph of Mr. Daniels' vehicle before he departed.

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A records check on Mr. Daniels revealed some additional suspicious factors. In 1996 and 1997, Mr. Daniels was an alleged witness in two other bar robberies (event # 961012-0315 and event # 971223-0235). From a robbery detective's point of view, being a victim/witness in three bar robberies is unlikely and suspicious. Furthermore, in 1998, Mr. Daniels was arrested after robbing the cashier's cage at the Ellis Island Casino located 4178 Koval Lane, Las Vegas, NV 89109 (armed robbery). In 1999, Mr. Daniels was arrested after robbing Pepe Muldoon's Bar located at 4341 N. Rancho Dr., Las Vegas, NV 89108. During the Pepe Muldoon's robbery, Mr. Daniels entered the bar and ordered a cup of coffee. After receiving the coffee, Mr. Daniels pulled out a gun and robbed the bartender. Mr. Daniels then made the bartender go to the bathroom and wait (sound familiar?). Mr. Daniels ultimately spent approximately eight years in prison for these robberies, and as of 11-14-09, he was still on parole (NV Parole and Probation Officer O'Connell). In all, Mr. Daniels was a registered felon for Robbery with a Deadly Weapon - five counts (NV /2000), Burglary with a Deadly Weapon (NV /2000), Robbery with a Deadly Weapon - two counts (NV /2000), Robbery (NV /2002), and Burglary with a Deadly Weapon (NV /2002). Attached to this arrest package are certified copies of Mr. Daniels' Judgements of Conviction (JOC's).

Based on the totality of these described facts and circumstances, it appeared as though Mr. Daniels was a likely suspect in the entire robbery series. He fit the description (based on statements and video surveillance), his car fit the description (based on statements and video surveillance), and he was on parole for committing similar crimes, to include a bar where he used the exact same modus operandi (ordered coffee, then robbed, then made victim wait in bathroom). For these reasons, Det. Miller requested that the LVMPD ROP (Repeat Offenders Program) unit follow Mr. Daniels for two reasons: To prevent or catch him in the act of committing similar crimes, and to see if he would lead the police to his co-conspirator (the heavier set suspect with prescription glasses).

The ROP unit, to include Det. Joe Giannone, P# 6225, began following Mr. Daniels around 11-17-09. On that date, the detectives observed Mr. Daniels meet with a Black male that they identified as Cary Pickett, ID# 0725059. Mr. Pickett was a Bleck male, 44 years old, 5'8", 205 Lbs, with a receding hairline, and listed as having corrective lenses per the Nevada Department of Motor Vehicles as of 07-2009. Mr. Pickett looked just like the heavier set suspect that Det. Miller had been looking for. The ROP detectives began following Mr. Pickett as well, and at one point, Det. Giannone observed Mr. Pickett wearing what appeared to be the exact same jacket that he wore during the Timbers Bar robbery. Det. Giannone, having observed the surveillance pictures from the described robberies, felt certain that Mr. Pickett was the heavier set suspect involved.

A records check on Mr. Pickett revealed that he was a registered felon for Attempt Concealed Weapon (NV / 1989), Attempt Grand Larceny (NV / 1991), Burglary (NV / 1992), Attempt Grand Larceny (NV / 1993), Escape of a Prisoner (NV / 1994), Grand Larceny (NV / 1997), Burglary (NV / 1997), and Transport of Controlled Substance (NV / 2007). Attached to this arrest package are certified copies of Mr. Pickett's Judgements of Conviction (JOC's).

In summary, the ROP unit tracked/followed Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett until mid January, 2010. They didn't catch them committing any additional crimes. In fact, to Det. Miller's knowledge, there hasn't been one other similar bar robbery in Clark County since the date of Mr. Daniels' interview on 11-14-09. Det. Miller showed Mr. Daniels the video surveillance on 11-14-09, and accused him of the crimes. It is believed that Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett were frightened after the interview and have been laying low ever since.

VIDEO SURVEILLANCE:

In short, as already mentioned, surveillance from seven of the eight described robberies was obtained. Based on the video surveillance and surrounding facts and circumstances, it was apparent that Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett were the suspects involved in the following incidents:

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PHONE RECORDS:

The investigation into Alan Daniels' and Cary Pickett's cell phone history is still on-going. However, the results so far would indicate that Mr. Daniels and Mr. Pickett were in contact with one another around the dates and times of several of the robberies. The Tenaya Lodge robbery was of particular interest, since Mr. Daniels would have one believe that he was simply a witness to the crime and not a principle suspect. As previously mentioned, Mr. Daniels allowed Det. Miller to look at his cell phone after the robbery, but his call history was suspiciously deleted. In fact, he indicated that a blank history simply meant that he hadn't made or received any calls that day (11-14-09). A witness, Sofia Lozano, observed Mr. Daniels messing around with his phone just prior to the robbery (possibly texting). A records check on Mr. Daniels' cell phone would indicate that he did contact Mr. Pickett via cell phone approximately two minutes before, and six minutes after, the robbery occurred at the Tenaya Lodge. In fact, he used his cell phone for multiple calls/texts on the morning of 11-14-09 (per records), but the cell history had been deleted. The following chart is a summary of Mr. Daniels' call history in relation to several of the described robberies (the investigation is on-going):
