

1 **MEMORANDUM OF POINTS AND AUTHORITIES**

2 Rule 30(d) of the Nevada Rules of Appellate Procedure allows an
3
4 appellant to include copies of relevant and necessary exhibits in the appendix.

5 However, if an exhibit is not able to be reproduced, a party may:

6 file a motion requesting the Supreme Court to
7 direct the district court clerk to transmit the original
8 exhibits. The Supreme Court will not permit the
9 transmittal of original exhibits except upon a showing
10 that the exhibits are relevant to the issues raised on
11 appeal, and that the Supreme Court's review of the
12 original exhibits is necessary to the determination of the
issue.

13 NRAP 30(d).

14 Defendant asks that this Court direct the District Court Clerk's office to
15 transmit State's Exhibit 27 for this Honorable Court's review. State's Exhibit 27
16 contains the audio recording of Appellant's statement to interrogating detectives.
17 Appellant is challenging the lower court's refusal to suppress that statement as
18 involuntary and obtained in violation of his *Miranda* rights. Accordingly, the
19 recorded statement contained in Exhibit 27 will be necessary for this Court's
20 adjudication of the instant matter.
