1	you, where did you get that information?
2	A. I believe from the San Jose officer.
3	Q. Okay. And you mentioned that you participated in
4	the investigation of the underlying matter with the
5	motorcycle crash that Detective Shearer testified to?
6	A. Yes.
7	Q. Did you were you at that scene?
8	A. Yes.
9	Q. And when you arrived, what did you see?
10	A. I saw a motorcycle down in the middle of the
11	roadway facing southeast direction. I saw a gold Toyota
12	Camry with front end damage. The motorcycle had pretty
13	severe front end damage. It was leaking fluids. There was
14	debris that was scattered across Soquel Drive from the
15	front of the automobile.
16	Q. Now, when you you viewed the motor vehicle as
17	it was after the crash?
18	A. Yes.
19	Q. Was there what would be considered a debris field
20	that from motorcycle?
21	A. That's fair to say, yes.
22	Q. Did you
23	MR. HINGLE: I would object to that as lack of
24	foundation. Outside the expert. He hasn't been tendered
25	as an actual reconstruction expert.
26	THE COURT: Sustained.

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1	Q. BY MR. BYERS: Did you look at the license plate
2	number of the motorcycle?
3	A. I díd.
4	Q. Did you do any investigation as to the registered
5	owner of the motorcycle?
6	A. The dispatcher conducted a records check with DMV
7	on that motorcycle.
8	Q. And who was the registered owner?
9	A. Mr. Cesar Villagrana.
10	Q. And do you know Mr. Villagrana, have you had
11	contact with him?
12	A. Yes.
13	Q. Okay. He's here in court today?
14	A. Yes.
15	Q. Can you point him out and identify an article of
16	clothing he's wearing?
17	A. The gentleman at the defense counsel wearing the
18	red and white flannel.
19	THE COURT: Identifying the Defendant.
20	Q. BY MR. BYERS: Did you speak with an Officer Tang
21	Wae from the California Highway Patrol at the scene?
22	A. Yes.
23	Q. Did you talk to him about any items of evidence?
24	A. Yes.
25	Q. Tell us about that.
26	A. He had the firearm that was found.

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1	Q.	Did you ask him where he had obtained the firearm?
2	Α.	He said he obtained it from Detective Harris.
3	Q.	Did you ask him or did he tell you if the firearm
4	was loade	ed when he obtained it from Detective Harris?
5	А.	He said the firearm was loathed.
6	Q	Okay. Did he provide you the firearm?
7	Α.	Yes, he did.
8	Q.	Did you inspect it?
9	А.	Yes, I did.
10	Q.	Did you was it loaded when he hand it to you?
11	Α.	No, it was not.
12	Q.	The firearm I believe that is People's Exhibit 1
13	or 2, is	that still up there?
14		THE CLERK: Here you go.
15	Q.	BY MR. BYERS: Do you recognize that firearm
16	depicted	in that exhibit?
17	Α.	Yes.
18	Q.	What exhibit is that, for the record?
19	Α.	One.
20	Q.	Okay. And when you were handed that firearm, it
21	was not 1	loaded?
22	Α.	Correct.
23	Q.	Now, that's a semi-automatic firearm?
24	Α.	Yes.
25	Q.	Is that loaded by the magazine, or individual
26	bullets p	put in some sort of cylinder?

1	A.	By a magazine.
2	Q.	Did you view the magazine?
3	Α.	Yes.
4	Q.	Were there individual bullets in the magazine when
5	you look	ed at it?
6	Α.	Yes, there was.
7	Q.	Did you inspect the bullets?
8	Α.	Yes, I did.
9	Q.	Did they appear to be capable of firing in a
10	firearm?	
11	Α.	Yes, they were.
12	Q.	Okay. Did you talk with a Jim McKinley?
13	А,	Yes, I did.
14	Q.	Who is Jim McKinley?
15	Α.	He was a security guard that was working by
16	Rite-Aid	at the time of the crash.
17	Q.	And did you ask Mr. McKinley if he was a witness
18	to the c	rash?
19	Α.	I don't recall if I asked him if he was a witness
20	to the c	rash itself.
21	Q.	Did you ask him about his observations related to
22	the cras	h?
23	Α.	Yes.
24	Q.	What did he tell you in that regard?
25	A.	That while he was working out by the Rite-Aid he
26	heard th	e cash, so he responded to that location, found
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1	there was a motorcycle accident, found a subject lying on
2	the ground appearing to be injured. He tried to hold that
3	person steady. And a person walked up with a firearm
4	trying to give it to the security guard. Mr. McKinley told
5 ⁷	that person he was not going to take that firearm and told
6	him to hand it to one of the deputies that were arriving on
7	scene.
8	Q. Did you see Mr. Villagrana at the scene?
9	A. I did not see Mr. Villagrana at the scene.
10	Q. Now, were you able I think it's People's
11	Exhibit 4. Is that the vest that you were talking about
12	earlier?
13	A. It is.
14	Q. Okay. Now, you were telling us already that you
15	found that vest at the scene?
16	A. Yes.
17	Q. Okay. And what did you what were you told
18	about that vest, where it came from? Or were you told
19	anything about it?
20	A. I was not told anything about the vest.
21	Q. Was a records check performed on the firearm given
22	to you by the CHP officer?
23	A. Yes.
24	Q. And what was the results of that records check?
25	MR. HINGLE: Objection. Multiple hearsay. Lack
26	of foundation as to where the records came from.

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1	THE COURT: Sustained.
2	Q. BY MR. BYERS: Did you were you able to
3	determine the serial number of the firearm that was handed
4	to you by the CHP officer?
5	A. Yes.
6	Q. Did you know it offhand or do you know the
7	serial number?
8	A. I believe it's SML34817.
9	Q. Okay. Was there a letter designation at the end
10	of those numbers?
11	A. Not that I recall.
12	Q. Did you enumerate the serial number in your police
13	report that you prepared?
14	A. Yes, the serial number is in my police report.
15	Q. Since you can't recall now, would looking at your
16	police report refresh your recollection as to what the
17	serial number was?
18	A. Yes, it would.
19	MR. BYERS: With the Court's permission?
20	THE COURT: Sure.
21	Q. BY MR. BYERS: Do you now remember what the serial
22	number of the firearm was?
23	A. Yes. SML34817 and with a D at the end.
24	Q. Do you know the type?
25	A. It was a Taurus.
26	Q. What caliber?
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1	A. A.40.
2	MR. BYERS: Your honor, If I could have marked as
3	People's next in order, it's a certified firearms history
4	from the California Department of Justice related to
5	firearm a Taurus .40 caliber firearm serial number
6	SML34817D. And reviewing the records it will indicate that
7	the first entry is entered as evidence in this sheriff's
8	department case.
9	(People's Exhibit 5 marked for identification.)
10	THE COURT: First entry is an investigation in
11	this case. There's no history for a registered owner?
12	MR. BYERS: Correct. So according to the records
13	there is no registered owner of this firearm.
14	Q. Detective, as you were at the scene, did you see
15	anyone else around the scene that you recognized as being
16	associated with the Hells Angels gang?
17	A. I did.
18	Q. Who was that?
19	A. Christopher Heck.
20	Q. How are you familiar with that individual?
21	A. He's a member of the Santa Cruz Chapter of the
22	Hells Angels.
23	Q. Did you find it significant that you observed him
24	around the scene?
25	A. Yes.
26	Q. Why's that?

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1	A. Because Mr. Villagrana gets in an accident and he
2	responds. It shows that Mr. Villagrana is not in bad
3	standing with the club, in my opinion.
4	Q. Okay. Did you participate in the execution of a
5	search warrant at Mr. Villagrana's home?
6	A. I did.
7	Q. And when was that search executed?
8	A. April 6th.
9	Q. And did you search Mr. Villagrana's room?
10	A. I did.
11	Q. How was it determined that it was Mr. Villagrana's
12	room?
13	A. It is the front left room of the house, so to
14	speak. There was a wallet inside the room that had
15	[•] Mr. Villagrana's driver's license in there. There was a
16	Kaiser insurance card with Mr. Villagrana's name on it.
17	There was a bottle of pills, medication pills with
18	Mr. Villagrana's name on it. Some paperwork, and
19	Mr. Villagrana actually told us also that it was his
20	bedroom.
21	Q. Did you then locate anything significant in
22	Mr. Villagrana's bedroom to help you determine if he is an
23	active participant in the Hells Angels gang?
24	A. I did.
25	Q. What was that?
26	A. We can start with, I would say, probably no less
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1	than 40 shirts that were all related to the Hells Angels,
2	hat related to the Hells Angels, I'll call them beanies or
3	toboggans I relate to the Hells Angels. Envelopes full of
4	stickers, I would say probably no less than 50 stickers
5	related to the Hells Angels. Patches related to the Hells
6	Angels. Fifteen or so articles of jewelry, rings relating
7	to the Hells Angels. Poster on the wall from Monterey 2010
8	toy run that was signed by members of the Hells Angels. A
9	big red banner on his wall that was framed that said hells
10	Angels San Jose. A Filthy Few banner that was also hanging
11	on the wall. Motorcycle parts related to the indicia
12	related to the Hells Angels. A second motorcycle in the
13	garage with stickers relating to the Hells Angels.
14	Stickers within the house, on the tool box that relate to
15	the Hells Angels. A roster of phone numbers for different
16	chapters for the Hells Angels, including members.
17	MR. BYERS: Your Honor, may I have something
18	marked as People's Exhibit 6?
19	THE COURT: Yes.
20	(People's Exhibit 6 marked for identification.)
21	Q. BY MR. BYERS: Detective, you listed quite a few
22	things that you saw at Mr. Villagrana's house and his room
23	that had the Hells Angels insignia on it. I'm going to
24	show you what's been mark as People's 6.
25	Do you recognize what that is?
26	A. I do.

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1	Q. And what is that?
2	A. That is the Hells Angels San Jose banner that I
3	described being in the bedroom.
4	Q. Okay. And you mentioned something about the
5	Filthy Few San Jose. What is that?
6	A. Filthy Few is the term used by the Hells Angels
7	regarding someone that's committed an act of violence for
8	the gang.
9	Q. So executing a search warrant in Mr. Villagrana's
10	home and locating numerous items of Hells Angels indicia,
11	did that help you determine if Mr. Villagrana is an active
12	participant in the gang?
13	A. Yes.
14	Q. Did you see any photographs at that location?
15	A. Yes.
16	Q. And were any of them significant to you?
17	A. Yes. I do remember a photograph of Mr. Villagrana
18	wearing his well, on the front the Hells Angels cut and
19	he's sitting with, I believe, the president of the Oakland
20	chapter and another member wearing the Hells Angels attire.
21	Q. Did you review San Jose Police Department report
22	case number 10 dash 309 dash 0952?
23	A. I did.
24	MR. HINGLE: Objection hearsay. And leading.
25	THE COURT: Overruled.
26	Q. BY MR. BYERS: And in reviewing, was there a date
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1	related to those events depicted in that police report?
2	A. I couldn't tell you a date just off the top of my
3	head.
4	Q. Would reviewing your report refresh your
5.	recollection as to the date?
6	A. Yes.
7	MR. BYERS: With the Court's permission?
8	THE COURT: Sure.
9	THE WITNESS: November 15th, 2010.
10	Q. BY MR. BYERS: Okay. And in reviewing that
11	report, were there information contained in there to help
12	you determine if Mr. Villagrana is an active participant in
13	the Hells Angels gang?
14	A, Yes.
15	Q. What was significant about that?
16	A. He was wearing a Hells Angels cut that we've been
17	describing with a full Hells Angels death head, California
18	on the back. His motorcycle, which is also the one from
19	the motorcycle accident on Soquel Drive, had three stickers
20	on the I believe the officer said the crank case cover
21	that related to the Hells Angels. And Mr. Villagrana told
22	the officer he was a member of the Hells Angels.
23	Q. Did you one final report. Did you review
24	Gilroy Police Department report 07 dash 5839 for events
25	that occurred on November 18, 2007?
26	MR. HINGLE: Objection. Leading.

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1	THE COURT: Sustained. I mean, overruled.
2	THE WITNESS: Yes.
3	Q. BY MR. BYERS: Okay. And did you find that parts
4	of that report significant in determining Mr. Villagrana's
5	association with the Hells Angels?
6	A. Yes.
7	Q. Tell us about that.
8	A. There was a fight at a bar in Gilroy and
9	Mr. Villagrana was wearing at that time in 2007 he was
10	wearing a prospect, his cut, lower rocker California,
11	Prospect San Jose on the front with patches.
12	Q. Did the report indicate if Mr. Villagrana was with
13	anyone at the time?
14	A. Yes, he was.
15	Q. And was that person identified?
16	A. Yes, he was.
17	Q. Was there something significant about that
18	individual?
19	A. That person was wearing a Hells Angels support
20	T-shirt.
21	Q. Going back to the underlying case on March 10th,
22	2011, is that area in Soquel and Soquel Drive I'm sorry,
23	the area in Aptos and Soquel Drive is that an
24	unincorporated area of the town?
25	A. Yes.
26	Q. And is it unlawful to discharge a firearm in that

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1	area?
2	A. Yes, it is.
3	Q. Do you have an opinion as to if on March 10th,
4	2011, if Mr. Villagrana was an active participant in the
5	Hells angels gang?
6	MR. HINGLE: I'm going to object to the use of the
7	term as irrelevant, as used to term Hells Angels gang.
8	THE COURT: Sustained. You can rephrase.
9	Q. BY MR. BYERS: Do you have an opinion as to if
10	Mr. Villagrana on March 10th, 2011, was an active
11	participant with the Hells Angels?
12	A. Yes.
13	Q. And how did what is your opinion?
14	A. That he was.
15	Q. Do you also have an opinion as if Mr. Villagrana
16	was a member of the Hells Angels on that date?
17	A. Yes, he was.
18	MR. BYERS: I have no further questions.
19	THE COURT: You want to ask if he has an opinion
20	as to whether the Hells Angels were a criminal street gang
21	on that date?
22	MR. BYERS: I'm sorry, sir?
23	THE COURT: You want to ask if he has an opinion
24	as to whether the Hells Angels were a criminal street gang
25	on that date?
26	MR. BYERS: Yes.

1	Q. Do you have an opinion if the Hells Angels were a
2	criminal street gang on March 10th, 2011?
3	A. Yes, they are. Or they were.
4	MR. BYERS: All right. Thank you. I have no
5	further questions.
6	THE COURT: Mr. Hingle.
7	CROSS-EXAMINATION
. 8	BY MR. HINGLE:
9	Q. As to that last answer, your opinion of the Hells
10	Angels were a California criminal street gang as defined by
11	the statute, are you referring to the Hells Angels world
12	wide, State of California, or what area are you referring
13	to the Hells Angels as an answer to that question?
14	A. Well, when 186.22 is a law in the State of
15	California, so therefore what we're discussing, in my
16	opinion, right now is the State of California.
17	Q. So in answer to that question, then, you were only
18	referring to Hells Angel members in the State of California
19	being members of a California criminal street gang,
20	correct?
21	A. What I'm trying to say is since we are in the
22	State of California we are discussing 186.22 as it applies
23	to what a criminal street gangs is. And my opinion is
24	based on the letter of that law for the State of
25	California.
26	Q. I appreciate that. My question to you is, from

1	what geographic area are you drawing individuals from the
2	Hells Angels street gang Hells Angels street gang in
з	your words, to come to that opinion?
4	A. California. And I have reviewed and observed
5	cases outside of California.
6	Q. Let's break this down.
7	A. Okay.
8	Q. Are you or are you not using cases outside of
9	California to determine whether or not the Hells Angels
10	motorcycle club is a California criminal street gang
11	pursuant to the 186.22 statutes?
12	A. Yes, I have reviewed cases outside of California.
13	Q. And you're using those cases in forming your
14	opinions that my client is an active member of California
15	criminal street gang?
16	A. I think it's fair to say I have reviewed cases,
17	but California there's plenty of cases in California
18	that are fine for me creating an opinion on whether the
19	Hells Angels are a criminal street gang under 186.22 in the
20	State of California, yes.
21	Q. I appreciate that, but you didn't answer my
22	question.
23	Are you or are you not considering cases from
24	outside of California in coming to the opinion that the
25	Hells Angels are a California criminal street gang?
26	MR. BYERS: Objection. Asked and answered.

THE COÚRT: Overruled. 1 2 THE WITNESS: So your question is have I -- am I 3 familiar with cases outside of the State of California and do I use those cases outside the State of California to 4 5 base my opinion on whether the Hells Angels are a crime 6 under 186.22? 7 BY MR. HINGLE: That was two questions. The last Q. 8 two I asked you, but yes. 9 Α. Yes, THE COURT: I'm sorry. Two questions. 10 Correct. 11 MR. HINGLE: Okay. THE COURT: And the answer, I guess, is yes. 12 13 BY MR. HINGLE: So, then, if you're using cases Ο. 14 out of California, how far are you going? By that I mean, 15 are you going out of the state of -- I mean are you going outside the continental United States? Are you going to 16 17 other countries? Because you've already established that your opinion is based on cases outside of the State of 18 19 California. Now I want to know if you're going outside of the country? 20 MR. BYERS: Objection. Misstates the testimony. 21 THE COURT: Improper discovery. Let's move on. 22 BY MR. HINGLE: How many Hells Angels chapters are 23 Q. within the State of California? 24 25 I would say approximately 20. Α. 26 Q. And approximately how many members are Hells

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1	Angels members in the State of California? By members I'm
2	using the term as defined by the Hells Angels.
3	A. I do not know the exact number.
4	Q. Do you know whether or not there is a Hells Angel
5	subset within Santa Clara County?
6	A. Are you asking if there's a chapter within Santa
7	Clara County?
8	Q. That's another way of putting it, yes.
9	A. There's the San Jose chapter.
10	Q. Is there a chapter in Santa Cruz County?
11	A. There is.
12	Q. And are these also referred to as charters in
13	addition to chapters?
14	A. They are.
15	Q. And are you familiar with the use of why they are
16	referred to as charters?
17	A. No, I do not know exactly why they are called
18	charters.
19	Q. Are you aware that the Hell Angle motorcycle club
20	is incorporated? Yes or no.
21	A. Yes.
22	Q. Are you aware that the death head that you may
23	I approach to see an exhibit, Your Honor?
24	Are you aware that the may I have freedom to
25	approach the witness?
26	THE COURT: Sure.
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1	Q. BY MR. HINGLE: Are you aware that the death head
2	which is pictured in Exhibit 4, and of course on the wall
3	in Exhibit 6, are you aware that that image is trademarked?
4	MR. BYERS: Objection, Relevance.
5	MR. HINGLE: Your Honor, I think it has a lot of
6	relevance. It has to do with whether or not this
7	organization is a California criminal street gang if
8	they're incorporated and they trademark their things and
9	they have attorneys that pursue them.
10	MR. BYERS: None of them including being a
11	California street gang.
12	MR. HINGLE: It certainly goes against his opinion
13	and its ability to cross-examine him on the basis of his
14	opinions as to whether or not he still thinks corporations
15	and structures of that sort actually are California
16	criminal street gangs, and that's where I'm trying to get
17	to.
18	THE COURT: The fact that people have attorneys
19	doesn't make them non-criminal. The fact that they are
20	organized and use trademark laws and other laws to their
21	benefit does not make them non-criminal. You can ask the
22	question, but it has about as much bearing as if asking if
23	the patches themselves are made in China. But go ahead.
24	Q. BY MR. HINGLE: Do you know whether or not that
25	death head is trademarked?.
26	A. Yes.
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1	Q. Do you know whether or not they enforce that
2	trademark with attorneys?
3	A. I do know that they have outlaw suits, yes.
4	Q. And you're also aware that they've sued other
5	entities for the use of the word words Hells Angels or
6	the use of their logos or designs, correct?
7	A. I have some basic knowledge that they have done
8	that, yes. I couldn't give you exact cases, no.
9	Q. Do you know how many how many members are in
10	the Santa Cruz County charter?
11	A. I believe approximately 12.
12	Q. Does Mr. Villagrana belong to the Santa Cruz
13	charter?
14	A. No.
15	Q. What charter does he belong to?
16	A. From the information I have he belongs to the San
17	Jose charter.
18	Q. And what is the source of that information that he
19	belongs to the San Jose charter?
20	A. Well, on the front of his patch has his charter
21	information, Hells Angels San Jose on the front of his cut
22	that was taken off the crime scene not the crime scene,
23	the accident scene.
24	Q. Okay. Are you aware how many members there are in
25	the San Jose chapter or charter of Hells Angels?
26	A. I would believe approximately 15.

1	Q. Now, as to as to Mr. Penna, San Mateo case you
2	spoke about?
з	A. Yes.
4	Q. You're not stating that he's a member of a Hells
5	Angels motorcycle club, correct?
6	A. That's an area that I'm trying excuse me. I'm
7	stating he is a member for the purpose of 186.22.
8	Q. I appreciate that, but that's not what I asked
9	you, sir. My question is, is he a member of the Hells
10	Angels motorcycle club pursuant to what you understand the
11	regulations of the Hells Angels motorcycle club?
12	MR. BYERS: Objection. Relevance.
13	THE COURT: Overruled.
14	Was he identified as a prospect?
15	THE WITNESS: Under the Hells Angels motorcycle
16	club he would be considered a prospect, yes.
17	Q. BY MR. HINGLE: And isn't it true do you have
18	any knowledge as to whether or not the Hells Angles meet
19	regularly on any day of the week? Regular meetings?
20	A. Yes. Once a week.
21	Q. And what day of the week is that usually?
22	A. I don't know what day of the week it is.
23	Q. Is it your testimony that you don't know what day
24	of the week the San Jose charter has weekly meetings?
25	A. I do not know the day of the week the San Jose
26	charter has meetings, no.

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1	Q. That would be the same as the Santa Cruz charter?
2	A. I do not know the day of the week, no.
3	Q. Do you have any inner knowledge of what occurs at
4	these weekly meetings, either the San Jose or the Santa
5	Cruz charter?
6	A. I've never been to a meeting, no.
7	Q. Have you ever gotten any information from anyone
8	as to what goes on inside those meetings?
9	A. Just speaking with other experts.
10	Q. And have they told you whether or not prospects
11	are allowed inside to discuss activities, or whether or not
12	they stay outside of these meetings?
13	A. My understanding is prospects are not allowed
14	inside.
15	Q. Just so we're clear, your understanding is that,
16	per the Hells Angels rules prospects are not allowed inside
17	the weekly meetings, and is your testimony that Joseph
18	Penna was a prospect I'm sorry, Sean Penna was a
19	prospect at the time of the 12/31/2009 crime, correct?
20	A. Yes.
21	Q. So as a prospect he would not have been able to
22	participate in the club as a full member, correct?
23	A. According to the club, yes.
24	Q. Now, you don't have any types of degrees in
25	behavioral science, correct?
26	A. That's correct.

1	Q. And have you ever studied any type of behavioral
2	science in relation to your work as a gang detective?
3	A. No.
4	Q. Now, you circled these you had a circle
5	You listed the primary activities of the Hells
6	Angels as murder, drug sales, illegal firearms, and illegal
7	possession. Do you recall that testimony?
8	A. I do.
9	Q. Now, I'm going to ask you specifically about a San
10	Jose charter of the Hells Angels motorcycle club.
11	A. Okay.
12	Q. I'm in essence limiting your prior testimony down
13	to a geographical area.
14	A. Okay.
15	Q. What is your opinion of the primary activities of
16	the San Jose charter of the Hells Angels motorcycle club?
17	A. I'm sorry? What's my opinion?
18	Q. What is your opinion as to what the primary
19	activities are of the San Jose charter of the Hells Angels
20	motorcycle club?
21	A. Crimes under 186.22, from possession of firearms
22	which we are discussing in this case.
23	Q. Anything besides specifically noting firearms,
24	are there any other of the enumerated crimes specifically
25	that you can point to as the primary activities of the San
26	Jose charter of the Hells Angels motorcycle club?

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1	A. Yes. I believe there's a member who has a case
2	against him for possession of a stolen firearm.
3	Q. Pardon me?
• 4	A. Possession of a stolen firearm.
5	Q. Anything besides illegal firearms and stolen
6	firearms?
7	A. Mr. Villagrana's assault with a deadly weapon in
8	Gilroy. That's Santa Cruz excuse me. I'm sorry.
9	That's also what we discussed here.
10	Q. Okay. Let's talk about that real quick. Isn't it
11	true that no charges were ever filed against Mr. Villagrana
12	is that case?
13	A. Yes.
14	Q. Okay. So you're using a police report in which
15	Mr. Villagrana was not even charged with a crime as a basis
16	of your opinion about him, correct?
17	A. Yes. I did not review the police report to make a
18	determination if he was guilty of a crime. I reviewed a
19	police report to try to form an opinion on his membership
20	of the Hells Angels.
21	Q. Let's talk about the most recent activity you
22	spoke about. You were asked a question as to whether or
23	not the San Jose incident of 6/25/11 was in your reports.
24	Do you recall that question?
25	A. No. I'm sorry? What was that question again?
26	Q. Do you recall the prior question from the
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1	prosecutor whether or not your reports referenced the
2	6/25/11 San Jose report involving Mr. Villagrana?
З	A. Whether my opinion document on Mr. Villagrana?
4	Q. Yes.
5	A. It does not contain that report.
6	Q. Okay. I just wanted to make that clear.
7	A. Yes.
8	Q. And as to that report you spoke to a member of the
9	intelligence unit, you didn't speak to the authors of that
10	report, correct?
11	A. Correct.
12	Q. And you don't know whether or not that intelligent
13	officer actually saw Mr. Villagrana wearing the cut, or the
14	vest on that date, isn't that true?
15	A. That's correct.
16	Q. So just so we're clear, the intelligence officer
17	never gave you any indication that she was present at the
18	scene on 6/25; is that correct?
19	A. That would be correct.
20	Q. So the source of your knowledge was speaking to an
21	officer who wasn't present on the scene but had presumably
22	read a report?
23	A. Correct.
24	Q. And as to the prior incident, did you speak to who
25	authored the report as to the Gilroy incident where
26	Mr. Villagrana was not charged with a crime?

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1	A. I'm sorry. There was like, I believe, seven
2	reports authored on that case.
3	No, I did not speak to those officers directly
4	about that case.
5	Q. Did you speak to any of the officers that authored
6	any of the reports concerning the Gilroy case that you
7	spoke of regarding Mr. Villagrana?
8	A. Not regarding that case, no.
9	Q. So then your basis of knowledge of the Gilroy
10	matter is from speaking to officers other than those that
11	actually wrote the reports investigating the crime,
12	correct?
13	A. No, I'm not saying that.
14	Q. What are you saying, then, if you didn't speak to
15	people who wrote the reports?
16	A. I'll make it clear. I did not speak to the
17	officers that had written those reports about those
18	reports. I did not speak to another officer about those
19	reports.
20	Q. Okay. Did you just read the reports yourself?
21	A. Absolutely.
22	Q. Okay. So your sole source of that incident is
23	based on the reading of the reports and that's it?
24	A. Absolutely.
25	Q. Going back real quick to the 6/25 matter. You
26	said that you believed Mr. Villagrana was cited?

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1	A. 6/25?
2	Q. 6/25 in San Jose. 6/25/11, this year.
3	A. Oh, yes. Yes. I'm sorry. I lost track of the
4	case. Yes.
5	Q. Have you actually run a criminal history to see
6	whether or not it shows he was arrested?
7	MR. BYERS: Objection. Relevance.
8	THE COURT: Overruled.
9	THE WITNESS: No, I did not run Mr. Villagrana's
10.	criminal history on that case.
11	Q. BY MR. HINGLE: Isn't it true that Mr. Villagrana
12	was not arrested, in fact, he was released from the scene?
13	A. Yes.
14	Q. And if he was released from the scene, then what
15	would he have been arrested for?
16	A. That was a citation.
17	THE COURT: It means it was either a misdemeanor
18	or an infraction.
19	MR, HINGLE: Okay.
20	Q. Now, you've testified that you had contact with
21	Mr. Villagrana. My question to you is when?
22	A. During the search warrant.
23	Q. Prior to that you did not have any personal
24	contact with him; is that correct?
25	A. No.
26	Q. No, it's not correct?

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1	A. I'm sorry. No, I have no contact with
2	Mr. Villagrana until the search warrant.
3	Q. Okay. Going back real quick to Mr. Penna.
4	Indicating in your testimony as to your belief that he was
5	a member of California criminal street gang that one of the
6	basis for that testimony was that his name showed up in
7	West Coast minutes. Do you recall that testimony? Do you
8	recall
9	A. I don't believe I spoke that Mr. Penna's name came
10	up in West Coast minutes.
11	Q. Okay.
12	THE COURT: Maybe it's in his report, but I don't
13	recall hearing that either.
14	Q. BY MR. HINGLE: To your knowledge, Mr you
15	don't have any knowledge of Mr. Penna's name appearing in
16	the West Coast minutes, correct?
17	A. No, I do not. I could get the information, but,
18	no, I do not know personally myself.
19	Q. I take it you've seen some West Coast minutes in
20	preparation for today's hearing at some point in the past?
21	A. I have seen them, yes.
22	Q. Okay. Let me ask you, do they specifically break
23	down the activities of the different charters?
24	A. They do.
25	Q. Okay. Have you ever seen any notations in any
26	West Coast minutes that the San Jose charter of the Hells

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1	Angels motorcycle club was planning, participating in or
2	committing any of the enumerated crimes?
з	A. I have only seen one West Coast minute, to be
4	clear, and that West Coast minute did not speak of the San
5	Jose chapter participating in any of the enumerated crimes
6	of 186,
7	Q. Did it speak of any Hells Angel members
8	participating in any of the enumerated crimes within Santa
9	Cruz County?
10	A. No.
11	Q. You also stated that you previously spoke to the
12	Hells Angels members. Other than Mr. Villagrana, who you
13	said you spoke to at the search warrant of his house, who
14	else have you spoke to?
15	A. I served a search warrant for Mr. Bettencourt.
16	He's now facing charges. I spoke to Mr. Bettencourt. He
17	was a member of the Santa Cruz chapter of the Hells Angels.
18	Q. I'm intricately familiar with Mr. Bettencourt's
19	cases as I represented him. And there were two search
20	warrants on his house. Did you participate on both of the
21	search warrants?
22	A. I did.
23	Q. And did you speak to him on both occasion?
24	A. No. Only on the first one.
25	Q. And other than Mr. Bettencourt and Mr. Villagrana,
26	are there any other members you've spoke with?

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1	A. I spoke to Mr. Macias. I've spoken to Mr. Torres.
2	Q. They are in the Santa Cruz chapters, correct?
3	A. Correct.
4	Q. And just so we're clear, Mr. Bettencourt is from
5	the Santa Cruz chapter, as well, correct?
6	A. Correct.
7	Q. Besides those gentlemen you just mentioned from
8	the Santa Cruz chapter, and Mr. Villagrana, any other Hells
9	Angels that you've spoken with?
10	A. Not the ones other than the ones it mentioned that
11	I can recall at this time.
12	Q. Have you ever been present when any other officer
13	spoke to any other Hells Angels members?
14	A. Yes.
15	Q. Other than those ones you listed right there?
16	A. Yes.
17	Q. Okay. What specifically were any of those members
18	from the San Jose charter?
19	A. Not that I can recall, no.
20	Q. Okay. Were they from the San Cruz charter but not
21	yet named by you, if you recall?
22	A. Yes.
23	Q. Was that location within Santa Cruz County?
24	A. Yes. It was in Santa Cruz County.
25	Q. In any of those conversations, did any of them
26	have any discussions with you about the primary activities,

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1	being murder, drug sales, illegal firearms, or anything
2	any other enumerated crimes?
3	A. No.
4	Q. Okay. Just so we're clear, then, you never had a
5	Hells Angel member say our primary purpose are the
6	commission of these crimes which are enumerated?
7	A. That's correct.
8	Q. Within Santa Cruz County in the last within a
9	five year period prior to the arrest of Mr. Villagrana in
10	this case, can you name any Hells Angel that was convicted
11	in Santa Cruz County of an enumerated crime? Yes or no.
12	MR. BYERS: Objection. Relevance.
13	THE COURT: Overruled.
14	THE WITNESS: In the last five years?
15	Q. BY MR. HINGLE: Yes.
16	A. No.
17	Q. Within I'm not going to go to every charter
18	with this. I'm just going to go over San Jose for the next
19	one.
20	Within the last five years of the arrest of
21	Mr. Villagrana, are you aware of any San Jose charter
22	members being convicted of any felonies?
23	A. Of any felonies?
24	Q. If it makes it easier I'll let me just say any
25	of the enumerated crime felonies?
26	A. No, not to my knowledge.
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1	Q. Okay. Just one other well, that's okay.
2	Now, as to this Scott Sutton case in Ventura
3	County, isn't it true that
4	THE COURT: Before we get into that, Counsel, it's
5	three o'clock. We'll take a 15 minute break. Be back at
6	3:15.
7	(Recess taken.)
8	THE COURT: Let's continue, Mr. Hingle.
9	Q. BY MR. HINGLE: Mr I'm sorry.
10	Deputy, do you have any facts upon which you can
11	state that the Defendant knows Mr. Penna, the gentleman
12	from San Mateo you spoke about?
13	A. Do I have any document that shows Mr. Villagrana
14	knows Mr. Penna?
15	Q. Yes.
16	A. I do not.
17	Q. Do you have anything undocumented, do you have any
18	knowledge that Mr. Villagrana knows Mr. Penna or
19	Mr. Penna's activities?
20	A. No.
21	Q. Same question except as to to Mr. Sutton in
22	Ventura. Do you have any opinion as to whether or not
23	Mr. Villagrana knows of Mr. Sutton's activities in Ventura
24	as by you as testified here today by you?
25	A. No.
26	Q. Do you have any knowledge that Mr. Villagrana has
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1	any relationship with the Ventura charter?
2	A. No.
3	Q. Do you have any knowledge as to whether or not
4	Mr. Villagrana has any relationship with the San Mateo
5	charter or strike that. The Daly City charter?
6	A. No.
7	Q. The San Mateo charter would fall under the Daly
8	City charter, correct?
9	A. Mr. Penna was wearing Daly City prospect on that
10	patch.
11	Q. And Mr. Sutton was wearing Ventura member indicia,
12	correct?
13	A. At the time he was stopped, correct.
14	Q. Neither one of those individuals was either
15	charged with a substantive gang crime or gang enhancement,
16	correct?
17	MR. BYERS: Objection. Relevance.
18	THE COURT: Overruled.
19	THE WITNESS: I don't believe either one there
20	actually was a filing for a 186.22.
21	Q. BY MR. HINGLE: In either case?
22	A. I'm sorry?
23	Q. I'll try to slow down, too.
24	Just so we're clear, to your knowledge neither
25	Mr. Penna or Mr. Sutton in cases you testified to were even
26	charged with the substantive crime or of being a California
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. 1	criminal street gang member or the enhancement, correct?
2	A. That is correct.
3	Q. Can you point to one Hells Angels member within
4	the State of California that is convicted of either the
5	substantive offense or the enhancement to California
6	Criminal Street Gang Act within five years of
7	Mr. Villagrana's arrest in this case?
8	MR. BYERS: Object. Relevance.
9	THE COURT: Overruled.
10	THE WITNESS: Not in the last five years that I
11	can recall, no.
12	Q. BY MR. HINGLE: Just so I'm clear. You can't
13	point to one Hells Angel member in the State of California
14	that's ever been convicted of the charge in this case
15	within five years of Mr. Villagrana?
16	A. Convicted, no.
17	Q. Within the State of California outside of the five
18	year period, can you point to any case in which there has
19	been a Hells Angel member convicted of the substantive
20	crime as charged in this case? By that I mean a California
21	criminal street gang.
22	A. I believe there was one out of King County or
23	Fresno County, but I believe that is well past your five
24	years. And I don't have any actual knowledge, it's just
25	what I've heard.
26	Q. Notwithstanding that you can't point within the

1	last five years to one person in the State of California
2	that is a member of the Hells Angels motorcycle club that
З	has been convicted of substantive charge or enhancement,
4	it's still your opinion that the primary activities of the
5	Hells Angels motorcycle club is the commission of the
6	enumerated acts; is that correct?
7	A. Yes.
8	Q. But there doesn't seem to be any convictions to
9	back up that opinion; would that be correct?
10	MR. BYERS: Objection. That misstates the
11	testimony, Your Honor.
12	THE COURT: What you were saying is there's no
13	convictions to back up the conviction.
14	MR. HINGLE: I'm sorry. I'm sorry.
15	THE COURT: The conviction if that's his
16	opinion.
17	MR. HINGLE: Bad, bad question.
18	Q. BY MR. HINGLE: You stated that it's unlawful to
19	discharge a firearm in the unincorporated area of Santa
20	Cruz County in which this weapon was found. Do you
21	remember that testimony?
22	A. Where the accident occurred, correct.
23	Q. Where the accident occurred?
24	A. Correct.
25	Q. What statute prohibits that? Is there a county
26	ordinance?

1	A. I'm sorry?
2	THE COURT: Thère is one. I voted for it, but
3	it's not relevant to anything in this case.
4	MR. HINGLE: Thank you. Move on.
5	Q. Now, you testified that murder, drug sales, and
б	illegal firearms were the primary activities of the Hells
7	Angels motorcycle club. You cited a couple of cases, both
8	of which had firearms, Mr. Sutton and Mr. Penna.
9	A. Correct.
10	Q. My question to you is, can you cite any case in
11	which there were convictions of murder for any Hells Angle
12	members within five years of the arrest of Mr. Villagrana
13	in this case?
14	MR. BYERS: Objection. Relevance as to
15	conviction.
16	THE COURT: I'm sorry. Can you restate the
17	question again, please?
18	MR. HINGLE: Certainly.
19	Q. You said that murder is the primary one of the
20	primary activities of the Hells Angels. Within the last
21	five years what murders within the State of California can
22	you point to in which someone was either arrested for
23	murder, prosecuted for murder, or convicted for murder?
24	A. I believe in San Diego a member shot and killed a
25	Mongol. I don't remember the exact circumstance. But
26	but I will be honest, I am not sure of the exact date. It

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1	could very well be with that prior five years you're
2	discussing. So, yes.
3	Q. Other than that one case, were there any other
4	murders involving people being arrested, charged or
5	convicted that you know of?
6	A. Well, Mr. Delano, I believe, was charged with
7	murder. I'm not sure what county. Somewhere in the
8	Central Valley.
9	Q. You're not sure what county it was?
10	A. I'd have to guess. But I'm not sure exactly what
11	county it was.
12	Q. Okay, Drug sales. Can you point to any can
13	you point to any we've already talked about Santa Clara,
14	San Jose, Santa Cruz charters, so I'm excluding those
15	because we've asked those questions. Can you name any
16	other Hell Angles members within the last five years of the
17	arrest in this case that have been convicted for drug ,
18	sales?
19	A. Not in I'm sorry. I'm sorry.
20	What chapters are we discussing again? These
21	questions are getting kind of long. I'm sorry.
22	Q. I'm not talking about Santa Cruz or San Jose
23	charters. I'm talking about any other charters in the
24	State of California.
25	A. Okay.
26	Q. Can you point to me any cases in which any members
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1	of any of those charters have been arrested, prosecuted or
2	convicted of a drug sale within five years of the date of
3	Mr. Villagrana's arrest?
4	A. No.
5	MR. HINGLE: Just a moment, Your Honor, if I may.
6	Q. Now, you stated that Santa Cruz County Task Force
7	has been in operation for almost a year, correct?
8	A. Correct.
9	Q. And you also stated that one of your jobs, duties
10	I should say, is identification of gangs and gang members,
11	correct?
12	A. Correct.
13	Q. Are there any internal files that the task force
14	keeps on Hells Angels members?
15	MR. BYERS: Objection. Calls for discovery.
16	THE COURT: Sustained.
17	Q. BY MR. HINGLE: Are there any internal files
18	are there any internal files that you reviewed in coming up
19	with any of the opinions that you've opined today that come
20	solely within Santa Cruz County Task Force? Yes or no.
21	A. You said like field interview cards and contact
22	reports? They're common record. I mean, there are
23	counties and other agency's police reports.
24	Q. There's no internal there's no internal book or
25	wall or photo where you've got listed all the Hells Angels
26	members from all the various charters, correct?

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1	A. I don't have a book with Hells Angels members, no.
2	Q. There's no records you keep on Hells Angel members
Э	within the Santa Cruz County Task Force, correct?
4	MR. BYERS: Objection. Calls for discovery.
5	THE COURT: Sustained.
6	Q. BY MR. HINGLE; Now, of the Hells Angel members
7	that you've spoken to personally, they've all admitted that
8	they were members of the Hells Angels motorcycle club,
9	correct?
10	A. Yes. I believe all that I've asked have admitted.
11	Q. No one's ever denied no member that you asked
12	whether or not he was, in fact, a member ever denied being
13	a member, correct?
14	A. Correct.
15	Q. Other than Mr. Bettencourt's case and
16	Mr. Villagrana's case, what other Hells Angels cases have
17	you participated on?
18	A. Case involving Randy Healy. He's a member of the
19	Santa Cruz chapter of the Hells Angels.
20	Q. Was that for one of the enumerated crimes under
21	the act?
22	A. Yes. Possession of a controlled substance for
23	sales.
24	Q. That case is still ongoing, correct?
25	A. Correct.
26	Q. Besides those three cases, Mr. Bettencourt, that

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1	gentleman, and Mr. Villagrana, are there any others?
2	A. No.
3	Q. Comparing that to, say, Norteno cases?
4	A. Okay.
5	Q. You participated in a lot more Norteno cases than
6	you would, say, Hells Angels cases? Would that be correct?
7	A. That would be fair to say.
8	Q. Same thing with Sureno cases within Santa Cruz
9	County?
10	A. Yes, that would be fair to say.
11	Q. Are you aware of whether or not there's a formal
12	membership application that's filled out by people who want
13	to become members of the Hells Angels motorcycle club?
14	A. I'm not aware of that, no.
15	Q. Do you know whether or not Mr. Villagrana has any
16	prior convictions for anything?
17	A. I'm not looking at his criminal I know he did
18	have a prior felony conviction. I do remember that from
19	the case involving a firearm.
20	Q. Other than the San Jose gang intelligence officer
21	you spoke of, Officer Walosy?
22	A. Ski. I can't pronounce her name. Sorry.
23	Q. Are there any other officers that you can
24	specifically name that you've spoken with in coming to the
25	opinions that you've expressed here today regarding
26	Mr. Villagrana?

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1	A. Officer Croucher who did the truck stop on
2	Mr. Villagrana that we discussed.
3	Q. In San Jose?
4	A. Correct.
5	Sergeant Darias from the L.A. Police Department
6	who's part of the task force that served the search warrant
7	for us for Mr. Villagrana. Officer Lindsey from the
В	Ventura Police Department that has the knowledge of the
9	cases of Sutton and other members of the Ventura Hells
10	Angels. Mr. Jorge Blanco from WSIN. Western States
11	Intelligence Network. So it's W-S-I-N.
12	I've spoken to him on many occasions and received
13	training and worked with him on cases.
14	MR. HINGLE: Thank you very much, Officer. That's
15	all of my questions.
16	THE COURT: Mr. Byers?
17	MR. BYERS: Thank you, Your Honor.
18	REDIRECT EXAMINATION
19	BY MR. BYERS:
20	Q. Detective, we had talked during your testimony, or
21	you talked during your testimony a little bit about
22	prospect and member as it relates to the Hells Angels own
23	consideration? •
24	A. Uh-huh.
25	Q. In essence, my understanding of your testimony was
26	according to the Hells Angels you can be a member or a

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1 prospect or nothing; is that correct? 2 Ά. Correct. They have their own definitions of who 3 everyone is. 4 ο. Do you share their definitional concept of what a 5 member of the Hells Angels is? 6 Α. No. 7 Tell us what is, in your opinion, the difference Q. 8 between a prospect and a member and what a member of the 9 Hells Angels is? 10 Well, I think as we have already discussed a Α. 11 member can have use of the death head insignia, and that 12 they go to church, while the prospects are not allowed to go into the church. But the idea -- excuse me, the status 13 14 of a prospect, this is a person who is sponsored by a 15 member, who's overseen by a member, who is voted on for his 16 membership, is voted on by the membership. Actually, a 17 unanimous vote by the chapter. This is a person who if doesn't meet certain criteria -- not certain criteria, 18 19 there's not lids, but a certain performance, I would say, 20 then they are actually not allowed to become members. These prospects, I have seen and I have been told 21 22 from people who have seen West Coast chart mems (phonetic), and the one I have seen, that prospects -- there's new 23 24 prospects this chapter as this guy is prospect for that 25 chapter. So these people are identified and given status 26 within the Hells Angels club, so therefore I do carry the K

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1	opinion that they are members for a 186 standpoint.
2	Q. Thank you.
3	And you mentioned there was 20 different charters
4	or chapters in California?
5	A. Correct.
6	Q. Roughly.
7	And what members or associates of those
8	charters also consider themselves to be members of the
9	Hells Angels as a whole?
10	A. Yes.
11	Q. Are the charters, the 20 different or so charts in
12	California, are they connected in the same activities as
13	the Hells Angels as a whole?
14	A. Yes.
15	Q. Were they do you consider members or well,
16	members of the charters to be members of the Hells Angels
17	as a whole?
18	A. Yes.
19	MR. BYERS: Thank you. I have no further
20	questions.
21	RECROSS-EXAMINATION
22	BY MR. HINGLE:
23	Q. Deputy, what did you mean when you stated that you
24	believe members of the individual Hells Angels charters are
25	also members of the Hells Angels as a whole?
26	A. It's an organization. So, yes, if you're a member
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1	of the San Jose chapter or the Santa Cruz chapter, you are
2	still a membership under the Hells Angels as a whole. As
3	you referred to, they're a corporation.
4	Q. Would it be would it be an accurate description
5	that the Hells Angels as a whole is an umbrella group and
6	every charter would be a subset of that main umbrella? The
7	Hells Angels are a big group, correct?
8	A. It's a world wide organization.
9	Q. Okay. World wide organization composing of a lot
10	of different charters, correct?
11	A. Correct.
12	Q. You testified as your opinions as to the Hells
13	Angels within the State of California as to whether or not
14	they are a California criminal street gang, correct?
15	A. That is correct.
16	Q. Is it your opinion, then, that every single member
17	of every single charter within the State of California is
18	also a member of a California criminal street gang?
19	A. Sir, are you asking me if all the members of the
20	Hells Angels are a member of a criminal street gang?
21	Q. All the members of every single charter in the
22	State of California, whether they are all members of a
23	California criminal street gang in your opinion?
24	A. Yes.
25	Q. Is it your opinion that all the members actively
26	participate with each other in the enumerated activities,

1 even though they come from separate charters? 2 Α. Are you -- I'm sorry. Can you define "with each 3 other"? 4 ο. Sure. Okay. Let's use better terminology. 5 Is it your -- is it your opinion that every Hells 6 Angels member of every single charter within California 7 willfully promotes, furthers or assists any other Hells 8 Angels member within the state in their felonious criminal 9 conduct? 10 MR. BYERS: Object. Relevance and vague. 11 THE COURT: Overruled. Just testing his expert 12 opinion. 13 It is my opinion that members of the THE WITNESS: 14 Hells Angels are members of a criminal street gang. 15 BY MR. HINGLE: I appreciate that. So is it your ο. 16 opinion that every single member of every single charter willfully promotes, furthers and assists all the other 17 18 members in the felonious conduct? 19 Α. Yes. 20 And is it your opinion that every single member of Q. 21 every single charter has knowledge that the other members 22 are engaged in the pattern of criminal gang active? 23 Α. Not direct knowledge that that person is, that 24 person is, that person is, no. 25 So it would be fair to say that someone from San ο. 26 Jose may not know the activities of individual members in

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l	Ventura, correct?
2	A. That would be fair so say, yes.
3	Q. And people in Santa Cruz County may not know the
4	individual actions of Ventura members, correct?
5	A. That could be fair to say, yes.
6	MR. HINGLE: Thank you. No further questions.
7	MR. BYERS: Just real quick question, Your Honor.
8	FURTHER REDIRECT EXAMINATION
9	MR. BYERS:
10	Q. When you say they may not know, are you speaking
11	of their knowledge of specific activities or knowledge of
12	the criminal nature of the organization?
13	A. I'm talking about specific activities. I might
14	not know that, you know, John Doe does this exact crime.
15	Q. Would individual members of each individual
16	charter have knowledge of the criminal nature of the
17	Organization?
18	A. Yes, I do believe they would.
19	MR. BYERS: Thank you. I have no further
20	questions.
21	THE COURT: All right. Thank you Deputy Simpson.
2,2	You're excused.
23	MR. BYERS: Your Honor, People move People's
24	Exhibits into evidence. I'm not sure if I got higher than
25	5.
26	THE CLERK: Six.

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1	MR. BYERS: One through 6.
2	THE COURT: Any objections?
3	MR. HINGLE: I have no objection except to one.
4	If I may look, Your Honor?
5	THE COURT: Which?
6	MR. HINGLE: Well, actually, as to all the
7	photographs I. Would object to all of them because they
8	have not been identified as being representations of
9	likenesses of the scene at the time they were taken.
10	There's been no testimony from the officer as to that.
11	As to the rap sheet purported from San Mateo
12	County on Mr. Penna, I would I would object to that
13	because that is not a certified court document. It's not a
14	certified copy of a conviction. And it's the basis of
15	that has not been shown to the Court so that the underlying
16	reliability of it can be established for its use.
17	Submitted.
18	THE COURT: You're correct that it's not a
19	certified court document. It's only certified by the
20	sheriff as being something out of their own records. I
21	have no certified court documents with regard to
22	Mr. Sutton's conviction in Ventura County.
23	I'll sustain the objection to Exhibit 3.
24	MR. BYERS: Your Honor, I could as to the rap
25	sheet. It's a governmental record. Pursuant to the Penal
26	Code that information is required by law to be entered into

1 as evidence, or not as evidence, in a database and required 2 to be kept in a database pursuant to convictions in courts. 3 There's a case that I could recite in the office which I 4 could retrieve which talks about which requirements under 5 the Government Code and Penal Code require that that б information be accurately reported ---7 THE COURT: That gets you around the hearsay 8 objection, but doesn't make it possible for me to take 9 notice of the truth of the things in there. Whereas a 10 certified conviction record I could actually assume that 11 he's convicted. MR. BYERS: Your Honor, it's a governmental 12 13 record. THE COURT: It doesn't matter. I'm not going to 14 15 find -- I'm going to find Mr. Penna is not a member of the 16 Hells Angels and you can't use it as a predicate offense in 17 any event. The other documents are all admitted. Everything 18 19 but 3. 20 Any other witnesses? 21 MR. BYERS: Just if I could ask the Court if I 22 could have leave for five minutes I can bring the case that 23 cites of that certified rap sheet is admissible for the 24 truth of what's contained inside of it. I think even if the Court was make -- it could still make its indicated 25 26 ruling Mr. Penna is not a member and allow in the rap sheet

BYERS: I do not, unfortunately. 6 But I have 7 entered in rap sheet -- certified rap sheets in this very 8 Court numerous occasions prior under the Governmental records exception. Because in essence people are tasked 9 10 and required to report such information, and that is a 11 certified document that is a certified government record 12 exception to the hearsay requirement. And the Court can 13 still rule the way its indicated that it doesn't believe that Mr. Penna is a member and allow that in as evidence. 14 15 MR. HINGLE: Your Honor, for it to come under the certified governmental records exception they would have to 16 17 prove that not only was there a duty for the body to 18 perform the act, but the act was performed in a timely 19 manner, from the -- the writing has to have been written 20 within a timely manner from the time the event happened and 21 conviction. They have no evidence that they can present before 22 23 you as to how long it was entered into the date after that conviction even if it wasn't correct. And I think there's 24 25 a distinguish whether or not you can use a certified 26 printout from the a sheriff's office from one county versus

2	MR. BYERS: That is from this County. It's a
З	governmental record. Under the law people are required to
4	report, such as your clerk, to report information to the
5	California Department of Justice to, again, establish as a
6	governmental record pulled out of the database by the
7	sheriff's department and certified as accurate.
8	THE COURT: That's fine. I'm actually going to
9	admit it. It is a document that we rely on all the time.
10	Although I know there's right now a major controversy going
11	on over reliability generally of these DOJ records because
12	there's often records of arrests and no matching
13	convictions. But this does actually state that Mr. Penna
14	was convicted of a gun offense under 12025. I would say
15	that many of the problems with the gang aspect of this
16	case.
17	Do you have any other witnesses?
18	MR. BYERS: People rest.
19	THE COURT: Any witnesses for the defense?
20	MR. HINGLE: No.
21	THE COURT: All the exhibits are admitted.
22	(People's Exhibit 1 through 6 received into
23	evidence.)
24	THE COURT: Argument.
25	MR. BYERS: Your Honor, in this case, and I would
26	imagine that you'd like me to focus specifically on the

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1	gang evidence, at least the existence of the criminal
2	street gang. That evidence was testified to by the expert.
3	He talked about a global organization, the Hells Angels,
4	which primary activities were ones that he opined were
5	the ones enumerated; they have three or more members, a
6	common name or identifying sign or symbol. All the
7	elements were testified to by the expert. And as we are
8	looking at here is a probable cause hearing. This is a
9	very minimal standard. In essence, if you have some
10	evidence to support the elements of the crime that's
11	presented here, then the Court should issue a holding
12	order. Clearly a preliminary hearing is not meant to spend
13	hours and hours and hours proving beyond a reasonable doubt
14	what is and isn't to be true. The only requirement here is
15	probable cause. So certainly
16	THE COURT: The only purpose of a preliminary
17	hearing that I've been able to figure out is it's filter
18	for getting rid of bad cases. It has no other real
19	purpose.
20	MR. BYERS: I think, in essence, a bad case would
21	be one that the People did not present some evidence as to
22	each element of the crime. In this case, I think the
23	Court's projecting its opinion of the case. But the People
24	have presented evidence to each element of the crime, which
25	requires a holding order. And that's why I was here,
26	that's why we're here, is to present evidence to show there

1 is some evidence to suggest probable cause as to each 2 element of the case. And the People through its two 3 witnesses establish probable cause to establish that the 4 Hells Angels is a criminal street gang under the 186.22(a) 5 and that Mr. Villagrana is an active participant in that 6 gang, and that he committed the felony of possessing a 7 loaded unregistered firearm on our streets. 8 So while it may have the purpose of getting rid of 9 cases -- or weak cases, but that's -- it's not weak. It's 10 cases where elements of offense were not proven. And in 11 this case regardless of the Court's opinion of the case as 12 a whole, elements to each -- evidence as to each element

13 were presented and I ask the Court to issue a holding 14 order.

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THE COURT: Mr. Hingle.

16 MR. HINGLE: Your Honor, this case, there should 17 not be a holding on Count 1, because there is failure on two counts by the People. There's been insufficient 18 19 evidence of primary activities of the gang. While the 20 officer testified that initial primary act, murder, drug 21 sales, illegal firearms of the Hells Angels, and that was 22 as a group as a whole in the State of California. When we 23 asked him what he can point to within the last five years, 24 murders, none. Drug sales, one. And two cases with 25 firearms for members from Ventura, and none of which 26 occurred anywhere close to Santa Cruz County.

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1 As to the second portion of it, the insufficiency 2 of the evidence required for the predicate acts, I think 3 the officer's testimony while he tries his might to say 4 that a prospect he considers him a member for the purposes 5 and that they can use that for a predicate act, but it was 6 very clear that prospects aren't allowed in meetings, they 7 sit outside of the weekly meetings, they clearly have a different status as the Hell Angels member, as such how 8 could they be found to come within a group for which they 9 are still trying to become. That's the whole point of 10 11 being a prospect. They're trying to rise up to a member. 12 They're not there yet, so a conviction of a prospect cannot 13 be used to show anything of the membership of the group as 14 a whole. Maybe he's gonna make it. Maybe he's not. We don't know that he didn't get kicked out of Daly City 15 16 because of the arrest in this case.

17 You can't use a prospect as a probable because with that they've got insufficient priors other than to 18 19 show Mr. Sutton's gun. Mr. Sutton's gun we've not no conviction information whatso. There's no certified prior 20 21 packets on either one of these individuals. And then when you look at really the argument of the group as the whole 22 23 and then the charters, they want to paint it as a huge 24 organization. The case law is held that just painting 25 someone as a Norte without more, if you know they are a 26 subset, if you can't find enumerated offenses and primary

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activities within this subset, then you really do not have
 a gang crime with that subset.
 Here we've got a specific subset. The San Jose

4 charter. Absolutely no enumerated offenses. No one within5 the last five years even has got anything on the radar.

6 Okay. Let's look at territory in Santa Cruz. No 7 one from the San Jose charter has been arrested within 8 Santa Cruz within the last five years. The two cases that 9 he did cite is one for drug sales and one for possession of 10 a firearm.

11 If the People were going to try to argue that the 12 current case could be used as a predicate, which the law does allow them to do, my argument is this, I don't 13 14 think -- I think there is stuff to talk about on two -- on 15 Count 2, but you have to be able to prove that the 16 possession of the gun was with the intent to further 17 activities of the group in order for that to be used as a 18 prior in this case.

What we've got is the gun, and the testimony was 19 Mr. Villagrana was lying on the ground, wasn't even seen by 20 the officer who testified, the second officer. The weapon 21 22 was supposedly found by a civilian and turned over to 23 another police officer in the location. The weapon is not 24 registered under the Department of Justice. There is nothing to show that Mr. Villagrana had exclusive 25 26 possession of that weapon. There's nothing to show that

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1	Mr. Villagrana had constructive possession of that weapon.
2	And under the law, the People have to be able to prove one
3	or the other. There's no evidence that Mr. Villagrana was
4	even conscious on the ground, Your Honor. No one said he
5	was conscious. How can someone if there's not any proof
6	that he was conscious on the ground be said to have
7	possessed something, either constructively or personally?
8	And the answer is, I think, as a matter of law you can't.
9	What we've got is a motorcycle on the ground. We've got a
10	gun found, we've got a gun found next to it, and
11	Mr. Villagrana has already left the scene and being
12	treated. I don't think that's enough to hold on 2, but
13	certainly not enough for 1. And even if you find a holding
14	on 2, that's not sufficient to use that act as a predicate
15	to find holding on 1.
16	And I submit.
17	MR. BYERS: Briefly, Your Honor. You heard
18	evidence well, as to the primary activities, firearms
19	possession can be a primary activity. We have evidence of
20	that right now. Also evidence in the prior cases. You
21	heard evidence of Penna and of Sutton and the Defendant.
22	Counsel is certainly correct, he could be a predicate
23	offender.
24	I think by looking at the photograph where the gun
25	was at where all that property from Mr. Villagrana's
26	motorcycle landed, I think it's pretty clear that he
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1	possessed it. I don't know if that's an issue.
2	THE COURT: Actually, the only evidence is that
3	it's so unlikely that a gun would be lying all by itself in
4	a public street. But that's really all you have, actually.
5	MR. BYERS: Right. And when a witness that came
6	to the accident picked up the gun and walked to where a
7	person was giving aid to Mr. Villagrana, that would seem to
8	indicate that it was there right after the accident. I
9	think the picture really suggested that.
10	THE COURT: After the accident. The question is
11	was it there before the accident. We really don't know.
12	MR. BYERS: And the probably cause sense I think
13	it's probable that a gun was not just laying in the middle
14	of
15	THE COURT: That's what I'm saying. All you got
16	is the unlikely event that a gun is just going to appear on
17	a public street by itself. But actually you have nothing
18	more than that.
19	MR. BYERS: At this point presented to the Court,
20	sure.
21	I think I've presented, or at least argued
22	sufficient for the probable cause that the Court issue a
23	holding order on all charges.
24	THE COURT: I don't find there's sufficient
25	evidence to hold Mr. Villagrana with regard to Count 1 for
26	all the reasons cited by Mr. Hingle.

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What you've got here -- your only evidence of gang activity is -- you can't really use Mr. Penna's conviction because I think your evidence is clear that he's a prospect. The expert testified that he did actually have to get voted in in order to participate in meetings of the organization and actually know how the organization works.

7 Your testimony is that he was a prospect, and I В don't think given the way -- the reach that's being made ° 9 here to reach a gang crime in this case where your expert 10 can't identify any felonious active other than a gun offense in Ventura County and a gun offense in Santa Cruz 11 12 County is sufficient enough to make out a pattern of gang 13 activity in this case where you have subsets. And you have subsets where the testimony is that they actually voted in 14 15 their own members without control from outside the subset.

With regard to Count 2. Count 2, the original pleading of violation 12025.1 doesn't apply, because it has to be a gun on your person or in a vehicle. And I don't think you can be within a motorcycle. You're outside the motorcycle.

So I'm not going to hold him in regard to Count 1.

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Count 3 is possession of an unregistered weapon. I have a suspicion that, in fact, Mr. Villagrana was in possession of the gun and it fell off his person when the motorcycle went down.' And I'll hold him with regard to that charge.

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1	Note that it's a wobbler. So it might not have
2	been a predicate offense in any event. Holding order with
3	regard to the amended complaint Count 3 which is charged as
4	a violation of 12031(a)(2)(f) which is having possession of
5	a firearm that's not registered with DOJ.
6	THE CLERK: So discharged on Counts 1 on 2?
7	THE COURT: Yes.
8	THE CLERK: And do you want the exhibits returned?
9	THE COURT: You want your exhibits back? Any
10	objections to that?
11	MR. BYERS: Yes, sir.

9	415, and 2010 a 415. So he's been involve in acts of the

11	THE COURT: That just means that he hangs out at
12	Joe's Bar in Boulder Creek.
13	MR. BYERS: Those numerous different elements
14	which the Court should consider before reducing to a
15	misdemeanor, one of which is this man was
16	THE COURT: The main one is the weight of the
17	evidence, which in this case mostly sides with
18	Mr. Villagrana and the fact that, although, you know, I
19	would like to think that the Hells Angels are a criminal
20	street gang, which is my own generic belief, I don't have
21	sufficient evidence to support that in this case. And
22	Mr. Villagrana does not have a significant criminal record.
23	And he had a gun, which apparently all Americans are
24	allowed to have as many as they want, except that his
25	wasn't registered.

4	the Court doesn't have all the information here before it.



FACTS:

3 NOTIFICATION:

On 03-17-2011, at approximately 1747 hours, I received a call from Monterey Communications Center (MCC) advising of a motorcycle traffic collision with ambulance in route on Soquel Dr at State Park Dr. I arrived on scene at 1754 hours.

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1 STATEMENTS:

<u>Party #1 (P-1) (Villagrana):</u> was interviewed at Valley Medical Center on 03-17-2011, and stated he was driving Vehicle #1 (V-1) (Harley Davidson) eastbound on Soquel Dr at an unknown speed. P-1 related he could not remember the collision or how the collision occurred. P-1 stated he had not consumed any alcohol or drugs prior to driving.

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Party #2 (P-2) (Prentice): was contacted at the scene and related he was driving Vehicle #2 (V-2) (Honda) eastbound on Soquel Dr. P-2 stated he was traveling at about 5 mph, with his left turn indicator on, preparing to make a left turn. P-2 observed Vehicle #1 (V-1) (Harley Davidson) in his rear view mirror approaching at a high rate of speed. V-2 came to a stop and P-2 felt an impact to the rear of V-2. P-2 observed Party #1 (P-1) (Villagrana) become ejected from V-1 and continue in an easterly direction and collide with the roadway. V-1 continued in a easterly direction and collided with the front of Vehicle #3 (V-3) (Toyota).

Party #3 (P-3) (Opland): was contact at the scene. P-3 stated she was driving Vehicle #3
(V-3) (Toyota) at the time of the collision. P-3 related she was traveling westbound on
Soquel Dr at approximately 25 mph. P-3 stated she observed V-2 stopped in the left turn

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1 CAUSE:

Party #1 (P-1) (Villagrana) caused this collision by driving in violation of California Vehicle Code section 22350 which states in part: No person shall drive a vehicle upon a highway at a speed that is greater than is reasonable or prudent having due regard for weather, visibility, the traffic on the highway, and in no event at a speed which endangers persons or property. P-1 was driving V-1 at a speed greater than conditions would allow, and subsequently collided with the rear of V-2.

The Cause was established by statements, and physical evidence.

13 RECOMMENDATIONS:

CASE SUMMARY:

On 3-10-11 at 1747, Santa Cruz County Sheriff patrol deputies were dispatched to assist the California Highway Patrol with a traffic accident that had just occurred on Soquel Dr in Aptos. The accident was reported to CHP as a vehicle versus a motorcycle and the motorcyclist was on the ground and had a handgun. Deputies Jalon Harris and Chuck Beckman arrived a few minutes later and found a damaged, black 2002 Harley Davidson motorcycle lying on the roadway. Several yards south of the motorcycle was an injured male lying in the roadway. The motorcycle's license plate CA 16E6615 returned registered to Cesar Villagrana at 6870 Rosanna St in Gilroy. Deputy Beckman assisted the motorcyclist and identified him as Cesar Villagrana. Deputy Harris located a witness on scene who was holding a handgun wrapped in a towel. Deputy Harris took possession of this handgun. The witness showed Deputy Harris where he located the handgun. Deputy Harris found the location to be approximately four feet from the damaged motorcycle and twenty to thirty feet from where Villagrana was laying. The area where the handgun was found was near several items of debris that appeared to have come out the of the motorcycle's hard-sided saddlebag.

The motorcycle had severe front end damage and the right side saddle bag had broken off and was also in the roadway a few feet south of the motorcycle. Numerous items of debris were scattered along the roadway near the saddlebag.

The handgun was a black semi-auto Tarus PT101 AF .40 cal. Deputy Gonzales attempted to run the serial number for the handgun but found it was not registered to Villagrana. Deputy Gonzales contacted Agent Kearns from the ATF and had him run the serial number. Agent Kearns found the gun was last sold in 1994 to a subject out of Montana.

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Villagrana was wearing a black leather vest with the full three piece Hells Angels patches on the back. His motorcycle helmet and motorcycle had a Hells Angles stickers as well as a Hells Angles pouch. Additionally, a Hells Angels t-shirt was located.

On 4-1-11, an arrest warrant for Villagrana along with a search warrant for his residence, 6870 Rosanna Street, Gilroy, CA was obtained. On 4-6-11, Law Enforcement executed the warrant. Villagrana was arrested and his residence searched. During the search, multiple items of indicia relating to membership in the Hells Angels were located including: numerous rings with Hells Angels logos, numerous Hells Angels patches, motorcycle parts with Hells Angels logos, numerous shirts with Hells Angels logos, and Hells Angels artwork.

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INFORMATION ON THE HELLS ANGELS STREET GANG:

The Hells Angels are an outlaw motorcycle gang. An outlaw motorcycle gang is an organization whose members utilize their motorcycle gang affiliation as a conduit for criminal enterprises. The criminal activity of outlaw motorcycle gangs are generally conspiratorial and include crimes such as murder, extortion, drug trafficking, and weapons violations.

Motorcycle gangs first came to the attention of law enforcement in 1947, during a motorcycle rally in Hollister, California, that was sponsored by the American Motorcycle Association (AMA). A fright broke out at the rally between members of two motorcycle gangs. Two members were arrested and other members descended on the jail to seek the release of their friends. This resulted in a riot in the town involving several gangs. The confrontation demonstrated motorcycle gangs' potential for violence and intimidation. The president of the AMA was interviewed after the incident and made the statement that 99% of the motorcycling public were honest, law abiding citizens and that only 1% were trouble makers. Outlaw motorcycle gangs still claim the 1% image to this day.

After the incident, membership in one of the gangs involved, the Pissed Off Bastards of Bloomington, increased. On March 17th 1948, some of the members left the club and created the Hells Angels and moved to San Bernardino California. Over the years, the Hells Angels have expanded both in the United States and throughout the world. Today, the Hells Angels have over one hundred charters in the United States and have charters in over 25 countries worldwide. The Hells Angels have maintained a chapter in Santa Cruz County for the past several years.

The Hells Angels have a hierarchical rank structure. Members in leadership positions maintain formal titles such as, President, Vice President, Secretary/Treasure and Sergeant-at-Arms. Membership into the Hells Angels is an exclusive, formal and lengthy process. Prospective member must move through several membership phases including being an Associate, then a Hang-a-Round, then a Prospect and then, after a vote by the membership, a full patch member. People that are African American or affiliation with law enforcement are excluded from membership.

Hells Angels, like other gangs, wear clothing and associate with symbols that identify them as gang members. These clothing and symbols help elevate the status of a member with the gang and the criminal community. The Hells Angels display their membership by wearing a vest with a set of three separate patches that is referred to as their "Colors" or "Cuts." The top patch or "rocker" displays the name of the gang, "Hells Angels." The middle patch displays the winged skull symbol of the gang, known as the death head. The bottom rocker displays the region the member is associated with, such as California, France, etc. These colors or cuts are sacred and only members are allowed to wear them. The Hells Angels Corporation owns the rights to words "Hells Angels" and the death head symbol. Members also tend to possess numerous other Hells Angels indicia including clothing, jewelry, artwork, photographs, plaques, patches and stickers. These items are considered property of the gang. Hells Angels associate with the colors red and white and the number \$1 (8=H, 1=A).

Over the years, the Hells Angels have feuded with rival outlaw motorcycle gangs throughout the United States and worldwide. Many of these rivalries are over control of territory and criminal enterprises. Some of these rivals include the outlaw motorcycle gangs Mongols, Vagos and Outlaws. These rivalries have led to violent confrontations, including in Laughlin, Nevada were two Hells Angels members were shot and killed and one Mongol member was stabled to death.





<u>03-17-11</u> Cesar Villagrana was in a traffic accident on Soquel Dr in Aptos, California. During the traffic accident, Villagrana was injured and his motorcycle was damaged. Villagrana was found to have been in possession of an unregistered handgun. Villagrana had been wearing a black leather vest with the following patches: on the back a Hells Angels, death head logo, California and on the front was a San Jose patch. On Villagrana's motorcycle there were three circular Hells Angels stickers that were on the top of the gas tank. During the investigation, a member of the Santa Cruz Hells Angels chapter responded to the accident scene.





Members of the Santa Cruz County Gang Task Force served a search warrant at 6870 Rosanna St in Gilroy, the listed address for Cesar Villagrana. During the search, officers located numerous items indicia relating to the Hells Angels criminal street gang including: approximately forty shirts/sweatshirts in the closet that had logo/writing associated with the Hells Angels, approximately fifteen rings and a belt buckle that had Hells Angel's logos, two manila envelopes that



contained patches associated with the Hells Angels, three manila envelopes containing stickers associated with the Hells Angels, three wool caps with logos associated with the Hells Angels, a banner with the phrase "Filthy Few San Jose", a 2010 Hells Angels Monterey Toy Run banner, and numerous other items associated with the Hells Angels. In the garage, Law Enforcement located a motorcycle (16H7558) that was registered to Villagrana and had Hells Angels stickers the gas tank and side. Additionally a photograph Villagrana and Elliot "Cisco" Valderrama, the President of the Oakland Chapter of the HA, was located.











This information is documented in Santa Cruz County case number 10-02482.

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11-05-10 San Jose Police Officer Croucher conducted a traffic stop on a 2002 Harley Davidson motorcycle 16E6615 that was being driven by Cesar Villagrana. Officer Croucher noted on a Field Interview card that Villagrana was wearing a three patch Hells Angels vest, a Hells Angels support tee shirt and a helmet with a Hells Angels support sticker. The motorcycle had various Hells Angels support stickers on the crank case cover. Villagrana told Officer Croucher that he was a member of the Hells Angels.

<u>9-18-07</u>

Gilroy Police officers respond to a fight at Claddagh Irish Pub in Gilroy. Villagrana and a male named Benjamin Carrasco were found to have been in a physical altercation with two males. Villagrana had been wearing a black leather vest with "San Jose" and "Prospect" on the font and a bottom "California" rocker and "MC" patch on the back. Carrasco had been wearing a Hells Angels support shirt. Prior to the altercation becoming physical, Villagrana is confronted by the victims and during the argument, he points to the Hells Angels patch on the front of his vest. During the fight, Villagrana throws a bar stool at the victims and chases after one of them while holding a knife.

This information is documented in Gilroy Police report #07-5839.



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186.22(a) PC - Gang Member Defined

Based on the above information, it is my opinion that <u>Cesar Villagrana is an active</u> participant in the *Hells Angels* criminal street gang because:

- He committed the crime charged in this case while wearing a full patch Hells Angels vest.
- During the search warrant from 4-6-11, Villagrana was in possession of numerous items with writing, logos or artwork associated with the Hells Angels.
- He was contacted in 2010 wearing a full patch Hells Angels vest and admitted to the officer that he was a member of the Hells Angels.
- In 2007, he got into a bar fight while wearing a Hells Angels prospect cut.

Based on the above information, it is my opinion that Cesar Villagrana has knowledge that the *Hells Angels* gang members engage in, or have engaged in, a pattern of criminal gang activity because:

- He personally committed an offense listed in Penal Code section 186.22(e).
- He had a framed "Filthy Few" banner hanging on bedroom wall. The term Filthy Few refers to a member who commits an act of violence for the gang.
- He had a tee shirt that had "In loving memory Papa Frisco." This shirt was referring to Mark "Papa Frisco" Guardado who was murdered in 2008. The suspect in that case was a member of the rival Mongols motorcycle gang.
- He had in his possession items related to the Laughlin Nevada incident.

Based on the above information, it is my opinion that <u>Cesar Villagrana willfully promotes</u>, <u>furthers or assists felonious criminal conduct by members of the Hells Angels criminal street gang because:</u>

• He was in possession of a loaded, unregistered, concealed firearm.

186.22(f) PC - Criminal Street Gang Defined:

Any ongoing organization, association, or group of three or more persons

The Hells Angels have three or more members.

Whether formal or informal

• The Hells Angels is a formal gang that has structure, hierarchy and organization. The Hells Angels have multiple chapters throughout the county and most chapters have a president, vice president, secretary and Sgt at Arms. Prospective members have to submit an application and pass a probationary period.

Having as one of its primary activities the commission of one or more of the criminal acts enumerated in paragraphs (1) to (33), inclusive, of subdivision (e),

• The Hells Angels have been involved in assaults, extortion, homicide, weapon charges and drug offenses.

Having a common name or common identifying sign or symbol,

 Some signs or symbols associated with Hells Angels are: Hells Angels, the Deathhead, 81, Big Red Machine, Filthy Few and the colors Red and White. And whose members individually or collectively engage in or have engaged in a pattern of criminal gang activity:

Ventura Police Department #09-13013 / Ventura County Superior Court Case 2009037017 PC §§ 12021, 12316, 12031, VC § 2800.1

On 9-24-2009, a Ventura Police Officer attempted to stop a vehicle being driven by Scott Robert Sutton DOB 2-15-68. Sutton did not yield and a pursuit ensued. During the pursuit, officers observed Sutton throwing an item out of the vehicle while on Byron Avenue. Sutton eventually pulled over and was arrested for evading a peace officer. Officers determined the object Sutton threw out of his vehicle while on Byron Avenue was a handgun and ammunition. Sutton was arrested for weapons charges. Sutton had a large Hells Angels death head tattoo on his back with the words "Hells Angels Ventura MC" tattooed around it. Sutton was wearing a belt buckle that had the words "Hells Angels member since 1995 Scott Sutton." On 10-9-2009, Ventura Police served a search warrant for Sutton's address and located numerous items related to the Hells Angels including: A full patch Santa Barbara vest, stickers, pins, photographs, plaques, clothing and paperwork. Sutton pled guilty to being a felon in possession of a firearm. Ventura County Court Docket # 2009037017.

South SF Police Department #09-9468 / San Mateo County Superior Court SC070882A PC §§ 186.22, 12020, 12025, 12031, H&S § 11350

On 12-31-2009, a South San Francisco Police Sergeant conducted a traffic stop on a motorcycle being driven by Sean Joseph Penna DOB 12-4-1975. Penna was found to be driving on an expired license. A search of Penna found he had a loaded revolver underneath his leather vest, an illegal belt buckle knife and Vicodin pills on his person. A search of Penna's motorcycle found an illegal ball peen hammer in a saddlebag and a 7" knife attached to the frame. During the incident, Penna was wearing a leather vest with the patches "Prospect" and "Daly City" on the front and a back bottom rocker of "California." He was also wearing a black hooded sweatshirt and a black tee shirt with Hells Angels writing. Penna's motorcycle had several Hells Angels support stickers attached to it. Penna pled to being in possession of a loaded firearm. San Mateo County Court Docket # SC070882A.

On 3-17-11, I was assigned to the Santa Cruz County Gang Task Force and riding with Deputy Gonzales. We were both in uniform and in a marked Sheriff's patrol vehicle. At approximately 1747 hrs, I heard over the radio Netcom dispatching a deputy to assist the California Highway Patrol (CHP) with a traffic accident that had just occurred in Aptos. The call was for a vehicle that had struck a motorcycle. The motorcyclist had reportedly flown 60 feet in the air and was down on the pavement. Netcom updated the incident by reporting that a possible bystander had pulled a gun from the pocket of the motorcycle rider and was holding the gun in a non threatening manner.

Deputy Gonzales and I responded from Watsonville. Santa Cruz County Sheriff's Detective Harris arrived on scene a few minutes later and took possession of the firearm (refer to Detective Harris' supplemental report for information on the condition of the firearm and where it was located when he arrived). Detective Harris reported over the radio that the motorcyclist had been wearing a Hells Angels clothing.

Deputy Gonzales and I arrived at approximately1803 hrs and found Deputy C. Beckman, Shearer and Zube already on scene. I saw a black Harley Davidson motorcycle lying down on its right side in the middle of the road. The front end of the motorcycle had considerable damage and it was leaking fluids. Spread out in front of the motorcycle all over the roadway were various items that appeared to have came off the bike during the accident. These items included, but are limited to, the right side trunk, a black bag, numerous small tool bags, a "mag" flashlight, a black helmet, clothing (where the motorcycle victim had been lying), and various automotive debris. Deputy Beckman and Gonzales took several digital photographs of the scene which showed the above mentioned debris (refer to Supplemental Reports).

The motorcycle's license plate, CA 16E6615, was ran through the DMV database and came back registered to Cesar Villagrana. Deputy Beckman identified the motorcycle victim as Cesar Villagrana. The vehicle that struck the motorcycle sustained driver side front end damage. I did not see any of that vehicle's doors/trunk open and it did not appear that any items came from out of the interior of that car during the accident.

I met with CHP Officer Tanguay who was conducting the accident investigation. Officer Tanguay told me that he now had possession of the firearm, later determined to be a Tarus .40 cal semi-auto handgun, and it was in the trunk of his patrol car. Officer Tanguay and I decided that the Sheriff's Office would investigate the circumstances surrounding the firearm and they would investigate the accident. Officer Tanguay told me he collected the firearm from Detective Harris and unloaded it. Officer Tanguay told me the firearm still had a magazine inside when he collected it. He removed the magazine and noticed it was loaded with several rounds. Officer Tanguay told me there was no round in the chamber when he unloaded it. Officer Tanguay turned possession of the firearm over to me, which I placed in the trunk of my patrol car. The firearm was not loaded at that time and the slide was locked back.

I then spoke to Jim McGinley who approached me at the scene. McGinley told me worked for First Alarm and responded to the accident. McGinley told me that he was working for First Alarm as a

security guard on this day and in uniform. He was standing by the Rite Aid store (approximately 100 yards from crash site) when he head the sound of a traffic accident coming from Soquel Dr near Aptos Rancho Rd. He ran over and saw a subject lying in the middle of the street and a motorcycle down in the roadway on Soquel Dr. He went over to the injured motorcyclist and saw he was struggling to breath. He held Villagrana stable while waiting for paramedics to arrive. A male walked over to him and tired to hand him a black Beretta or Ruger handgun that he had just found. McGinley instructed him to give to one of the deputies that were arriving on scene. McGinely left the scene when medical personnel arrived.

While investigating the accident scene, I walked over to where Villagrana had been lying when treated by medical personnel. At this time, Villagrana had been transported by AMR and all that was left in this area was a black leather vest or "cut", a black thermal shirt and a red flannel shirt, all of which had been cut off and left in the roadway by medical personnel. On the top back of the vest was a white patch that had the words "Hells Angels." In the middle of the vest was the trademarked Hells Angels death head logo. Under the death head was a white "California" patch. On the front bottom left side was a white "San Jose" patch. These patches Identified Villagrana as a full patched member of the Hells Angels. Deputy Gonzales and I collected this vest and several other items that had Hells Angels logos on them (refer to Deputy Gonzales Supplemental Report).

FIREARM INFORMATION


The firearm was a black semi-auto Tarus model number PT 101 AF. The caliber was .40 SW and the serial number was SML 34817 D. On 3-18-11, Deputy Gonzales ran that serial number, but it returned not registered. Deputy Gonzales photographed the handgun and booked it into Sheriff's Property. Along with the handgun, Officer Tanguay gave me the magazine which had been inside the gun when it was recovered on the scene. Deputy Gonzales and I later unloaded the magazine and found ten .40 cal rounds had been in it. The magazine was photographed and booked into Sheriff's Property.

186.22 PC INFORMATION

The Hells Angels is a world wide recognized motorcycle club with over 75 chapters in the United States. The Hells Angels also have chapters in over thirty countries internationally. Their name and logo (death head) are trademarked and they have their own web site (<<u>www.hells-angles.com></u>). Hells Angels members have been documented carrying firearms on their person and motorcycles/vehicles. The Hells Angels are a documented criminal street gang in the state of California.

Prior to the accident, the San Jose Police Department had information that Villagrana was a member of the Hells Angels motorcycle gang. Deputy Gonzales and I collected several Hells Angels related items including the black vest, a helmet with a Hells Angels sticker, a Hells Angels tee shirt, a black bag with the Hells Angels death head and Villagrana's motorcycle had three Hells Angels stickers on the top of the tank. Based on the above information, I believe Villagrana is a member of the Hells Angels criminal street gang

As I was leaving the accident scene, I noticed Christopher Hecht ride up and park his motorcycle near the accident site and walk towards the CHP officers who were still on scene. I know Hecht from





prior incidents and know him to be a full patch member of the Hells Angels and the president of the Santa Cruz Chapter. Based on Hecht's response to the accident, I believe Villagrana is still an active member of the Hells Angels and in good standing.

Based on the officers at the scene, the firearm was found in close proximity to the motorcycle crash and Cesar Villagrana, leading me to believe that the gun either came from Villagrana's person or the motorcycle. The firearm was considered loaded under 12031(g) PC due to having a loaded magazine attached. Under 12025(B) PC it is illegal for a person to have a concealed, concealable firearm that is not registered with DOJ to themselves.

INVESTIGATION CONTINUING. I am conducting further follow up on Villagana's association with the Hells Angels.

SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT

On 03/17/11, at approximately 1751 hours, I was working uniformed patrol within the county of Santa Cruz. At around the above listed time I responded along with several deputies to a vehicle accident involving a motorcyclist near 7851 Soquel Drive.

While responding dispatch advised that a the motorcyclist was possibly in possession of a handgun. I arrived on scene and observed Deputy Beckman providing care to the motorcyclist I also observed Detective Harris in plain clothes standing near the sidewalk talking to a group of people. I approached Det. Harris and asked how I could help. Harris showed me a black semi-automatic handgun laying on the ground where he was standing. He quickly told me that the firearm had been recovered by Cyrus Mozayan who was standing near by. Harris asked me to stand by with the firearm as he retrieved his camera and photographed it.

Det. Harris cleared the scene and asked me to interview Mozavan. I observed CHP Officer Tanguay collect the firearm, made it safe and secured it.

I then spoke with Cyrus Mozayan and collected the following information.

STATEMENT OF CYRUS MOZAYAN

Mozayan was wearing full medical style "scrubs". He explained to me that he was a medical doctor and was on his way home from work. Mozayan told me that he was traveling south bound on Soquel Drive when he observed the a motorcycle speed past him in a heavy traffic area. Mozayan estimated the speed of the motorcycle to be approximately "60 mph". He watched the motorcycle approach the controlled intersection in front of Safeway and observed the motorcycle turn into the "turn lane" and "run the red light". Mozavan further explained that as soon as he went through the intersection he collided with the two involved vehicles.

Mozayan drove to the scene, parked and began walking over to where the motorcyclist, Cesar Villagrana, was laving. He noticed that several bystanders were already helping him. Mozayana noticed a black handgun laying on the ground and assumed it belonged to Villagrana because his other property from the bike was strewn about the roadway. Fearing a bystander with bad intentions would get a hold of the firearm. Mozavana picked it up and walked it approximately 20 feet away and set it on the ground. When Det. Harris arrived Mozayana alerted him of the firearm. Mozayana pointed to the location of where he remembered picking up the firearm. He pointed to a spot on the left side of the street in between the wreck motorcycle and where Villagrana was currentyl laying. It was approximately 10-15 feet from Villagrana.

Mozayana did not have any additional information.

On 3-17-11 at 5:51 P.M I responded to 7851 Soquel Dr. in Aptos Ca. for a report of vehicle accident involving a motorcyclist who was hit by a car and was possibly killed. Net. Comm. advised the motorcyclist, later identified as (C-1) CESAR VILLAGRANA, was on the pavement and in his pocket was a handgun. While driving to the scene Net. Comm. advised a bystander pulled the gun away from VILLAGRANA.

When I arrived on scene I saw VILLAGRANA was laying on his back in the middle of Soquel Drive. I walked up to VILLAGRANA and started assisting by stabilizing his neck. Other citizens were also assisting VILLAGRANA and VILLAGRANA was breathing and moving. I saw VILLAGRANA was wearing a helmet and a black leather jacket with Hells Angels emblems on the jacket. Santa Cruz Sheriff's Detective JALON HARRIS was on scene and had the gun secured.

One of the citizens who was assisting VILLAGRANA handed me a business card holder. Inside the holder were two California Department Of Motor Vehicle copies of VILLAGRANA'S drivers license information. After I wrote down some information from the copies I placed the card holder back inside one of VILLAGRANA'S shoe which was in the street with other personal effects belonging to VILLAGRANA. On 3-18-11 I had our records section printout a copy of VILLAGRANA'S California Department Of Motor Vehicles Image Record. The photo on the record matched the person who I assisted at the accident.

Once the paramedics arrived on scene they took over treating VILLAGRANA. I took several photos of the scene and submitted them into evidence. I was in patrol unit 081 and the car cam video as working. The video was activated at 5:40 P.M

NARRATIVE

On 3-17-11 at approximately 1750 hours, I was off-duty in civilian clothes in an unmarked Sheriff's vehicle. I was on Soquel Drive coming up on State Park Drive in Aptos. CA. I heard via my in-car radio that there was an accident involving a motorcyclist at 7851 Soquel Drive in Aptos, CA. I also heard via NetCom that the motorcyclist had a handoun. I came upon the accident scene and saw a damaged motorcycle and two damaged cars. There where no other first responders on scene. There were also numerous bystanders standing on the side of the road. I saw a group of people around a man lying on the ground wearing a helmet in the middle of the road. I saw that the helmet had what appeared to be Hells Angels stickers on it. There was a First Alarm guard near the man lying on the ground. I saw that the man, later identified as (S01) Cesar Villagrana, was breathing and his eyes were open. I asked him if he was okay but he did not answer and had a blank stare. I saw that one of the bystanders was holding Cesar's head still. I then asked the First Alarm guard where the handgun was. The guard pointed out a man standing on the sidewalk wearing blue scrubs and said that he had the gun. I walked over to the man, later identified as (C01) Cyrus Mozayan, and I saw that he was holding a handoun and a knife wrapped in a green towel. I identified myself to him and asked him to set the gun on the ground which he did. I saw that the handoun had a magazine in it and that the safety was off (reference photos). Lasked Cyrus where he found the gun? Cyrus pointed out where he found the gun which was approximately four feet from the motorcycle and 20'-30' from where the rider was laving on the pavement. Cyrus told me that he just picked it up to keep it safe. I saw that the gun had been near some other items that looked to be from the saddlebags of the motorcycle. I saw that there was an open hard-sided saddlebag near the handgun on the ground (reference photos). The saddle bag looked like it had come off the motorcycle.

At that point, Deputy C. Beckman arrived on scene and began to care for Villagrana.

I then ran the damaged motorcycle's license plate (CA License 16E6615) through NetCom. NetCom told me the motorcycle was registered to Cesar Villagrana out of Gilroy, CA.

I then placed my badge on the ground where Cyrus said he found the gun. I took a photo of that area and the entire accident scene. I also took photos of the gun in the condition that Cyrus found it. The gun appeared to be a Taurus type black semi-automatic handgun. I later booked the photos into CSI. CHP Officer Tanguay then came over, took possession of the firearm, and unloaded it.

Deputy C. Shearer arrived on scene and spoke further with Cyrus. I then cleared the scene.

NARRATIVE:

On 3/17/11 I was assigned to the Santa Cruz County Gang Task Force (SCCGTF) and partnered with Dep. Simpson. We were in SCCGTF uniform and operating a marked Sheriff's Office patrol vehicle while conducting street enforcement in the Watsonville area of Santa Cruz County. At approximately 1747 HRS I heard a radio dispatch for patrol regarding a Hells Angels member who was involved in a motorcycle accident in front of the Chase bank located near the intersection of State Park Dr. and Soquel Dr. in Aptos. Dep. Beckman later identified the rider as Cesar Villagrana (S1).

Det. Harris had secured a firearm that appeared to have come from the motorcycle and/or the motorcycle rider. Several CHP units went to the scene and we responded from Watsonville to assist in any possible criminal investigation stemming from the gun possession. As we arrived on scene SCSO deputies and CHP officers were managing the accident scene and had already spoke with several witnesses. Refer to the attached supplemental reports for these interviews.

Dep. Simpson spoke with the CHP officers and the CHP supervisor on scene and determined that we would conduct the investigation for the firearm possession. I began to photograph the general scene of the accident. I also photographed several items of Hells Angels (H.A.)paraphemalia that were strewn about the roadway from the motorcycle. I noted that a Hells Angels "cut" or vest had been cut off the rider (by EMS) and was lying on the ground. I photographed the vest, a red and white keychain, the motorcycle (with 3 H.A. stickers on the console), a half-helmet with an H.A. sticker on the back and two red bandanas. Dep. Simpson and I collected the items as evidence. I also collected a cellular phone and an lpod as evidence, pending a search warrant for the information contained within each item. Dep. Simpson retrieved a Taurus PT-101.40 caliber handgun (S/N SML34817D) from a CHP officer that was holding the gun in his vehicle.

After the items had been photographed and collected, Dep. Simpson and I left the scene as CHP was concluding the accident investigation. As we began to drive away towards State Park Dr. I saw another motorcycle rider park a motorcycle in the Safeway parking iot and begin to walk towards the scene. The rider was not wearing a helmet, and recognized the man from previous investigations to be Christopher Hecht. I know from these investigations that Hecht is a documented member of the Hells Angels and the Santa Cruz Chapter President.

I later photographed the items of gang paraphernalia, the firearm and ammunition/magazine. I booked all items of evidence into Sheriff's Property. I later booked all scene photographs and the photographs of the evidence into Sheriff's CSI. I contacted the San Jose PD Intelligence Unit and requested any gang information regarding Villagrana (as he is a Santa Clara County resident) be forwarded to our office for further follow-up.

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

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

NARRATIVE

On 11-02-11, I was assigned to the Investigations Division of the Santa Cruz County Sheriff's Office. ADA A. Byers called me and requested I come to Department 7 of the Santa Cruz County Courthouse to take court ordered DNA swabs from (S01) Cesar Villagrana. Detective C. Clark and I met with ADA Byers. ADA Byers told me that the Honorable Judge A. Symons had ordered two sets of DNA buccal swabs be taken from Cesar Villagrana. One set was to be compared to the firearm found where Cesar crashed in Aptos and the other was to be entered into the criminal DNA database (CODIS). ADA Byers took myself and Deputy C. Clark to where Cesar was waiting with his attorney. I asked Cesar for his ID card which he showed me. I wrote down Cesar's CA DL Number (B1543695) and asked Cesar his DOB (06-01-75). Cesar provided it. I then instructed Cesar on how to rub the cotton tip applicators that collect the DNA specimens on the inside of his cheeks. Cesar then complied and provided two sets of DNA buccal swabs (for a total of 4 swabs). I then had him place the DNA swabs in two separate evidence envelopes. I then left the courthouse and sealed the DNA envelopes. I then placed the swabs into Sheriff's Office Property.

SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT

Over the past week, I have conducted follow-up investigation regarding this case and the suspect Cesar Villagrana. During the original investigation, I determined Villagrana was a member of the Hells Angels Motorcycle Club, a criminal street gang as defined in 186.22(f) PC. On 3-31-11, I authored a search warrant for Villagrana's residence at 6870 Rosanna St in Gilroy for gang paraphernalia. On 4-1-11, Honorable Judge Almquist signed the search warrant. On 4-5-11, SCCGTF Inspector Sulay walked through an arrest warrant on Villagrana for 12025 PC and 186.22 PC.

On 4-6-11, myself and SCCGTF officers Sulay and Gonzales met with Gilroy Police to assist us with the service of the search and arrest warrant. We met with members of Gilroy PD's Anti Crime Team (ACT), including Sgt Deras and officers Roccaforte, Remmick, Guerin and Rocha. At approximately 0900 hrs, we served the search warrant. Sgt Deras knocked on the front door and announced "Gilroy PD, search warrant, open the door." Approximately thirty seconds later, Villagrana answered the door and was detained in handcuffs. Officers entered the residence and contacted Villagrana's parents, Miguel Reynoso and Catalina Reynoso. Both Miguel and Catalina were PAT searched and I had them sit, not handcuffed, in the living room.

Once the house was cleared, I met with Villagrana and explained the search and arrest warrant. Villagrana told me he would not speak to me without an attorney. I did not question Villagrana regarding this case. I provided Villagrana with a copy of the search warrant which he had me give to Miguel.

The house was a single story, single family residence with three bedrooms and an attached garage. I found the bedroom nearest the front of the residence to be Villagrana's. The bedroom next to it belonged to Miguel's other son, also named Miguel Reynoso. The back bedroom was Miguel and Catalina's. Prior to searching, I took numerous digital photographs of the residence.

I determined the front bedroom was Villagrana's from the large amount of indicia that I located inside it, including: Villagrana's wallet with his CDL, a Kaiser insurance card in Villagrana's name, several medication bottles in Villaragna's name, numerous paperwork with Villagrana's name on them and Villagrana told me it was his bedroom.

Inside Villagrana's bedroom, I located a large amount of Hells Angels paraphernalia. Hanging on the north side wall was a "Filthy Few San Jose" banner in a wood frame. Next to it on the same wall was a red banner in a black frame that had the words "Hells Angels San Jose and the death head logo. Next to the Hells Angels banner was a frame that contained nine cards that contained the name Hells Angels or Hells Angels art work including the death head. Hanging on the east wall was a framed poster for the December 10, 2010 Hells Angels Monterey Toy Run. This poster appeared to have nine autographs on it from other Hells Angels members including "Big Wikle, Gary, Chris, Lil Rick and Jack. I believed these were Hells Angels members due to most have HAMC (Hells Angles Motorcycle Club) written into or next to the name. I took several photographs of these framed banners. I collected the Filthy Few

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banner and the Toy Run poster and booked them into Sheriff's Property.

Hanging inside the closet, I found approximately forty shirts/sweatshits that had Hells Angles writing or artwork on them. I photographed these items and collected the following twenty shirts:

1. White tee shirt with the following writing: "1st Anniversary Hells Angels Los Angels, September 2008 and the death head.

2. Black tee shirt with: Hells Angles MC, United States and the death head.

3. Same black tee shirt as #2.

4. Black tee shirt with: In loving memory of Papa, Frisco, with the death head.

5. Black tee shirt from the 2003 New Hampshire World Run, including Hells Angels writing and death head.

6. White tee shirt, same as #1.

7. Red sweatshirt with the following writing: San Jose 40, Jim Elrite 35 years, Jimmy Arnett 15 years, Hells Angels San Jose and the death head.

8. Red tee shirt for 2010 Brass Knuckle Run.

9. Black tee shirt with Hells Angels MC Richmond with the death head.

10. Black tee shirt with Hells Angles MC on front and AFFA on back.

11. Black tee shirt with the following writing on front: "I dont believe in heaven I dont believe in hellwhen I diem I'm going to paradise my brothers are waiting for me" RIP Boomer July 26, 1940

February 2, 2011. Hells Angles MC Forever and death head on back.

12. Blue tee shirt with Hells Angels MC Frisco on front and HA art work on back.

13. Black tee shirt with Hells Angles MC New York and death head.

14. Gray tee shirt with Hells Angels NC N.Sacto, AFFA, LONESOME, TONY PONI, LEONARD, ERIC, HANGTOWNon front and Hells Angels Sacramento with death head on back.

15. Black tee shirt with Hells Angels 30 years SFV on front.

16. White tee shirt with Parker, AZ, South Run 2009 on front and Hells Angels MC Forever with death head on back.

17. Black tee shirt with Williams , AZ, South Run 2007 on front and Hells Angles MC Forever with death head on back.

18. White tee shirt with Hells Angels West Coast on front and Hells Angels 2010 North Run on back.

19. Black collared shirt with Hells Angles MC California and death head on back.

20. Red collared shirt with Hells Angels Santa Cruz California and death head on back.

Also in the closet, sitting on the top self was a gray baseball cap with "Hells Angels 20 years Vallejo" and the death head on the front. On the top shelf of the closet, I found two leather wrist guards with the death head stamped on them. I collected these guards and booked them into Sheriff's Property.

Deputy Gonzales and I searched the dresser in the bedroom. In the top drawer we located the following items:

1. An Apple Ipod Touch case. This was the type case an Ipod comes from the store in. I know from experience that Ipod cases have the serial number for the Ipod that was sold in it. This case had the following serial number: 9C926SA5201. This serial number matched the serial number for the Ipod Touch that I found at the scene of the accident. I photographed and booked this case into Sheriff's Property.

2. Seven manilla envelopes. Two contained numerous Hells Angels patches. Three contained

numerous Hells Angles stickers. One contained business cards, several with Villagrana's name on them. One contained four Hells Angels bandanas. All these items were photographed and booked into Sheriff's property.

3. Two sliver metal motorcycle crankcase covers with the following logo: Hells Angels MC San Jose and the death head. I photographed and booked these into Sheriff's property.

4. A purple Crown Royal velvet liquor case that contained numerous CD's. Refer to Deputy Gonzales supplemental report for information on what was on these CD's.

5. Three watch caps, two red, one black that had Hells Angels name or logo on them. I photographed and booked these into property.

6. Four red bandanas. I also found approximately five other red bandanas that I did not collect.

7. Two two page roster sheets for Hells Angels members. I photocopied these rosters as evidence and booked the originals into Sheriff's Property. Also with the rosters were two Hells Angels Motorcycle Corporation agreement contacts. These contacts were not filled out. I photocopied these forms and booked the originals into Sheriff's Property.

On top of the dresser was a jewelry box that contained approximately 15 Hells Angels rings. I collected nine of these rings from the box, a gold death head belt buckle and two death head patches and an Hells Angles logoed card. I booked these items into Sheriff's Property.

I collected several items of indicia that was located on the bedroom TV case. These items included an envelope that was address to Villagrana at 6870 Rosanna St in Gilroy. I also took several photographs of indicia that was in the bedroom.

On the coffee table was were two hand written notes from a male believed to be Tom Schmidt. In these notes, Schmidt talks about needing money, taking some of the "stuff" and making six times as much, and wanting to come out and transport the stuff instead of mailing it. I booked these notes into property. Also on the coffee, I located an Express Mail envelope. Inside the envelope was a photograph that included Villagrana with two other Hells Angels members and a had written note from "Tom" stating he wants to set up a pipeline and make some real money. The envelope was addressed Johnny Glenn at 681 Parkdale Dr in Campbell from Tom Schmidt at 23 Edge Hill Rd in Wappingers Falls NY. I contacted the New York State Troopers and forwarded them the information regarding Schmidt and possible drug trafficking.

In the garage, Inspector Sulay found a brown leather hand gun holster. It appeared to be designed for a revolver. This was found on a bench inside a hard hat. Near the holster (approximately two feet) was a red bandana with "45" in black on it. I photographed these items and booked them into Sheriff's Property. Also in the garage was a black motorcycle with the CA license plate of 16H7558. It had modified Hells Angels death head stickers on the tank and a Hells Angels California sticker on the crankcase. The license plate came back to a 1998 Harley to Villagrana at 6870 Rosanna St in Gilroy. I took several photographs of this motorcycle.

I arrested Villagrana for his warrant out of Santa Cruz County. Villagrana told me he wanted to be booked on the warrant at the Santa Clara County Jail. I transported Villagrana to the Gilroy Police Department and turned him over to Sgt Deras to be booked.

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

On 7-20-11, I was involved in a preliminary examination for Cesar Villagrana involving this case in the Santa Cruz Superior Court, Department 5. Villagrana was not held on the 186.22(a) PC charge, being an active participate in a criminal street gang by Honorable Judge Almquist. As part of the ruling, Judge Almquist found the investigation could not show Villagrana had sufficient knowledge of criminal activities committed by Hells Angels members in chapters outside Santa Cruz and Santa Clara Counties, primarily with Ventura Chapter member Scott Sutton and Daly City member Sean Penna.

On 8-11-11, I authored a search warrant for the two cellular phones that were in Sheriff's Property. This search warrant was signed by Honorable Judge Volkmann. The first was an orange Casio Boulder (Serial #CVDK0696639). This cell phone had been found at the accident scene on 3-17-11 and seized at that time by the Santa Cruz County Gang Task Force. The second cell phone was a gray LG (serial # 809KPGS0284919) and had been found in Villagrana's bedroom during a search warrant at Villagrana's residence, 6870 Rosanna St Gilroy, on 4-6-11. I would like to note that both of these cell phones were search during the course of the warrant of 4-6-11 for gang indicia and were not loaded. At the time of those searches, I did not deem any significant gang indicia existed on the phones.

On 8-17-11, I searched the phones per the warrant. I found the orange Casio had a damaged charging receiver and was unable to be downloaded or recharged. Due to this I was only able to briefly view the contents on that phone. I scrolled through the contact list, but did not seen a contact that I would believe to have been for Scott Sutton, Sean Penna.

I then searched the gray LG cell phone. This phone was capable of being download via cellebrite machine. I download the contents of this phone including the properties, contact list, text messages and photographs. The cell phone was not supported for me to download the call histories. On this phone, | did not see any contacts that I believed would have been for Sutton or Penna.

| printed a copy of the LG phone download and booked it into Sheriff's Property as evidence. | booked the two phones back into Sheriff's Property.

On 3-17-11, I was assigned to the Santa Cruz County Gang Task Force and riding with Deputy Gonzales. We were both in uniform and in a marked Sheriff's patrol vehicle. At approximately 1747 hrs, I heard over the radio Netcom dispatching a deputy to assist the California Highway Patrol (CHP) with a traffic accident that had just occurred in Aptos. The call was for a vehicle that had struck a motorcycle. The motorcyclist had reportedly flown 60 feet in the air and was down on the pavement. Netcom updated the incident by reporting that a possible bystander had pulled a gun from the pocket of the motorcycle rider and was holding the gun in a non threatening manner.

Deputy Gonzales and I responded from Watsonville. Santa Cruz County Sheriff's Detective Harris arrived on scene a few minutes later and took possession of the firearm (refer to Detective Harris' supplemental report for information on the condition of the firearm and where it was located when he arrived). Detective Harris reported over the radio that the motorcyclist had been wearing a Hells Angels clothing.

Deputy Gonzales and I arrived at approximately1803 hrs and found Deputy C. Beckman, Shearer and Zube already on scene. I saw a black Harley Davidson motorcycle lying down on its right side in the middle of the road. The front end of the motorcycle had considerable damage and it was leaking fluids. Spread out in front of the motorcycle all over the roadway were various items that appeared to have came off the bike during the accident. These items included, but are limited to, the right side trunk, a black bag, numerous small tool bags, a "mag" flashlight, a black helmet, clothing (where the motorcycle victim had been lying), and various automotive debris. Deputy Beckman and Gonzales took several digital photographs of the scene which showed the above mentioned debris (refer to Supplemental Reports).

The motorcycle's license plate, CA 16E6615, was ran through the DMV database and came back registered to Cesar Villagrana. Deputy Beckman identified the motorcycle victim as Cesar Villagrana. The vehicle that struck the motorcycle sustained driver side front end damage. I did not see any of that vehicle's doors/trunk open and it did not appear that any items came from out of the interior of that car during the accident.

I met with CHP Officer Tanguay who was conducting the accident investigation. Officer Tanguay told me that he now had possession of the firearm, later determined to be a Tarus .40 cal semi-auto handgun, and it was in the trunk of his patrol car. Officer Tanguay and I decided that the Sheriff's Office would investigate the circumstances surrounding the firearm and they would investigate the accident. Officer Tanguay told me he collected the firearm from Detective Harris and unloaded it. Officer Tanguay told me the firearm still had a magazine inside when he collected it. He removed the magazine and noticed it was loaded with several rounds. Officer Tanguay told me there was no round in the chamber when he unloaded it. Officer Tanguay turned possession of the firearm over to me, which I placed in the trunk of my patrol car. The firearm was not loaded at that time and the slide was locked back.

I then spoke to Jim McGinley who approached me at the scene. McGinley told me worked for First Alarm and responded to the accident. McGinley told me that he was working for First Alarm as a

security guard on this day and in uniform. He was standing by the Rite Aid store (approximately 100 yards from crash site) when he head the sound of a traffic accident coming from Soquel Dr near Aptos Rancho Rd. He ran over and saw a subject lying in the middle of the street and a motorcycle down in the roadway on Soquel Dr. He went over to the injured motorcyclist and saw he was struggling to breath. He held Villagrana stable while waiting for paramedics to arrive. A male walked over to him and tired to hand him a black Beretta or Ruger handgun that he had just found. McGinley instructed him to give to one of the deputies that were arriving on scene. McGinely left the scene when medical personnel arrived.

While investigating the accident scene, I walked over to where Villagrana had been lying when treated by medical personnel. At this time, Villagrana had been transported by AMR and all that was left in this area was a black leather vest or "cut", a black thermal shirt and a red flannel shirt, all of which had been cut off and left in the roadway by medical personnel. On the top back of the vest was a white patch that had the words "Hells Angels." In the middle of the vest was the trademarked Hells Angels death head logo. Under the death head was a white "California" patch. On the front bottom left side was a white "San Jose" patch. These patches identified Villagrana as a full patched member of the Hells Angels. Deputy Gonzales and I collected this vest and several other items that had Hells Angels logos on them (refer to Deputy Gonzales Supplemental Report).

FIREARM INFORMATION

The firearm was a black semi-auto Tarus model number PT 101 AF. The caliber was .40 SW and the serial number was SML 34817 D. On 3-18-11, Deputy Gonzales ran that serial number, but it returned not registered. Deputy Gonzales photographed the handgun and booked it into Sheriff's Property. Along with the handgun, Officer Tanguay gave me the magazine which had been inside the gun when it was recovered on the scene. Deputy Gonzales and I later unloaded the magazine and found ten .40 cal rounds had been in it. The magazine was photographed and booked into Sheriff's Property.

186.22 PC INFORMATION

The Hells Angels is a world wide recognized motorcycle club with over 75 chapters in the United States. The Hells Angels also have chapters in over thirty countries internationally. Their name and logo (death head) are trademarked and they have their own web site (<<u>www.hells-angles.com</u>>). Hells Angels members have been documented carrying firearms on their person and motorcycles/vehicles. The Hells Angels are a documented criminal street gang in the state of California.

Prior to the accident, the San Jose Police Department had information that Villagrana was a member of the Helis Angels motorcycle gang. Deputy Gonzales and I collected several Helis Angels related items including the black vest, a helmet with a Hells Angels sticker, a Hells Angels tee shirt, a black bag with the Hells Angels death head and Villagrana's motorcycle had three Hells Angels stickers on the top of the tank. Based on the above information, I believe Villagrana is a member of the Hells Angels criminal street gang

As I was leaving the accident scene, I noticed Christopher Hecht ride up and park his motorcycle near the accident site and walk towards the CHP officers who were still on scene. I know Hecht from

prior incidents and know him to be a full patch member of the Helis Angels and the president of the Santa Cruz Chapter. Based on Hecht's response to the accident, I believe Villagrana is still an active member of the Helis Angels and in good standing.

Based on the officers at the scene, the firearm was found in close proximity to the motorcycle crash and Cesar Villagrana, leading me to believe that the gun either came from Villagrana's person or the motorcycle. The firearm was considered loaded under 12031(g) PC due to having a loaded magazine attached. Under 12025(B) PC it is illegal for a person to have a concealed, concealable firearm that is not registered with DOJ to themselves.

INVESTIGATION CONTINUING, I am conducting further follow up on Villagana's association with the Hells Angels.

SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT

On 03/17/11, at approximately 1751 hours, I was working uniformed patrol within the county of Santa Cruz. At around the above listed time I responded along with several deputies to a vehicle accident involving a motorcyclist near 7851 Soquel Drive.

While responding dispatch advised that a the motorcyclist was possibly in possession of a handgun. I arrived on scene and observed Deputy Beckman providing care to the motorcyclist I also observed Detective Harris in plain clothes standing near the sidewalk talking to a group of people. I approached Det. Harris and asked how I could help. Harris showed me a black semi-automatic handgun laying on the ground where he was standing. He quickly told me that the firearm had been recovered by Cyrus Mozayan who was standing near by. Harris asked me to stand by with the firearm as he retrieved his camera and photographed it.

Det. Harris cleared the scene and asked me to interview Mozayan. I observed CHP Officer Tanguay collect the firearm, made it safe and secured it.

I then spoke with Cyrus Mozayan and collected the following information.

STATEMENT OF CYRUS MOZAYAN

Mozayan was wearing full medical style "scrubs". He explained to me that he was a medical doctor and was on his way home from work. Mozayan told me that he was traveling south bound on Soquel Drive when he observed the a motorcycle speed past him in a heavy traffic area. Mozayan estimated the speed of the motorcycle to be approximately "60 mph". He watched the motorcycle approach the controlled intersection in front of Safeway and observed the motorcycle turn into the "turn lane" and "run the red light". Mozayan further explained that as soon as he went through the intersection he collided with the two involved vehicles.

Mozayan drove to the scene, parked and began walking over to where the motorcyclist, Cesar Villagrana, was laying. He noticed that several bystanders were already helping him. Mozayana noticed a black handgun laying on the ground and assumed it belonged to Villagrana because his other property from the bike was strewn about the roadway. Fearing a bystander with bad intentions would get a hold of the firearm, Mozayana picked it up and walked it approximately 20 feet away and set it on the ground. When Det. Harris arrived Mozayana alerted him of the firearm. Mozayana pointed to the location of where he remembered picking up the firearm. He pointed to a spot on the left side of the street in between the wreck motorcycle and where Villagrana was currentyl laying. It was approximately 10-15 feet from Villagrana.

Mozayana did not have any additional information.

On 3-17-11 at 5:51 P.M I responded to 7851 Soquel Dr. in Aptos Ca. for a report of vehicle accident involving a motorcyclist who was hit by a car and was possibly killed. Net. Comm. advised the motorcyclist, later identified as (C-1) CESAR VILLAGRANA, was on the pavement and in his pocket was a handgun. While driving to the scene Net. Comm. advised a bystander pulled the gun away from VILLAGRANA.

When I arrived on scene I saw VILLAGRANA was laying on his back in the middle of Soquel Drive. I walked up to VILLAGRANA and started assisting by stabilizing his neck. Other citizens were also assisting VILLAGRANA and VILLAGRANA was breathing and moving. I saw VILLAGRANA was wearing a helmet and a black leather jacket with Hells Angels emblems on the jacket. Santa Cruz Sheriff's Detective JALON HARRIS was on scene and had the gun secured.

One of the citizens who was assisting VILLAGRANA handed me a business card holder. Inside the holder were two California Department Of Motor Vehicle copies of VILLAGRANA'S drivers license information. After I wrote down some information from the copies I placed the card holder back inside one of VILLAGRANA'S shoe which was in the street with other personal effects belonging to VILLAGRANA. On 3-18-11 I had our records section printout a copy of VILLAGRANA'S California Department Of Motor Vehicles Image Record. The photo on the record matched the person who I assisted at the accident.

Once the paramedics arrived on scene they took over treating VILLAGRANA. I took several photos of the scene and submitted them into evidence. I was in patrol unit 081 and the car cam video as working. The video was activated at 5:40 P.M

NARRATIVE

On 3-17-11 at approximately 1750 hours, I was off-duty in civilian clothes in an unmarked Sheriff's vehicle. I was on Soquel Drive coming up on State Park Drive in Aptos, CA.] heard via my in-car radio that there was an accident involving a motorcyclist at 7851 Soquel Drive in Aptos, CA. I also heard via NetCom that the motorcyclist had a handgun. I came upon the accident scene and saw a damaged motorcycle and two damaged cars. There where no other first responders on scene. There were also numerous bystanders standing on the side of the road. I saw a group of people around a man lying on the ground wearing a helmet in the middle of the road. I saw that the helmet had what appeared to be Hells Angels stickers on it. There was a First Alarm guard near the man lying on the ground. I saw that the man, later identified as (S01) Cesar Villagrana, was breathing and his eyes were open. I asked him if he was okay but he did not answer and had a blank stare. I saw that one of the bystanders was holding Cesar's head still. I then asked the First Alarm guard where the handgun was. The guard pointed out a man standing on the sidewalk wearing blue scrubs and said that he had the gun. 1 walked over to the man, later identified as (C01) Cyrus Mozavan, and I saw that he was holding a handoun and a knife wrapped in a green towel. I identified myself to him and asked him to set the gun on the ground which he did. I saw that the handgun had a magazine in it and that the safety was off (reference photos). I asked Cyrus where he found the gun? Cyrus pointed out where he found the gun which was approximately four feet from the motorcycle and 20'-30' from where the rider was laying on the payement. Cyrus told me that he just picked it up to keep it safe. I saw that the gun had been near some other items that looked to be from the saddlebags of the motorcycle. I saw that there was an open hard-sided saddlebag near the handgun on the ground (reference photos). The saddle bag looked like it had come off the motorcycle.

At that point, Deputy C. Beckman arrived on scene and began to care for Villagrana.

I then ran the damaged motorcycle's license plate (CA License 16E6615) through NetCom. NetCom told me the motorcycle was registered to Cesar Villagrana out of Gilroy, CA.

I then placed my badge on the ground where Cyrus said he found the gun. I took a photo of that area and the entire accident scene. I also took photos of the gun in the condition that Cyrus found it. The gun appeared to be a Taurus type black semi-automatic handgun. I later booked the photos into CSI. CHP Officer Tanguay then came over, took possession of the firearm, and unloaded it.

Deputy C. Shearer arrived on scene and spoke further with Cyrus. I then cleared the scene.



NARRATIVE:

On 3/17/11 I was assigned to the Santa Cruz County Gang Task Force (SCCGTF) and partnered with Dep. Simpson. We were in SCCGTF uniform and operating a marked Sheriff's Office patrol vehicle while conducting street enforcement in the Watsonville area of Santa Cruz County. At approximately 1747 HRS I heard a radio dispatch for patrol regarding a Hells Angels member who was involved in a motorcycle accident in front of the Chase bank located near the intersection of State Park Dr. and Soquel Dr. in Aptos. Dep. Beckman later identified the rider as Cesar Villagrana (S1).

Det. Harris had secured a firearm that appeared to have come from the motorcycle and/or the motorcycle rider. Several CHP units went to the scene and we responded from Watsonville to assist in any possible criminal investigation stemming from the gun possession. As we arrived on scene SCSO deputies and CHP officers were managing the accident scene and had already spoke with several witnesses. Refer to the attached supplemental reports for these interviews.

Dep. Simpson spoke with the CHP officers and the CHP supervisor on scene and determined that we would conduct the investigation for the firearm possession. I began to photograph the general scene of the accident. I also photographed several items of Hells Angels (H.A.)paraphernalia that were strewn about the roadway from the motorcycle. I noted that a Hells Angels "cut" or vest had been cut off the rider (by EMS) and was lying on the ground. I photographed the vest, a red and white keychain, the motorcycle (with 3 H.A. stickers on the console), a half-helmet with an H.A. sticker on the back and two red bandanas. Dep. Simpson and I collected the items as evidence. I also collected a cellular phone and an lpod as evidence, pending a search warrant for the information contained within each item. Dep. Simpson retrieved a Taurus PT-101 .40 caliber handgun (S/N SML34817D) from a CHP officer that was holding the gun in his vehicle.

After the items had been photographed and collected, Dep. Simpson and I left the scene as CHP was concluding the accident investigation. As we began to drive away towards State Park Dr. I saw another motorcycle rider park a motorcycle in the Safeway parking lot and begin to walk towards the scene. The rider was not wearing a helmet, and recognized the man from previous investigations to be Christopher Hecht. I know from these investigations that Hecht is a documented member of the Hells Angels and the Santa Cruz Chapter President.

I later photographed the items of gang paraphemalia, the firearm and ammunition/magazine. I booked all items of evidence into Sheriff's Property. I later booked all scene photographs and the photographs of the evidence into Sheriff's CSI. I contacted the San Jose PD Intelligence Unit and requested any gang information regarding Villagrana (as he is a Santa Clara County resident) be forwarded to our office for further follow-up.

SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT

Over the past week, I have conducted follow-up investigation regarding this case and the suspect Cesar Villagrana. During the original investigation, I determined Villagrana was a member of the Hells Angels Motorcycle Club, a criminal street gang as defined in 186.22(f) PC. On 3-31-11, I authored a search warrant for Villagrana's residence at 6870 Rosanna St in Gilroy for gang paraphernalia. On 4-1-11, Honorable Judge Almquist signed the search warrant. On 4-5-11, SCCGTF Inspector Sulay walked through an arrest warrant on Villagrana for 12025 PC and 186.22 PC.

On 4-6-11, myself and SCCGTF officers Sulay and Gonzales met with Gilroy Police to assist us with the service of the search and arrest warrant. We met with members of Gilroy PD's Anti Crime Team (ACT), including Sgt Deras and officers Roccaforte, Remmick, Guerin and Rocha. At approximately 0900 hrs, we served the search warrant. Sgt Deras knocked on the front door and announced "Gilroy PD, search warrant, open the door." Approximately thirty seconds later, Villagrana answered the door and was detained in handcuffs. Officers entered the residence and contacted Villagrana's parents, Miguel Reynoso and Catalina Reynoso. Both Miguel and Catalina were PAT searched and I had them sit, not handcuffed, in the living room.

Once the house was cleared, I met with Villagrana and explained the search and arrest warrant. Villagrana told me he would not speak to me without an attorney. I did not question Villagrana regarding this case. I provided Villagrana with a copy of the search warrant which he had me give to Miguel.

The house was a single story, single family residence with three bedrooms and an attached garage. I found the bedroom nearest the front of the residence to be Villagrana's. The bedroom next to it belonged to Miguel's other son, also named Miguel Reynoso. The back bedroom was Miguel and Catalina's. Prior to searching, I took numerous digital photographs of the residence.

I determined the front bedroom was Villagrana's from the large amount of indicia that I located inside it, including: Villagrana's wallet with his CDL, a Kaiser insurance card in Villagrana's name, several medication bottles in Villaragna's name, numerous paperwork with Villagrana's name on them and Villagrana told me it was his bedroom.

Inside Villagrana's bedroom, I located a large amount of Hells Angels paraphernalia. Hanging on the north side wall was a "Filthy Few San Jose" banner in a wood frame. Next to it on the same wall was a red banner in a black frame that had the words "Hells Angels San Jose and the death head logo. Next to the Hells Angels banner was a frame that contained nine cards that contained the name Hells Angels or Hells Angels art work including the death head. Hanging on the east wall was a framed poster for the December 10, 2010 Hells Angels Monterey Toy Run. This poster appeared to have nine autographs on it from other Hells Angels members including "Big Wikle, Gary, Chris, Lil Rick and Jack. I believed these were Hells Angels members due to most have HAMC (Hells Angles Motorcycle Club) written into or next to the name. I took several photographs of these framed banners. I collected the Filthy Few banner and the Toy Run poster and booked them into Sheriff's Property.

Hanging inside the closet, I found approximately forty shirts/sweatshits that had Hells Angles writing or artwork on them. I photographed these items and collected the following twenty shirts:

1. White tee shirt with the following writing: "1st Anniversary Hells Angels Los Angels, September 2008 and the death head.

2. Black tee shirt with: Hells Angles MC, United States and the death head.

3. Same black tee shirt as #2.

4. Black tee shirt with: In loving memory of Papa, Frisco, with the death head.

5. Black tee shirt from the 2003 New Hampshire World Run, including Hells Angels writing and death head.

6. White tee shirt, same as #1.

7. Red sweatshirt with the following writing: San Jose 40, Jim Elrite 35 years, Jimmy Arnett 15 years, Hells Angels San Jose and the death head.

8. Red tee shirt for 2010 Brass Knuckle Run.

9. Black tee shirt with Hells Angels MC Richmond with the death head.

10. Black tee shirt with Hells Angles MC on front and AFFA on back.

11. Black tee shirt with the following writing on front: "I dont believe in heaven I dont believe in hellwhen I diem I'm going to paradise my brothers are waiting for me" RIP Boomer July 26,1940

February 2, 2011. Hells Angles MC Forever and death head on back.

12. Blue tee shirt with Hells Angels MC Frisco on front and HA art work on back.

13. Black tee shirt with Hells Angles MC New York and death head.

14. Gray tee shirt with Hells Angels NC N.Sacto, AFFA, LONESOME, TONY PONI, LEONARD, ERIC, HANGTOWNon front and Hells Angels Sacramento with death head on back.

15. Black tee shirt with Hells Angels 30 years SFV on front.

16. White tee shirt with Parker, AZ, South Run 2009 on front and Hells Angels MC Forever with death head on back.

17. Black tee shirt with Williams, AZ, South Run 2007 on front and Hells Angles MC Forever with death head on back.

18. White tee shirt with Hells Angels West Coast on front and Hells Angels 2010 North Run on back.

19. Black collared shirt with Hells Angles MC California and death head on back.

20. Red collared shirt with Hells Angels Santa Cruz California and death head on back.

Also in the closet, sitting on the top self was a gray baseball cap with "Hells Angels 20 years Vallejo" and the death head on the front. On the top shelf of the closet, I found two leather wrist guards with the death head stamped on them. I collected these guards and booked them into Sheriff's Property.

Deputy Gonzales and I searched the dresser in the bedroom. In the top drawer we located the following items:

1. An Apple lpod Touch case. This was the type case an lpod comes from the store in. I know from experience that lpod cases have the serial number for the lpod that was sold in it. This case had the following serial number: 9C926SA5201. This serial number matched the serial number for the lpod Touch that I found at the scene of the accident. I photographed and booked this case into Sheriff's Property.

2. Seven manilla envelopes. Two contained numerous Hells Angels patches. Three contained numerous Hells Angles stickers. One contained business cards, several with Villagrana's name on

them. One contained four Hells Angels bandanas. All these items were photographed and booked into Sheriff's property.

3. Two sliver metal motorcycle crankcase covers with the following logo: Hells Angels MC San Jose and the death head. I photographed and booked these into Sheriff's property.

4. A purple Crown Royal velvet liquor case that contained numerous CD's. Refer to Deputy Gonzales supplemental report for information on what was on these CD's.

5. Three watch caps, two red, one black that had Hells Angels name or logo on them. I photographed and booked these into property.

6. Four red bandanas. I also found approximately five other red bandanas that I did not collect.

7. Two two page roster sheets for Hells Angels members. I photocopied these rosters as evidence and booked the originals into Sheriff's Property. Also with the rosters were two Hells Angels Motorcycle Corporation agreement contacts. These contacts were not filled out. I photocopied these forms and booked the originals into Sheriff's Property.

On top of the dresser was a jewelry box that contained approximately 15 Hells Angels rings. I collected nine of these rings from the box, a gold death head belt buckle and two death head patches and an Hells Angles logoed card. I booked these items into Sheriff's Property.

I collected several items of indicia that was located on the bedroom TV case. These items included an envelope that was address to Villagrana at 6870 Rosanna St in Gilroy. I also took several photographs of indicia that was in the bedroom.

On the coffee table was were two hand written notes from a male believed to be Tom Schmidt. In these notes, Schmidt talks about needing money, taking some of the "stuff" and making six times as much, and wanting to come out and transport the stuff instead of mailing it. I booked these notes into property. Also on the coffee, I located an Express Mail envelope. Inside the envelope was a photograph that included Villagrana with two other Hells Angels members and a had written note from "Tom" stating he wants to set up a pipeline and make some real money. The envelope was addressed Johnny Glenn at 681 Parkdale Dr in Campbell from Tom Schmidt at 23 Edge Hill Rd in Wappingers Falls NY. I contacted the New York State Troopers and forwarded them the information regarding Schmidt and possible drug trafficking.

In the garage, Inspector Sulay found a brown leather hand gun holster. It appeared to be designed for a revolver. This was found on a bench inside a hard hat. Near the holster (approximately two feet) was a red bandana with "45" in black on it. I photographed these items and booked them into Sheriff's Property. Also in the garage was a black motorcycle with the CA license plate of 16H7558. It had modified Hells Angels death head stickers on the tank and a Hells Angels California sticker on the crankcase. The license plate came back to a 1998 Harley to Villagrana at 6870 Rosanna St in Gilroy. I took several photographs of this motorcycle.

I arrested Villagrana for his warrant out of Santa Cruz County. Villagrana told me he wanted to be booked on the warrant at the Santa Clara County Jail. I transported Villagrana to the Gilroy Police Department and turned him over to Sgt Deras to be booked.

NARRATIVE:

On 4/6/11 I was assigned to the Santa Cruz County Gang Task Force. I responded to the Gilroy Police Department to assist in the execution of a search warrant and arrest warrant for Cesar Villagrana (A1), After receiving a briefing regarding the execution and mechanics of the operation, I drove with Det. Simpson to 6870 Rosanna St. in Gilroy, the Villagrana residence. I was wearing full SCCGTF BDU uniform.

After entry had been made and the residence was secured I was tasked with primarily assisting Det. Simpson in conducting the search of Villagrana's bedroom and documenting items that were seized. After Det. Simpson had identified the items for seizure, I completed the Santa Cruz County E&PR. 1 later reviewed the list of items seized with Villagrana and left a copy of the E&PR with the copy of the search warrant at the residence.

After completion of the search warrant I helped collect the items and later book them into Sheriff's Property. As part of this process I reviewed twenty-six (26) re-writable cd-r's that were found in Villagrana's top dresser drawer. While several of the discs were unable to be opened, I was able to open files from six of the discs. The information contained in these files was mostly related to the Laughlin shooting in 2002. These files contained court transcripts of the grand jury hearings including witness names, juror names and examinations by the grandy jury.

The other files that were opened contained wiretap transcripts, wiretap recordings, ATF ops documentation and ATF reports involving the use of confidential informants and undercover agents. On the heading of some of these pages were phone numbers, cellular phone numbers and fax numbers along with names of ATF agents involved in the investigations. After reviewing the footage I notified WISN representative Jorge Gilblanco of the findings, and Sgt. Morales notified Special Agent Ciccone of ATF to confirm that these items are documented as being released for public record.

After reviewing the discs I assisted Det, Simpson in the booking of all items of evidence to be submitted to Sheriff's Property as evidence, all photographs were submitted to Sheriff's CSI as evidence.

On 7-20-11, I was involved in a preliminary examination for Cesar Villagrana involving this case in the Santa Cruz Superior Court, Department 5. Villagrana was not held on the 186.22(a) PC charge, being an active participate in a criminal street gang by Honorable Judge Almquist. As part of the ruling, Judge Almquist found the investigation could not show Villagrana had sufficient knowledge of criminal activities committed by Hells Angels members in chapters outside Santa Cruz and Santa Clara Counties, primarily with Ventura Chapter member Scott Sutton and Daly City member Sean Penna.

On 8-11-11, I authored a search warrant for the two cellular phones that were in Sheriff's Property. This search warrant was signed by Honorable Judge Volkmann. The first was an orange Casio Boulder (Serial #CVDK0696639). This cell phone had been found at the accident scene on 3-17-11 and seized at that time by the Santa Cruz County Gang Task Force. The second cell phone was a gray LG (serial # 809KPGS0284919) and had been found in Villagrana's bedroom during a search warrant at Villagrana's residence, 6870 Rosanna St Gilroy, on 4-6-11. I would like to note that both of these cell phones were search during the course of the warrant of 4-6-11 for gang indicia and were not loaded. At the time of those searches, I did not deem any significant gang indicia existed on the phones.

On 8-17-11, I searched the phones per the warrant. I found the orange Casio had a damaged charging receiver and was unable to be downloaded or recharged. Due to this I was only able to briefly view the contents on that phone. I scrolled through the contact list, but did not seen a contact that I would believe to have been for Scott Sutton, Sean Penna.

I then searched the gray LG cell phone. This phone was capable of being download via cellebrite machine. I download the contents of this phone including the properties, contact list, text messages and photographs. The cell phone was not supported for me to download the call histories. On this phone, I did not see any contacts that I believed would have been for Sutton or Penna.

I printed a copy of the LG phone download and booked it into Sheriff's Property as evidence. I booked the two phones back into Sheriff's Property.

On 11-02-11, I was assigned to the Investigations Division of the Santa Cruz County Sheriff's Office. ADA A. Byers called me and requested I come to Department 7 of the Santa Cruz County Courthouse to take court ordered DNA swabs from (S01) Cesar Villagrana. Detective C. Clark and I met with ADA Byers. ADA Byers told me that the Honorable Judge A. Symons had ordered two sets of DNA buccal swabs be taken from Cesar Villagrana. One set was to be compared to the firearm found where Cesar crashed in Aptos and the other was to be entered into the criminal DNA database (CODIS). ADA Byers took myself and Deputy C. Clark to where Cesar was waiting with his attorney. I asked Cesar for his ID card which he showed me. I wrote down Cesar's CA DL Number (B1543695) and asked Cesar his DOB (06-01-75). Cesar provided it. I then instructed Cesar on how to rub the cotton tip applicators that collect the DNA specimens on the inside of his cheeks. Cesar then complied and provided two sets of DNA buccal swabs (for a total of 4 swabs). I then had him place the DNA swabs in two separate evidence envelopes. I then left the courthouse and sealed the DNA envelopes. I then placed the swabs into Sheriff's Office Property.



The DNA extracts were amplified at the gender marker amelogenin and 15 STR loci using the Identifiler PCR. Kit and analyzed using capillary electrophoresis. The results of this analysis are in the following table.

M-o-z-a-y-a-n, during your investigation? 18 19 Α. Yes, I did. Did he tell you, or -- did he tell you he observed 20 Ο. 21 the accident? 22 Yes, he did. Α. And what did he tell you about that? 23 Q. 24 MR. HINGLE: Judge, hearsay. Lack of foundation. 25 THE COURT: Excuse me? Hearsay. Lack of foundation. 26 MR. HINGLE:

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THE COURT: Overruled.

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2	THE WITNESS: Mr I may say it incorrectly,
3	Mozayan explained to me he was coming home from work
4	traveling on Soquel Drive toward Britannia Arms up to
5	Safeway shopping center when he was passed by a motorcycle
6	which was later determined to be the one in the accident.
7	He was passed at a speed which he approximated being 60
8	miles an hour. When the motorcycle, as well as his
9	vehicle, came up to the intersection directly in front of
10	the Safeway shopping center, Rio Del Mar, the motorcyclist
11	turned into the right-turn lane, passed the vehicles
12	running the red light. Almost immediately after going
13	through the intersection he collided with two vehicles.
14	Q. BY MR. BYERS: After the collision, did
15	Mr. Mozayan relate anything he did?
16	A. I'm sorry. The last part of your question?
17	Q. Did Mr. Mozayan go to the collision scene?
18	A. Yes, he did.
19	Q. Did he tell you what he did when he got there?
20	A. Yes. Mr. Mozayan explained he's a medical doctor
21	and his first concern was the rider of the motorcycle's
22	safety and his condition. As he approached he saw he was
23	already being cared for by bystanders, and at that point he
24	observed I'm sorry, he walked towards Mr. Villagrama and
25	turned away from him after he saw that he was being treated
26	and saw a black semiautomatic handgun on the ground.

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1 Q. Did he show you the handgun? 2 Α. Yes, he did. 3 MR. BYERS: Your Honor, may I approach? THE COURT: 4 Yes. ·5 MR. BYERS: Have this marked as People's Exhibit 6 I'll show Counsel. 1. 7 (People's Exhibit 1 marked for identification.) 8 MR. HINGLE: Thank you. 9 ο. BY MR. BYERS: Deputy, I'm going to show you 10 what's been marked as People's Exhibit 1. 11 Do you recognize what's depicted in that 12 photograph? 13 Α. Yes, I do. What's depicted in that photograph? 14 Q. 15 A. The same black semi-automatic handgun that was 16 pointed out to me by Mr. Mozayan. 17 Is that the gun he found during the accident Q. 18 scene? 19 Α. Yes, it is. 20 Q. Did he show you -- when he showed you that gun, 21 was it where he had found it? 22 Α. No, it was not. 23 Q. Did he explain why it wasn't? 24 Α. Yes. 25 Q, Tell us about that. 26 He explained that he was concerned that a Α.

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1	bystander with, quote, bad intentions would retrieve the
2	firearm and remove it from the scene or use it in any other
3	way. So he collected the firearm to prevent that from
4	happening.
5	Q. Did you ask him to show you where he originally
6	located the firearm?
7	A. Yes, I did.
8	MR. BYERS: And, Your Honor, may I approach again?
9	THE COURT: Yes.
10	MR. BYERS: Show Counsel what I've asked to be
11	marked as People's Exhibit 2.
12	(People's Exhibit 2 marked for identification.)
13	Q. BY MR. BYERS: Deputy, I'm going to show you a
14	photograph. Do you recognize what's depicted in that
15	photograph?
16	A. Yes, I do.
17	Q. And is there a location well, tell us what's
18	depicted in this photograph.
19	A. It's a large debris area including the vehicle
20	or the motorcycle on its side, oil debris, plastic, broken
21	lights on the roadway. Also in the picture is at about ten
22	feet in front of the patrol vehicle is the clothing which
23	Mr. Villagrana was wearing, including the Hell Angels vest
24	which is where he was being treated, where the person
25	removed the vest from him and the clothing.
26	At about ten, 15 feet from that towards the

.

1	sidewalk is close to where the two deputies are standing is
2	where Mr. Mozayan stated he found originally found the
3	firearm.
4	Q. Do you have a pen on you?
5	A. I do not, unfortunately.
6	MR. BYERS: Your Honor, may I approach?
7	THE COURT: Yes.
8	MR. BYERS: I'll hand you a pen, and maybe you can
9	put a circle around the area where Mr. Mozayan related to
10	you where he located that firearm.
11	A. (Witness complies.)
12	Q. Thank you. Maybe put your initials by that, just
13	so we are clear.
14	A. (Witness complies.)
15	Q. Thanks, Deputy.
16	After you saw the firearm, it was on the ground
17	when you first saw the firearm it was on the ground?
18	A. Yes.
19	Q. Did Mr. Mozayan give that to any deputy on the
20	scene?
21	A. Yes, he did.
22	Q. What did he tell you about that?
23	A. He explained that when he saw Detective Harris
24	arrive on scene he alerted Harris of the firearm, at which
25	point Detective Harris stood over it until I arrived on
26	scene.
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1 MR. BYERS: Thank you, Deputy: I have no further 2 questions. 3 THE COURT: Any questions? 4 CROSS-EXAMINATION 5 BY MR. HINGLE: 6 Was it your testimony that Deputy Harris stood ο. 7 over the firearm until you arrived at the scene? Yes, it is. 8 Α. 9 So the location you saw it at was the original Q. 10 location it was spotted by Mr. Mozayan? 11 Α. No. It was a location where he had moved the firearm 12 ο. 13 to? 14 Yes. Α. Did he indicate to you that he picked it up and 15 Q. went to that location and sat it down, or did he hold on --16 indicate that I held onto it for a period of time before 17 handing it over to another officer? 18 19 In my report it reflects that he alerted Detective Α. 20 Harris of the firearm. And when I arrived on scene nobody 21 was holding it, it was on the ground. Had the magazine been taken out of the firearm? 22 Ο. 23 No, it had not. Not at that point. Α. 24 Q. All right. Now, you also stated that 25 Mr. Villagrana was the driver of the motorcycle? 26 Α. Yes.

1 Q. What is the basis of that opinion? 2 Α. His proximity to the motorcycle, his clothing 3 consistent with that of a motorcycle rider, as well as 4 Mr. Mozayan's statement. 5 ο. Mr. Mozayan couldn't specifically identify the 6 person that rode passed him, though, could he? 7 Α. I don't think -- I think he was wearing a helmet. 8 I don't think he physically saw his face, no. So then there was no specific identification of 9 Ο. Mr. Villagrana either by -- or by either Mr. Mozayan or any 10 11 of the other two individuals in the automobiles that were involved in the accident; isn't that correct? 12 I can't testify to that. I can only testify to 13 Α. 14 what Mr. Mozayan told me. I didn't have any contact with 15 the other individuals in the vehicles. He was the only 16 person that I interviewed at the screen. 17 MR. HINGLE: Thank you. No further questions. 18 THE COURT: Redirect? 19 MR. BYERS: No, sir. THE COURT: All right. Thank you, Deputy Shearer. 20 You're excused. 21 22 MR. BYERS: People would like to call Detective 23 Jeff Simpson to the stand. 24JEFFREY SIMPSON, having been first duly sworn, testified as follows: 25 26 MR. BYERS: Your, Honor I believe Deputy Shearer

1 was excused. Would it be all right if he stayed in the 2 courtroom unless if there's any motions. 3 THE COURT: Sure. MR. HINGLE: Your Honor, Defendant --4 5 THE COURT: Just say yes and I'll ask him to leave. 6 7 I would say, you know, that I'd like MR. HINGLE: 8 him to be excluded, because if the Detective mentions 9 something beyond and is subject to recall, then it's --10 THE COURT: All right. Well, he's not subject to 11 recall, he's excused. You want him subject to recall? 12 MR. HINGLE: I want him subject to recall. 13 THE COURT: You're subject to recall. You may not 14 stay in the courtroom. Thank you. 15 DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. BYERS: 16 Q. Sir, could you please state your name and spell 17 your last name. 18 19 Α. Jeffrey Simpson, S-i-m-p-s-o-n. 20 Ο. What is your current occupation? 21 Α. I'm a deputy sheriff for the County of Santa Cruz. 22 ο. What kind of an assignment do you have as a deputy 23 sheriff? 24 Α. I'm assigned to the Santa Cruz Gang Task Force. 25 Q. And how many people are assigned to the Santa Cruz 26 Gang Task Force?

1	A. Four.
2	Q. And how long have you been with the task force?
З	A. Since it formed, which is coming up on one year at
4	the end of this month.
5	Q. What are your duties as a member of the gang task
б	force?
7	A. My duties are to provide street level enforcement
8	directed towards gang crimes, identification of gang
9	members, investigation of gang crimes, identification of
10	gangs, and intelligence gathering relating to gangs and
· 1 1	gang members.
12	Q. Does that include all criminal street gangs that
13	are encountered by law enforcement inside Santa Cruz
. 14	County?
15	A. Yes.
16	Q. And how long have you been a police officer?
17	A. Eight years. It will be eight years in this
18	August.
19	Q. And do you have some specialized training as it
20	relates to investigation of gang crimes?
21	A. Ido.
22	Q. Tell us about that.
23	A. I've received, I would say, no less than 70 hours
24	of formal training relating to gangs, from gang
25	investigation courses, courses on prison gangs, the Nuestra
26	Familia and Nortenos. I've had training on the Mexican
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1	Mafia and Surénos, use of informants, prison parole, outlaw
2	motorcycle gangs, social networking related to gangs. I
3	have instructed two hours as the instructor on outlaw
4	motorcycles at the Santa Cruz County Gang Academy which was
5	last month. In addition, I've had I've spent a lot of
6	time just talking informally with a lot of experts relating
7	to gang crimes in Santa Cruz County.
8	Q. And do you continue to update your training and
9	experience as it relates to investigating criminal street .
10	gangs?
11	A. Yes.
12	Q. Do you have law enforcement experience, actually
13	hands-on experience investigating criminal street gangs?
14	A. Absolutely.
15	Q. During your training and experience, is that
16	experience in investigating gang related crimes or authored
17	search warrants?
18	A. I have.
19	Q. How about executing search warrants?
20	A. I have.
21	Q. Making arrests?
22	A.' I have.
23	Q. Do you hold specialized knowledge about gang
24	recognition and practices inside and culture inside
25	Santa Cruz?
26	A. Ido.

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1 MR. BYERS: Your Honor, at this time I'd ask that 2 Detective Simpson be designated as an expert in that field. 3 MR. HINGLE: What field specifically? I'm sorry. 4 MR. BYERS: Gang recognition, practices and 5 culture inside of Santa Cruz County. 6 THE COURT: Any objection? 7 MR. HINGLE: If I could just have a second, Your 8 Honor. 9 As an expert in gang recognition and practices in Santa Clara County? 10 11 MR. BYERS: If we're going to be clear, gang 12 recognition, practices and culture, I would assume in and 13 out of Santa Cruz County. MR. HINGLE: No objection, Your Honor. 14 15 THE COURT: All right. He'll be designated as 16 such for the purposes of this prelim hearing only. MR. BYERS: Thank you, Your Honor. 17 Are you familiar with the Hells Angels? 18 ο. 19 Α. Yes, I am. 20 Q. Have you spoken with members of that group? 21 Yes, I have spoken to members of the Hells Angels. Α. 22 Have you talked with other law enforcement experts ο. 23 about the Hells Angels? 24 Α. Yes. Have you reviewed offense reports related to the 25 ο. 26 Hells Angels?

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1	Α.	Yes.
2	Q.	How about court documents?
3	A.	Yes.
4	Q.	Have you investigated crimes committed by the
5	Hells An	gels members?
6	A.	Yes.
7	Q.	Do the Hells Angels have a common name or
8	identify	ing sign or symbol?
9	А.	They do.
10	Q.	What is that?
11	Α.	The name Hells Angels, and symbol is what is
12	called t	he death head. It's a skull with a side profile of
13	a skull	with a single wing coming off the back.
14	Q.	Do they have a particular color that's associated
15	with the	π?
16	Α.	Red and white.
17	Q.	Do they have three or more members?
18	Α.	Yes, they do.
19	Q.	And how long have the Hells Angels been around?
20	Α.	Since 1948.
21	Q.	And what are the primary activities of the Hells
22	Angels?	
23	Α.	Crimes that are included under 186.22(e); murder,
24	drug sal	es, illegal firearms, possession.
25	Q.	And how are you aware of the criminal activities?
26	Α.	From research. And I've been a lead investigator
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1 in crimes relating -- excuse me. 2 I've been a lead investigator investigating crimes 3 by the Hells Angels for possession of a firearm, felon in possession of a firearm, illegal narcotics for sale. 4 Controlled substances for sale. 5 Are you familiar with an individual by the name of 6 ο. 7 Scott Sutton? 8 I am. Α. 9 Are you specifically familiar with a Ventura Q. 10 County case number, police department case number 0913013 11 for events that occurred on September 24th, 2009 where he was subsequently convicted of possess -- being a felon in 12 13 possession of a firearm? 14 MR. HINGLE: Objection. Leading. 15 THE COURT: Sustained. MR. BYERS: Well, I don't know if it's leading, 16 17 I'm just asking if he's familiar with that particular case. THE COURT: Well, it's a leading question. 18 The 19 objection was an advisement not to ask too many more of 20 them or Counsel will start objecting. The question calls 21 for a yes or no answer. Reask your question. 22 ο. BY MR. BYERS: So you're familiar with Mr. Sutton; 23 is that correct? 24 Not personally, but I am aware of him. Α. 25 Okay. And how are you aware of him? 0. 26 Α. From reviewing reports and speaking to

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1	investigators.
2	Q. And in what county did you review reports and
3	speak to investigators
4	A. Ventura.
5	Q and talk to investigators to obtain information
6	on Mr. Sutton?
7	A. Ventura County.
8	Q. And was there a particular case that you reviewed
9	and talked to investigators in Ventura County related to
10	Mr. Sutton?
11	A. Yes.
12	Q. And tell us about that.
13	A. In 2009, I believe it's September 24th, 2009, an
14	officer from the Ventura Police Department attempted to
15	stop a vehicle, a pickup truck, for making an illegal turn.
16	The truck did not yield to the police officer. A short
17	pursuit ensued. When the vehicle, the truck pulled onto a
18	street called Byron Avenue, the officer saw the driver of
19	the truck throw an item out of the driver's side window,
20	the truck, a few blocks later, then stops. The officer
21	contacts the driver, identifies him as Scott Sutton.
22	Officers then return to Byron Avenue. And I believe at 203
23	Byron Avenue they discover a .32 automatic firearm
24	excuse me, a .32 automatic handgun that had been broken and
2,5	appeared to have been thrown out the window. They spoke to
26	the person at that address who said after the pursuit went

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1	by he noticed the firearm on his driveway.
2	Mr. Sutton had on a belt buckle that said Hells
3	Angels, member since 1995, Scott Sutton. And he also had a
4	tattoo on the back which is Hells Angels with the death
5	head in Venture.
6	Q. Based on your discussions with the investigating
7	officers and your review of some documents, do you have an
8	opinion as to Mr. Sutton is a member of the Hells Angels on
9	September 24th, 2009?
10	A. I do.
11	Q. And what is that opinion?
12	A. That he was a member of the Hells Angels.
13	Q. Are you familiar with an individual by the name of
14	Sean Penna, P-e-n-n-a?
15	A. Not personally, but from reports, yes.
16	Q. Okay. So you've done some research on an
17	individual by that name?
18	A. Yes, I have.
19	Q. And did you review some law enforcement reports
20	related to that individual?
21	A. I have.
22	Q. What about court documents?
23	A. I have not.
24	Q. Okay. Did you speak with any investigating
25	officers related to crimes that Mr. Penna has been involved
26.	in?
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1	A. I spoke to a lead investigator.
2	Q. Tell us about were you familiar with a
3	particular crime that he was involved in?
4	A. Yes, I am.
5	Q. Tell us about that.
6	A. I believe it's December 31st, if I'm not mistaken,
7	2009, a sergeant from the South San Francisco Police
8	Department attempts to conduct a vehicle stop on a
9	motorcycle, I believe for loud exhaust. He conduct's the
10	traffic stop, he contacts the driver of the motorcycle,
11	identifies him as Sean Penna. He runs the subject for
12	license status, finds out his license is expired. He
13	decides to conduct a pat-down search of Mr. Penna's
14	clothing, and Mr. Penna at that time was wearing a black
15	vest, or a cut, that had a cross on his left side and a
16	patch across the back Daly City. On the back it had a
17	little
18	THE REPORTER: Wait. You're going way too fast.
19	THE WITNESS: On the left side he had two patches,
20	one that says Prospect and one that said Daly City. On the
21	back of the vest on the lower portion there was a rocker, a
22	white patch with red lettering that said California.
23	And I'm sorry.
24	So when the officer conducted the pat-down search,
25	under the vest he felt a hard object that he recognized and
26	believed to be a firearm. He then removed that object and
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1	found it was a loaded revolver. Mr. Penna was then
2	arrested for the firearm violations.
3	He also had a black sweatshirt on that said
4	Support 81 Daly City. And he also had a T-shirt on that
Ś	was, I believe it said support your local red and white
6	raising team.
7	Q. BY MR. BYERS: Now, in doing the review you did on
8	Mr. Penna, do you have an opinion as to if he was a member
9	of the Hells Angels on January 31st, 2009?
10	MR. HINGLE: I'm going to object as ambiguous as
11	to the use of the term member. It's not been described by
12	the officer.
13	THE COURT: Sustained.
14	Q. BY MR. BYERS: Well, let me ask you this: Earlier
15	you said that Mr. Sutton was a member of the Hells Angels.
16	What exactly did you mean by that?
17	A. A member is according to their motorcycle club,
18	a member has the full three patch cuts where it says Hells
19	Angels on the top, the death head in the middle and
20	California on the bottom.
21	Q. And does a member, in your opinion, of the Hells
22	Angels be required to actively participate in the group?
23	A. Yes.
24	Q. Okay. Now, in your sense when you're telling us
25	who is a member of the Hells Angels in your opinion, are
26	you relying on the Hells Angels themselves to determine

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1 that, or is there some standard that you set to determine 2 If someone is actually a member actively participating in a 3 gang? 4 Α. In this instance where I discussing Mr. Penna I'm 5 not describing him as a member by what they determine it to be by the Hells Angels motorcycle club. I'm determining 6 7 under my opinion of 186.22, that definition, yes, he is a 8 member, he has status in the gang, he is noted in West 9 Coast Chapter minutes as becoming a prospect, so there is actually a rank structure and that person is identified and 10 11 has status within in gang. So he would, in my opinion, be 12 a member. 13 ο. So your opinion on January 31st, 2009, Mr. Penna was a member of the Hells Angels criminal street gang? 14 Yes. 15 Α. 16 Q. Based on your --MR. HINGLE: I'll object to that last question as 17 18 leading, and also as the use of the term Hells Angels 19 criminal street gang. That's irrelevant. What's relevant 20 is whether or not it's a California criminal street gang. 21 THE COURT: Sustained as to the latter point. 22 Overruled as to the former. 23 So just to be clear that the testimony MR. BYERS: 24 about him being a member on that date is in evidence? 25 THE COURT: He's a member of -- according to the testimony he's a member of the Hells Angels on that date. 26

1	MR. BYERS: Excellent.
2	THE COURT: You need to established that the Hells
3	Angels is a criminal street gang in the State of California
4	on that date.
5	Q. BY MR. BYERS: Let me ask you this, Detective:
6	Based on your training and experience in the field of
7	criminal street gangs, do you have an opinion as to if the
8	Hells Angels are a criminal street gang under the
9	California Penal Code?
10	A. Yes.
11	Q. Yes, you believe they are?
12	A. Yes.
13	Q. I want to ask you a little bit about the culture
14	and habits of a Hells Angels criminal street gang member.
15	Are you familiar with some of the indicia that they
16	possess?
17	MR. HINGLE: Your Honor, I'm sorry. Objection. I
18	must object to the use of that term every time, Hells
19	Angels criminal street gang member, because that's not the
20	definition.
21	THE COURT: Sustained.
22	Q. BY MR. BYERS: Are you familiar with the indicia
23	that a Hells Angels member or associate would possess?
24	A. I am.
25	Q. And have you spoken with other experts about the
26	indicia that they process?
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1	A. I have.
2	Q. And what type of indicia would you expect to see
3	possessed by a member of the Hells Angels?
4	A. Clothing, using numerous articles of clothing with
5	Hells Angels, Support Your Local 81, the death head, hats,
6	jackets, stickers, patches, motorcycle parts, jewelry, art
7	work, posters, et cetera.
8	Q. Now, in your opinion, the public display of such
9	indicia, would that have some significance for the Hells
10	Angels gang member?
11	A. Yes.
12	Q. Tell us about that.
·13	A. Well, first of all it identifies himself as a
14	member of the Hells Angels and for other club members that
15	they are a member of the Hells Angels, which might be
16	prestigious in the world of motorcycles. And are violent
17	towards rivals, that this is their territory, they are in
18	this territory. And it also is a message to the general
19	public citizens that they are members of the Hells Angels.
20	Q. Now, you mentioned the patches that a Hells Angel
21	member might have on his jacket with the three part, the
22	Hells Angels, the death head, and the city on the bottom?
23	A. The region or their territory.
24	. Q. Is there some significance of displaying that in
25	public, the Hells Angels?
26	A. It's their colors. It's their identification as a

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1 member of their gang.

2	Q. Would someone who wasn't a member be able to
3	display that let's just take a vest, a leather vest and
4	a jacket with Hells Angels, with the death head, with the
5	city on the bottom displayed in public, would a nonmember
6	be able to display that in public?
7	A. No.
8	Q. What would happen, in your opinion, if they are
9	not allowed to do that?
10	A. I would say a minimum an ass kicking.
11	Q. Okay. And is there some significance, let's just
12	say I have a T-shirt, I'm down at the beach and it has this
13	symbol on it, is there some difference between that and
14	actually riding, say, a Harley-Davidson motorcycle having
15	this on the back of me if I'm doing that?
16	A. I'm sorry, I'm not exactly understanding your
17	question.
18	Q. Let me just ask you this: If you have the Hells
19	Angels insignia, right, would you find it different if
20	someone was wearing that, say, down at the beach as opposed
21	to being on the back of being on the back of a
22	HarleyDavidson motorcycle riding around town?
23	MR. HINGLE: I'm going to object as ambiguous.
24	Which insignia we talking about, the death head or
25	something else?
26	THE COURT: Sustained.

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1	MR. BYERS: Okay. Let's start with the original.
. 2	Well, let me approach.
3	Your Honor, can I have this marked as People's
4	Exhibit 3?
5	THE COURT: Sure.
6	MR. BYERS: Before I do that I ask I have
7	another exhibit. Ask that to be marked as People's Exhibit
. 8	3. And I'll show Counsel.
9	It's a certified rap sheet for Mr. Penna, and on
10	page 1, 2 there's a conviction related to an event that
11	occurred in San Mateo County that I'd ask to be entered in
12	as Exhibit 3, and as a certified government record.
13	THE COURT: Rap sheet on who? Mr. Penna?
14	MR. BYERS: Yes, sir.
15	(People's Exhibit 3 marked for identification.)
16	THE COURT: Pena or Penna?
17	MR. BYERS: I believe it's P-e-n-n-a.
18	THE COURT: Penna.
19'	MR. BYERS: 'I'm going to show Counsel what's now
20	been marked as People's Exhibit 4.
21	(People's Exhibit 4 marked for identification.)
22	MR. BYERS: May I approach?
23	THE COURT: Yes.
24	Q. BY MR. BYERS: Detective, showing you what's been
25	marked as People's Exhibit 4.
_. 26	Now, we've been talking about the death head and a

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1	patch and the insignia. What's depicted in People's 4?
2	A. I recognize this to be the cut on the vest that
з	was that was on Mr. Villagrana, or taken off him at the
4	scene of the motorcycle accident on Soquel Drive.
5	Q. Let me just focus on what is on the jacket. It's
6	a leather jacket, right?
7	A, It's a leather vest.
8	Q. A vest. Okay. Let me just focus on what's on the
9	vest. Is that the death head insignia that you've been
10	talking about?
11	A. In the middle, yes.
12	Q. Okay. And what's on top of that?
13	A. It's called a topper rocker. It goes across the
14	top and it has the words Hells Angels.
15	Q. What's along the bottom?
16	A. The bottom is a lower rocker that says California.
17	Q. Now, you said that someone who displays that in
18	public who was not a member might be in danger?
19	A. Yes.
20	Q. Now, I was going to ask you if I displayed that,
21	say, at the beach, would that be different than displaying
22	it on the back of a Harley-Davidson motorcycle driving down
23.	the road?
24	A. In my opinion if you were wearing these,
25	specifically the death head, it did not matter if you're at
26	the beach or on the back of a motorcycle, you do not wear

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1	the death head.
2	Q. Unless you're a member?
З	A. Unless you're a member, correct.
4	Q. Are the in your experience or in your basic
5	training and experience is it common for members of the
6	Hells Angels to possess weapons?
7	A. Yes.
8	Q. And how do weapons play into the Hells Angels
9	culture?
10	A. First of all, it's protection. The Hells Angels
11	do have rifles, and they do have a violent history with
12	their rifles. So obviously I excuse me. I would
13	believe it's used for protection for use in crimes.
14	Q. Are the Hells Angels a violent gang?
15	A. Yes, they are.
16	Q. Have you been aware of incidences of violence
17	perpetrated by the Hells Angels?
18	A. I have.
19	Q. For what purpose does the Hells Angels use
20	violence?
21	A. Against rivals. Against people who have dropped
22	out in bad standing. I would say people who interfere in
23	their business.
24	Q. And based on your general knowledge of Hells
25	Angels, would a member of the Hells Angels have knowledge
26	of the criminal activity of the group as a whole?
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1 Α. Yes. 2 I'm going to object as ambiguous to MR. HINGLE: 3 that question. What are we talking about? Every Hells 4 Angels chapter in the world, a specific Hells Angel chapter 5 in Santa Cruz County, a specific Hells Angels chapter that 6 Mr. Villagrana may be a member of? 7 THE COURT: Sustained. 8 BY MR. 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1	Q. BY MR. BYERS: Okay. Now, I'm going to start I
2	guess we'll just start with most recent. Did you review a
3	San Jose Police Department report 11 dash 176 dash 0937?
4	MR. HINGLE: Objection. Leading.
5	THE COURT: Overruled.
6	THE WITNESS: I have.
7	Q. BY MR. BYERS: And in reviewing that report, did
8	that assist you in determining Mr. Villagrana's level of
9	participation in the Hells Angels gang?
10	A. Yes.
11	Q. And what was significant or maybe you can tell
12	us a little bit about what you read about in that report
13	and what was significant about that to help you make your
14	determination?
15	A. San Jose police officers were responding to a
16	fight with multiple subjects, I believe at some type of
17	fair event downtown. They found Mr. Villagrana was
18	involved in the fight and he was wearing a Hells Angels cut
19	that we've already discussed. And the officers then
20	stopped the fight by using pepper spray, and Mr. Villagrana
21	was cited, I believe, for public fighting.
22	Q. And do you recall the date when those events
23	occurred?
24	A. I believe it was June 25th.
25	Q. Okay. And you mentioned that
26	THE COURT: June 25th of this year?
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1	THE WITNESS: Oh, yes. I'm not 100 percent sure.
2	I'm pretty sure it was June 25th.
3	Q. BY MR. BYERS: And you created a report detailing
4	your investigation for this case into the Hells Angels
5	gang?
6	A. I have.
7	Q. And do you have it with you?
8	A. Yes, I do.
9	Q. Would reviewing that report help refresh your
10	recollection as to what the date of that San Jose incident
11	was?
12	A. Yes, it would.
13	MR. BYERS: With the Court's permission?
14	THE COURT: Yes.
15	Q. BY MR. BYERS: Did you review your report?
16	A. According to the officers it says June 25th.
17	Q. And you mentioned during your testimony that
18	Mr. Villagrana, according to the report, was wearing that
19	full cut?
20	A. Yes.
21	Q. And that's a gang, going back to People's Exhibit
22	4 with the full patch, is that what you believe that to be?
23	A. Yes.
24	Q. And, again, displaying that you found that to be
25	significant?
26	A. Yes.

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1	Q. Now, did you participate in the investigation of
2	this matter?
3	A. I did.
4	THE COURT: Just a second. First of all, did the
5	officer who wrote the report see him wearing that at the
6	time of the June 25th incident?
7	THE WITNESS: I don't recall.
8	Q. BY MR. BYERS: Let me ask you this: Back to the
9	June incident you mentioned that you had some information
10	that Mr. Villagrana was wearing a full cut. Where did you
11	get that information?
12	A. From a San Jose intelligence officer.
13	Q. You spoke to another officer?
14	A. Correct.
15	Q. Okay. So in investigating that particular
16	incident you talked to two different officers from San Jose
17	Police Department?
18	A. No.
19	Q. Tell us about that. Tell us who you talked with.
20	A. Her name was Eve, and I'm sorry, I believe it's
21	W-o-l-o-s-k-i. She's works for the San Jose Police
22	Department doing intelligence.
23	Q. So the report doesn't indicate what Mr. Villagrana
24	was wearing?
25	MR. HINGLE: Objection. Calls for hearsay.
26	THE COURT: Sustained.

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1	MR. BYERS: It's the
2	THE COURT: Is Woloski a police officer?
3	MR. BYERS: I'm not sure.
4	It's not hearsay because it's only going to form
5	his opinion well, it is his opinion, but he's able to
6	rely on hearsay because he's an expert. Experts rely on
7	police reports and other hearsay, so it's not hearsay
8	well, it is hearsay, but it's still admissible. It's not
9	for the truth of the matter, however.
10	THE COURT: All right. Did you say Mr. Villagrana
11	was cited for something as a result of this activity on
12	June 25th? And if he did, I didn't hear what it was.
