**DECLARATION**  
(NRS 53.045)

I, JONATHAN VANBOSKERCK, am a duly licensed attorney in the State of Nevada and am employed by the Clark County District Attorney's Office.

Except by Court Order, an Answering Brief shall not exceed 30 pages in length or shall contain no more than 14,000 words or 1,300 lines of text. NRAP 32(a)(7)(A)(i)-(ii); NRAP 32(a)(7)(D).

On November 21, 2014, this Court granted, in part, Appellant's Motion for Leave to File Opening Brief on Appeal Which Exceed Type-Volume Limits. Pursuant to this Court's order, Appellant was permitted to file an Opening Brief that did not exceed 22,000 words. On December 4, 2014, Appellant filed an Opening Brief comprising of 18,969 words.

Appellant's Opening Brief contained 6 grounds, many of which required thorough discussion. These included review of the voluntariness of a confession, determination of custody, and sufficiency of the evidence. Respondent has diligently sought to respond in as concise a manner as possible, without sacrificing depth, breadth, or accuracy. See NRAP 32(a)(7)(A)(D)(i). However, in order to fully develop the facts and answer the issues Appellant raised therein, it has been necessary to prepare a Answering Brief containing 14,986 words. Thus, Respondent requests the same type volume limit as Appellant received, not to exceed 22,000 words.
