5 **STATE BAR OF NEVADA'S MOTION TO EXTEND TIME IN WHICH**
6 **TO FILE SUPPLEMENTAL PETITION**

7 COMES NOW the Board of Governors of the State Bar of Nevada ("the
8 Board"), by and through Alan Lefebvre, President, and hereby moves for a
9 ninety (90) day extension of time, though September 30, 2014, in which to file
10 the Supplemental Petition on the amendments to Rule of Professional Conduct
11 1.2 regarding medical marijuana. This Motion is made and based upon the
12 following Memorandum of Points and Authorities and all matters on file herein.

13 **MEMORANDUM OF POINTS AND AUTHORITIES**

14 **1. The Board of Governors Seek an Extension of Time to Properly**
15 **Assess Further Rule Changes.**

16 By Order filed May 8, 2014, this Court directed the Board to supplement
17 its petition to address whether any further action or additional rules might
18 require amendment or commentary in view of RPC 1.2 and Comment [1],
19 Nevada Constitution article 4 section 38; NRS chapter 453A; and any related
20 federal statutes. The Order also directed the Board to consider in its

1 supplemental analysis the eight “enforcement priorities” identified in the
2 August 29, 2013, memorandum by Deputy United States Attorney General
3 James M. Cole. The Supplemental Petition was to be filed by June 30, 2014.

4 Further this Court ordered that public written comment was extended to
5 May 30, 2014.

6 The Board has convened a task force to review the need for additional
7 rule changes in light of the public hearing comments. The Board meets
8 periodically and requests additional time to properly research and consider the
9 issues and impact of additional rule changes. The Court’s current amendment
10 in the form of a comment is narrowly tailored and will facilitate the ongoing
11 licensing and regulatory activities already underway. Therefore, the granting of
12 additional time to properly assess further rule changes will not impede that
13 process but will allow a full and informed review of the rules.


