## **ORDER GRANTING MOTION**

This case was originally exempted from this court's settlement program shortly after it was docketed as it did not appear amenable to the mediation process and because in its case appeal statement appellant indicated that "[t]his appeal does not involve the possibility of settlement." *See* NRAP 3(f); NRAP 16(a). Appellant has now filed a motion to have this case referred back to the settlement program. Appellant indicates that it has reassessed its position, and now believes that "this appeal should proceed to mediation."

Respondents have filed a joint response to appellant's motion. Respondents indicate that although they continue to believe that this matter would be difficult to resolve through mediation, they are willing to hear and consider . . . settlement proposals," and are willing to participate in mediation through this court's settlement program.

Appellant has filed a reply to the response, indicating that while it understands the unique difficulties that mediating this case may

SUPREME COURT OF NEVADA present, in light of respondents' willingness to participate in mediation, its motion for referral to the settlement program should be granted.

Cause appearing, we grant the motion and refer this appeal to the settlement program. Accordingly, briefing in this matter is stayed. See NRAP 16(a)(1). Further, the assigned settlement judge shall expedite settlement proceedings to the extent possible.

It is so ORDERED.
