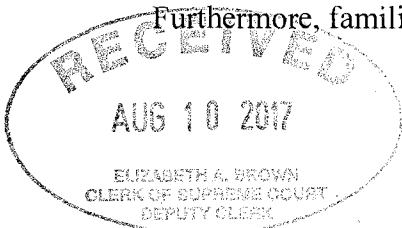
Dear Justices:

In response to the Supreme Court's solicitation for letters of interest in serving on the permanent Nevada Guardianship Commission, I write to express my interest in serving on this Commission and ask for your consideration of said request to serve.

I am currently serving my seventh year as an elected District Judge in the Eighth Judicial District- Family Division. Since January 2017, I have had the privilege of handling forty (40%) percent of the Adult Guardianship cases in Nevada's most populous county. In addition to an adult guardianship calendar, I also hear and adjudicate minor guardianships.

As a District Judge, I share the concerns of those persons involved in the guardianship process and the individuals who may be subject to the guardianship statutes, rules, and processes in the State of Nevada. I want to ensure that persons who become subject to a guardianship proceeding are protected and their rights are respected.

Furthermore, families that seek a guardianship for their loved ones should find the

process reasonable and straightforward. The family court judges in Clark County handle all minor guardianships. In addition to my experience with adult guardianships, I could serve as a conduit for the family judges' concerns and suggestions relating to the new minor guardianship statutes.

For these reasons, I hope to serve on this Commission and develop appropriate rules and procedures for these incredibly important cases. Thank you for your consideration.
