- 8 Q AND THEN SAME THING FOR DINNER?
- 9 A YES.
- 10 Q NOW, WERE YOU ALLOWED TO HAVE ANY SNACKS IN BETWEEN
- 11 THEN?
- 12 **A** NO.
- 13 Q WHAT ABOUT DRINKS OF WATER, WERE YOU ALLOWED TO HAVE
- 14 WATER?
- 15 A WELL, I HAVE -- I HAD THIS PILL THAT I TOOK EVERY
- 16 MORNING, LIKE SHE'D GIVE US -- SHE'D GIVE ME A LITTLE BIT OF
- 17 WATER, AND IF -- LIKE IF SHE -- I THINK SHE HAD PILLS, TOO,
- 18 THAT SHE HAD TO TAKE, SHE'D GIVE US A LITTLE BIT OF WATER, AND
- 19 SOMETIMES SHE'D GIVE US A LITTLE, LIKE CUP, THAT'S ALL SHE'D
- 20 FILL IT UP AND GIVE IT TO US.
- 21 Q OKAY. WHEN YOU SAID THAT SMALL, MAYBE LIKE -- YOU
- 22 DID LIKE THREE OR FOUR INCHES?
- 23 A YEAH, FOUR INCHES.
- Q OKAY. UM -- NOW, WHEN YOU ATE THE BLENDED -- OR
- 25 DRANK THE BLENDED THING OUT OF CUP, WERE YOU ALLOWED TO SIT

- 1 DOWN AND EAT OR DID YOU HAVE TO STAND AND DRINK IT?
- 2 A WELL SOMETIMES WE STOOD -- WE HAD DIFFERENT PLACES
- 3 IN THE KITCHEN. NOT IN THE -- NOT BY THE COUNTER, BUT IN THE
- 4 KITCHEN KITCHEN, WE'D STAND IN OUR OWN PLACES AND DRINK IT, OR
- 5 SOMETIMES WE'D JUST STAND BY THE COUNTER AND DRINK IT.
- 6 Q OKAY. WHAT WOULD HAPPEN IF YOU HAD AN ACCIDENT,
- 7 WOULD YOU STILL BE ALLOWED TO EAT?
- 8 A SHE SAID -- SOMETIMES SHE'D SAY NO, SOMETIMES SHE'D
- 9 SAY YES.
- 10 O OKAY. ON THE -- ON THE TIMES THAT SHE WOULD SAY
- 11 NO -- UM -- SO IF YOU HAD AN ACCIDENT AND SHE SAID NO YOU
- 12 COULDN'T EAT, HOW LONG WOULD IT BE BEFORE YOU WERE ALLOWED TO
- 13 EAT OR DRINK AGAIN?
- 14 A WELL, SOMETIMES WE WOULDN'T EAT ALL DAY. AND IF WE
- 15 DID IT LIKE THE NEXT DAY WE WEREN'T ALLOWED TO EAT, BUT
- 16 SHE'D -- SOMETIMES SHE'D CHANGE HER MIND, ACTUALLY GIVE US
- 17 SOMETHING.
- 18 Q OKAY. SO SOMETIMES YOU WOULDN'T BE ALLOWED TO EAT
- 19 OR DRINK FOR THAT DAY OR THE NEXT DAY, AND SOMETIMES SHE'D
- 20 CHANGE HER MIND AND SHE WOULD LET YOU EAT, RIGHT?
- 21 **A** YES.
- 22 O OKAY. NOW WHAT WOULD -- ON THOSE TIMES WHEN YOU
- 23 TALKED ABOUT EARLIER WHERE MISS JANET AND MISS DWIGHT -- I'M
- 24 SORRY MISS JANET AND MISS DANIELLE WERE OUT OF TOWN AND JUST
- 25 MR. DWIGHT WAS TAKING CARE OF YOU -- UM -- IF YOU HAD AN

- 1 ACCIDENT ON THOSE DAYS, WERE YOU ALLOWED TO EAT OR DRINK?
- 2 A WELL, HE'D CALL MISS JANET AND TELL HIM -- SHE'D
- 3 TELL HIM WHAT TO DO.
- 4 Q OKAY. AND SO IF MISS JANET TOLD HIM, "NO THEY CAN'T
- 5 EAT OR DRINK," DID MR. DWIGHT LET YOU EAT OR DRINK OR DID HE
- 6 NOT LET YOU?
- 7 A HE FOLLOWED THE RULES MISS JANET MADE UP.
- 8 Q OKAY.
- 9 IF YOU HAD AN ACCIDENT AND YOUR UNDERWEAR GOT DIRTY,
- 10 DID YOU EVER HAVE TO DO ANYTHING SPECIFIC WITH YOUR UNDERWEAR?
- 11 A WELL, MISS JANET WOULD -- SHE DID IT TO ANASTASIA
- 12 ONE TIME.
- 13 **Q** OKAY.
- 14 A COUPLE OF TIMES, ACTUALLY. LIKE WE HAD FOSTER
- 15 KIDS AND SHE POOPED ON HERSELF, BECAUSE SHE WAS AFRAID TO GET
- 16 UP AND GO TO THE BATHROOM.
- 17 Q OKAY.
- 18 A SO MISS JANET SAW HER ON THE CAN IN HER -- I DON'T
- 19 KNOW WHAT IT WAS, BUT IT'S -- (SOUND) -- LANGUAGE, SHE PUT ON
- 20 HER HEAD.
- 21 **Q** SHE PUT --
- 22 A SHE MADE HER STAND UP ON THE BOARD.
- 23 Q SHE MADE ANASTASIA PUT HER UNDERWEAR ON HER HEAD?
- A NO, SHE PUT IT ON ANASTASIA'S HEAD, MADE HER STAND
- 25 UP ON THE BOARD, SHE DRAPED HER ARMS UP IN THE AIR.

- 1 Q OKAY. DID YOU EVER HAVE TO PUT UNDERWEAR IN YOUR
- 2 MOUTH?
- 3 A YES.
- 4 MR. MANN: OBJECTION, LEADING.
- 5 **THE COURT:** OVERRULED.
- 6 BY MS. BLUTH:
- 7 Q WHO MADE YOU PUT UNDERWEAR IN YOUR MOUTH?
- 8 A MISS JANET.
- 9 Q OKAY. WAS THE UNDERWEAR CLEAN OR DIRTY?
- 10 **A** DIRTY.
- 11 Q DID THAT HAPPEN A LOT?
- 12 **A** YES.
- 13 Q DID YOU SEE YOUR SISTERS HAVE TO DO THAT?
- 14 **A** YES.
- 15 Q WERE THERE TIMES -- UM -- AFTER AN ACCIDENT WHERE
- 16 YOU HAD TO ACT LIKE A BABY?
- 17 **A** YES.
- 18 Q CAN YOU TELL ME ABOUT THAT?
- 19 A MISS JANET AND MR. DWIGHT WOULD MAKE FUN OF US.
- 20 LIKE WE HAD FOSTER KIDS AND THEY MADE US JUST -- MAKE US SAY
- 21 WHAT -- WHAT THE NAMES ON THE BUCKET, AND DO A WEIRD DANCE,
- 22 LIKE -- I DON'T KNOW WHAT'S -- HOW TO EXPLAIN IT, BECAUSE WE
- 23 HAD NAMES ON OUR BUCKETS, AND THOSE -- WE WOULD HAVE TO SAY IT
- 24 TO THE FOSTER KIDS, AND THEY'D LAUGH AT US AND KEEP DOING IT
- 25 TO US.

- 1 **Q** OKAY.
- 2 A LIKE A PACIFIER.
- 3 O WHAT ABOUT THE PACIFIER?
- 4 A PACIFIER WAS IN OUR MOUTHS.
- 5  $\mathbf{Q}$  OKAY.
- 6 A AND IF WE -- IF SALIVA WOULD START COMING OUT OF OUR
- 7 MOUTH, THEY'D SLAP US.
- 8 Q WHERE WOULD THEY SLAP YOU?
- 9 A SOMETIMES ON THE BOTTOM OR FACE OR ARM.
- 10 Q OKAY. AND WHEN YOU SAY THEY, ARE YOU TALKING
- 11 ABOUT MR. DWIGHT AND MISS JANET?
- 12 **A** WELL MAINLY MISS JANET.
- 13 **Q** OKAY.
- 14 MR. MANN: I'M SORRY, I'M HAVING A HARD TIME HEARING HER.
- 15 THE COURT: THAT'S OKAY. CAN YOU -- THAT'S OKAY. YOU
- 16 CAN LOOK MY WAY, BUT CAN YOU SPEAK INTO THE MICROPHONE? IT'S
- 17 OKAY, YOU'RE DOING GREAT. WE CAN HEAR EVERYTHING UP UNTIL
- 18 JUST WHAT YOU JUST SAID, SO -- UM -- I THINK MISS BLUTH ASKED
- 19 YOU WHO WOULD DO THAT.
- 20 **THE WITNESS:** MAINLY MISS JANET.
- 21 BY MS. BLUTH:
- 22 Q WHEN YOU SAY MAINLY, WAS THERE OTHER PEOPLE WHO EVER
- 23 MADE YOU DO IT?
- 24 A LIKE IF MR. DWIGHT WAS UP IN THE ROOM WE'D DO IT.
- 25 THEY'D BRING -- BEFORE THAT WE'D BE STANDING LIKE IN THE

- 1 KITCHEN, THEY'D CALL THE FOSTER KIDS TO COME DOWN, AND THEY'D
- 2 JUST BE LAUGHING AND MAKE FUN OF US. AND IF SALIVA STARTED
- 3 COMING OUT OF MY MOUTH, THEY'D SLAP US AND SOMETIMES KICK US.
- 4 Q OKAY. YOU TALKED A LITTLE BIT ABOUT TAKING SHOWERS.
- 5 UM -- DID YOU EVER TAKE BATHS OR WAS IT ONLY SHOWERS?
- 6 A SHOWERS.
- 7 Q OOPS, YOU OKAY? DID I PUT THAT TOO CLOSE TO YOU?
- 8 SORRY.
- 9 NOW, WERE THERE ANY RULES ABOUT THE SHOWER?
- 10 A WELL, SHE'D PUT IT LIKE ON THE --
- 11 THE REPORTER: ON THE WHAT?
- 12 THE WITNESS: LUKEWARM.
- 13 THE REPORTER: OKAY.
- 14 THE WITNESS: AND THEN SHE'D GIVE US SOAP AND SHE'D -- WE
- 15 HAD TO WASH UNTIL SHE COME UPSTAIRS OR UNTIL SHE SAYS TO STOP.
- 16 BY MS. BLUTH:
- 17 Q OKAY. UM -- NOW, YOU SAID LUKEWARM. WAS THERE --
- 18 DID YOU EVER TAKE COLD SHOWERS OR WERE THEY ALWAYS LUKEWARM?
- 19 A SOMETIMES LUKEWARM, SOMETIMES COLD.
- 20 Q WELL, WHY WOULD SOMETIMES YOU GET LUKEWARM AND
- 21 SOMETIMES COLD?
- 22 A IT DEPENDS ON WHAT SHE WANTED TO GIVE US. LIKE IF
- 23 SHE WANTED TO GIVE US A COLD SHOWER OR -- OR A LUKEWARM SHOWER
- 24 OR -- DEPENDS ON OUR BEHAVIOR.
- 25 Q OKAY. NOW, WHAT WOULD HAPPEN IF SHE THOUGHT YOU

- 1 WERE ACTING BAD OR YOU HAD AN ACCIDENT?
- 2 A SHE'D GIVE US LIKE SOMETIMES LUKEWARM. LIKE SHE'D
- 3 DECIDE -- SOMETIMES I THINK -- I DON'T KNOW IF SHE DID -- THIS
- 4 IS WHAT I THINK SHE WAS LIKE -- LIKE -- SHE'D BE LIKE, SHE'D
- 5 DECIDE ABOUT IT IF SHE WANTS TO GIVE US A REALLY COLD SHOWER
- 6 OR SHE -- IF SHE WANTED TO POUR -- GET A BUCKET AND FILL IT
- 7 WITH ICE AND DUMP IT ON US OR -- AND SHE DECIDES.
- 8 Q MISS JANET DECIDES?
- 9 A YES.
- 10 OKAY. NOW, AFTER YOU GOT OUT OF THE SHOWER HOW
- 11 WOULD YOU DRY OFF?
- 12 A WE'D SHAKE OFF, OR SOMETIMES SHE'D GIVE US OUR
- 13 TOWEL.
- 14 Q OKAY. WERE THERE EVER ANY FANS USED IN THE
- 15 BATHROOM?
- 16 A YES. SHE'D GET LIKE THIS SMALL FAN AND PLUG IT IN
- 17 THE OUTLET, AND SHE'D MAKE US STAY IN FRONT OF IT AND DRY OFF
- 18 WHILE THE OTHER ONE WAS TAKING A SHOWER.
- 19 Q WHEN YOU SAY SHE, ARE YOU TALKING ABOUT MISS JANET?
- 20 **A** YES.
- 21 Q AFTER YOU WOULD TAKE A SHOWER, DID ANYBODY EVER
- 22 CHECK THE SHOWER?
- 23 A YES. SHE'D GET LIKE THIS FLASHLIGHT AND LOOK IN THE
- 24 SHOWER TO SEE IF THERE WAS ANY PEE SPOTS OR -- JUST CHECK.
- 25 SHE ALWAYS CHECKS.

- 1 Q WHAT DID SHE TELL YOU ABOUT THAT SPECIAL FLASHLIGHT?
- A NOTHING. SHE'D JUST GET THE FLASHLIGHT, AND IT WAS
- 3 A PURPLE LIGHT, BUT I DON'T KNOW WHAT IT DID.
- 4 Q OKAY. AND SO SUPPOSABLY SHE COULD SEE IF THERE WAS
- 5 PEE.
- 6 A WITH THE FLASHLIGHT. I GUESS THAT'S WHAT THE
- 7 FLASHLIGHT THAT WAS FOR ANYWAY.
- 8 Q OKAY. AND SO WHAT WOULD HAPPEN IF SHE SAW PEE IN
- 9 THERE?
- 10 A SHE'D SAY "WHAT'S THIS", AND SAY -- AND IF WE'D SAY
- 11 IT WAS, SHE'D START YELLING AT US OR -- SHE SAYS, "DID YOU PEE
- 12 IN THE TUB?" WE'D SAY NO. SHE'D SAY, "I'M NOT STUPID I CAN
- 13 SEE THE SPOTS."
- 14 Q OKAY. DID YOU GET IN TROUBLE FOR HAVING SPOTS?
- 15 **A** YES.
- 16 Q WHAT ABOUT -- UM -- YOUR UNDERWEAR, WAS YOUR
- 17 UNDERWEAR EVER CHECKED?
- 18 **A** YES.
- 19 **Q** WHO WOULD CHECK YOUR UNDERWEAR?
- 20 **A** LIKE IF -- SOMETIMES MISS JANET, SOMETIMES MR.
- 21 DWIGHT, SOMETIMES DANIELLE.
- 22 O OKAY. AND WHEN THEY WOULD CHECK YOUR UNDERWEAR, DID
- 23 THEY USE THE LIGHT, TOO, OR IS IT -- HOW WOULD THEY CHECK YOUR
- 24 UNDERWEAR?
- 25 A SOMETIMES THEY USE A REGULAR LIGHT OR IT'S A PURPLE

- 1 LIGHT, OR SOMETIMES THEY WOULDN'T USE THE LIGHT.
- 2 O AND -- AND WHAT WOULD HAPPEN IF SOMEBODY FOUND
- 3 SOMETHING?
- 4 A GET IN TROUBLE.
- 5 O AND WHAT IS GETTING IN TROUBLE MEAN?
- 6 A WE'D GET SPANKED.
- 7 O OKAY. BY WHOEVER IT WAS THAT WAS CHECKING?
- 8 A WELL LIKE -- YES.
- 9 Q WHEN YOU SAY SPANKED, WOULD YOU GET SPANKED WITH
- 10 YOUR HAND OR WITH -- WITH THEIR HAND OR WAS IT ALWAYS THE
- 11 STICK?
- 12 A WELL, SOMETIMES THEY SPANK US WITH THEIR HANDS OR
- 13 WITH -- MISS JANET'S SLIPPER, OR WITH THE PAINT STICK. MAINLY
- 14 WITH THE PAINT STICK.
- 15 O UM -- WHERE DID YOU SLEEP IN THE HOUSE?
- 16 A WELL, LIKE SOMETIMES WE'D SLEEP BY THE STAIRS, OR
- 17 SOMETIMES I SLEEP IN FRONT OF DANIELLE'S ROOM ON THE BOARD,
- 18 BUT THERE WAS A GATE, SO I COULDN'T CROSS BECAUSE THERE WAS A
- 19 BATHROOM RIGHT THERE, AND WOULD -- I'D SLEEP BY THE STAIRS IN
- 20 THE LOFT, LIKE IN THE MIDDLE.
- 21 **Q** WELL, WHO DECIDED WHERE IT WAS THAT YOU SLEPT?
- 22 A MISS JANET.
- 23 O AND WHAT WOULD YOU SLEEP ON?
- A A BOARD, BUT -- BUT THEN SHE DECIDED LIKE IF WE PEE
- 25 ON OURSELVES, LIKE SHE GOT US THESE FOLD UP BEDS YOU COULD

- 1 SLEEP ON AND FOLD THEM UP, BUT SHE'D SAY IF WE LIKE PEE ON
- 2 OURSELF, SHE SAID, YOU LOST YOUR BED FOR THE NIGHT, OR THE
- 3 NEXT -- NEXT DAY IF WE DIDN'T DO IT WE'D GET IT BACK.
- 4 Q OKAY. SO ON DAYS WHEN YOU HAD AN ACCIDENT OR YOU
- 5 GOT IN TROUBLE YOU HAD TO SLEEP ON A BOARD?
- 6 A YES.
- 7 Q OKAY. AND WHEN YOU SLEPT ON THE BOARD, DID YOU --
- 8 CAN YOU EXPLAIN THE BOARD TO ME? LIKE DID YOU HAVE SHEETS, OR
- 9 WAS IT JUST A BOARD?
- 10 A JUST A BOARD.
- 11 Q OKAY. AND WERE YOU ALLOWED TO WEAR PAJAMAS?
- 12 A WELL WE MAINLY SLEPT IN OUR UNDERWEAR. I THINK
- 13 WE -- WELL, I THINK WE COULD WEAR PAJAMAS, I CAN'T REMEMBER.
- O ON DAYS WHEN YOU HAD AN ACCIDENT AND YOU WERE IN
- 15 TROUBLE, WHAT DID YOU SLEEP IN?
- 16 A WHAT DO YOU MEAN?
- 17 Q LIKE YOU SAID, ON SOME DAYS YOU SLEPT IN YOUR
- 18 UNDERWEAR AND SOME DAYS YOU SLEPT IN YOUR PAJAMAS?
- 19 **A** YES.
- 20 Q UM -- AND WHAT ABOUT -- WERE THERE ANY FANS IN -- IN
- 21 THAT AREA WHERE YOU SLEPT?
- 22 A YES. LIKE THEY'D GET -- MISS JANET WOULD GET THE
- 23 FANS, AND THERE'S THIS ONE -- ONE -- ONE TIME IT WAS A BIG FAN
- 24 AND SHE COULD PUT IT LIKE LOW OR HIGH, SHE PUT IT IN FRONT OF
- 25 US WHILE WE ARE SLEEPING, OR SOMETIMES SHE'D PUT ALL THE FANS

- 1 ON US.
- 2 OKAY. IF YOU WERE IN TROUBLE?
- 3 A YES.
- 4 Q WHEN -- UM -- ON THE DAYS WHEN MISS JANET WAS OUT OF
- 5 TOWN AND YOU HAD AN ACCIDENT, SO MR. DWIGHT WAS THERE, WOULD
- 6 YOU STILL SLEEP ON THE BOARDS?
- 7 A WELL, WHEN MISS REBECCA WAS THERE, AND MISS JANET,
- 8 WE SLEPT ON THE BEDS.
- 9 Q OKAY.
- 10 A BUT I THINK LIKE IF WE HAD AN ACCIDENT SHE'D GET --
- 11 HE, I MEAN, WOULD CALL HER AND SHE'D DECIDE IF WE SLEPT ON THE
- 12 BOARD OR THE BED.
- 13 Q OKAY. SO MR. DWIGHT WOULD CALL MISS JANET, AND IF
- 14 SHE SAID THEY HAVE TO SLEEP ON THE BOARDS, THEN MR. DWIGHT
- 15 WOULD MAKE YOU SLEEP ON THE BOARDS?
- 16 A YES. JUST FOLLOW THE RULES THAT SHE HAD MADE.
- 17 Q OKAY. SO HE FOLLOWED MISS JANET'S RULES?
- 18 **A** YES.
- 19 Q UM -- AND YOU DIDN'T HAVE ANY -- I THINK I ASKED YOU
- 20 THIS, BUT YOU DIDN'T HAVE ANY SHEETS OR BLANKETS?
- 21 A ON THE BED, YES. BUT LIKE WE'D SLEEP ON THE BED TO
- 22 HAVE A SHEET, BUT SOMETIMES SHE'D GIVE US A BLANKET.
- 23 **Q** UM-HUM.
- 24 A BUT ON THE BOARD, NO.
- 25 **Q** OKAY.

- A SOMETIMES WE SLEPT ON A TOWEL ON THE FLOOR. YEAH,
- 2 WE HAD A TOWEL, LIKE SHE COULD GIVE -- GIVE US A TOWEL AND
- 3 WE'D PUT IT ON THE BOARD.
- 4 Q OKAY. SO THE BOARD WAS ON THE GROUND AND THEN THE
- 5 TOWEL WAS ON THE BOARD AND THEN YOU SLEPT ON THE TOWEL?
- 6 A YES.
- 7 O IN YOUR UNDERWEAR?
- 8 A (NO AUDIBLE RESPONSE.)
- 9 Q IS THAT A YEAH?
- 10 **A** YES.
- OR A YES. SORRY, I SAY YEAH, TOO.
- 12 UM -- NOW, YOU HAD TALKED EARLIER ABOUT DOING
- 13 YOUR -- YOU DID YOUR HOMEWORK DOWNSTAIRS IN THE KITCHEN.
- 14 WHO CHECKED YOUR HOMEWORK?
- 15 **A** UM -- LIKE IF MISS JANET WAS DOING SOMETHING SHE'D
- 16 ASK MR. DWIGHT OR DANIELLE IF THEY COULD CHECK IT, AND THEY'D
- 17 CHECK IT AND JUST TAKE TURNS.
- 18 Q OKAY. SO LET'S TALK ABOUT IF MISS JAN -- SO
- 19 SOMETIMES, THOUGH, DID MISS JANET CHECK YOUR HOMEWORK?
- 20 **A** YES.
- 21 Q AND WHAT WOULD HAPPEN IF -- UM -- YOU GOT SOMETHING
- 22 WRONG?
- 23 **A** WE'D GET SPANKED.
- 24 **Q** BY WHO OR WHOM?
- 25 **A** MAINLY MISS JANET.

- 1 Q DID YOU GET PUNISHED IN ANY OTHER WAYS IF YOU GOT --
- 2 IF SHE GOT FRUSTRATED WITH YOU FOR NOT DOING YOUR HOMEWORK
- 3 RIGHT?
- 4 A YES.
- 5 Q CAN YOU EXPLAIN TO ME THOSE?
- A LIKE WE KEPT GETTING IT WRONG SHE'S LIKE -- SHE
- 7 WOULD BE LIKE, IF YOU DON'T GET THIS ANSWER RIGHT THIS TIME
- 8 YOU'RE NOT GONNA' EAT.
- 9 Q OKAY.
- 10 A OR LIKE WE'D STAY UP LATE AND KEEP DOING -- TRYING
- 11 TO GO WORK ON THE ANSWER.
- 12 Q OKAY. WERE -- IN THE HOUSE THAT YOU LIVED IN, WAS
- 13 THAT ONE STORY OR TWO STORY?
- 14 A TWO STORY.
- 15 Q OKAY. UM -- DID YOU EVER GET HURT FROM FALLING DOWN
- 16 STAIRS IN THAT HOUSE?
- 17 **A** YES.
- 18 Q HOW DID YOU FALL?
- 19 A WELL, LIKE MISS JANET WOULD -- FROM PEEING ON
- 20 OURSELVES, SHE'D TELL TO US TO GET UP, AND WE'D LOOK AT HER --
- THE REPORTER: I'M SORRY, YOU WHAT?
- THE WITNESS: WE'D LOOK AT HER IN A MEAN WAY, BECAUSE WE
- 23 WERE MAD, AND SHE'D, LIKE DON'T LOOK AT ME, TURN AROUND, AND
- 24 THEN SHE'D KICK US AND WE'D TRIED TO GO UP THE STAIRS AND

- 6 A IT WAS LIKE THIS TUBE CONNECTED TO THIS BAG, AND
- 7 SHE'D USE IT ON US, LIKE SHE'D CLOSE THE DOOR AND PUT A TOWEL
- 8 LIKE ON THE GROUND, AND THEN WE'D -- SHE'D ASK US, "DO YOU
- 9 HAVE TO GO THE BATHROOM BEFORE I LEAVE?" AND WE'D SAY NO.
- 10 AND IF -- SHE'D CHECK US, GET A CATHETER FROM LIKE -- SHE'D DO

- 16 GONNA' GET IT BECAUSE YOU LIED TO ME.
- 17 Q OKAY. SO I WANT TO BREAK THAT DOWN A LITTLE BIT.
- 18 SO SHE WOULD ASK YOU, DO YOU HAVE TO GO TO THE
- 19 BATHROOM, AND YOU WOULD SAY NO?
- 20 **A** YES.
- 21 Q OKAY. AND THEN YOU SAID SHE WOULD CHECK YOU?
- 22 **A** YES.
- 23 Q WHEN YOU SAID SHE'D CLOSE THE DOOR AND PUT A TOWEL
- 24 DOWN, WHAT ROOM WAS IT, OR WAS IT LOTS OF DIFFERENT ROOMS?
- 25 A MAIN -- WELL, I CA -- I REMEMBER WHEN SHE DID IT TO

- 1 US ONE TIME IN THE BATHROOM BY THE TWO BEDROOMS WHERE THE GATE
- 2 WAS, WHERE I SLEPT. LIKE DANIELLE'S ROOM WAS HERE, AND I
- 3 SLEPT BY THE BOARD, LET'S JUST GET HERE, AND THEN THE BATHROOM
- 4 AND TWO OTHER ROOMS.
- 5 **Q** OKAY.
- 6 A SO SHE'D DO IT IN THE BATHROOM.
- 7 Q AND SO SHE'D LAY DOWN THE TOWEL, AND THEN WOULD YOU
- 8 LAY DOWN ON THE TOWEL?
- 9 A YES.
- 10 Q OKAY. AND WHERE WOULD SHE PUT THE CATHETER?
- 11 A HER FRONT PRIVATE.
- 12 Q OKAY. WOULD IT GO INSIDE?
- 13 **A** YES.
- 14 Q OKAY. AND THEN IF PEE CAME OUT YOU WERE IN TROUBLE?
- 15 **A** YES.
- 16 Q WOULD YOU EVER TRY TO FIGHT HER AND -- AND NOT LET
- 17 HER PUT THE CATHETER IN?
- 18 **A** YES.
- 19 **Q** WHAT WOULD HAPPEN WHEN YOU FOUGHT?
- 20 A SHE'D SPANK US.
- 21 Q DID SHE EVER THREATEN YOU WITH ANYTHING?
- 22 A WELL, SHE'D SAY SHE'S GONNA' -- I REMEMBER ONE TIME
- 23 AVA WAS IN THE SHOWER AND SOME -- IT WAS SOMETHING ABOUT THE
- 24 BATHROOM, AND SHE THREATENED AVA, CUT HER WITH THE RAZOR
- 25 BLADE, AND SHE SAID SHE'S GONNA' LAUGH, AND WATCH AVA BLEED TO

- 1 DEATH IN THE TUB.
- 2 OKAY. DID SHE EVER THREATEN YOU WITH THE RAZOR
- 3 BLADE?
- 4 A YES.
- 5 Q UM -- IF I ASKED YOU TO DRAW THE RAZOR BLADE, DO YOU
- 6 REMEMBER WHAT IT LOOKS LIKE?
- 7 **A** YES.
- 8 MS. BLUTH: MAY I APPROACH, YOUR HONOR?
- 9 THE COURT: YES.
- 10 BY MS. BLUTH:
- 11 Q COULD YOU DRAW THE RAZOR FOR ME, THE RAZOR BLADE?
- 12 WHAT COLOR WAS IT?
- 13 A GRAY. IT WAS SHARP, AND THERE WAS A -- IN THE
- 14 MIDDLE.
- 15 THE REPORTER: AND WHAT'S IN THE MIDDLE?
- 16 MS. BLUTH: THERE WAS ONE IN THE MIDDLE, IT'S A LINE.
- 17 MAY I HAVE THIS MARKED OR -- AND SO THIS -- THIS IS WHAT
- 18 YOU DREW OF THE -- OF THE RAZOR BLADE THAT IT LOOKS LIKE THE
- 19 RAZOR BLADE THAT MISS JANET THREATENED YOU WITH?
- 20 **THE WITNESS:** YES.
- 21 MS. BLUTH: JUDGE, I'D ASK TO HAVE THIS ADMITTED AND

- 23 THE COURT: ANY OBJECTION, MR. MANN?

- 8 THE COURT: HOLD ON ONE SECOND, SORRY. WHAT ARE YOU

- 10 THE CLERK: IT WILL BE FIVE.
- 11 THE COURT: FIVE? IT WILL BE MARKED -- JUST FOR THE
- 12 RECORD, IT WILL BE MARKED AND ADMITTED AS EXHIBIT 5.
- 13 MS. BLUTH: THANK YOU.
- 14 (WHEREUPON STATE'S PROPOSED EXHIBIT NO. 5 WAS MARKED FOR
- 15 IDENTIFICATION AND ADMITTED INTO EVIDENCE.)
- 16 THE COURT: I'M SORRY, GO AHEAD.
- 17 BY MS. BLUTH:

- 3 Q IF YOU DON'T SHUT UP, WHAT?
- 4 A SHE'S GONNA' GO GET THE RAZOR BLADE AND CUT US.
- 5 Q OKAY. DID SHE SHOW YOU IT?
- 6 **A** YES.
- 7 AND ONE TIME SHE CUT AVA ON THE LIP, BECAUSE -- SHE
- 8 HAD WENT DOWNSTAIRS AND I LOOKED OVER AT AVA AND I SAID, "AVA
- 9 WHAT HAPPENED TO YOUR LIP?" AND SHE SAID --
- 10 MR. MANN: OBJECTION, HEARSAY.
- 11 THE COURT: SUSTAINED. IT'S OKAY.
- 12 MS. BLUTH: THAT'S OKAY.
- 13 THE WITNESS: DO --
- 14 THE COURT: NO, THAT'S OKAY, YOU DON'T HAVE TO ANSWER IT.
- 15 MS. BLUTH: YOU DON'T HAVE TO ANSWER THAT ONE.
- 16 THANKS, AVA [SIC].
- 17 Q DID YOU -- UM -- BEFORE YOU LEFT FOR MARVELOUS GIRLS
- 18 ACADEMY -- AM I SAYING THAT RIGHT, OR IS IT MARVELOUS GRACE?
- 19 HOW DO YOU SAY IT?
- 20 A MARVELOUS GRACE GIRLS ACADEMY.
- 21 Q BEFORE YOU LEFT FOR MARVELOUS GRACE GIRLS ACADEMY,
- 22 DO YOU REMEMBER SEEING AVA WITH A BLACK EYE?
- 23 **A** YES.
- 24 Q WERE YOU THERE WHEN AVA GOT THAT BLACK EYE?
- 25 **A** YES.

- 1 Q CAN YOU TELL ME HOW SHE GOT IT?
- 2 A WELL, SHE -- I SAW AVA -- MISS JANET WAS OVER THERE
- 3 ON THE COUCH WATCHING TV -- SHE WAS SHAKING, I SAID, "AVA, DO
- 4 YOU HAVE TO GO TO THE BATHROOM?" SHE SAID "YES." I SAY,
- 5 "JUST SAY SOMETHING, IT'S NOT GOING TO BE BAD." AND SHE SAID,
- 6 "NO, I'M SCARED." AND I SAID, "AVA, YOU'RE GONNA' GET IN MORE

- 1 A I KNOW SHE HAD ACCIDENTS IN THE BUCKET.
- 2 OKAY. UM -- DID YOU EVER HAVE TO EAT OR DRINK ANY
- 3 OF YOUR PEE OR POOP?
- 4 A I DON'T THINK SO.
- O OKAY. DID YOU EVER SEE -- UM -- ANASTASIA HAVE TO?
- 6 A YEAH. SHE POOPED IN THE POTTY TOILET THAT THEY GOT
- 7 HER, AND THEN -- UM -- I THINK MISS JANET -- IT WAS EITHER
- 8 MISS JANET OR DANIELLE SMELLED SOMETHING, AND THEY SAID -- I
- 9 THINK DANIELLE SAID, "WHAT'S THAT SMELL", AND THEY TOLD --

- 23 ABOUT THE CATHETER. WHEN MISS JANET -- UM -- OR ACTUALLY
- 24 STRIKE THAT QUESTION.
- 25 WHO BROUGHT THE -- OR WHO BOUGHT THE CATHETERS?

- 1 A I THINK MISS JANET BRUNG IT FROM HER JOB.
- 2 Q OKAY. DID YOU EVER HEAR MR. DWIGHT AND MISS JANET
- 3 TALKING ABOUT THE CATHETERS?

- 5 Q DID YOU EVER HEAR ANYBODY ORDERING THE CATHETERS ON

- 11 SAW SOMETHING ON THE TV ABOUT SOMETHING CATHETERS, AND THEN HE
- 12 CALLED A NUMBER. AND I CAN'T REMEMBER IF IT WAS MISS JANET OR
- 13 MR. DWIGHT, BUT I THINK IT WAS MR. DWIGHT, I'M NOT SURE, HE

- 19 THE COURT: SURE. WHAT ARE YOU APPROACHING WITH?
- 20 MS. BLUTH: UM -- STATE'S ALREADY IN EVIDENCE AS 2. I
- 21 HAD ASKED --
- 22 **THE COURT:** AS TWO?
- 23 MS. BLUTH: YEAH.
- 24 THE COURT: OKAY.
- 25 MS. BLUTH: STATE'S 2.

- 1 MR. MANN: CAN I SEE IT, MISS --
- 2 MS. BLUTH: OH, YEAH.
- 3 O I HAD ASKED YOU EARLIER ABOUT THE PAINT STICK, AND
- 4 YOU SAID IT WAS BROWN, FROM HOME DEPOT. IF I SHOWED YOU A
- 5 PICTURE OF IT WOULD YOU RECOGNIZE IT?
- 6 A YES.
- 7 Q SHOWING YOU STATE'S EXHIBIT 2, DOES THAT LOOK LIKE
- 8 ONE OF THE PAINT STICKS THAT WAS USED?
- 9 A YES.
- 10 Q OKAY. NOW, THE PAINT STICKS -- I MEAN THERE WASN'T
- 11 JUST ONE THAT WAS USED, RIGHT? SOME WOULD BREAK AND THEN
- 12 THERE'D BE NEW ONES?
- 13 MR. MANN: OBJECTION, LEADING.
- 14 THE COURT: SUSTAINED.
- 15 BY MS. BLUTH:
- 16 Q WAS THERE JUST ONE OR WERE THERE A LOT IN THE HOUSE?
- 17 A WELL, JUST THEY'D SPANK US, AND IF THEY TAKE -- AND
- 18 IF WE RAN OUT, DIDN'T HAVE ANY MORE IN THE GARAGE, THEY'D GO
- 19 BUY IT.
- 20 Q WHO WOULD GO BUY IT?
- 21 A WELL SOMETIMES MR. DWIGHT.
- 22 MS. BLUTH: THANK YOU, AMAYA.
- 23 I'LL PASS THE WITNESS.
- THE COURT: OKAY. NOW MR. MANN IS GOING TO ASK YOU SOME

- 14 Q WHAT WAS THAT MEDICAL CONDITION?
- 15 A IT WAS SOMETHING ABOUT MY COLON.
- 16 Q OKAY. SOMETHING TO DO WITH YOUR STOMACH AND YOUR
- 17 COLON?
- 18 **A** YES.
- 19 Q OKAY. AND -- UM -- YOU WENT AND SAW A DOCTOR?
- 20 **A** YES.
- 21 O AND THE DOCTOR WAS THE ONE THAT INSTRUCTED ABOUT
- 22 THE -- UH -- WHAT TYPES OF FOOD YOU COULD EAT, CORRECT?
- 23 **A** YES.
- 24 Q OKAY. BECAUSE YOU WERE HAVING PAINS IN YOUR
- 25 STOMACH?

- 1 A YES.
- 2 UM -- AND JUST TO BE CLEAR, BEFORE YOU WENT TO THE
- 3 DOCTOR, THAT'S WHEN YOU WERE EATING REGULAR FOOD, CORRECT?
- 4 **A** YES.
- 5 OKAY. AND IT WAS AFTER THAT YOU WENT TO THE DOCTOR
- 6 THAT YOU STARTED EATING BLENDED FOOD, CORRECT?
- 7 **A** YES.
- 8 Q OKAY. AND -- UM -- AFTER THAT TIME YOU ACTUALLY HAD
- 9 SIGNIFICANTLY MORE MEDICAL ISSUES, CORRECT?
- 10 **A** YES.
- 11 Q YOU EVEN WERE TAKEN TO THE HOSPITAL A COUPLE TIMES?
- 12 **A** YES.
- 13 Q OKAY. UM -- ONE OF THOSE TIMES WAS IN DECEMBER OF
- 14 2012, CORRECT?
- 15 **A** YES.
- 16 Q OKAY. DO YOU KNOW WHY YOU WENT TO THE HOSPITAL IN
- 17 DECEMBER OF 2012?
- 18 **A** YES.
- 19 Q WHY DID YOU GO TO THE HOSPITAL IN DECEMBER 2012?
- 20 A I HAD A SEIZURE.
- 21 O OKAY. AND WAS THAT THE FIRST TIME THAT YOU HAD A
- 22 SEIZURE?
- 23 **A** YES.
- 24 Q AND FROM THAT SEIZURE WERE YOU DIAGNOSED WITH SOME
- 25 SORT OF CONDITION THAT CAUSES SEIZURES?

- 1 A YES.
- 2 O DO YOU KNOW WHAT I MEAN WHEN I SAY DIAGNOSED?
- 3 A I THINK SO.
- 4 Q WHEN THE DOCTOR SAYS YOU HAVE A CONDITION OR A
- 5 PROBLEM WHERE YOU HAVE SEIZURES.
- A UM -- I THINK SO, BUT I KNOW THAT HE SAID THAT I
- 7 CAN'T HAVE BANANAS.
- 8 Q YOU CAN'T HAVE BANANAS?
- 9 A YES.
- 10 O OKAY. AND -- UM -- YOU WERE IN THE HOSPITAL IN A
- 11 COMA FOR A LONG TIME -- UH -- IN DECEMBER, CORRECT?
- 12 **A** YES.
- 13 Q AND YOU ENDED UP WAKING UP ON CHRISTMAS DAY; IS THAT
- 14 RIGHT?
- 15 **A** YES.
- 16 Q AND -- UM -- WHEN YOU WOKE UP -- UM -- THE SOLANDERS
- 17 WERE THERE WITH YOUR SISTERS, CORRECT?
- 18 **A** YES.
- 19 Q AND THEY WERE EXCITED TO SEE YOU WAKE UP, CORRECT?
- 20 **A** YES.
- 21 Q OKAY. AND YOU WERE ADOPTED IN JANUARY OF 2011; IS
- 22 THAT RIGHT?
- 23 **A** YES.
- 24 Q OKAY. UM -- WHEN YOU WERE ADOPTED YOU WENT ON --
- 25 UM -- SEVERAL TRIPS WITH THE SOLANDERS, CORRECT?

- 1 **A** YES.
- 2 YOU WENT TO DISNEY WORLD?
- 3 A YES.
- 4 Q YOU WENT TO CALIFORNIA?
- 5 A YES.
- 6 Q YOU WENT TO MANY PLACES, CORRECT?
- 7 **A** YES.
- 8 Q OKAY. SOMETIMES WITH ALL YOUR SISTERS, SOMETIMES
- 9 NOT, CORRECT?
- 10 A WELL, YEAH, WE WENT WITH MY SISTERS.
- 11 Q ALL THE TIME YOU WENT WITH YOUR SISTERS?
- 12 A WELL, THERE WAS ONE TIME WHEN WE WENT TO DISNEY
- 13 WORLD, I HAD ACTED UP BECAUSE I GOT MAD ABOUT SOMETHING, SO
- 14 WHEN THEY -- THEY -- THE SOLANDERS DIDN'T WANT TO -- THEY
- 15 NOT -- WELL, LIKE THEY DIDN'T WANT TO --
- 16 Q YOU GOT IN TROUBLE --
- 17 A -- I CAN'T -- AND THEY DIDN'T WANT TO -- UM -- GIVE
- 18 US A REWARD BECAUSE WE DIDN'T DESERVE IT. WELL I DIDN'T
- 19 DESERVE IT, BECAUSE I HAD ACTED OUT, SO AVA WENT WITH HER

- 2 Q OKAY. AND THEY ACTUALLY HAD A POINT SYSTEM FOR
- 3 TIMES THAT YOU MISS BEHAVED, CORRECT?
- 4 **A** YES.
- 5 Q AND THERE WAS A CHART ON THE REFRIGERATOR ABOUT YOUR
- 6 MISBEHAVIOR, CORRECT?
- 7 **A** YES.
- 8 Q UM -- AND IF YOU GOT SIX DEMERITS OR SIX POINTS FOR
- 9 MISBEHAVIOR, YOU GOT IN TROUBLE, CORRECT?
- 10 **A** YES.
- 11 O SO ESSENTIALLY YOU HAD SIX WARNINGS BEFORE YOU GOT
- 12 PUNISHED FOR YOUR MISBEHAVIOR, CORRECT?
- 13 **A** YES.
- 14 O OKAY. BUT YOU WERE THE ONE THAT -- BETWEEN YOUR
- 15 THREE SISTERS, THAT WOULD GET IN TROUBLE THE MOST, CORRECT?
- 16 **A** YES.
- 17 Q UM -- AND YOU HAD -- YOU WOULD USUALLY GET IN
- 18 TROUBLE FOR LYING, CORRECT?
- 19 **A** YES.
- 20 O UM -- THAT YOU WOULD -- UM -- HAVE NUMEROUS
- 21 INSTANCES WHERE YOU WOULD MAKE UP STORIES, AND THEN THEY FOUND

- 3 O AND SOMETIMES THAT PUNISHMENT WOULD BE FROM THAT
- 4 STICK, THAT EXHIBIT 2 THAT MISS BLUTH SHOWED YOU, CORRECT?
- 5 A YES.
- 6 OKAY. AND -- UM -- WHEN YOU GOT SPANKED WITH THAT
- 7 STICK -- UM -- HOW MANY TIMES WOULD YOU GET SPANKED?
- 8 A WELL, IF WE DID SOMETHING WRONG THAT'S HOW MANY
- 9 TIMES WE'D GET SPANKED LIKE. I DON'T KNOW HOW TO EXPLAIN IT.
- 10 Q SURE. LET ME SEE IF I CAN HELP YOU, OKAY?
- ON ONE INSTANCE OF GETTING IN TROUBLE WHERE YOU WERE
- 12 GOING TO BE SPANKED --
- 13 **A** YES.
- 14 O -- HOW MANY HITS OF THE PAINT STICK WOULD YOU
- 15 RECEIVE?
- 16 A I DON'T KNOW.
- 17 **Q** ONE?
- 18 A I THINK SO.
- 19 Q OKAY. SO YOU THINK ONE HIT?
- 20 A YEAH. I THINK IT -- I THINK THEY DID IT LIKE
- 21 COME -- LIKE IF HOW MANY -- LIKE HOW MANY BAD THINGS WE DID,
- 22 THAT'S HOW MANY TIMES WE GOT HIT WITH THE PAINT STICK.
- 23 Q SO IF YOU GOT SIX POINTS YOU'D GET HIT SIX TIMES?
- 24 A I CAN'T REMEMBER, BUT I -- IT WAS A LONG TIME AGO.
- 25 **Q** OKAY.

- 1 THE COURT: WHAT DID YOU SAY, MAYA? I DIDN'T HEAR YOU,
- 2 I'M SORRY.
- 3 THE WITNESS: I CAN'T REMEMBER BECAUSE IT WAS A LONG TIME

- 6 BY MR. MANN:
- 7 Q NOW -- UM -- WHEN -- UM -- WHEN YOU -- UM -- WERE
- 8 LIVING WITH -- OR BEFORE YOU STARTED LIVING WITH THE SOLANDERS

- 15 **Q** OKAY. ANOTHER FOSTER FAMILY?
- 16 **A** YES.
- 17 Q OKAY. AND BEFORE THAT FOSTER FAMILY?
- 18 A BEFORE THAT FOSTER FAMILY WE WERE -- WELL BEFORE
- 19 MISS DEBBIE WE WERE AT THAT FOSTER FAMILY, BUT BEFORE THAT I
- 20 THINK WE WERE AT CHILD HAVEN.
- 21 Q OKAY. AND HOW LONG DO YOU REMEMBER YOUR WERE AT
- 22 CHILD HAVEN, A SHORT OR A LONG TIME?
- 23 **A** I CAN'T REMEMBER.
- 24 Q OKAY. AND BEFORE CHILD HAVEN YOU WERE AT YOUR
- 25 BIOLOGICAL MOTHER'S HOUSE, CORRECT?

- 1 A GRANDMA'S.
- 2 Q GRANDMA'S.
- 3 A (NO AUDIBLE RESPONSE.)
- 4 O AND -- UM -- WAS YOUR MOTHER LIVING AT THAT HOUSE
- 5 WITH YOUR GRANDMA, OR WERE YOU WITHOUT YOUR MOTHER THERE?
- 6 A NO, MOM WASN'T THERE.
- 7  $\mathbf{Q}$  OKAY.
- 8 NOW -- UM -- THE BLENDED FOOD, YOU REMEMBER TALKING
- 9 TO -- UM -- MISS EBRAHIM -- UM -- ABOUT -- LET'S SEE, IN ABOUT
- 10 MARCH OF THIS YEAR, IN -- UH -- AT, I THINK IT WAS CHILD
- 11 HAVEN?
- 12 (DISCUSSION BETWEEN MS. BLUTH AND MR. MANN.)
- 13 MR. MANN: OH, OKAY. MISS FAIZA?
- 14 MS. BLUTH: FAIZA.
- 15 BY MR. MANN:
- 16 **Q** FAIZA?
- 17 A I CAN'T REMEMBER.
- 18 Q OKAY. DO YOU REMEMBER GOING INTO A ROOM AND HAVING
- 19 A CONVERSATION WITH SOMEONE WHO ASKED YOU QUESTIONS ABOUT WHAT

- 22 O NO -- UH -- HERE IN LAS VEGAS.

- 24 Q OKAY. DID YOU HAVE A CONVERSATION WITH -- UM --
- 25 SOMEONE IN FLORIDA ABOUT WHAT HAPPENED IN THE SOLANDER'S

- 2 A YES.
- 3 Q TELL ME ABOUT THAT CONVERSATION, WHO WAS THERE?
- 4 MISS JACK -- JACKIE.
- 5 **Q** MISS JACKIE?
- A YEAH, SHE HAD -- ONE OF DIRECTORS, BECAUSE WE WERE
- 7 GOING TO A WEDDING, AND THE DIRECTOR -- WE TOLD THE DIRECTOR A
- 8 COUPLE DAYS AGO -- A COUPLE DAYS BEFORE SHE CAME, AND HE HAD

- 17 REMEMBER WHAT SHE LOOKED -- WHO SHE WORKED WITH, I MEAN.
- 18 Q OH, ALL RIGHT. BUT YOU WERE ON YOUR WAY TO A
- 19 WEDDING WHEN SHE HAD THIS DISCUSSION WITH YOU?
- 20 **A** YES.
- 21 Q OKAY. DID YOU GET TO GO TO THE WEDDING?
- 22 **A** YES.
- 23 Q OKAY. WHO'S WEDDING WAS IT?
- 24 A UM -- MISS SHELBY (PHONETIC), SHE WAS -- SHE'S ONE
- 25 OF THE LADIES THAT HELP -- NOT HELPS OUT, BUT HER FAMILY COMES

- 1 AND HELPS OUT SOMETIMES AT MARVELOUS GRACE.
- 2 Q OKAY. SO -- UM -- THIS WEDDING FOR MISS SHELBY, SHE
- 3 WAS A HELPER AT THE SCHOOL, AND YOU HAD THIS CONVERSATION WITH
- 4 MISS JACKIE BEFORE THAT WEDDING, BEFORE YOU WERE ABLE TO GO TO
- 5 THAT WEDDING?
- 6 **A** YES.
- 7 **Q** OKAY.
- 8 A IT WAS THE SAME DATE.
- 9 Q SAME DAY AS THE WEDDING?
- 10 **A** (NO AUDIBLE RESPONSE.)
- 11 Q IS THAT A YES?
- 12 **A** YES.
- 13 Q OKAY, THANK YOU.
- 14 UH -- BUT YOU DON'T REMEMBER HAVING A
- 15 CONVERSATION -- UH -- IN LAS VEGAS?
- 16 **A** NO.
- 17 Q OKAY. NOW, DO YOU REMEMBER -- UM -- TALKING TO
- 18 SOMEONE ABOUT THE BLENDED FOOD, AND WHAT WAS IN THAT BLENDED
- 19 FOOD?
- 20 A YES, IN FLORIDA.
- 21 Q OKAY. AND -- UM -- WHEN YOU WERE HAVING THAT
- 22 CONVERSATION WERE YOU BEING HONEST?
- 23 **A** YES.
- 24 Q AND DID YOU TELL THE WHOLE TRUTH?
- 25 **A** YES.

- 1 O OKAY. AND -- UM -- IN THAT CONVERSATION YOU TOLD
- 2 WHOMEVER WAS INTERVIEWING YOU THAT THE BLENDED FOOD INCLUDED
- 3 DEAD MICE; IS THAT RIGHT?
- 4 A YES, BECAUSE THAT'S WHAT THEY TOLD ME THERE WAS
- 5 THESE LITTLE LONG PIECE OF -- OF --
- 6 Q AND THAT DEAD MICE CAME OUT OF A CAN?
- 7 MS. BLUTH: JUDGE, I'D ASK THAT SHE BE ABLE TO FINISH HER
- 8 ANSWER.
- 9 THE COURT: YEAH, YOU DID INTERRUPT HER.

- 25 DECIDED. BUT I REMEMBER SHE PUT BEETS AND THIS BIG FAT GRAY

- 1 STUFF, AND THEN THAT NASTY BIG LONG SALTY MEAT.
- 2 THE COURT: OKAY. GO AHEAD MR. MANN.
- 3 MR. MANN: OKAY.
- 4 Q BUT -- UM -- YOU HAD TOLD THIS INTERVIEWER THAT YOU
- 5 HAD SEEN THE CAN WITH THE DEAD MICE, CORRECT?
- 6 A YES. BECAUSE LIKE IF -- LIKE WE WOULD SIT ON THE
- 7 TOILETS, AND I'D LOOK UP AND I SAW THE CAN.
- 8 Q OKAY. AND YOU SAID THAT THAT CAN INCLUDED DEAD
- 9 MICE, CORRECT?
- 10 **A** YES.
- 11 Q YOU ALSO TOLD THEM THAT -- UM -- THAT THEY MADE YOU
- 12 EAT COW PRIVATES; IS THAT RIGHT?
- 13 A I THINK YEAH, THAT'S THE -- THAT'S THE GRAY --
- 14 THAT'S THE BIG GRAY STUFF THAT I WAS TALKING ABOUT.
- 15 Q OKAY. SO THAT'S WHAT YOU TOLD THEM THAT THEY MADE
- 16 YOU EAT, CORRECT?
- 17 **A** YES.
- 18 Q ALL RIGHT. NOW -- UM -- LET'S TALK ABOUT THE --
- 19 UH -- BUCKETS WITH THE SEATS ON THEM. UM -- THOSE BUCKETS,

- 2 IT WASN'T AN ACCIDENT, YOU DID THAT ON PURPOSE, CORRECT?
- 3 A YES, WHEN I GOT MAD.
- 4 O WHEN YOU GOT MAD THAT'S WHAT YOU WOULD DO?
- 5 A BUT LIKE WHEN THEY SET THE TIMER THEY'D SAY YOU HAD
- 6 TO WAIT, BECAUSE WE JUST WENT TO THE BATHROOM AND WE'RE NOT
- 7 GOING UPSTAIRS.
- 8 OKAY, LET'S TALK ABOUT THAT TIMER REAL QUICK.
- 9 WHEN YOU WERE HOMESCHOOLED YOU WERE PUT ON A TIMER
- 10 WHEN YOU COULD GO TO THE BATHROOM, CORRECT?
- 11 **A** YES.
- 12 Q AND YOU WERE GIVEN A BATHROOM BREAK EVERY HOUR WHEN
- 13 YOU WERE HOMESCHOOLED, CORRECT?
- 14 **A** YES.
- 15 Q AND THEY WOULD ENCOURAGE YOU TO GO TO THE BATHROOM
- 16 DURING THAT BATHROOM BREAK, CORRECT?
- 17 **A** YES.
- 18 Q AND YOU WOULD REFUSE TO GO TO THE BATHROOM DURING
- 19 THE BATHROOM BREAK, RIGHT?
- 20 **A** YES.
- 21 Q BUT YOU WOULD THEN PEE OR POOP ON YOURSELF DURING
- 22 THE NON-BREAK TIMES, CORRECT?
- 23 **A** YES.
- 24 Q SO YOU WERE DOING THIS IN A WAY TO PROTEST OR BE MAD
- 25 ABOUT THE FACT THAT YOU COULD ONLY GO AT CERTAIN TIMES?

- 1 A YEAH, BECAUSE IT SET -- IT WASN'T LIKE MISS JANET
- 2 WOULD SET LIKE HOW MANY HOURS SHE WANTED TO -- FOR THE
- 3 BATHROOM BREAK.
- 4 Q SO SHE WOULD SET THE TIMER FOR AN HOUR?
- 5 A YEAH -- NO.
- 6 Q YOU'D GO FOR AN HOUR?
- 7 **A** OH.
- 8 THE COURT: HOLD ON. WOULD SHE SET IT FOR AN HOUR?
- 9 THE WITNESS: WELL, I THINK SHE TOLD ME THAT SHE SET IT
- 10 FOR AN HOUR, BUT LIKE SHE'D DECIDE HOW MANY HOURS SHE WANTED
- 11 TO SET THE TIMER FOR.

- 23 WENT TO THE BATHROOM, AND WE SAY SOMETHING AFTER THAT, AND
- 24 MISS JANET CAME DOWNSTAIRS SHE'D BE LIKE, WELL, A -- I JUST

- 11 O OKAY. AND IF SOMEONE ELSE HAD TO GO TO THE BATHROOM
- 12 AND DID NOT SAY SOMETHING, AND THEN WHEN MISS JANET CAME BACK
- 13 DOWN FROM TAKING THE FIRST PERSON TO THE BATHROOM, THAT'S WHEN
- 14 SHE WOULD GET UPSET IF YOU THEN SAID, OH, I HAVE TO GO TO THE
- 15 BATHROOM?
- 16 **A** YES.
- 17 O BECAUSE SHE INSTRUCTED YOU THAT IF YOU HAVE TO GO TO
- 18 THE BATHROOM YOU NEED TO SAY SOMETHING WHEN YOU HAVE TO GO TO
- 19 THE BATHROOM, RIGHT?
- 20 **A** YES.
- 21 Q AND NOT TO WAIT UNTIL EVERYONE'S GONE TO THE
- 22 BATHROOM BEFORE YOU CAN TO GO?
- 23 **A** YES.
- 24 Q OKAY. AND THE BUCKETS CAME OUT WHEN YOU GOT -- WHEN
- 25 YOU KEPT ON PURPOSELY PEEING OR POOPING YOUR PANTS?

- 1 A YES.
- 2 OKAY. AND -- UM -- BUT WHEN YOU SAT ON THE BUCKETS
- 3 YOU ACTUALLY HAD YOUR CLOTHES ON WHEN YOU SAT ON THE BUCKET,
- 4 CORRECT?
- 5 A WE HAD A SHIRT ON, BUT WE -- LIKE MISS JANET WOULD
- 6 JUST SAY, IF SHE WANTED TO GIVE US -- LIKE WANTED TO GIVE
- 7 US -- TO WEAR CLOTHES. BUT LIKE SOMETIMES WE WOULDN'T, WE'D
- 8 JUST HAVE OUR UNDERWEAR ON, ON THE BUCKETS.
- 9 **Q** OKAY.
- 10 A SHE DECIDES, NOT US.
- 11 O WHEN YOU HAD THE BUCKET YOU WERE SITTING NEXT TO
- 12 AVA?
- 13 A YES, AVA WAS IN THE MIDDLE, ANASTASIA WAS ON THE
- 14 OTHER SIDE OF AVA, AND I WAS ON THE OTHER SIDE OF THAT.
- 15 Q OKAY. AND ANASTASIA ACTUALLY WASN'T ON A BUCKET,
- 16 SHE WAS ON A -- A --
- 17 **A** YEAH.
- 18 Q -- TRAINING POTTY, RIGHT?
- 19 **A** YEAH.
- 20 Q OKAY. SO ANASTASIA WAS SITTING ON A TRAINING POTTY,
- 21 YOU WERE SITTING ON THIS HOMEMADE BUCKET, ALONG WITH AVA
- 22 SITTING ON HER OWN HOMEMADE BUCKET?
- 23 **A** YES.
- 24 Q AND -- UM -- EVERY TIME THAT YOU HAD TO SIT ON A
- 25 BUCKET AVA WAS NEXT TO YOU SITTING ON THAT BUCKET?

- 1 A YES.
- O OKAY. NOW, IF AVA TESTIFIED EARLIER THAT WHEN SHE
- 3 HAD TO SIT ON THE BUCKET SHE WAS WEARING ALL HER CLOTHES --
- 4 MS. BLUTH: OBJECTION, JUDGE, THAT MISSTATES --
- 5 MR. MANN: -- WOULD THAT BE A CORRECT --
- 6 THE COURT: HOLD ON.
- 7 MR. MANN: -- OR INCORRECT STATEMENT?
- 8 MS. BLUTH: OBJECTION, YOUR HONOR, THAT MISSTATE'S AVA'S
- 9 TESTIMONY. SHE STATED THAT SHE --
- 10 MR. MANN: THAT'S --
- 11 MS. BLUTH: -- THINGS ON.

- 1 MR. MANN: WELL, BECAUSE I'M ASKING WHETHER SHE BELIEVES

- 3 MS. BLUTH: OH, SO NOW SHE'S GONNA' BE A WITNESS IN

- 16 CORRECT OR INCORRECT STATEMENT?
- 17 THE COURT: IF SHE TESTIFIED TO THAT?
- 18 MR. MANN: IF SHE TESTIFIED TO THAT.
- 19 THE COURT: OKAY. I'M GOING TO OVERRULE IT, THAT EXACT
- 20 QUESTION.
- 21 MR. MANN: SURE.
- 22 **Q** AMAYA, ARE YOU READY?
- 23 **A** YES.
- 24 Q OKAY. IF AVA TESTIFIED THAT WHEN SHE SAT ON THE
- 25 BUCKET SHE WAS FULLY CLOTHED, WOULD THAT BE A CORRECT OR

- 1 INCORRECT STATEMENT?
- A MISS JANET DECIDED WHETHER SHE WANTED TO GIVE US

- 7 O LET -- LET ME JUST -- I ASKED YOU, WOULD THAT BE A
- 8 CORRECT OR INCORRECT STATEMENT?
- 9 A THAT'S INCORRECT, BECAUSE MISS JANET DECIDES IF SHE
- 10 WANTED TO --
- 11 **Q** OKAY.
- 12 A -- US TO WEAR CLOTHES.
- 13 **Q** THANK YOU.
- 14 NOW -- NOW, YOU GETTING IN TROUBLE, WE HAD TALKED
- 15 ABOUT THAT YOU WOULD GET A LOT OF DEMERITS OR POINTS AGAINST
- 16 YOU AT THE SOLANDERS HOUSE, CORRECT?
- 17 **A** YES.
- 18 Q OKAY. NOW, YOU CONTINUED TO GET IN TROUBLE EVEN AT
- 19 THE GIRLS HOME IN FLORIDA, CORRECT?
- 20 A YES, I'D GET DEMERITS.
- 21 Q YOU WOULD GET DEMERITS THERE AS WELL?
- 22 **A** YES.
- 23 **Q** OKAY.
- 24 A BUT THEY DIDN'T SPANK US AT ALL.
- 25 **Q** OKAY. DO YOU MIND TAKING YOUR HAND DOWN, BECAUSE

- 1 I'M JUST HAVING A HARD TIME HEARING YOU.
- 2 AND SO YOU WOULD GET IN TROUBLE, AND THERE WAS EVEN
- 3 A POINT WHERE YOU GOT IN TROUBLE SO MUCH YOU ENDED UP MISSING
- 4 YOUR BIRTHDAY, CORRECT?
- 5 **A** NO.
- 6 MS. BLUTH: JUDGE, OBJECTION AS TO RELEVANCE.
- 7 THE WITNESS: I HADN'T HAD --
- 8 THE COURT: HOLD ON ONE SECOND.
- 9 MS. BLUTH: SORRY. I DIDN'T EXPLAIN THE RULES OF --
- 10 OBJECTION RULES.
- 11 MY OBJECTION IS AS TO RELEVANCE, AS WELL AS BEYOND THE
- 12 SCOPE OF DIRECT EXAMINATION.
- 13 **THE COURT:** MR. MANN?
- 14 MR. MANN: YOUR HONOR, I'LL REPHRASE THE QUESTION.
- 15 Q SO WHEN YOU MOVED TO FLORIDA YOU CONTINUED TO GET IN
- 16 TROUBLE, IT WASN'T AS IF YOU STOPPED GETTING IN TROUBLE?
- 17 A YEAH, BECAUSE WE'RE NOT ALL PERFECT.
- 18 O OKAY. ALL RIGHT.
- 19 AND YOU GREW A VERY CLOSE RELATIONSHIP WITH THE
- 20 BLANKENSHIPS?
- 21 **A** YES.
- 22 Q OKAY. AND YOU TALKED TO THEM ABOUT YOUR HOME?
- 23 **A** YES.
- 24 Q AND THE SITUATION AT HOME?
- 25 **A** YES.

- 1 Q AND HOW FRUSTRATED YOU WERE?
- 2 A YES.
- 3 Q HOW YOU DIDN'T WANT TO BE ADOPTED BY THE SOLANDERS?
- 4 A YES.
- 5 Q HOW YOU NEEDED TO FIND A WAY OUT FROM LIVING AT THE
- 6 SOLANDERS' HOUSE?
- 7 A YES.
- 8 Q AND THEY HELPED YOU FIND THAT WAY OUT?
- 9 A YES.
- 10 Q THEY HELPED YOU TELL THIS STORY, CORRECT?
- 11 **A** YES.
- 12 Q AND YOU AND YOUR SISTERS TALKED ABOUT TELLING THIS
- 13 STORY, CORRECT?
- 14 **A** YES.
- 15 **Q** WHEN YOU WERE IN FLORIDA?
- 16 A BECAUSE WE -- WE WERE -- THEY -- WE WERE IN SCHOOL
- 17 ONE DAY, AND I WAS TALKING TO ONE OF THE STAFF ABOUT IT, AND
- 18 SHE SAID, OKAY, WE'RE GONNA' TALK TO THE -- TO BROTHER
- 19 BLANKENSHIP. SO WE HAD TOLD -- WE TOOK TURNS, WE WENT IN HIS
- 20 OFFICE EACH BY OURSELVES, SO WE TOLD HIM EACH -- HIM OUR --
- 21 OUR OWN STORY.
- 22 O OKAY. AND THEN YOU ENDED UP TALKING TO BROTHER
- 23 BLANKENSHIP, ALL THREE OF YOU TOGETHER AFTER THAT, CORRECT?
- 24 **A** YES.
- 25 Q AND AT THAT POINT YOU WAITED, RIGHT?

- 1 A YES.
- 2 Q YOU WAITED FOR SOMETIME UNTIL THIS PERSON, I THINK
- 3 YOU SAID MISS JACKIE?
- 4 A YES.
- 5 Q CAME AND ASKED YOU QUESTIONS ABOUT THE SOLANDERS'
- 6 HOUSE?
- 7 **A** YES.
- 8 Q AND THAT'S WHEN YOU WERE ABLE TO TELL THESE STORIES,
- 9 CORRECT?
- 10 **A** YES.
- 11 O NOW -- UM -- YOU WERE -- UM -- SENT TO MONTEVISTA
- 12 PSYCHIATRIC HOSPITAL WHILE YOU WERE AT THE SOLANDERS' HOUSE,
- 13 CORRECT?
- 14 **A** YES.
- 15 MS. BLUTH: OBJECTION, BEYOND THE SCOPE OF DIRECT
- 16 EXAMINATION.
- 17 MR. MANN: YOUR HONOR, IT GOES DIRECTLY TO HER ABILITY TO
- 18 RECALL AND RELATE EVENTS. GOES TO HER ABILITY TO -- UM -- THE
- 19 REASONING AS TO WHY SHE WAS AT MONTEVISTA -- UM -- PURPOSELY--
- 20 **THE COURT:** IF SHE KNOWS. I'M GOING TO OVERRULE IT.
- 21 MR. MANN: OKAY.
- 22 Q DO YOU KNOW WHY YOU WERE SENT TO MONTEVISTA?
- 23 **A** YES, BECAUSE I WAS ACTING UP.
- 24 Q HOW WERE YOU ACTING UP?
- 25 A I GOT MAD, LIKE I THROW TANTRUMS --

- 1 **Q** OKAY.
- 2 -- FOR A VERY GOOD REASON.
- 3 Q YOU WERE ALSO LYING?
- 4 A YES.
- 5 Q OKAY. AND SO WHEN YOU WERE AT MONTEVISTA THEY
- 6 WORKED ON ANGER ISSUES WITH YOU?
- 7 **A** YES.
- 8 Q AND YOUR LYING ISSUES?
- 9 A YES.
- 10 Q OKAY. UM -- AND WHILE YOU WERE AT MONTEVISTA
- 11 HOSPITAL YOU TOLD A LIE ABOUT A FIVE YEAR OLD BOY TRYING TO
- 12 KILL YOU?
- 13 A YES, BECAUSE THAT'S WHAT HE ACTUALLY TOLD ME.
- 14 **O** OKAY.
- 15 A BECAUSE I DIDN'T HELP HIM DO SOMETHING WITH THIS
- 16 BOWLING PIN, BECAUSE IT WAS RIPPED, BECAUSE IT WAS NOT -- IT
- 17 WAS PLASTIC.
- 18 Q OKAY.
- 19 A SO HE SAID HELP ME, AND HE THREATENED ME TO KILL ME,
- 20 AND I DON'T -- I JUST CAN'T STAND CERTAIN PEOPLE.
- 21 Q OKAY. AND THERE WAS ALSO A TIME THAT YOU PLAYED A
- 22 JOKE ON MR. SOLANDER, CORRECT? MR. DWIGHT?
- 23 A I DON'T KNOW WHAT YOU'RE TALKING ABOUT AT ALL.
- 24 Q OKAY. WHERE YOU FAKED TO HAVE A SEIZURE?
- 25 A YES. WHY? BECAUSE I DIDN'T WANT TO LIVE IN THE

- 1 HOUSE, BECAUSE THE WAY THEY WERE TREATING MY SISTERS AND ME.
- 2 Q OKAY.
- 3 A I HAVE EVERY RIGHT TO TELL WHAT THEY DID TO ME. AND
- 4 I DON'T CARE IF DANIELLE DOESN'T LIKE ME, OR IF SHE LAUGHS AT
- 5 ME BECAUSE I'M UP HERE CRYING, BECAUSE AT LEAST I WAS -- I HAD
- 6 SOMEONE -- TO HAVE SOMEONE THAT CARES ABOUT ME.
- 7 MR. RUE: YOUR HONOR, FOR THE RECORD THERE'S BEEN NO
- 8 LAUGHTER.
- 9 MS. BLUTH: ACTUALLY I'VE SEEN IT PERSONALLY.
- 10 MR. RUE: NO. NO, YOUR HONOR.
- 11 THE WITNESS: YES, I SAW IT WITH MY OWN EYES, I'M NOT
- 12 BLIND AT ALL, OKAY?
- 13 THE COURT: HOLD ON, AMAYA.
- MR. MANN: YOUR HONOR, WHY DON'T WE TAKE A BREAK.
- 15 THE COURT: YEAH, LET'S TAKE A BREAK.
- 16 WE CAN MAKE A RECORD IN A MINUTE.
- 17 MS. BLUTH: IS JAVS ON, JUDGE?
- 18 THE COURT: WELL, IT JUST GOT TURNED ON ABOUT FOUR
- 19 MINUTES AGO, BECAUSE NOBODY ASKED US TO DO IT, AND WE'RE NOT A
- 20 GATEKEEPER OF EVERYTHING SO --
- 21 MS. BLUTH: I KNOW, I WAS JUST ASKING.
- 22 THE COURT: YEAH, SO I'M JUST TELLING YOU IT JUST GOT
- 23 TURNED ON ABOUT FOUR MINUTES AGO.
- MS. BLUTH: OKAY.
- 25 **THE COURT:** WHEN I REMEMBERED.

- 1 UM -- OKAY. YOU TAKE BREAK. MISS LISA IS GOING TO TAKE
- 2 YOU, OKAY? WE'RE ALL GOING TO TAKE A BREAK.
- 3 AND I ALSO NEED TO TALK ABOUT TIMING. BEFORE THE LAWYERS
- 4 TAKE A BREAK, CAN WE JUST COME UP HERE AND TALK ABOUT TIMING?
- 5 I GOT TO COURTROOM SHARE AND STUFF LIKE THAT.
- 6 (WHEREUPON COUNSEL APPROACHED THE BENCH.)
- 7 THE COURT: AND THEN WHILE -- UM -- MAYA'S OUT OF THE
- 8 COURTROOM, I THINK EVERYBODY WAS TRYING TO MAKE A RECORD, I'D
- 9 JUST RATHER HER NOT BE IN HERE BECAUSE SHE CHIMED IN.
- 10 SO, MR. RUE?
- 11 MR. RUE: WELL, JUDGE, THERE WAS NO LAUGHING, THERE WAS
- 12 NO -- THERE WAS NO LAUGHING, WHATSOEVER, BY THIS TABLE, BY MY
- 13 CLIENT OR ANYONE ELSE.
- 14 **THE COURT:** MISS BLUTH?
- 15 MS. BLUTH: I MEAN I DID SEE DURING -- I -- I THINK
- 16 LAUGHING IS A STRONGER TERM. DURING MY QUESTIONING MULTIPLE
- 17 TIMES I HAVE SEEN DANIELLE SMILE AND SMIRK AND, YOU KNOW, MAKE
- 18 LITTLE NOISES. I DON'T THINK SHE'S FULL OUT LAUGHING, BUT I
- 19 HAVE SEEN HER ROLL HER EYES AND SMILE AND SMIRK MULTIPLE
- 20 TIMES.
- 21 THE COURT: OKAY. AND FOR THE RECORD, I HAVE NOT NOTICED
- 22 ANY OF IT. ALL I'VE NOTICED IS MR. SOLANDER SPEAKING WITH
- 23 MR. MUELLER AND WRITING NOTES, WHICH HE IS MOST LIKELY -- I
- 24 MEAN ABSOLUTELY ENTITLED TO DO.
- 25 ALTHOUGH I HAVEN'T BEEN LOOKING AT THE DEFENDANTS, I'VE

- 1 BEEN WATCHING THE WITNESS, SO --
- 2 MR. MANN: YOUR HONOR --
- 3 THE COURT: -- AND I DIDN'T SEE ANYTHING, SO.
- 4 MR. MANN: -- MR. MUELLER IS NOT HERE RIGHT NOW.
- 5 **THE COURT:** OH, OKAY.
- 6 (WHEREUPON MR. MUELLER ENTERED THE COURTROOM.)
- 7 THE COURT: THEY WERE JUST MAKING A RECORD OF THE --
- 8 MS. BLUTH: LAUGHING.
- 9 THE COURT: -- COMMENTS --
- 10 MR. MUELLER: OKAY.
- 11 THE COURT: -- ABOUT THE LAUGHING AND THE SMIRKING. I
- 12 SAID ALL I HAVE SEEN IN -- PERTAINING TO ANY OF DEFENDANTS, IS
- 13 THAT MR. SOLANDER'S BEEN QUIETLY SPEAKING WITH YOU, WHICH HE
- 14 HAS AN ABSOLUTE RIGHT TO DO. I HAVEN'T NOTICED ANY ACTIVITY
- 15 ON BEHALF OF MRS. SOLANDER OR MRS. HINTON, BUT, AGAIN, I
- 16 HAVEN'T BEEN -- I'VE BEEN NOTICING OBVIOUSLY ANYTHING THAT
- 17 MR. DWIGHT DOES BECAUSE I'M LOOKING AT THE WITNESS, BUT I'M
- 18 NOT LOOKING THIS WAY TOWARDS THE DEFENDANTS, SO -- I MEAN IT
- 19 IS WHAT IT IS. YOU GUYS CAN MAKE A RECORD ALL YOU WANT.
- 20 WE DON'T HAVE A -- AND BY THE WAY, JAVS IS NOW GOING, BUT
- 21 I MEAN TO THE EXTENT THERE IS SILENT -- ANYTHING SILENT GOING
- 22 ON, JAVS ISN'T GOING TO PICK IT UP ANYWAY.
- 23 MS. BLUTH: RIGHT.
- 24 THE COURT: BECAUSE JAVS ONLY PICKS UP AUDIBLE SOUNDS,
- 25 AND THAT'S IF IT'S ENOUGH TO CATCH THE MICROPHONE.

- 1 SO AS I EXPLAINED TO THE LAWYERS, WE'LL GO UNTIL ABOUT
- 2 12:15, THEN WE'RE GOING TO TAKE A BREAK TILL 1 O'CLOCK, AND WE
- 3 WILL BE RESUMING NEXT DOOR IN J.C. 11, IN THIS COURTROOM RIGHT
- 4 NEXT DOOR IN 7B, AFTER EVERYBODY GETS LUNCH.
- 5 MS. BLUTH: OKAY.
- 6 THE COURT: OKAY. YOU CAN CALL HER BACK IN.
- 7 (WHEREUPON THE WITNESS ENTERED THE COURTROOM.)
- 8 THE COURT: OKAY. MISS MAYA, YOU REALIZE YOU'RE STILL
- 9 SWEARING TO TELL THE TRUTH, RIGHT? YOU REALIZE THAT --
- 10 THE WITNESS: YEAH.
- 11 THE COURT: -- JUST BECAUSE WE TOOK A BREAK?
- 12 **THE WITNESS:** YES.
- 13 THE COURT: OKAY. ALL RIGHT.
- MR. MANN IS GOING TO KEEP ON ASKING QUESTIONS, AND THEN
- 15 WE'RE GOING TO TAKE A LUNCH BREAK IN ABOUT 25 MINUTES.
- 16 BY MR. MANN:
- 17 O MAYA, WE WERE TALKING ABOUT HOW YOU FAKED A SEIZURE
- 18 AND MADE MR. DWIGHT CALL 9-1-1 AND TAKE YOU TO THE HOSPITAL;
- 19 DO YOU REMEMBER THAT?
- 20 **A** YEAH. I DIDN'T GO TO THE HOSPITAL.
- 21 **Q** OKAY. BUT YOU WENT IN AN AMBULANCE?
- 22 **A** NO.
- 23 **Q** CALLED 9-1-1?
- A I DON'T KNOW. I FAKED IT, BUT I DIDN'T GO TO THE
- 25 HOSPITAL.

- 1 Q HOW DID YOU FAKE IT?
- 2 A BECAUSE I DIDN'T WANT TO BE IN THE HOME.
- 3 Q OKAY. AND ABOUT WHEN WAS THIS?
- A LAST YEAR. NO, 2012 SOME -- I CAN'T REMEMBER.
- 5 O OKAY. AND DO YOU REMEMBER IF IT WAS WARM OR COLD
- 6 OUTSIDE?
- 7 A I CAN'T REMEMBER.
- 8 Q YOU CAN'T REMEMBER?
- 9 A NO, IT WAS YEARS AGO.
- 10 O OKAY. AND -- UM -- YOU PURPOSELY MADE THIS FAKE
- 11 SEIZURE SO YOU COULD GET OUT OF THE HOME?
- 12 **A** YES.
- 13 Q AND YOU WERE GOING TO LEAVE YOUR SISTERS IN THE HOME
- 14 WHEN YOU WERE HAVING A SEIZURE?
- 15 **A** NO, I WAS GONNA' BRING MY SISTERS WITH ME, BECAUSE I
- 16 WASN'T GONNA' LET THESE PEOPLE DO THAT TO MY SISTERS.
- 17 Q OKAY. AND SO WHEN YOU WERE FAKING THIS SEIZURE, HOW
- 18 WERE YOU GOING TO BRING YOUR SISTERS WITH YOU?
- 19 A I WAS GONNA' CALL THE POLICE AND MAKE SURE THAT
- 20 THESE PEOPLE SUFFER WHAT -- FOR WHAT THEY DID, BECAUSE I DON'T
- 21 WANT THEM TO DO TO OTHER PEOPLE.
- 22 **Q** OKAY.
- 23 A I CAN'T EVEN GO BACK TO MARVELOUS GRACE BECAUSE OF
- 24 THEM. AND I HAD A RELATIONSHIP WITH ALL OF THOSE PEOPLE IN
- 25 THAT HOME.

- 1 Q OKAY. MARVELOUS GRACE THAT WAS THE SCHOOL IN
- 2 FLORIDA?
- 3 A YES.
- 4 Q OKAY. AND WHO SENT YOU TO MARVELOUS GRACE IN THE
- 5 FIRST PLACE?
- 6 A THE SOLANDERS.
- 7 Q OKAY. SO THEY WERE THE ONES THAT PUT YOU TO THAT
- 8 PLACE THAT YOU THOUGHT WAS REALLY GREAT?
- 9 A YES.
- 10 O OKAY. AND -- UM -- YOU'RE SAYING NOW THAT THEY ARE
- 11 THE ONES THAT ARE KEEPING YOU FROM GOING BACK TO MARVELOUS
- 12 GRACE?
- 13 A YEAH, I CAN'T GO BACK.
- 14 Q BECAUSE --
- 15 A BECAUSE IF I WAS STILL THERE THEY WOULD HAVE BEEN
- 16 ABLE TO TAKE ME BACK AND START DOING THE SAME THING. I'M NOT
- 17 STUPID AT ALL. I DESERVE TO BE IN THAT HOME.
- 18 **Q** WHAT HOME?
- 19 A MARVELOUS GRACE, BECAUSE THEY ACTUALLY CHANGED MY
- 20 LIFE.
- 21 **Q** OKAY.
- 22 A I DON'T LIKE -- THE PERSON I WAS BEFORE I WENT THERE
- 23 I'M NOT THAT PERSON ANYMORE. I LOVE MY ENEMY, I LOVE MISS
- 24 JANET AND I LOVE DANIELLE AND LOVE MR. DWIGHT, I LOVE ALL OF
- 25 THEM. I CAN'T TELL THEM, I CAN'T EVEN TALK TO THEM, THOUGH.

- 1 Q OKAY.
- 2 A AND I DON'T -- I DON'T LIKE TO SEE MISS JANET OR ANY
- 3 OF THEM TO BE IN JAIL BECAUSE IT KIND OF HURTS.
- 4 O WHY DOES IT HURT?
- 5 A WHY? BECAUSE I CAN'T TALK TO THEM, I CAN'T TELL
- 6 THEM I LOVE THEM. I CAN'T ACTUALLY HUG THE PEOPLE THAT I --
- 7 THAT I ONCE DIDN'T LOVE, BUT ACTUALLY NOW I DO, BECAUSE I
- 8 REALIZE THEY ACTUALLY TRIED TO HELP ME WHEN I WAS IN FOSTER
- 9 HOME WITH THEM. MISS JANET MADE ME CRY BECAUSE SHE KNOWS THAT
- 10 EVERYTHING THAT SHE'S DONE TO ME, THAT I DON'T HATE HER. I
- 11 ACTUALLY LOVE MY ENEMY.

- 25 A AND GOD IS GONNA' BLESS HER FOR WHAT SHE DID. SHE'S

- 1 GONNA' -- THERE'S PEOPLE IN THIS WORLD THAT DID BAD THINGS AND
- 2 GOOD THINGS, BUT THEY ARE GOING TO BE BLESSED LATER ON IN
- 3 LIFE, BECAUSE GOD IS GONNA' COME BACK. HE'S GONNA' COME BACK
- 4 AND TAKE ALL THE SAVED PEOPLE UP TO HEAVEN. EVEN IF YOU'RE IN

- 15 **Q** OKAY. THANK YOU.
- 16 UM -- WHEN YOU MOVED INTO THE SOLANDERS' HOUSE AS A
- 17 FOSTER CHILD, YOU WERE UPSET, CORRECT?
- 18 **A** YES.
- 19 Q YOU DIDN'T WANT TO BE THERE?
- 20 **A** YES.
- 21 Q AND YOUR FRUSTRATION GREW, AND YOU WERE UPSET EVEN
- 22 MORE WHEN THEY ADOPTED YOU.
- 23 **A** YES.
- 24 Q AND YOU COULDN'T FIGURE OUT HOW TO DEAL WITH THAT
- 25 ANGER AND FRUSTRATION AT THAT TIME, CORRECT?

- 1 A YES.
- 2 Q AND THAT'S WHY YOU WERE ACTING OUT?
- 3 A YES.
- 4 Q THAT'S WHY YOU WERE GOING TO THE BATHROOM ON
- 5 YOURSELF?
- 6 A YES.
- 8 SOLANDERS, BUT BEING THERE?
- 9 **A** YES.
- 10 Q AND THEY WERE TRYING TO HELP YOU BREAK THAT BEHAVIOR
- 11 CYCLE?
- 12 **A** YES, BECAUSE I WANTED TO BE WITH MY FAMILY, MY REAL
- 13 FAMILY, BUT I --
- 14 Q YOU WANTED TO BE WITH YOUR BIOLOGICAL PARENTS?
- 15 **A** YES. BUT I ALSO KNEW THAT, ALSO TO MYSELF, IT WAS
- 16 GOING TO BE OKAY, THEY'RE GOING TO TAKE CARE OF ME.
- 17 **Q** BUT IT REALLY MADE YOU UPSET --
- 18 **A** YES.
- 19 Q -- WHEN MISS JANET TOLD YOU TO CALL HER MOM, RIGHT?
- 20 A NO. I ACTUALLY WANTED TO CALL HER MOM, BECAUSE I
- 21 DIDN'T HAVE A MOM AT ALL. I HAVE A MOM OUT IN THE WORLD, AND
- 22 SHE'S ONE OF MY MOMS RIGHT NOW.
- 23 Q OKAY. BUT YOU WANTED TO BE BACK TO YOUR BIOLOGICAL
- 24 MOTHER?
- A NO. NOT AFTER WHAT SHE DID TO ME, DUMPING ME OUT ON

- 1 THE STREET WITH MY GRANDMA, SHE DOESN'T CARE ABOUT ME.
- 2 Q OKAY. BUT --
- 3 A SHE CARES ABOUT ME.
- 4 AND I KNOW THAT DANIELLE DOES NOT LIKE TO SEE HER
- 5 BIOLOGICAL MOM CRY, OR ANY OF HER OTHER KIDS, AND I DON'T
- 6 EITHER.
- 7 Q BUT AT THE TIME THAT YOU WERE ADOPTED YOU WERE
- 8 ANGRY?
- 9 A YES.
- 10 **Q** AND YOU TOOK THAT ANGER OUT ON MISS JANET?
- 11 **A** YES.
- 12 I ASKED GOD TO FORGIVE ME FOR ALL OF THAT. I
- 13 LITERALLY WRITE PRAYERS ON MY PAPER, LAY THEM OUTSIDE, AND
- 14 THEY'RE ALWAYS GONE IN THE MORNING BECAUSE MY PRAYERS ARE
- 15 ANSWERED.
- 16 Q ASKING FOR FORGIVENESS FOR WHAT --
- 17 **A** YES.
- 18 Q -- YOU DID TO MISS JANET?
- 19 A I ACTUALLY STILL DO THAT EVERY DAY. I WRITE THINGS
- 20 ON MY PAPERS AND I PUT THEM LIKE IN FRONT -- IN THE FRONT YARD
- 21 AND EVERYTHING, WHEN I CHECK OUTSIDE THEY'RE GONE, BECAUSE MY
- 22 PRAYERS HAVE BEEN ANSWERED.
- 23 AND I WROTE PRAYERS ON MY -- ON BALLOONS AND LET
- 24 THEM GO, SO I KNOW THAT GOD HE EXISTS AND HE DOES FORGIVE.
- 25 Q AND THIS FORGIVENESS THAT YOU WANT TO EXTEND TO

- 1 MISS JANET, THAT HAPPENED AFTER YOU CAME BACK FROM FLORIDA,
- 2 CORRECT?
- 3 A YES, I FORGAVE HER FOR ALL THE THINGS SHE DID TO ME,
- 4 AND I'M AC -- I'M ACTUALLY PRAYING FOR ALL OF THEM.
- 5 **Q** OKAY.
- A I PRAY EVERY NIGHT, I ASK GOD TO SAVE THEM, TO
- 7 CONVICT THEM, I WANT TO TELL THEM THAT YOU NEED TO CHANGE
- 8 BEFORE IT'S TOO LATE.
- 9 **Q** OKAY.
- 10 NOW, YOU HAD TESTIFIED REGARDING AVA AND HER BLACK
- 11 EYE, DO YOU REMEMBER THAT?
- 12 **A** YES.
- 13 O OKAY. UM -- CAN YOU DESCRIBE FOR ME WHERE AVA WAS
- 14 WHEN THIS OCCURRED?
- 15 A SHE WAS BY THE COUNTER WHEN MISS JANET DID IT TO
- 16 HER.
- 17 Q OKAY. WAS SHE SITTING OR STANDING?
- 18 A SHE -- SHE -- MISS JANET KICKED HER DOWN THE STAIRS,
- 19 AND SHE GRABBED HER HEAD AND SLAMMED IT ON THE DOOR, BUT
- 20 SHE -- WELL SHE WAS GONNA', SHE WAS STANDING, AND THEN SHE
- 21 TOLD HER TO SIT DOWN.
- 22 THE COURT: WHO -- SORRY MAYA. WHO'S SHE? ARE YOU
- 23 TALKING ABOUT MISS JANET WAS STANDING OR --
- 24 THE WITNESS: NO, AVA.
- 25 THE COURT: -- AVA? AVA, OKAY.

## 1 BY MR. MANN:

- 2 Q SO AVA WAS STANDING NEAR THE STAIRS, AND THAT'S WHEN
- 3 MISS JANET DID SOMETHING WITH THE DOOR?
- A NO, SHE TOLD THEM -- AVA HAD WENT ON THE BATHROOM IN
- 5 THE -- THE BUCKET, SO MISS JANET KICKED HER UP THE STAIRS,
- 6 BECAUSE SHE WAS REALLY UPSET. THEN SHE WENT -- SHE CAME BACK
- 7 DOWNSTAIRS AND KEPT DOING IT, AND THEN AVA WAS STANDING WHEN
- 8 HER -- WHEN SHE WAS DOING -- WHEN SHE WAS -- WHEN AVA WAS
- 9 STARTING TO GET THE BLACK EYE.
- 10 Q OKAY. AVA WAS STANDING WHERE?
- 11 A BY THE COUNTER IN THE KITCHEN.
- 12 O OKAY. AND YOU SAID WHEN AVA WAS STARTING TO GET THE
- 13 BLACK EYE. DID YOU ACTUALLY SEE HOW?
- 14 **A** YES.
- 15 Q WHAT DID YOU SEE?
- 16 A I WAS RIGHT NEXT TO HER.
- 17 Q WHAT DID YOU SEE?
- 18 A I SAW MISS JANET GRAB HER HEAD, KEPT -- KEEP
- 19 SLAMMING IT ON THE COUNTER. MY EYES WERE WATERING UP, I WAS
- 20 ABOUT TO START CRYING.
- 21 O OKAY. AND AVA WAS STANDING UP WHEN SHE -- WHEN MISS
- 22 JANET SUPPOSABLY PUT HER HEAD ON THE COUNTER, SLAMMED HER HEAD
- 23 ON THE COUNTER IS WHAT YOU SAID?
- 24 **A** YES.
- 25 Q OKAY. AND THIS WAS SHORTLY AFTER YOU SAID AVA HAD

- 1 AN ACCIDENT IN THE BUCKET?
- 2 **A** YES.
- 3 Q AND HAD GONE UPSTAIRS?
- 4 A YEAH. SHE AND MISS JANET --
- 5 Q AND THEN COME -- AND THEN COME BACK DOWNSTAIRS?
- 6 A YES.
- 7 Q OKAY. AND WHAT ROOM DID THIS OCCUR IN?
- 8 A THE INCIDENT WITH THE BATHROOM?
- 9 Q THE INCIDENT WITH THE COUNTER.
- 10 A IT WAS IN THE KITCHEN. THE COUNTER'S IN THE
- 11 KITCHEN.
- 12 Q OKAY. AND WHEN -- UH -- AVA HAD THE ACCIDENT, WHERE
- 13 WAS SHE?
- 14 A IT WAS IN THE KITCHEN, BECAUSE SHE WAS SITTING ON --
- 15 BY -- ON THE TOILET. NOT THE REGULAR TOILET, BUT THE BUCKET--
- 16 **Q** THE BUCKET?
- 17 A -- BY THE COUNTER.
- 18 Q OKAY. AND -- UM -- THE SHOWERS THAT YOU WERE ASKED
- 19 ABOUT, YOU SAID THAT THE SHOWERS WERE PUT ON BY MISS JANET?
- 20 **A** YES.
- 21 Q AND THEY WERE LUKEWARM SHOWERS OR COLD SHOWERS; IS
- 22 THAT RIGHT?
- 23 **A** YES.
- 24 **Q** OKAY.
- 25 A SHE DECIDED WHEN SHE -- WHAT TYPE OF SHOWER. LIKE

- 1 NOT TYPE, BUT LIKE IF -- WHAT -- WHAT TEMPERATURE SHE WANTED
- 2 TO THE WATER TO BE.
- 3 Q OKAY. AND SO IT WAS EITHER LUKEWARM OR COLD, AND
- 4 SOMETIMES COLD WITH AN ICE BUCKET, THAT IS WHAT YOU SAID?
- 5 A YES.
- 6 Q OKAY. UM -- WAS THAT THE ONLY WAY THE SHOWERS WERE?
- 7 A WELL, LIKE WHEN I HAD MY SEIZURE SHE GAVE ME A WARM
- 8 SHOWER. AND SHE DIDN'T FAVOR NEITHER ONE -- NONE OF US, SHE
- 9 TREATED US THE SAME WAY. SHE -- LIKE IF -- LET'S SAY AVA WAS
- 10 ONLY SO GOOD IN THE WEEK, AND MISS JANET SAW THAT, AND SHE
- 11 WANTED TO REWARD HER FOR THAT, THAT'S SOMETHING THAT
- 12 MISS JANET WOULD DO, SHE DID IT -- SHE DID THAT -- SHE DID ALL
- 13 OF THAT FOR US.
- 14 O SHE WOULD GIVE A WARM SHOWER?
- 15 A YES, SOMETIMES. BUT IF SHE MESSES UP, THEN SHE
- 16 LOSES HER PRIVILEGES, MISS JANET GETS UPSET.
- 17 Q OKAY. COURT'S INDULGENCE.
- 18 UM -- NOW THE SHOWERS, THEY WERE NEVER SO HOT THAT
- 19 YOU GOT BURNED, WAS IT?
- 20 A NO, NOT ME. SHE PUT OUT -- ON THE LUKEWARM SO IT
- 21 WAS FINE.
- 22 O AND YOU HAD SAID THAT SHE TREATED YOU GUYS ALL
- 23 EQUALLY?
- 24 **A** YES.
- 25 **Q** OKAY.

- 1 A IF SOMEONE PEED ON THEMSELVES AND NOT -- THAT PERSON
- 2 GOT SPANKED, AND ANOTHER ONE -- SOMEONE ELSE DID THAT, SHE'D
- 3 DO THE SAME THING, BECAUSE SHE DIDN'T FAVOR NONE OF US,
- 4 BECAUSE YOU CAN'T FAVOR SOMEONE WHEN THEY ACT UP.
- 5 Q NOW -- UM -- THE SOLANDERS -- UM -- TAUGHT YOU AND
- 6 YOUR SISTERS HOW TO RIDE BIKES, RIGHT?
- 7 **A** YES.
- 8 Q UM -- THAT YOU GUYS WERE OUT ON THE STREET?
- 9 A YES.
- 10 Q AND -- UH -- THEY HAD GIVEN YOU BIKES TO RIDE ON?
- 11 A YES. BUT I HAD GOT FRUSTRATED SO I JUST GAVE UP.
- 12 **Q** YOU GOT FRUSTRATED?
- 13 **A** YES.
- 14 Q BECAUSE YOU KEPT ON FALLING?
- 15 **A** YES.
- 16 Q AND -- UH -- WHEN YOU WOULD FALL SOMETIMES YOU WOULD
- 17 SCRAPE YOUR KNEES OR ARMS?
- 18 **A** YES.
- 19 Q OKAY. AND -- UM -- WHEN YOU WOULD SCRAPE YOUR KNEES
- 20 OR ARMS -- UH -- MISS JANET WOULD PUT A BAND-AID ON YOU?
- 21 **A** YES.
- 22 Q IS THAT A YES?
- 23 **A** YES.
- Q OKAY. AND SHE WOULD TAKE CARE OF YOUR INJURIES,
- 25 CORRECT?

- 1 A YES.
- 2 Q ALL RIGHT. UM -- AND EVEN THOUGH YOU GOT
- 3 FRUSTRATED, ANASTASIA AND AVA YOU SAW WOULD CONTINUALLY WORK
- 4 ON THEIR BIKING SKILLS, RIGHT?
- 5 A YES. AND THEY TOLD ME DON'T GIVE UP, 'CAUSE IF YOU
- 6 GIVE UP NOW YOU'LL NEVER BE ABLE TO DO IT.
- 7 **Q** OKAY.
- 8 A BUT I WAS ALWAYS TOLD THAT. BUT NOW THAT I SEE WHAT
- 9 THEY TOLD ME, I REALIZE THAT, WHEN I SAY I GAVE UP, I CAN'T --
- 10 I CAN'T EVEN DO IT. THEY -- MISS DEBBIE HAS A BIKE AND I
- 11 CAN'T EVEN RIDE THE BIKE, BECAUSE I GAVE UP ON MYSELF.
- 12 Q BUT YOU ALSO SAW YOUR SISTERS AND YOU WOULD SEE YOUR
- 13 SISTERS FALL?
- 14 A YES. BUT THEY NEVER GAVE UP LIKE I DID, AND I'M
- 15 GLAD IT DIDN'T HAPPEN TO THEM.
- 16 Q OKAY. NOW, THE -- UM -- SLEEPING, YOU HAD PAJAMAS
- 17 TO WEAR, CORRECT?
- 18 **A** YES.
- 19 Q OKAY. AND YOU WERE INSTRUCTED THAT AFTER EACH --
- 20 AFTER SLEEPING EACH NIGHT YOU WERE TOLD TO FOLD UP YOUR
- 21 PAJAMAS AND PUT THEM ON THE TABLE IN THE LOFT, CORRECT?
- 22 **A** YES.
- 23 Q UM -- AND SO EVERY SATURDAY YOUR PAJAMAS WERE
- 24 WASHED?
- 25 **A** YES.

- 1 O AND THOSE WERE THE PAJAMAS THAT YOU WOULD WEAR EVERY
- 2 DAY OF THE WEEK?
- 3 A YES.
- 4 O OKAY. AND SO THERE RARELY, IF EVER, WAS A TIME THAT
- 5 YOU WERE TOLD NOT TO WEAR YOUR PAJAMAS, CORRECT?
- 6 A WHEN WE -- LIKE IF I HAD -- IF I PEED ON MYSELF,
- 7 WHICH I DID, BECAUSE I WAS MAD, MISS JANET WOULD FIND OUT
- 8 BECAUSE OUR PAJAMAS WOULD BE WET, AND SHE'D WASHED THEM. BUT
- 9 SHE'D BE UPSET, TOO, SO SHE WASN'T GOING TO KEEP WASTING HER
- 10 TIME, KEEP WASHING OUR CLOTHES WHEN WE SHOULD BE WASHING THEM,
- 11 BECAUSE SHE DOESN'T HAVE TO WASH OUR DIRTY CLOTHES, WE SHOULD,
- 12 BECAUSE THEY'RE NOT HER CLOTHES. SO SHE'D SAY, "IF YOU KEEP
- 13 PEEING ON YOURSELF YOU'RE NOT GOING TO WEAR YOUR PAJAMAS,
- 14 BECAUSE I'M NOT GOING TO WASH YOUR CLOTHES THAT ARE NASTY AND
- 15 FILTHY, BECAUSE I SHOULDN'T HAVE TO WASH YOUR CLOTHES."
- 16 Q AND SO WHEN YOU WERE TOLD TO WEAR YOUR UNDERWEAR
- 17 INSTEAD OF YOUR PAJAMAS, THAT WAS ON THE NIGHTS THAT YOU DID
- 18 PEE YOURSELF --
- 19 **A** YES.
- 20 O -- AND YOU WERE TOLD TO TAKE IT OFF AND WEAR YOUR
- 21 UNDERWEAR BECAUSE THERE WEREN'T ANY OTHER PAJAMAS TO WEAR?
- 22 **A** YES.
- 23 Q OKAY. AND -- UM -- THE FANS THAT WERE, YOU SAID,
- 24 DIRECTED UPON YOU GUYS, THAT WAS BECAUSE IT WAS HOT OUT,
- 25 CORRECT?

- 1 A YES.
- 2 Q AND IT WAS TO COOL YOU GUYS OFF?
- 3 A YES.
- 4 Q RIGHT?
- 5 A WELL, LIKE IF WE PEED ON OURSELF SHE WANTED US --
- 6 SHE DIDN'T WANT -- MISS JANET DIDN'T WANT US TO BE SOAKED IN
- 7 OUR UNDERWEAR, SO SHE PUT THE FAN ON US TO DRY. LIKE IF --
- 8 LIKE WHEN I DO MY HOMEWORK, WHEN I WAS WITH THEM, I'D FALL
- 9 ASLEEP, SO SHE'D PUT THE FAN ON FOR ME TO KEEP ME AWAKE SO I
- 10 CAN GET IT DONE.
- 11 Q OKAY. BECAUSE IT WOULD BE HOT?
- 12 **A** NO --
- 13 MS. BLUTH: OBJECTION.
- 14 THE WITNESS: -- SO I CAN SAY AWAKE.
- 15 THE COURT: HOLD ON.
- 16 MS. BLUTH: I WAS GOING TO SAY IT MISSTATES HER
- 17 TESTIMONY, BUT SHE CORRECTED IT.
- 18 BY MR. MANN:
- 19 Q AND -- UM -- THE FANS -- UM -- THERE WAS JUST ONE
- 20 BIG FAN THAT AIRED THE ROOM, CORRECT?
- 21 A THERE WAS ...
- 22 O IN -- IN YOUR LOFT?
- 23 A THERE WAS FOUR -- THERE'S -- THERE WAS ONE BIG FAN,
- 24 THE BIGGEST FAN, BUT THERE WAS ALSO OTHER FANS, TOO.
- 25 Q BUT THAT WAS -- THOSE FANS WERE USED WHETHER YOU

- 1 WERE WEARING PAJAMAS OR UNDERWEAR -- UH -- WHETHER YOU HAD
- 2 PEED YOURSELF OR NOT, TO COOL YOU GUYS OFF; CORRECT?
- A YES. OR TO DRY OFF, OR TO KEEP -- TO KEEP ME AWAKE.
- 4 **Q** OKAY.
- 5 A FROM WHEN I DO MY HOMEWORK.
- 6 Q OKAY.
- 7 AND -- UM -- THE -- THE STAIRS -- YOU HAD TALKED
- 8 ABOUT -- UM -- THAT MISS JANET KICKED YOU WHILE YOU WERE GOING
- 9 UP THE STAIRS; IS THAT CORRECT?
- 10 **A** YES.
- 11 Q SHE NEVER KICKED YOU DOWN THE STAIRS, CORRECT?
- 12 A WELL, SHE -- NOT WHEN WE WERE GOING DOWNSTAIRS SHE
- 13 DIDN'T KICK US AS HARD, BUT SHE STILL KICKED US.
- 14 Q DID YOU FALL?
- 15 **A** YES, SOMETIMES I FELL.
- 16 **Q** FELL, HOW FAR?
- 17 A I DON'T KNOW, BUT NOT FAR.
- 18 **Q** OKAY.
- 19 A NOT FAR ENOUGH FOR ME TO GET HURT.
- 20 Q DID YOU FALL ON YOUR HEAD?
- 21 A NOT ON MY HEAD, BUT I KNOW I -- I KNOW I FELL LIKE
- 22 IN PART LIKE ON MY ARM.
- 23 **Q** OKAY.
- 24 A AND BLEED, A LITTLE, NOT A LOT.
- 25 Q AND IT WOULD BLEED A LITTLE?

- 1 A YES.
- 2 DID SHE PUT A BAND-AID ON IT?
- A I -- I TOLD HER LIKE IF SHE WENT -- I SAID -- SAY
- 4 "MOM, MY ARMS HURT." SHE SAID, "OKAY, I'M GONNA' GET A
- 5 BAND-AID, " SHE'D GIVE US A BAND-AID AND CLEAN IT UP.
- 6 Q OKAY. AND WHEN -- WHEN WOULD SHE KICK YOU DOWN THE
- 7 STAIRS?
- 8 A WHEN SHE WAS UPSET, WHEN WE PEED ON OURSELF OR WHEN
- 9 WE DIDN'T GET OUR HOMEWORK RIGHT.
- 10 Q SO SHE WOULD PURPOSELY TAKE YOU TO THE STAIRS TO
- 11 KICK YOU DOWN THE STAIRS?
- 12 A NO. SHE DIDN'T WANT -- OH. LIKE IF WE HAD PEED ON
- 13 OURSELF SHE DIDN'T WANT TO SMELL IT, RIGHT? SO SHE'D GO --
- 14 SHE'D TAKE US UPSTAIRS TO CLEAN UP TO TAKE A SHOWER OR SHE'D
- 15 SAY -- UM -- SHE'D GIVE US A SHOWER WHEN SHE DECIDES, BUT THEN
- 16 SHE'D GET THE -- BRING THE FAN DOWN AND PUT IT ON US TO DRY --
- 17 TO DRY OFF.
- 18 Q OKAY. BUT WHAT I'M TRYING TO UNDERSTAND IS WHEN SHE
- 19 WOULD -- YOU SAID --
- 20 A WHEN SHE WAS UPSET WHEN WE DID THAT, WHEN WE PEED
- 21 OURSELF AND WHEN WE DIDN'T GET OUR HOMEWORK RIGHT OR WHEN WE
- 22 DID SOMETHING BAD.
- 23 Q SHE WOULD PURPOSELY KICK YOU DOWN THE STAIRS?
- 24 A NO. SHE'D --
- 25 **Q** ALL RIGHT.

- 1 -- KICK US DOWN THE STAIRS BECAUSE SHE WAS UPSET,
- SHE DIDN'T DO IT ON PURPOSE. SHE DID -- THAT WAS ONE OF OUR
- 3 PUNISHMENTS.
- 4 Q OKAY.
- 5 A PURPOSE IS WHEN YOU KICK SOMEONE DOWN THE STAIRS,
- 6 AND YOU SEE IT, YOU START -- I MEAN YOU -- LIKE LET'S SAY
- 7 MISS JANET AND DANIELLE -- LIKE SAY MISS JANET WAS UPSET AT
- 8 DANIELLE BECAUSE SHE FORGOT TO WASH HER CLOTHES, AND
- 9 MISS JANET START TO LAUGH, AND SHE HAD SAW, SHE KNEW SHE WAS
- 10 LAUGHING, SHE DID THAT ON PURPOSE.
- BUT SHE DIDN'T DO IT ON PURPOSE, THAT WAS ONE OF OUR
- 12 PUNISHMENTS FOR US SO SHE COULD TRY TO TELL -- THAT WAS
- 13 ANOTHER WAY FOR HER TO TRY TO TELL US TO STOP DOING THIS,
- 14 BECAUSE SHE -- SHE NEEDS -- SHE CAN'T REWARD, SHE NEEDS TO
- 15 PUNISH US SOME WAY. SHE CAN'T JUST LET US GET AWAY WITH IT.
- 16 SHE DIDN'T DO IT ON PURPOSE.
- 17 Q OKAY. AND -- UM -- YOU SAID THE ONLY TIME YOU GOT
- 18 HURT WAS WHEN YOU GOT YOUR ARM SCRAPED UP?
- 19 A YEAH. LIKE IF WE FELL DOWN THE STAIRS, BUT SHE'D
- 20 KICK -- SHE'D KICK US LIGHTLY. BUT IF SHE WAS REALLY UPSET,
- 21 MEDIUM. BUT THAT'S -- THAT'S AS FAR AS THAT -- AS IT WENT.
- 22 **Q** OKAY.
- 23 A SHE DIDN'T KICK US AS -- LIKE ALL THE WAY DOWN THE
- 24 STAIRS FOR US TO ROLL AND CRASH INTO A GLASS, NO, SHE NEVER
- 25 DID THAT.

- 1 Q OKAY.
- 2 A BUT SHE KICKED US LIGHTLY.
- 3 **Q** LIGHTLY?
- 4 A YES.
- 5 O OKAY. AND -- UM -- THE CATHETER -- UM -- YOU'VE HAD
- 6 A CATHETER PUT INTO YOU BEFORE, CORRECT?
- 7 A YES.
- 8 Q UH -- IN THE HOSPITAL?
- 9 A YES.
- 10 Q OKAY. AND SO YOU KNOW WHAT A CATHETER IS AND WHAT
- 11 IT DOES?
- 12 **A** YES.
- O OKAY. HOW MANY TIMES DO YOU THINK A HOSPITAL OR A
- 14 DOCTOR'S PUT A CATHETER IN YOU?
- 15 A WELL, I KNOW THEY PUT ONE -- A CATHETER IN ME WHEN I
- 16 HAD THE SEIZURE, BECAUSE I REMEMBER MISS JANET --
- 17 Q IS THAT IN DECEMBER?

- 20 A -- I -- I ASKED MISS JANET, SO WHERE EXACTLY WAS I
- 21 AT WHEN I HAD THE SEIZURE, SHE SHOWED ME, BECAUSE THERE WAS
- 22 BLOOD -- BECAUSE THERE WAS BLOOD COMING OUT OF MY MOUTH,
- 23 AND -- UH -- THEY SAID THEY PUT A CATHETER IN ME BECAUSE -- TO
- 24 GET THE PEE OUT, AND THEN THEY -- YEAH. SO --
- 25 **Q** OKAY.

- 1 A -- SHE TOLD ME --
- 2 Q IS THAT THE ONLY TIME THAT YOU CAN THINK OF THAT A
- 3 HOSPITAL PUT A CATHETER IN YOU, OR WAS THERE ANOTHER TIME?
- 4 A THAT'S -- THAT'S THE ONLY TIME I CAN REMEMBER THAT
- 5 THE HOSPITAL PUT A CATHETER IN ME.
- 6 Q ALL RIGHT.
- 7 A I DON'T THINK -- BUT DON'T KNOW -- THEY GAVE ME
- 8 SOMETHING IN THE HOSPITAL BEFORE THAT FOR MY STOMACH TO HELP
- 9 TO -- I THINK IT WAS A COLONOSCOPY, OKAY, YEAH THEY GAVE ME A
- 10 COLONOSCOPY. IT DON'T KNOW IF IT WAS A CATHETER.
- 11 Q OKAY.
- 12 A I KNOW IT WAS A TUBE TO TRY TO GET THAT --
- 13 **Q** OKAY.
- 14 A -- STUFF OUT.
- DO YOU KNOW WHAT PART OF YOUR BODY A CATHETER GOES
- 16 IN TO?
- ANY -- NOT ANY, BUT LIKE THE BODY PARTS DOWN HERE.
- 18 Q OKAY. UM -- SO YOU MOTION TO YOUR STOMACH AREA; IS
- 19 THAT RIGHT?
- A NO, DOWN HERE.
- 21 Q OKAY. DO YOU KNOW WHAT THOSE BODY PARTS ARE
- 22 DESCRIBED AS?
- 23 **A** YES.
- 24 Q DO YOU KNOW WHAT THEIR NAMES ARE?
- 25 **A** YES.

- 1 Q OKAY. CAN YOU TELL ME WHAT PARTS OF YOUR BODY THAT
- 2 A CATHETER IS PUT INTO?
- 3 A UM -- BOTTOM AND A VAGINA.
- 4 Q OKAY. AND SO YOU THINK THAT YOU'VE HAD A CATHETER
- 5 IN YOUR VAGINA AND IN YOUR BOTTOM?
- 6 A I DON'T THINK MY BOTTOM, BECAUSE I KNOW I HAD A
- 7 COLONOSCOPY, BUT I CAN'T REMEMBER BECAUSE THEY PUT ME TO
- 8 SLEEP.
- 9 OKAY. SO YOU'RE NOT JUST SURE IF YOU HAD A CATHETER
- 10 IN YOUR BOTTOM?
- 11 **A** YEAH.
- 12 Q OKAY. BUT YOU ARE SURE THAT THE HOSPITAL PUT A
- 13 CATHETER IN YOUR VAGINA?
- 14 **A** YES.
- 15 O OKAY. UM -- AND YOU TALKED ABOUT MISS JANET
- 16 ATTEMPTING TO PUT A CATHETER IN YOU, RIGHT?
- 17 A YES. BECAUSE WHEN SHE WAS GETTING READY TO GO
- 18 SOMEWHERE, SHE'D ASK US, "DO YOU HAVE TO GO TO THE BATHROOM,"
- 19 AND SHE'D -- WE'D SAY NO. SHE'D SAY, "OKAY, I WANT TO CHECK,
- 20 BECAUSE I'M NOT GONNA' DEAL WITH YOU PEEING ON YOURSELF WHEN
- 21 I'M TRYING TO GO SOMEWHERE." SO SHE'D GET THE CATHETER AND

- 2 O DID YOU LET HER PUT THE CATHETER IN?
- A YES, BECAUSE -- WELL, LIKE I DIDN'T WANT HER TO PUT
- 4 IT IN, BECAUSE I DIDN'T WANT IT TO HURT, BUT SHE WANTED TO PUT
- 5 IT IN, BECAUSE SHE DIDN'T WANT TO DEAL WITH THE PEEING ISSUES.
- 6 Q OKAY.
- 7 A SO THEN SHE WAS TRYING TO MAKE SURE THAT WE DON'T
- 8 PEE ON OURSELF OR NONE OF THAT.
- 9 OKAY. NOW MISS BLUTH HAD YOU DRAW A PICTURE OF A
- 10 RAZOR BLADE.
- 11 **A** YES.
- 12 WHEN WAS THAT RAZOR BLADE USED?
- 13 A WHEN LIKE WE'D PEE ON OURSELVES, SHE'D ACT -- SHE
- 14 DIDN'T ACTUALLY DO IT, CUT US, LIKE SKIN OFF, SHE JUST SAID,
- 15 I'M GONNA' CUT YOU IF YOU DON'T -- IF YOU DON'T STOP PEEING ON
- 16 YOURSELF.
- 17 Q DO YOU NEED SOME WATER?
- 18 **A** NO.
- 19 **Q** OKAY.
- 20 A BUT SHE -- THAT'S -- I WAS THINKING WHEN SHE SAID
- 21 THAT SHE WAS TRYING TO SAY -- SHE'S TRYING TO TELL US, THIS IS
- 22 ANOTHER WAY, SHE -- I WAS THINKING MAYBE SHE'S LIKE -- SHE
- 23 CAME UP WITH THIS TO TELL US TO STOP DOING THIS, TO STOP
- 24 PEEING AND POOPING ON OURSELVES SO SHE DOESN'T -- SO LIKE IT
- 25 DOESN'T GET WORSE WHEN WE GET OLDER.

- 1 **Q** OKAY.
- 2 A SO SHE DIDN'T ACTUALLY CUT US, LIKE SKIN OFF.
- 3 BUT LIKE WHEN AVA WAS IN THE -- SHE -- SHE SAID
- 4 MISS JANET ACCIDENTALLY CUT HER ON THE LIP, AND I SAID,
- 5 WELL -- AND I JUST -- I DON'T KNOW, SAID OKAY. WELL MAYBE --
- 6 MAYBE IT WAS BECAUSE YOU WERE TRYING TO FIGHT HER, AND THE
- 7 RAZOR BLADE WAS IN HER HAND AND SHE ACCIDENTALLY CUT YOU. SO
- 8 SHE DIDN'T -- IT WAS AN ACCIDENT WHEN SHE CUT AVA ON THE LIP.
- 9 SHE DIDN'T LITERALLY STAND THERE AND DO THIS.

- 11 A SHE DID IT ON ACCIDENT, BECAUSE AVA WAS TRYING TO
- 12 FIGHT HER BACK.
- 13 **Q** OKAY.
- 14 A BUT SHE NEVER ACTUALLY CUT US --
- 15 Q ALL RIGHT.
- 16 A -- ON PURPOSE.
- 17 Q HAVE YOU PERSONALLY ACTUALLY SEEN THE RAZOR BLADE?
- 18 A YES. SHE WOULD --
- 19 **Q** OKAY. AND --
- 20 A BECAUSE WE HAD -- I HAD -- I HAD PEED ON MYSELF, AND
- 21 SHE SAID, "IF YOU DON'T STOP I'M GONNA' GET THE RAZOR BLADE
- 22 AND SHOW IT TO YOU."
- AND SO SHE WENT IN HER ROOM, BECAUSE I DID IT, AND
- 24 SHE WENT IN HER ROOM AND SHOWED US, AND SHE SAID THIS IS --
- 25 SHE SHOWED US THE RAZOR BLADE AND SHE SAID, "IF YOU DON'T STOP

- 1 I'M GONNA' HAVE" -- "I'M GONNA' USE THIS." AND IT WAS ANOTHER

- 6 Q WHEN SHE SHOWED YOU THAT RAZOR BLADE, DID THAT SCARE
- 7 YOU OR DID YOU THINK --
- 8 A YEAH, IT SCARED ME. I -- I TOLD MYSELF, I REALLY
- 9 JUST THOUGHT -- BECAUSE I DON'T WANT TO DIE IN A BATHTUB.
- 10 Q ALL RIGHT. WHERE DID SHE GET THE RAZOR BLADE FROM?
- 11 A I DON'T KNOW.
- 12 Q DID YOU SEE HER GO AND GET THE RAZOR BLADE?
- 13 **A** NO.
- 14 Q SO ALL OF SUDDEN SHE JUST HAD A RAZOR BLADE?
- 15 A I THINK SO. I DON'T KNOW WHERE -- WHERE SHE GOT IT
- 16 WHEN SHE GOT IT.
- 17 Q OKAY. DO YOU KNOW WHERE SHE KEPT THE RAZOR BLADE?
- 18 A IN HER ROOM SOMEWHERE, I DON'T KNOW.
- 19 Q SO YOU BELIEVED THAT SHE WOULD GO IN HER ROOM TO GET
- 20 THE RAZOR BLADE?
- 21 A THAT'S WHERE SHE WENT TO GET THE RAZOR BLADE WHEN
- 22 SEE TOLD ME -- SHOWED -- WHEN SHE SHOWED ME THE RAZOR BLADE.
- 23 BUT I DON'T KNOW IF SHE KEPT IT IN OTHER PLACES.
- 24 Q OKAY. NOW -- UM -- WHEN YOU WERE -- UM -- GETTING
- 25 THE CATHETER PUT IN YOU, WHERE WERE YOU?

- 1 A IN THE BATHROOM, ON A TOWEL.
- 2 **Q** WHERE? WHAT BATHROOM?
- 3 A THERE'S TWO BATHROOMS. ONE -- ONE OF THE BATHROOM
- 4 IS BY THE BEDROOMS THAT THE FOSTER KIDS SLEPT IN.
- 5 Q SO ARE WE TALKING UPSTAIRS OR DOWNSTAIRS?
- 6 A IT WAS -- IT WAS UPSTAIRS.
- 7 Q UPSTAIRS.
- 8 A YEAH. BUT I --
- 9 Q AND YOU SAID THERE'S TWO BATHROOMS UPSTAIRS?
- 10 **A** YES.
- 11 Q OKAY.
- 12 A AND ONE BY THERE AND THEN ONE BY -- IN THE LOFT. BY
- 13 THE LOFT, I MEAN.
- 14 Q OKAY. AND YOU SAID THIS WAS IN THE BATHROOM BY THE
- 15 LOFT?
- 16 **A** NO.
- 17 **Q** NO?
- 18 A IT WAS BY -- THE BATHROOM BY THE TWO BEDROOMS.
- 19 Q BY THE TWO BEDROOMS, OKAY.
- 20 A BECAUSE SHE WAS GOING SOMEWHERE, SHE SAID -- SHE
- 21 ASKED ALL OF THREE OF US, AND SHE SAID IT LOUD, SHE SAID, "DO
- 22 YOU HAVE TO GO TO THE BATHROOM?" AND I -- WE ALL SAID NO.
- AND SHE CHECKED US, AND SHE SAID, "WELL, IF PEE
- 24 COMES OUT YOU'RE GONNA' GET A SPANKING BECAUSE YOU LIED TO
- 25 ME." AND I DIDN'T -- I DIDN'T -- NO PEE CAME OUT OF ME, I

- 1 DON'T THINK SO, BUT I DIDN'T GET A SPANKING, NO.
- 2 **Q** OKAY.
- 3 A BUT SHE -- I KNOW LIKE THAT THE BATHROOM WAS BY THE
- 4 TWO BEDROOMS, AND SHE LAYS THE TOWEL IN THE -- BY THE SINK
- 5 ERA -- AREA.
- 6 O AND THAT'S NEXT TO THE FOSTER KIDS AREA?
- 7 A THE BEDROOMS.
- 8 Q OKAY, THE BEDROOMS.
- 9 AND WHEN THIS WOULD HAPPEN WERE THE FOSTER KIDS
- 10 THERE?
- 11 A NO, THEY WERE GOING WITH THEM.
- 12 Q THEY WERE GOING WITH --
- 13 **A** WITH --
- 14 Q -- MISS JANET?
- 15 **A** YEAH, THE SOLANDERS.
- 16 O OKAY. UM -- AND SO THE FOSTER KIDS WERE OBVIOUSLY
- 17 STILL IN THE HOUSE WHEN THIS WAS GOING ON?
- 18 A YEAH, BUT THEY WERE DOWNSTAIRS.
- 19 Q THEY WERE DOWNSTAIRS. OKAY. AND --
- THE COURT: WE'RE SUPPOSE TO BE TAKING A BREAK, MR. MANN.
- 21 MR. MANN: YES. OH, I'M SORRY.
- 22 THE COURT: OKAY.
- 23 MR. MANN: IF YOU WANT TO STOP --
- 24 THE COURT: ARE YOU READY?
- MR. MANN: YEAH, THAT'S FINE, YOUR HONOR.

- 1 THE COURT: YEAH, OKAY.
- 2 ALL RIGHT, WE'RE GOING TO TAKE A LUNCH BREAK. WE'LL
- 3 RESUME AT 1 O'CLOCK OR THEREABOUTS RIGHT NEXT DOOR IN J.C. 11,
- 4 7B.
- 5 MR. MANN: THANK YOU, YOUR HONOR.
- 6 THE COURT: ALL RIGHT, THANK YOU.
- 7 (WHEREUPON THE LUNCH BREAK WAS TAKEN.)
- 8 THE COURT: WE ARE BACK ON THE RECORD. WE HAVE EVERYBODY
- 9 HERE.
- 10 WE DO WANT TO MAKE A RECORD OF THE PEOPLE THAT ARE IN THE
- 11 COURTROOM THAT ARE NOT PARTIES OR LAWYERS OF THE PARTIES.
- 12 MISS BLUTH?
- 13 MS. BLUTH: OH.
- 14 THE COURT: CAN YOU TELL US WHO'S IN THE COURTROOM?
- 15 MS. BLUTH: YES. UM -- WHAT'S YOUR LAST NAME.
- 16 MS. PATEL: PATEL.
- 17 MS. BLUTH: PATEL. UM -- YOUR HONOR, MISS PATEL IS A
- 18 DISTRICT ATTORNEY IN OUR FAMILY DIVISION.
- 19 **THE COURT:** OKAY.
- 20 MS. BLUTH: AND THEN WE HAVE MISS STACY FROM CPS, AND
- 21 YOUR LAST NAME IS?
- 22 MS. DASTRUP: DASTRUP.
- MS. BLUTH: DASTRUP. AND THEN -- UM -- I DON'T THINK
- 24 WE'RE -- MISS BRASIER, ALISON BRASIER, WHO WAS SITTING WITH
- 25 AVA -- UM -- IS THEIR CASA ADVOCATE, AND SO SHE WILL BE

- 1 SITTING WITH AMAYA THIS AFTERNOON, WHILE MISS DEBBIE, THEIR
- 2 FOSTER PARENT WHO WAS IN THE COURTROOM WITH AMAYA THIS
- 3 MORNING, WENT TO GO GET ANASTASIA FOR HER TESTIMONY.
- 4 THE COURT: OKAY.
- 5 MS. BLUTH: SO WE'RE ACTUALLY GOING TO HAVE A DIFFERENT
- 6 INDIVIDUAL SITTING THIS AFTERNOON.
- 7 MR. MANN: AND, YOUR HONOR, I DIDN'T REALIZE THAT WAS
- 8 MISS DEBBIE WHO WAS UP THERE. IT'S MY UNDERSTANDING THAT SHE
- 9 WAS INTERVIEWED AS A POTENTIAL WITNESS BY THE POLICE -- UM --
- 10 AND MAY HAVE HAD ISSUES THAT WE MAY NEED TO GET INTO FOR TRIAL
- 11 PURPOSES AT A LATER TIME. I DIDN'T REALIZE SHE WAS SITTING IN
- 12 HERE FOR THE TRIAL. I DIDN'T KNOW WHO THAT WAS, ACTUALLY.
- 13 SO, I JUST WANT TO MAKE IT CLEAR.
- 14 THE COURT: OKAY. I DIDN'T KNOW WHO IT WAS EITHER,
- 15 FRANKLY, BUT I WASN'T --
- 16 MR. MANN: MY OBJECTION TO --
- 17 THE COURT: I MEAN, I JUST ASSUMED SHE WAS A CASA PERSON,
- 18 BUT THAT'S PROBABLY A BAD ASSUMPTION ON MY BEHALF AND YOUR
- 19 BEHALF.
- 20 MR. MANN: AND MINE, YEAH. I -- I ASSUMED THAT ANYONE
- 21 THAT WAS A POTENTIAL WITNESS WOULD NOT BE SITTING UP THERE AS
- 22 FAMILY SUPPORT.
- 23 MS. LUZAICH: WELL, THE STATUTE IS VERY CLEAR THAT THE
- 24 CHILD CAN HAVE ANYONE THEY WANT. ANYONE, EVEN IF THEY ARE IN
- 25 THE FUTURE GOING TO BE A WITNESS. IF THEY'RE GOING TO BE A

- 1 WITNESS AT THE HEARING, AT THIS POINT, THEY WOULD HAVE JUST
- 2 TESTIFIED FIRST. BUT SINCE SHE WASN'T TESTIFYING --
- 3 MR. RUE: SO SHE COULD HAVE AVA UP THERE?
- 4 MS. LUZAICH: -- IT WASN'T AN ISSUE.
- 5 I'M SORRY?
- 6 MR. RUE: SO SHE COULD HAVE AVA UP THERE?
- 7 MS. BLUTH: IF SHE CHOSE.
- 8 MS. LUZAICH: IF SHE WANTED, YEAH.
- 9 MR. RUE: I DON'T THINK THAT THE JUDGE WOULD HAVE ALLOWED
- 10 THAT.
- 11 MS. BLUTH: WELL --
- 12 THE COURT: WELL LUCKILY I HAVEN'T BEEN POSED WITH THAT
- 13 PROBLEM SO -- THE ONE THING I TOLD THE LAWYERS AT THE BENCH
- 14 WHEN WE CAME BACK ON THE REC -- OR CAME BACK INTO THE
- 15 COURTROOM, NOT ON THE RECORD, AND I ASKED THEM IF THEY WANTED
- 16 THIS ON THE RECORD, AND -- UM -- I THINK THE DEFENSE DOES WANT
- 17 THIS ON THE RECORD, SO I'M GOING TO PUT IT ON THE RECORD --
- 18 UM -- TO NOTE THE WITNESS, MAYA IS NOT IN THE COURTROOM RIGHT
- 19 NOW, BUT -- UM -- I DID LET THEM KNOW WHILE I WAS -- YOU KNOW,
- 20 MAYA WAS IN THE BACK HALLWAY WITH HER CASA REPRESENTATIVE --
- 21 MS. BLUTH: CORRECT.
- 22 THE COURT: -- ALISON, AND I DID GIVE HER A RING POP,
- 23 BECAUSE SHE WAS VERY UPSET, AND I TOLD HER CANDY MAKES
- 24 EVERYBODY FEEL BETTER. AND THEN MISS ALISON BROUGHT HER INTO
- 25 MY CHAMBERS AND TOLD HER SHE COULD ASK THE JUDGE WHAT,

- 1 APPARENTLY SHE WAS ASKING MISS ALISON, SO -- UM -- MAYA ASKED
- 2 ME, WHILE I WAS SITTING AT MY DESK, WHEN SHE COULD SPEAK WITH
- 3 THE SOLANDERS, AND WHEN SHE COULD -- WHEN SHE COULD SEE THE
- 4 SOLANDERS.
- 5 AND SO I WANTED TO DISCLOSE THAT, AND DISCLOSE THAT I
- 6 PRETTY MUCH IN ALL INTENTS AND PURPOSES TOLD HER THAT SHE
- 7 COULD NOT SPEAK WITH THE SOLANDERS OR SEE THE SOLANDERS WHILE
- 8 THEY WERE IN CUSTODY, BUT THAT'S NOT UNIQUE, THAT THAT IS WITH
- 9 EVERY CASE WHERE PEOPLE WERE IN CUSTODY, AND THAT WHATEVER SHE
- 10 FELT AND WHATEVER SHE WANTED TO TELL THE SOLANDERS, SHE HAD
- 11 SAID FROM THE STAND EARLIER IN HER TESTIMONY, AND THAT
- 12 EVERYBODY WAS LISTENING TO HER, INCLUDING THE SOLANDERS. SO I
- 13 TOLD HER BASICALLY THAT I THINK -- I THOUGHT SHE HAD ALREADY
- 14 SAID WHAT SHE WANTED TO SAY -- UM -- PRIOR TO THE BREAK WHILE

- 16 MS. BLUTH: AND, JUDGE, THAT IS RIGHT.
- 17 AND JUST FOR THE RECORD, ALISON IS THEIR CASA
- 18 REPRESENTATIVE, ALISON BRASIER, B-R-A-S-I-E-R. AND I HAVE
- 19 SPOKEN TO THEM, I HAVE EXPLAINED TO HER THAT SHE CAN'T SPEAK
- 20 WITH THEM. SHE HAS ASKED ME SEVERAL TIMES TO TELL THEM THAT
- 21 SHE LOVES THEM AND SHE FORGIVES THEM. AND I -- YOU KNOW, I --
- 22 SHE'S A CHILD, WHAT CAN I SAY, AND I'VE EXPLAINED MANY TIMES
- 23 THAT THEY HAVE ATTORNEYS AND THAT SHE CAN'T SPEAK WITH THEM
- 24 RIGHT NOW.
- 25 THE COURT: OKAY.

- 1 MS. BLUTH: SO THAT'S KIND OF JUST THE SITUATION.
- 2 MR. MANN: YOUR HONOR, JUST ONE LAST THING, LOOKS LIKE WE
- 3 HAVE TWO MORE PEOPLE IN THE COURTROOM, JUST FOR THE RECORD WHO
- 4 ARE THEY?
- 5 THE COURT: SURE.
- 6 MS. BLUTH: CAN YOU STAND AND GIVE YOUR NAMES FOR THE
- 7 RECORD?
- 8 MS. VECCHIO: JENNIFER VECCHIO, I'M A LICENSED
- 9 PSYCHOLOGIST.
- 10 THE COURT: CAN YOU SPEAK UP, WE'RE TAKING A RECORD.
- 11 MS. VECCHIO: SORRY. JENNIFER VECCHIO, THE -- THE
- 12 PSYCHOLOGIST.
- 13 THE COURT: OKAY.
- 14 MR. MANN: FOR?
- 15 MS. VECCHIO: FOR ALL THREE GIRLS.
- 16 **THE COURT:** FOR WHAT?
- 17 MS. VECCHIO: FOR ALL THREE GIRLS.
- 18 THE COURT: OH, OKAY.
- MS. HIGHER: MY NAME IS AMNA HIGHER, I'M ONE OF THE
- 20 THERAPISTS FOR ALL THREE GIRLS.
- 21 THE COURT: ALL RIGHT. AND WE'VE ALREADY DISCLOSED THE
- 22 OTHER TWO, AND THEN WE HAVE THE PERSON -- DID WE GET THE NAME
- 23 OF THE PERSON THAT WAS --
- 24 MR. MUELLER: NO, WE DIDN'T, BUT --
- 25 THE COURT: OKAY. WELL, WE MIGHT AS WELL.

- 1 WHAT'S YOUR NAME?
- 2 MS. SCHULTZ: SHOULD I STAND?
- 3 THE COURT: SURE. JUST -- BECAUSE SHE'S TAKING A RECORD,
- 4 SO.
- 5 MS. SCHULTZ: OKAY, MARIN SCHULTZ (PHONETIC). I'M A --
- 6 THE COURT: WHAT'S YOUR FIRST NAME?
- 7 MS. SCHULTZ: MARIN, LIKE THE COUNTY IN CALIFORNIA. SO
- 8 M-A-R-I-N, AND THEN SCHULTZ.
- 9 THE COURT: OKAY. AND YOU'RE A SOCIAL WORKER?
- 10 MS. SCHULTZ: YES.

- 21 THE COURT: ALL RIGHT, MAYA, IT'S KIND OF A CHANGE OF
- 22 SCENERY, BUT IT KIND OF LOOKS LIKE THE SAME THING, HUH?
- 23 SAME -- DIFFERENT COURTROOM, BUT EVERY OTHER -- THEY ALL LOOK
- 24 THE SAME.
- 25 OKAY. YOU REALIZE YOU'RE STILL UNDER OATH, AND THAT

- 1 YOU'VE PROMISED AND SWORN TO TELL THE -- TELL THE TRUTH,
- 2 CORRECT?
- 3 THE WITNESS: (NO AUDIBLE RESPONSE.)
- 4 THE COURT: IS THAT A YES?
- 5 THE WITNESS: YES.
- 6 THE COURT: OKAY. ALL RIGHT.
- 7 WE'RE GOING TO GET STARTED. I THINK MR. MANN WAS ASKING
- 8 YOU QUESTIONS, AND HE'S GOING TO FINISH UP, AND THEN THERE
- 9 ARE -- THE OTHER LAWYERS WILL BE ABLE TO ASK YOU QUESTIONS.

- 17 UM -- YOU HAD TALKED ABOUT -- UM -- THE TIME THAT
- 18 YOU WERE TAKEN INTO THE BATHROOM AND A TOWEL WAS LAID DOWN,
- 19 AND YOU LIED ON THE BATH -- ON THAT TOWEL IN THE BATHROOM?
- 20 **A** YES.
- 21 Q OKAY. NOW, THERE WAS A -- A TIME THAT YOU HAD SOME
- 22 IRRITATION IN YOUR VAGINAL AREA, CORRECT, AND YOU WENT TO A
- 23 DOCTOR?
- 24 A YES.
- 25 Q OKAY. AND THAT DOCTOR PRESCRIBED SOME CREAM TO BE

- 1 APPLIED TO YOUR PRIVATE AREA, YOUR VAGINAL AREA?
- 2 A YES.
- 3 Q YES. OKAY.
- AND ISN'T IT TRUE THAT IT WAS AT THAT TIME THAT
- 5 MISS JANET WOULD APPLY THE CREAM TO YOUR VAGINAL AREA WHEN YOU
- 6 LIED ON THE TOWEL?
- 7 A YES.
- 8 Q OKAY. AND THAT -- UM -- THE TIMES REGARDING THE
- 9 CATHETER WAS REALLY RELATING TO THE TIMES THAT SHE WAS -- YOU
- 10 WERE APPLYING THE -- UH -- CREAM TO THE VAGINAL AREA, CORRECT?
- 11 A YES.
- 12 Q OKAY. UM -- NOW, YOU ALSO -- UM -- TALKED ABOUT --
- 13 UM -- YOU HAVING SOME MEDICAL ISSUES, CORRECT?
- 14 **A** YES.
- 15 Q OKAY. YOU HAD AN ISSUE WITH YOUR STOMACH AND YOUR
- 16 COLON?
- 17 **A** YES.
- 18 O YOU HAD SOME PSYCHIATRIC ISSUES?
- 19 **A** YES.
- 20 Q OKAY. UM -- NOW YOU WERE PRESCRIBED MEDICATIONS FOR
- 21 THAT, CORRECT?
- 22 **A** YES.
- 23 OKAY. AND ARE YOU CURRENTLY ON ANY MEDICATIONS?
- 24 A I DON'T KNOW WHAT IT'S CALLED, IT'S THE SEIZURE
- 25 MEDICINE.

- 1 Q OKAY. IS THAT THE ONLY MEDICINE THAT YOU'RE TAKING
- 2 FOR SEIZURES?
- 3 A YES.
- 4 Q OKAY. WERE YOU TAKING OTHER MEDICINES AWHILE BACK,
- 5 OR JUST THAT ONE?
- 6 A I WAS TAKING THE PILL, THE -- SOMETHING FOR MY --
- 7 UM -- I DON'T KNOW WHAT IT'S CALLED.
- 8 Q OKAY. DO YOU REMEMBER WHAT THE PILL LOOKED LIKE?
- 9 A IT WAS REALLY SMALL. IT WAS SOMETHING FOR MY -- I
- 10 CAN'T REMEMBER WHAT IT WAS.
- 11 Q DO YOU REMEMBER WHAT DOCTOR PRESCRIBED IT?
- 12 **A** NO.
- 13 Q OKAY. WAS IT A DOCTOR IN LAS VEGAS OR IN FLORIDA?
- 14 A UM -- IN LAS VEGAS.
- 15 O OKAY. AND WERE YOU PRESCRIBED IT BEFORE YOU LEFT
- 16 FOR FLORIDA OR AFTER YOU LEFT FOR FLORIDA?
- 17 **A** BEFORE.
- 18 Q OKAY. AND WAS IT TO HELP YOUR TUMMY OR SOMETHING
- 19 ELSE?
- 20 A SOMETHING ELSE.
- 21 Q OKAY. NOW -- UM -- DO YOU REMEMBER YOUR DOCTOR THAT
- 22 DEALT WITH YOUR TUMMY ISSUES IN LAS VEGAS?
- 23 **A** YES.
- 24 Q DO YOU REMEMBER WHAT HIS NAME OR HER NAME WAS?
- 25 A NO, I JUST KNOW THAT HE WORKS AT SUMMERLIN HOSPITAL.

- 1 Q HE WORKS AT SUMMERLIN HOSPITAL?
- 2 A YES.
- 3 O WOULD YOU GO THERE WHEN YOU WEREN'T BEING ADMITTED
- 4 INTO THE HOSPITAL, JUST FOR LIKE A REGULAR VISIT?
- 5 A YEAH, LIKE -- UM -- WHEN I HAD AN APPOINTMENT FOR MY
- 6 STOMACH.
- 7 Q OKAY. AND WAS THIS BEFORE AND AFTER YOUR
- 8 COLONOSCOPY? DO YOU REMEMBER WHEN THEY PUT YOU TO SLEEP AND
- 9 THEY LOOKED UP YOUR BUTT?
- 10 A I THINK IT WAS BEFORE, I CAN'T REMEMBER, THOUGH.
- O OKAY. OKAY. UM -- AND -- UM -- BUT YOU WERE
- 12 PRESCRIBED WITH A -- OR DIAGNOSED WITH A CONDITION REGARDING
- 13 YOUR STOMACH?
- 14 **A** YES.
- 15 Q OR YOUR COLON?
- 16 WHAT -- WHAT WAS THAT CONDITION?
- 17 A IT WAS SOMETHING THAT I CAN'T DIGEST FOOD CORRECTLY
- 18 LIKE OTHER PEOPLE CAN, SOMETHING LIKE THAT.
- 19 Q OKAY. DO YOU REMEMBER WHAT THE NAME WAS, OR NO?
- 20 A I CAN'T REMEMBER THE NAME.
- 21 Q DID THE DOCTOR TALK TO YOU DIRECTLY?
- 22 A WELL, I WAS IN THE DOCTOR'S OFFICE, MISS JANET WAS
- 23 THERE.
- 24 **Q** OKAY.
- 25 A BUT I DIDN'T -- I COULDN'T FULLY UNDERSTAND WHAT HE

- 1 WAS SAYING.
- 2 Q OKAY. BUT THE DOCTOR TALKED IN FRONT OF YOU?
- 3 A YES.
- 4 Q OKAY. AND HE -- UM -- TOLD YOU THAT YOU HAD SOME
- 5 PROBLEMS WITH YOUR STOMACH?
- 6 A YES.
- 7 Q OKAY. AND AFTER THE DOCTOR TALKED TO YOU AND AFTER
- 8 THE COLONOSCOPY -- UM -- YOU STARTED EATING SOME BLENDED FOOD?
- 9 A YES.
- 10 Q AND THEN YOUR STOMACH STARTED FEELING BETTER?
- 11 **A** YES.
- 12 Q OKAY. AND -- UM -- SO YOU STARTED TO FEEL -- UM --
- 13 BETTER AND DIDN'T NEED TO DO AS MUCH TO KEEP YOUR STOMACH
- 14 BETTER, CORRECT?
- 15 **A** YES.
- 16 Q OKAY. NOW, AFTER YOUR STOMACH STARTED FEELING
- 17 BETTER, DID YOU CONTINUE TO PURPOSELY PEE OR POOP YOUR PANTS
- 18 BECAUSE YOU WERE MAD?
- 19 **A** YES.
- 20 O AND SO -- UM -- EVEN THOUGH YOU HAD ISSUES WITH YOUR
- 21 STOMACH, YOU WERE STILL MAKING YOURSELF PEE OR POOP YOUR
- 22 PANTS?
- 23 **A** YES.
- 24 **Q** OKAY.
- 25 NOW -- UM -- YOUR HOMEWORK THAT YOU WOULD DO WHILE

- 1 YOU WERE -- UM -- WHILE YOU WERE HOMESCHOOLED, DID IT TAKE YOU
- 2 MOST OF THE DAY TO DO IT?
- 3 A YES.
- 4 Q WHAT KIND OF HOMEWORK WAS IT?
- 5 A WELL, WE GET LIKE HOMEWORK IN EVERY SINGLE SUBJECT.
- 6 Q OKAY. MATH?
- 7 A YES.
- 8 Q ENGLISH?
- 9 A (NO AUDIBLE RESPONSE.)
- 10 **Q** YES?
- 11 **A** YES.
- 12 Q OKAY. UM -- AND WAS THERE AN AREA OR SUBJECT THAT
- 13 YOU HAD A LITTLE MORE DIFFICULTY WITH?
- 14 A UM -- I THINK IT WAS -- I CAN'T REMEMBER, LIKE IT
- 15 WAS SOMETHING DOING -- IT WAS -- HAD TO DO SOMETHING WITH
- 16 ENGLISH.
- 17 Q OKAY. MATH YOU DID OKAY, THOUGH?
- 18 A I KIND OF STRUGGLED WITH IT.
- 19 Q OKAY. AND SO SOMETIMES MISS JANET WOULD TELL YOU,
- 20 WHATEVER YOUR HOMEWORK WAS THAT YOU NEED TO CONTINUE TRYING TO
- 21 WORK ON IT?
- 22 **A** YES.
- Q OKAY. AND THAT SHE TOLD YOU, YOU NEED TO SIT AND
- 24 KEEP WORKING ON THAT HOMEWORK?

- 1 Q OKAY. AND SOMETIMES, THOUGH, YOU WOULD PEE OR POOP
- 2 YOURSELF TO GET OUT OF HAVING TO DO YOUR HOMEWORK, RIGHT?
- 3 **A** YES.
- 4 OKAY. AND SO YOU USED PEEING OR POOPING ON YOURSELF
- 5 AS KIND OF A WAY TO GET BACK AT MISS JANET OR MR. DWIGHT,
- 6 RIGHT?
- 7 **A** YES.
- 8 MR. MANN: COURT'S INDULGENCE.
- 9 (DISCUSSION BETWEEN MR. MANN AND DEFENDANT J. SOLANDER.)
- 10 BY MR. MANN:
- 11 O NOW, AT NIGHT -- UM -- THERE WAS A BATHROOM NEAR

- 20 Q IT WAS IN THE SHAPE OF AN ANGEL?
- 21 **A** YES.
- 22 OKAY. AND SO THEY HAD THAT NIGHTLIGHT IN THAT
- 23 BATHROOM SO YOU GUYS COULD SEE AT NIGHT TO GO TO THE BATHROOM?
- 24 **A** YES.
- 25 O SO IF YOU NEEDED TO GO TO THE BATHROOM YOU WOULD

- 1 NEED TO GO GET UP AND WALK OVER THERE TO GO TO THE BATHROOM? YES. Α O THERE WAS NOTHING PREVENTING YOU GOING TO THE 4 BATHROOM, CORRECT? YES. 5 Α SO IF YOU WANTED TO YOU COULD GO TO THE BATHROOM AT Q 7 ANY TIME DURING THE NIGHT? A YES. 8 Q OKAY. - 9 IN YOUR BED THAT YOU WERE MADE TO LAY ON THE FLOOR OR THE
- 10 BOARDS?
- 11 **A** YES.
- 12 Q SO THAT CAME AFTER YOU CONTINUED TO PEE IN THE BED?
- 13 **A** YES.
- 14 Q NOW, HOW DID THE MATTRESS SMELL AFTER YOU PEED ON IT
- 15 A FEW TIMES?
- 16 A HMM, I DON'T KNOW, BECAUSE I NEVER SMELLED IT.
- 17 Q YOU NEVER NOTICED THE SMELL?
- 18 A (NO AUDIBLE RESPONSE.)
- 19 Q BECAUSE THAT'S WHERE THE FAN WAS, WAS UP IN -- NEAR
- 20 THE BED?
- 21 A THE FAN WAS IN FRONT OF THE BOARDS.
- 22 Q IN FRONT OF THE BOARDS?
- 23 **A** YES.
- 24 Q NOW, DID MR. DWIGHT NORMALLY TUCK YOU IN OR WAS IT
- 25 MOSTLY JANET?

- 1 A MOSTLY MISS JANET.
- 2 Q MOSTLY MISS JANET.
- 3 NOW, WAS MR. DWIGHT -- WHEN YOU WERE BEING
- 4 HOMESCHOOLED, WHO DID MOST OF THE INSTRUCTION?
- 5 A LIKE WHO'S THE ONE THAT MAYBE CORRECTED OUR
- 6 HOMEWORK?
- 7 O WHO WAS THE ONE WHO WAS TEACHING YOU AND POINTING AT
- 8 THE BOARD AND EXPLAIN --
- 9 **A** MISS JANET.
- 10 Q MISS JANET WAS THE ONE WHO WAS HOMESCHOOLING YOU?
- 11 **A** YES.
- 12 Q ALL RIGHT. AND THIS WAS AFTER YOU GUYS HAD GOTTEN
- 13 KICKED OUT OR ASKED TO LEAVE THE PUBLIC SCHOOL?
- 14 A THIS WAS AFTER WE WERE TAKEN OUT.
- 15 Q TAKEN OUT. ALL RIGHT.
- 16 AND YOU GUYS HAD GOT CAUGHT STEALING?
- 17 **A** YES.
- 18 Q NOW, YOU AND YOUR TWO SISTERS WEREN'T THE ONLY KIDS
- 19 AT THE SOLANDER HOUSE, WERE THERE -- WERE YOU?
- 20 **A** NO.
- 21 Q ALL RIGHT. WHO WERE THE OTHER KIDS WHEN YOU FIRST
- 22 ARRIVED?
- 23 **A** LIKE THE FIRST -- FIRST DAY WE WERE WITH THE
- 24 SOLANDERS?
- 25 YES. WHO WAS ALL THERE?

- 1 A NO ONE BUT THEM.
- 2 Q ALL RIGHT. AND LATER DID SOME OTHER KIDS ARRIVE?
- 3 **A** YES.
- 4 Q AND WHO WAS THAT?
- 5 A UM -- THERE WAS IVY AND AUTUMN, AND THEN --
- 6 Q IVY AND AUTUMN.
- 7 A NOVALIEH, AREAHIA, DEMEYER AND KAESHIA.
- 8 **Q** OKAY.
- 9 A AND THEN ADDISON (PHONETIC) AND FRANKIE (PHONETIC).
- 10 Q FRANKIE. SO THAT'S A TOTAL OF SEVEN KIDS?
- 11 A SPI -- SPIDER.
- 12 Q AND SPIDER, OKAY. A TOTAL OF EIGHT KIDS?
- 13 **A** YES.
- 14 Q NOW, OF ALL THOSE OTHER KIDS, DID ANY OF THOSE KIDS
- 15 HAVE TO SIT ON THE BUCKETS?
- 16 **A** NO.
- 17 O DID ANY OF THOSE KIDS PEE AND POOP THEMSELVES?
- 18 A SOMETIMES.
- 19 **Q** INTENTIONALLY?
- 20 **A** SOMETIMES.
- 21 Q AS AN ACCIDENT OR AS A REGULAR --
- 22 A ACCIDENT.
- 23 Q OKAY. BUT NOT LIKE YOU GUYS WERE DOING ON A REGULAR
- 24 BASIS?
- 25 **A** NO.

- O ALL RIGHT. DID ANY OF THOSE KIDS -- UM -- HAVE
- 2 TO -- OR HAS ANY OF THEM SIT ON THE BUCKETS? THEY DIDN'T HAVE
- 3 TO -- UM -- THEY NEVER PEED THEIR BEDS?
- A SOMETIMES, BUT THEY DIDN'T HAVE TO SIT ON THE
- 5 BUCKETS AT ALL.
- 6 Q ALL RIGHT. AND THESE KIDS ALL WENT TO PUBLIC
- 7 SCHOOLS OR ALL -- ALL WENT TO SCHOOL, THEY WEREN'T
- 8 HOMESCHOOLED?
- 9 **A** NO.
- 10 Q ALL RIGHT. NOW, IN THE MORNING WHEN YOU GOT UP IN
- 11 THE MORNING, WAS MR. DWIGHT HOME OR HAD HE ALREADY GONE TO

- 13 A WELL, HE WAS GONE MOST OF THE TIME. BUT WHEN WE GET

- 20 A WELL, HE'S LIKE GONE MOST OF THE WEEK.
- 21 Q GONE MOST OF THE WEEK?
- 22 **A** YES.
- 23 **Q** OKAY.
- 24 A WHEN WE WERE THERE.
- 25 Q ALL RIGHT. SO MR. DWIGHT WASN'T THERE TO MAKE YOU

- 1 SLEEP ON THE BOARDS?
- 2 **A** NO.
- 3 Q ALL RIGHT. NOW -- THEN MR. DWIGHT WOULDN'T HAVE
- 4 BEEN THERE TO -- UH -- HAVE THE FAN BLOW ON YOU?
- 5 **A** NO.
- 6 Q OKAY. NOW, WHO COOKED MOST OF THE MEALS FOR YOU AND
- 7 THE OTHER KIDS?
- 8 A MISS JANET.
- 9 **Q** MISS JANET?
- AND DID SHE CONTINUE TO COOK THE MEALS AFTER SHE
- 11 FOUND OUT YOU NEEDED SPECIAL BLEND FOR YOUR -- UH -- STOMACH?
- 12 A WELL, SHE'D MAKE IT AND BLEND IT UP FOR US.
- 13 Q THEN SHE WOULD?
- 14 **A** YES.
- 15 Q ALL RIGHT. NOW, DID -- SHE HAD YOU EAT THAT FOOD, I
- 16 MEAN THE -- THE -- THE BLENDED FOOD FOR YOU?
- 17 **A** YES.
- 18 Q ALL RIGHT. DID YOU NOTICE ANY IMPROVEMENT IN YOUR
- 19 STOMACH, DID IT MAKE YOU FEEL BETTER?
- 20 A YEAH, IT HELPED A LOT. I WAS NOT AS CONSTIPATED AS
- 21 I WAS BEFORE.
- 22 Q OKAY. SO IT DID -- IT DID HELP?
- 23 **A** (NO AUDIBLE RESPONSE.)
- 24 Q NOW, DID THERE COME A TIME WHERE MISS JANET SAID YOU
- 25 COULDN'T EAT?

- A WELL, LIKE IF WE COULDN'T GET OUR HOMEWORK RIGHT,
- 2 LIKE -- YES, IF WE COULDN'T GET OUR HOMEWORK RIGHT SHE'D BE
- 3 LIKE, YOU CAN'T EAT UNTIL YOU GET THIS HOMEWORK PROBLEM RIGHT,
- 4 BECAUSE YOU GOT TO GET IT DONE.
- 5 Q OKAY. SO IT WAS SIT THERE AND DO YOUR HOMEWORK

- 12 A (NO AUDIBLE RESPONSE.)
- 13 Q -- YOU GOT DINNER?
- 14 A NO. BECAUSE SHE DIDN'T WANT TO FEED US SO LATE,
- 15 BECAUSE THEN WE'D FLOOD THE BED.
- 16 **Q** YOU DID WHAT?
- 17 A BECAUSE THEN WE'D FLOOD THE BED.
- 18 O FLOOD THE BED?
- 19 **A** YES.
- 20 Q NOW, DID THERE COME A TIME WHEN MISS JANET WAS
- 21 WANTING TO GO SOMEWHERE AND TAKE YOU GUYS OUT, AND YOU WOULD
- 22 HAVE TO STOP AND PEE YOURSELVES BEFORE YOU LEFT THE TOWN --
- 23 BEFORE YOU LEFT THE HOUSE?
- 24 A WHEN WE WENT ON VACATIONS, YEAH.
- 25 Q OKAY. AND YOU WERE DOING THAT INTENTIONALLY AT THIS

- 1 TIME?
- 2 A UM -- WE WERE.
- 3 O YOU DID -- YOU DID IT ON PURPOSE?
- 4 A YEAH, BECAUSE I WAS MAD.
- 5 **Q** BECAUSE YOU WERE MAD.
- NOW, DID MR. DWIGHT EVER COOK MEALS FOR YOU?
- 7 A SOMETIMES.
- 8 Q BUT OCCASIONALLY NOT -- NOT AS A MATTER OF COURSE,
- 9 NOT -- NOT ALWAYS?
- 10 A YES.
- 11 Q ALL RIGHT. NOW, DID MR. DWIGHT EVER NOT GIVE YOU

- 14 UP HERE.

- 16 THE COUNTER THAT HIGH, I DON'T UNDERSTAND.
- 17 A THE COUNTER WASN'T ATTACHED TO IT, IT WAS LIKE ABOUT

- 6 Q SO YOU GOT SPANKED IF YOU DIDN'T ASK AND YOU WET
- 7 YOUR PANTS?
- 8 A YES.
- 9 Q AND YOU GOT SPANKED IF YOU DID ASK?
- 10 A YES. IF WE -- SOMEONE JUST WENT AND THEY -- AFTER
- 11 THAT YOU ASKED AGAIN.
- 12 Q OKAY. SO THEN, BECAUSE YOU WERE GETTING SPANKED
- 13 WHEN YOU ASKED AND WHEN YOU DIDN'T ASK, DID IT MAKE YOU SCARED
- 14 TO ASK?
- 15 **A** YES.
- 16 Q UM -- SO BECAUSE YOU WERE SCARED TO ASK, SOMETIMES
- 17 DID YOU GO IN YOUR PANTS?
- 18 **A** YES.
- 19 MR. MUELLER: OBJECTION, AS TO LEADING.
- 20 **THE COURT:** SUSTAINED.
- 21 BY MS. BLUTH:
- 22 O UM -- WERE THERE EVER ANY TIMES WHEN YOU HAD AN
- 23 ACCIDENT -- UM -- I WAS GOING SAY HAD AN ACCIDENT ON ACCIDENT.
- 24 BUT, I MEAN, WAS THERE EVER A TIME WHERE YOU WENT, PEED IN
- 25 YOUR PANTS OR POOP IN YOUR PANTS ON ACCIDENT, YOU DIDN'T MEAN

- 1 TO?
- 2 A WELL, I REMEMBER THERE WAS THIS ONE TIME -- UM --
- 3 THE DOCTOR HAD GAVE US -- HE GAVE ME MEDICINE TO TAKE OVER THE
- 4 WEEKEND, AND I REALLY HAD TO GO, AND IT HELPS YOUR STOMACH,
- 5 LIKE IT HELPS -- IT HELPS LIKE -- MISS JANET SAID BECAUSE
- 6 THAT -- SHE GAVE ME THE MEDICINE, AND I DIDN'T MAKE IT TO THE
- 7 BATHROOM BECAUSE IT HAD SOMETHING TO DO WITH -- I DON'T KNOW
- 8 WHAT IT WAS, BUT IT HAD -- IT WAS COMING DOWN FAST AND I
- 9 DIDN'T MAKE IT, AND HAD TOLD HER, AND SHE SAID, I UNDERSTAND
- 10 BECAUSE YOU'RE TAKING THE MEDICINE, BUT SHE WAS OKAY WITH THAT
- 11 BECAUSE SHE UNDERSTOOD.
- 12 Q OKAY. SO ON THE TIMES WHEN YOU WERE TOO SCARED TO
- 13 ASK TO GO TO THE BATHROOM, WHAT WOULD HAPPEN?
- 14 A WE'D GET IN TROUBLE FOR NOT SAYING NOTHING.
- 15 Q OKAY. AND THEN IF YOU DIDN'T ASK TO GO TO THE
- 16 BATHROOM, LIKE HOW -- I MEAN, DID YOU JUST WAIT TILL NEXT TIME
- 17 OR DID YOU GO IN YOUR PANTS OR WHAT WOULD HAPPEN?
- 18 A WELL LIKE IF I DIDN'T ASK I WOULD BE ABLE TO HOLD IT
- 19 TILL NEXT TIME, OR IF I HAD TO GO REALLY, REALLY BAD -- UM --
- 20 AND I DIDN'T SAY NOTHING, I WOULD GET IN TROUBLE, BUT LIKE --
- 21 UM -- USUALLY I WOULD HOLD IT FOR A LONG TIME. LIKE IF I HAD
- 22 TO GO JUST A LITTLE BIT -- UM -- I COULD HOLD IT TILL THE NEXT
- 23 BATHROOM BREAK. BUT IF I HAD TO GO REALLY BAD, I COULDN'T, SO
- 24 I HAVE TO GO.
- 25 Q OKAY. SO WOULD YOU EVER FLOOD YOUR PANTS?

- 1 A YES.
- 2 O THE FANS THAT WE'VE TALKED ABOUT, WERE THOSE USED
- 3 ALL YEAR LONG, NO MATTER WHAT IT WAS LIKE OUTSIDE? THE FANS
- 4 THAT WE TALKED ABOUT -- UM -- THAT EVERY --
- 5 A YEAH, I KNOW THE FANS, BUT LIKE IF WE WERE FALLING
- 6 ASLEEP WHILE DOING OUR HOMEWORK WE'D HAVE THE FAN ON US SO WE
- 7 COULD FINISH DOING OUR HOMEWORK, OR IF WE PEED ON OURSELF WE'D
- 8 GET THE FAN TO DRY OFF.
- 9 Q AND YOU TALKED ABOUT THE FANS BEING ON UPSTAIRS WHEN
- 10 YOU WERE SLEEPING?
- 11 **A** YES.
- 12 Q WHEN YOU DIDN'T HAVE -- WHEN YOU JUST HAD YOUR
- 13 UNDERWEAR ON?
- 14 **A** YES.
- 15 Q WERE THOSE USED ALL THE TIME NO MATTER WHAT IT WAS
- 16 LIKE OUTSIDE?
- 17 A SOMETIMES. NOT ALL THE TIME, BUT SOMETIMES SHE PUT
- 18 THE FAN ON US, BUT NOT ALL THE TIME.
- 19 **Q** OKAY.
- 20 UM -- I GUESS WHAT I'M ASKING YOU IS, WERE THE FANS
- 21 JUST USED IN THE HOT MONTHS OR WERE THE FANS USED AS
- 22 PUNISHMENT NO MATTER WHAT TIME OF MONTH -- TIME OF YEAR IT
- 23 WAS.
- 24 A IT WAS JUST -- THEY WERE JUST USED TO STAY UP AND --
- 25 STAY AWAKE TO DO OUR HOMEWORK AND TO DRY OFF. LIKE WHEN WE

- 1 WOULD TAKE A SHOWER OR WHEN WE FLOOD THE BED, THOSE WERE THE
- 2 ONLY TIMES THEY WERE USED.
- 3 Q THAT'S WHAT I'M TALKING ABOUT, WHEN YOU WOULD FLOOD
- 4 THE BED, I'M ASKING IF THE FANS WERE ON YOU --
- 5 A NOT FOR PUNISHMENT, ONLY FOR THOSE REASONS.
- 6 Q EVEN IN THE WINTER?
- 7 A LIKE IF WE DIDN'T GET OUT HOMEWORK DONE, WE -- AND
- 8 WE WERE FALLING ASLEEP, BECAUSE WE WERE FALLING ASLEEP SHE'D
- 9 PUT THE FAN ON US TO KEEP US AWAKE SO WE COULD DO OUR
- 10 HOMEWORK.
- 11 BUT IF WE FLOOD -- LIKE IF WE WENT BATHROOM ON
- 12 OURSELF, SHE'D -- UH -- GO UPSTAIRS AND -- WE'D GO UPSTAIRS
- 13 AND TAKE A SHOWER, AND WE DRY OFF. AND THEN IF WE DIDN'T TAKE
- 14 A SHOWER, SHE'D PUT THE FAN ON US TO DRY OFF.
- 15 **Q** OKAY.
- 16 A NOT ALL -- BUT LIKE THEY WEREN'T USED AS
- 17 PUNISHMENTS, THEY WERE ONLY USED FOR THOSE REASONS.
- 18 Q OKAY. AND THANK YOU FOR CLARIFYING THAT FOR ME.
- 19 WHAT I'M ASKING ABOUT IS SPECIFICALLY AT BEDTIME
- 20 WHEN YOU WERE ON THE BOARDS OR LAYING ON THE TOWEL.
- 21 **A** SOMETIMES LIKE IF WE DID SOMETHING REALLY BAD
- 22 SHE'S -- MISS JANET WOULD DEICIDE IF SHE WANTED THE FAN ON US,
- 23 OR IF WE'D GET THE FAN.
- 24 Q WHILE YOU WERE SLEEPING, IS WHAT I'M TALKING ABOUT.
- 25 **A** YES.

- 1 Q OKAY. AND IF MR. DWIGHT WAS THERE AND MISS JANET
- 2 WASN'T THERE, WOULD MR. DWIGHT CALL MISS JANET, AND MISS JANET
- 3 WOULD TELL HIM HOW IT WOULD GO?
- 4 MR. MUELLER: OBJECTION AS TO WHAT WAS SAID ON A PHONE
- 5 CALL CONVERSATION.
- 6 THE COURT: SUSTAINED, UNLESS SHE CAN LAY SOME
- 7 FOUNDATION.
- 8 BY MS. BLUTH:
- 9 Q WHEN IT WAS BEDTIME AND MR. DWIGHT WAS TAKING CARE
- 10 OF YOU, HOW WOULD IT BE DECIDED IF YOU HAD THE FAN ON OR NOT?
- 11 A WELL, IT DEPENDS, BECAUSE I DON'T KNOW HOW -- I
- 12 DON'T KNOW HOW TO EXPLAIN IT. BECAUSE THEY WEREN'T -- THEY
- 13 WERE USED FOR THOSE REASONS I HAD SAID, BUT -- YEAH, MR.
- 14 DWIGHT WOULD CALL MISS JANET AND THEN ASK HIM WHAT TO DO --
- 15 AND ASK HER WHAT TO DO, I MEAN, AND THEN SHE'D TELL HIM AND
- 16 THEN HE'D DO IT.
- 17 MR. MANN: OBJECTION, FOUNDATION, HEARSAY.
- 18 MS. BLUTH: WELL IT'S STATEMENTS OF --
- 19 THE COURT: WELL IT'S -- I DON'T KNOW IF IT'S OFFERED FOR
- 20 THE TRUTH OF THE MATTER ASSERTED IN IT BEING THAT SHE TOLD HIM
- 21 TO DO IT, IT'S BASED UPON WHAT HE DID NEXT.
- 22 MR. MANN: AND, YOUR HONOR, I --
- 23 THE COURT: BUT FOUNDATION I THINK IS APPROPRIATE.
- 24 MR. MANN: FOUNDATION AS TO KNOWLEDGE.
- 25 **THE COURT:** YEAH.

- 1 MS. BLUTH: SHE JUST SAID SHE -- DID YOU -- DID YOU --
- 2 THE COURT: WELL, SHE DIDN'T -- SHE DIDN'T SAY SHE
- 3 PERSONALLY WITNESSED IT. I THINK MAYBE ASSUMED IT, BUT SHE
- 4 DIDN'T SAY IT SPECIFICALLY.
- 5 BY MS. BLUTH:
- 6 Q DID YOU HEAR MR. DWIGHT HAVE A CONVERSATION WITH
- 7 MISS JANET?
- 8 **A** NO.
- 9 **Q** OKAY.
- 10 A I KNOW THAT LIKE -- LIKE WHEN IT'S LIKE -- THERE WAS
- 11 THIS ONE TIME WHERE MISS JANET WAS GOING SOME WHERE AND SHE
- 12 SAID -- SHE ASKED US, DO YOU HAVE TO GO TO THE BATHROOM, SHE
- 13 SAID -- SHE SAID TO LOOK -- SHE SAID, WELL YOU HAVE TO WAIT
- 14 UNTIL I GET BACK OR IF -- BUT IF YOU CAN'T HOLD IT YOU CAN
- 15 TELL -- TELL -- UM -- MISTER -- DAD, AND THEN -- UM -- YOU CAN
- 16 GO TO THE BATHROOM, BUT I -- I DON'T REMEMBER.
- 17 Q OKAY. I GUESS WHAT I'M ASKING IS, WERE THE FANS
- 18 USED AT NIGHT BY MR. DWIGHT WHEN MISS JANET WASN'T THERE?
- 19 A SOMETIMES -- UM -- THEY WERE LEFT ON.
- 20 **Q** OKAY.
- 21 A BUT I DON'T THINK SO.
- 22 Q OKAY. WELL, WERE THEY LEFT ON OR NOT?
- 23 A WELL, SOMETIMES THEY WERE LEFT ON DURING THE DAY,
- 24 LIKE IF MISS JANET HAD TO GO TO HER -- LIKE LET'S SAY SHE HAD
- 25 TO GO TO AN IMPORTANT MEETING AND WE WERE DOWNSTAIRS -- UM --

- 1 EATING BREAKFAST, THEN WE HAVE TO GO BACK UPSTAIRS TO DO OUR
- 2 HOMEWORK WHILE SHE'S AT HER APPOINTMENT.
- 3 Q UM-HUM.
- 4 A SO THEY WERE LEFT ON SO SHE DOESN'T HAVE TO KEEP
- 5 RUNNING UPSTAIRS AND TURNING THE FAN ON.
- 6 Q OKAY. WHEN WE WERE -- THIS MORNING WHEN WE WERE ON
- 7 WHAT'S CALLED -- WHEN I WAS ASKING THE QUESTIONS THIS MORNING
- 8 FIRST, WHEN WE WERE IN THE OTHER COURTROOM?
- 9 **A** (NO AUDIBLE RESPONSE.)
- 10 Q WE TALKED ABOUT -- UM -- WHEN MISS JANET WAS OUT OF
- 11 TOWN AND MR. DWIGHT WOULD TAKE CARE OF YOU.
- 12 **A** YES.
- 13 Q AND I ASKED YOU SOME QUESTIONS ABOUT BEDTIME; DO YOU
- 14 REMEMBER THAT?
- 15 **A** YES.
- 16 Q AND YOU SAID THAT MR. DWIGHT WOULD TURN THE FANS ON.
- 17 **A** YES.
- 18 O IF MISS JANET TOLD HIM TO.
- 19 **A** YEAH.
- 20 Q OKAY. IS THAT WHAT YOU'RE SAYING?
- 21 **A** YES.
- 22 MR. MANN: OBJECTION, FOUNDATION.
- 23 THE COURT: SUSTAINED. LAY A BETTER FOUNDATION.
- MS. BLUTH: THAT MR. DWIGHT WOULD LEAVE THE FANS ON? I
- 25 MEAN THE -- THE -- JUDGE --

- 1 THE COURT: WELL THAT'S --
- 2 MS. BLUTH: I MEAN THE RELEVANT PART, I'M JUST ASKING
- 3 THAT THE --
- 4 THE COURT: THAT'S PROBABLY TRUE, WHERE HE GOT THE --
- 5 OKAY. THAT'S PROBABLY TRUE, MR. MANN.
- 6 WHO'S OBJECTION WAS IT?
- 7 MR. MANN: IT WAS MY OBJECTION, YOUR HONOR, AND IT WAS
- 8 THE NOT -- EXCUSE ME, I APOLOGIZE. THE QUESTION WAS NOT
- 9 SOLELY DID MR. DWIGHT LEAVE THE FANS ON. THE QUESTION WAS,
- 10 DID MR. DWIGHT LEAVE THE FANS ON BECAUSE MISS JANET TOLD HIM
- 11 TO, AND THAT'S WHAT I'M OBJECTING TO IS THE LAST PART.
- 12 THE COURT: THAT'S CORRECT. SUSTAINED.
- 13 MS. BLUTH: BUT THE REST OF THE ANS -- IS THE REST OF HER
- 14 ANSWER STAND, THAT MIS -- MR. DWIGHT TURNED --
- 15 THE COURT: WHY DON'T YOU JUST REASK THE QUESTION WITHOUT
- 16 THE LACK OF FOUNDATION.
- 17 MS. BLUTH: OKAY.
- 18 Q DID MR. DWIGHT HAVE THE FANS ON AT NIGHTTIME? WAS
- 19 HE -- DID THE FANS BLOW -- WE'RE NOT GOING TO GET INTO THE
- 20 CONVERSATION THAT MR. DWIGHT HAD WITH MISS JANET. BUT DID MR.
- 21 DWIGHT TURN THE FANS ON WITH YOU -- FANS ON YOU AT NIGHT WHEN
- 22 YOU WERE SLEEPING ON THE BOARDS?
- 23 A I DON'T THINK SO, BUT I'M NOT SURE.
- 24 Q OKAY. DO YOU REMEMBER THIS MORNING SAYING THAT HE
- 25 DID?

- 1 A I DON'T REMEMBER.
- 2 MR. MUELLER: OBJECTION, ASKED AND ANSWERED.
- 3 MS. BLUTH: OKAY. WELL SHE SAID --
- 4 THE COURT: SUS --
- 5 MR. MUELLER: IT'S ASKED AND ANSWERED.
- 6 THE COURT: SUSTAINED.
- 7 BY MS. BLUTH:
- 8 Q WHEN ONE OF THE ATTORNEYS WAS ASKING YOU QUESTIONS,
- 9 YOU SAID THAT YOU DESERVED IT, YOU DESERVED GETTING SPANKINGS
- 10 AND BEATINGS WITH THE STICK. WHY DO YOU THINK YOU DESERVED
- 11 IT?
- 12 MR. MUELLER: OBJECTION.
- 13 THE WITNESS: WELL --
- 14 MR. MUELLER: AND NOBODY'S BEAT HER WITH A STICK. THAT'S
- 15 THE TESTIMONY HAS NOT BEEN PRODUCED ON THE STAND.
- 16 MS. BLUTH: REALLY?
- 17 MR. MUELLER: SHE WAS SPANKED.
- 18 MS. BLUTH: BEAT OR SPANKED.
- 19 MR. MUELLER: DID SOMETHING WRONG.
- THE COURT: OKAY. JUST -- MAYBE JUST USE THE TERM HIT,
- 21 WHICH IS A PRETTY NEBULOUS TERM.
- 22 BY MS. BLUTH:
- 23 Q WHEN YOU WERE HIT WITH THE STICKS, YOU SAID THAT YOU
- 24 THOUGHT YOU DESERVED IT.
- 25 **A** YEAH, WHEN I DID SOMETHING WRONG, BUT I DIDN'T

- 1 DESERVE TO GET SPANKED IF I DIDN'T GET MY HOMEWORK RIGHT OR
- 2 WRONG.
- 3 Q OKAY. AND THEN YOU WERE ASKED SOME QUESTIONS
- 4 ABOUT -- UM -- WHEN DANIELLE HIT YOU ON YOUR ARM, YOU SAID YOU
- 5 STOLE, WHAT DID YOU STEAL?
- 6 A THERE WAS -- THERE WAS -- THE FOOD FROM THE PANTRY,
- 7 BUT I CAN'T REMEMBER WHAT WE STOLE, BUT I KNOW -- ALL I KNOW
- 8 THAT ME AND MY SISTERS HAD STOLE, AND THEN WE GOT CAUGHT AND I
- 9 GOT HIT WITH THE PAINT STICK. AND I TRIED TO TELL MISS JANET
- 10 ON THE PHONE, BUT SHE WAS MAKING LOUD NOISES SO I -- SHE
- 11 COULDN'T HEAR, AND SHE WAS ALREADY GONE.
- 12 O AND WHY WERE YOU STEALING FOOD?
- 13 A BECAUSE WE WERE HUNG -- BECAUSE I WAS HUNGRY.
- 14 Q NOW, WHEN -- I'M NOT SURE WHICH ATTORNEY WAS ASKING
- 15 YOU QUESTIONS ABOUT -- UM -- GOING TO THE BATHROOM AT NIGHT,
- 16 AND YOU SAID THAT YOU COULD GO TO BATHROOM AT NIGHT.
- 17 **A** YES.
- 18 Q DID THERE COME A TIME WHEN YOU WEREN'T ALLOWED TO GO
- 19 TO THE BATHROOM AT NIGHT?
- 20 A WHEN THE DOOR -- BATHROOM DOOR WAS LOCKED. CUZ --
- 21 LIKE SHE -- MISS JANET ASKED US DID WE HAVE TO GO TO THE
- 22 BATHROOM -- UM -- BEFORE WE GO TO BED, AND WE'D SAY NO,
- 23 BECAUSE -- WELL, I'D SAY NO BECAUSE I WAS SCARED OF -- TO
- 24 FLOOD THE TOILET BECAUSE I LIKE TO -- YEAH, TO FLOOD THE
- 25 TOILET, SO I'D SAY NO, AND THEN I'D END UP FLOODING THE BED.

- 1 O AND WHEN YOU TERM -- WHEN YOU USE THE TERM FLOODING,
- 2 YOU MEAN PEEING, RIGHT?
- 3 A YES.
- 4 Q LIKE IF YOU SAY FLOOD THE BED, YOU MEAN YOU PEED
- 5 YOUR BED? IS THAT RIGHT?
- 6 A YES.
- 7 Q SO YOU WERE TOO SCARED TO SAY THAT YOU HAD TO GO, SO
- 8 INSTEAD YOU FLOODED YOUR BED?
- 9 **A** YES.
- 10 **Q** UM -- NOW -- SO WHEN DID -- YOU TALKED EARLIER ABOUT
- 11 THE ALARM, WHEN DID THE ALARM START GETTING USED ON THE
- 12 BATHROOM DOOR?
- 13 A IT WAS TO USE -- WELL WE -- EVERY TIME WE WENT TO
- 14 THE BATHROOM THE -- LIKE THEY HAD THIS ALARM WHERE IF YOU
- 15 WANTED THE ALARM TO BE ON, WHEN YOU OPEN THE DOOR, OR IF YOU
- 16 DON'T WANT IT TO BE ON, LIKE IF WE WENT TO THE BATHROOM THE
- 17 ALARM WOULD GO OFF.
- 18 Q OKAY. SO AT NIGHTTIME WAS THE ALARM ON THE DOOR?
- 19 **A** YES.
- 20 MS. BLUTH: COURT'S INDULGENCE.
- 21 (DISCUSSION BETWEEN MS. BLUTH AND MS. LUZAICH.)
- 22 BY MS. BLUTH:
- 23 Q EARLIER YOU SAID THAT -- UM -- SOMETIMES YOU WOULD
- 24 FLOOD YOUR PANTS BECAUSE YOU WERE MAD?
- 25 **A** YES.

- 1 O WHAT WERE YOU MAD ABOUT?
- 2 A WELL, I WAS MAD LIKE IF I GOT SPANKED, BECAUSE I
- 3 COULDN'T GET MY HOMEWORK RIGHT. THAT WAS -- THAT'S -- THAT
- 4 WAS ONE REASON I DID IT. ANOTHER REASON WAS BECAUSE I DIDN'T
- 5 WANT TO BE IN THE HOME.
- 6 Q WHY DIDN'T YOU WANT TO BE IN THE HOME?
- 7 **A** BECAUSE OF THE TREATMENT.
- 8 Q WHAT DO YOU MEAN, WHAT TREATMENT?
- 9 A LIKE THE ARM THING. I WANTED TO TELL -- I TRIED TO
- 10 TELL MISS JANET, BUT I COULDN'T BECAUSE SHE WAS ALREADY GONE
- 11 OFF THE COMPUTER. AND THEN WHEN SHE GOT HOME I TRIED TO TELL
- 12 HER AGAIN BUT ...
- 13 **Q** WHAT OTHER TYPE OF TREATMENT?
- 14 A WELL, THOSE WERE TWO OF THE REASONS. BUT ANOTHER
- 15 REASON WAS BECAUSE SOMETIMES I FELT LIKE I WAS BEING LEFT OUT.
- 16 **Q** OKAY.
- 17 MR. MANN: YOUR HONOR, EXCUSE ME, MAY WE APPROACH,
- 18 PLEASE?
- 19 **THE COURT:** SURE.
- 20 (WHEREUPON ALL COUNSEL APPROACHED THE BENCH.)
- 21 BY MS. BLUTH:
- 22 Q THE MARVELOUS GRACE GIRLS ACADEMY, WAS THAT A
- 23 RELIGIOUS SCHOOL?
- 24 **A** YES.
- 25 Q OKAY. NOW, WERE YOU RELIGIOUS BEFORE YOU WENT TO

- 1 THAT SCHOOL?
- 2 **A** NO.
- 3 Q OKAY. SO YOU LEARNED TO BE RELIGIOUS THERE?
- 4 **A** YES.
- 5 Q OKAY. AND THEN LASTLY, IS IT -- IS YOUR RELIGION
- 6 IMPORTANT TO YOU?
- 7 **A** YES.
- 8 Q LIKE WHEN YOU'RE DOING THINGS FOR FUN, DO YOU READ
- 9 ABOUT GOD OR LISTEN TO SONGS ABOUT GOD FOR FUN?
- 10 MR. MUELLER: OBJECTION. THIS IS WELL BEYOND THE SCOPE
- 11 OF DIRECT OR EVEN CROSS.
- 12 MR. MANN: AND RELEVANCE.
- 13 **THE COURT:** TRUE.
- 14 MS. BLUTH: SHE WENT -- ON CROSS-EXAMINATION SHE DID A
- 15 LENGTHY RELIGIOUS ANSWER TO ONE OF -- MANY OF MR. MANN'S --
- 16 I'M JUST TRYING TO EXPLAIN -- I DON'T THINK IT'S BEYOND THE

- 1 Q AND GO THROUGH AN INVESTIGATION, ALL BECAUSE OF THAT
- 2 LIE IN 2011; CORRECT?
- 3 A YES.
- 4 O OKAY. AND YOU LET THEM GO THROUGH ALL THAT WORK
- 5 BECAUSE OF THAT LIE, CORRECT?
- 6 A YES.
- 7 Q NOW THE -- UM -- TIMER, YOU DIDN'T REALLY CARE ABOUT
- 8 THE TIMER ITSELF, RIGHT?

- 5 Q OKAY. AND YOU ACTUALLY, BACK THEN, HAD AN ISSUE
- 6 WITH VIOLENCE, RIGHT?
- 7 A YES.
- 8 Q UM -- THAT'S ONE OF THE REASONS WHY YOU WENT TO THE
- 9 MONTEVISTA HOSPITAL, RIGHT?
- 10 **A** YES.
- 11 Q OKAY. UM -- NOW, THE BATHROOM -- UM -- YOU HAD
- 12 TALKED ABOUT THE FACT THAT YOU WERE ABLE TO GO TO THE BATHROOM
- 13 AT NIGHT --
- 14 **A** YES.
- 15 **Q** -- WHEN I HAD ASKED YOU?
- 16 **A** YES.
- 17 O AND THEN WHEN MISS BLUTH ASKED YOU, YOU SAID, WELL,

- 10 Q OKAY. AND YOU JUST POINTED TO -- DID YOU POINT TO
- 11 YOUR LEFT WRIST?
- 12 **A** YES.
- 13 Q OR YOU POINT -- DO YOU HAVE A MARK THERE?
- 14 **A** YES.
- 15 MS. BLUTH: OKAY. CAN -- CAN I APPROACH, JUDGE?
- 16 THE COURT: YES.
- 17 MS. BLUTH: CAN I SEE YOU HAND?
- 18 MR. RUE: JUDGE, CAN I APPROACH, TOO?
- 19 THE COURT: YES. NOW EVERYBODY IS GOING TO WANT TO SEE
- 20 YOUR HAND, IT'S OKAY.
- 21 MS. BLUTH: IT'S ALL RIGHT.
- THIS IS MR. MANN AND THIS IS MR. RUE. CAN YOU SHOW THEM
- 23 WHERE THE MARK IS ON YOUR HAND?
- 24 OKAY. AND THAT'S -- UM -- THERE'S TWO MARKS ON HER --
- 25 WHAT'S THIS THING CALLED?

- 1 MR. MANN: A WRIST BONE.
- THE COURT: WELL THE JUDGE WANTS TO SEE, TOO.
- 3 MS. BLUTH: OKAY. TWO MARKS ON HER LEFT WRIST BONE.
- 4 WOULD YOU MIND SHOWING JUDGE YOUR ARM FOR ME? THANK YOU.
- 5 THE COURT: YOU GOT TO COME OVER CLOSER.
- 6 MS. BLUTH: SHE CAN'T SEE.
- 7 THE COURT: MY EYES AREN'T VERY GOOD. WHERE'S -- POINT
- 8 IT OUT. OKAY. ALL RIGHT.
- 9 BY MS. BLUTH:
- 10 Q WHY WAS IT THAT MISS DANIELLE HIT YOU WITH THE RULER
- 11 ON YOUR WRIST, IF YOU REMEMBER.
- 12 A NO, I DON'T REMEMBER.
- 13 Q UM -- NOW, DID MISS DANIELLE HIT YOU ON YOUR BOTTOM,
- 14 TOO, OR JUST YOUR WRIST?
- 15 **A** UM -- SHE -- FIRST SHE -- WHEN WE GOT IN HER ROOM
- 16 SHE HIT ME ON HER BOTTOM -- ON MY BOTTOM, AND THEN I GOT UP
- 17 AND THEN SHE ENDED UP -- AND THEN SHE HIT ME ON MY WRIST.
- 18 Q OKAY. UM -- NOW, WHAT ABOUT WHEN YOU HAD ACCIDENTS,
- 19 DID MISS DANIELLE EVER HIT YOU FOR HAVING ACCIDENTS?
- 20 **A** NO.
- 21 **Q** ALL RIGHT.
- 22 A I DON'T THINK SO.
- 23 Q OKAY. SO HOW MANY TIMES DID MISS DANIELLE HIT YOU
- 24 WITH THE PAINT STICK?
- 25 A ABOUT ONCE OR TWICE.

- OKAY. NOW, WHEN -- UM -- WHEN THE THREE OF THEM --
- 2 OR ACTUALLY SCRATCH THAT QUESTION.
- 3 DID THE PAINT STICKS EVER BREAK WHEN SOMEBODY WAS
- 4 HITTING YOU?
- 5 A YES.
- 6 Q AND WHO WAS IT, IF YOU REMEMBER?
- 7 A IT WAS MISS JANET AND I BELIEVE MR. DWIGHT.
- 8 Q OKAY. AND WHAT WOULD HAPPEN WHEN THE STICK WOULD
- 9 BREAK?
- 10 A UM -- THEY WOULD GET A NEW ONE AND -- BECAUSE THEY
- 11 HAVE -- UH -- PACKS OF THEM.
- 12 Q OKAY. NOW, WHAT WOULD IT FEEL LIKE WHEN YOU WERE
- 13 GETTING SPANKED WITH THAT STICK?
- 14 A IT WAS VERY HARD.
- 15 O AND WHAT WOULD HAPPEN TO YOUR BOTTOM?
- 16 **A** IT WILL BLEED.
- 17 Q HOW DID YOU KNOW IT WOULD BLEED?
- 18 A BECAUSE WHEN I PULLED DOWN MY PANTS IT -- ALL YOU
- 19 SAW WAS BLOOD.
- 20 Q OKAY. NOW, YOU TALKED ABOUT BEING -- THAT YOU WOULD
- 21 HAVE ACCIDENTS.
- 22 A (NO AUDIBLE RESPONSE.)
- 23 Q WHY WAS IT THAT YOU WERE HAVING ACCIDENTS?
- 24 A BECAUSE WHENEVER WE -- WHENEVER I HAD TO GO TO THE
- 25 BATHROOM I WOULD SAY, CAN'T -- WHEN -- WHEN -- MISS JANET WHEN

- 1 I -- WHEN THE TIMES -- UH -- CAN I GO TO THE BATHROOM AND --
- 2 UM -- SHE'LL SAY -- SHE SOMETIMES SHE WON'T ANSWER ME, SHE'LL
- 3 JUST SIT THERE AND WATCH TV. BUT THEN I'LL SAY IT AGAIN,
- 4 BECAUSE IF -- UM -- I DON'T -- IF I DON'T HEAR HER HOW AM I
- 5 SUPPOSE TO KNOW IF SHE'S -- IF SHE KNOWS THAT I HAVE TO GO OR
- 6 NOT. SO THEN I SAID IT AGAIN, AND SHE STILL DIDN'T ANSWER,
- 7 AND THEN I KEPT SAYING IT, SO THEN -- AND THEN I SAID, OKAY, I
- 8 HAVE TO GO REALLY BAD, AND THEN SHE GOT MAD AND THEN -- UM --
- 9 SHE WOULD START TAKING ME UPSTAIRS.
- 10 O OKAY. UM -- WERE YOU EVER SCARED TO ASK IF YOU
- 11 COULD GO?
- 12 **A** YES.
- 13 O WHY?
- 14 A BECAUSE SHE WOULD ALWAYS YELL AT US AND GET MAD AT
- 15 US.
- 16 Q OKAY. NOW, WERE THERE TIMES THAT MR. DWIGHT WAS
- 17 HOME -- UM -- AND MISS JANET WASN'T HOME, SO MR. DWIGHT WAS
- 18 JUST WATCHING YOU?
- 19 **A** YES.
- 20 Q OKAY. WHEN MR. DWIGHT WAS WATCHING YOU, DID
- 21 MISS JANET STILL HAVE RULES ABOUT YOU GOING TO THE BATHROOM?
- 22 **A** YES.
- 23 Q AND SO HOW DID THAT WORK WHEN MR. DWIGHT WAS THERE?
- 24 A WHEN WE HAD TO GO HE WOULD LET US GO AND -- BUT HE
- 25 STILL HAD TO FOLLOW THE RULES.

- 1 Q WELL WHAT WERE THE RULES?
- 2 A IF WE HAD TO GO SH -- SHE -- SOMETIMES SHE WOULDN'T
- 3 EVEN LET US GO UNTIL SHE COMES BACK HOME, SO THEN WE CAN'T
- 4 ASK. SO THEN AFTER WHEN -- WHEN SHE DOESN'T SAY THAT WE CAN'T
- 5 ASK UNTIL SHE COMES HOME --
- 6 **Q** OKAY.
- A -- WE ASK HIM AND THEN HE LET'S US GO.
- 8 Q OKAY. SO IF -- IF MISS JANET TOLD MR. DWIGHT THAT
- 9 YOU GUYS HAD TO WAIT, THAT MEANT YOU HAD TO WAIT?
- 10 **A** YEAH.
- 11 Q UNTIL SHE GOT BACK?
- 12 **A** YES.
- 13 Q SO YOU HAD TO HOLD IT?
- 14 **A** YES.
- 15 Q OKAY. UM -- WHEN YOU WOULD GO TO THE BATHROOM,
- 16 COULD YOU USE AS MUCH TOILET PAPER AS YOU WANTED TO USE?
- 17 **A** NO.
- 18 O OKAY. HOW DID THAT WORK?
- 19 A SHE WOULD, YOU KNOW, WHENEVER WE WOULD GO NO. 1, SHE
- 20 WOULD GIVE US THREE SQUARES. AND THEN WHENEVER WE'D GO NO. 2,
- 21 SHE'LL GIVE US SIX SQUARES. AND IF WE NEEDED MORE, SHE'LL
- 22 GIVE US MORE, CUZ SOMETIMES SHE WOULDN'T GIVE US MORE.
- 23 Q NOW -- UM -- AT NIGHTTIME WHAT WOULD HAPPEN IF YOU
- 24 HAD TO GO TO THE BATHROOM?
- 25 **A** WELL, AT FIRST WE COULD GO AND WE -- SHE'LL

- 1 LAYOUT -- UM -- WE HAD A TABLE IN THERE AND SHE -- AND SHE
- 2 WOULD LAYOUT TWO -- I THINK TWO OR THREE PIECES OF TOILET
- 3 PAPER --
- 4 Q OKAY.
- 5 A -- FOR EACH ONE OF US. AND -- UM -- SHE WOULD --
- 6 AND WE WOULD GO TO THE BATHROOM, AND THEN AT LEAST -- ABOUT
- 7 LIKE COUPLE MONTHS LATER SHE STOPPED IT, AND THEN SHE -- WE
- 8 HAD A -- WE HAD A -- UM -- ASK HER. WE HAD TO KNOCK ON THE
- 9 DOOR AND ASK HER, AND THEN AFTER -- AND THEN AFTER LIKE A
- 10 COUPLE MONTHS AFTER THAT SHE WOULD NOT LET US GO ANYMORE.
- 11 **Q** OKAY.
- 12 A AND WE HAD TO WAIT UNTIL THE MORNING.
- 13 Q OKAY. NOW, WHEN YOU SLEPT, WERE THERE ANY GATES OR
- 14 ALARMS TO KEEP YOU FROM GOING TO THE BATHROOM?
- 15 **A** YES.
- 16 Q WHAT WAS THERE?
- 17 A THERE WAS AN ALARM ON THE DOOR SO EACH TIME WE
- 18 OPENED IT, IT WOULD GO OFF. I MEAN LIKE IT WOULD LIKE SOUND,
- 19 AND THEN -- UM -- THEY -- WE HAD A GATE AND WE COULDN'T GO
- 20 PAST THE BATHROOM, ANYMORE PAST THE BATHROOM, SO -- AND IF WE
- 21 CLIMBED OVER IT SHE WOULD KNOW BECAUSE -- UM -- SHE HAS
- 22 CAMERAS AND SHE KEPT SAYING THAT -- UM -- IT WOULD ELECTROCUTE
- 23 US.
- 24 Q WHEN YOU SAY SHE, ARE YOU TALKING ABOUT MISS JANET?
- 25 **A** YES.

- 1 Q OKAY. UM -- AND I SHOULD HAVE ASKED YOU THIS, I
- 2 APOLOGIZE I FORGOT, BUT WHEN YOU WERE -- UM -- TALKING ABOUT
- 3 GETTING BEAT WITH THE STICK, DID YOU -- WERE YOU EVER TOLD TO
- 4 "GET IN THE POSITION"?
- 5 A YES.
- 6 Q WHAT DOES "GET IN THE POSITION" MEAN?
- A WHEN -- IT'S KIND OF LIKE WHERE YOU GET IN A
- 8 POSITION OF A PUSH UP.
- 9 Q OKAY. SO ARE -- YOU'RE JUST ON THE GROUND?
- 10 **A** YEAH.
- 11 Q AND WHO WOULD SAY "GET IN THE POSITION"?
- 12 **A** MAINLY MR. DWIGHT, AND SOMETIMES MISS JANET.
- 13 Q UM -- WHEN YOU WERE FIRST ADOPTED BY THE SOLANDERS,
- 14 DID YOU GO TO REGULAR SCHOOL OR WERE YOU HOMESCHOOLED?
- 15 **A** UM -- I BELIEVE I WAS IN REG -- REGULAR SCHOOL.
- 16 Q OKAY. AND AT SOME POINT DID YOU START GETTING
- 17 HOMESCHOOLED?
- 18 **A** YES.
- 19 **Q** DO YOU KNOW WHY?
- 20 A UM -- I -- I CAN'T REMEMBER.
- 21 Q OKAY. UM -- WHEN YOU -- I'M SORRY, I'M A LITTLE
- 22 HEAVIER THAN I THOUGHT.
- 23 WHEN YOU -- UM -- STARTED GETTING HOMESCHOOLED, DID
- 24 YOU -- WOULD YOU -- WHERE WOULD YOU SIT IN THE HOUSE TO DO
- 25 YOUR WORK?

- 1 A UM -- WE HAD AN ISLAND IN THE KITCHEN AND WE WOULD
- 2 DO -- WE HAD CHAIRS, AND THEN WE HAD BUCKETS AND THEN -- UM --
- 3 WE WOULD DO OUR HOMEWORK THERE.
- 4 O OKAY. WHAT DID THE BUCKETS LOOK LIKE?
- 5 A THEY HAD -- WE GOT IT FROM HOME DEPOT AND IT SAID
- 6 HOME DEPOT ON IT, HAD A TOILET SEAT ON IT.
- 7 Q ALL RIGHT. AND WHEN YOU SAY WE GOT THE BUCKETS FROM
- 8 HOME DEPOT, WHO'S WE?
- 9 A UM -- MR. DWIGHT.
- 10 Q OKAY. AND THEY HAD -- WHAT -- DID YOU -- WHAT COLOR
- 11 WERE THE BUCKETS?
- 12 A ORANGE.
- 13 Q ORANGE. AND WHEN YOU SAY THEY HAD A SEAT ON THEM,
- 14 CAN YOU EXPLAIN WHAT THE SEAT LOOKED LIKE?
- 15 **A** IT WAS LIKE -- UM -- IT WAS LIKE A REGULAR TOILET
- 16 SEAT, BUT -- EXCEPT FOR IT WAS THE -- THE PART WHERE YOU SIT
- 17 ON, IT WAS TOOKEN OFF AND THEN YOU JUST PUT IT ON THE BUCKET.
- 18 O OKAY. AND WHO PUT THE SEAT ON THE BUCKET?
- 19 **A** MR. DWIGHT.
- 20 Q UM -- AND YOU SAID THAT YOU WOULD HAVE TO SIT ON
- 21 THOSE WHILE YOU WERE DURING YOUR HOMEWORK?
- 22 **A** YES.
- 23 Q SO HOW LONG WOULD YOU HAVE TO SIT ON THEM FOR?
- 24 A PARTICULARLY ALL DAY UNTIL WE GO TO BED.
- 25 Q AND WHO MADE YOU SIT ON THEM?

- 1 **A** MISS JANET.
- 2 O ON THE DAYS WHEN MISS JANET WAS GONE AND IT WAS JUST
- 3 YOU GUYS AND MR. DWIGHT, DID YOU SIT ON -- DID YOU STILL HAVE
- 4 TO SIT ON THE BUCKETS?
- 5 A YES.
- 6 O WHILE YOU WERE LIVING WITH THE SOLANDERS, AFTER YOU
- 7 WERE ADOPTED, WERE YOU ALLOWED TO EAT WHATEVER YOU WANTED?
- 8 **A** NO.
- 9 Q TELL ME WHAT YOU WERE -- WHAT YOU COULD EAT.
- 10 A AT FIRST WE ATE -- UM -- VEGETABLES AND RED BEANS
- 11 AND RICE, AND -- UM -- IN THE MORNING WE'LL EAT EITHER OATMEAL
- 12 OR CEREAL. AND -- UH -- THEN SHE STARTED TO BLEN --
- 13 MISS JANET STARTED TO BLEND UP THE FOOD.
- 14 **Q** OKAY.
- 15 A AND I DON'T KNOW WHAT ELSE SHE PUT IN IT, BECAUSE
- 16 SOMETIMES SHE WOULDN'T PUT RED BEANS AND RICE AND VEGETABLES,
- 17 SOMETIME SHE'LL PUT STUFF THAT I DIDN'T EVEN KNOW WHAT IT WAS.
- 18 Q OKAY. DID SHE EVER TELL YOU WHAT SHE WAS PUTTING IN
- 19 IT?
- 20 A SHE KEPT SAYING THAT WE WERE EATING MICE.
- 21 Q DID YOU BELIEVE HER WHEN SHE TOLD YOU THAT?
- 22 **A** NOT REALLY.
- 23 Q OKAY. UM -- SO WHEN YOU WOULD EAT THE BLENDED FOOD,
- 24 WHEN DID YOU EAT IT? LIKE IN THE MORNING WOULD YOU EAT THE
- 25 BLENDED FOOD?

- 1 A UM -- AT FIRST WE JUST ATE IT -- UM -- THREE TIMES A
- 2 DAY, AND THEN SHE STOPPED DOING THAT AND WE WOULD EAT IT
- 3 SOMETIMES ONE DAY, ONE, ONE PART OF THE DAY, AND SOMETIMES
- 4 WE'LL EAT IT FROM BREAK -- FOR BREAKFAST AND DINNER.
- 5 Q OKAY. SO WERE THERE SOME DAYS WHERE YOU WOULD GET
- 6 BLENDED FOOD AND REGULAR FOOD, OR ONCE YOU STARTED EATING THE
- 7 BLENDED FOOD THAT'S ALL YOU GOT?
- 8 A THAT'S ALL I -- THAT'S ALL WE GOT. BUT THEN ONE DAY
- 9 SHE STARTED TO GIVE US -- UM -- FOR BREAKFAST WE WOULD EAT --
- 10 UM -- OUINOA AND OATMEAL, AND THEN FOR LUNCH WE WOULD HAVE
- 11 CORNBREAD, BEANS AND RICE.
- 12 Q OKAY. AND SO -- UM -- WHAT WOULD HAPPEN IF YOU HAD
- 13 AN ACCIDENT, WOULD YOU STILL GET TO EAT OR DRINK?
- 14 A SOMETIMES SHE WON'T LET US EAT FOR THE REST OF THE
- 15 DAY. SOMETIMES SHE'LL LIKE NOT LET US EAT FOR LIKE TWO DAYS.
- 16 **Q** IF YOU HAD AN ACCIDENT?
- 17 **A** YES.
- 18 Q SO YOU WOULD GO TWO DAYS WITHOUT GETTING TO EAT?
- 19 **A** YES.
- 20 **Q** WERE YOU ALLOWED TO HAVE WATER?
- 21 **A** NO.
- 22 **Q** WERE YOU HUNGRY?
- 23 A I WAS -- YES, I WAS HUNGRY. BUT AT THE SAME TIME
- 24 SHE -- WHEN SHE WAS FEEDING US LIKE THREE FULL CUPS OF THE
- 25 BLENDED FOOL -- UM -- FOOD, IT -- IT GOT -- IT GOT ME

- 1 PRACTICALLY -- I -- IT JUST KEPT GIVING ME STOMACH ACHES.
- 3 A YES.
- 4 O WHAT WOULD HAPPEN IF MR. DWIGHT WAS WATCHING YOU AND
- 5 YOU HAD AN ACCIDENT, WOULD YOU STILL GET TO EAT OR DID YOU NOT
- 6 GET FOOD?
- 7 **A** UM --
- 8 MR. MUELLER: OBJECTION, ASSUMES FACTS NOT IN EVIDENCE.
- 9 THE COURT: SHE JUST ASKED THE QUESTION.
- 10 MR. MUELLER: ASSUMES FACTS THAT -- IT'S SPECULATION.
- 11 SHE HASN'T ESTABLISHED THIS ACTUALLY EVER OCCURRED.
- 12 MS. BLUTH: SHE ALREADY --
- 13 **THE COURT:** OVERRULED.
- 14 BY MS. BLUTH:
- DO YOU WANT ME TO REPEAT THE QUESTION, OR DO YOU
- 16 REMEMBER IT?
- 17 A NO, I DON'T REMEMBER.
- 18 Q OKAY. UM -- SO WHEN MR. DWIGHT WOULD WATCH YOU, AND
- 19 MISS JA -- AND MISS JANET WASN'T THERE, AND YOU HAD AN
- 20 ACCIDENT -- UM -- WOULD MR. DWIGHT STILL GIVE YOU FOOD OR
- 21 WOULD HE NOT LET YOU EAT, EITHER?
- 22 A I CAN'T REMEMBER.
- Q OKAY. DID YOU EVER HAVE TO -- UM -- PUT ANY OF YOUR
- 24 CLOTHES IN YOUR MOUTH?
- 25 **A** YES.

- 1 MR. MANN: OBJECTION LEADING.
- MS. BLUTH: IT DOESN'T SUGGEST AN ANSWER, IT'S A
- 3 QUESTION.
- 4 THE COURT: OVERRULED.
- 5 BY MS. BLUTH:
- 6 Q WHAT CLOTHES DID YOU HAVE TO PUT IN YOUR MOUTH?
- 7 A OUR UNDERWEAR.
- 8 Q WHO MADE YOU PUT YOUR UNDERWEAR IN YOUR MOUTH?
- 9 A MISS JANET.
- 10 Q DO YOU KNOW WHY?
- 11 A BECAUSE SHE GOT MAD AT US, AND -- UM -- WE HAD AN
- 12 ACCIDENT SHE PUT IT IN OUR MOUTH, AND SHE --
- 13 THE COURT: AND YOU'RE USING THE TERM WE AND OUR. DID
- 14 THAT HAPPEN TO YOU, OR YOUR SISTERS, OR EVERYBODY, OR WHAT?
- 15 **THE WITNESS:** ME.
- 16 THE COURT: YOU PERSONALLY?
- 17 **THE WITNESS:** YES.
- 18 THE COURT: OKAY. GO AHEAD.
- 19 BY MS. BLUTH:
- 20 Q SO DID MISS -- WHEN YOU SAY SHE, YOU'RE TALKING
- 21 ABOUT MISS JANET?
- 22 **A** YES.
- 23 Q UM -- AND THE UNDERWEAR THAT YOU PUT IN YOUR MOUTH,
- 24 WERE THOSE THE SAME UNDERWEAR THAT YOU HAD AN ACCIDENT IN?
- 25 **A** YES.

- 1 Q DID YOU EVER SEE YOUR SISTERS HAVE TO DO THAT, OR
- 2 WAS IT JUST YOU?
- 3 A I NEVER SAW THEM. I NEVER SEEN -- UM -- THEM HAVE
- 4 TO DO IT.
- 5 Q ALL RIGHT. AT -- AT YOUR HOUSE WERE YOU ALLOWED TO
- 6 TAKE BATHS OR WERE YOU -- DID YOU TAKE SHOWERS?
- 7 A SHOWERS.
- 8 Q OKAY. TELL ME ABOUT THE SHOWERS YOU WOULD TAKE
- 9 THERE.
- 10 **A** WE WOULD -- WE WOULD TAKE SHOWERS, AND WHENEVER WE
- 11 HAD AN ACCIDENT OR WE WOULD NOT FINISH OUR SCHOOL WORK, SHE
- 12 WOULD -- UM -- GET MAD, AND THEN SHE -- WHEN WE TOOK A SHOWER
- 13 SHE'LL PUT ICE ON US AND THEN -- A BUCKET OF ICE AND THEN
- 14 SHE'LL PUT A FAN ON US -- UM -- AND SHE'LL -- THAT'S HOW WE --
- 15 SHE WOULD -- DRIED OFF.
- 16 Q OKAY. AND WHO'S SHE?
- 17 A MISS JANET.
- 18 Q OKAY. UM -- SO IN THE COLD SHOWER WHAT DID IT FEEL
- 19 LIKE WHEN THE -- WHEN SHE WOULD POUR THE ICE ON YOU?
- 20 A IT WAS COLD, VERY COLD.
- 21 O AND SO WHEN YOU GOT OUT OF THE SHOWER -- UM -- WERE
- 22 YOU EVER GIVEN A TOWEL, OR HOW DID YOU -- DID YOU JUST STAND
- 23 IN FRONT OF THE FAN, EXPLAIN IT TO ME?
- 24 A SOMETIMES SHE WOULD GIVE US -- VERY RARELY SHE WILL
- 25 GIVE US TOWELS.

- 1 **Q** OKAY.
- 2 A AND MOST -- MOST OF THE TIME SHE'LL -- SHE'LL MAKE
- 3 US STAND IN FRONT OF THE FANS.
- 4 Q OKAY. NOW, WHEN YOU GOT OUT OF THE SHOWER -- UM --
- 5 WOULD -- DID ANYBODY CHECK THE SHOWER?
- 6 A YES.
- 7 Q AND WHO WOULD CHECK IT?
- 8 A MISS JANET AND I THINK MR. DWIGHT, TOO.
- 9 Q WHAT WOULD THEY CHECK IT WITH?

- 11 IT -- WHATEVER THERE WAS IN IT, IT WILL TURN GREEN WHEN YOU
- 12 PUT IT ON IT.
- 13 Q OKAY. AND WAS THERE EVER A TIME WHEN YOU GOT OUT OF
- 14 THE SHOWER AND -- AND MISS JANET OR MR. DWIGHT FOUND GREEN?
- 15 A I CAN'T REMEMBER.
- 16 Q OKAY. WHAT ABOUT YOUR UNDERWEAR, DID ANYBODY EVER
- 17 CHECK YOUR UNDERWEAR?
- 18 **A** YES.
- 19 Q WHAT WOULD HAPPEN IF THEY FOUND SOMETHING?
- 20 A UM -- THEY WILL GET MAD AND THEN THEY'LL -- MISS --
- 21 I MEAN MISS JANET SHE WOULD SLAP US OR -- UM -- IF IT'S LIKE
- 22 IN THE MIDDLE OF THE DAY SHE'LL -- UM -- WHILE WE'RE ON THE
- 23 TOILET SHE'LL SLAP US AGAINST THE TOILET AND THEN -- OR EITHER
- 24 THAT AND SHE'LL KICK US.
- 25 Q WHERE WOULD SHE KICK YOU?

- 1 A ON OUR BOTTOM. ON MY BOTTOM.
- Q OKAY. WHILE YOU'RE STANDING OR WALKING, HOW?
- 3 A STANDING.
- 4 Q OKAY. NOW, DID MR. DWIGHT EVER CHECK YOUR
- 5 UNDERWEAR?
- 6 A YES.
- 7 Q AND WHAT WOULD HAPPEN IF MR. DWIGHT FOUND SOMETHING?
- 8 A HE'LL JUST SAY SOMETHING AND -- UM -- HE'LL TELL
- 9 MISS JANET.
- 10 O SO WHAT WOULD HAPPEN IF -- IF MR. DWIGHT FOUND
- 11 SOMETHING AND THEN TOLD MISS JANET WHAT HE FOUND?
- 12 A HE'LL -- SHE'LL GET MAD AND THEN SHE'LL SLAP US AND
- 13 KICK US.
- 14 Q WHERE DID YOU SLEEP IN THE SOLANDER'S HOUSE?
- 15 A IN THE LOFT ON BOARDS.
- 16 Q OKAY. NOW, IS THE LOFT -- IS IT A TWO STORY HOUSE?
- 17 **A** YES.
- 18 Q OKAY. UM -- AND IN -- YOU SAID YOU SLEPT IN THE
- 19 LOFT ON BOARDS. CAN YOU EXPLAIN THE BOARDS TO ME?
- 20 A UM -- THEY WERE BLUE AND -- UM -- THEY HAD OUR NAMES
- 21 ON IT.
- 22 Q AND LIKE HOW WAS IT WRITTEN ON IT, WAS IT MARKER OR?
- 23 A UM -- SHARPIE.
- 24 Q OKAY. AND WHO WROTE YOUR NAMES ON THEM?
- A MR. DWIGHT.

- 1 Q OKAY. SO DID EACH OF YOU AND YOUR SISTER HAVE A
- 2 SEPARATE BOARD? LIKE ONE BOARD FOR EACH OF YOU?
- 3 **A** YES.
- 4 Q OKAY. AND WHEN YOU WOULD SLEEP ON THE BOARDS IN THE
- 5 LOFT, WERE YOU ALLOWED TO HAVE ANY SHEETS OR COVERS?
- A NO. BUT SOMETIMES SHE'LL GIVE US A PILLOW. AND
- 7 SOME -- ONE -- UM -- ONE DAY SHE STARTED TO GIVE US THESE --
- 8 YOU KNOW HOW HOTELS HAVE THESE -- UH -- THOSE BEDS IN THE
- 9 COUCHES.
- 10 O LIKE A PULL -- LIKE A --
- 11 **A** YEAH.
- 12 **Q** -- POP UP BED?
- 13 A YEAH. UM -- SHE ORDERED THOSE AND -- UM --
- 14 SHE'LL -- SHE HAD US SLEEP ON THOSE, AND THEN SHE STOPPED IT,
- 15 AND THEN SHE MADE US SLEEP ON THE BOARDS AGAIN.
- 16 Q OKAY. UM -- NOW, WHEN YOU WERE SLEEPING ON THE
- 17 BOARDS, DID YOU GET TO WEAR PAJAMAS?
- 18 A NO, WE ONLY -- SOMETIMES WE ONLY GOT TO WEAR A SHIRT
- 19 AND OUR UNDERWEAR, AND SOMETIMES WE'D JUST WEAR OUR UNDERWEAR
- 20 TO BED.
- 21 Q OKAY. WERE YOU COLD?
- 22 **A** YES.
- 23 Q UM -- WERE THERE ANY FANS UPSTIRS IN THE LOFT?
- 24 **A** YES.
- 25 Q AND WHEN YOU WERE SLEEPING ON THE BOARDS IN YOUR

- 1 UNDERWEAR, WERE THE FANS ON OR OFF?
- 2 **A** ON.
- 3 O AND WHO WOULD TURN THE FANS ON?
- 4 A MISS JANET.
- 5 Q NOW, WHEN IT WAS BED TIME -- WAS THERE EVER A
- 6 TIME -- UM -- WHEN MISS JANET WENT OUT OF TOWN AND SO IT WAS
- 7 JUST YOU GUYS AND MR. DWIGHT?
- 8 A YEAH, AND WE HAD AN -- AN -- A NANNY, AND SHE WAS
- 9 THERE HALF OF THE TIME, AND THEN WE HAD ANOTHER NANNY, SHE WAS
- 10 THERE FOR THE REST OF THE TIME.
- 11 O OKAY. SO WHEN MR. DWIGHT WAS TAKING CARE OF YOU AT
- 12 NIGHT, DID YOU STILL SLEEP ON THE BOARDS?
- 13 A WHEN SHE WAS ON VACATION?
- 14 Q UM -- WHEN MISS JANET WAS GONE, YEAH, ON VACATION,
- 15 MR. DWIGHT WAS THERE, DID YOU STILL SLEEP ON THE BOARDS?
- 16 A NO, WE HAD -- UH -- THE PULL UP BEDS, THE POP UP
- 17 BEDS.
- 18 Q OKAY. NOW, WAS -- UM -- MR. DWIGHT EVER HOME WHEN
- 19 YOU WERE SLEEPING ON THE BOARDS?
- 20 **A** YES.
- 21 Q OKAY. AND WHEN THE FANS WERE ON YOU?
- 22 **A** YES.
- 23 Q DID YOU HAVE AN INJURY TO THE BACK OF YOUR EAR AND
- 24 YOUR SHOULDER?
- 25 **A** YES.

- 1 Q CAN YOU TELL ME HOW YOU GOT THAT?
- 2 A UM -- ONE DAY I WAS CLEANING UP THE DOGS BATHROOM,
- 3 AND THEN -- UM -- AFTER THAT I CAME BACK IN AND THEN SHE MADE
- 4 ME WASH MY HANDS, MISS JANET MADE ME WASH MY HANDS, AND THEN
- 5 IT WAS REALLY HOT SO THEN I JUMPED OUT, I LIKE JERKED MY HANDS
- 6 OUT, AND THEN SHE GOT MAD AND THEN SHE SQUEEZED BY ARMS AND
- 7 MADE ME COME -- GO, PUT MY HANDS IN THERE. AND WE HAD A
- 8 CANDLE IN THERE AND -- UM -- SHE WOULD TAKE THE LID AND SHE
- 9 WOULD FILL IT UP WITH THE WATER AND SHE WOULD SPLASH IT ON MY
- 10 FACE, AND THEN -- UM -- I KEPT CRYING, AND SHE GOT -- SHE SAID
- 11 TO STOP CRYING. SO THEN I WOULDN'T STOP CRYING BECAUSE IT --
- 12 THEY KEPT HURTING -- UM -- IT KEPT HURTING, SO THEN MISS JANET
- 13 PICK ME UP AND THEN SHE -- SHE LIKE TRIED TO PUT MY WHOLE BODY
- 14 IN THE SINK SO THEN THEY -- SHE GOT MY -- THIS SIDE OF MY BACK
- 15 AND I BELIEVE THIS SIDE OF MY EAR.
- 16 Q OKAY. WHAT BATHROOM WERE YOU IN?
- 17 **A** DOWNSTAIRS.
- 18 Q OKAY. AND WHERE WERE YOUR SISTERS WHEN THIS WAS
- 19 GOING ON?
- 20 A UM -- IN THE KITCHEN TRYING -- READING THEIR SCHOOL
- 21 WORK.
- 22 Q OKAY. AND DO YOU STILL HAVE THOSE SCARS TODAY?
- 23 A UM -- YOU CAN'T REALLY SEE ON THE EAR.
- 24 **Q** OKAY.
- 25 **A** BUT YOU CAN REALLY SEE ON THE BACK.

- 1 Q OKAY. CAN I COME UP AND LOOK?
- 2 A YES.
- 3 MS. BLUTH: OKAY. YOU GUYS WANT TO LOOK?
- 4 I'M GOING TO LET MR. RUE AND -- UM -- MR. MANN, I DON'T
- 5 KNOW IF MR. MUELLER IS COMING.
- 6 WOULD YOU MIND TURNING AROUND SO I CAN SHOW
- 7 EVERYBODY AND THEN WE'LL SHOW JUDGE? OKAY. WE'LL SHOW JUDGE
- 8 LAST, OKAY?
- 9 THE COURT: I'M ALWAYS LAST.
- 10 MS. BLUTH: YEAH. SO -- UM -- AM I -- RIGHT HERE?
- 11 **THE WITNESS:** (NO AUDIBLE RESPONSE.)
- 12 BY MS. BLUTH:
- 13 **Q** IS THAT A YES?
- 14 **A** YES.
- 15 Q OKAY. SO I'M GOING TO SAY A --
- 16 MR. MANN: INCH?
- 17 MS. BLUTH: TWO?
- 18 MR. MANN: INCH AND A HALF.
- 19 MS. BLUTH: INCH AND A HALF, TWO INCHES, JUDGE, FROM THE
- 20 RIGHT SHOULDER BLADE INTO THE BACK OF THE ARMPIT, AND THEN --
- 21 I DON'T KNOW IF THERE'S -- THERE IS SOME -- UM -- THERE'S A
- 22 WHITE SCAR ABOUT AN INCH LONG UNDERNEATH THE RIGHT EAR.
- MR. MUELLER, CAN YOU SEE?
- 24 MR. MUELLER: I CANNOT SEE. OKAY, THANK YOU.
- 25 MS. BLUTH: OKAY?

- 1 AND THEN WE'RE GOING TO SHOW THE JUDGE, OKAY?
- 2 THE COURT: OKAY.
- 3 MS. BLUTH: SHOW HER YOUR EAR.
- 4 THE COURT: OKAY.
- 5 MS. BLUTH: OKAY. GO AHEAD AND SIT DOWN, SWEETHEART.
- 6 SHE WANTS MISS ALISON.
- 7 THE COURT: OH, OKAY. SURE, NO WORRIES.
- 8 DO YOU WANT TO TAKE A BREAK OR YOU JUST WANT MISS ALISON
- 9 UP HERE?
- 10 THE WITNESS: MISS ALISON UP HERE.
- 11 THE COURT: SURE. YOU'RE BEING PAGED.
- 12 MS. BLUTH: SHE'S GOING TO SIT OVER HERE, OKAY?
- THE COURT: SHE'S GOING ON SIT RIGHT BEHIND YOU, OKAY?
- 14 BY MS. BLUTH:
- 15 O NOW, DID YOU EVER GET TO SEE A DOCTOR OR GET
- 16 TREATMENT FOR THOSE BURNS?
- 17 A I DID NOT SEE A DOCTOR, BUT -- UM -- SHE DID PUT
- 18 STUFF ON IT, AND I DON'T KNOW WHAT THE STUFF WAS.
- 19 Q UM -- WHO PUT STUFF ON IT?
- 20 **A** MISS JANET.
- 21 Q OKAY. DID THAT HURT PRETTY BADLY?
- 22 **A** YES.
- 23 Q NOW -- UM -- DID YOU EVER HAVE ANY ACCIDENTS WITH
- 24 POOP IN THE BUCKETS?
- 25 **A** YES.

- 1 Q OR IN THE SMALL POTTY?
- 2 **A** YEAH.
- 3 Q AND WHAT HAPPENED AFTER YOU HAD THAT ACCIDENT?
- 4 A SHE WOULD GET MAD AND THEN SHE'LL MAKE ME CLEAN IT
- 5 UP, MISS JANET, AND THEN -- UM -- SHE'LL GIVE ME A SPANKING,
- 6 AND THEN SHE'LL START SLAPPING ME AND KICKING ME.
- 7 Q OKAY. UM -- DID THERE EVER COME A TIME WHERE YOU
- 8 HAD TO EAT OR DRINK YOUR PEE OR POOP?
- 9 A IT WASN'T REALLY EATING OR DRINKING. SHE WOULD
- 10 LIKE -- ONE TIME SHE TOOK MY HEAD AND THEN SHE PUT IT IN THE
- 11 TOILET AFTER I WENT TO THE BATHROOM, AND SHE'LL LIKE TAKE OUR
- 12 UNDERWEAR AND BALL IT UP AND THEN STUFF IT IN OUR MOUTH.
- 13 Q OKAY. THE TIME THAT MISS JANET GOT MAD AT YOU AND
- 14 STUCK YOUR HEAD IN THE TOILET IN THE POOP, WHY DID SHE DO
- 15 THAT?
- 16 A I DON'T KNOW.
- 17 **Q** WERE YOU IN TROUBLE?
- 18 A I CAN'T REMEMBER.
- 19 Q OKAY. AND WHAT --
- 20 MR. MANN: YOUR HONOR, CAN WE GET A FOUNDATION TO TIME,
- 21 EVERYTHING IS SO --
- 22 THE COURT: YOU CAN --
- 23 MR. MANN: -- ARBITRARY.
- 24 MS. BLUTH: SURE.
- THE COURT: WELL, I UNDERSTAND THAT, BUT CAN YOU TRY TO

- 1 LAY A TIMEFRAME.
- 2 MS. BLUTH: SURE.
- 3 O UM -- EVERYTHING WE'VE TALKED ABOUT SO FAR, WAS THIS
- 4 BEFORE OR AFTER YOU GOT ADOPTED?
- 5 A I BELIEVE -- UM -- AFTER WE GOT ADOPTED.
- 6 Q OKAY. AND THE TIME THAT -- UM -- MISS JANET STUCK
- 7 YOUR HEAD IN THE TOILET -- UM -- AND -- AND WHEN THE POOP WAS
- 8 IN THE TOILET, DO YOU KNOW HOW LONG AGO THAT WAS OR HOW OLD
- 9 YOU WERE WHEN THAT HAPPENED?
- 10 A UM -- I THINK I WAS EIGHT. I CAN'T REMEMBER REALLY.
- 11 Q OKAY. DID IT HAPPEN AFTER YOU WERE ADOPTED?
- 12 **A** YES.
- 13 Q DID IT HAPPEN AT THE HOUSE ON WAKASHAN, OR THE --
- 14 THE SECOND HOUSE YOU LIVED IN?
- 15 **A** YES.
- 16 Q UM -- NOW, WHEN YOU WOULD DO YOUR HOMEWORK, WHILE
- 17 YOU WERE BEING HOMESCHOOLED, WHO WAS IT THAT HOMESCHOOLED YOU?
- 18 **A** MISS JANET.
- 19 Q AND HOW WOULD THE HOMESCHOOLING WORK? LIKE TELL ME
- 20 WHAT A DAY WOULD -- WOULD BE LIKE?
- 21 A PRACTICALLY WE JUST -- UM -- SAT DOWN AND DID OUR
- 22 HOMEWORK -- I MEAN SCHOOL WORK ALL DAY, WE DIDN'T DO ANYTHING
- 23 ELSE.
- 24 Q OKAY. BUT I MEAN WOULD SOMEONE TEACH YOU, LIKE THIS
- 25 IS THE LESSON, THIS IS WHAT YOU'RE LEARNING --

- 1 **A** NO.
- 2 -- OR DID YOU JUST READ BOOKS ALL DAY AND STUDY?
- 3 A WE -- SHE WOULD GIVE US PAPERS AND WE'LL JUST DO IT.
- 4 O OKAY. SO WAS ANYBODY TEACHING YOU?
- 5 A NO. IT WAS -- WE JUST HAD BOOKS WHERE IT WOULD --
- 6 WHERE SHE WOULD RIP IT OUT OF THE BOOK AND SHE'LL GIVE THIS --
- 7 GIVE IT TO US, AND THEN WE HAVE TO DO IT.
- 8 Q OKAY. WHAT WOULD HAPPEN IF YOU GOT ANY OF YOUR
- 9 HOMEWORK OR YOUR SCHOOL WORK WRONG?
- 10 A SHE'LL GET MAD AND THEN -- UM -- SHE'LL -- SHE'LL --
- 11 UM -- START LIKE BLASTING OFF, BECAUSE WE DIDN'T -- WE
- 12 COULDN'T UNDERSTAND. AND SO THEN -- UM -- SHE'LL START
- 13 SLAPPING US AND KICKING US, BECAUSE WE DIDN'T KNOW THE ANSWER.
- 14 Q OKAY. WHEN YOU SAY SHE WOULD SLAP YOU AND KICK YOU,
- 15 WHERE WOULD SHE SLAP YOU?
- 16 A ON OUR FACE. ON MY FACE.
- 17 Q OKAY. AND WHEN YOU SAY SHE, YOU'RE TALKING ABOUT
- 18 MISS JANET?
- 19 **A** YES.
- 20 Q AND WHERE WOULD SHE KICK YOU?
- 21 A ON MY BOTTOM.
- 22 Q UM -- NOW, DID -- WAS THERE EVER A TIME WHEN YOU GOT
- 23 INJURED ON THE STAIRS?
- 24 **A** YES.
- 25 **Q** HOW DID THAT HAPPEN?

- 1 A UM -- WELL, I WAS WALKING DOWNSTAIRS, SHE WAS
- 2 KICKING ME. AND WHILE I WAS -- LIKE SHE KEPT KICKING ME, SO I
- 3 WASN'T REALLY ABLE TO WALK DOWN THE STAIRS.
- 4 Q OKAY.
- 5 A SO THEN I -- I FELL, AND THEN SHE -- AND I -- I WAS
- 6 BLEEDING ON MY LIP, AND SO THEN SHE TOOK MY SHIRT AND WIPED IT
- 7 ON MY -- WIPED MY LIP ON MY SHIRT.
- 8 Q SO WHO WAS IT THAT KICKED YOU ON THE STAIRS?
- 9 A MISS JANET.
- 10 Q OKAY. DO YOU KNOW WHY YOU WERE GETTING KICKED?
- 11 A I DO NOT REMEMBER.
- 12 Q OKAY. NOW, DO YOU KNOW WHAT A CATHETER IS?
- 13 **A** YES.
- 14 Q WHAT DOES IT LOOK LIKE? WHAT DOES ONE LOOK LIKE?
- 15 HAVE YOU EVER SEEN ONE?
- 16 **A** YES.
- 17 O CAN YOU EXPLAIN TO ME WHAT IT LOOKS LIKE?
- 18 A IT'S A NEEDLE, AND IT HAS A LITTLE TUBE, AND IT HAS
- 19 A BAG ON -- IT HAS A BAG CONNECT TO THE TUBE. AND -- WELL
- 20 WHENEVER YOU PUT IT IN YOUR PRIVATE AND THEN -- UM -- IT TAKES
- 21 ALL OF IT OUT, AND THEN IT FILLS IT UP IN THE BAG.
- 22 O HOW DO YOU KNOW WHAT A CATHETER IS?
- 23 A BECAUSE MISS JANET DID ONE ON ME.
- 24 Q OKAY. UM -- WHEN MISS JANET WOULD USE THE CATHETER
- 25 ON YOU -- FIRST OF ALL, DID THAT HAPPEN ONE TIME OR MORE THAN

- 1 ONE TIME?
- 2 A MORE THAN ONE TIME.
- OKAY. SO IN WHAT ROOM OR ROOMS IN THE HOUSE WOULD
- 4 SHE USE THE CATHETER?
- 5 A IN -- UM -- ME AND AMAYA'S OLD BEDROOM, AND IN THE
- 6 UPSTIRS BATHROOM AND IN THE LOFT.
- 7 O OKAY. SO EXPLAIN TO ME THE PROCESS BY WHICH SHE
- 8 WOULD USE THE CATHETER ON YOU? CAN YOU WALK ME THROUGH HOW
- 9 THAT WOULD WORK?
- 10 A I DON'T UNDERSTAND.
- 11 Q SO WHEN MISS -- UM -- WHEN MISS JANET WOULD USE THE
- 12 CATHETER ON YOU, LET'S TALK ABOUT THE BATHROOM. SO YOU --
- 13 WOULD THE TWO OF YOU BE IN THE BATHROOM ALONE?
- 14 **A** YES.
- 15 Q OKAY. AND THE DOOR BE OPEN OR SHUT?
- 16 A OPENED.
- 17 O OKAY. UM -- AND THEN WHERE WOULD YOU GO IN THE
- 18 BATHROOM? WOULD YOU SIT OR STAND OR LAY DOWN?
- 19 A I WOULD LAY DOWN.
- 20 Q OKAY. WHAT WOULD YOU LAY ON?
- 21 A A TOWEL.
- 22 Q SO ONCE YOU LAID DOWN, WHAT WOULD HAPPEN?
- 23 A SHE WOULD PUT THE CATH -- CATHETER IN ME.
- 24 Q OKAY. WHERE WOULD SHE PUT IT?
- 25 A IN MY PRIVATE.

- 1 Q UM -- AND THEN WOULD ANYTHING COME OUT OF THE
- 2 CATHETER?
- 3 A YES.
- 4 Q WHAT WOULD COME OUT?
- 5 **A** MY BATHROOM.
- 6 Q YOUR BATHROOM? LIKE PEE?
- 7 A YES.
- 8 Q AND IF PEE CAME OUT, WOULD YOU BE IN TROUBLE, OR
- 9 WHAT WOULD HAPPEN?
- 10 A I'LL BE IN TROUBLE.
- 11 Q WHAT -- WHAT DOES THAT MEAN, IF YOU'RE IN TROUBLE,
- 12 WHAT HAPPENS?
- 13 A UM -- I'LL -- SHE'LL SAY -- SHE'LL PRACTICALLY SAY
- 14 THAT I DIDN'T ASK TO GO TO THE BATHROOM, AND I WAS SCARED TO
- 15 BECAUSE SHE KEPT YELLING AT ME IF I ASKED TO GO. AND
- 16 SHE'LL -- UM -- SOMETIMES WHEN SHE'S LIKE REALLY MAD, SHE'LL
- 17 TAKE THE NEEDLE AND LIKE MOVE IT AROUND LIKE EVERYWHERE.
- 18 **Q** IN YOUR PRIVATE?
- 19 **A** YES.
- 20 **Q** DID THAT HURT?
- 21 **A** YES.
- Q OKAY. WHEN YOU SAID THAT SHE GOT MAD BECAUSE YOU
- 23 DIDN'T ASK.
- 24 **A** YES.
- 25 Q BUT YOU SAID EARLIER THAT SOMETIMES YOU WOULD GET IN

- 1 TROUBLE WHEN YOU DID ASK.
- 2 A YES, BECAUSE SHE WOULD LIKE GET MAD BECAUSE WE HAD
- 3 TO GO TO THE BATHROOM, AND WHAT AM I SUPPOSE TO DO, I HAVE TO
- 4 GO, I HAVE TO GO.
- 5 Q OKAY. NOW, YOU SAID THAT THAT HAPPENED WITH
- 6 MISS JANET IN THE BATHROOM IN YOUR AND AMAYA'S BEDROOM, IN
- 7 YOUR OLD BEDROOM?
- 8 A UM-HUM.
- 9 Q BUT IN THAT SAME HOUSE ON WAKASHAN?
- 10 **A** YES.
- 11 Q AND THEN IN THE LOFT?
- 12 **A** YES.
- 13 Q SO IT HAPPENED AT LEAST THREE TIMES THAT YOU CAN
- 14 REMEMBER?
- 15 **A** YES.
- 16 Q UM -- NOW, DO YOU KNOW WHO BOUGHT THOSE CATHETERS?
- 17 A MR. DWIGHT.
- 18 Q OKAY. UM -- AND WHERE WAS MR. DWIGHT WHEN
- 19 MISS JANET WAS USING THEM ON YOU?
- 20 A UM -- ONE TIME HE WAS AT THE DOORWAY, BUT HE WASN'T
- 21 LOOKING AT ME. AND -- UM --



- 12 O MA'AM, WHAT DO YOU DO FOR A LIVING?
- 13 A I'M A PEDIATRICIAN AT SUNRISE CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL,
- 14 AS WELL AS AT SOUTHERN NEVADA CHILDREN'S ASSESSMENT CENTER.
- 15 **Q** OKAY.
- 16 A UM -- AND I WORK IN TWO BASIC AREAS, AS A CHILD
- 17 ABUSE PEDIATRICIAN, AS WELL AS AN E.R. PHYSICIAN.
- 18 Q CAN YOU DESCRIBE FOR THE COURT WHAT TRAINING,
- 19 EDUCATION YOU HAVE THAT QUALIFIES YOU TO DO THAT?
- 20 A UM -- I ATTENDED -- UH -- UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA,
- 21 LOS ANGELES -- UM -- AND EARNED A BACHELOR'S DEGREE IN
- 22 NEUROSCIENCE. UM -- AFTER WHICH, I ATTENDED MEDICAL SCHOOL AT
- 23 UNIVERSITY OF VERMONT, A FOUR-YEAR PROGRAM, AT THE END OF
- 24 WHICH I WAS A MEDICAL DOCTOR.
- 25 I NEXT ATTENDED A SPECIALTY PEDIATRIC RESIDENCY AT

- 1 THE UNIVERSITY OF NEVADA IN THE LAS VEGAS PROGRAM. UM -- AND
- 2 AFTER WHICH, I SPENT ABOUT SIX MONTHS IN AN APPRENTICESHIP
- 3 WITH A CHILD ABUSE PEDIATRICIAN, AND THEN CONTINUED -- UH --
- 4 WORKING IN THAT FIELD.
- 5 O AND WHAT HAVE YOU BEEN DOING SINCE YOUR -- UH --
- 6 APPRENTICESHIP FINISHED?
- 7 A UM -- SO I EVALUATE ANY CONCERNS OF CHILD ABUSE
- 8 AND/OR NEGLECT, IN ADDITION TO TAKING SHIFTS IN THE EMERGENCY
- 9 DEPARTMENT AS JUST A E.R. DOCTOR.
- 10 Q AND HAVE YOU TESTIFIED AS AN EXPERT IN THE EIGHTH
- 11 JUDICIAL COURTS IN BOTH FAMILY COURT AND CRIMINAL COURT AS A
- 12 PEDIATRICIAN, AS WELL AS A CHILD ABUSE EXPERT?
- 13 **A** YES.
- 14 Q NOW, CAN YOU DESCRIBE FOR US, YOU SAID YOU WORKED
- 15 BOTH AT SUNRISE CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL AND THE SNCAC. WHAT DO
- 16 YOU DO AT SUNRISE CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL?
- 17 A AT SUNRISE CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL, WHEN -- UM -- A
- 18 CHILD COMES IN AND SEES ONE OF OUR PHYSICIAN STAFF DUE TO
- 19 CONCERNS -- UH -- WHATEVER THEY COME IN FOR, AND THERE MAY BE
- 20 CONCERNS OF SEXUAL ABUSE, NEGLECT OR PHYSICAL ABUSE -- UM --
- 21 ONE OF THE PHYSICIANS OR A SOCIAL WORKER MAY CONTACT ME AND
- 22 CONSULT FOR ME TO CONTINUE THE EVALUATION AS A CONSULTANT. SO
- 23 THAT MAY TAKE PLACE IN THE EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT, THAT MAY TAKE
- 24 PLACE IN THE PEDIATRIC FLOOR OR THE INTENSIVE CARE UNIT.
- 25 Q AS THE CHILD ABUSE PEDIATRICIAN -- UM -- DO YOU SEE

- 1 EVERY CHILD, OR ARE THERE SITUATIONS WHERE YOU'RE ASKED TO
- 2 REVIEW MEDICAL RECORDS FOR -- UM -- OTHER INDIVIDUALS?
- 3 A UM -- EITHER, EITHER WAY. SO I -- I SEE A GREAT
- 4 MAJORITY OF THEM, AND THEN ANOTHER PART OF WHAT I DO WITH WORK
- 5 IS TO STAFF -- UH -- CHILDREN, THE MEDICAL CONCERNS OF
- 6 CHILDREN THAT MAY HAVE NOT GONE THROUGH EITHER MY FACILITY OR
- 7 BEEN IN AN OUTSIDE FACILITY, OR NOT IN MEDICAL CARE AT THAT
- 8 TIME.
- 9 OKAY. UM -- YOU MENTIONED THAT YOU ALSO TAKE SHIFTS
- 10 AT THE SUNRISE CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL. CAN YOU DESCRIBE WHAT YOU
- 11 DO THERE?
- 12 **A** UM -- I WORK AS AN EMERGENCY ROOM PHYSICIAN JUST
- 13 SEEING WHATEVER COMES THROUGH THE DOOR.
- 14 Q OKAY. SO YOU DON'T ONLY WORK ON CHILD ABUSE CASES,
- 15 YOU SEE KIDS FOR OTHER CONCERNS AS WELL?
- 16 **A** CORRECT.
- 17 Q AND THEN YOU SAID THAT YOU WORK AT THE SNCAC. CAN
- 18 YOU DESCRIBE FOR THE COURT VERY BRIEFLY WHAT IS THE SNCAC?
- 19 A THE SNCAC IS A -- IT'S A --
- 20 MR. MUELLER: MAY I ASK THE WITNESS TO SLOW DOWN JUST A
- 21 LITTLE BIT ON THE JARGON, I CAN'T WRITE AS FAST AS THEY CAN
- 22 TALK. WHAT -- WHAT IS --
- 23 THE COURT: OKAY, WELL --
- 24 MR. MUELLER: S, WHAT IS IT?
- 25 THE WITNESS: SOUTHERN NEVADA CHILDREN'S ASSESSMENT

- 1 CENTER.
- 2 MR. MUELLER: ALL RIGHT. THANK YOU.
- 3 THE WITNESS: SURE.
- 4 UM -- SO THE SNCAC OR THE CAC -- UM -- IS A -- KIND OF A
- 5 ONE-STOP SHOP FOR KIDS WHEN THERE COMES TO CONCERNS OF CHILD
- 6 ABUSE. SPECIFICALLY, MY CLINIC -- UM -- FOCUSES ON
- 7 NON-EMERGENT CONCERNS OF CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE.
- 8 FOR INSTANCE, IF A CHILD HAS ANY CONCERNS, HAS DISCLOSED
- 9 SOMETHING MAYBE INAPPROPRIATE HAS HAPPENED, OR SOMETHING LIKE
- 10 THAT, AND SOMEBODY HAS CONCERNS, THEN THEY CAN MAKE
- 11 APPOINTMENTS -- UM -- WHICH WE HAVE FOR TWICE A WEEK.
- 12 UM -- IN ADDITION, IF THERE ARE CONCERNS OF SEXUAL ABUSE
- 13 AND/OR PHYSICAL ABUSE AND NEGLECT, THEN I CAN SEE THEM THERE,
- 14 AS WELL. THE MAJOR DIFFERENCE IS THAT WE DON'T COLLECT ANY
- 15 FORENSIC EVIDENCE. WE DON'T -- UM -- SEE KIDS WHO HAVE
- 16 EMERGENT OR REQUIRING MEDICAL TREATMENT AT THAT MOMENT FOR
- 17 ANYTHING THAT YOU WOULD SEE, LET'S SAY, IN A HOSPITAL.
- 18 BY MS. LUZAICH:
- 19 Q AND WHEN YOU TALK ABOUT BEING A CHILD ABUSE
- 20 PEDIATRICIAN, IS THAT ONLY PHYSICAL ABUSE, ONLY SEXUAL ABUSE,
- 21 A COMBINATION OF THE TWO?
- 22 A IT CAN BE A COMBINATION -- UM -- ALSO COULD INCLUDE
- 23 NEGLECT AS WELL.
- 24 Q OKAY. WHEN YOU SEE THE KIDS AT SUNRISE CHILDREN'S
- 25 HOSPITAL, DO YOU -- YOU TALKED ABOUT COLLECTING FORENSIC

- 1 EVIDENCE. IS THAT THE ONLY DIFFERENCE IN HOW THE KIDS ARE
- 2 TREATED AT SUNRISE AS OPPOSED TO AT THE CAC?
- 3 A THAT'S A MAJOR DIFFERENCE, YES.
- 4 Q SO WHEN THE KIDS COME INTO THE CAC -- WELL, CAN YOU
- 5 DESCRIBE WHAT THE CAC BUILDING IS, FOR THOSE HERE WHO HAVE NOT
- 6 BEEN THERE?
- 7 **A** SURE.
- 8 IT'S A LOCKED FACILITY -- UM -- THAT IS SET UP FOR
- 9 CHILDREN WHEN THERE ARE CONCERNS OF ABUSE. THEY CAN KIND OF
- 10 COME IN -- UM -- WHETHER IT'S INVESTIGATORS OR CPS, OR --
- 11 UH -- SOMETIMES THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE HAVE KIND OF
- 12 FACILITIES IN THAT ONE AREA -- UM -- SO A CHILD DOESN'T HAVE
- 13 TO TRAVEL TOO MUCH WHEN THERE ARE ANY CONCERNS.
- 14 IN THAT, THEY ALSO HAVE PSYCHOLOGY SERVICES. THERE
- 15 ARE OTHER VICTIM TYPE OF ADVOCACY SERVICES, AS WELL AS THE
- 16 CLINIC THAT -- UM -- I'M A PART OF. UM -- AND IT JUST --
- 17 UM -- IT MAKES IT KIND OF A MORE CHILD FRIENDLY SAFE
- 18 ATMOSPHERE FOR KIDS.
- 19 THEY CAN ALSO CONDUCT FORENSIC INTERVIEWS IN THIS
- 20 FACILITY, AND SO IT'S SOMEWHERE THAT IT'S TRYING OF BE KIND OF
- 21 SAFE AND AN EASY PLACE THAT KIDS CAN HAVE ALL THEIR
- 22 EVALUATIONS DONE, KIND OF IN THE SAME TIME.
- 23 Q OKAY. SO IT'S BASICALLY ONE BUILDING THAT HOUSES
- 24 METRO'S SEXUAL ABUSE JUVENILE DIVISION, THE SEXUAL ABUSE CHILD
- 25 PROTECTIVE SERVICES INVESTIGATORS -- UM -- FORENSIC

- 1 INTERVIEWERS --
- 2 A YES.
- 3 Q -- AND FORENSIC INTERVIEW ROOMS --
- 4 A CORRECT.
- 5 Q -- PSYCHOLOGICAL COUNSELING, AND THEN YOU SAID YOU
- 6 HAVE A CLINIC THERE?
- 7 **A** YES.
- 8 Q CAN YOU DESCRIBE FOR THE COURT YOUR CLINIC THAT'S
- 9 THERE?
- 10 A SO OUR CLINIC IS FOR -- IT'S ON MONDAYS AND
- 11 THURSDAYS -- UM -- APPOINTMENTS ARE MADE VIA A REFERRAL --
- 12 UM -- FROM AN AGENCY -- UM -- SUCH AS LAW ENFORCEMENT OR CPS.
- 13 UM -- THE CLINIC IS -- CONSISTS OF MYSELF AND THEN TWO NURSES,
- 14 WHO ARE NURSES AT THE SUNRISE CHILDREN'S EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT.
- 15 UM -- AND WHEN WE SEE CHILDREN, WE DO A HEAD-TO-TOE
- 16 EVALUATION. UM -- NO MATTER WHAT THE CONCERNS BROUGHT THEM
- 17 THERE, WE CHECK THEIR VISUAL ACUITY, MAKE SURE THEY CAN SEE
- 18 OKAY. WE CHECK DENTAL, HEIGHT, WEIGHT, GO THROUGH ALL THEIR
- 19 VITAL SIGNS AND DO KIND OF FULL-TIME BODY CHECKS ON THEM.
- 20 UM -- AND THEN WE WILL PROCEED TO DO A PHYSICAL
- 21 EXAMINATION, AS WELL AS TALK TO ANY CAREGIVERS, IF THEY'RE,
- 22 YOU KNOW, ANYBODY THAT'S PRESENT -- UM -- THEY HAVE CONCERNS
- 23 OR QUESTIONS, AND -- UM -- THEN OFFER ANY REFERRALS BEYOND
- 24 THAT POINT.
- 25 WE ALSO HAVE THE ABILITY TO DRAW BLOOD AND TAKE LABS

- 1 FROM URINE, AS WELL AS FROM ANY OF THE OTHER BODY FLUIDS.
- 2 YOU SAID THAT YOU DON'T -- UM -- COLLECT FORENSIC
- 3 EVIDENCE, BUT DO YOU ALSO DO, AND THEREFORE HAVE THE ABILITY
- 4 TO DO -- UM -- VAGINAL EXAMS?
- 5 A ABSOLUTELY, YES.
- 6 Q AND WHEN YOU DO A VAGINAL EXAM ON A CHILD, IS THAT
- 7 THE SAME AS ON AN ADULT OR DIFFERENT?
- 8 A UM -- IT DEPENDS ON THE AGE, SO IT'S A LITTLE BIT
- 9 DIFFERENT. WITH ADULTS IT'S PRETTY STANDARDIZED WHERE THERE
- 10 MAY BE INTERNAL EXAMS, MUCH LIKE WHEN A FEMALE GOES TO HER --
- 11 UM -- OB/GYN OR SOMETHING LIKE THAT -- UM -- AND THAT'S PRETTY
- 12 STANDARD FOR ADULTS.
- for the kids, it depends on what stage of puberty
- 14 THEY ARE IN. WE MAY NOT DO INTERNAL EVALUATIONS, THE MORE
- 15 EXTERNAL, KIND OF LOOK ON THE OUTSIDE OF THE BODY. UM -- BUT
- 16 IN TERMS OF TESTING THAT WE COLLECT FOR SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED
- 17 INFECTIONS, THAT'S PRETTY MUCH THE SAME ACROSS THE BOARD.
- 18 Q AND THAT'S DONE BY BLOOD AS OPPOSED TO -- UM --
- 19 **A** WE DO BOTH. WE DO BLOOD --
- 20 **Q** -- SWABS?
- 21 A -- AND WE DO SWABS.
- 22 O OKAY. I'M GOING TO DIRECT YOUR ATTENTION
- 23 SPECIFICALLY TO MARCH 13TH OF 2014. WERE YOU WORKING AT THE
- 24 SNCAC, YOUR CLINIC, THAT DAY?
- 25 **A** YES.
