*ORDER*

Petitioner has filed a motion for leave to file volumes 11-17 of its appendix under seal. In support of the motion, petitioner asserts that the documents included in volumes 11-17 were filed under seal and/or redacted in the district court pursuant to a protective order.

The district court's order allows the parties to designate as confidential any documents they in good faith reasonably believe that contain nonpublic confidential information. The volumes of the appendix submitted under seal consist of a request for production of documents, responses and objections to the request for production of documents, a motion to compel responses to request for production of documents, an appendix of exhibits related to the motion to compel, and an opposition to and reply in support of the motion to compel. We are concerned whether all documents included in volumes 11-17 are or should have been subject

to the district court's protective order. Specifically, the documents contain a significant amount of information that does not appear to meet the definition of confidential or highly confidential information as defined in the district court's order. And some documents are available to the public, such as copies of newspaper articles and documents that appear to have been filed in the district court's public docket. Despite our concern, given the district court order and the fact that it appears the documents were filed under seal or redacted in the district court, we grant the motion.

The clerk of this court shall file volumes 11-17 of petitioner's appendix under seal.

It is so ORDERED.
