ORDER REGARDING EXHIBITS

On March 7, 2016, this court granted appellant's motion asking us to direct the district court clerk to transmit original CD exhibits necessary for this court's review of an issue on appeal. We received the exhibits on March 15, 2016. Upon attempting to review the exhibits, however, this court has determined that the discs cannot be reviewed, despite following the instructions for playing the discs as outlined in the supplement filed by counsel for appellant on February 25, 2016, because the discs contain a shortcut referencing the audio on a computer rather than the audio itself. For this reason, the discs were apparently readable in the district court because the originating computer was present, but they are not readable by this court.

Accordingly, the parties are advised that unless and until the contents of the exhibits are presented to us in a readable electronic or written format accompanied by specific instructions explaining how to play them and what software is required, this court cannot access their contents. If the deficiency is not cured within 10 days of the date of this
