
## IN THE SUPREME COURT OF THE STATE OF NEVADA

## ORDER GRANTING MOTIONS AND REJECTING BRIEFS

Cause appearing, the motions for leave to file amicus briefs in support of appellant's petition for rehearing are granted. See NRAP 29. However, we are unable to file the submitted amicus briefs at this time because they contain formatting deficiencies. Specifically, the brief submitted by the Nevada State Board of Medical Examiners is not double spaced and does not have 1-inch margins on all 4 sides, and the brief submitted by the Nevada State Contractors Board does not contain a table of contents or a table of authorities. See NRAP 29(d), NRAP 29(d)(1), NRAP 29(d)(2), NRAP 32(a)(4).

Accordingly, we direct the clerk of this court to reject the brief submitted via E-Flex on August 9, 2017, and to detach the brief from the motion filed on August 11, 2017, and return it unfiled. The Nevada State Board of Medical Examiners and the Nevada State Contractors Board shall each have 5 days from the date of this order to file amicus briefs that comply

SUPREME COURT OF NEVADA with NRAP 29(d) and NRAP 32. Failure to comply with this order may result in the waiver of the opportunity to file an amicus brief.

Respondents shall have until September 15, 2017, to file and serve their answer to appellant's petition for rehearing, including any response to the briefs of amici curiae.

It is so ORDERED.
