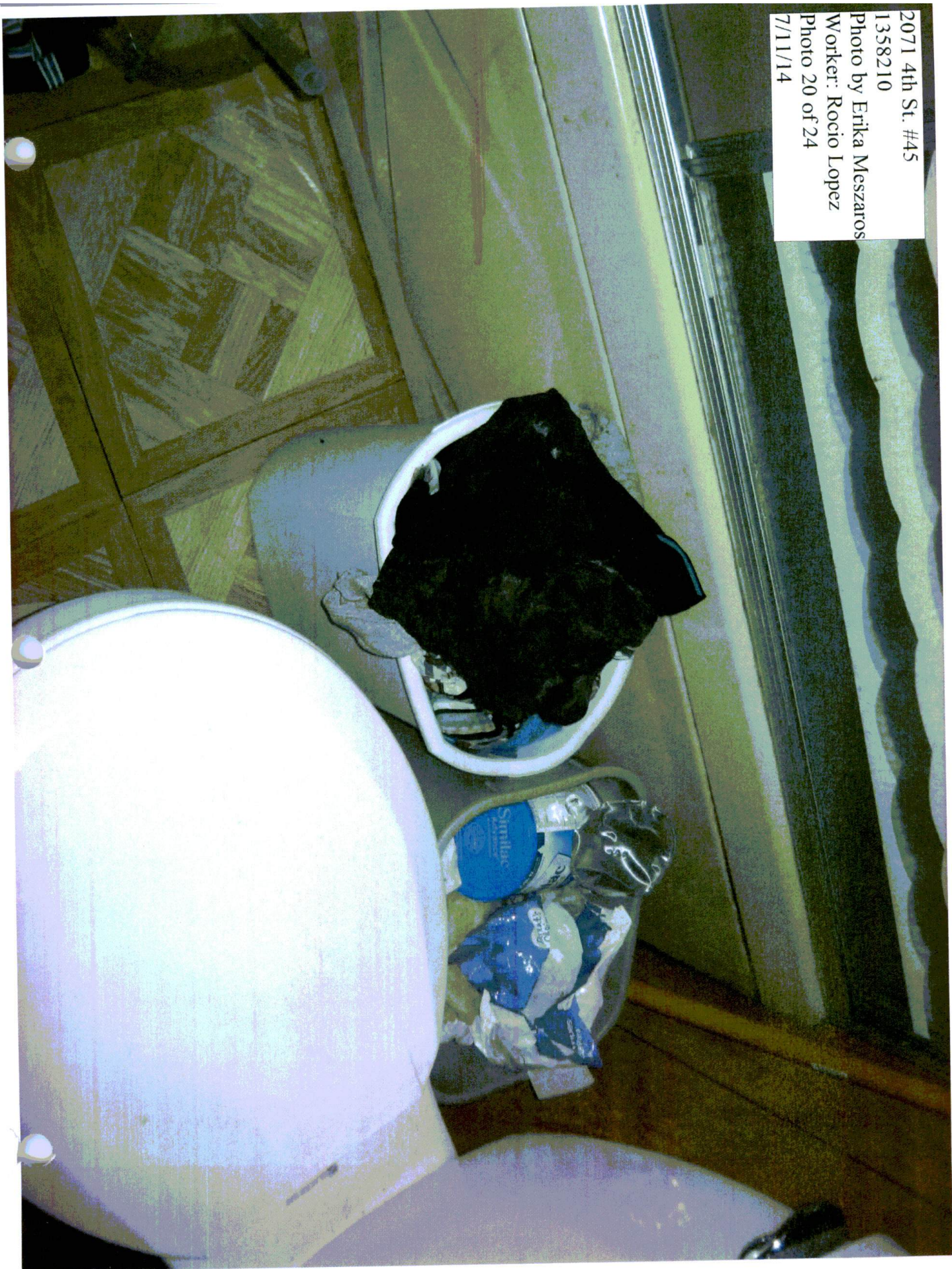

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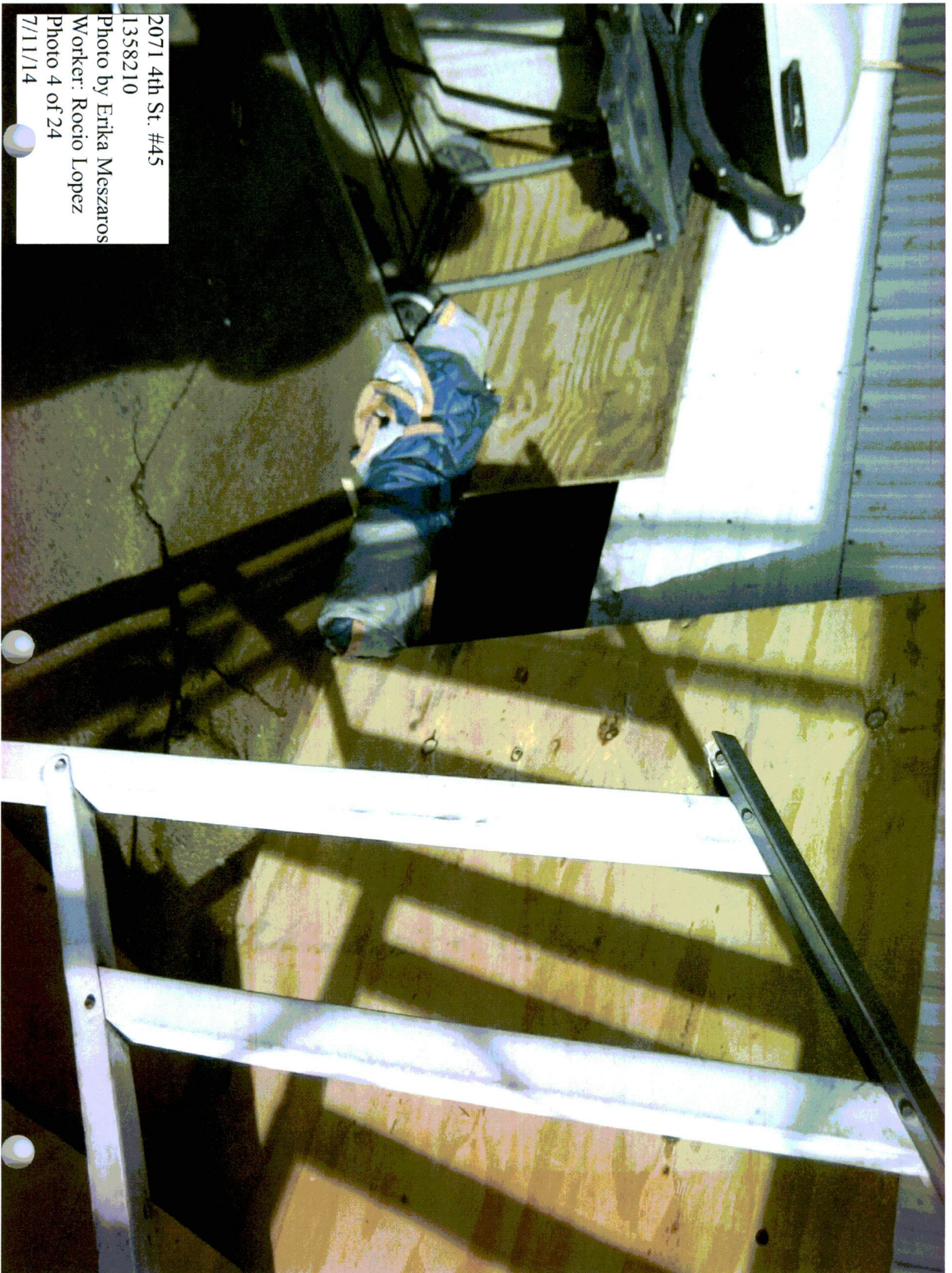

Impending Danger Threats:

Describe each identified Impending Danger Threat. Evaluate and describe in detail how each threat is occurring within the family including when (time of day), how often, under what circumstances, other influences involved, and caregivers access to the child(ren).

Family does not have resources to meet basic needs.

Both parents have exhausted all resources within the community regarding housing. Prior to the family residing in the motel room and their apartment, the family was residing in the family shelter, gospel mission, men's shelter and family promise. It was reported to this agency that the family was kicked out of the Family Shelter Shelter in which the family stayed at the shelter from April 2012-September 2012. During that time frame, the family was kicked out of the shelter due to not obeying the rules, i.e. Jacqueline and Robert would not supervise their children, that the family would not clean their rooms however would clean other guest rooms, and would not follow their case plan as far as getting employment and finding their own housing. Once the family was kicked out, they accessed resources through the Men's Shelter as well as the Prayer House until the agencies were full. In October 2012, WCDSS assisted the family in getting into the Family Promise which would house the family until they could get into

their own apartment. Robert was kicked out of Family Promise in November 2012 due to stealing belongings such as the director's cell phone, and continued to cause problems with the other families within the agency. Jacqueline and the children were able to stay at Family Promise until the agency went under due to lack of funding in December 2012.

Family is currently on the waitlist for housing as they just turned in their application as of March 2013. Family does not have support from other family members to see if they could stay with them until they could sustain stable housing. Jacqueline and Roberto lost their jobs and were depending on Robert's "free play" from Casino's to pay for rent. Jacqueline also receives TANF however could not explain where her TANF money went as she initially stated that she paid for the motel room but then contradicted herself by saying her tax refund paid for the motel. Even though the family is accessing resources through out the community, i.e. Nevada State Welfare to include TANF and Food Stamps, the family is still unable to provide the basic needs for their children.

One or both parents/caregivers lack parenting knowledge, skills, and motivation which affects child safety.

Both parents are averse to parenting and they do not provide the basic needs to include shelter and educational needs for Roberto. Roberto has missed 45 days of school just this year and has been tardy on 8 separate occasions. Roberto's school counselor stated that she has excused some of the days due to the family's situation, i.e. 21 1/2 days have been excused, due to the family being transient. Lori reported that due to the attendance, Roberto has suffered academically and will more than likely have to repeat the grade. Lori stated that Roberto has Speech and Language difficulties and is currently on an IEP for that. Both parents were provided with information to attend a SAARB meeting in February 2013 for Roberto's poor attendance however both parents failed to attend that meeting. School offered the family with a conference call regarding the meeting and offered the family to reschedule the meeting but against the family failed to attend. Both parents have demonstrated their lack of motivation when it comes to parenting as both parents admitted that they do not take Roberto to the bus station even though the school has provided transportation for him.

Due to the family's financial issues, they are unable to provide basic needs including a stable home. Both parents have exhausted all housing resources to include the Family Shelter, Family Promise, Women's Shelter, Men's Shelter and the Prayer House through the Gospel Mission. Ms. Guerrero and Mr. Hunt-Taylor were in the Family Shelter from April 2012 to September 2012. Ms. Guerrero and Mr. Hunt-Taylor were kicked out of the shelter due to non-compliance, i.e. family did not complete their case plan with regards to finding employment and housing. Mr. Hunt-Taylor was kicked out of Family Promise for allegedly stealing belongings from the director of Family Promise in December 2012. Due to the family being transient on multiple times and exhausted all resources, the family does not have a calm or consistent home environment in order to provide safety services within the home. The family is aware of community resources to include Family Shelter, Gospel Mission, Men's Shelter, St. Vincent's, WIC, Continuum/Child Find, and Nevada State Welfare to include TANF, Food Stamps and Medicaid. WCDSS has provided this family with services in the past to include information regarding housing (Section 8/Reno Housing), Food Pantries as well as Food, information regarding employment, and assisted with the family getting into their apartment to include payment for their deposit and LITHF Funding. Even though the family is aware and accessing services in Washoe County, they are still unable to meet the children's basic needs.

His siblings are also in the home and he is comfortable with them and in their presence.

Update 1/23/15 - Ethan does not have any behavioral, mental health, or educational needs at this time. The ASQ assessment was submitted to NEIS and no concerns were reported. Ethan does apparently have struggles with afebrile seizures - His temperature rises too high too fast when he is not feeling well and he will lose consciousness. MASTER'S RECOMMENDATIONS AND ORDER FOR PROTECTIVE CUSTODY

14

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This matter came before the Court for a Protective Custody hearing on September 16, 2014, before Master Cynthia Lu and the following persons appeared: Jacqueline Guerrero, mother of said minor child, represented by Lee Elkins and Jane Fosbinder, Deputy Public Defenders; Robert Hunt-Taylor, father of said minor child, in custody, represented by Jenna Pritsos, Deputy Alternate Public Defender; Denise Tyre and Rocio Lopez from the Washoe County Department of Social Services (hereinafter "WCDSS"), represented by Tyler Elcano, Deputy District Attorney; and Tom Bolan, investigator with the Washoe County Public Defender's office.

The rule of exclusion was invoked. Testimony was taken from Rocio Lopez and Denise Tyre from WCDSS; Mirabel Stalker (hereinafter "Ms. Stalker"), family friend; Stephanie Lizarraga, family friend; and

1 Jacqueline Guerrero (hereinafter "Ms. Guerrero"), mother. Parties
2 stipulated to the admission of the following hearing exhibits:
3 fourteen photos from WCDSS taken on September 11, 2014 by WCDSS and
4 four photos from Respondent mother taken on September 15, 2014 by the
5 Washoe County Public Defender's office.

6 The minor child was taken into protective custody on September
7 11, 2014 after a Warrant Authorizing Emergency Placement of Children
8 into Protective Custody was granted by the Hon. Deborah Schumacher.

9 FINDINGS OF FACT

10 The testimony presented revealed that WCDSS had concerns
11 regarding Ethan's welfare when he was seen on two occasions at the
12 agency office looking dirty; photographs of the residence of Ms.
13 Guerrero revealed pet urine stains, feces on the carpet, piles of
14 clothing, dirty diapers on the ground, and clothing and shoes
15 identified as belonging to Ms. Guerrero; Ms. Guerrero was not
16 addressing her mental health condition of depression; and Ms. Guerrero
17 was not employed.

18 Ms. Guerrero testified that she had moved from the residence that
19 WCDSS had inspected on August 15, 2014. Ms. Guerrero testified that
20 for a month, she kept forgetting to ask her new roommate, Ms. Stalker,
21 if WCDSS could inspect her residence despite repeated requests from
22 WCDSS to do a home inspection in order to close out a new referral on
23 Ethan. Further, the photographs provided by Ms. Guerrero revealed one
24 packed up pack and play, but no other personal property of Ms.
25 Guerrero in the residence was photographed. Ms. Stalker testified

26

1 that Ms. Guerrero had not been added onto the lease, which would have
2 assisted in verifying Ms. Guerrero's new residence.

3 Ms. Tyre testified there was a prior referral regarding the
4 condition of the home beginning in July 2014, but the agency
5 determined the condition of the home was not a danger to Ethan as he
6 was not mobile at the time, so Ethan was not removed. Ms. Tyre had an
7 open case on the family since July 31, 2014 after Mr. Hunt-Taylor was
8 arrested for domestic battery against Ms. Guerrero. Ms. Tyre provided
9 vouchers and referrals for Ms. Guerrero and victim services offered
10 Ms. Guerrero a deposit for her own apartment, but Ms. Guerrero failed
11 to follow up with victim services. Ms. Tyre provided diapers, wipes
12 and bottles to Ms. Guerrero. Ms. Tyre testified that when she located
13 Ms. Guerrero at Ms. Stalker's residence to pick up Ethan pursuant to
14 the warrant, Ms. Guerrero stated to her that she knew her room was
15 messy. Ms. Tyre stated that Ms. Guerrero never provided any other
16 address as her residence to the agency prior to September 11, 2014.

17 FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

18 Having heard and considered the testimony and evidence with good
19 cause therefore appearing, the Court hereby makes the following
20 findings and recommendations:

- 21 1. The Court has jurisdiction pursuant to NRS Chapter 432B.
- 22 2. There is reasonable cause to believe that:
 - 23 a. Continuation in the home is contrary to the welfare of the
24 child and not in the child's best interest due to the unsafe and
25 unsanitary condition of the residence of Ms. Guerrero; the unaddressed
26 mental health issues of Ms. Guerrero; Ms. Guerrero is unable to meet

1 basic needs of the child; and Mr. Hunt-Taylor is unable to discharge
2 his responsibilities due to incarceration.

3 b. To date, reasonable efforts have been provided to prevent
4 the need to place the child into protective custody in that there were
5 no local relatives available to safety plan with, and the risk and
6 safety factors at the time left no other alternative but to remove the
7 child and place the child in family foster care.

8 c. The above-named child shall be placed in the legal and
9 physical custody of WCDSS.

10 d. The child may be physically placed with appropriate
11 relatives or a parent with appropriate safety planning.

12 e. Ms. Guerrero and Mr. Hunt-Taylor are found to be indigent.
13 The Public Defender's Office and the Alternate Public Defender's
14 office are appointed as counsel to the parents.

15 3. WCDSS may consent to any and all necessary and/or emergency
16 medical treatment for the above-named minor child while the child
17 remains in its custody. The parents or legal guardians shall
18 reimburse WCDSS for the costs of care provided in NRS 432B.560(2).

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1 4. CASA is appointed to represent the minor child.

2 IT IS SO RECOMMENDED.

12 Tyre she lost her only bottle for Ethan and did not have resources to

- 26 (5) A strong urine and feces odor;

1 (6) Clothing that Ms. Tyre had observed Ms. Guerrero

5 (8) Baby food and canned food items; and

6 (9) Multiple small items scattered on the ground that
7 are choking hazards for Ethan.

15 (k) On or about April 17, 2014, a plan of termination of

18 (l) Ms. Guerrero has been offered numerous services by WCDSS
19 including, but not limited to, cleaning supplies, bus passes,
20 budgeting, job search information, referrals and vouchers for
21 counseling/therapy services, drug screens, food bank and Salvation
22 Army referrals, and Reno Housing Authority contact/referral.

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
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IV.

Worker asked Roberto where he and his family are living in which he stated that he sleeps outside with his Spiderman blanket and that he uses his back pack as a pillow. Roberto reported that he saw a blue alien and that they get to watch the stars at night. Roberto also stated that he and his siblings have bunk beds and that they stay in some church, prior to that they were staying in the shelter. Roberto reported that he did not like staying at the shelter because he got bit by a bug, i.e. worker did observe some bites on Roberto that appear to be bed bugs. Worker asked Roberto if he and his siblings take baths or showers in which Roberto stated both. Roberto stated that he took a bath last night and that his siblings also have to take baths every night. Roberto appeared to be disheveled, i.e. hair not brushed, clothes appeared to be dirty however Roberto just came in from playing recess. Roberto had a slight odor to him, especially with his

shoes and socks.

Throughout the investigation, Jacqueline and Robert accessed services regarding housing, i.e. stayed at Family Promise until they got into their own apartment, and were able to provide basic needs for their children. All 3 children's hygiene increased through out the investigaiton and the school worked with the family regarding Roberto's speech delays and attendance issues.

Jacqueline stated that when the Men's Shelter as well as Prayer House are full, then they stay with friends "here and there." Jacqueline reported that she always makes sure that her children takes baths every night however did admit that sometimes her children will wear the same outfits as she is only able to access laundry once a week. Jacqueline stated that the bites were due to bed bug bites that he received while they stayed at the Family Shelter. Robert and Jacqueline reported that she applied for Section 8 Housing in February and are currently on the wait list. Jacqueline reported that she and the children have been staying at the Prayer House all last week, i.e. they have to check in on a daily basis however Robert could not stay with them therefore he would stay at the Men's Shelter. Jacqueline and Robert stated that when they could not stay at the Prayer House or Men's Shelter then they would stay with their friend, Bianca. Jacqueline reported that this weekend, they will be staying with Jacqueline's mother Maureen Salazar, but could only stay for the weekend as her landlord will not allow them to move in full time. Robert informed this worker that he does not get along with Jacqueline's mother and states that if Jacqueline and their children stay with Maureen, she will not allow Robert to move in. Robert informed this worker that Maureen does not like him as he hasn't been working. Robert stated that he is trying to find work and has a good lead as selling vacuums door to door. Jacqueline and Robert indicated that even though they are currently homeless, they make sure that their children are given baths every night. . Worker discussed proper hygiene as well as increase hygiene for all 3 children as recommended by nurse Pomi.

Another volunteer remembered that they saw Jacqueline and Robert's daughter, Kayleigh with it however the family stated that they looked through all their stuff and could not find it. R/P was able to look at the cell phone bill in which there are multiple texts and calls to and from the phone which the family used.

Worker met with Family Promise Director, Ray Duffy, on 11-13-12. Ray informed workers that he will be kicking the Guerrero family out this evening as the family stole a cell phone from them. Ray stated that the cell phone has been missing since last week and initially Ray thought that the volunteer misplaced the phone. Ray reported that when he spoke with the volunteer, she informed Ray that she saw the Guerrero's daughter, Kayleigh playing with the phone but when asked, both parents stated that they looked through all their stuff and could not find it. Ray indicated that he has since checked the cell phone's bill and saw that there are multiple texts and call to and from the phone which the family used. Ray stated that he has not confronted the family yet as he wanted workers to have a heads up on it. At this time, Ray called Jacqueline and informed her that he would like to speak with her and Robert ASAP. Jacqueline stated that she is currently applying for jobs as well as Robert and will not be able to come in until this evening. Ray informed workers that he will speak with the family on 11-14-12 regarding the cell

phone and would like workers present. Ray will allow the family to stay tonight until this is resolved.

Workers met with Ray and the Guerrero family on 11-14-12. After speaking with the family, Ray felt that Jacqueline did not know about the stolen phone therefore he will allow her and the children to remain in Family Promise however Robert is no longer allowed to be on property.

Ray discussed the cell phone bill that shows the phone calls and text messages that were going through to individuals who know the Guerrero family. Jacqueline again stated that she did not know about the stolen phone and when Robert was confronted, he initially denied but then handed the cell phone to Ray. Jacqueline started crying and became angry with Robert and stated that she did not know and wanted him to be arrested for theft. Workers informed Robert that he is putting his family in jeopardy of not having a home and if his children do not have a place to stay then workers have no other option but to place them into protective custody. Jacqueline again stated that she did not know and does not want her children being placed into care when she has done nothing wrong. Ray felt that Jacqueline did not know about the stolen phone therefore he will allow her and the children to remain in Family Promise however Robert is no longer allowed to be on property. Workers and Ray informed Robert that he is not allowed to be on the premises of Family Promise and if he shows up, then Jacqueline and the children will no longer be allowed to stay at Family Promise. Robert and Jacqueline both stated that they understood and Robert packed up his belongings and left the residence. Jr. HSSS will continue to work with the family regarding housing and providing the basic needs for their children. Workers observed all 3 children to be eating breakfast and sitting in the living room playing. All 3 children were clean, dressed appropriately for the weather and no marks or bruises were present.

Assessment Area One: Maltreatment

Worker finds the allegation of Negligent Treatment-Inadequate Supervision and Negligent Treatment-Educational Neglect from the report dated on April 19, 2013 to be substantiated. The report indicated that Robert Hunt-Taylor, Jacqueline Guerrero as well as their 3 children were being evicted from their motel room and did not have a plan as to how they were going to pay for the room or where they would stay with their children. The report also alleged that Roberto has missed 45 days of school just this year and had a scheduled SAARB meeting in February 2013 however the parents failed to attend the meeting. Roberto will have to repeat Kindergarten due to his poor attendance and is receiving special education services for his speech issues.

ERU workers met with the motel manager at the Sundane Motel on 4-19-13. The motel manager reported that the family owes \$200.00 for rent and if they do not come up with the money today they would be evicted. Motel manager spoke with the family on 4-19-13 as well as ERU workers in which the family stated that they do not have enough money to pay for the motel room and admitted that they were being evicted from the room if they did not pay \$200.00. Both parents reported that they gave plasma on April 18, 2013 and earned a total of \$70.00 however that money went towards rent that they owed from the week before. Jacqueline reported that she also receives \$530.00 in TANF cash benefits from Nevada State Welfare towards the 1st of the month however could not explain as to how that money was spent. ERU

workers were concern that Jacqueline and Robert's financial income is not being spent to provide the basic necessities to include food, clothing, and shelter as ERU workers observed a Silver Legacy Casino Player's club card on the table in the motel and observed minimal clothing for the children. When ERU workers spoke with Roberto, he reported that his parents play games at Circus Circus and that he gets toys from those games.

WCDSS also spoke with Lori Draper, school counselor at Libby Booth, on 4-19-13 with regards to Roberto Taylor. Lori reported that Roberto has missed 45 days of school this year and has been tardy on 8 different occasions. WCDSS learned through Roberto's school that Roberto has missed 45 days of school this year and has been tardy on 8 different occasions. School reported that Roberto will have to repeat Kindergarten due to his poor attendance and reported that he is currently in Special Education and has speech delays. School has provided the family with assistance through Children In Transition to include transportation however the family continues to disregard Roberto's education. School has exhausted all truancy resources and had a scheduled SAARB meeting in February 2013 however both parents failed to attend the meeting.

Answer:

Robert and Jacqueline both reported that they had their own apartment from December 2012-March 2013 when they were evicted due to non payment. Jacqueline reported that she lost her job on 12/25/12 due to a "miscommunication" and started working under the table for cleaning houses. Jacqueline stated that she was able to maintain her apartment by working under the table however she lost that job in March 2013. Robert stated that he was also able to maintain their apartment as he had a job however he too lost his job in January 2013 due to a "miscommunication." Robert indicated that he then started working for Liberty Taxes as a signer and that the position was only part-time and seasonal. Robert stated that he lost that job in April 2013. Due to losing their jobs, they were unable to stay in their apartment and lost their apartment in March 2013. During that time, both parents stated that they moved into the Sundance Motel and paid for approximately a month through their tax refund. Jacqueline reported that the motel manager told them that they would only have to pay \$130.00 a week and did not realize that he was charging them \$200.00 even though he provided the family with a receipt. Jacqueline and Robert both stated that they gave plasma and only received \$70.00 from it. Robert reported that he signed up for a Silver Legacy's Player's Card as he would receive free play every Friday. Robert stated that if he won anything over the free play that money would go towards rent but stated that he never won anything. Both parents reported that they have applied for Reno Housing as of March 2013 and that they are on the wait list. Both parents also stated that Jacqueline earns \$513.00 in TANF and that she will be receiving that

money on the 1st of the month. When asked where they spent Jacqueline's TANF from the month of April, both parents stated that they put the money towards their motel room which contradicts their initial story of putting their tax refund towards the motel. During this time, worker inquired about Roberto's attendance issues, i.e. 45 days, and asked why they missed his SAARB meeting. Jacqueline and Robert admitted that Roberto has caught "lice and a virus" from school and stated that it is difficult having to walk him each morning to the bus station down town. Jacqueline and Robert both stated that Roberto was sent to SAARB in February 2013 due to his poor attendance however both parents did not attend that meeting. Jacqueline initially could not provide any reason or explanation as to why she did not follow through with the meeting but then stated that she had a miscarriage. When asked why Robert did not attend the meeting he too did not have an explanation as to why he did not attend.

It was reported by Jacqueline that the family had to move from their apartment as they were being evicted due to non payment. Jacqueline did not have a plan as to how she was going to get the money in order to pay for the motel room nor did Jacqueline have a game plan as to where her children could stay until she could sustain stable housing. Jacqueline has exhausted all resources within the community regarding housing as she reported that prior to residing in their apartment, the family was residing in the family shelter, gospel mission, men's shelter and family promise. It was reported to this agency that the family was kicked out of the Family Shelter Shelter in which the family stayed at the shelter from April 2012-September 2012. During that time frame, the family was kicked out of the shelter due to not obeying the rules, i.e. Jacqueline and Robert would not supervise their children, that the family would not clean their rooms however would clean other guest rooms, and would not follow their case plan as far as getting employment and finding their own housing. Once the family was kicked out, they accessed resources through the Men's Shelter as well as the Prayer House until the agencies were full. In October 2012, WCDSS assisted the family in getting into the Family Promise which would house the family until they could get into their own

apartment. Robert was kicked out of Family Promise in November 2012 due to stealing belongings such as the director's cell phone, and continued to cause problems with the other families within the agency. Jacqueline and the children were able to stay at Family Promise until the agency went under due to lack of funding in December 2012. Jacqueline reported that she and Robert have been together for 7 years and denied any domestic violence. During the initial investigation, Jacqueline was not employed however stated on April 24, 2013, that she was hired back on with Harrah's Casino with their house keeping. This is the 2nd time that Jacqueline has been hired on with Harrah's as she was working with them during the winter time of 2012 but lost her job on 12/25/12 due to a "miscommunication." Jacqueline is receiving assistance through Nevada State Welfare to include TANF, Food Stamps and Medicaid however could not explain where her TANF money goes. Jacqueline denies any drug usage, alcohol usage or any mental health issues. Jacqueline did admit that she has been depressed since February 2013 when she found out that she was pregnant with twins and miscarried the pregnancy. Jacqueline stated that she did not seek counseling services regarding the loss of her pregnancy but feels that it would benefit her. Jacqueline stated that she has her friends that she has met through the different shelters as well as Robert as her main support. Jacqueline does have family that reside in Reno, NV however she does not look at them for support. Worker is concern as Jacqueline has demonstrated that she can not provide stable housing for her children and does not understand the cause-effect relationship between her own actions, i.e. being transient, and the effect it has on her children, i.e. Roberto missing 45 days of school and suffering academically.

Prior to moving into their apartment, the family was residing in a 2 bedroom apartment from December 2012-March 2013 when the family was evicted due to non payment. It was reported by Robert that the family had to move from their apartment as they were being evicted due to non payment. Robert did not have a plan as to how he was going to get the money in order to pay for the motel room nor did Robert have a game plan as to where his children could stay until he could sustain stable housing. Robert has exhausted all resources within the community regarding housing as he

reported that prior to residing in their apartment, the family was residing in the family shelter, gospel mission, men's shelter and family promise. It was reported to this agency that the family was kicked out of the Family Shelter Shelter in which the family stayed at the shelter from April 2012-September 2012. During that time frame, the family was kicked out of the shelter due to not obeying the rules, i.e. Jacqueline and Robert would not supervise their children, that the family would not clean their rooms however would clean other guest rooms, and would not follow their case plan as far as getting employment and finding their own housing. Once the family was kicked out, they accessed resources through the Men's Shelter as well as the Prayer House until the agencies were full. In October 2012, WCDSS assisted the family in getting into the Family Promise which would house the family until they could get into their own apartment. Robert was kicked out of Family Promise in November 2012 due to stealing belongings such as the director's cell phone, and continued to cause problems with the other families within the agency. Jacqueline and the children were able to stay at Family Promise until the agency went under due to lack of funding in December 2012. During the initial investigation, Robert was unemployed however reported on 4/23/12 that he was hired on through JNL Distrubution selling Kirby's and that his orientation started on 4/24/13. Robert reported that he was employed at Cal Neva as a deep cleaner earning \$9.00hr however lost his in January 2013 due to a "miscommunication". Robert then worked at Liberty Taxes as a signer but stated that it was only part-time and the work was only seasonal. Robert stated that job ended in April 2013. Robert did admit that he would sign up for Casino Player Card's in order for him to gamble "free play" in hopes of earning enough money to pay for rent. Robert would not disclose how much he would spend in "free play" but stated that he never won. Robert also gave plasma in hopes of earning enough income to provide a roof of his children's heads but only received \$70.00. Robert stated that he and Jacqueline have been together for 7 years and denies any domestic violence within their relationship. Robert denies any drug usage, alcohol usage or mental health issues. Robert states that he only has support from Jacqueline as well as his female friends that he met through the different shelters. Worker is concern as Robert has demonstrated that he can not provide stable housing for his children and does not understand the cause-effect relationship between his own actions, i.e. being transient, gambling, and the effect it has on his children, i.e. Roberto missing 45 days of school and suffering accademically.

Answer:

Jacqueline Guerrero is the mother to 4 children; 3 who remain in the care/custody of WCDSS (since April 2013) and 1 who remains in her care at this time. Since March 2013 at the time of the agency's legal involvement, she has failed to secure any type of employment despite Jacqueline's inability to provide her children with their basic needs is what resulted in them being placed into foster care. This has historically been an issue for Jacqueline. The family's residence has been consistently unstable and they have been residing in numerous motel rooms/apartments and have had continuous issues ensuring that their rent is paid which has resulted in evictions as recent as September 2013. Prior to the agency's legal involvement the family has appeared to exhaust community resources having previously accessed services from the family shelter, gospel mission, men's shelter and family promise. The family has never taken advantage of any community resources that they've been offered and have often been "kicked out" of shelters due to failing to be compliant to basic shelter rules and/or failing to follow their case plans. For instance, the family refused to clean their room at the family shelter and failed to seek employment/other housing options. At family promise Robert was caught stealing personal property from the director. Jacqueline speaks about community resources as if it is something owed to her rather than a service and presents as very entitled to these services appearing to have no motivation to secure better stability for herself or her children. At this time Jacqueline receives \$90 in food stamps and the family has just 6 months left of receiving TANF before they will face a "sit out" period of these services. There have been ongoing concerns since March 2013 about the family's ability to appropriately manage their TANF and food stamps. There have been ongoing concerns about Jacqueline and/or Robert having issues with excessive gambling based on their lack of being able to recall how they finances are spent and previous social workers seeing gambling/casino cards amongst the

family's belongings. Jacqueline and Robert admit to gambling but only when they have "free plays." Jacqueline and Robert have failed to cooperate with their case plan with their Welfare worker (failing to turn in needed job seeking forms, etc.). Jacqueline reports that she and Robert have been together since 2006 and denies any domestic violence. Jacqueline does appear to put Robert above the needs for herself and even her children. For instance, despite apparent knowledge of his ongoing substance abuse (see adult functioning) and the family's significantly low income she appears to continuously support Robert even when this has ultimately led to the loss of her children in her custody. Jacqueline denies any drug and/or alcohol use. Jacqueline has previously admitted feelings of depression after she suffered a miscarriage in February 2013 and in March 2013 suggested that she would accept counseling services. Since that time, Jacqueline has completed a Psycho Social with Brianna Carter MA, MFT Intern. She was diagnosed with Axis I Panic Disorder without Agoraphobia. She was recommended to attend individual therapy with an emphasis on psycho education around panic attacks, stress reduction and coping. Jacqueline also stated that she was interested in couple's therapy to increase effective communication. Jacqueline has thus far failed to follow through with counseling and has stated she does not want to participate in this service although she appears to be extremely overwhelmed and cries frequently. Jacqueline does have the local support of her father who at the time of Jacqueline's fourth baby being born allowed the family to move into his home. However, he does stress the importance of Jacqueline and Robert moving out and gaining self sufficiency and stresses that this is a temporary situation only. It appears that this is Jacqueline's only

stable form of support and should her father no longer allow the family to live there they will once again have no ability to meet their child Ethan basic needs and once again need the intervention of WCDSS.

Answer:

Robert is the father of 4 children; 3 who remain in the physical/legal care of WCDSS (since March 2013) and 1 who remains in his care. At this time Robert, Jacqueline and their youngest child reside with Jacqueline's father and are almost solely reliant on him to meet their needs and the needs of their infant. Robert has not had steady employment since April 2013 and since that time the family has been completely reliant on welfare benefits (\$90/food stamps and

TANF) and others to meet their basic needs. Robert was able to show this worker a pay stub that he has been working at SK foods although there is still some discrepancies on how often he does go into work. The family has had ongoing issues with establishing their basic needs on a consistent basis and have relied on several community resources (family promise/men's shelter/family shelter) in the past. The family has often been "kicked out" of shelters and programs due to failing to cooperate with basic rules and case plans and once Robert was found to have stolen property from the director of Family Promise. It should be noted that often relating to the family being kicked out has been related to their area/room being profoundly dirty and them refusing to clean it. As recently as September 2013 their home was observed to be completely filthy (strong odor of cat urine, piles of clothes/clutter, etc) and found to living in a home without power. It should be noted that at that time no children were in their physical care as Jacqueline was pregnant with Ethan at the time. Jacqueline and Robert appear to have no motivation to change their lifestyle or to have stability for themselves or their children. They appear to view the financial assistance of others as something expected rather than help and appear to often take advantage of services and fail to follow through with even the most basic tasks to ensure some stability. Robert has denied any drug use throughout this case despite proof of the contrary. In June 2013 he tested positive for marijuana and indicated that he had "picked up a used cigarette that must have had marijuana in it." In August 2013 he again tested positive for the substance and again denied use. In January 2014 Robert acknowledged his ongoing use of marijuana indicating that he uses the substance daily. Robert has denied any use of alcohol. Additionally, there have been concerns about Jacqueline and Robert gambling as they have always been unable to recall how their TANF income is spent. They have denied these allegations although have admitted to gambling but "only when they have free plays." Robert speaks positively about his 8 year relationship with Jacqueline, denying any domestic violence. Robert has failed to attend scheduled appointments to complete a substance abuse evaluation. Robert presents as having no desire to change his lifestyle and has apparently made no positive changes since March 2013 despite three of his children remaining in the agency's custody. Robert appears to be fine with being completely reliant on others and despite his personal choices that have affected the family's financial struggles (ongoing unemployment; failure to comply with shelter regulations and rules, ongoing drug use) he appears to assume no responsibility for his actions.

Jaqueline's 3 older children continue to be in the care of the department. However, upon inspection of the home it was messy, however did not present any immediate safety threats. Ethan is not of an age where he is able to walk however even if he could there does not appear to be any immediate safety threats on the floor. The home smelled of cat urine, however it was not observed to have urine on the ground or anywhere that could make contact with Ethan. The

home was found to have a great deal of baby food, formula, diapers, wipes, and other baby supplies. Ethan had safe sleep arrangements in the home. Jacqueline has extensive history with the agency. She has three older children who are in care however she does not know why they were removed or why they remain out of care. Jacqueline reports that she wants to reunify with her children however she believes she is on track for termination at this time. Jacqueline believes that she has been doing what the agency requires however presents as very confused about the situation. Jacqueline's home at the time of the report was a trailer that's condition was questionable as it was clearly very old and not well-maintained. There were no obvious safety hazards. Throughout the case an IO came into the agency regarding a DV altercation between Jacqueline and Robert. The incident did not involve the child or put Ethan at risk, however Jacqueline made the decision to leave the residence and moved in with a close family friend. She was residing with Ethan at this home until she was able to find section 8 housing. Her housing was approved and she was looking for an apartment.

Worker Tyre has been attempting to obtain Jacqueline's address since July 31 as she moved from the 4th street trailer originally inspected. Jacqueline is unwilling to provide address as she states she is living with Alberto but will be moving as soon as her section 8 housing goes through. She reports that it is supposed to go through the first week on September and provides that address for this worker. This worker scheduled an appointment for 9/5 to see the home and do the final visit for Jackie and Ethan. Worker arrived on this day and the apartment manager reported that Jackie had not followed through with arrangements made for her to move in. Worker verified with RPD victim services on this day that they were waiting for Jackie to follow through so she could take advantage of their services for them to pay the deposit.

Worker made contact with Jackie on 9/10/14 when Jackie reported she was desperate for diapers. Worker said that she would bring her diapers if Jackie would provide her address. Jackie provided that she lives in the Lion's Crest mobile home park #38. Worker made an appointment for the next day around noon to bring her diapers and to see her home. Jackie clarified that this worker would only inspect the room she was staying in and this worker stated that the entire home needed to be free of safety hazards.

Worker went to the home on 9/11 as scheduled and found the room Jackie was staying in to present with safety hazards. Worker verified with the owner of the home that indeed Jackie was staying in that room and Jackie comes and goes as she pleases.

Although Ms. Guerrero denies living in the residence inspected to be her own, it was founded in the Protective Custody hearing that the evidence was cleanvincing that she did in fact live at that residence and that the condition of the residence was unsafe for Ethan, considering his vulnerability.

Answer:

In the beginning of July the agency became involved with Ms. Guerrero in regards to her son Ethan after a report was made to the agency that the home Ethan was residing in posed safety

threats and concerns for a child at Ethan's vulnerable age. Workers evaluated a home at 2071 4th street #45. Workers went on July 11, 2014 and evaluated the home for safety concerns. At this time the home was found to have an old refrigerator with molded food, strong odor of cat urine, and debris on the floor. there was not an apparent safety threat to Ethan at this time as he was not mobile. Developmentally, he was not yet crawling. The home was found to be safe at this address and this time. Social Worker Denise Tyre continued with an investigation at this time.

On July 31, 2014, there was an incident of Domestic Violence reported to the Agency in which Mr. Robert Hunt-Taylor was arrested on charges of domestic violence. Ms. Guerrero reported shortly after that to agency representatives that she had moved and was living with her new boyfriend whose first name is "Alberto". Ms. Guerrero reported to Ms. Tyre and her ongoing social worker Rocio Lopez that her new residence was located off 4th street in a different mobile home park. She was unable to provide workers with the address of this residence until Ms. Tyre agreed to meet her at her residence on September 11, 2014. Ms. Tyre arranged an appointment to meet Ms. Guerrero at her home located at the Lion's Crest mobile home park #38. When Ms. Tyre arrived to this residence she was permitted into the home by the home owner. this person directed Ms. Tyre to Ms. Guerrero's room which was found to have pet urine stains, feces on the carpet, piles of clothing, dirty diapers on the ground, and clothing and shoes identified as belonging to Ms. Guerrero. This home was assessed to be unsafe for Ethan as he is now crawling and walking with assistance. There was no safe place for Ethan to sleep. The room was found to have baby food appropriate for Ethan's age.

On September 11, 2014, Ms. Tyre was granted a warrant from Judge Schumacher. The warrant was executed at Ms. Guerrero's friend (Ms. Stalker)'s apartment located at 700 Peckham #75. Ms. Tyre spoke to Ms. Guerrero outside the residence where Ms. Guerrero stated she had been staying with her friend overnight because she was in the hospital. She reported that she knew her room was messy and was just about to return home to clean it. Ms. Tyre was not permitted into the residence by Ms. Stalker and Ms. Guerrero so RPD was contacted for an officer to assist putting Ethan into protective custody. Ms. Stalker's body language was threatening towards Ms. Tyre at this time. Officer Lake assisted with the removal at which time Ms. Guerrero threw a bottle at his head, striking him in the back of the head. Ms. Guerrero was not arrested for this.

Jaqueline has extensive history with the agency. She has three older children who are in care however she does not know why they were removed or why they remain out of care. Jaqueline reports that she wants to reunify with her children however she believes she is on track for termination at this time. Jaqueline believes that she has been doing what the agency requires however presents as very confused about the situation.

Jaqueline's home at the time of the report was a trailer that's condition was questionable as it was clearly very old and not well-maintained. There were no obvious safety hazards. Throughout the case an IO came into the agency regarding a DV altercation between Jaqueline and Robert. The incident did not involved the child or put Ethan at risk, however Jaqueline made the decision to leave the residence and moved in with a close family friend. She was residing with Ethan at this home until she was able to find section 8 housing. Her housing was approved and she was looking for an apartment.

Ms. Tyre scheduled an appointment for 9/5 to see the home and do the final visit for Jackie and Ethan. Worker arrived on this day and the apartment manager reported that Jackie had not followed through with arrangements made for her to move in. Worker verified with RPD victim

services on this day that they were waiting for Jackie to follow through so she could take advantage of their services for them to pay the deposit.

Since July 7, 2014 the agency has been working with Ms. Guerrero in regards to Ethan. Ms. Guerrero struggles to provide for Ethan's basic needs as she has had to repeatedly ask for help from the agency. She reports that she can work however needs to contact the labor company in the morning to see if there is a shift available. Ms. Guerrero reports that she does not do that as she receives financial support from her boyfriend Alberto. Ms. Guerrero has contacted the agency multiple times since Ethan coming into care looking for a bus pass. She often calls an hour or two before her visit and expects Ms. Tyre to drive the bus pass to her residence. Ms. Guerrero is unable to explain why transportation to her visits is an issue as this has not been a problem in the past. Ms. Tyre has the most success in contacting Ms. Guerrero during her visitation times as she is consistent in visiting.

Answer:

Jacqueline is a 24 year old female. She reports no health problems. She appears to be slightly over weight however this does not present to effect her mobility. Jacqueline does not report any substance use or misuse. She does not report taking any prescription drugs at this time. Jacqueline has mental health issues as bipolar and depression. These issues are part of her case plan with her other children to be addressed however there is a struggle to get her to actively address them. Her mental health prevents her from having proper motivation needed to properly care for Ethan. She is unable to work due to her lack of motivation,. and unable to

provide for Ethan's basic needs independently. She rely's on people around her and the agency in order to provide for basic needs and does not appear to have motivation to change this. Despite being provided multiple services, Ms. Guerrero has been unable to make changes in her parenting, motivation, or productiveness as an adult. Ms. Guerrero is often transient and stays at different people's homes until she is ultimately kicked out. She often depends on men to support her financially, and has not displayed an ability to be independent financially. Jacqueline was involved in a relationship with Robert however there was some violence in that relationship and Robert went to jail. Jacqueline reports not wishing to engage in another relationship with him and has since obtained another boyfriend by the name of Alberto. Jacqueline has indicated that Alberto has criminal history however no one knows what it is and they will not provide information about his birthday, social, etc. Mr. Hunt-Taylor has expressed extreme concern in regards to Alberto. Mr. Robert Hunt-Taylor believes that he is a drug user and is on the run from the law.

Ms. Guerrero has been difficult to work with in that she often acts like she does not understand what's happening around her or with her case dispute multiple conversations, documents, etc that have been provided explaining what is going on and what makes her home unsafe. She has poor follow through on any case planning or being independent. Impending Danger Threats:

Family does not have resources to meet basic needs.

Both parents have exhausted all resources within the community regarding housing. Prior to the family residing in the motel room and their apartment, the family was residing in the family shelter, gospel mission, men's shelter and family promise. It was reported to this agency that the family was kicked out of the Family Shelter Shelter in which the family stayed at the shelter from April 2012-September 2012. During that time frame, the family was kicked out of the shelter due to not obeying the rules, i.e. Jacqueline and Robert would not supervise their children, that the family would not clean their rooms however would clean other guest rooms, and would not follow their case plan as far as getting employment and finding their own housing. Once the family was kicked out, they accessed resources through the Men's Shelter as well as the Prayer House until the agencies were full. In October 2012, WCDSS assisted the family in getting into the Family Promise which would house the family until they could get into their own apartment. Robert was kicked out of Family Promise in November 2012 due to stealing belongings such as the director's cell phone, and continued to cause problems with the other families within the agency. Jacqueline and the children were able to stay at Family Promise until the agency went under due to lack of funding in December 2012.

Family is currently on the waitlist for housing as they just turned in their application as of March 2013. Family does not have support from other family members to see if they could stay with them until they could sustain stable housing. Jacqueline and Roberto lost their jobs and were depending on Robert's "free play" from Casino's to pay for rent. Jacqueline also receives TANF

however could not explain where her TANF money went as she initially stated that she paid for the motel room but then contradicted herself by saying her tax refund paid for the motel. Even though the family is accessing resources through out the community, i.e. Nevada State Welfare to include TANF and Food Stamps, the family is still unable to provide the basic needs for their children.

One or both parents/caregivers lack parenting knowledge, skills, and motivation which affects child safety.

Both parents are averse to parenting and they do not provide the basic needs to include shelter and educational needs for Roberto. Roberto has missed 45 days of school just this year and has been tardy on 8 separate occasions. Roberto's school counselor stated that she has excused some of the days due to the family's situation, i.e. 21 1/2 days have been excused, due to the family being transient. Lori reported that due to the attendance, Roberto has suffered academically and will more than likely have to repeat the grade. Lori stated that Roberto has Speech and Language difficulties and is currently on an IEP for that. Both parents were provided with information to attend a SAARB meeting in February 2013 for Roberto's poor attendance however both parents failed to attend that meeting. School offered the family with a conference call regarding the meeting and offered the family to reschedule the meeting but against the family failed to attend. Both parents have demonstrated their lack of motivation when it comes to parenting as both parents admitted that they do not take Roberto to the bus station even though the school has provided transportation for him.
