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

12 assigned to the State of Nevada versus Ralph Alexander,  
13 James Earl Parker and Tonya Martin, Grand Jury case  
14 number 14BGJ113A-C.

08:52 15 As a matter of housekeeping, ladies and  
16 gentlemen, you have previously heard testimony and  
17 returned a true bill on Ralph Alexander and James Parker  
18 back on August 13, 2015. We are now back here with a  
19 superseding Indictment which is your Exhibit Number 1 I  
08:52 20 believe. In that Indictment you will see charges that  
21 you've previously returned a true bill on and then there  
22 are new charges. So for clarity purposes if I could,  
23 the new charges, the charges that we're asking you to  
24 focus on today would be Count 1, conspiracy to commit  
08:53 25 robbery, and then jump to page 3, Counts 4, 5, 6, 7, 8,

08:53 1 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18 and 19. Those are  
2 the counts that we're going to be presenting evidence.  
3 The remainder of the counts you have already heard the  
4 evidence and already returned a true bill. Does anyone  
08:53 5 have any questions in that regard?

6 Additionally the counts that we're bringing  
7 to you now that are new counts involve charges that you  
8 have already been instructed on. So there are more  
9 counts but it's the same charges. You've already been  
08:54 10 instructed, you've also been given those instructions on  
11 the law. Does anyone have any questions on the  
12 instructions on the law before we start with our  
13 witnesses?

18 and nothing but the truth, testified as follows:

22 BY MR. PESCI:

23 Q. Sir, are you a detective with Metropolitan  
24 Police Department?

08:55 25 A. Yes, sir, I am.

08:55 1 Q. How long have you been with Metro?

2 A. Almost 18 years.

3 Q. And for some of those years did you work  
4 robbery?

08:55 5 A. Yes, sir, I did.

6 Q. I want to direct your attention back to an  
7 incident that occurred on or about June 15th of 2015 at  
8 the Boulder Station here in Las Vegas, Clark County,  
9 Nevada. That's on Boulder Highway; is that correct?

08:55 10 A. Yes, sir, it is.

11 Q. Were you involved in the investigation of  
12 some crimes that occurred there?

13 A. Yes, I was.

14 Q. And have you previously testified in front  
08:55 15 of this Grand Jury about that incident?

16 A. Yes, sir, I did.

17 Q. So we're bringing you back to talk about  
18 another facet of it. Previously you talked about the  
19 incident of a woman being robbed while she was seated at  
08:56 20 a game inside of a casino.

21 A. Yes, sir, that's correct.

22 Q. And you talked to us a lot about  
23 surveillance.

24 A. Yes, I did.

08:56 25 Q. In fact there was some information from the

08:56 1 surveillance and witnesses about a white female being  
2 involved potentially; is that correct?

3 A. That is correct.

4 Q. As you come here and testify today, did you  
08:56 5 interview an individual by the name of Tonya Martin?

6 A. Yes, sir, I did.

7 Q. Had she become a person of interest or a  
8 suspect in your investigation?

9 A. Yes, sir, she is.

08:56 10 Q. So when you spoke to her, was she arrested  
11 or not arrested?

12 A. No, she was not arrested.

13 Q. Did you ask her to come meet with you?

14 A. Yes, I did.

08:56 15 Q. Specifically was this on July the 27th of  
16 2015?

17 A. Yes, sir, it was.

18 Q. When she came to meet with you, was she  
19 placed in handcuffs?

08:56 20 A. No, she was not.

21 Q. Did you indicate to her that she was free  
22 to leave?

23 A. Yes, sir, I did.

24 Q. At any point was she restrained?

08:57 25 A. No, sir, she wasn't.

08:57 1 Q. At the end of your interview was she let  
2 go?

3 A. Yes, sir, she was.

4 Q. With that backdrop, did you ask her about  
08:57 5 the incident that occurred that day at the Boulder  
6 Station, that being June 15, 2015?

7 A. Yes, sir, I did.

8 Q. Showing you Grand Jury Exhibit Number 24.  
9 Do you recognize the individual in Grand Jury  
08:57 10 Exhibit 24?

11 A. Yes, sir, that's Tonya Martin.

12 Q. Is that a fair and accurate depiction of  
13 Miss Martin that you interviewed?

14 A. Yes, sir, it is.

08:57 15 Q. Did you ask her about the incident?

16 A. Yes, I did.

17 Q. What did she tell you?

18 A. She stated that she and Ralph were at the  
19 casino. At one point they had left, went into her  
08:57 20 vehicle. At some point Mr. Alexander had changed  
21 clothes, left the vehicle, went back inside and then she  
22 had stated that she had left the parking lot just to the  
23 outside of the Boulder Station parking lot.

24 Q. In your investigation had you reviewed the  
08:58 25 surveillance from Boulder Station?

08:58 1 A. Yes, I did.

2 Q. Was there a vehicle of interest in that  
3 surveillance?

4 A. Yes, there was. It was a 2000, early  
08:58 5 2000's gold Taurus.

6 Q. Showing you Grand Jury Exhibit 23. Do you  
7 recognize that?

8 A. Yes, it is the vehicle registration.

9 Q. So is this DMV records about that  
08:58 10 particular car?

11 A. Yes, it is.

12 Q. And is that a 2002 --

13 A. Yes, it is, a 2002 Ford Taurus.

14 Q. What's the color?

08:58 15 A. It looks like --

16 Q. Or do you remember the color?

17 A. It was gold. They don't have the color  
18 depicted on here.

19 Q. Were you able to confirm with Miss Martin  
08:58 20 the video surveillance about the car?

21 A. Yes, I did.

22 Q. Did you ask her if that was her car?

23 A. Yes, I did, she stated it was.

24 Q. So now that car was the car that you had  
08:58 25 seen in the surveillance outside of Boulder Station?

08:58 1 A. Yes, it was.

2 Q. What did she tell you happened in the car?

3 A. She stated that Mr. Alexander had, when  
4 they originally left to go into the vehicle, that he had  
08:59 5 changed his clothes and then exited the vehicle and she  
6 stated that she exited to the parking lot, exited the  
7 parking lot just off of I believe it was Lamb Boulevard  
8 which runs right next to the Boulder Station. Short  
9 time later Mr. Alexander came running and then reentered  
08:59 10 the vehicle.

11 Q. Now did that corroborate or was that  
12 consistent with what you saw in the video surveillance  
13 and the information you had from witnesses in this case?

14 A. Yes, it did.

08:59 15 Q. And in particular you previously testified  
16 about how there was a change of clothes?

17 A. Yes, I did.

18 Q. And so she confirmed that?

19 A. Yes, that's correct.

08:59 20 Q. Did she indicate to you who Ralph Alexander  
21 was to her?

22 A. I don't recall, I believe it was either her  
23 boyfriend or her husband. I'm pretty sure it was her  
24 boyfriend or something like that. Significant other.

08:59 25 Q. Did she say that after Mr. Alexander



08:59 1 changed he went back into the casino?

2 A. Yes, he did reenter the casino.

3 Q. And then what did she tell you happened  
4 after that?

08:59 5 A. She stated that once he got back in the car  
6 that he had told her that he had robbed, there was a  
7 lady that was sitting in there that he robbed.

8 Q. And ladies and gentlemen of the Grand Jury,  
9 what one witness says that the other witness said, you  
09:00 10 cannot use that against Mr. Alexander. This is really  
11 going to Miss Martin and what she knew what was going  
12 on. Will you not use that against Mr. Alexander?  
13 Everyone can understand that and follow that admonition?  
14 Thank you.

09:00 15 So Miss Martin said that she understood  
16 what was going on as far as what he did inside?

17 A. That is correct.

18 Q. And did she indicate to you ever that she  
19 saw a gun?

09:00 20 A. No. She as a matter of fact stated that  
21 she had never observed him with a firearm.

22 Q. You had information from the witness and  
23 the victims about a gun; is that correct?

24 A. That is correct.

09:00 25 Q. Based upon that you asked her specifically

09:00 1 about that?

2 A. That is correct.

3 Q. And if I understand you correctly, she  
4 denied seeing a gun?

09:00 5 A. That is correct.

6 Q. What about any money or proceeds from the

8 A. She stated that Mr. Alexander had gotten  
9 \$200 from the incident.

16 believe it was North Lamb.

17 Q. Was there anything else from that interview  
18 that you think is pertinent to this presentation?

19 A. Not that I can think of.

24 BY MS. KILLER:

09:05 25 Q. Good morning, Mr. Tran.

09:05 1 A. Good morning.

2 Q. Because we're taking a record of this, the  
3 interpreter has to give all of your responses and ask  
4 all of my questions even if you might be able to  
09:05 5 understand part of it.

6 A. Okay. Yes.

7 Q. Directing your attention to June 26th of  
8 2015 at around 6:45 p.m. Were you at work at the LV  
9 Nail Spa at 4430 East Charleston here in Las Vegas,  
09:06 10 Clark County, Nevada?

11 A. Yes.

12 Q. What is your position with the nail spa,  
13 how are you employed there?

14 A. I'm a nail technician.

09:06 15 Q. On the evening of June 26th did something  
16 occur which causes you to be here today to testify?

17 A. Yes. That day I was working, it was on a  
18 Friday, and we had a lot of customers at that location.  
19 At that time suddenly I saw two men walk in. I saw one  
09:07 20 of the men had a gun in his hand and they approached the  
21 women who were the nail technicians and they were asking  
22 something. They said, they asked about the cell phone,  
23 the laptop or the wallets, they have to hand them over.

24 Q. Let me take you back a little bit. When  
09:08 25 they walked in, were you able to see their faces or did

09:08 1 they have something covering their faces?

2 A. The one that had the gun did not cover his  
3 face. The other one who stood near the front door had a  
4 face mask. And then both of them collected the items.

09:08 5 Q. The one who had the mask on, what did it  
6 look like?

7 A. It was a small leather piece. It covers  
8 from --

9 THE INTERPRETER: Gesturing from the nose  
09:09 10 down to the mouth.

11 THE WITNESS: It was a black leather and it  
12 has opening for the mouth where you could see his mouth.

13 THE INTERPRETER: Not see his mouth.  
14 Sorry.

09:09 15 THE WITNESS: The face mask had a picture  
16 of a mouth on it with a smiling, a smiling open mouth.  
17 BY MS. KILLER:

18 Q. Okay. Was it like dark and then it had a  
19 light face on it?

09:10 20 A. That face mask had a mouth painted on it  
21 with a smiling mouth on it.

22 Q. Okay. And did you see -- how many guns did  
23 you see with them?

24 A. Because when I was sitting which is toward  
09:10 25 the back of the store I saw the man had one gun. The

09:10 1 man near the front door who was collecting the items,  
2 I'm thinking that he had also a gun on his side but I'm  
3 not sure because he didn't display his gun. His hands  
4 were busy collecting the items.

09:11 5 Q. And you had said at some point during the  
6 incident both people took items from the people in the  
7 store?

8 A. Yes.

9 Q. Did they take any money from your business?

09:12 10 A. I saw that they collected money from the  
11 owner on the table. It was on a nail table where they  
12 collected the money and it was in a pile on the table.

13 Q. Did they take anything from you?

14 A. They demanded from me but I told them I  
09:12 15 didn't have anything, I was working.

16 Q. Did they have you, did you have to move  
17 from where you were sitting at all or did you stay in  
18 the same place during the whole incident?

19 A. No. I was so scared.

09:13 20 MS. KILLER: At this time the State has no  
21 further questions for Mr. Tran. Do the ladies and  
22 gentlemen of the Grand Jury have any?

23 A JUROR: Just a date. Did you say  
24 June 15th?

09:13 25 MR. PESCI: I believe I said June 26th of

09:13 1 2015.

2 Q. Is that the date this occurred, Mr. Tran?

3 A JUROR: It is the date. I heard the  
4 15th. Forgive me.

2 A. Yes.

3 Q. Is Vietnamese your first language?

4 A. Yeah.

09:17 5 Q. Okay. What is your job at the nail spa?

6 A. Nail tech.

7 Q. Were you working there with Cang Tran?

8 A. Yes.

9 Q. Is that the gentleman that just left the

09:17 10 Grand Jury?

11 A. Correct.

12 Q. Were you the supervisor or what was your

13 job?

14 A. Yes, supervisor.

09:17 15 Q. What happened?

16 A. I speak in Vietnamese?

17 Q. Please.

18 A. I was waxing on a customer and there were

19 two people who enter the store with a gun.

09:18 20 Q. Can you describe those two people?

21 A. They are black and they wore face mask.

22 Q. Were they men or women?

23 A. Men.

24 Q. And then can you describe the masks?

09:18 25 A. It's a face mask, it's like a Halloween

09:18 1 mask that has a skull on it.

2 Q. So one mask had a skull?

3 A. And the other one it was only covering the  
4 mouth.

09:18 5 Q. So the second person, the person without  
6 the skull mask, had something else on his face?

7 A. Yes, it was a mouth covering.

8 Q. What did these two men do?

9 A. They told everybody to stand up and give  
09:19 10 them money.

11 Q. Did they take any money from you?

12 A. Yes.

13 Q. When they did this, did they have a gun?

14 A. Yes, they had gun and they put it on my  
09:19 15 body.

16 Q. How many guns did you see?

17 A. I was so scared so I don't know if one of  
18 them had a gun or not, but the one that was holding the  
19 gun to me had the gun.

09:20 20 Q. Okay. Did he actually touch you with the  
21 gun or did he just point the gun at you?

22 A. He pointed a gun at my heart, my body.

23 Q. Can you describe the gun?

24 A. It's about this big. It's not too big.

09:20 25 Q. Is it a handgun?

09:20 1 A. Yes.

2 Q. Where did you get the money to give him  
3 from?

4 A. It was money that I collected from the  
09:20 5 customers. It was in the drawer.

6 Q. In the drawer?

7 A. Yes.

8 Q. So your business drawer where you kept the  
9 money from the business?

09:20 10 A. Yes.

11 Q. How much money did you give him?

12 A. I don't remember exactly but it's about six  
13 or \$700.

14 Q. Did you also give him your cell phone?

09:21 15 A. They demanded a cell phone but when they  
16 opened the drawer they didn't see it.

17 Q. Okay. So you did not give your cell phone?

18 A. No.

19 Q. Did you see other customers also handing  
09:21 20 over money or personal items?

21 A. They hand over their small wallets or cell  
22 phones.

23 Q. The man that had the gun on you, while he  
24 was doing that, what was the other man doing?

09:22 25 A. While he was pointing a gun at me the other

09:22 1 one was collecting the money or the items from the  
2 customers.

3 Q. Did they threaten you?

4 A. He said you have to sit down, otherwise if  
09:22 5 you don't sit down I will shoot you.

6 Q. Did you sit down?

7 A. Yes.

8 Q. After they grabbed stuff from everyone did  
9 they leave?

09:22 10 A. Yes.

11 Q. Did you see where they went?

12 A. No. I was so scared.

13 MR. PESCI: No further questions from the  
14 State. Are there any questions from the Grand Jury?

09:23 15 BY A JUROR:

16 Q. So no personal property was taken from you  
17 during the robbery?

18 A. No, just the cash.

19 Q. Thank you.

09:23 20 BY A JUROR:

21 Q. Did he actually put the gun on your heart  
22 or did he, was he away from you when he pointed the gun  
23 at your heart?

24 A. He held onto my shirt and pointed the gun  
09:23 25 but did not touch my body, no.

09:23 1 Q. Thank you.

2 BY MR. PESCI:

3 Q. Following up on that first question. Your  
4 own personal money wasn't taken from you, but you were  
09:23 5 the person who got the money from the store and gave it  
6 to him; is that correct?

7 A. So that day I had a hundred dollar cash for  
8 the change of the money, plus the money that I collected  
9 from the customers.

09:24 10 Q. Okay. Thank you.

11 THE FOREPERSON: No further questions.

12 By law, these proceedings are secret and  
13 you are prohibited from disclosing to anyone anything  
14 that has transpired before us, including evidence and  
09:24 15 statements presented to the Grand Jury, any event  
16 occurring or statement made in the presence of the Grand

24 Do you understand this admonition?

09:24 25 THE WITNESS: Yes.

09:24 1 THE FOREPERSON: Thank you, ma'am. You're  
2 excused.

3 THE WITNESS: Thank you.

4 THE FOREPERSON: If you could, ma'am,  
09:25 5 please raise your right hand.

6 You do solemnly swear the testimony you are

09:26 25 THE FOREPERSON: Thank you.



09:26 1 EVANGELINA ESPINOZA,  
2 having been first duly sworn by the Foreperson of the  
3 Grand Jury to testify to the truth, the whole truth,  
4 and nothing but the truth, testified as follows:

09:26 5

6 EXAMINATION

7

8 BY MR. PESCI:

9 Q. Ma'am, I want to direct your attention to

09:26 10 about 6:45 p.m. on June 26th of this year. Were you at  
11 the Las Vegas Nail Spa on East Charleston?

12 A. Yes.

13 Q. Were you a customer there?

14 A. Yes.

09:27 15 Q. Were you having your nails down?

16 A. My feet.

17 Q. I apologize. So it was a pedicure?

18 A. Yes, it was a pedicure.

19 Q. What happened in the mist of your pedicure

09:27 20 that you had probably not planned for?

21 A. Well, she was about to paint my nails and  
22 all of a sudden you hear the door open, they have some  
23 little bells there, and the two guys, there was two men  
24 or boys, whatever, and he said to give him the cell

09:27 25 phone and your money and he just pointed the gun at all

09:27 1 of us.

2 Q. Let's describe those two men. Could you  
3 describe them please?

4 A. Maybe a little bit taller than me. They  
09:27 5 were thin built. One of them had like a mask and then  
6 the other one had like covered. The one that had the  
7 gun, I don't remember if he was the one with the mask,  
8 and the one that was like behind him just had his face,  
9 like half of his face, and one of them was like light  
09:28 10 color and the other one was dark, darker.

11 Q. Were they white, were they Hispanic, were  
12 they black?

13 A. No, to me I think they were black.

14 Q. But you're saying that one was a lighter  
09:28 15 complexion than the other?

16 A. Yes. Uh-huh.

17 Q. That woman right there is taking everything  
18 down. We just can't talk at the same time.

19 A. Okay.

09:28 20 Q. Thank you.

21 Now let's go through these masks. You said  
22 one of them just covered up part of the face?

23 A. Yes.

24 Q. Can you describe that?

09:28 25 A. It was maybe like a bandanna.

09:28 1 Q. Do you remember the color?

2 A. No.

3 Q. That's okay. The other individual,  
4 describe what was on his face.

09:28 5 A. He had like a skull mask.

6 Q. So there was a mask and on the mask there  
7 was a depiction of a skull?

8 A. Yeah.

9 Q. And you remember at least one gun?

09:28 10 A. Yes.

11 Q. Can you describe it?

12 A. I don't know the gun. I just know it was a  
13 gun.

14 Q. That's okay. Was it a handgun?

09:29 15 A. Yeah.

16 Q. Did you see a second gun or just one?

17 A. No, just one.

18 Q. What was being said by these two  
19 individuals?

09:29 20 A. He just, when he walked in he was just like  
21 to give us your cell phone and give me your money.

22 Q. When you say he, the person that said that,  
23 could you remember if that was the one with the bandanna  
24 or the one with the skull mask?

09:29 25 A. He was, I think he was the one with the

09:29 1 skull mask.

2 Q. Whichever one of them said it, what was the  
3 other one doing when the one person said give us your  
4 cell phones and money?

09:29 5 A. He was just standing like, like in the  
6 back. Like he was just standing there. He wouldn't do  
7 nothing.

8 Q. What happened next?

9 A. And then he just like took my cell phone.  
09:29 10 And he went to the next girl, he went to the next girl,  
11 he got her stuff, he went to the other one, he got her  
12 stuff and he walked right back. And then he came back  
13 to the front and he just like put the gun to, I guess  
14 she was the owner. I mean I still picture that gun like  
09:30 15 on the side of me.

16 Q. Was the gun pointed at you?

17 A. I wasn't pointed at me but it was pointed  
18 at her, in her chest, and he told her to open the cash  
19 register.

09:30 20 Q. Did you see her open it?

21 A. Uh-huh.

22 Q. Is that a yes?

23 A. Yes.

24 Q. It's okay, ma'am. Do you need a break? Do  
09:30 25 you want to take a break?

09:30 1 A. No, I'm okay.

2 Q. You said that a cell phone was taken. Was  
3 there anything else taken from you besides your cell  
4 phone?

09:30 5 A. My cell phone, my ATM card and two credit  
6 cards and \$40.

7 Q. So some cash, some credit cards. Did you  
8 have any of your IDs?

9 A. Yeah, it was my driver's license.

09:30 10 Q. And that was all taken from you?

11 A. Uh-huh.

12 Q. Is that a yes?

13 A. Yes.

14 Q. You're doing great, ma'am.

09:30 15 And that was by the two people?

16 A. No, just the one that was doing everything,  
17 like the main one that had the gun, because the other  
18 one was just standing there.

19 Q. Where was he standing?

09:31 20 A. Like as you walk in, there's like, where  
21 she has like her nail polishes there and then her  
22 register is like in back of it. And then there's like a  
23 chair there. So he was just standing like by the, like  
24 by the counter.

09:31 25 Q. Is that a counter or -- is that near the

09:31 1 door?

2 A. Yeah, that counter's nearby the door.

3 Q. So that second individual who was not  
4 actually taking stuff, was he standing by the door?

09:31 5 A. Yeah, he was just standing like not by the  
6 door, like you could say like a piece like this by the  
7 counter.

8 Q. By the counter?

9 A. Uh-huh. Like he was just like watching us  
09:31 10 to see what our movements was.

11 Q. So he was watching over as it was all  
12 happening?

13 A. Uh-huh.

14 Q. Is that yes?

09:31 15 A. Yes. I'm sorry.

16 Q. It's okay. What happened next?

17 A. And then when he pointed the gun at her and  
18 he took the money, he walked again, and then he took the  
19 lady's phone that was, because like she still had it  
09:32 20 there and I guess he missed it the first time, so he  
21 snatched it and he went all the way to the end and he  
22 told the man that was there doing the nails to go down  
23 to the floor and like he pushed him down. And then  
24 that's when he told the girl that was there, I got you  
09:32 25 baby girl, like not you. She had her purse.

09:32 1 Q. One of the customers?

2 A. Yeah, one of the customers. She had her  
3 purse with her when she came out of the nail salon and  
4 she had her phone.

09:32 5 Q. Did you know her?

6 A. No.

7 Q. You don't know her name?

8 A. No.

9 Q. So nothing was taken from her?

09:32 10 A. That I recall and I remember, no.

11 Q. Okay. And what happened after that?

12 A. Then he walked back and he was saying for  
13 nobody to move, like just nobody moved and they just ran  
14 out.

09:32 15 Q. Now the individual that you've described  
16 that was going around taking stuff, was that the person  
17 with the skull mask?

18 A. Uh-huh.

19 Q. Is that a yes?

09:33 20 A. Yes, I think I do think that it was him.

21 Q. Did you see them leave?

22 A. Yeah. When they just left, that's when  
23 everybody just got up. I mean I didn't see them leave  
24 but I know that they were saying that there was somebody  
09:33 25 outside waiting for them.

09:33 1 Q. But you didn't see that?

2 A. No, I didn't see that.

3 Q. We ask the Grand Jury to strike that  
4 information, to not consider that.

09:33 5 But did you see them actually go out the  
6 store?

7 A. Yes.

8 Q. Did they go together?

9 A. Yeah, they ran both together. They went to  
09:33 10 the, your left, I'm sorry.

11 Q. Do you know who the person was that they  
12 got the cell phone the second time through?

13 A. The young lady that was next to me. I mean  
14 she's outside.

09:33 15 Q. Okay.

16 A. Cause I remember like who was sitting in  
17 the chairs and everything.

18 MR. PESCI: All right. No more questions.  
19 Any questions from the Grand Jury?

09:34 20 BY A JUROR:

21 Q. Miss Espinoza, how many employees were in  
22 the store at the time?

23 A. It was the one that was doing mine and then  
24 the next one -- one, two, three four -- I believe it was  
09:34 25 four or five. With the owner.



09:34 1 Q. Thank you.

2 THE FOREPERSON: No more questions.

3 By law, these proceedings are secret and

4 you are prohibited from disclosing to anyone anything

09:34 5 that has transpired before us, including evidence and

6 statements presented to the Grand Jury, any event

7 occurring or statement made in the presence of the Grand

8 Jury, and information obtained by the Grand Jury.

19 THE FOREPERSON: Thank you.

09:36 20 ANGELICA MIRANDA,  
21 having been first duly sworn by the Foreperson of the  
22 Grand Jury to testify to the truth, the whole truth,  
23 and nothing but the truth, testified as follows:

09:36 25 EXAMINATION

09:36

1

2 BY MS. KILLER:

3

Q. Good morning, Miss Miranda.

4

A. Good morning.

09:36

5

Q. On June 26th of 2015, were you at the LV

6

Nail Spa at 4430 East Charleston here in Las Vegas,

7

Clark County, Nevada?

8

A. Yes, I was.

9

Q. And did something occur around 6:45 p.m.

09:37

10

which causes you to be here today?

11

A. Yes.

12

Q. What happened that you weren't expecting to

13

happen?

14

A. I was sitting down getting a pedicure and

09:37

15

two gentlemen walked in and started to rob the place at

16

gunpoint.

17

Q. Those gentlemen who walked in, could you

18

tell if they were black, white, Hispanic or Asian?

19

A. They were black.

09:37

20

Q. And if you remember, can you describe for

21

us their build? Were they tall, short, fat, thin?

22

A. The first one -- well, they kind of both

23

came in simultaneous, but one stayed towards the front

24

of the store, one stayed towards the back of the store.

09:37

25

The one that came to the back of the store, he was

09:37 1 taller, little slimmer. He was wearing big clothing and  
2 he had multiple layers of clothing so it's kind of hard  
3 to tell the exact build, but he was taller. The other  
4 one, he was a little shorter, a little lighter skin.

09:38 5 The other one was a little darker skin. They were both  
6 wearing jeans and like two layers of clothing. They  
7 both have a double layer of clothing. I can't give, if  
8 I had to guess, one was probably around 6-foot, maybe  
9 the other one is around 5'10", 5'11", somewhere around  
09:38 10 there if I had to guess.

11 Q. Did they have anything over their faces?

12 A. One of them that came to the far end, he  
13 had a full ski mask with a skull print on it. The one  
14 that stayed in the front, he had a blue or black  
09:38 15 bandanna across the lower part, from his nose down. One  
16 of them had a baseball cap on and I can't really  
17 remember if it was the one that was in the far end or  
18 the front end, but one of them did have a baseball cap  
19 as well. The one that had the full mask, he had little  
09:39 20 twisties or curls in his hair. The one that was in the  
21 very front of the store, he had like I guess  
22 unmanageable hair and it was in a ponytail. It was not  
23 as neat as the other guy's hair.

24 Q. Did you see, you had said robbed at  
09:39 25 gunpoint. Did you see one or both of the gentlemen who

09:39 1 came in with a gun?

2 A. They both had guns. The gentleman that was  
3 at the, that came and walked all the way to the far end,  
4 he had a revolver. The gentleman that stayed up front  
09:39 5 and actually was more the aggressor, he had, it was an  
6 automatic, semi-automatic. Maybe a nine millimeter.  
7 Probably it was, it was --

8 Q. Was it a handgun though?

9 A. Yeah. Yeah, it was definitely a handgun.

09:40 10 I was just trying to think. To me it looked like an  
11 older style. It wasn't like a new one, you know. I'm a  
12 little bit familiar with guns so.

13 Q. If you happen to remember, do you recall  
14 what color either of the guns were?

09:40 15 A. The revolver was like a gun metal, like a  
16 silver, but not a shiny silver but kind of like a gray,  
17 almost like this color kind of. And brown. I think it  
18 had a brown handle.

19 The other one that was in the front with  
09:40 20 the semi-automatic to me looked like a 9-millimeter,  
21 probably a five inch, six inch barrel. That one was  
22 black, all black.

23 Q. Correct me if I am remembering what you  
24 just said wrong.

09:40 25 A. Sure.

09:40 1 Q. So the person that stayed in the front of  
2 the store had the black semi-automatic gun?

3 A. Correct.

4 Q. And the person that came and walked back  
09:40 5 near you had the brown revolver or the gray or silver  
6 revolver with the brown grip?

7 A. Correct.

8 Q. Did they demand any items?

9 A. Yes. When they first walked in, the one in  
09:41 10 the front, he said this is what's going to happen, he's  
11 like everybody is going to give us all your money, all  
12 your purses, everything. Everybody stayed still. And  
13 then the gentleman that had walked to the back, he was  
14 pointing the gun and then the one in the front ended up  
09:41 15 grabbing the owner and pulled her and made her go,  
16 because she wasn't in the front where the register was,  
17 and he took her over there and then he was asking her  
18 for the money and she wasn't giving it, she didn't want  
19 to, didn't want to, and then he told her, you know like  
09:41 20 he threw her, he pretty much like threw her over there  
21 and told her to open it and for her not to make him  
22 shoot her over no dumb shit. And then, so then she  
23 opened the register and then she, you know, gave him the  
24 money. And then the other gentleman pulled out a bag  
09:42 25 from his pocket. He pulled out like one of those

09:42 1 reusable grocery bags, it was a blue, it was like a blue  
2 Walmart bag, he pulled it out of his pocket and then  
3 started going by everybody and grabbing everybody's  
4 purses and wallets and everything and putting them in  
09:42 5 the bag.

6 Q. The one that was walking around grabbing  
7 items, putting them in the blue bag, which face covering  
8 did he have?

9 A. The full face.

09:42 10 Q. The one --

11 A. The one with the revolver.

12 Q. Sorry, we just can't talk at the same time.  
13 It was which one?

14 A. The one with the revolver, the taller one.

09:42 15 Q. And the mask he had on --

16 A. The full mask.

17 Q. With the skull on it?

18 A. Yes, the skull mask.

19 Q. And then the one that grabbed the owner was  
09:42 20 the one with the, you said the half --

21 A. The bandanna, the half face bandanna.

22 Q. What items did they take from you  
23 personally?

24 A. My phone, my phone charger, my purse. It  
09:42 25 was a wallet, it wasn't actually a purse. It was a

09:42 1 wallet and it had everything in there. My IDs, driver's  
2 license, military ID, credit cards. It had, I had my  
3 paycheck, I had just cashed my paycheck so they took all  
4 my money. They took everything.

09:43 5 Q. You said you had just cashed your paycheck.  
6 So was there actual US currency or cash in your wallet?

7 A. Cash, uh-huh.

8 Q. After the man with the skull mask came  
9 around and collected the items from the customers  
09:43 10 including yourself, what happened next?

11 A. After that the other one in the front with  
12 the semi-automatic, he asked the owner to get on her  
13 knees, he told her to get on her knees and to get down.  
14 Then he walked all the way to the end where I was and  
09:43 15 where the other gunman was and there was another  
16 employee that was in front of me that was doing a lady's  
17 nails, he told him to get on the ground. He wouldn't do  
18 it and he was afraid and he was like no, no, no, and  
19 then he's like, you know, get on the ground, and he  
09:44 20 wouldn't do it and he wouldn't do it. The worker kind  
21 of like got in a semi-fetal position and then he still  
22 wouldn't get on the ground so the gentleman shoved him  
23 and he went on the floor. And while he was on the floor  
24 he just stayed like in a fetal position. Then after  
09:44 25 that they got up and they went out.



09:44 1 Q. Did you see where they went after they went  
2 out the front door?

3 A. No, because, I just saw them run, I saw  
4 them run out the door and then they took a left out the  
09:44 5 door, but then after that I couldn't because everybody  
6 else that was in there kind of ran up to the, and she  
7 had the shade down too much to where we couldn't see.  
8 That's why we couldn't see them come in.

9 Q. I wanted to clarify one thing with you so I  
09:44 10 make sure I'm getting it right. You said when they  
11 walked in, it was the person who stayed in the front  
12 with the bandanna who gave the initial commands about  
13 what was going to happen?

14 A. Right. Correct. He seemed to be the one  
09:45 15 in command the whole time. The other one was just  
16 pretty much there doing what the other said. But he  
17 did, is the one that demanded, when he was coming he was  
18 like grabbing everybody's belongings and stuff.

19 MS. KILLER: At this time the State has no  
09:45 20 further questions. Do the ladies and gentlemen of the  
21 Grand Jury have any?

22 THE WITNESS: Yes, ma'am.

23 BY A JUROR:

24 Q. How did he know which one was the owner?  
09:45 25 Did he ask who was the owner there?

09:45 1 A. No, ma'am, he just --

2 Q. So he knew who it was?

3 A. Correct. He knew -- they had to have known  
4 because he just walked in and went straight to her. And  
09:45 5 normally -- I mean I've been going here for eight years  
6 I've been going to this nail shop. So she normally sits  
7 in the very front, but at this time she wasn't there  
8 because she was doing a pedicure and she had just  
9 stopped doing a pedicure so that she can go do eyebrows  
09:46 10 and the girl that was sitting in that chair was in the  
11 one almost next to the register. But he couldn't have  
12 known because there was like three other workers and he  
13 just went to her and specifically picked her up and took  
14 her over there. Didn't ask who's the owner, didn't ask  
09:46 15 any of that questions. He specifically went to her.

16 Q. Thank you.

17 A JUROR: She asked the question I was  
18 going to ask. Thank you.

19 BY A JUROR:

09:46 20 Q. Did either of these gunmen appear to be  
21 familiar with anyone else, talk to anybody by name or --

22 A. They didn't seem to be familiar. The only  
23 thing I can tell you is there was a young lady getting  
24 her nails done that was sitting right directly across  
09:46 25 from me, she had her belongings, and none of her

09:46 1 belongings got taken from her. There was nothing taken  
2 from her and he only talked to her like when he was  
3 telling the gentleman that was doing her nails to get on  
4 the floor, get on the floor, he told her, not you baby  
09:47 5 girl, you're okay. But that's the only person he seemed  
6 to have talked to. And she's the only one that nothing  
7 got taken from.

8 BY MS. KILLER:

9 Q. Could you describe that lady you were just  
09:47 10 speaking of?

11 A. She is, she is a lighter skin black female,  
12 she has curly hair. It was, she kind of looks mixed  
13 actually. She could pass like if she was mixed, maybe  
14 African American and white kind of mix. Her hair was a  
09:47 15 lighter brown, curly. She had it up in a ponytail at  
16 the time I believe. She's probably 5'4", 5'5",  
17 somewhere around there. She's thin. That's all I can  
18 remember.

19 MS. KILLER: Thank you.

09:47 20 One more question over here.

21 BY A JUROR:

22 Q. Did you get your ID back?

23 A. I didn't get anything back, no, ma'am. I  
24 had to get them but I didn't -- they kept everything.

09:47 25 Yes, sir.

09:47 1 BY A JUROR:

2 Q. What do you do for a living?

3 A. Service adviser for an auto part, for a  
4 dealership.

09:48 5 Q. How much money did they take from you?

6 A. That check, it was 14, it was either 1435  
7 or 1485 that they took. My check was more but I had  
8 stopped and paid my phone bill because Sprint was across  
9 the street. So I had stopped and paid my phone bill so  
09:48 10 I did make a couple payments before I got there, because  
11 my appointment was at 5:30 wasn't ready, so I ended up  
12 coming back. So out of my 1600, they took about 1435,  
13 1485.

14 Q. And how do you know so much about guns?

09:48 15 A. I have four actually now. So I do.

16 Q. Good for you.

17 A. I grew up in Texas. I grew up around guns.

18 Q. Thank you.

19 A. You're welcome.

09:48 20 A JUROR: Angelica, I just wanted to tell  
21 you that you make a very good witness and you're very

2 nails done at the Las Vegas Nail Spa on East Charleston?

3 A. No, I was getting my eyebrows done.

4 Q. Okay. I keep messing that up. I asked  
10:10 5 someone that too and they were getting their feet done.

6 So you were at that spa?

7 A. Yes.

8 Q. And you were getting your eyebrows done?

9 A. Yes.

10:10 10 Q. And it was at about 6:45 at night?

11 A. I don't know exactly what it was.

12 Q. Was it in the evening?

13 A. Yeah, it was close to closing so around  
14 that time.

10:11 15 Q. What happens that brings you here?

16 A. I was laying down getting my eyebrows waxed  
17 and two guys came in, one had on a mask and the other  
18 one, he had on a black bandanna around his face, and  
19 they robbed the place. They both had guns.

10:11 20 Q. Can you describe them?

21 A. The one that was at the far end, I can't  
22 describe him because he had on a white mask.

23 Q. Can you describe the mask?

24 A. It was a white mask. It wasn't like a -- I  
10:11 25 think kind of like a Scream mask.

10:11 1 Q. Scream?

2 A. Yeah, like a Scream mask.

3 Q. So kind of like a white ghost almost?

4 A. Yeah. And it was like kind of long at the

10:11 5 bottom. And the other guy, he had a black bandanna,

6 nappy hair pulled to the back like in a ponytail.

7 Q. Were they tall? What was their --

8 A. I think he was probably about like 5'9".

9 Q. And were these males, females?

10:12 10 A. They were males.

11 Q. Were they white, black, Hispanic?

12 A. Black.

13 Q. And then you said how many guns did you

14 see?

10:12 15 A. Two. One of them was a black gun and the

16 other one, it was like, I think it was black and it had

17 like a brown handle. I know it had a brown handle but I

18 can't remember if it was black or like silver.

19 Q. And were these handguns?

10:12 20 A. Yes.

21 Q. Do you know the difference between a

22 semi-automatic handgun and a revolver?

23 A. Is a semi the one that got like the six?

24 Q. I can't really give you that. It's just if

10:12 25 you know.

10:12 1 A. Okay. The one gun that had the brown  
2 handle, I know that one is the one that had like the  
3 little barrel with the, you know, that has, it usually  
4 has about six bullets.

10:12 5 Q. Kind of like an old cowboy gun, the  
6 cylinder?

7 A. Yeah, that one had that and a brown handle.  
8 And the other one was a regular black gun.

9 Q. What did these two people do?

10:13 10 A. They robbed the place. The one --

11 Q. Did they demand anything? Did they say  
12 anything?

13 A. Yeah. They demanded for us to give them  
14 our stuff. The one that had the black bandanna on his  
10:13 15 face, he was standing right next to me, he told the lady  
16 to open up the drawer and, you know, give him the money  
17 and everything and he's like don't make me kill you over  
18 no stupid shit. Wait. Don't make me shoot you over no  
19 stupid shit, that's what he said. And then she opened  
10:13 20 the drawer and she walked back like towards where I was  
21 but on the left side and he told her to get on the floor  
22 and he grabbed my wallet. And the other guy was on the  
23 other end and he grabbed everyone's stuff. And then the  
24 one that had the black bandanna, he walked back to the  
10:14 25 end and he asked the, I'm not sure if he was the owner

10:14 1 but the short Asian guy, he asked him for the money or  
2 whatever and he didn't have no money to give him.

3 Q. Okay. You said that your wallet was taken?

4 A. Yeah.

10:14 5 Q. Did you have money in your wallet?

6 A. Yes.

7 Q. Did you have credit cards and ID in your  
8 wallet?

9 A. Yes.

10:14 10 Q. Those were all taken from you?

11 A. Yeah.

12 Q. Was the gun pointed at you when it was  
13 taken?

14 A. No, the gun wasn't pointed at me.

10:14 15 Q. But did he have or one of them have a gun  
16 while it was taken from you?

17 A. Yes.

18 Q. Did you see them do anything else?

19 A. No. I just know that the one that had the  
10:14 20 black bandanna around his face, he did, he pointed the  
21 gun at the owner, the Chinese lady.

22 Q. Where the drawer was?

23 A. Yes.

24 Q. And did you see that money taken from the  
10:15 25 drawer?

10:15 1 A. Yes.

2 Q. And then at some point did they eventually  
3 leave?

4 A. Yes.

10:15 5 Q. Was there one person that nothing was taken  
6 from?

7 A. Yes. It was a black lady, she was the one  
8 that was getting her nails done on the end where the  
9 short Asian guy was. She didn't get anything taken.

10:15 10 She went to try to hand her stuff and he was like no  
11 baby girl, you all right, or something like that. And  
12 then they left.

13 Q. Did you see them leave?

14 A. Yes.

10:15 15 Q. Did they leave together?

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. Did you see which way they went?

18 A. They went left towards the beauty salon.

19 Q. Could you see outside?

10:15 20 A. Yes.

21 Q. What did you see out there?

22 A. I saw them get in a white car.

23 Q. A white car?

24 A. Yes.

10:16 25 Q. Do you remember anything else about the



10:16 1 car?

2 A. It was, it looked like those old police  
3 cars.

4 Q. Could you see someone in the car?

10:16 5 A. No, I just saw the two guys get in the back  
6 seat.

22 EXAMINATION

24 BY MS. KILLER:

10:18 25 Q. Miss Montes-Cervantes, directing your

10:18 1 attention to June 26th of 2015. Were you at the LV Nail  
2 Spa on 4430 East Charleston here in Las Vegas, Clark  
3 County, Nevada?

4 A. Yes.

10:19 5 Q. And was that around 6:45 in the evening?

6 A. Yeah, right when they're about to close.

7 Q. Do you know what time they close?

8 A. I just know that it was before 7 o'clock  
9 because I think they close at 7:00 so it was around

10:19 10 6:00.

11 Q. So sometime shortly before 7:00 did  
12 something occur which causes you to be here today?

13 A. Yes.

14 Q. What happened?

10:19 15 A. Well, I went with my sister to the salon to  
16 get a pedicure and as we were just minding our own  
17 business, just sitting down, two men walked in with  
18 guns. They rushed in, started pointing guns at us. One  
19 was kind of like right in front of us and the other one  
10:19 20 was telling the owner to give up the stuff.

21 Q. Let me stop you there. The one that was  
22 right in front of you, can you describe him for us?

23 A. They were black males. And he was covered  
24 up, his face was covered up. I just know that there was  
10:20 25 one taller than the other one. And the one that was in

10:20 1 front of us was a bit taller than the other.

2 Q. And can you describe what was covering his  
3 face?

4 A. I think it was like a bandanna or something  
10:20 5 because you could see his eyes but just not the lower  
6 half of his face.

7 Q. And the other one, did he have his face  
8 covered as well?

9 A. The other one, he probably had something  
10:20 10 covered but I tried not to look at him, but his  
11 bandanna, whatever he got on his face, actually went  
12 down and he was lighter than the other guy.

13 Q. And I think you had said -- did you see one  
14 gun or two?

10:20 15 A. I saw the one that was in front of me, he  
16 had a gun, and I think the other one had a gun too,  
17 cause he was yelling at the owner, asking for the money.  
18 He took the money from her and then he walked towards  
19 the other, the other guys that, there was an older man  
10:21 20 and I think one or two other ladies, I think just one,  
21 and he asked both of them to get on the floor. And I  
22 don't know if maybe because they don't speak English too  
23 well, I think he was kind of trying to get a little  
24 aggressive, but that's all I can really remember.

10:21 25 Q. Did they take any items from you?

10:21 1 A. Yes, he took my purse, my wallet that was  
2 in there and my cell phone.

3 Q. Was there any ID cards or credit cards in  
4 your wallet?

10:21 5 A. Yeah. Well, I had my two debit cards and  
6 my insurance cards and my driver's license and all my,  
7 all my stuff in there.

8 Q. Did you have any cash or checks in your  
9 wallet?

10:22 10 A. I probably had like \$13 in cash.  
11 Everything else was on my debit card.

12 Q. Do you remember if when the men came in  
13 they made any statements like demanding any certain  
14 items?

10:22 15 A. Well, when they walked in they just started  
16 pointing guns at us, asked the owner to give them the  
17 money, and the guy in front of us with the gun, pointing  
18 the gun at us, took all our belongings, everybody in  
19 there.

10:22 20 Q. After they took your belongings, you had  
21 said the man who had been towards the front came back  
22 near the other one?

23 A. Yeah. One was, one was right in front of  
24 us, the other one was closer to the door. He actually  
10:23 25 moved closer and told one of the older guys that works

10:23 1 there to get on the floor and was telling the owner also  
2 to get on the floor.

3 Q. After that, what happened or where did they  
4 go?

10:23 5 A. They just took our stuff and they left,  
6 they ran out.

7 Q. Did you see where they went when they ran  
8 out?

9 A. No.

10:23 10 MS. KILLER: At this time the State has no  
11 further questions. Do the ladies and gentlemen of the

13 Seeing none.

13 Q. Good morning, Miss Montes. On June 26th of  
14 2015 were you at the LV Nail Spa on 4430 East Charleston  
10:25 15 here in Las Vegas, Clark County, Nevada?

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. And did something occur around 6:45 p.m.  
18 that evening that causes you to be here today?

19 A. We got robbed.

10:26 20 Q. What were you having done at the salon when  
21 that occurred?

22 A. I was getting my pedicure.

23 Q. And while you were getting your pedicure,  
24 can you tell us what you noticed first?

10:26 25 A. I noticed two black men coming to the store

10:26 1 covered, their face covered, and they came towards us,  
2 told us not to move.

3 Q. When you say their faces were covered, can  
4 you describe for us what was over their faces?

10:26 5 A. Beanies. Not beanies, I don't know what  
6 they're called. Bandannas. I'm not really sure, they  
7 were just covered.

8 Q. Something was covering. Okay. If you  
9 remember, do you remember what colors were those, if  
10:26 10 they were the same or different?

11 A. I don't remember very well. I just went  
12 into shock to be honest with you. They came in with  
13 guns, I noticed it right away, I froze.

14 Q. That's all right. You said you noticed  
10:27 15 guns. How many?

16 A. I believe they both had a gun each.

17 Q. So two total, one with each person?

18 A. Yes.

19 Q. And when they came in, did they say  
10:27 20 anything to you or the other customers?

21 A. They told us not to move, not to say  
22 anything. They told the owner to go behind the register  
23 and give them the money.

24 Q. Did they ask for any property from you or  
10:27 25 the other customers?

10:27 1 A. First they got the money from the owner and  
2 then they walked down the aisle and they took our  
3 belongings.

4 Q. Were both individuals taking items from  
10:27 5 different people in the store?

6 A. I wasn't really trying to see them. I was  
7 scared. But I know one of them did walk down the aisle  
8 individually and took our belongings.

9 Q. Do you know if it was the same one that was  
10:28 10 getting the money from the owner or a different?

11 A. I believe so. He was the one doing most  
12 all the work that I noticed. I heard his voice like  
13 around the, across the whole room. I can't really say  
14 per se if he was but I think he really was, he was the  
10:28 15 one.

16 Q. He sounded to you like one giving most of  
17 the instructions?

18 A. (No audible response.)

19 Q. Did they come into the store together, at  
10:28 20 the same time?

21 A. Yes.

22 Q. Did they leave at the same time?

23 A. Yes.

24 Q. Did you see them talking to each other or  
10:28 25 signaling to each other during the robbery?

10:28 1 A. I wasn't looking straight at them so I  
2 wouldn't be able to say yes or no.

3 Q. What items, if any, did they take from you?

4 A. Well, they took my purse, they took my car  
10:28 5 keys, my wallet, my phone.

6 Q. Did you have any identification in your  
7 wallet?

8 A. Yes, I had my ID, I believe I had my son's  
9 social, social card. I have all my kids insurance.

10:29 10 Q. Did you have any cash in your wallet?

11 A. I had \$110 cash.

12 Q. Do you remember anything about how the guns  
13 looked?

14 A. I know one of them was like really old,  
10:29 15 gray with brown handle, and that's the one that the guy  
16 dropped. I saw when he picked it up, he dropped it as  
17 he was receiving the money. And the other gentleman I  
18 don't remember anything from him.

19 Q. Did you notice anything else during the  
10:29 20 robbery that you can remember now?

21 A. It was scary. I was really trying not to  
22 look at them. I just --

23 Q. Did you see if they, you said they ran out  
24 of the store. Did you see which direction they went?

10:30 25 A. I just saw them going like towards south.

10:30 1 After that I didn't see if they got, what car they got  
2 into, what side of the street they went to, if they went  
3 west or --

4 Q. So you just saw them run out on foot and  
10:30 5 then go towards -- would it have been, if you remember,  
6 the left or the right of the front door?

7 A. From the front door they left left. They  
8 went somewhere to the side of the corner of the little  
9 shopping center and from there I didn't see where they  
10:30 10 went.

11 MS. KILLER: At this time the State has no  
12 further questions for Miss Montes. Do the ladies and  
13 gentlemen of the Grand Jury have any?

14 BY A JUROR:

10:30 15 Q. Miss Montes-Cervantes, did you happen to  
16 see their faces at all, could you estimate their age?

17 A. I know they were probably in their  
18 twenties. They looked really skinny, like if they were  
19 on drugs. One of them had like a fro. They were  
10:31 20 covered. After that I really tried not to look at them,  
21 I didn't want them to be like oh, you saw me, I have to  
22 shoot you now. I really didn't try to see them very  
23 well. They just looked tall, skinny and they were both  
24 black males.

10:31 25 Q. Did the bag that they had -- excuse me.

10:31 1 MS. KILLER: I just have to instruct the  
2 ladies and gentlemen of the Grand Jury to disregard and  
3 to strike the comment that they may have been on drugs.  
4 That's speculation and is not relevant in the  
10:31 5 consideration of these offenses.

6 Go ahead, ma'am. I'm sorry.

7 BY A JUROR:

8 Q. How big was this bag that they had if they  
9 took your full purses?

10:31 10 A. Well, it looked like one of those grocery  
11 bags, the one you can reuse again.

12 Q. The little brown paper bags?

13 A. No.

14 Q. I mean plastic bags.

10:31 15 A. No. If you go to Walmart or 99 Cent Store,  
16 the ones you go buy and use again. They're like  
17 clothing material. I'm not sure. They're really big,  
18 you can put a lot of stuff in there. And that's the one  
19 he reached out of his pocket and he definitely told the  
10:32 20 owner put the money in here. After that I didn't see  
21 anything anymore.

22 Q. Thank you.

23 MS. KILLER: Any other questions?

24 Seeing none.

10:32 25 THE FOREPERSON: By law, these proceedings

10:32 1 are secret and you are prohibited from disclosing to  
2 anyone anything that has transpired before us, including  
3 evidence and statements presented to the Grand Jury, any  
4 event occurring or statement made in the presence of the  
10:32 5 Grand Jury, and information obtained by the Grand Jury.

6 Failure to comply with this admonition is a

10:34 10 Do you understand this advisement?

11 THE WITNESS: Yes.

12 THE FOREPERSON: Please state your first  
13 and last name and spell both for the record.

14 THE WITNESS: Alma Gutierrez. A-L-M-A,  
10:34 15 G-U-T-I-E-R-R-E-Z.

16 THE FOREPERSON: Thank you.

17 ALMA GUTIERREZ,

18 having been first duly sworn by the Foreperson of the  
19 Grand Jury to testify to the truth, the whole truth,  
10:34 20 and nothing but the truth, testified as follows:

22 EXAMINATION

23

24 BY MS. KILLER:

10:34 25 Q. Miss Gutierrez, on June 30th of 2015 at



10:34 1 around 4:25 a.m., were you working at the Rainbow Market  
2 at 5075 East Washington?

3 A. Yes.

4 Q. And is that here in Las Vegas, Clark  
10:34 5 County, Nevada?

6 A. Yes.

7 Q. What's your position there?

8 A. Graveyard cashier.

9 Q. What happened on that morning that causes  
10:35 10 you to be here today?

11 A. I was standing behind the counter when two  
12 men came into the store. The first one had a gun in his  
13 hand, pointed at me and told me to give him everything I  
14 had. He then went to the security guard. The next man  
10:35 15 stayed at the counter and he took all the money from the  
16 register. Then they asked me if I could access the  
17 safe, I told them I couldn't, and then they left.

18 Q. Were you able to see the faces of these men  
19 or did they have their faces covered?

10:35 20 A. No. The first one with the gun had a  
21 bandanna covering the lower half of his face and the  
22 second one had some sort of hoodie that's zipped up all  
23 the way.

24 Q. And were these gentlemen black, white,  
10:35 25 Asian, Hispanic, if you could tell?

10:35 1 A. The second one was black. That was the one  
2 without the gun.

3 Q. The first one could you tell?

4 A. No.

10:36 5 Q. Did you speak with the police after this  
6 incident?

7 A. Yes.

8 Q. And did you fill out a handwritten  
9 statement?

10:36 10 A. Yes.

11 Q. Would it refresh your memory or  
12 recollection about the other man if I showed you that  
13 statement?

14 A. Sure. Yes.

10:36 15 Okay.

16 Q. For the record I'm taking the statement  
17 back with me.

18 Do you remember how you described the other  
19 man?

10:37 20 A. Hispanic. The first one with the gun.

21 Q. Do you have surveillance cameras in your  
22 store?

23 A. Yes.

24 Q. And do you know if they were working on  
10:37 25 that day?

10:37 1 A. Yes.

2 Q. Would you recognize the still shots or  
3 still pauses from that surveillance if they were shown  
4 to you?

10:37 5 A. Yes.

6 Q. Showing you Grand Jury Exhibit Number 74.  
7 Do you see yourself in that still shot?

8 A. Yes.

9 Q. For the record, can you describe where in  
10 the photo you are?

11 A. Coffee area.

12 Q. And it's kind of in the upper right corner?

13 A. Uh, the end of the store --

14 Q. Nope, that's all right. I just needed it  
15 in the photograph.

16 I'm going to have you, I'm going to hand  
17 all of these to you and then I'll ask you one question  
18 at the end. Okay? So that's Exhibit 74.

19 Showing you Exhibit 73. Showing you  
10:38 20 Exhibit 72. Showing you Exhibit 71. Showing you  
21 Exhibit 70. Showing you Exhibit 69. Showing you  
22 Exhibit 68. Showing you Exhibit 67. 66. 65. 64. 63.  
23 And Exhibit 6-0, 60. Do you recognize what's occurring  
24 in the surveillance footage in those photos?

10:39 25 A. Yes.

10:39 1 Q. Is that the robbery you're here describing  
2 right now?

3 A. Yes.

4 Q. Do these fairly and accurately depict the  
10:39 5 events of that evening?

6 A. Yes.

7 Q. Showing you Exhibit 74. You had identified  
8 yourself over here by the coffee area. Who is this  
9 other person in the photograph? Do you know him?

10:39 10 A. Security guard.

11 Q. And do you know his name by chance?

12 A. I don't remember it.

13 Q. Was he in the store as well when the  
14 robbery occurred?

10:39 15 A. Yes.

16 Q. And you had said the, was it the first man  
17 to enter that had the gun out?

18 A. That was the first one that I thought was  
19 Hispanic.

10:40 20 Q. And for the record that was Exhibit 73.

21 Showing you Exhibit 71. Are these the  
22 individuals that entered your store?

23 A. Yes.

24 Q. And which one stayed with you at the cash  
10:40 25 register?

10:40 1 A. The one with the skull hoodie.

2 Q. And do you know where the other man went?

3 A. Towards the security guard.

4 Q. Showing you Exhibit 68. Is that you behind

10:40 5 the register?

6 A. Yes.

7 Q. And ladies and gentlemen, you'll have all

8 of these when you deliberate.

9 Are we looking down at the register in this

10:41 10 photo?

11 A. Yes.

12 Q. So down here in the bottom right corner,

13 would that be you?

14 A. That's my head.

10:41 15 Q. And that's the suspect that stayed with you

16 at the register?

17 A. Yes.

18 Q. Did he in fact get money from your

19 register?

10:41 20 A. Yes.

21 Q. Do you know how much?

22 A. Not the exact amount.

23 Q. Do you know an approximate amount?

24 A. I believe it was over a hundred dollars.

10:41 25 Q. Did you see one gun that morning or two?

10:41 1 A. One.

2 Q. And I believe, but I just want to clarify,  
3 it was the man with the bandanna covering that was  
4 holding it?

10:41 5 A. Yes.

6 MS. KILLER: The State has no further  
7 questions at this time. Do the ladies and gentlemen of  
8 the Grand Jury?

9 BY A JUROR:

10:42 10 Q. The time stamp on those were like 4:26 in  
11 the morning. Is that correct? Was it that time of the  
12 day?

13 A. Somewhere around that time, yes.

14 Q. And the security guard, was he a security

10:42 15 at the store or was he just a random --

16 A. Yes, he was security at the store.

17 Q. Did he have a gun?

18 A. No, he's unarmed.

19 THE FOREPERSON: No further questions.

10:42 20 By law, these proceedings are secret and  
21 you are prohibited from disclosing to anyone anything  
22 that has transpired before us, including evidence and  
23 statements presented to the Grand Jury, any event

10:44 15 RAMON VASQUEZ,  
16 having been first duly sworn by the Foreperson of the  
17 Grand Jury to testify to the truth, the whole truth,  
18 and nothing but the truth, testified as follows:

10:44 20 EXAMINATION

21

22 BY MR. PESCI:

23 Q. Sir, do you work at the Rainbow Market at  
24 5075 East Washington?

10:44 25 A. Yeah, I run that store.



10:44 1 Q. Are you aware that there was a robbery that  
2 occurred on June the 30th of 2015?

3 A. Yes.

4 Q. Did that occur in the early morning hours?

10:44 5 A. Yeah.

6 Q. Does your establishment have video  
7 surveillance?

8 A. I gave it to the detective that was there  
9 and then another detective came back and got it again  
10:45 10 because I guess it wouldn't play on their computer, but  
11 it only holds up to 30 days so we don't have it no more.

12 Q. But does your business have video  
13 surveillance?

14 A. Yeah, we do.

10:45 15 Q. Is it the ordinary course of your business  
16 to maintain and run that surveillance?

17 A. Yes.

18 Q. And you keep that video you said for 30  
19 days?

10:45 20 A. Yes.

21 Q. I want to show you Grand Jury Exhibits, it  
22 looks like 60 through 74. Do you recognize what's  
23 depicted there?

24 A. Yes.

10:45 25 Q. Are these still frames of video

10:45 1 surveillance from your establishment?

2 A. Yes.

3 Q. Does it in fact have a date and time stamp  
4 on them?

10:45 5 A. Yes.

6 Q. And do you recognize that location?

7 A. Yes.

8 Q. You said you're the manager?

9 A. Uh-huh.

10:45 10 Q. Is that a yes?

11 A. Yes.

12 Q. I want to show you also Grand Jury Exhibits  
13 62 and 61. Do you recognize those?

14 A. Yes.

10:45 15 Q. There seems to be some writing on the  
16 surveillance still frame; is that correct?

17 A. Yes.

18 Q. Is that what your machine --

19 A. Yes, it's from the registers, when the

10:45 20 receipt prints up it shows on the camera what came up or  
21 whatever, like how she hit no sale to open the thing,  
22 that's what that's seeing.

23 Q. So this writing here talks about which  
24 register, the date, the time?

10:46 25 A. Yes.

10:46 1 Q. And it's the Rainbow Market?

2 A. Yes.

3 Q. Are these fair and accurate depictions of  
4 the surveillance that you personally provided to the  
10:46 5 detectives?

6 A. Yes. The only thing that might be a little  
7 off, because the timing on our camera is a little messed  
8 up by like 10 or 20 minutes.

9 Q. You're sure of the date?

10:46 10 A. Yes.

11 Q. And you're sure of the general time, it  
12 might be off a few minutes?

13 A. Uh-huh.

14 Q. Is that a yes?

10:46 15 A. Yes.

16 MR. PESCI: Are there any questions from  
17 the ladies and gentlemen of the Grand Jury?

18 THE FOREPERSON: By law, these proceedings  
19 are secret and you are prohibited from disclosing to  
10:46 20 anyone anything that has transpired before us, including  
21 evidence and statements presented to the Grand Jury, any  
22 event occurring or statement made in the presence of the

16 this Grand Jury shall be the truth, the whole truth, and  
17 nothing but the truth, so help you God?

18 THE WITNESS: Yes, sir.

19 THE FOREPERSON: Thank you. Please be  
10:47 20 seated.

21 You are advised that you are here today to  
22 give testimony in the investigation pertaining to the  
23 offenses of burglary while in possession of a firearm,  
24 robbery with use of a deadly weapon, conspiracy to  
10:47 25 commit robbery, attempt robbery with use of a deadly

10:47 1 weapon, and assault with a deadly weapon, involving

3 Do you understand this advisement?

4 THE WITNESS: Do I understand what?

10:48 5 THE FOREPERSON: The advisement of the  
6 reason you're here today.

7 You are advised that you are here today to  
8 give testimony in the investigation pertaining to the  
9 offenses of burglary while in possession of a firearm,  
10:48 10 robbery with use of a deadly weapon, conspiracy to  
11 commit robbery, attempt robbery with use of a deadly  
12 weapon, and assault with a deadly weapon, involving  
13 Ralph Alexander, James Parker and Tonya Martin.

14 Do you understand this advisement?

10:48 15 THE WITNESS: Who's Tonya?

16 MR. PESCI: Sir, the question is whether  
17 you understand that you're here to present evidence  
18 about this particular incident that occurred. You don't  
19 have to know the people. It's just that you're here to  
10:49 20 give testimony about the incident.

21 THE WITNESS: All right.

22 MR. PESCI: Do you understand that?

23 THE WITNESS: I'm not really sure.

24 MR. PESCI: Okay. Well, you've been  
10:49 25 subpoenaed to come to the Grand Jury; is that correct?

10:49 1 THE WITNESS: Yeah, because I witnessed a  
2 incident.

3 MR. PESCI: Exactly. That's what --

4 THE WITNESS: Involving two subjects and  
10:49 5 I'm curious where he's coming up with a third subject.

6 MR. PESCI: Because there is more than one  
7 incident being presented. So the fact that you're  
8 hearing about a third doesn't bear on your testimony  
9 about your particular incident. They're hearing about  
10:49 10 more than one incident, that's why you're hearing more  
11 than one name. So it makes sense that you're curious  
12 that way. But we're just asking you, do you understand  
13 that you're giving testimony about your particular  
14 incident?

10:49 15 THE WITNESS: All right.

16 MR. PESCI: Okay.

17 THE FOREPERSON: Please state your first  
18 and last name and spell both for the record.

19 THE WITNESS: Ronald, R-O-N-A-L-D, Main,  
10:49 20 M-A-I-N.

21 THE FOREPERSON: Thank you.

22 RONALD MAIN,  
23 having been first duly sworn by the Foreperson of the  
24 Grand Jury to testify to the truth, the whole truth,  
10:50 25 and nothing but the truth, testified as follows:

EXAMINATION

BY MR. PESCI:

Q. Sir, I want to direct your attention to June the 30th of 2015 at about 4:25 in the morning.

Were you working at the Rainbow Market located at 5075 East Washington?

A. Yes.

Q. And what was your job there that morning?

A. Security officer.

Q. Did something happen, the incident that you referred to earlier, could you tell the ladies and gentlemen of the Grand Jury about that incident?

A. At approximately the time that you state, two individuals entered the store. The first one that entered the store was brandishing a firearm and as soon as the first subject entered the store brandishing the firearm he immediately was observed as panning with the weapon the interior of the store. At first he did not see me because I was in a aisleway, but when he discovered, when he did see me and discovered who I was he made a beeline right for me and put that revolver right up in my face.

Q. Okay. You have surveillance at your store; is that correct?

10:51 1 A. I presume they do.

2 Q. Do you recognize what's depicted in Grand  
3 Jury Exhibit 71?

4 You described about two individuals coming  
10:51 5 in the store with a gun; is that correct?

6 A. Yep.

7 Q. Do you recognize that as the individuals  
8 you just testified about?

9 A. Yep. The first one, he's the short one.

10:51 10 Q. Let me stop you for one second. What I'm  
11 going to do, so you can explain like you just were,  
12 we're going to put this over here, so over your shoulder  
13 now you can explain that and then the Grand Jury can  
14 know what you're talking about.

10:52 15 A. All right. Subject number 1 that has the  
16 weapon in his right hand, again upon entering the store  
17 he was conducting a panning a panning motion presumably  
18 for his, presumably for his partner who is entering the  
19 store behind him.

10:52 20 Q. Does the person behind him have a mask with  
21 like a skull on it?

22 A. Yes, and a hoodie.

23 Q. And you testified earlier that originally  
24 they didn't see you, but when they did they pointed the  
10:52 25 gun at you?



10:52 1 A. Subject number 1, he was the observer, just  
2 quickly checking the interior and like I said panning  
3 his weapon to see if there were probably any threats.

4 Q. And let me show you 73 and 74. Do you  
10:53 5 recognize those?

6 A. Okay.

7 Q. Do you recognize what is depicted in those?

8 A. Okay. That's me in the upper and then me  
9 and subject number 1.

10:53 10 Q. So you testified earlier that when they  
11 first came in they didn't see you. So showing you 74,  
12 they hadn't yet seen you; is that correct?

13 A. At first because -- yeah.

14 Q. And then 73, you said that when they did  
10:53 15 see you they made a beeline to you and pointed the gun  
16 at you?

17 A. Just subject number 1 with the weapon as  
18 depicted in this picture. And at that point, at that  
19 point he got very close and made direct constant eye  
10:54 20 contact and I just kept reassuring, not making, you  
21 know, with the hands out in the open and reassuring  
22 subject number 1 that I was unarmed, no weapon, no  
23 weapon of any kind and that I was not, that I was not,  
24 you know, I was not a threat to him.

10:54 25 Q. Okay. Did they demand anything from you?

10:54 1 A. No. As a matter of fact, as a matter of  
2 fact subject number 1 pretty much kept quiet during the  
3 entire ordeal. Mainly he just wanted to, you know, keep  
4 me company.

10:55 5 Q. What did subject number 2 do?

6 A. Subject number 2 was a very busy  
7 individual. He, subject number 2 made a direct beeline  
8 for the counter immediately, hollering at the cashier  
9 that, you know, to, you know, give me all the money, and  
10:55 10 then he kept going from like give me all the money to  
11 give me the cash. He just kept going back and forth.

12 Q. When he was saying that did the cashier  
13 give him the money?

14 A. Yeah, she complied fully. Quickly.

10:55 15 Q. After she did that did those two leave?

16 A. Subject -- yeah. Subject -- okay.

17 Q. That's all right. Don't mind the phone.

18 A. Yeah, they quickly -- subject number 2, the  
19 tall one with the mask that was at the counter, he  
10:56 20 exited first, and then subject number 1 with the weapon,  
21 he exited, he exited making sure of course nobody  
22 followed them out the door.

23 Q. Did you see where they went when they left?

24 A. It appeared, the only one that I could see  
10:56 25 at the time is, it appeared that when they exited, I

10:56 1 wish I had a picture, it appeared that when they exited  
2 out the door they went through the, to the north. Is  
3 that a --

4 Q. Yes. Putting back 71 which shows the  
10:56 5 doors.

6 A. Oh, okay. Well, okay. Like I said subject  
7 number 2, the one with the skull mask, he exited first,  
8 followed of course by subject number 1 who was making  
9 sure that no one was going to follow him out. And then  
10:57 10 when they, when they exited, the one, the one that I  
11 could see was the skull mask as they made a left turn  
12 going towards, back out through the north parking lot  
13 presumably, presumably just running, they could have ran  
14 north, they could have ran to the west.

10:57 15 Q. You don't know but you saw them run out in  
16 that direction?

17 A. But the one thing is that in facing, you  
18 know, that did see subject number 2, the skull mask,  
19 that they went, that they went on the north side, north  
10:57 20 side of the store so, and at that point it's unknown.

21 Q. You didn't see after that?

22 A. Yeah.

23 MR. PESCI: No further questions. Any  
24 questions from the Grand Jury?

25

10:57 1 BY A JUROR:

2 Q. Mr. Main, can you describe these two  
3 individuals, whatever you could see, their ethnicity,  
4 anything that you could tell about them?

10:58 5 A. Subject number 1, dark skin, because he  
6 had, he was wearing a ball cap and he had a bandanna,  
7 bandanna up to about the bridge, the bridge of his nose,  
8 but other than that dark skinned. And probably, well,  
9 short. Probably just, probably just didn't even come up  
10:58 10 to maybe, you know, maybe my chin. But the other one,  
11 the other one was, he, at first he appeared very tall  
12 when he entered but then he, but then he kind of  
13 maintained a, kind of a bent over like he was, you know,  
14 trying to lean over, maybe confuse individuals on, you  
10:59 15 know, his height. But other than the fact that subject  
16 number 2 was pretty well covered. But subject number 1,  
17 you know, dark skinned, and that was basically just  
18 forehead, eyes and the upper bridge of the nose, but for  
19 the most part very well covered up. And subject  
10:59 20 number 1 hardly, hardly said a word at all except at  
21 first when they entered the store subject number 1  
22 yelled to, for everybody to just stay out in the open,  
23 keep their hands, keep their hands up, that this is a,  
24 that, he clearly stated that this is a robbery.

11:00 25 Q. So you couldn't tell, by what you could see

11:00 1 you could not tell their ethnicity, they were dark  
2 skinned --

3 A. Only one and that what was subject  
4 number 1, the short one, as in the photograph, that was  
11:00 5 the only one to show a weapon, that gave me his  
6 undivided attention. The only thing that I could make  
7 for certain is that, you know, just, you know, just dark  
8 skin.

9 Q. Was it dark skin like mine or was it darker  
11:00 10 than mine?

11 A. He was pretty dark. It was hard to -- I  
12 mean it would be a flip of the coin if he was Hispanic  
13 or black.

14 Q. Thank you.

11:00 15 THE FOREPERSON: No further questions.

16 By law, these proceedings are secret and  
17 you are prohibited from disclosing to anyone anything  
18 that has transpired before us, including evidence and  
19 statements presented to the Grand Jury, any event  
11:00 20 occurring or statement made in the presence of the Grand  
21 Jury, and information obtained by the Grand Jury.

22 Failure to comply with this admonition is a  
23 gross misdemeanor punishable by a year in the Clark  
24 County Detention Center and a \$2,000 fine. In addition,  
11:00 25 you may be held in contempt of court punishable by an

11:00 1 additional \$500 fine and 25 days in the Clark County  
2 Detention Center.

3 Do you understand this admonition?

4 THE WITNESS: Yes.

11:01 5 THE FOREPERSON: Thank you, sir. You are  
6 excused.

7 MR. PESCI: State your name, sir.

8 THE WITNESS: Douglas Wayne Salter.

9 THE FOREPERSON: If you would, sir, please  
11:01 10 raise your right hand.

11 You do solemnly swear the testimony you are  
12 about to give upon the investigation now pending before  
13 this Grand Jury shall be the truth, the whole truth, and  
14 nothing but the truth, so help you God?

11:02 15 THE WITNESS: Yes.

16 THE FOREPERSON: Please be seated.

17 You are advised that you are here today to  
18 give testimony in the investigation pertaining to the  
19 offenses of burglary while in possession of a firearm,  
11:02 20 robbery with use of a deadly weapon, conspiracy to  
21 commit robbery, attempt robbery with use of a deadly  
22 weapon, and assault with a deadly weapon, involving  
23 Ralph Alexander, James Parker and Tonya Martin.

24 Do you understand this advisement?

11:02 25 THE WITNESS: Yes, sir.

11:02 1 THE FOREPERSON: Please state your first  
2 and last name and spell both for the record.

3 THE WITNESS: Douglas Salter.  
4 D-O-U-G-L-A-S, last name S-A-L-T-E-R.

11:02 5 THE FOREPERSON: Thank you.

6 DOUGLAS WAYNE SALTER,  
7 having been first duly sworn by the Foreperson of the  
8 Grand Jury to testify to the truth, the whole truth,  
9 and nothing but the truth, testified as follows:

11:02 10  
11 EXAMINATION

12  
13 BY MR. PESCI:

14 Q. Sir, I want to direct your attention to  
11:02 15 June the 19th of 2015 at about 2:45 in the morning.  
16 Were you at the Kwiky Market located at 6055 East Lake  
17 Mead?

18 A. Yes.

19 Q. Are you familiar with that location?

11:03 20 A. Inside and out.

21 Q. Have you been there quite a bit?

22 A. Yes.

23 Q. And in fact are you aware that that  
24 location has video surveillance?

11:03 25 A. Yes.

11:03 1 Q. Were you actually a part of installing that  
2 video surveillance?

3 A. There is probably three or four different  
4 phases over the last six years. I probably worked on  
11:03 5 two of them. They update them every now and then.

6 Q. When you say you worked on them --

7 A. I actually put them in, hooked them up,  
8 plugged them in, put them behind the computer, every  
9 phase of it.

11:03 10 Q. That woman in front of is you writing  
11 everything down. We cannot speak at the same time or I  
12 promise you she'll yell at us.

13 So showing you Grand Jury Exhibits 45 --  
14 no, I'm sorry -- 25 through 45. Do you recognize these  
11:04 15 as being still frames from the surveillance from that  
16 Kwiky Mart that you installed that surveillance? Do you  
17 recognize that, sir?

18 A. Yeah, that's my mother's truck. I was  
19 driving it that night.

11:04 20 Q. So Grand Jury Exhibit 45 depicts the  
21 outside of the establishment; is that correct?

22 A. Yes.

23 Q. And you recognize the truck there as being  
24 your mother's truck?

11:04 25 A. License plate was FXYGRM. You can actually



11:04 1 see --

2 Q. And 25 through 45 are all fair and accurate  
3 depictions of that surveillance?

4 A. Yeah.

11:04 5 Q. Okay. Now who's working there that night?

6 A. Craig. I don't know his last name.

7 Q. But how do you know Craig?

8 A. He's been an employee there about 11  
9 months. I've been there about six years.

11:05 10 Q. Does Craig Tunnell, does that ring a bell?

11 A. It rings a bell but I'm not positive.

12 Q. You know him mostly by Craig?

13 A. Yeah.

14 Q. Was he working that night when you were

11:05 15 there?

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. Were you a customer that night?

18 A. Yes, I was.

19 Q. And were you, what were you doing as a

11:05 20 customer there? What particularly were you doing?

21 A. I was playing the furthest machine from  
22 the, actually the first counter on the nickel slot  
23 machine, poker machine.

24 Q. What happened while you were there on that

11:05 25 poker machine?

11:05 1 A. Well, I was at the end of the room by the  
2 glass and the clerk's counter is right there. And I  
3 sort of angle myself this way anyway, you know. And I  
4 caught the guy coming through the door basically  
11:05 5 hunching and going right behind the counter to the cash  
6 register which is only about six feet from the door.

7 Q. And you prior to your testimony have  
8 reviewed video surveillance from this particular  
9 incident; is that correct?

11:06 10 A. No, I haven't.

11 Q. Did you, when we were out in the hall --

12 A. Just what you showed me out there, yes. I  
13 haven't seen it with the owner of the store.

14 Q. So just before you came in here did you and  
11:06 15 I review surveillance from this incident?

16 A. Yes, we did.

17 Q. Did you recognize that as being  
18 surveillance from the incident that you were involved  
19 in?

11:06 20 A. Definitely.

21 Q. So we're going to play that now.

22 Do you recognize what we're looking at?

23 A. Yeah, we're looking from west to east  
24 behind the counter.

11:06 25 Q. And is this surveillance from the incident?

11:06 1 A. I just want to see where Craig was coming  
2 from because he was behind me over by the sodas. I  
3 would be back in that far corner.

4 Q. So did you see Craig in the video a moment  
11:06 5 ago?

6 A. Yes, I did.

7 Q. And Craig was the Craig Tunnell, the one we  
8 talked about earlier?

9 A. Yes.

11:07 10 Q. Was he the cashier working the counter at  
11 that time?

12 A. Yes. At that time he was stocking. They  
13 do a lot of that on graveyard.

14 Q. On the video does he, Craig, run out of the  
11:07 15 video?

16 A. He runs into the video from the far east  
17 side of the store.

18 Q. And that's Craig in the green shirt that we  
19 see?

11:07 20 A. Right.

21 Q. Chased off by one of the individuals?

22 A. Yes.

23 Q. You can have a seat if it's more  
24 comfortable for you.

11:07 25 A. Yeah, I can see it.

11:07 1 Q. Do you see someone going out the store  
2 right now?

3 A. That's me and that's the girl I was trying  
4 to drag out of there with me. I had her behind me at an  
11:08 5 angle on the inside of that gaming room where they  
6 couldn't see because of the dividers and as soon as his  
7 gun hand went behind the chips and stuff, I knew he  
8 couldn't move that quick so I said let's go and we took  
9 off.

11:08 10 Q. When you say we meaning you and --

11 A. The girl that was on the machine next to me  
12 closer to the counter.

13 Q. She's going to start yelling at me. She's  
14 going to yell because we're talking at the same time.

11:08 15 So did you see you and that female on this  
16 video surveillance exit?

17 A. Well, I can't see our faces or anything,  
18 but yes, that is us.

19 Q. That's what I'm trying to understand, if  
11:08 20 you recognize yourself.

21 A. Yes, definitely.

22 Q. And as you watched this video right now,  
23 this portion is after you've left?

24 A. Right.

11:08 25 Q. But you're able to see that the register --

11:08 1 you're familiar with the register in this location?

2 A. Yes.

3 Q. That the register had been opened?

4 A. I see it open.

11:08 5 Q. And that there was money taken from the  
6 register?

7 A. Yeah.

8 Q. And that Craig the clerk had actually been  
9 moved away at gunpoint?

11:09 10 A. Yeah, almost as he got behind the counter  
11 to grab the guy he seen.

12 Q. Did you get much of a look at these two  
13 guys?

14 A. The only, I only seen one guy by the way  
11:09 15 that -- you see the guy is going in and out of the  
16 picture. When I was looking, I seen the first guy come  
17 in, I grabbed her from the slot machine to hide her  
18 behind me and looked back and that's the only guy I  
19 seen. It could have been the same, the two guys  
11:09 20 switched, I don't know at that point.

21 Q. When you ran outside what did you do?

22 A. As soon as I got outside the door, I waited  
23 for her and grabbed her hand and then she threw away  
24 some kind of knife or something that she had on her. It  
11:09 25 wasn't even illegal. I think she had warrants or

11:09 1 something, I don't know. And I just tried to drag her  
2 across the street while I was calling 911 at the same  
3 time.

4 Q. Was there anybody else in the store that  
11:09 5 you know of?

6 A. Nobody.

7 Q. That you know of?

8 A. That I know of. That's the only door to  
9 get in there.

11:10 10 Q. All right. So I'm going to show you now  
11 Grand Jury Exhibit 45. Earlier I think you testified  
12 that this is your mom's truck?

13 A. Yes. And I was driving it.

14 Q. And then do you see an individual that was  
11:10 15 inside the store earlier that had the mask on?

16 A. From that picture I can't tell what it is.

17 It's pretty obvious, yeah, it's the two  
18 guys, one in the mask and --

19 Q. So this is the person with the mask, Grand  
11:10 20 Jury Exhibit 44, approaching the store at this point; is  
21 that correct?

22 A. I don't know that. They could be walking  
23 backwards out of there for all I know.

24 Q. You see them outside from the surveillance  
11:10 25 camera.

11:10 1 A. Yes.

2 Q. Showing you Grand Jury Exhibit 43, do you  
3 recognize that?

4 A. Yeah.

11:10 5 Q. And who is that?

6 A. That looks like me. I was moving pretty  
7 good.

8 Q. So that's you running out, right?

9 A. I'm not getting shot again.

11:11 10 Q. Do you recognize yourself there?

11 A. Yeah. I gained a little bit of weight over  
12 the years.

13 MR. PESCI: Any questions from the ladies  
14 and gentlemen of the Grand Jury?

11:11 15 BY A JUROR:

16 Q. Yeah. Doug.

17 A. Yes, ma'am.

18 Q. Can you in any way describe these  
19 individuals? What did they look like, what ethnicity  
11:11 20 wise, hair?

21 A. I could not look at them if they were  
22 standing right there and tell you if that was them for  
23 sure, no. Because of the masks. And I really didn't  
24 see the white mask. I seen the other one. Because he  
11:11 25 was out of my frame of view back towards the --

11:11 1 Q. Thank you.

2 THE FOREPERSON: No further questions.

3 MR. PESCI: No further questions from the  
4 State.

11:11 5 THE FOREPERSON: By law, these proceedings  
6 are secret and you are prohibited from disclosing to  
7 anyone anything that has transpired before us, including  
8 evidence and statements presented to the Grand Jury, any  
9 event occurring or statement made in the presence of the  
11:11 10 Grand Jury, and information obtained by the Grand Jury.

11 Failure to comply with this admonition is a  
12 gross misdemeanor punishable by a year in the Clark  
13 County Detention Center and a \$2,000 fine. In addition,  
14 you may be held in contempt of court punishable by an  
11:11 15 additional \$500 fine and 25 days in the Clark County

17 Do you understand this admonition?

23 we have one more witness, the detective. Do you want  
24 another break or what is it you'd like to do? Keep  
11:12 25 going?



11:12 1 I just need to confer with the detective  
2 for just one moment. Okay? Sorry for the delay.

3 THE FOREPERSON: If you would, sir, please  
4 raise your right hand.

11:13 5 You do solemnly swear the testimony you are  
6 about to give upon the investigation now pending before  
7 this Grand Jury shall be the truth, the whole truth, and  
8 nothing but the truth, so help you God?

9 THE WITNESS: Yes, sir.

11:13 10 THE FOREPERSON: Thank you. Please be  
11 seated.

24 D-A-V-I-D, M-I-L-L-E-R.

11:13 25 THE FOREPERSON: Thank you, sir.

11:13 1 DAVID MILLER,

2 having been first duly sworn by the Foreperson of the  
3 Grand Jury to testify to the truth, the whole truth,  
4 and nothing but the truth, testified as follows:

11:13 5  
6 EXAMINATION

7  
8 BY MR. PESCI:

9 Q. Sir, are you a detective with the  
11:13 10 Metropolitan Police Department assigned to the robbery  
11 section?

12 A. Yes, sir.

13 Q. How long have you been with Metro?

14 A. For 15 years, sir.

11:13 15 Q. And you have previously testified in front  
16 of this Grand Jury about different incidents involving  
17 this case?

18 A. Yes, sir.

19 Q. So we're going to pick up and talk about  
11:14 20 some of those that you already spoke of and then some  
21 other ones. Is that all right, Detective?

22 A. Yes, sir.

23 Q. In particular in this investigation did a  
24 Ford Taurus become something of interest to you?

11:14 25 A. Yes, sir.

11:14 1 Q. Showing you Grand Jury Exhibit 23. Do you  
2 recognize that as being a certified copy of DMV records  
3 for the Ford Taurus that was the subject of your  
4 investigation?

11:14 5 A. Yes, sir.

6 Q. Who was it registered to?

7 A. To Tonya Martin.

8 Q. Did you speak to a Tonya Martin?

9 A. I did.

11:14 10 Q. We're going to get into that in just a  
11 minute. But was that car of interest to you?

12 A. Yes.

13 Q. Why?

14 A. Because after the Family Dollar robbery on  
11:14 15 July 9th we had a witness in the neighborhood say they  
16 saw a white female in a Ford, a gold Ford Taurus bearing  
17 Nevada plate 005LNU trying to pick up suspects and so,  
18 but on that date we didn't stop the car or catch the  
19 car, catch the female. She got away that day.

11:15 20 Q. But that information was related to you by  
21 the witness that was here earlier testifying?

22 A. Yes.

23 Q. That became an issue of interest for you?

24 A. Yes.

11:15 25 Q. And then showing you Grand Jury Exhibits 55

11:15 1 through 59, do you recognize those?

2 A. Yes.

3 Q. What do you recognize these to be?

4 A. I took these pictures. These are pictures  
11:15 5 of Tonya Martin's 2002 gold Ford Taurus with the Nevada  
6 plate 005LNU.

7 Q. Does that match the DMV records?

8 A. Yes.

9 Q. Did you take these photographs when you  
11:15 10 were meeting with Tonya Martin?

11 A. I did.

12 Q. Did she agree to you taking these  
13 photographs?

14 A. I don't think I asked actually. It was  
11:15 15 sitting out in front of the house she's staying in right  
16 now.

17 Q. Did you tell her that you were going to?

18 A. Oh yeah, she was watching me take the  
19 pictures.

11:15 20 Q. That's what I meant. I apologize. Bad  
21 wording.

22 Are those fair and accurate pictures of her  
23 Ford Taurus?

24 A. Yes, sir.

11:15 25 Q. Was that Ford Taurus actually in video

11:15 1 surveillance or what appears to be the Ford Taurus  
2 depicted in Grand Jury Exhibit 26 which is associated  
3 with the Kwiky Mart robbery on June the 19th?

4 A. That's correct.

11:16 5 Q. Do you see that in this surveillance?

6 A. Yes.

7 Q. Is that another reason why you were  
8 focusing on this because from that incident, the Kwiky  
9 Market, it appeared to be the same car?

11:16 10 A. Right.

11 Q. Was there another incident that happened on  
12 June the 26th that also you had surveillance that was  
13 associated with a robbery there?

14 A. Yes, the LV Nail Spa.

11:16 15 Q. LV Nail Spa. Is that on Charleston?

16 A. Yes, 4430 East Charleston.

17 Q. Showing you Grand Jury Exhibits 46 through  
18 54. Do you recognize those?

19 A. Yes. Yep.

11:16 20 Q. Okay. Are these fair and accurate  
21 depictions of that area on the June 26th date?

22 A. Yes.

23 Q. Did you or someone with you as a part of  
24 your investigation obtain the video surveillance from  
11:17 25 that area?

11:17 1 A. Yes.

2 Q. If I understood correctly, the nail salon  
3 did not have internal surveillance?

4 A. That's correct, not at the time.

11:17 5 Q. There were other businesses in the area  
6 that had surveillance?

7 A. That's right.

8 Q. You obtained that surveillance?

9 A. Yes.

11:17 10 Q. And you reviewed that surveillance?

11 A. Yes.

12 Q. Do you see what appears to be the same Ford  
13 Taurus in the video surveillance from the June 26th  
14 incident outside of the LV Nail salon?

11:17 15 A. Correct.

16 Q. In fact did you obtain surveillance  
17 separate and distinct from the surveillance depicted in  
18 Exhibits 49 through 54? 49 through 54 was from one  
19 camera; is that correct?

11:17 20 A. Yeah. There were several different cameras  
21 and some were obviously better pictures than others.

22 Q. And in fact 48, Grand Jury Exhibit 48, is  
23 surveillance from a different camera; is that correct?

24 A. Right.

11:18 25 Q. But is that showing the same June 26th area

11:18 1 of the LV Nails?

2 A. Right. This is outside the LV Nails and  
3 you can see, in this picture you can see picture of the  
4 car waiting for the suspects to get back in after the  
11:18 5 robbery.

6 Q. And then did you actually get the source of  
7 another video from a young man who was skateboarding  
8 just outside the nail salon?

9 A. Yeah.

11:18 10 Q. Showing you Grand Jury Exhibits 46 and 47,  
11 do you recognize those?

12 A. Yes. This is, these are the, this is kind  
13 of almost a different angle. That one picture we just  
14 discussed you can see the car waiting. And this is the  
11:18 15 same basic thing except up close and personal because  
16 Armando was actually filming as he was, filming his  
17 buddies as they were skateboarding by exactly when the  
18 suspects ran and got back into the car, the gold Ford  
19 Taurus.

11:18 20 Q. Do you remember Armando's last name?

21 A. Ramirez.

22 Q. Did you meet with Armando?

23 A. Yes.

24 Q. Did he show you his video surveillance?

11:19 25 A. He did.

11:19 1 Q. I shouldn't say surveillance. I'm sorry.  
2 From his camera.

3 A. Home video, yes.

4 Q. And did you obtain copies of that?

11:19 5 A. I did.

6 Q. Are these fair and accurate depictions of  
7 those copies?

8 A. Yes.

9 Q. Do you recognize this area?

11:19 10 A. Yes.

11 Q. Do you know it to be the nail salon?

12 A. Yes.

13 Q. So you said a moment ago that this happened  
14 just as the individuals came out; is that correct?

11:19 15 A. Correct.

16 Q. Showing you Grand Jury Exhibit 46. Do you  
17 recognize that?

18 A. Yes.

19 Q. Is this from Armando's camera?

11:19 20 A. Yes, his cell phone camera.

21 Q. What do we have on the left hand side?

22 A. That is the gold Ford Taurus and the  
23 suspects, if you're watching the video, they just run by  
24 and they're getting into the car as we speak and then  
11:19 25 pulled off.



11:19 1 Q. Showing you 47, is that a better view of  
2 the car?

3 A. Yes.

4 Q. Does that look like the car that's depicted  
11:19 5 in the other surveillance from the same location,  
6 State's 54?

7 A. Yes. I'm not -- yeah. Right. Yes. Okay.  
8 I couldn't see which car we were talking about. Yes.

9 Q. Let me put a different one up. State's 52,  
11:20 10 do you recognize that?

11 A. Yes.

12 Q. Does that appear to be the same car that's  
13 depicted outside the Kwiky Mart in Grand Jury  
14 Exhibit 26?

11:20 15 A. The --

16 Q. Hold on one second.

17 Grand Jury Exhibit 53, the car we're  
18 talking about, it's not the parked car?

19 A. No.

11:20 20 Q. It's the car driving?

21 A. The one driving through. That's why I was  
22 confused the first two. I didn't know which car we were  
23 talking about.

24 Q. That's my fault. But State's 53 we see the  
11:20 25 car that we also see in State's 26 which we also see in

11:21 1 State's 55 which is the car you took pictures of, Tonya  
2 Martin's car?

3 A. Yes, sir.

4 Q. So we've got her car at the Kwiky Mart and  
11:21 5 the LV Nails. You also had information originally from  
6 the Family Dollar.

7 A. Correct.

8 Q. And in your investigation, this jury's  
9 previously heard about the incident at the Boulder  
11:21 10 Highway, did you also have video and information of the  
11 same car outside that location?

12 A. Yes.

13 Q. So with all that information did you then  
14 go and interview Tonya Martin?

11:21 15 A. I did.

16 Q. Showing you Grand Jury Exhibit 24. Do you  
17 recognize that?

18 A. That's Tonya Martin, yes.

19 Q. When you spoke to her, was she in  
11:21 20 handcuffs, was she in custody?

21 A. No, not at all.

22 Q. Did you arrange to meet with her?

23 A. Yes.

24 Q. Did she agree to meet with you?

11:21 25 A. Yes.

11:21 1 Q. Where did you actually meet with her?

2 A. Where she's living now which I believe is  
3 her sister's house.

4 Q. Did you explain to her that no matter what  
11:22 5 she said that you were not going to arrest her?

6 A. I told her I wasn't going to arrest her  
7 that day. She had her little kids with her and I told  
8 her all I wanted to do that particular day was get  
9 information.

11:22 10 Q. Did she agree to meet with you?

11 A. Yes.

12 Q. Did you actually provide her with her  
13 Miranda rights?

14 A. I did.

11:22 15 Q. She wasn't in custody and she was free to  
16 leave; is that correct?

17 A. That is correct.

18 Q. But you still gave her those rights?

19 A. Yes.

11:22 20 Q. With those rights did she determine to  
21 speak with you?

22 A. Yes.

23 Q. Did you ask her about all these incidents?

24 A. I did.

11:22 25 Q. Specifically did you ask what her

11:22 1 relationship was with any of these other two  
2 individuals?

3 A. Yes.

4 Q. What did she say?

11:22 5 A. She had been dating Ralph Alexander for  
6 approximately a year and a half and she also had one  
7 child with him.

8 Q. Did you show her actually some photographs  
9 that you had from these various incidents?

11:22 10 A. Yes.

11 Q. Was she able to recognize herself?

12 A. No, I don't think she recognized herself.  
13 She recognized her car.

14 Q. I apologize.

11:23 15 A. Yeah. And she also recognized Ralph  
16 Alexander.

17 Q. And the photo that she recognized of Ralph  
18 Alexander, were you familiar with that photograph?

19 A. Yes.

11:23 20 Q. Did you know that Ralph Alexander was in  
21 that photograph?

22 A. It was my belief he was, yes.

23 Q. Did you end up doing a line-up or showing  
24 her a photo line-up?

11:23 25 A. Not until -- I interviewed her on

11:23 1 August 12th. I showed her a photo line-up on  
2 August 25th I think.

3 Q. Did she identify somebody?

4 A. Yes.

11:23 5 Q. Who did she identify?

6 A. James Parker.

7 Q. So not Ralph Alexander but the second  
8 individual?

9 A. Right. I didn't show her a picture, a  
11:23 10 photo line-up of James Parker (sic) because she had a  
11 child with him and had been dating him for a year and a  
12 half, she knew who Ralph Alexander was already.

13 Q. Did ask her about her involvement or  
14 whether or not she was present at any of these  
11:23 15 incidents?

16 A. I did.

17 Q. What did she tell you?

18 A. She said she was the driver in her 2002  
19 gold Ford Taurus on all four, on four robberies.

11:24 20 Q. Did you have information about the Boulder  
21 Station robbery from Detective Lorson?

22 A. I did have some information on that but I  
23 specifically kind of stayed away from that and made it  
24 very clear to her that we were only going to talk about  
11:24 25 a different four.

11:24 1 Q. However she acknowledged that she was  
2 involved in that incident?

3 A. To my recollection, but we didn't get into  
4 detail about it.

11:24 5 Q. Because you know that Detective Lorson  
6 already covered it?

7 A. Right.

8 Q. He was the gentleman that testified here  
9 today, the very first witness?

11:24 10 A. Yes.

11 Q. So that is the first incident at Boulder  
12 Station. Going forward chronologically, the Kwiky Mart  
13 on East Lake Mead on June 19th, did you ask her about  
14 that?

11:24 15 A. I did.

16 Q. What did she say about that?

17 A. She provided some accurate details. I  
18 provided her a very minimal amount of information just  
19 to kind of refresh her memory and she provided accurate

11:24 20 details. For instance, she said that the robbery  
21 specifically occurred at a convenience store that did  
22 not have gas pumps, she said it happened during the  
23 night, she said it happened on Lake Mead and Sloan. And  
24 all that, all those details were very accurate as to the  
11:25 25 time, the location and kind of a description of the

11:25 1 business in itself because that becomes pertinent a  
2 little bit later that she specifically said this is a  
3 convenience store that did not have gas pumps. She said  
4 during that robbery both, at the time during this first  
11:25 5 interview she knew that the second suspect was named J  
6 but she didn't know that his name was James Parker. She  
7 didn't identify him until August 25th like we just  
8 discussed. But she said that J, James Parker, and Ralph  
9 Alexander were the suspects that went inside the  
11:25 10 convenience store to do the robbery. She said that  
11 Ralph Alexander would wear a bandanna over his face and  
12 she said, she wasn't exactly sure how much money they  
13 got out of it but she specifically remembered that they  
14 got a large amount of change, she said about \$80 worth  
11:25 15 of change, which was really accurate because in fact I  
16 think like \$240 was stolen during that robbery or  
17 somewhere in there, but specifically \$76 of that was  
18 change. So she was very accurate on those details.

19 Q. And she said her part was that she was the  
11:26 20 driver?

21 A. Correct.

22 Q. So that was the incident on June 19th at  
23 the Kwiky Mart. Did you ask her about June 26th, the  
24 Nail Spa on East Charleston?

11:26 25 A. Yes. She remembered that one much better.

11:26 1 She specifically said it did occur, this particular  
2 incident did occur at like a nail or a beauty type store  
3 she knew. She said she dropped J and Ralph off on the  
4 sidewalk and waited for them as they went in to do the  
11:26 5 robbery. She said again that Ralph would always wear  
6 that bandanna. She indicated that when they came out  
7 she didn't know exactly everything they got because one  
8 of them had a backpack and the contents were in the  
9 backpack, but she also seemed to remember something  
11:26 10 about a tip jar.

11 Q. And did she explain what her role was?

12 A. Again she said she was the driver and it  
13 kind of completely matched up with the video  
14 surveillance we already had.

11:27 15 Q. Did you ask her about the June 30th  
16 incident at Rainbow Market on East Washington?

17 A. Yes. Again she provided accurate details.  
18 She said it happened during the night. She said that,  
19 she specifically remembered that it happened at Nellis  
11:27 20 and Washington which was right on the money. She  
21 indicated again that she used her 2002 gold Ford Taurus,  
22 that she was the driver, that Ralph and J went inside  
23 the business, and this one she accurately said it was a  
24 convenience store, she said this one did have gas pumps  
11:27 25 and that is accurate. So everything she said matched



11:27 1 up.

2 Q. Okay. Did you ask her also about the  
3 July 9th Family Dollar?

4 A. I did.

11:27 5 Q. And what did she say her involvement was in  
6 that?

7 A. That was the one that Ralph and James  
8 Parker were already in custody for. She indicated that  
9 yes she was using her 2002 Ford gold Taurus. She said  
11:28 10 she dropped Ralph off, and in that particular case James  
11 actually must have met up with him because he wasn't in  
12 the car initially. She said she waited for Ralph over  
13 in that neighborhood that was behind to the south of,  
14 which is accurate to where the witness actually saw her  
11:28 15 car and that's where the foot pursuit occurred as well.

16 Q. So in this particular incident she only  
17 dropped off one?

18 A. Correct.

19 Q. Which was?

11:28 20 A. Ralph Alexander.

21 Q. And did she say that she was the driver  
22 again on this incident?

23 A. Yes.

24 Q. In all of these incidents you had  
11:28 25 information about a weapon being used; is that correct?

11:28 1 A. Yes.

2 Q. Did you ask her about her ever seeing a  
3 weapon?

4 A. She didn't say she saw a weapon. She said  
11:28 5 she never saw a gun. I showed her some surveillance  
6 pictures later regarding the Rainbow Market at which  
7 time she recognized Ralph wearing the bandanna, said he  
8 does have a gun.

9 Q. But as far as her, she said she never saw a  
11:29 10 gun separate from you showing her that surveillance?

11 A. Right. Correct.

12 Q. Now ladies and gentlemen of the Grand Jury,  
13 you're hearing evidence about identification by the one  
14 defendant of the other. You are not to consider that as  
11:29 15 to Ralph Alexander. This is just to be considered as to  
16 Tonya Martin and her involvement. It ties into those  
17 events, that's how we give it context, but it's not  
18 substantive evidence against the other co-defendants.  
19 Will you follow that admonition?

11:29 20 There's nothing to the contrary from the  
21 Grand Jury. Okay.

22 Did she talk about how there was a  
23 particular mask that he would use?

24 A. Yes. She said that he, that she had seen  
11:29 25 this, I think she described it as a, I want to say a

11:29 1 Scream mask. I can't remember. I think she described  
2 it as a Scream mask. And I showed her a picture of the  
3 mask that we recovered on July 9th with the Punisher  
4 symbol and she said yes, that's the mask. She said she  
11:30 5 had seen both Ralph and James in possession of that in  
6 the past, however she said during the robberies Ralph  
7 would be the one that would wear the bandanna.

8 Q. So it's very clear, you had some witnesses  
9 describe this as a Scream mask; is that correct?

11:30 10 A. Some said skull, some said Scream.

11 Q. And you've just used the term Punisher?

12 A. Correct.

13 Q. Where does that come from?

14 A. I believe it's a comic book, I think that's  
11:30 15 where it derives from, but that's what, when we  
16 ultimately recovered it that's what it in fact is, it's  
17 the Punisher something.

18 MR. PESCI: No further questions from the  
19 State.

11:30 20 BY A JUROR:

21 Q. How old is Tonya Martin?

22 A. I don't remember. I think she's 30 --  
23 she's in her thirties.

24 BY MR. PESCI:

11:31 25 Q. Detective, would it refresh your

11:31 1 recollection if you reviewed your transcribed statement  
2 with her?

3 A. Yes.

4 Let me do my math. She was born in '82.

11:31 5 Twenty, thirty --

6 A JUROR: Thirty-two.

7 THE WITNESS: Thirty-two. Thank you. I'm  
8 so sorry.

9 A JUROR: Thank you, Officer.

11:31 10 THE WITNESS: Thank you.

11 BY A JUROR:

12 Q. Did you recover any purses, cell phones,  
13 money from all, any of the victims of any of the  
14 robberies?

11:31 15 A. No, sir. Once we arrested James and Ralph  
16 on July 9th we weren't certain of addresses to even  
17 search.

18 Q. Thank you.

19 BY A JUROR:

11:31 20 Q. What was Tonya's ethnicity? Was she white?

21 A. Yes, she is a white female.

22 Q. Okay.

23 THE FOREPERSON: No further questions.

24 By law, these proceedings are secret and

11:31 25 you are prohibited from disclosing to anyone anything

11:31 1 that has transpired before us, including evidence and  
2 statements presented to the Grand Jury, any event  
3 occurring or statement made in the presence of the Grand  
4 Jury, and information obtained by the Grand Jury.

11:31 5 Failure to comply with this admonition is a  
6 gross misdemeanor punishable by a year in the Clark  
7 County Detention Center and a \$2,000 fine. In addition,  
8 you may be held in contempt of court punishable by an  
9 additional \$500 fine and 25 days in the Clark County  
11:31 10 Detention Center.

11 Do you understand this admonition?

12 THE WITNESS: Yes, sir, I do.

13 THE FOREPERSON: Thank you, sir. You're

6 Does anyone have any questions about that?

7 I would also point out that in Count 9,  
8 still on page 5, this was the Vietnamese women, Lien  
9 Nguyen, on line 1, she said it was only US currency that  
11:33 10 was taken.

11 MS. KILLER: And then when you turn to page  
12 6 on Count 13 on line 26, after the word purse, where it  
13 says purse and, we would ask that you amend to mark  
14 slash or wallet, adding the word wallet there. So it  
11:34 15 would read: And/or a purse and/or a wallet and its  
16 contents.

17 On the next page, on page 7, Count 15, line  
18 25, after Montes, we would ask that you add dash  
19 Cervantes, C-E-R-V-A-N-T-E-S, as Iracema testified that  
11:34 20 her last name was hyphenated, Montes-Cervantes.

21 Above that on line 24, the to-wit for Count  
22 15 should read US currency and/or a purse and/or a  
23 wallet with identification and/or credit cards.

24 A JUROR: How about a cell phone, Count 15?  
11:35 25 She testified he took her cell phone too. Would you

11:35 1 like to add that?

2 MS. KILLER: Yes, that's correct. Thank  
3 you. After credit cards you can add and/or cell phone.

4 On Count 16, regarding Irais Montes, after  
11:35 5 purse, please add and/or car keys before and/or  
6 identification.

7 I believe that's all the changes to the  
8 superseding Indictment.

9 A JUROR: Excuse me. I think Irais Montes,  
11:36 10 the second name is mentioned on the Indictment that I  
11 have, page 8, line 2.

12 MS. KILLER: Oh.

13 A JUROR: Her name is mentioned twice in  
14 the Indictment.

11:36 15 MS. KILLER: Oh page 7, line 27 it is there  
16 again.

17 A JUROR: I have line 28 but.

18 MS. KILLER: Maybe they printed on  
19 different pages. I apologize.

11:36 20 Yes, the second instance in Count 15 if we  
21 could correct that as well.

22 MR. PESCI: Thank you very much. That  
23 concludes. We're submitting the case.

24 A JUROR: One more question.

11:37 25 A JUROR: Are we not doing A, B and C? You

11:37 1 didn't change the Indictment number, case number to  
2 include C.

3 MS. KILLER: We'll move to amend on page 11  
4 the Grand Jury case number to read 14BGJ113ABC.

11:37 5 (At this time, all persons, other than  
6 members of the Grand Jury, exit the room at 11:37 a.m.  
7 and return at 11:47 a.m.)

8 THE FOREPERSON: Mr. and Madame District  
9 Attorney, by a vote of 12 or more grand jurors a true  
11:47 10 bill has been returned against defendants Ralph  
11 Alexander, James Parker, Tonya Martin, charging the  
12 crimes of burglary while in possession of a firearm,  
13 robbery with use of a deadly weapon, conspiracy to  
14 commit robbery, attempt robbery with use of a deadly  
11:47 15 weapon, and assault with a deadly weapon, in Grand Jury  
16 case number 14BGJ113AB-C. We instruct you to prepare an  
17 Indictment in conformance with the proposed Indictment  
18 previously submitted to us.

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

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
