


ORDER DENYING STAY AND DIRECTING ANSWER


This is an original petition for a writ of mandamus or, alternatively, a writ of prohibition challenging a district court order allowing video camera access to court proceedings in a criminal trial. Specifically, petitioner objects to real party in interest My Entertainment TV (MET) filming his trial. Petitioner has also filed a motion to stay such filming. Having considered the documents on file herein, we conclude that a stay is not warranted, and we therefore deny the motion.


However, it appears that an answer will assist this court in resolving the petition. MET, on behalf of respondents, shall have 5 days from the date of this order to file an answer, including authorities, against issuance of the requested writ. In addition to the other issues raised, the answer shall address MET's intended use of the film in light of SCR

241(1), which limits the use of video of court proceedings to educational or informational purposes only, and not "unrelated advertising purposes." Petitioner shall have 3 days from service of the answer to file and serve any reply.

It is so ORDERED.
