MEMORANDUM OF POINTS AND AUTHORITIES

Rule 30(d) of the Nevada Rules of Appellate Procedure allows an appellant to include copies of relevant and necessary exhibits in the appendix. However, if an exhibit is not able to be reproduced,

the parties may file a motion requesting the court to direct the district court clerk to transmit the original exhibits. The court will not permit the transmittal of original exhibits except upon a showing that the exhibits are relevant to the issues raised on appeal, and that the court's review of the original exhibits is necessary to the determination of the issues.

NRAP 30 (d).

Appellant asks that this Court direct the District Court Clerk's office to transmit original State's Exhibits 1-20 and Court Exhibit 2 to the Supreme Court for its review.

Appellant was convicted of thirteen counts of possession of credit or debit card without cardholder's consent. State's Exhibits 1-19 are photographs of the credit cards that form the basis for Appellant's convictions. Court Exhibit 2 is a copy of the State's Power Point Presentation which also contains photographs of the credit cards at issue in this case. State's Exhibit 20 is a photograph of Appellant in handcuffs standing in front of a police car. These exhibits are all referenced in Appellant's Fast Track Statement and are relevant to several arguments on appeal.

All of these exhibits (except Appellant's photograph) contain "Personal information" (e.g., a "natural person's first name . . . and last name in combination

with ... credit card number[s]"). See NRS 603A.040(1)(c). Pursuant to ADKT 410 Exhibit A, the Amendment to Rule 2 of the Policy for Handling Filed, Lodged, and Presumptively Confidential Documents, documents containing "personal information" as defined by NRS 603A.040 should not be filed in an unredacted manner. In this case, Appellant has redacted all but the last four digits of the credit card numbers at issue, pursuant to this rule.

Unfortunately, after making these redactions, it is exceedingly difficult to read the remaining contents of the exhibits as they currently appear in Appellant's Appendix. The credit cards were originally in color, but were introduced into evidence in the form of black-and-white photocopies. The evidence vault prepared color copies of the black and white exhibits for the Public Defender's Office. When we copied them back into black and white for inclusion in the Appendix and then scanned them in black and white to this Court, significant distortion occurred. See Appellant's Appendix Vol. 4 at pp. 702-737.

For that same reason, Appellant is seeking transmission of State's Exhibit 20, the color photograph of Appellant in handcuffs in front of a police car, and Court Exhibit 2, the PowerPoint Presentation that includes copies of this color photograph. Again, because of the distortion that occurs when we try to include such documents in an Appendix, the Court is unable to see just how prejudicial

this picture was to Appellant's case without looking at the original document. See Appellant's Appendix Vol. 4 at pp. 700-701.

Because Appellant relies on and refers to each of the aforementioned exhibits in his Fast Track Statement, it is necessary for this Court to review the original exhibits on appeal. Additionally, having access to the original documents will allow the Court to see the credit cards in an unredacted manner.

Appellant therefore requests that this Honorable Court direct the Eighth Judicial District Court Clerk to transmit original State's Exhibits 1-20 and Court Exhibit 2 for this Court's review.
