*ORDER GRANTING MOTION IN PART AND DIRECTING FILING OF
TRANSCRIPT REQUEST FORM*

The parties have filed a joint motion for an extension of time to file the opening and answering briefs. Cause appearing, we grant the motion to the following extent. Appellant shall have until July 2, 2018, to file and serve the opening brief and appendix.¹ NRAP 31(b)(3)(B). Because the motion is not signed by counsel of record for respondent,² we decline to grant any extension of time to file the answering brief. *See* NRAP 25(a)(5). We note, however, that if appellant files her opening brief on July 2, 2018,

the answering brief will be due to be filed by August 1, 2018, *see* NRAP 31(a)(1), the date requested in the motion.

On April 2, 2018, we entered an order directing appellant to file and serve, within 14 days, either a supplemental transcript request form or a supplemental certification that no transcripts are requested. *See* NRAP 9(a). To date, the required document has not been filed with the clerk of this court. Appellant's counsel shall have 11 days from the date of this order to file and serve the transcript request form or a certificate that no transcripts will be requested. We caution appellant's counsel that failure to comply with this order may result in the imposition of sanctions. NRAP 9(a)(7).

It is so ORDERED.
