On March 12, 2015, you responded to the request for evidence concerning the extension of time filed concerning Permit 72700. Given the similarity of information stated on the request for extension of time concerning Permit 72700, and Permits 64977, 64978, 66400, 73428, 73429, 73430 and 74327, this response applies equally to all of the listed Permits (i.e., 'the Project').

Pursuant to NRS § 533.380(3) an application for the extension must in all cases be accompanied by proof and evidence of the reasonable diligence with which the applicant is pursuing the perfection of the application. The measure of reasonable diligence is the steady application of effort to perfect the application in a reasonably expedient and efficient manner under all the facts and circumstances. NRS § 533.380(6). Further, when a project or integrated system is composed of several features, work on one feature of the project or system may be considered in finding that reasonable diligence has been shown in the development of water rights for all features of the entire project or system. *Id.*

In addition, in requests for extensions on permits for municipal use on any land referred to in NRS § 533.380(1)(b), or for any use which may be served by a county, city, town, public water district or public water company, requests an extension of time to apply the water to a beneficial use, the State Engineer shall also consider:

(a) Whether the holder has shown good cause for not having made a complete application of the water to a beneficial use;

(b) The number of parcels and commercial or residential units which are contained in or planned for the land being developed or the area being served by the county, city, town, public water district or public water company;

(c) Any economic conditions which affect the ability of the holder to

make a complete application of the water to a beneficial use;

(d) Any delays in the development of the land or the area being served by the county, city, town, public water district or public water company which were caused by unanticipated natural conditions; and

(e) The period contemplated in the:

(1) Plan for the development of a project approved by the local government pursuant to NRS 278.010 to 278.460, inclusive; or

(2) Plan for the development of a planned unit development recorded pursuant to chapter 278A of NRS,

if any, for completing the development of the land.

Your response included a written response, copies of the amendment to the Washoe County Regional Water Management Plan to Include the North Valley Strategy, Regional Water Planning Commission Minutes, a written Current Status of the Project, and various invoices for legal fees, consultant and professional fees, accountant fees and secretary of state fees. I have considered the evidence you submitted concerning the extension request and a discussion of my opinion concerning the evidence submitted as it relates to the extension request follows below.

1. <u>Discussion of Amendment to the Regional Water Management Plan and Current Status of the Project</u>

The Amendment to the Regional Water Management Plan to Include the North Valley Strategy (1995-2015), which was adopted March 31, 1997, identified four water supply alternatives, one of which included the Warm Springs Importation Project ("Project"). Although the Project was briefly described, the Plan Amendment makes clear that the County sought to pursue multiple projects simultaneously in order to maximize flexibility, to provide greater competitive position among negotiations with project proponents, and to secure a reliable water supply system beyond 2015. Therefore, it was recommended that, among other potential projects, your Project was to be aggressively pursued and implemented as needed and merited. Specific activities of the Regional Plan to implement the strategy included entering into agreements with project proponents to resolve remaining implementation issues and set performance criteria for proving viability of the projects. If the projects met the performance criteria, completed supporting technical analysis, submitted permit applications, prepared environmental documentation, completed preliminary engineering design, then the county would initiate formal discussions with project proponents to establish potential terms of an agreement to implement each project. Based on the results of these activities the County was to implement either the Project or the Green Gulch Project, or both.

Subsequent to the revision of the Regional Plan, the "Current Status of the Project" does identify a number of performance criteria that were carried out, including: conformance reviews completed by the Regional Water Planning Commission, a Record of Decision issued on the EIS, Special Permit issued by the County, a Utility Environmental Protection Act (UEPA) permit issued by the Public Utility Commission, easements and rights of way were obtained and the drilling of seven wells. You also state that a final report, the archeological survey, is due later this year.

From the foregoing history it is evident that in 1997, the County contemplated the Project as a potential water source for the North Valleys, and considered future implementation of the Project subject to later-met performance criteria. As you demonstrate in your response, many activities were carried out laying the groundwork for the Project until the economic slowdown beginning in or around 2008.

2. Discussion of invoices

You submitted a number of invoices for attorney's fees, which your response states were incurred from meetings with Washoe County commissioners and meetings with representatives of the Washoe County District Attorney's Office to develop an appropriate agreement for Washoe County to obtain the Project. While you state that ultimately an agreement was not reached with the County, the attorney's fees which were incurred appear to support the portions of the Regional Water Management Plan that formal discussions between the County and you would occur concerning the potential terms of an agreement to implement the Project.

As well, the consultant fees paid to Robert Williams to draft a letter of support regarding the FEIS demonstrates new efforts toward project milestones.

However, I find that the invoices for professional accounting and tax preparation services, and annual Secretary of State filing fees, do not help demonstrate the steady application of effort to perfect the application. Rather, invoices for professional accounting and tax preparation services, annual Secretary of State filing fees are indicative of revolving administrative fees incurred by Intermountain Water Supply.

You later clarified that the attorney's fees were incurred by Rew Goodenew, of Parsons, Behle & Lattimer.

3. Application of Bacher.

I decline at this time to apply the anti-speculation doctrine of the Bacher decision to deny the extensions on the basis of speculation. I would note, however, that the applications for extensions of time filed since 2011 have indicated you are seeking a buyer for the project. Inasmuch as negotiations with the County were unfruitful at the end of 2014, the inability to secure a buyer in future requests for extensions of time will not be considered good cause for extensions of time. See Colorado River Water Conservation Dist. v. Vidler Tunnel Water Co., 594 P.2d 566 (Colo. 1979) (articulating anti-speculation doctrine adopted by Bacher, stating the right to appropriate is for use, not merely for profit).

In considering NRS 533.380(4), <u>I find good cause for granting extensions</u> on the Project permits. The area to be served is Lemmon Valley, which has existing developments with currently little to no recharge. It is true that economic conditions have been poor in recent years for which I have taken into consideration.

Notwithstanding that the extensions of time are being granted, please be advised that further requests for extensions on permits comprising the Project will be closely scrutinized to ensure the statutory criteria for granting extensions of time are adhered to. In that vein, for any future extensions of time filed regarding the Project, please submit evidence request for extensions are filed, which demonstrates good cause supporting future extension requests made pursuant to NRS 533.380.²

Please be advised that the 1993 Nevada Legislature passed and the Governor signed into law S.B. 19 which established certain noticing requirements which must be met by any applicant for underground water for municipal, quasi-municipal, or industrial uses for 0.5 c.f.s. or greater. Ground surface and measuring point elevations will be measured at each production and monitoring well using a survey-grade GPS instrument. Groundwater level data will be downloaded at least semiannually into a project database and the accuracy of the measurements checked with manual measurements using an electronic sounder. GROUNDWATER QUALITY

Groundwater quality samples will be collected from all five production wells and selected monitoring wells and analyzed by a laboratory for major ions, trace elements, and/or isotopes. The wells to be sampled for laboratory analysis include all production wells (DV-I through DV-5) and the following two nested monitoring wells: DVM-17 (shallow) and DVM-18 (deep) located near the state line (Figure D-2).

The following parameters will be measured in each water sample:

- Field Parameters: Water temperature, pH, and specific conductance.
- Common lons: Calcium, sodium, potassium, magnesium, chloride, fluoride, sulfate, bicarbonate, nitrate, total dissolved solids, and total suspended solids.
- Trace Elements: Arsenic, barium, copper, Iron, lead, manganese, and zinc.
- Isotopes: Oxygen-18 and deuterium.

More extensive water quality analysis will be performed for samples from the production wells to meet Safe Drinking Water requirements. Samples will be collected and analyzed from the selected wells on a quarterly basis for the first two years of production well pumping to establish seasonal variations. Thereafter, the wells will be sampled and analyzed semiannually. An exception is that the isotopes will be analyzed only once per year for the first two years.

Frequency, sampling location, and water quality parameters will be reviewed by the WAC on an annual basis, and may be reduced or expanded in scope upon its recommendation.

STREAM FLOW

Miscellaneous stream flow measurements in Dry Valley Creek and North Fork Dry Valley Creek have been made in the past 4 years by the USGS (Berger 2004) and Intermountain Water Supply. Perennial flow is observed to occur in the upgradient portions of these streams until the drainages discharge to the lower valley floor. The proposed production wells are located near the transition zone from perennial to ephemeral or intermittent flows. Approximately 2.5 miles farther downstream near the CA-NV state line, Dry Valley Creek is observed to maintain a small perennial flow for a short reach.

Three continuous stage recorders will be installed on lower North Fork Dry Valley Creek (S-1), upper Dry Valley Creek (S-2), and lower Dry Valley Creek (S-3 near the state line) (Figure D-2). The stage data will converted to flow rate using rating curve information developed from various flow measurements made over a range of flow conditions. This information will better characterize baseline stream flow conditions, and provide a means to monitor potential effects of production wells pumping on surface water flow.

SPRINGS AND RIPARIAN AREAS


Selected springs and associated riparian areas will be monitored in Dry Valley to determine if pumping from the production wells would have an adverse effect on flow and/or vegetative conditions. The springs selected for monitoring are: DVC-81 (seepage from Dry Valley Creek into a pond); and DVC-86 (Duckweed Spring) (Figure D-2). Monitoring activities will be conducted on a quarterly basis, with information

periodically entered into the project database. Monitoring activities will include the following:

- Flow: Flow rate of water discharging from the spring will be measured using a flow meter or portable flume. Alternatively, a staff gage can be installed to measure relative changes in water level if the flow is in a well-defined channel. For low flows or dispersed flows on the ground surface, flows can be estimated.
- Photo-Documentation of Vegetation: One or more photographs will be taken
 of the spring site from the same location each time so that relative changes in
 vegetation and overall site conditions can be evaluated.

PRECIPITATION

A precipitation gage will be installed in Dry Valley to measure precipitation amount on a daily basis. This information will be recorded weekly by the well field operator, and periodically entered into the project database.

Monitor wells and springs are shown on Figure D-1 of Attachment A. A list of the wells with survey coordinates was also attached to your correspondence of May 23, 2006.

There were a few minor differences between your attached list of proposed monitor wells and Figure D-1 of Attachment A. Figure D-1 shows well Headquarters MW-2, however the table lists Headquarters MW-1. Jennifer Morgan of your staff recently clarified that Headquarters MW-2 is the actual well to be monitored. In addition, Ms. Morgan indicated the well shown as BB MWA on Figure D-1 is the same as well BB-2A in your table.

As we discussed at our meeting of May 8, 2006, there must be two additional monitor wells in addition to the monitor wells shown on Figure D-1 of Attachment A. These wells will be Sand Pass MW-2, to be used in conjunction with Sand Pass MW-1 to determine hydraulic gradient in that location. Another new well is to be located near USGS-01 such that the two wells together will provide information on the groundwater gradient and change in gradient between the Fish Springs Ranch and the Sierra Army Depot. Well USGS-04 was shown on your list of May 23 but is not suitably located to identify changes in gradient between the pumping center and the

Sierra Army Depot. These new wells shall be measured at least quarterly. Monitor wells LB2, USGS-04 and well 9 are shown on Figure D-1, but are not currently equipped with a recording pressure transducer. Are these wells part of the monitoring program, and if so, are you planning to equip them with recording devices or to measure manually?

You have requested to exclude High Rock Spring, designated as HLV-165 on Figure D-1, from the monitoring network. High Rock Spring is approximately 12 miles northwest of the center of the planned well field, and your request to remove the site from the network is approved.

The following table is believed to accurately list each of the planned monitor wells. Please contact me if you believe this list to be incorrect, incomplete or if you would like to propose changes. The Plan is tentatively approved subject to clarification on the status of USGS-04, LB2 and well 9 and to the addition of one new monitor well near USGS-01, whose location and depth must be pre-approved by this office. The Nevada Division of Water Resources reserves the right to amend this plan any time during the life of the project as conditions warrant.



for a time when it could be needed. When developers again come knocking, for instance, or a groundwater basin somewhere needs recharging.

Her ally on the commission, Chairman David Humke, agrees.


"It could be for a lot of things," he said. "Could be agricultural. It could be residential. There might be a new town in Warm Springs or Dry Valley. We may need it for fire protection."

The pair echo the sales pitch Marshall has been delivering to county commissioners.

Marshall is adamant that it's a good deal for the county—a deal that will keep intact the 3,400 acre-feet of groundwater he's spent two decades assembling in the hopes of selling it to developers during the boom.

Indeed, the sales price he is offering the county is literally pennies on the dollar compared to what he might have sold the water for just 10 years ago.

"If something were to happen to me, there's no doubt many people would start filing on these water rights, and they would be lost to the citizens of Washoe County," he said.

Thrnipseed reviewed all of
the past studies and concluded
Marshall's proposal is a "great
opportunity for Washoe County."

"The water rights are reasonably priced," Turnipseed wrote. "At least five scientists, some of the best in the world, have studied the basins, and all indications are that the water is there."

The appraisal that Turnipseed provided with the report valued the water rights at \$7.2 million — \$2.4 million below Marshall's offer.

Turnipseed also concluded his report with a sales pitch of his own, offering to help the county keep the water rights in good standing with the state engineer and facilitate any attempt to re-permit the water for use outside Lemmon Valley.

As for the Earth Knowledge study that recommended further modeling, Turnipseed concluded, "We don't have that hixury here" and said the past studies are valid.

That finding is confested by Washoe County's former hydrogeologist Dan Dragan, who wrote a letter to commissioners opposing the purchase.

"Every professional report I've read about this project, based on my 30-plus years' exTims is an investment for Washoe County."

Or, it could be a bailout for a water project Marshall was never able to make good on.

There was a need!

Marshall's water project has a storied past.

In the late 1990s, when developers had designs on building a sea of homes in the North Valleys, no more precious a commodity existed than water.

The Truckee River couldn't sustain all of the proposed development Established groundwater basins were being tapped out. Red tape had scattled the most ambitious of water importation projects from Honey Lake.

And so the scramble for water was on.

For those who could deliver the water, the fortunes could be instant.

Water rights were fetching anywhere from \$20,000 to \$50,000 an acre-foot.

In 2005, when Washoe County auctioned off 174 acre-feet of water rights, it brought in an average of \$40,492 an acre-foot. One acre-foot of water is to like shough to supply two the fainty bones for one water.

At that rate, Marshall potentially could have made \$136 million on his Dry Valley water.


But it didn't quite work out


Marshall arrived in Reno in 1958 as a young lawyer with dreams of being a rancher. He eventually bought his ranch in Warm Springs Valley, where he and his son, Tom Marshall, run cattle.

When the water wars began for supplying developers in the North Valleys, Marshall thought he would be able to export water from his Warm Springs ranch. As he was purting that project together, an engineer suggested he take a look

flow through the pipe.

To date, no water has actually been imported for sale. The same recession that robbed Marshall of the chance to make good on his water rights halted demand for Vidler's water, too. But the company stands ready to sell it once demand resumes, and the infrastructure is already in place to deliver it.

As a point of almost unbearable irony for the Marshalls, Vidien's pipe runs right over the family's water rights. Connecting to the pipe would be a potentially easy endeavor.

But it can't happen now under the terms of a settlement with the Pyramid Lake Painte Tribe, which had sued the U.S. Bureau of Land Management over the right of way granted to Vidler for the pipeline.

In the early days, Bob Marshall said, he tried on multiple occasions to strike a deal with Vidler, but terms could never be reached.

He doesn't have the capital to build a pipeline for his water. And he knows the pipeline price tag — anywhere from \$20 million to \$50 million — is enough to make taxpayers balk. So he focuses his pitch on the fact Washoe County can simply hold on to the water rights until a need arises.

"We went through the recession—I call it the depression—and that hit us. We haven't been able to do anything with (the water)," Marshall said.

Bob Marshall called me'

This isn't the first time Marshall has tried to sell the water to Washoe County.

In 2012, he made a \$9 million pitch to the commission. His pitch went nowhere in the face of significant opposition from county staff, which raised concerns about the amount of water that's actually underground in Dry Valley.

perience as a hydrogeologist, leaves strong doubts about the value of Dry Valley water rights," Dragan wrote. "Most studies and reports state there are not enough data to conclude the aquifers can produce water in the quantity and quality necessary for a good municipal water supply and in amounts consistent with (Marshall's) permits."

Vahid Behmaram, Washoe County's current water rights manager, also raised significant concerns about the availability of the water.

But Weber has dismissed those concerns and has accused county staff of bias.

"I don't want to say I know more about water than the people who work for Washoe County, because I know they do know it," Weber said "But at some point in time, you have to look at, are there other issues our staff is dealing with? Could they be partisan, if you will, to not wanting the water for a particular reason?"

Weber declined to be more specific in describing staff's motivation for opposing the purchase, adding that "our staff have been fighting Mr. Marshall for many years."

Washoe County Manager John Slaughter disputed that staff has a bias.

"Certainly our staff has had numerous years that they've either followed this or had the opportunity to review proposals," Slaughter said. "I don't know that I am aware of any particular bias. I would hope that staff is providing the information and then letting the policymakers make the decision on the policy direction they want to go."

While Humke and Weber have championed the idea, other commissioners are skeptical.

Commissioner Vaughn Hartung said he can trius if y pending \$9.6 million A a "DELL"

at water in neighboring Dry Valley, Upper Dry Valley and Bedell Flat.

"We found out there weren't any permits out there," Mar-

shall said.

The county wound up prohibiting the export of water from the Warm Springs Basin. So Marshall focused even more on filing for the Dry Valley water.

"Sometimes I get the feeling people think we've done bad things trying to take water into Lemmon Valley," Marshall said at a commission meeting last month. "I don't think we did. There was a need."

But as Marshall was putting together his project—applying for water permits with the state, drilling wells, conducting environmental assessments, cobbling together rights of way across federal land, obtaining special use permits—he was up against another company doing pretty much the same thing.

Vidler Water Co had assembled water rights in Fish Springs Ranch even farther north of Reno and raised the capital for a 28-mile pipeline to feed the water to Lemmon Val-

Marshall's project essentially fell flat.

An unfinished project

At 80, Marshall has a mind like a steel trap, instantly recalling names, dates and figures from decades ago. He has dencing blue eyes, a witty charm and is always ready with an entertaining story to tell about old-time Reno, fast cars and that randy bull that almost broke out

of the back of his 1931 pickup truckin downtown Los Angeles.

Beyond his perpetually friendly demeanor, however, Marshall has a bubbling frustration over his water project. He does his best to keep it under wraps.

But he said he's put a lot of time and effort into assembling the water rights, which had the potential to be very incrative for him and his family.

Along the way, he has jumped through bureaucratic hoops at the county, state and federal level. In 1997, his project was approved as a preferred way to provide water to the North Valleys by the Regional Water Planning Commission.

And in the most recent water management plan, the Dry Valley water is identified as a source to help Cold Springs with its water needs in the future.

While Marshall is losth to express his frustration, he notes that he wants to see the project through in his lifetime.

"I hate to tell you this, but a clock does run on a person's life," Marshall said. "I'm 80 years old. I don't want to leave my family with an unfinished project."

Them Marshall doesn't work as hard to keep up a veneer of diplomacy. In his opinion, the county and its staff have kow-towed to Vidler Water—a multimillion-dollar substituty of a giant holding company that has invested heavily in lobbying local government to see its project through.

The Marshalls, by contrast,

he says, are local ranchers who have done their best to give back to the community.

"We're just two local guys with a little bit of water to sell," Tom Marshall said. "We don't have the money to go schmooze the commissioners. We can't afford to pay all those lobbyists, and I don't like them, anyway. I think they're a waste of money."

And, it's not like the county has never bought water off a rancher before, Tom Marshall said during a recent tour of five test wells the family has drilled to help prove the water resource.

In fact, in 1987, the county bought the surface water rights in Dry Valley from rancher Dalton LaRue. The babbling brook runs right over the top of the Marshalls' groundwater.

"The county bought the La-Rues' water," Tom Marshall said, standing on the edge of the small creek in Dry Valley. "Why can't they buy ours?"

Water wars

Vidler won the North Valleys water war. Many county officials point to the Vidler project as an example of how water deals should be done.

The private company invested its own money — up to \$100 million — to both assemble the water rights and build the infrastructure for piping it to Lemmon Valley.

That infrastructure has been deeded to Washoe County, which now is responsible for its operating and maintenance costs. And only Vidler water can

The subject has been studied ad nauseam. Analyses date back to the 1960s and include various models for estimating how much water seeps into the ground and is stored each year. To help the research along, the Marshalls built five test wells, running 10-day pumps to better establish the potential yield.

According to the early models, the groundwater is recharged at a fast enough rate to yield the 3,400 acre-feet Marshall has permits for. But in 2008, an independent review by Earth Knowledge concluded "there is insufficient data to make an informed decision on the availability of ground water."

Further, the quality of the water was called into question, with findings of arsenic and a pH level above allowable levels for drinking water. That's not unusual for the region, which has to treat or blend water from multiple sources to achieve healthy limits.

In light of those concerns, the county passed on Marshall's offer.

But now, with one new commissioner on the board, and new staff leading the county's water resources division, Marshall has decided to make another go of it...

In September, with the help of Weber and Humke, Marshall convinced the county to spend \$25,000 on yet another independent assessment of the water.

The county hired Mike Turnipseed, the former state engineer.

Asked how he came by the contract, Turnipseed answered:

purpose and no identifiable return on investment when the county is facing so many other needs in the wake of the recession.

"The county, first of all, is not really in a position to make these kinds of long-term investments, and if we were going to spend this kind of money, I personally see a higher need," Hartung said. "Everything from the detention facility to senior services and all points in between."

Commissioner Marsha Berkhigler raised a similar point.

"Where would the money come from?" Berkhigier said. "We are doing well, but we are not fully recovered and we have lots of things we need to do with the money we do have."

Marshall said he is sympathetic to the county's financial needs. He has asked for a down payment of 7.5 percent and is willing to finance the balance over 10 years at a 5 percent interest rate.

Weber has no suggestions for where the county would find the

money.
"I don't know. Staff is supposed to be answering that,"
Weber said.

Humke said he would suggest using money the federal government pays the county in lieu of property taxes. That is estimated to be about \$3 million a year.

But Slaughter said that money is already included in the general fund budget. If the county used it to buy water rights, it would have to offset it with a "revenue increase or an expenditure decrease" somewhere else.

Suits seek to block water pipeline to Vegas

Environmentalists, rural advocates take the debate into federal system

An environmental group and a coalition of rural interests filed separate federal lawsuits Wednesday seeking to block a massive water pipeline that would pump billions of gallons of water from beneath remote valleys along the Nevada-Utah line and ship it to Las Vegas.

The lawsuits are the first foray into the federal court system in the ongoing battle over plans by the Southern Nevada Water Authority to siphon groundwater from four rural valleys in the central eastern part of the state to quench the thirst of the desert gambling metropolis that is home to 2 million people and hosts 40 million visitors anmully

The Center for Biological Diversity argues in its lawsuit that the water pipeline project would virtually suck rural groundwater dry and turn meadows to dust. The suit contends the project imperils delicate species, including fish, frogs, toads and sage grouse, a chicken-size bird being considered for protection under the Endangered Species Act.

In a statement, the Las Vegas-based water authority said environmental groups "regularly test the sufficiency of federal environmental examinations made under the National Environmental Policy Act by filing lawsuits."

"We will review the complaint over the next few weeks to determine our course of action," the agency said.

The suit claims the U.S. Bureau of Land Management violated federal environmental laws when it granted the water suthority the right of way for the 250-mile; multibillion-dollar pipeline project in 2012.

"Congress passed these laws to make sure our public lands are managed on the basis of multiple use, to protect irreplaceable cultural and natural resources for current and future generations," said Rob Mrowka, Nevada representative for the Tucson-based environmental group.

A separate lawsuit was filed by a coalition of local governments in White Pine and Lincoln counties, citizen groups, Indian tribes, environmental organizations and others. It also argues that the BLM failed to adequately analyze effects the water project would have on the rural landscape, livelihoods and cultural resources.

Simeon Herskovits, a lawyer for the coalition, said scientific modeling shows the pumping would have devastating consequences for the Spring, Cave, Dry Lake and Delamar valleys. He said BLM's plans to offset the effects of withdrawing the water are "woefully vague and inadequate" and have little to no hope of success.

Both lawsuits, filed in U.S. District Court in Las Vegas, seek an injunction to block the project from going forward.

Apush to find more water for Las Vegas has increased in recent years amid ongoing drought in the Southwest and the depletion of the Lake Mead reservoir on the Colorado River to half full. Las Vegas draws about 90 percent of its drinking water from the reservoir behind Hoover Dam.

The federal lawsums are the latest in years of litigation that until now has taken place in state courts.
