This Information Is About Your Illness and Diagnosis

BURNS (Second-Degree, Partial thickness)

There are three levels of burns:

- **First-degree** burns only affect the outer layer of the skin and cause pain, redness, and swelling.
- **Second-degree** burns (partial thickness) affect both the outer and the underlying layer of skin and cause pain, redness, swelling, and blistering.
- **Third-degree** burns (full thickness) extend into the deeper tissue of the skin and are more severe. They cause white or blackened, charred skin that may feel numb.

Second-degree burns destroy the outer layers of the skin. The skin is reddened and has blisters. That makes infection more likely. While the skin is healing, apply a burn cream to fight infection. Sterile dressings will keep the skin clean and protect it from more injury from rubbing. It may take up to 3 weeks to heal. The deeper and larger the burn, the longer it may take to heal. Some second-degree burns may cause scars.

Please follow these instructions:

- Wash your hands with soap and water before and after caring for the burn.
- Keep the burned area clean and dry.
- Use a clean cloth to wash the burn each day with soap and water.
