## **MEMORANDUM**

I, KRISTA D. BARRIE, am a duly licensed attorney in the State of Nevada and am employed by the Clark County District Attorney's Office.

Respondent's Answering Brief is currently due August 21, 2018. This is a direct appeal from the Judgment of Conviction. This Court may extend the time to file a Respondent's Answering Brief upon a clear showing of good cause. NRAP 31(b)(3). Further extensions may be granted upon a showing of extraordinary circumstances and extreme need. <u>Id</u>.

The State herein makes its second request for an enlargement of time. The State requests thirty (30) days to include September 20, 2018, within which to file Respondent's Answering Brief.

Appellant's Opening Brief was originally due on January 25, 2018, but Appellant requested and received two extensions: the first, by stipulation on January 25, 2018, for thirty (30) days, and the second, on February 23, 2018, which was granted in part and allowed Appellant another (49) days to file his Opening Brief. On April 10, 2018, Appellant also filed a Motion for Leave to File Opening Brief in Excess of Type-Volume Limitations, which was granted.

The Opening Brief contains seventy-two pages with nine (9) claims, which include numerous sub issues requiring a thorough examination of this extensive, 2,988 page trial record, which resulted in Appellant's conviction of life in prison.

Moreover, Appellant attached JAVS videos of his jury trial to his Brief, which the State has to review in order to prepare an adequate Response. Additionally, Appellant's Statement of Facts fails to include the detailed testimony of the six child-victims in this case, who testified at trial through the Spanish interpreter, which the State intends to include in the Respondent's Brief in order to provide this Court with the factual background necessary to review the issues presented.

While the State has a working draft, this draft must still be refined and reviewed by not only the assigning attorney, but by the trial deputies in charge of this case.

Therefore, the State hereby makes this second request to extend time to allow an additional thirty (30) days to review and properly brief Appellant's claim for this Court. This motion is made in good faith and not for the purposes of undue delay.
