Jackson Mountains and the Bilk Creek Range, and is almost completely separated from the main valley by a north-trending ridge along the west edge of T. 43 N., R. 32 E. This part of the valley trends northwest and is 10 miles long and about 4 miles wide.

Numbering System for Wells and Springs

The well-numbering system used in this report indicates the location of the wells within the rectangular subdivisions of the public lands referenced to the Mount Diablo meridian and base line. The first two segments of a well number designate the township and range; the third segment is the number of the section followed by a letter which designates the quarter section in which the well or spring is located. Following the letter a number indicates the order in which the well or spring was recorded within the subdivision. The letters A, B, C, and D designate, respectively, the northeast, northwest, southwest, and southeast quarters of the section. For example, well number 46/30-13A1 designates the first well recorded in the NE 1/4 sec. 13, T. 46 N., R. 30 E., Mount Diablo base and meridian.

Plate I shows the location of wells and springs in the valley. The available data on the wells and springs are listed in table 2. The results of chemical analyses of water from the thermal springs and selected wells are in table 3.

GEOGRAPHIC FEATURES

Landforms and Drainage

Pine Forest Valley is in the Great Basin section of the Basin and Range physiographic province. The Great Basin is an area of alternating mountain ranges and valleys which generally trend nearly north. The mountain ranges commonly are 50 to 70 miles long and 6 to 15 miles wide. The valleys have approximately the same dimensions. The crests of the mountain ranges ordinarily are 3,000 to 5,000 feet above the valley floors and 7,000 to 10,000 feet above sea level. Typically, a range is a faulted and tilted block.

The intermontane valleys are characteristically closed alluvium-filled basins, although some valleys are interconnected by drainage channels. Playas, or "dry lakes", are present in most of the valleys and receive runoff from the mountain ranges. Pine Forest Valley differs from the typical valley of the Great Basin in that it is not closed and has no playa. Runoff from the valley discharges into the Quinn River, which in turn flows southwestward to the playas of the Black Rock Desert where it evaporates.

Mountains

The Bilk Creek Range, which borders the east side of the valley, consists mostly of lava flows of Tertiary age to which a gentle eastward dip of 10° to 15° has been imparted by faulting and tilting of the mountain block. The crest

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ranges from about 1,000 feet above the valley floor at the southern end of the valley to about 3,000 feet above the floor near the northern end.

Along the west side of the valley, the Pine Forest Range rises rather abruptly above the valley floor. At both the southern and northern ends the crest is about 3,000 feet above the valley floor but near the middle of the range at Duffer Peak, altitude 9,500 feet, the crest is about 5,400 feet above the valley floor. This range is composed predominantly of granodiorite but also contains some volcanic and sedimentary rocks, especially at the southern end.

The Jackson Mountains, a complex of metamorphic and volcanic rocks, rise to about 4,500 feet above the valley floor at their northern end in a northfacing amphitheater whose west limb extends as a low spur toward the center of the valley.

Piedmont Slopes and Valley Floor

Piedmont slopes consist of coalescing alluvial fans that form a continuous apron around the mountain ranges and merge almost imperceptibly into the valley floor. These slopes range in width from less than half a mile at the south end of the valley to several miles at the north end.

The valley floor is the relatively flat area downslope from the alluvial fans. It has an area of approximately 200 square miles, or about 70 percent of the total area of alluvium. The gradient of the main part of the valley is generally southward and ranges from more than 50 feet per mile at the north end of the valley to about 8 feet per mile at the south end. That part of the valley floor which lies in the gap between the Jackson Mountains and the Bilk Creek Range is nearly level.

Streams

Many of the streams that drain the mountain ranges are ephermeral. Most of the smaller stream courses carry water only during and after storms, but some also carry water for a few months during late winter and spring.

Meager flow characterizes most of the streams draining the Bilk Creek Range. This range is composed largely of volcanic rocks that are jointed and broken to form a porous surface, and thus most of the precipitation on the range infiltrates to the ground-water reservoir rather than moving overland.

The Bilk Creek-Quinn River drainageway is the major stream system in the valley. Bilk Creek, which drains about 50 square miles, is incised deeply into the Bilk Creek Range. The flow of this stream is perennial but flashy in nature and, reportedly, during the spring runoff it overflows the 2,000 acrefoot capacity reservoir in sec. 4, T. 43 N., R. 32 E., which is used by the Quinn River Crossing Ranch to control the flow of Bilk Creek below the reservoir for irrigation.

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The canyons along the east flank of the Pine Forest Range broaden into alluvial basins in their upper reaches. The streams in this area are fed by seepage from the mantle of alluvium which acts as a regulator, absorbing water from snowmelt and rain and discharging it into the canyons as seeps and springs. Most of these streams, therefore, are perennial in their upper reaches, but the water sinks into the alluvium of the piedmont slope and few of the streams reach the valley floor except during periods of high runoff.

Several stream channels are incised in the main valley floor. Most notable of these is the channel of the Quinn River which is dry throughout most of the year. In the winter, however, when evapotranspiration requirements are less and precipitation is somewhat greater, the water table rises and the Quinn River drains the valley southwestward to the Black Rock Desert at a gradient of about 8 feet per mile. The gradient of the Quinn River above the confluence with Bilk Creek is less than 2 feet per mile. The flow of water is negligible in this reach of the river, except during periods of extremely high runoff.

Climate

The climate of the valley ranges from arid to semiarid. The precipitation and humidity are low and summer temperatures and evaporation rates are high. Precipitation is irregular in areal distribution but generally is least on the valley floor and greatest on the highest parts of the mountains. The range in temperature is large, both daily and seasonally. The growing season is short.


Figure 2, based on records from the U. S. Weather Bureau station at Quinn River Crossing Ranch, shows the average monthly precipitation and average monthly temperatures for a 26-year period ending in 1950, and the average of the monthly high and of the monthly low temperatures for a 5-year period ending 1950.


Recorded temperatures range from a maximum of 105°F to a minimum of -34°F. Although freezing temperatures have been recorded every month of the year, the average date of the last killing frost in the spring is June 20, and that of the first killing frost in the fall is September 5; thus the average growing season has 77 days (U. S. Department of Agriculture, 1941, p. 979). However, the U.S. Weather Bureau station (altitude 4, 087 feet) is only 50 feet above the lowest part of the valley and, because cold air commonly flows into the low parts of a valley during periods of little or no wind movement, the station records probably show somewhat lower temperatures than generally occur in other parts of the valley. Thus, a somewhat longer growing season may prevail along the piedmont slopes and the higher parts of the valley floor.

The average annual precipitation for the 26-year period of record is 5.6 inches. Most of this occurs during the winter as snow. Ordinarily the snow on the valley floor melts in a few days, but at the higher elevations it may remain for several weeks or months. The summers are notably dry. Usually, precipitation is only a small fraction of an inch during July and August, the driest

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months, and in some years there is no precipitation during these months! The evaporation rate from a free-water surface, based on data from Weather Bureau records in the State, is estimated to be about 4 feet per year, or more than 8 times the precipitation.

GEOLOGY

Previous Investigations

The geology of Humboldt County has been mapped by Ronald Willden (1961). The bedrock-alluvium contact and the distribution of the younger and the older alluvium, as shown on figure 2, are taken from Willden's map.

Summary of Late Cenozoic History

The present topography of Pine Forest Valley and the surrounding mountain ranges began to take form during the latter part of the Tertiary period. At that time, the country rock, composed of granodiorite of Cretaceous and Tertiary age and various volcanic rocks of Tertiary age, was broken and tilted by extensive faulting which continued into the Pleistocene epoch.

Erosion of the uplifted mountain blocks has partly filled the valley with alluvium. The maximum thickness of the alluvium is unknown, but on the basis of the log of well 43/32-20C1, the alluvium is at least 700 feet thick and in the central parts of the valley is composed, in large part, of lake sediments.

The Quinn River probably has occupied its present course, perhaps intermittently, since late Tertiary time. The present course may have been determined by the regional faulting or the river may have existed before the mountain ranges were uplifted to their present form. If the river predates the mountain ranges, downcutting by the river kept pace with the uplifting of the mountains, carving the gaps through which the river now flows. In either sequence of events alternating uplift and downcutting imply the formation of lakes behind the temporary barriers and alternate drowning and rejuvenation of the river. The types of sediments would vary in response to the changes in environment.

The climatic fluctuations of the Pleistocene epoch resulted in a series of lakes which intermittently covered a large part of western Nevada. The most recent of these, Lake Lahontan, attained a maximum depth of about 350 feet in Pine Forest Valley. To a large extent, the present valley floor is underlain by lake sediments and represents the configuration of the ancient lake bottom. Many stages and fluctuations of Lake Lahontan are recorded in these sediments and in the shoreline features, such as beaches and spits, which terrace the surrounding hillsides.

The processes of erosion and deposition have resulted only in minor changes since the last withdrawal of Lake Lahontan.

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PHYSICAL CHARACTER AND WATER-BEARING PROPERTIES OF THE ROCKS

Bedrock

The volcanic rocks are mainly basalt and andesite and are characterized by closely spaced columnar jointing. Weathering causes the columns to break down into cobble-size pieces. Much of the surface of the Bilk Creek Range is littered with the resulting coarse rubble which permits much of the precipitation to infiltrate rapidly to considerable depths below the land surface and, eventually, to the ground-water reservoir.

Joints in the granodiorite of the Pine Forest Range, on the other hand, are generally quite widely spaced, and the rock is dense and impermeable. Deep infiltration is thus negligible. However, the granodiorite is mantled by the products of its own weathering which are capable of retaining a considerable volume of water. The available snowmelt and rainfall runs off only after the mantle becomes saturated.

Movement of ground water in the consolidated rocks of the mountain ranges is largely through joints and other secondary openings and in porous zones between lava flows. Although the total volume of water moving through bedrock may be quite large, as it is assumed to be in the Bilk Creek Range, the success of a well penetrating the bedrock is dependent on its tapping enough of the secondary water-bearing zones to yield the required amount of water. The chances of intercepting a sufficient number of water-bearing zones are generally so poor that the consolidated bedrock, whether in the mountains or buried beneath the valley fill, probably will not yield large amounts of water to wells.

Valley Fill

The valley fill is composed of rock debris which has been eroded from the surrounding mountains. It includes an unknown thickness of unconsolidated material, comprising the older and younger alluvium, which are composed mainly of stream deposits and lake sediments. These alluvial deposits form the principal source of ground water in the valley. Alluvium is unconsolidated water-laid rock debris ranging in size from boulders to clay. Where it contains well-sorted sand or gravel it may yield moderate to large amounts of water to wells.

Older Alluvium

Deposits of older alluvium form the piedmont slopes along the flanks of the mountains and the low divide at the northern end of the valley (plate 1). Also it underlies younger alluvium beneath much of the floor of the valley where it is composed principally of lake sediments.

During periods between high lake stages, some of the alluvium was

deposited in the lower parts of the valley. These deposits, to some extent, were reworked and sorted by the advancing waters of a later highwater stage which subsequently covered them with silt and clay. These reworked layers of alluvium are generally moderately permeable, and may yield moderate to large amounts of water to properly constructed wells.

The major streams probably have followed their present courses throughout much of the history of the valley; thus, stream-laid deposits of permeable sand and gravel may be present at various depth within the valley fill.

Well 42/31-11B1 on the bank of the Quinn River was drilled to a depth of 352 feet. Although no log is available, this well, which flows 170 gpm (gallons per minute) at the surface and has been pumped at a rate of 2,400 gpm with a drawdown of 52 feet, probably taps permeable material of older river deposits. Overlying deposits of lake clay may form the confining layer responsible for the artesian condition.

Younger Alluvium

The younger alluvium is composed mainly of lake sediments which were deposited in Lake Lahontan and some stream deposits of post-Lahontan age. The contact between the older and younger alluvium shown on plate 1 is drawn at the highest shoreline of Lake Lahontan. The younger alluvium is predominantly silt and clay, which are deep-lake deposits, separated by layers of sand and gravel, which are principally stream deposits and reworked alluvium that accumulated during shallow stages of the lakes and periods of emergence of the land surface. The sand and gravel strata are the most important aquifers in the section of lake sediments. Their occurrence, although probably widespread, generally is obscured by overlying sediments. One exception is the large gravel spit which trends north through secs. 30 and 31, T. 43 N., R. 32 E. Well 43/32-30A2, which was drilled near the toe of this spit, yielded 1,600 gpm with a drawdown of 40 feet (table 1), indicating a specific capacity of about 40 gpm/ ft. The confluence of Bilk Creek and the Quinn River nearby suggests that stream, as well as lake currents, may have had a part in depositing and reworking the sand and gravel now underlying the area.

GROUND WATER

Occurrence and Movement

Most of the available ground water in Pine Forest Valley occurs in the unconsolidated sediments of the valley fill. Where the valley fill consists of fine-grained material, such as silt and clay, or of poorly sorted alluvium, the permeability is low and only small yields can be expected from wells. In contrast, strata of well-sorted sand and gravel have moderate to high permeabilities and will yield water readily to wells.

Ground water occurs in the valley either under water-table or artesian conditions. Under water-table conditions the water stands in the well at about the same altitude at which it was first found. Under artesian conditions, the

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water is under pressure and rises in wells to above the bottom of the relatively impermeable stratum that acts as the confining bed. If the water is under sufficient pressure to flow at the land surface, as at well 42/31-11B1, the well is called a flowing artesian well.

The lake sediments of the valley fill form an excellent environment for artesian conditions because they are composed of alternating layers of permeable and relatively impermeable materials and because the recharge to them is from the margins of the valley, which are at slightly higher elevations than most of the valley floor. However, none of the wells drilled to date have high artesian heads, and the only flowing well in the valley, 42/31-11B1, is below the average level of the valley floor.

Ground water flows in the direction of lower head just as surface water does. The movement, however, is much slower. Ground water generally moves from recharge areas in the mountains and piedmont slopes toward the axis of the valley where a considerable part of it is discharged by evapotranspiration. That which is not discharged within the valley moves southwestward as underflow toward the Black Rock Desert.

The gradient of the water table in the main part of the valley is southwestward at about & teet per mile, whereas the gradient of the water table in that part of the valley between the Jackson Mountains and the Bilk Creek Range is northward at less than 2 feet per mile. The latter gradient is reduced and possibly even locally reversed during the summer by the spreading of irrigation water in the vicinity of the Quinn River Crossing Ranch.

Recharge

The ultimate source of recharge to the ground-water reservoir of Pine Forest Valley, except for a minor amount of underflow from the upper reaches of the Quinn River, is the precipitation on the alluvial fans and the mountains that border the valley.

The average annual precipitation within the drainage area can be estimated from a map showing precipitation zones in Nevada (Hardman, 1936). The total annual precipitation within the Pine Forest Valley drainage basin, on the basis of Hardman's map, as modified by subsequent data, is about 260,000 acre-feet. This figure was derived by subdividing the drainage basin of the valley into precipitation zones and multiplying the area of each zone by the average precipitation within the zone, as tabulated below:

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STATEMENT OF THE FACTS

I. **Happy Creek Ranch**

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Happy Creek is a family owned ranching and farming company. Four brothers, Daniel B. May, Thomas R. May, James J. May, and Stephen G. May are the owners and provide senior management.¹ These four brothers have been exclusively engaged in farming, ranching, and cattle operations for their entire lives.

Happy Creek operates Happy Creek Ranch which is located between Winnemucca, Nevada, and Denio, Nevada, and nestled to the northeast of the Jackson Mountain Range. Happy Creek Ranch is in the Pine Forest Valley groundwater basin (Basin 029) in northern Humboldt County.² Happy Creek Ranch has a cattle operation and produces alfalfa and grain crops and currently employs five full-time employees, one part-time employee, and two seasonal employees, to run a cattle operation and produce alfalfa and grain crops. There are 600 cow-calf pairs in the ranching operation on the Happy Creek Ranch.³ The alfalfa produced on the land is either fed to Happy Creek's cattle as winter feed or sold as a cash crop. Small grain crops are planted for rotation with alfalfa and are harvested as hay. That hay is either fed to cattle as feed supplement, or sold as a cash crop.

Happy Creek Ranch has 1,399 acres of deeded land that includes 855 irrigated acres. Approximately 765 of Happy Creek's irrigated acres are irrigated with the underground water rights 17 that are the subject of this proceeding. The alfalfa produced on those 765 acres is essential to the 18 economic viability of Happy Creek Ranch.⁴ Additionally, Happy Creek has the right to graze 95,126 19 20 acres of public land in the Happy Creek Grazing Allotment administered by the Bureau of Land Management, and 6,054 acres of public land in the Hog John Grazing Allotment administered by the 21 Bureau of Indian Affairs.⁵ 22

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II.

Water Rights for Happy Creek Ranch Prior to 2007

Settlers arrived in and around Happy Creek Ranch as early as 1865.⁶ Roads and corrals depicted on the 1874 General Land Office ("GLO") survey maps indicate that Happy Creek Ranch was used as part of a livestock operation prior to 1873.⁷ Development of the waters at Happy Creek Ranch for irrigation purposes was initiated on or before 1886, and irrigation on the ranch has been continually developed and improved since that date.⁸ Throughout the past 150 years, several proofs were filed to document pre-statutory appropriation of water rights and multiple applications for water were filed to appropriate additional water for Happy Creek for use on the ranch. Happy Creek has operated the Happy Creek Ranch since 1992.⁹

This action involves the removal of the senior priorities from Happy Creek's water rights. 10 Permits 76237 through 76244 (the "Permits") represent change applications on Happy Creek's senior 11 groundwater rights. These eight groundwater rights represent 3,063 acre feet of water used by Happy 12 Creek Ranch for irrigation purposes. Happy Creek expended significant effort and beneficially used 13 these water rights long before Happy Creek filed the applications for Permits 76237 through 76244. In 14 fact, before the Permits were issued, the water rights were already certificated by the State Engineer 15 for irrigation on the much of the same land.¹⁰ This fact is illustrated by several overlay maps from the 16 state water rights files that Happy Creek has included in a supplemental record on appeal. The maps 17 show that the place of use identified in the Permits includes lands that already had certificated, 18 appurtenant water rights.¹¹ 19

The priority dates for Happy Creek's eight water rights were as follows:

A. <u>Permit 76237</u>

The application for Permit 76237 was filed on September 7, 2007, to change the place of use of a water right that was originally applied for on December 15, 1966 (Permit 23550), and was certificated on January 9, 1973 (Certificate 7981). Permit 23550 (Certificate 7981) was granted for the irrigation of 230.7 acres with 922 afa. The place of use of this perfected water right was then changed by Permit 60059. Permit 60059 was applied for on May 10, 1994, and was certificated on September 25, 2003 (Certificate 16214).¹² The priority date for this water right was December 15, 1966.

B.

<u>Permit 76238</u>

The application for Permit 76238 was filed on September 7, 2007, to change the place of use for a water right that was originally applied for on March 3, 1969 (Permit 24928), and certificated on November 11, 1974 (Certificate 8376). Permit 24928 (Certificate 8376) was granted for the irrigation

1 of 228.4 acres with 913 afa. The place of use of this perfected water right was then changed by Permit 2 60060. Permit 60060 was filed on May 10, 1994, and certificated on September 25, 2003 (Certificate 16215). The priority date of this water right was March 3, 1969. 3

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C. **Permit 76239**

The application for Permit 76239 was filed on September 7, 2007 to change the place of use of 5 a water right that was originally applied for on March 3, 1969 (Permit 24927), and certificated on 6 7 November 19, 1974 (Certificate 8375). Permit 24927 (Certificate 8375) was granted for the irrigation 8 of 219.8 acres with 879 afa. The place of use of this perfected water right was then changed by Permit 60061. Permit 60061 was applied for on May 10, 1994, and certificated on September 25, 2003 (Certificate 16216). The priority date for this water right was March 3, 1969. 10

D. Permit 76240

The application for Permit 76240 was filed on September 7, 2007, to change the place of use of 12 a water right that was originally applied for on October 8, 1954 (Permit 15824), and certificated on 13 January 5, 1959 (Certificate 4841). Permit 15824 (Certificate 4841) was granted for the irrigation of 14 15 147.6 acres with 590 afa. An application for Permit 22866 was filed on November 24, 1965 to change the point of diversion of Permit 15824 (Certificate 4841) and was certificated on April 25, 1968 16 17 (Certificate 6626) to irrigate of 135.8 acres with 543 afa. The place of use and period of use of this perfected water right was then changed by Permit 60063 to irrigate different fields on the same ranch, 18 and was comingled with the water rights that were changed by Permits 60059 through 60066. Permit 19 60063 was applied for on May 10, 1994, and was certificated on September 25, 2003 (Certificate 20 16217). The priority for this water right was October 8, 1954. 21

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Ε. **Permit 76241**

23 The application for Permit 76241 was filed on September 7, 2007, to change the place of use of a supplemental water right that was originally applied for on September 5, 1979 (Permit 38957). 24 Permit 38957 was granted for the irrigation of 640 acres with 2,560 afa. The place of use of this 25 supplemental water right was changed by Permit 60064. Permit 60064 was applied for on May 10,

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1994, and was certificated on September 25, 2003 (Certificate 16218). The priority date of this water 1 2 right was November 6, 1990.

F. Permit 76242

The application for Permit 76242 was filed on September 7, 2007, to change the place of use of 4 a water right that was originally applied for on September 25, 1981 (Permit 44504). Permit 44504 was 5 granted for the irrigation of 362.85 acres with 1,451 afa. Permit 44504 was then changed by Permit 6 60065. Permit 60065 was applied for on May 10, 1994, and was certificated on September 25, 2003 7 (Certificate 16219). The priority of this water right was September 25, 1981. 8

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Permit 76243

The application for Permit 76243 was filed on September 7, 2007, to change the place of use of 10 a water right that was originally applied for on June 5, 1963 (Permit 21317), and was certificated on July 17, 1968 (Certificate 6711). Permit 21317 (Certificate 6711) was granted for the irrigation of 40.7 acres with 162 afa. The place of use and period of use of this perfected water right was changed by Permit 60066 to move the place of use to different fields and was comingled with the water rights changed by Permits 60059 through 60066. Permit 60066 was applied for on May 10, 1994, and was certificated on September 25, 2003 (Certificate 16220). The priority date for this water right was June 5, 1963.

H. Permit 76244

The application for Permit 76244 was filed on September 7, 2007 to change the place of use of 19 a water right that was originally applied for on September 18, 1967 (Permit 24126), and was 20 certificated on October 2, 1972 (Certificate 7950). Permit 24126 (Certificate 7950) was granted for 21 the irrigation of 119.0 acres with 476 acre feet. The place of use of this perfected water right was 22 changed by Permit 60062. Permit 60062 was applied for on May 10, 1994. Permit 60062 was 23 beneficially used along with the other comingled water rights at Happy Creek Ranch; however, a 24 change application was filed before the right could be certificated. Permit 71784 was applied for on 25 October 19, 2004, to correct the point of diversion of Permit 60062. The priority date for this water 26 27 right was September 18, 1967.

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III. Over-appropriation in Pine Forest Valley

The Pine Forest Valley groundwater basin (Basin 029) is over-appropriated by 25,828.31 afa. The perennial yield of Pine Forest Valley is 11,000 afa.¹³ On May 1, 1978, the State Engineer issued Order 711 and designated portions of Pine Forest Valley pursuant to NRS 534.010 to NRS 534.190.¹⁴ On December 1, 1983, the State Engineer issued a curtailment order (Order 831) to deny any future ground water applications for irrigation in the basin.¹⁵ In Order 831, the State Engineer noted that his office's crop and pumpage inventories indicate that groundwater withdrawals in Pine Forest Valley are in excess of the estimated recharge to the basin. The crop inventory for the 2015 irrigation season indicates that 22,326 afa of groundwater was pumped to irrigate 6,446 acres.¹⁶ Since the perennial yield of the basin is 11,000 acre feet per year, at least half of the water rights that are used in Pine Forest Valley would be curtailed if the basin were regulated by priority.

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IV. <u>Happy Creek's Water Rights Professional</u>

In 1994, Happy Creek hired John H. Milton III of Desert Mountain Surveying to prepare and file water rights applications, permits, and all related items with the Nevada Division of Water Resources. Additionally, Happy Creek utilized Mr. Milton's expertise for consultation concerning the development and preservation of water rights, surveying services, water rights maps, change applications, proofs of completion, proofs of beneficial use, and requests for extension of time regarding those water rights filings. Mr. Milton routinely prepared and signed all the documents filed with the DWR on behalf of Happy Creek.¹⁷

Mr. Milton has been a licensed Professional Land Surveyor ("PLS"), license number 005271,
 since February 9, 1980.¹⁸ During his licensure he also spent twelve years as a Humboldt County

Commissioner and has served as the Humboldt County Commission Chair out of Winnemucca, 1 2 Nevada.

When Mr. Milton was hired, Happy Creek owned the original base rights that were used to 3 flood irrigate Happy Creek Ranch. One of the first things Milton did for Happy Creek Ranch was to 4 file the 1994 applications for Permits 60059 through 60066 to comingle the water on Happy Creek Ranch. Since 1994, Mr. Milton has made many filings with the DWR as agent for Happy Creek, and Mr. Milton never missed a filing deadline prior to June 2016.¹⁹

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Ranch Improvements at Happy Creek

In 2007, Happy Creek began a project to further improve the efficiency of its irrigation system. Happy Creek planned the addition of three center-pivot irrigation systems which, when combined with 10 its existing two center-pivot irrigation systems, would converted most of the irrigated acres to centerpivots. Pivot irrigation provides a more effective method for farming. First, pivot irrigation reduces the amount of water needed on the land. Second, it allows a farmer to irrigate more acreage uniformly with less work. Third, pivot irrigation allows more crop development than flood irrigation. Overall, pivot irrigation results in a more efficient operation while reducing water use.

16 As part of the improvement project, Mr. Milton recommended that Happy Creek change the place of use with respect to all of Happy Creek's water rights on its 765 acres of irrigated land.²⁰ To 17 do so, Happy Creek filed change applications to change Permits 60059 through 60066. These change 18 applications were granted as Permits 76237 through 76244. Mr. Milton prepared, signed, and filed 19 each of the change applications as the agent for Happy Creek, and did not miss a filing deadline with 20 respect to Permits 76237 through 76244 until the one that is at issue here.

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of center-pivot systems.²¹ The second phase of the improvements required the relocation of a ranch-1 house trailer and hay stack yard, the removal of the septic system, bottomless watering tank, and trees, 2 and the purchase and installation of additional center-pivot systems.²² 3

Additionally, all of the six wells that are used in conjunction with the Permits for the irrigation of the crops require maintenance, repair and improvements in the ordinary course.²³ Two irrigation wells were replaced, one in 2006 and one in 2014, with newly re-drilled wells and new pumps and related equipment. Another well required extensive reworking in order to maintain pumping efficiencies.

Happy Creek spent over seven hundred thousand dollars (\$700,000.00) on maintenance and improvements of water diversions.²⁴ These moneys were spent so Happy Creek could use its groundwater pursuant to Permits 76237 through 76244.25 In addition, Happy Creek paid Mr. Milton \$53,000.00 since 1996 for his services to maintain the entirety of its water rights.²⁶ Happy Creek also has paid all statutory filing fees, permit fees, and other fees as required by the State Engineer.

VI. Required filings for Permits 76237 through 76244

Happy Creek diligently sought to obtain and document the data needed to prepare and file the Proofs of Beneficial Use ("PBUs") with the State Engineer's Office.²⁷ The PBUs for the Permits 16 required meter readings for the six wells for a minimum of 12 consecutive months.²⁸ Happy Creek 17 developed a procedure to record on a monthly basis the readings from the totalizing flow meters on its 18 irrigation wells.²⁹ One or more of the totalizing flow meters on the six irrigation wells failed during 19 the course of each irrigation season from 2012 through 2016. Less than a complete set of data for all 20 21 of the wells was available during any one 12 month period. As a result, Mr. Milton filed Extensions of

Time ("EOTs") for filing the proofs in order to obtain the required 12 consecutive months of meter 1 2 readings.

From when he was hired in 1994 through 2016, Mr. Milton filed all of the required paperwork to keep all of Happy Creek's water rights in good standing.³⁰ However, in 2016, Mr. Milton missed the deadline for filing a PBU or EOT for the Permits. In 2010 Proofs of Completion of the works of diversion were prepared, signed and timely filed by Mr. Milton with respect to these permits. In 2012, 2013, 2014, and 2015, PBUs for Permits 76237 through 76244 were due on the same date, April 29. In each of those four years, Mr. Milton prepared, signed, and filed timely requests for extensions of time for each of these permits on behalf of Happy Creek.³¹

10 On May 19, 2016, the State Engineer mailed, via certified mailing, the final notice for the Permits to Happy Creek ("Final Notice").³² This notice informed Happy Creek that the PBUs, or EOTs, must be filed within 30 days of May 19, 2016. Otherwise, Happy Creek's Permits would be cancelled.³³ This notice was also e-mailed to Mr. Milton by the State Engineer.³⁴ Happy Creek received the notice on approximately May 23, 2016.³⁵ On May 23, 2016, Happy Creek e-mailed the Final Notice to Mr. Milton.³⁶ Mr. Milton did not timely file the required paperwork for the Permits with the State Engineer. He did, however, on June 13, 2016, timely file the appropriate paperwork for three stockwater rights that are owned by Happy Creek.³⁷

VII. State Engineer's Cancellation of the Permits and Removal Of Senior Priority

On July 8, 2016, Mr. Milton realized that he had missed the deadline for filing PBUs or 19 EOTs.³⁸ On behalf of Happy Creek, Mr. Milton petitioned the State Engineer to reinstate the Permits 20

on July 11, 2016.³⁹ At that time, the State Engineer had not officially cancelled the Permits. On July 19, 2016, the State Engineer issued a Notice of Cancellation of the Permits.⁴⁰ On September 9, 2016, the State Engineer confirmed receipt of the written petition requesting the reinstatement of the Permits and scheduled a hearing for October 12, 2016.41

The State Engineer held the reinstatement hearing regarding the Permits on October 12, 2016. Mr. Milton and Happy Creek's General Manager, Glen Thiede, appeared at the reinstatement hearing.⁴² When Mr. Milton was questioned about the cancellation of Happy Creek's Permits, he responded that he failed to make timely filings because the notices were sent to him when he was updating his computer to the new Windows operating program, and he claimed he lost quite a few emails during that update.⁴³ He stated that these problems interfered with his ability to receive emails, including the email from DWR with the final notice letter.⁴⁴

At the reinstatement hearing, the State Engineer ruled that the cancellation of the Permits would be rescinded contingent on the filing of PBUs or EOTs.⁴⁵ Mr. Milton promptly filed EOTs on October 17, 2016.⁴⁶ In the EOTs, Mr. Milton recognized that "at least 2400 acre feet" of Happy Creek's water rights under the Permits were placed to beneficial use in the 2015 irrigation season.⁴⁷ Based upon this information, the State Engineer granted Happy Creek's EOTs.⁴⁸

This appeal followed.

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STANDARD OF REVIEW

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A party aggrieved by an order or decision of the State Engineer is entitled to have the order or decision reviewed, in the nature of an appeal, pursuant to NRS 533.450(1). The role of the reviewing court is to determine if the decision was arbitrary or capricious and thus an abuse of discretion, or if it was otherwise affected by prejudicial legal error.⁵¹ A decision is arbitrary and capricious if it is contrary to law. With regard to factual findings, the court must determine whether substantial evidence exists in the record to support the State Engineer's decision.⁵² With regard to purely legal questions, the standard of review is de novo.⁵³ Although a statute restricts the actions of the State Engineer, this does not affect the power of the district court to grant equitable relief to the petitioner when warranted.⁵⁴

LEGAL BACKGROUND

An application must be filed with the State Engineer to appropriate water or to change the point of diversion, manner of use, or place of use of an existing water right.⁵⁵ The State Engineer may issue a permit to authorize the requested beneficial use of water.⁵⁶ Permit conditions include deadlines for filing a proof of completion of the proposed works of diversion (a "POC") and for placing the water to beneficial use (a "PBU").⁵⁷ The State Engineer then reviews the proof of beneficial use, and if it is satisfactory, he issues a certificate.⁵⁸ A water right that is certificated is considered to be perfected property right and can only be lost by forfeiture.⁵⁹

Nevada adopted the basis for its current water law in the early 1900s, and that water law did
not provide the State Engineer with any discretion regarding the cancellation of water permits when

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neither a POC, PBU, nor EOT is filed.⁶⁰ From 1913 until 1981, the only remedy from cancelation was to appeal the State Engineer's decision to district court, or file an application for a new appropriation of water.

The Nevada Supreme Court ruled that this remedy was not fair or equitable. In *American National*, the State Engineer canceled a permit for a water right that had been used to cultivate land.⁶¹ The permit was canceled because the permittee failed to timely file the required PBU. In that case, the water was being used, land was being cultivated, and even though all prior proofs were filed on time, the proof in question "simply was not filed with the State Engineer."⁶² The State Engineer argued that the mandatory language contained within NRS 533.410 required him to cancel the permit even though no other person would be damaged if the permittee was allowed to use the water. The Court agreed with the State Engineer that the statute's mandatory language required him to cancel the permit. But the Court held that the district court properly exercised its equitable power and overturned the State Engineer's decision. In doing so the Court remarked that when the State Engineer is placed "in an awkward and unenviable position" that requires the strict enforcement of mandatory provisions of state water law, his determinations are subject to reversal by a court's exercise of equitable power.⁶³

After *American National*, the State Engineer proposed a change to NRS 533.395 in 1981. The State Engineer's 1981 proposal was adopted and remains the law today. Now, if a water right holder fails to file a required POC or PBU, and does not file a request for an EOT, the water right is subject to cancellation. If a permit is cancelled, the holder of the permit may file a written petition with the State Engineer requesting a review of the cancellation. After receiving and considering evidence, the State Engineer may affirm, modify, or rescind the cancellation. If the State Engineer modifies or rescinds the cancellation of the permit, NRS 533.395(3) states, "the effective date of the appropriation under

the permit is vacated and replaced by the date of the filing of the written petition with the State Engineer." 2

This removal of the senior priority date by the State Engineer of a cancelled permit was recently challenged in *Benson v. State Engineer*.⁶⁴ In *Benson*, as in this case, the permittee sought equitable relief from the removal of its priority date.⁶⁵ The Court refused to grant equitable relief because the Bensons failed to exhaust the administrative remedies provided in NRS 533.395(2)-(3) which allows the filing of a written petition with the State Engineer to reinstate their permits.⁶⁶ Unlike Benson, Happy Creek exhausted the administrative requirements of NRS 533.395. While the cancellation of the Permits was rescinded by the State Engineer, Happy Creek lost the senior priority of its water rights and now faces the complete loss of its water rights in a future curtailment action or conflicts analysis.

ARGUMENT

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I.

Equitable Relief Should Be Granted.

Α. **The Equitable Power of Courts**

15 Judicial power is the authority to hear and determine justiciable controversies and includes the authority to enforce any valid judgment, decree or order.⁶⁷ The judicial function of district judges and 16 district courts is the exercise of judicial authority to hear and determine questions in controversy. This 17 is expressly authorized in the jurisdictional provision of district courts in the Nevada Constitution, art. 18 VI, § 6. District courts are granted the authority to exercise powers that are reasonably incidental to 19 20 the fulfillment of, and are inherent in, the much broader judicial powers in the Constitution.⁶⁸ The 21 judiciary's inherent power is derived from at least three sources: (1) the separation of powers doctrine 22 (2) the state constitution, and (3) the common law.

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The doctrine of separation of powers holds that each branch of government is independent from the others and cannot exercise the powers of the two other branches. Regarding such discord 2 between the legislative and judicial branches of government, it is well settled that the judiciary retains 3 the authority to "hear and determine justiciable controversies," as a coequal power to the legislature's 4 broad authority to enact, amend, and repeal legislation.⁶⁹ And as one commentator aptly explained 5 this distinction, "[t]o declare what the law is or has been is judicial power; to declare what the 6 law shall be is legislative."70 7

The Constitution mandates that the inherent powers of the judiciary are out of the reach for any amendment by the legislature.⁷¹ The Nevada Constitution ensures that procedural laws enacted by the legislature may not unreasonably inhibit the powers reserved to the people in the articles of the State Constitution. The district court's power to act in equity is also clearly demonstrated in Nev. Const. art VI, § 6, which provides:

> The district courts in the several judicial districts of this state shall have original jurisdiction in all cases in equity; also, in all cases at law, which involve the title of the right of possession to, or the possession of real property. They shall also have final appellate jurisdiction in cases arising in justices' courts, and such other inferior tribunals as may be established by law.⁷²

Finally, the right to act in equity is a long standing right of the district courts.⁷³ This is 17 demonstrated through the merging of the court of chancellors with the district courts.⁷⁴ whereby the 18 equitable powers of the court of chancellors was transferred to the district courts.⁷⁵ In this case, Happy 19 Creek requests that the Court exercise this equitable power to restore the senior priority of its water 20 rights. 21

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B. Equitable Relief in Water Cases

The Nevada Supreme Court has continuously held that the "district court's power to grant equitable relief is not affected by a determination of the State Engineer that a water rights permit was correctly cancelled."⁷⁶ In *Curtis Park*, the Nevada Supreme Court set a bright line rule that makes it clear that equitable relief is available from a State Engineer decision when the action of the State Engineer is mandatory.⁷⁷

1. <u>American National</u>

In American National, the Nevada Supreme Court held that the district court properly granted 8 equitable relief even though the water right holder failed to file a timely proof of beneficial use.⁷⁸ The 9 Court reinstated the water right with its original priority date. The Court upheld the district court's 10 grant of equitable relief, in part based on the permittee's expenditure of \$35,000 to improve the land 11 because this demonstrated diligent protection of the water right.⁷⁹ The Court further analyzed the 12 following factors: (1) The State Engineer does not plan to grant new permits in the near future, (2) no 13 other person would be damaged, (3) tax revenues to Humboldt County would increase if the land was 14 cultivated, and (4) cancellation of the permit would forfeit the permittee's water rights.⁸⁰ 15

2. <u>Bailey</u>

In *Bailey*, the State Engineer sent a notice to the Baileys stating that proof of beneficial use must be received by the State Engineer within 30 days or the Baileys' water rights permit would be cancelled.⁸¹ The notice was returned to the State Engineer marked "[u]nclaimed,"⁸² and the State Engineer cancelled the Bailey's water rights permit. But the State Engineer did not send a notice of cancellation to the Baileys.⁸³ The Baileys learned of the cancellation of their water right permit

shortly after it was cancelled and asked the State Engineer if the right could be reinstated.⁸⁴ Upon advice of the office of the State Engineer, the Baileys filed an application for a new water rights permit.⁸⁵ The State Engineer denied the Baileys' application, and the office engineer who had advised the Baileys testified that he knew no new permits were being issued at the time he advised the Baileys to submit a new application.⁸⁶ Based on these facts, the district court disallowed the challenge of the cancellation of the original permit, but ordered that the new application be approved.⁸⁷ This decision resulted in the water rights being reinstated with the priority date of the new application. The Baileys appealed this decision to the Supreme Court. Ultimately, the Supreme Court fully reinstated the Baileys' original water right with its original priority date.⁸⁸

3. <u>Engelmann</u>

In Englemann, the Nevada Supreme Court held that although the water statute stated permits 11 "shall" be cancelled by the Nevada State Engineer, that directive did not affect the power of the 12 district court to grant equitable relief to a permittee when warranted.⁸⁹ In Englemann, the permittee 13 was aware of the requirement to file for an extension of time or proof of beneficial use within one year 14 of the State Engineer issuing his permits.⁹⁰ Subsequently, the State Engineer informed the permittee by certified letter that he had 30 days to file a PBU or EOT on his water rights.⁹¹ A second notice was 16 returned to the State Engineer as undeliverable.⁹² Although permittee had knowledge that a document 17 18 was due a year from the first notice and did not file one, the Nevada Supreme Court held that the lower court should consider whether the permittee failed to exercise diligence in the protection of his water 19 rights.⁹³ A permittee's prior knowledge of a future filing requirement with the State Engineer was not 20 21 dispositive to whether equitable relief could be granted if other evidence showed a permittee diligently

protected their water rights.⁹⁴ Based on these facts, the Supreme Court reinstated the Englemanns' 2 water right with its original priority date.

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4. Principles for exercising equitable relief in water cases

a. **Mandatory Duty of State Engineer**

5 The Supreme Court has held that equitable relief is appropriate when the State Engineer has no 6 discretion under a statute because he has been assigned a mandatory duty by the legislature. In Curtis *Park*, the Supreme Court determined the State Engineer was applying a discretionary act.⁹⁵ When the State Engineer is acting in a discretionary manner, the district court is without authority to grant equitable relief. In this case, however, NRS 533.395 places a mandatory duty on the State Engineer 10 and he has no discretion under the terms of the statute. When the Legislature uses mandatory language, the language must be strictly adhered to.⁹⁶ The mandatory language in NRS 533.410 provides that a permit 'shall' be cancelled by the State Engineer when the permittee fails to file proof of application of water to beneficial use. The State Engineer is authorized to rescind such a cancellation under NRS 533.395(2); however, he is required to vacate the priority date of the reinstated water right and replace it with the date of filing of the written petition that requested review of the cancellation of the water right under NRS 533.395(3).

17 The statutory directives involving cancelation do not affect the power of the district court to grant equitable relief to the permittee when warranted.⁹⁷ Due to the mandatory nature of NRS 533.395 18 19 and NRS 533.410, this Court can award equitable relief to Happy Creek.

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b. Factors supporting equitable relief

21 The Supreme Court has considered certain factors when considering whether to grant equitable 22 relief and reinstate cancelled permits with their original priorities. Those factors include: (1) the 23

beneficial use of the water, (2) improvements paid for and constructed, (3) timely filing of other filings 1 by the permittee, (4) a professional being hired and entrusted with the task, (5) no harm, and (6) 2 3 benefit to the community.

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C.

Importance of senior priority

1. Priority of water rights are an important real property interest.

In Nevada, water rights are constitutionally protected property rights.⁹⁸ These rights consist of 6 a quantity of water that may be appropriated from a particular source and the priority date assigned to the water right.⁹⁹ Each water right permit is issued subject to all existing senior rights to the same source of water.¹⁰⁰ The most basic tenant of prior appropriation is that the one who is first in time is first in right. The one who first appropriates water has the sole right to use that water to the exclusion of any subsequent appropriator "to the full extent of his appropriation."¹⁰¹ Junior water right users are subject to curtailment of their water rights.¹⁰² A senior appropriator may lawfully demand from junior appropriators that "he have at his headgate" water needed to supply his water right.¹⁰³ Junior appropriators are only allowed to divert water at such times as when all prior appropriations are being met, as those conditions existed when the junior appropriations began.¹⁰⁴

of holders of existing appropriations can be satisfied."¹⁰⁵ For instance, an explicit condition of the junior permits granted for groundwater pumping in Pine Forest Valley is that each right is issued 2 "subject to existing rights on the source."¹⁰⁶ 3

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2. The State Engineer is required to protect senior water rights.

Prior appropriation requires the State Engineer to protect senior water rights. Across the western states, a senior water right holder is protected against a subsequent appropriator. A senior water right holder is entitled to the specific quantity of water that was actually diverted and applied to a beneficial use.¹⁰⁷ This principle was made clear when the Oregon Supreme Court determined that removal of priority is an impairment of a senior water right.¹⁰⁸

D. Happy Creek is entitled to equitable relief.

In American National, the Supreme Court recognized the necessity to grant equitable relief 11 when the permittee had expended a large amount of money in maintaining the water rights. In Bailey, 12 13 equitable relief was granted to the permittee when no new water rights would be issued in the basin. 14 In Engelmann, the Supreme Court remanded the case to the District Court to determine whether the 15 permittee had exercised due diligence in protection of his water right, and thus, whether an equitable remedy would apply. All three factors from these cases are present in Happy Creek's case. 16

17 First, Happy Creek has expended more than \$700,000.00 on maintenance and improvements of its water rights.¹⁰⁹ This amount does not include the funds in excess of \$52,000.00 that Happy Creek 18 paid its agent, Mr. Milton, to maintain its water rights.¹¹⁰ Both the improvements to the diversion 19 20 structures and the payment to a water rights surveyor to maintain the water rights demonstrate Happy Creek's diligence in maintaining its water rights. Furthermore, but for the change applications filed by 21

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Mr. Milton in 2007, Happy Creek's water rights would have remained certificated and would not have 1 2 been subject to cancellation.

Second, similar to the American National and Bailey factors, the State Engineer will not issue new permits in the future for irrigation water rights.¹¹¹ Any curtailment by priority by the State Engineer will effectively forfeit Happy Creek's water rights. Prior to the removal of its senior priority, Happy Creek's Permit No. 76240 was the oldest priority groundwater permit in the basin. Happy Creek's once senior water rights are now the most junior rights in the basin.¹¹² This means that Happy Creek's Permit 76240 went from the last water right that could have been cut in a curtailment action (if *all* pumping in the basin were to be ordered to cease) to the first water right that would be cut in a curtailment action (if any pumping in the basin is ordered to be reduced). By losing its senior priority status, Happy Creek has lost any and all protection its senior water rights would receive in a priority analysis.

The third factor reviewed by the Nevada Supreme Court is the water user's exercise of 13 diligence in maintaining the water resource. Happy Creek spent over 20 years building water 14 diversions, drilling wells, and maintaining their water right.¹¹³ The 2007 change applications were applied for to more efficiently develop the land.¹¹⁴ Happy Creek placed all the water under the 17 permits to beneficial use and has produced crops on its 765 acres of irrigated land continuously since 1992.¹¹⁵ Happy Creek was advised by Mr. Milton that the proofs of beneficial use for Permits 76237 18 19 through 76244 would need to be filed simultaneously and would need to cover the identical 12 month period of use.¹¹⁶ Despite its continual efforts to record the necessary data, one or more totalizing flow 20 meters on the six irrigation wells did not work from 2012 through 2016, and less than a complete set 21 of data for all of the permits was available.¹¹⁷ For that reason, instead of filing PBUs, on behalf of 22

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Happy Creek, Mr. Milton timely filed EOTs in 2012 through 2015. The meters were promptly
 replaced when substantial work was performed on two wells in recent years.¹¹⁸ Instead of filing
 PBUs, however, Happy Creek filed EOTs because accurate well readings for pumpage were not
 available.

All of these actions demonstrate diligent maintenance of Happy Creek's water rights. Additionally, Happy Creek has spent a large amount of money to hire a professional to maintain its water rights. The hiring of Mr. Milton, a licensed professional, demonstrates that Happy Creek intended to diligently maintain its water rights. Happy Creek has demonstrated every factor that requires the granting of equitable relief in this instance, including the following.

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1. <u>Happy Creek's water rights were previously certificated</u>

11 All of Happy Creek's Permits have previously been certificated under the base rights. Since 12 the first appropriation of groundwater irrigation rights in 1954, Happy Creek and its predecessors in 13 interest have been diligently applying its acquired groundwater rights to beneficial use. The groundwater irrigation rights on Happy Creek Ranch were originally appropriated and certificated in 14 stages on various portions of the ranch in the 1950s through the 1970s. In 1994, change applications 15 16 60059 through 60066 were filed against the original appropriations to comingle the groundwater rights on Happy Creek Ranch "in order to achieve the most efficient methods of irrigation."¹¹⁹ Permits 17 60059 through 60066 were fully beneficially used, and the majority of the comingled rights were again 18 19 certificated in 2003.

The only reason these Permits were subjected to the possibility of cancellation was due to the filing of change applications against the certificated base rights that was advised by Mr. Milton to allow for the installation of additional pivots to replace flood irrigation.¹²⁰ The Permits are changes of

existing perfected water rights within the same general place of use to irrigate 765.9 acres.¹²¹ While 2 the majority of the place of use of the base rights remained unchanged, change applications were filed against the whole of the base rights. This all-encompassing change allowed for easy mapping and 3 clean paperwork, but did not involve any large change in the historic use of the water rights. Yet, the 4 5 change applications burdened Happy Creek with the need to file new proofs to re-perfect its previously perfected base rights. This non-perfected status created the circumstance in which Happy Creek's 6 agent Mr. Milton could fail to timely file the necessary paperwork with the State Engineer. That 7 failure put Happy Creek's water rights in jeopardy, despite the fact that the water has continually and 8 diligently been put to beneficial use for decades.¹²² 9

2. Junior water rights are subject to non-protection, curtailment, and reduced value.

The State Engineer has authority to require junior appropriators to curtail or cease pumping. First, the State Engineer has implied authority that is incident to the State Engineer's authority to administer the public waters of the state pursuant to NRS chapters 533 and 534. Second, the State Engineer has express statutory authority to force junior appropriators to cease pumping that violates Nevada water law, or the terms of permits and certificates, pursuant to NRS 534.193 and NRS 534.195. Further, under NRS 534.110(6) and NRS 534.120(1), the State Engineer may issue orders to curtail or cease pumping in order to regulate the use of water on a priority basis.

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basins that are being depleted, the State Engineer has express authority to issue orders to curtail or 1 2 cease pumping if deemed essential for the welfare of the area involved.¹²⁴

The removal of Happy Creek's original priority dates has caused irrefutable harm to Happy Creek's real property rights and has reduced the value of its water rights. As described by real property appraiser, Mr. Hardung, there is a monetary value attached to the relative priority of a permit or certificated water right.¹²⁵ The loss of priority to Happy Creek affects the worth of their water rights, which should be remedied.

Happy Creek held eight permitted water rights with a duty of 3,063 afa. The original priority dates of those eight permitted water rights ranged from 1954 to 1990. Except for one permit, all of Happy Creek's permits pre-dated the State Engineer's 1983 curtailment order. Six of Happy Creek's permits pre-dated the State Engineer's 1978 designation order. Happy Creek formerly held the oldest groundwater rights in the basin. Now, Happy Creek has lost the protection and value of the seniority of its water rights.

Protection from Conflicts a.

NRS 533.370(2) sets the test the State Engineer is required to perform prior to granting an application to appropriate water as follows:

> [W]here there is no unappropriated water in the proposed source of supply, or where its proposed use or change conflicts with existing rights¹²⁶

Allowing conflicting 22 water use violates both Nevada statutory law and the prior appropriation doctrine.¹²⁸

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As recently as 2015, the Nevada Supreme Court has reversed a State Engineer decision regarding the issuance of permits and applications when there is a conflict with existing water rights.¹²⁹ In *Eureka County*, the Supreme Court again emphasized the importance of the protection of senior water rights.¹³⁰ In *Eureka County*, the applicant was unable to demonstrate that its water rights would not conflict with the senior water rights in the basin.¹³¹ Due to this, the decision was remanded for further conflict analysis.¹³² Similarly, since its senior priority has been removed, Happy Creek's water use can now conflict with other use of water are now considered senior. If there is a conflict between Happy Creek's water rights and those rights, then Happy Creek may lose its water rights and its ability to run its operations.

b. <u>Subject to Curtailment</u>

The State Engineer has an ongoing obligation to manage the permits he issues to protect existing rights. These principles were specifically applied to groundwater in NRS 534.110. That statute allows the State Engineer to grant a junior groundwater right, but such right can only be granted as "long as the rights of holders of existing appropriations can be satisfied." But when the State Engineer determines that "the groundwater supply may not be adequate for the needs of all permittees and all vested-right claimants," the State Engineer may order that withdrawals "be restricted to conform to priority rights." Even though the State Engineer granted junior groundwater rights in Pine Forest Valley Basin (029), if the State Engineer becomes aware that junior pumping conflicts with existing rights, the State Engineer must curtail pumping.

Curtailment is a real threat. In 2015 and in again in 2016, the State Engineer attempted curtailment actions in Smith and Mason Valley where he sought to curtail supplemental groundwater rights.¹³³ In 2015, the Pershing County Water Conservation District ("PCWCD") filed a Petition for Writ of Mandamus or in the Alternative, Writ of Prohibition with the Eleventh Judicial District Court

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The purpose of PCWCD's Writ was to (1) bring all over-appropriated ("PCWCD's Writ"). groundwater basins surrounding the Humboldt River back to their perennial annual yield; (2) eliminate 2 the cone of depression caused by over-allocation of groundwater pumping causing interference with 3 surface water flows in the Humboldt River; and (3) to regulate water used for mining and milling purposes pursuant to Nevada statutory code. PCWCD's Writ is currently being reviewed by the district court. In 2015, Sadler Ranch, LLC filed a Petition for Curtailment in Diamond Valley due to the impact caused by junior water right pumpers on senior water rights. These are all incidents of curtailment that will impact junior water rights.

Pine Forest Valley Basin is over appropriated by 25,828.31afa. On May 1, 1978, the State Engineer designated portions of ground water appropriation in the Pine Forest Valley Basin pursuant to NRS 534.010 to NRS 534.190. On December 1, 1983, the State Engineer issued a curtailment order that denied all future issuances of all ground water irrigation applications in the basin. Essentially, there is not enough water in Pine Forest Valley Basin to support the ongoing underground pumping in the valley. When that happens in Pine Forest Valley Basin, Happy Creek's Permits will be the first rights curtailed. Given these considerations, justice and fairness demand that Happy Creek's senior priority be reinstated.

Happy Creek's water was beneficially used. 3.

Happy Creek has diligently used its water rights on its land pursuant to the Permit terms.¹³⁴ 18 19 Mr. Milton's most recent EOT recognized that "at least 2400 acre feet" of Happy Creek's water rights 20 under the Permits were placed to beneficial use in the 2015 irrigation season. Glen Thiede, Happy Creek's General Manager, compiled monthly meter reading reports that prove the beneficial use of the 21 underground water associated with these permits.¹³⁵ The water rights in the Permits have continually 22 and beneficially been used by Happy Creek.¹³⁶ 23

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4. **Improvements** made to the ranch

2 In September 2007, acting on the advice of Mr. Milton, Happy Creek filed change applications 3 signed by Mr. Milton, which changed Permits 60059 through 60061 and 60063 through 60066 4 (Certificates 16214 through 16220) and Permit 71784, and which resulted in the issuance of Permits 76237 through 76244.¹³⁷ Following the filing of the change applications in 2007, Happy Creek diligently undertook the necessary work and completed the irrigation system improvements which it 6 7 had contemplated.

Happy Creek has spent in excess of \$700,000 for the improvement of its underground irrigation water systems for use of the irrigation water under Permits 76237 through 76244. That sum includes the purchase and installation of three center-pivot irrigation systems and the refurbishing of irrigation wells.

Proofs of completion for Permits 76237 through 76244 were filed with the State Engineer in 2010. Following the filing of the proofs of completion for Permits 76237 through 76244 in 2010, Mr. Milton advised Happy Creek that because the irrigation water under those Permits was co-mingled, the PBUs for Permits 76237 through 76244 would need to be filed simultaneously and, in addition, would 16 need to cover the same 12 month period of beneficial use for each of the six wells associated with those Permits. Happy Creek developed procedures under which readings from the totalizing flow meters on the irrigation wells were recorded and reported monthly. 18

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Happy Creek hired a professional and timely filed other filings. 5.

20 Happy Creek hired a professional to maintain all of its Permits. For twenty years, Mr. Milton 21 consistently maintained Happy Creek's water rights in good standing without missing a filing deadline. In 2012, 2013, 2014, and 2015, the proofs of beneficial use for Permits 76237 through 22 23 76244 were due on the same date, April 29. In each of those four years, Mr. Milton prepared, signed, and filed a timely request for an EOT on behalf of Happy Creek.¹³⁸ Additionally, when Happy Creek 24

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received the Notice of Cancellation in May 2016, it promptly provided notice to Mr. Milton and 1 2 justifiably relied on Mr. Milton to timely file the EOTs as required by NRS 533.395.¹³⁹ Additionally. Happy Creek has paid Mr. Milton \$53,000 for his services.¹⁴⁰ At about the same time that Mr. Milton 3 received the notice for the Permits, he also received notice that the PBU for stockwater rights under 4 Permits 83008, 83009, and 83012 were due.¹⁴¹ The PBUs for those stockwater rights were timely filed 5 on June 13, 2016.¹⁴² 6

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6.

Community benefit and no harm to other parties

There can be no harm if Happy Creek is allowed to maintain the status quo which existed prior to June 2016. There was no harm when Happy Creek was operating under its true priority dates. There is no way harm will be caused by allowing Happy Creek to have its prior priority dates and the community will benefit from Happy Creek keeping its priority.

II. The Removal of Happy Creek's Senior Priority is an Unconstitutional Taking.

The right to just compensation for private property taken for public use is guaranteed by both the United States and the Nevada Constitutions.¹⁴³

> Private property shall not be taken for public use without just compensation having been first made, or secured, except in cases of war, riot, fire, or great public peril, in which case compensation shall be afterward made.¹⁴⁴

The Legislature cannot authorize an unconstitutional taking. Under Nevada law, to state a 18 cause of action for inverse condemnation, an owner of a property right needs to show there was an 19 invasion or an appropriation of some valuable property right which the property owner possessed and 20 the invasion or appropriation must directly and specifically affect the property owner to his injury.¹⁴⁵ 21

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

1	The district court's power to act in equity can protect against the potential claim of an
2	unconstitutional taking of Happy Creek's property. The taking here is the removal of the priority dates
3	that Happy Creek has diligently maintained until its agent failed to file the proper documents. The
4	priority dates of water rights are a separate "stick" in a bundle of rights attendant to real property. As
5	identified by Mr. Hardung, there is monetary value attached to the priority of a permit or certificated
6	water right. ¹⁴⁶ The loss of priority to Happy Creek affects the worth of their rights, which should be
7	remedied. Without resetting Happy Creek's Permits back to their original dates, a cause of action for
8	inverse condemnation will lie against a government agency to recover the value of property taken by
9	the agency. ¹⁴⁷







FOREWORD

This reconnaissance report on the ground-water resources of Pine Forest Valley in Humboldt County, is the fourth report in a series of such reports authorized by the 1960 Legislature. The preceeding reports cover Newark Valley, White Pine County; Pine Valley, Eureka and Elko Counties; and Long Valley in White Pine and Elko Counties. Several other such reports are now in process of review including Diamond Valley, Eureka County; Gabbs Valley, Mineral County; Independence Valley, Elko County; Imlay Area, Humboldt River Basin in Pershing County; and Desert Valley in Humboldt and Pershing Counties, all of which should be in printed form by July 1, 1962.

During 1961 the first report under an information series was issued. This report by O. J. Loeltz, Engineer, and G. T. Malmberg, Geologist, covered the ground-water situation in Nevada in 1960.

The reconnaissance ground-water surveys are conducted under a cooperative program between the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources and the United States Geological Survey. They are designed to give information on the ground-water resources in areas where there is a lack of such information. They are not intended to take the place of the more detailed cooperative ground-water surveys under the regular ground-water program which has been in progress since 1946.

It is intended to continue these studies until all of the major basins in the State have been covered, either by detailed, semi-detailed, or reconnaissance studies.

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GROUND-WATER RESOURCES OF PINE FOREST VALLEY

HUMBOLDT COUNTY, NEVADA

ABSTRACT

Pine Forest Valley is an intermontane valley in the Great Basin section of the Basin and Range physiographic province. The valley is drained by the Quinn River. The climate is arid to semiarid; precipitation on the floor of the valley is less than 6 inches annually.

The valley is bordered by mountain ranges composed principally of granodiorite and volcanic rocks. The mountains were uplifted by faulting and tilting during the latter part of the Tertiary period. Material eroded from the uplands has filled the intermontane basin of the valley with at least 700 feet of alluvium, including lake and stream sediments. The amount of ground water stored in the upper few hundred feet of valley fill is estimated at about 18,000 acre-feet per foot of thickness of saturated sediments.

The ground-water reservoir is recharged by streams that drain the bordering mountain ranges. Ground water moves from the areas of recharge toward the axis of the valley and thence southwestward. About 2,700 acrefeet of ground water is discharged by underflow each year to the Black Rock Desert, but under natural conditions most of the ground-water discharge, about 11,000 acre-feet per year, is transpired by plants that send their roots to the water table or to the capillary fringe above it. A minor amount of ground water, about 200 acre-feet per year, is discharged by thermal springs. The total average annual ground-water discharge, under natural conditions, is equal to the average annual recharge and is estimated to range from 10,000 to 15,000 acre-feet per year.

The ground water is generally suitable for irrigation and domestic use. The principal exception is water from thermal springs which is unsuitable for irrigating most crops because of the high sodium content.

Although desirable, it may not be practical to intercept by wells and use consumptively all the ground water that is now being discharged by evapotranspiration. The perennial yield, the amount of natural discharge by phreatophytes, and underflow that can be salvaged for beneficial use probably does not exceed 10,000 to 15,000 acre-feet. Gross pumpage in 1960 was only about 3,000 acre-feet.

INTRODUCTION

This report is one of a series of reconnaissance studies of the valleys of northwestern Nevada (fig. 1). These studies are made by the U. S. Geological Survey in cooperation with the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, State of Nevada, and are part of a statewide study to evaluate the ground-water resources of Nevada.

The purposes of this study of Pine Forest Valley are: (1) To determine the nature and extent of the aquifers; (2) to evaluate the occurrence and movement of ground water, including the sources of recharge and areas of discharge; (3) to estimate the average annual recharge to the aquifers; (4) to estimate the quantity of ground water that can be developed perennially; and (5) to determine the chemical quality of the ground water and its suitability for irrigation and domestic use.

Pine Forest Valley is only sparsely populated. The nearest communities are Winnemucca, about 60 miles to the southeast, and Denio, about 10 miles to the north. Winnemucca has a population of 3,453 according to the 1960 census. Denio is a local supply center for the ranches in the area. The economy of the valley is based on ranching and the irrigation of about 3,000 acres of cultivated land.

The valley is traversed by Nevada Highway 8A which connects Winnemucca with Denio and northwestern Nevada.


The fieldwork for this report was done during parts of October and November 1960. It consists of a study of the physiographic features of the area and of the water-bearing character of the geologic units, an inventory of the wells and springs, and the mapping of vegetation that consumes ground water.

The assistance provided by residents of the area in the form of information regarding wells, springs, and local irrigation practices is gratefully acknowledged.

Location and Extent of the Area

Pine Forest Valley is in north-central Humboldt County. The valley is the northernmost extension of the Black Rock Desert and is bounded by the Pine Forest Range on the west and the Bilk Creek Range on the east. The coalescence of the two ranges in a low alluvial saddle forms the northern boundary of the valley. The Ouinn River enters the valley from the southeast through a gap between the Jackson Mountains and the Bilk Creek Range. It flows northwest toward the center of the valley, then swings southwestward along the west side of the Jackson Mountains, into the Black Rock Desert.

Pine Forest Valley has an area of about 500 square miles. The main part of the valley floor trends south, principally in R. 31 E., and is about 25 miles long and 6 miles wide. A smaller part lies within the gap between the

JURISDICTIONAL STATEMENT

Pursuant to NRS 533.450(1), decisions of the State Engineer are subject to judicial review "in
the proper court of the county in which the matters affected or a portion thereof are situated." The real
property relative to this action is within Humboldt County. Therefore, the Sixth Judicial District Court
of the State of Nevada in and for Humboldt County is the proper venue for judicial review of the State
Engineer's November 1, 2016, decision regarding cancelled permit nos. 76237 through 76244
("Permits"), inclusive ("Reinstatement Letter").

8 Pursuant to *Howell v. Ricci*, the Nevada Supreme Court held that a letter from the State 9 Engineer that: (1) affects a property interest, (2) relates to the administration of determined rights, and 10 (3) constitutes a final written determination on the issue is a decision that an aggrieved party may 11 properly challenge through a petition for judicial review.² On November 1, 2016, the State Engineer 12 issued a Reinstatement Letter to Petitioner that reinstated Petitioner's Permits from cancellation status, 13 but changed the priority dates of all the Permits to July 11, 2016.

II. <u>BACKGROUND</u>

Petitioner, Happy Creek, holds eight water permits for irrigation of land located in the Pine 15 16 Forest Valley Basin in Humboldt County. The perennial yield for Pine Forest Valley Basin is 11,000. Currently, 39,757.97 underground water rights in Pine Forest Valley Basin have been appropriated. 17 Happy Creek's eight water permits were of varying priority dates. Permit No. 76240 held a priority 18 date of October 8, 1954. Permit No. 76243, held a priority date of June 5, 1963. Permit No. 76237 19 held a priority date of December 15, 1966. Permit No. 76244 held a priority date of September 18, 20 1967. Permit Nos. 76238 - 39 held a priority date of March 3, 1969. Permit No. 76242 held a priority 21 date of September 25, 1981. Permit No. 76241 held a priority date of November 6, 1990 (collectively, 22 23 "Permits"). Permit No. 76240 was the oldest priority permit in the basin, challenged only by vested water rights. 24

The preservation of the Permits was entrusted by Happy Creek to Mr. John Milton of Desert Mountain Surveying. Mr. Milton is a Nevada Professional Land Surveyor, license no. 5271. Mr.

Milton is an engineer operating as an agent for Happy Creek for over a decade. Mr. Milton has
 consistently maintained Happy Creek's water rights in good standing until the current action.

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On May 19, 2016, the State Engineer mailed, via certified mailing, the final notice for permits 76237-44 to Happy Creek ("Final Notice"). This notice informed Happy Creek that a proof of beneficial use and cultural map ("PBU") or a request for an extension of time ("EOT") must be filed on or before April 29, 2016, or Happy Creek's Permits would be cancelled.³ This same notice was e-mailed to Desert Mountain Surveying. On May 23, 2016, Happy Creek e-mailed the Final Notice to John Milton, of Desert Mountain Surveying.⁴

9 On July 11, 2016, Mr. Milton petitioned the Nevada State Engineer to reinstate the Permits. On July 19, 2016, the State Engineer issued the Notice of Cancellation of Permits 76237-44. On July 8, 10 2016, Mr. Milton recognized that he may have confused the Final Notice for the Permits with different 11 responsibilities with his office.⁵ The State Engineer held the reinstatement hearing on October 12, 12 2016. On November 1, 2016, the State Engineer issued his written disposition regarding the Permits 13 and their reinstatement. The State Engineer does not possess equitable powers and is required to 14 reinstate the priority date as "the date of the filing of the written petition" for reinstatement.⁶ And 15 therefore, the priority date for all eight Permits was changed to July 11, 2016. 16

III. <u>GROUNDS FOR PETITION</u>

A. Water rights are unique real property

Nevada has always recognized that water rights are unique real property rights.⁷ The bundle of property rights includes "all rights inherent to ownership, including the inalienable right to possess,

priority.⁹ Under the prior appropriation doctrine, water rights are acquired by diverting water and
 applying it for a beneficial purpose; a distinctive feature of the prior appropriation doctrine is the rule
 of priority under which relative rights of water users are ranked in the order of their seniority.¹⁰

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B. Equitable Relief may be afforded to the Petitioner.

Nevada water law supports the contention that equity is appropriate to limit the harsh consequences of Nevada law where circumstances justify protecting individual landowners from unjust outcomes.¹¹ State Engineer v. American National Insurance Co., Bailey v. State of Nevada, and Engelmann v. Westergard, are all examples of the Nevada Supreme Court embracing the principle that the district court may grant equitable relief regarding cancelled water rights.¹²

Similar to other petitioners who have received equitable relief from Nevada courts, Happy Creek has diligently complied with the beneficial use requirements of Nevada water law.¹³ Further, Happy Creek informed and instructed their agent to file the appropriate documents to protect their Permits. Happy Creek is currently using the water associated with the Permits on their ranch in Humboldt County. Happy Creek has never received a four year forfeiture letter, and has assigned a ranch manager to place the water to beneficial use on their Humboldt County Ranch.¹⁴

Similar to *Great Basin Water Network v. State Eng'r*, voiding the priority dates of the Permits is inequitable to the applicant.¹⁵ Just as the Nevada Supreme Court held that applicants cannot be punished for the State Engineer's failure to follow his statutory duties, Happy Creek should not be

punished for the failure of its agent.¹⁶ In Great Basin, the Nevada Supreme Court pursued the course 1 of action that was "the proper and most equitable remedy."¹⁷ 2

If Pine Forest Valley Basin is curtailed, Happy Creek is subject to losing use of their once 3 senior water rights.¹⁸ Further, the State Engineer has already ordered that he will not issue any 4 additional irrigation water rights in the Pine Forrest Valley Basin.¹⁹ 5
