- 18 BY MS. BLUTH:
- 19 Q CAN YOU SAY IT AGAIN?
- 20 **A** JUBILEE GARDENS AVENUE.
- 21 Q AND THEN AFTER JUBILEE GARDENS AVENUE, WHICH HOUSE
- 22 DID YOU MOVE TO?
- 23 **A** WAKASHAN.
- 24 Q OKAY. NOW I'M GOING TO ASK --
- MR. MANN: I'M SORRY, YOUR HONOR, I DIDN'T --

- 1 THE COURT: WHAT DID YOU SAY, SWEETIE?
- 2 THE WITNESS: WAKASHAN.
- 3 THE COURT: WAKASHAN?
- 4 THE WITNESS: YES.
- 5 THE COURT: OKAY.

- 7 Q NOW, YOU TALKED TO THE POLICE ABOUT SOME OF THE

- 4 **A** NO.
- 5 O SO WHEN COULD YOU GO TO THE BATHROOM?
- 6 A WE HAD TO ASK, AND THEN WHEN THE TIME WAS UP, OR IF
- 7 WE HAD TO GO BEFORE THAT, SOMETIMES THEY WOULD LET US GO.

- 7 **A** YES.
- 8 Q OKAY. NOW, IF YOU ASKED TO GO TO THE BATHROOM AND
- 9 YOU WEREN'T -- YOU KNOW, AND IT WASN'T YOUR TIME YET, WHAT
- 10 WOULD HAPPEN TO YOU?
- 11 A WHAT DO YOU MEAN BY THAT?

- 22 **Q** WHO WROTE ON IT?
- A MR. DWIGHT.
- Q WHAT DID HE WRITE?
- 25 A BOARD OF EDUCATION.

- 1 MS. BLUTH: OKAY.
- 2 SHOWING COUNSEL STATE'S PROPOSED EXHIBIT 2.
- 3 YOUR HONOR, MAY I APPROACH THE WITNESS?
- 4 THE COURT: SURE.
- 5 BY MS. BLUTH:
- 6 Q OKAY. AVA, IF I SHOWED YOU A PICTURE OF THE STICK
- 7 RULER FROM HOME DEPOT, WOULD YOU RECOGNIZE IT?
- 8 A YES.
- 9 Q OKAY. I'M SHOWING YOU WHAT'S BEEN MARKED FOR
- 10 PURPOSES OF IDENTIFICATION AS STATE'S PROPOSED EXHIBIT 2. IS
- 11 THIS LIKE ONE OF THE STICKS THAT WAS USED?
- 12 **A** YES.
- 13 Q OKAY. DOES THAT SAY -- IT KIND OF GOT CUT OFF, BUT
- 14 CAN YOU SAY -- SEE HOME DEPOT THERE IN THE CORNER?
- 15 **A** YES.
- 16 Q OKAY. AND IS THIS A FAIR AND ACCURATE -- IS THIS
- 17 WHAT IT LOOKED LIKE?
- 18 **A** YES.
- 19 **Q** OKAY.
- 20 MS. BLUTH: YOUR HONOR, I'D ASK TO MOVE INTO EVIDENCE,

- THE COURT: ANY OBJECTION, MR. MANN?
- 23 MR. MANN: UM -- NO, YOUR HONOR.

- 6 DID IT BREAK YOUR SKIN?
- 7 **A** YES.
- 8 Q DID YOU EVER BLEED FROM IT?
- 9 **A** YES.
- 10 Q OKAY. SOMETIMES WHEN MR. DWIGHT AND MISS DANIELLE
- 11 WOULD HIT YOU, DID THE STICK EVER BREAK?
- 12 MR. RUE: OBJECTION. IT WAS NEVER MISS DANIELLE.

- 2 MS. BRAISER: GO IN THE --
- 3 THE COURT: YES, SURE. GO AHEAD.
- 4 WHAT'S MISS -- WHAT'S AVA'S CASA ATTORNEY'S NAME, FIRST
- 5 NAME?
- 6 MS. BLUTH: ALISON, A-L-I-S-O-N.
- 7 **THE COURT:** THANK YOU.
- 8 MS. BLUTH: B-R-A-S-I-E-R.
- 9 (WHEREUPON WITNESS AND MS. BRASIER LEFT THE COURTROOM.)
- 10 THE COURT: I SENT THEM INTO MY CHAMBERS TO USE THE
- 11 BATHROOM. I TOLD MY J.E.A. NOT TO TALK TO THEM OR ANYTHING,
- 12 SO ...
- 13 MS. BLUTH: THANK YOU, YOUR HONOR.
- 14 THE COURT: I THINK MISS LISA'S IN THERE, TOO.
- MS. BLUTH: JUDGE, I WON'T TALK ABOUT THE CASE, BUT I'M
- 16 GOING TO CHECK ON HER.
- 17 THE COURT: OKAY.
- 18 MS. BLUTH: I WON'T TALK ABOUT THE CASE.
- 19 (WHEREUPON THERE WAS A BREAK IN THE PROCEEDINGS.)

- 6 MS. BLUTH: -- ANY OBJECTION?

- 24 Q NOW, AVA, WHEN YOU SAT ON THESE BUCKETS, WAS --
- 25 DID -- DID THEY LOOK LIKE THIS OR WAS THERE SOMETHING ELSE ON

- 1 THEM?
- 2 A THERE WAS A TOILET SEAT ON THEM.
- OKAY. AND DO YOU KNOW WHO BOUGHT THESE BUCKETS?
- 4 A MR. DWIGHT.
- 5 Q OKAY. AND DO YOU KNOW WHO PUT THE TOILET SEAT ON
- 6 THEM?
- 7 A MR. DWIGHT.
- 8 Q OKAY. UM -- SO EXPLAIN TO ME, YOU KNOW, WHY YOU
- 9 WOULD HAVE TO SIT ON THERE.
- 10 A SO WE WOULDN'T HAVE AN ACCIDENT IN OUR PANTS, SO IT
- 11 WOULD BE MORE MESSIER.
- 12 Q OKAY. AND HOW LONG WAS IT THAT YOU WOULD SIT ON
- 13 THOSE?
- 14 A ALL DAY UNTIL IT WAS TIME TO GO TO BED.
- 15 Q OKAY. WOULD ANASTASIA AND AMAYA HAVE TO SIT ON THE
- 16 BUCKETS ALL DAY, TOO?
- 17 **A** YES.
- 18 Q WHEN YOU WERE FOSTER -- WHEN YOU WERE A FOSTER CHILD
- 19 IN THE SOLANDER HOME, WHAT TYPES OF THINGS COULD YOU EAT OR
- 20 DRINK?
- 21 **A** WE WOULD EAT LIKE REGULAR FOOD LIKE ANY OTHER KID.
- 22 Q OKAY. SO LIKE WHAT IF YOU WANTED MCDONALD'S, COULD
- 23 YOU HAVE MCDONALD'S?
- 24 **A** YEAH.
- 25 **Q** OKAY. NOW, ONCE YOU GOT ADOPTED, DID THAT CHANGE?

- 1 A WE STILL -- IT WAS FOR A LITTLE BIT, THEN AFTER
- 2 THAT, AFTER MISS JANET HAD FOUND OUT THAT I HAD STOMACH
- 3 ISSUES, THEN I HAD TO DRINK MY FOOD.
- 4 Q OKAY. NOW, WHO TOLD YOU, YOU HAD STOMACH ISSUES?
- 5 A A DOCTOR.
- 6 Q OKAY. UM -- AND THEN YOU STARTED TO HAVE -- DID YOU
- 7 SAY MISS JANET STARTED BLENDING YOUR FOOD?
- 8 A YES.
- 9 O EXPLAIN THAT TO ME. WHAT DOES THAT MEAN?
- 10 A SHE WOULD GET THE -- MISS JANET WOULD MAKE THE FOOD
- 11 AND PUT IT IN A BLENDER AND -- UM -- MIX IT IN THERE, AND THEN
- 12 I WOULD HAVE TO DRINK IT OUT OF A CUP.
- 13 Q OKAY. AND THAT'S WHAT YOU WERE GIVEN TO EAT?
- 14 **A** YES.
- 15 O NOW, WERE YOUR SISTERS GIVEN THE SAME THING OR
- 16 SOMETHING DIFFERENT?
- 17 A THEY WERE GIVEN THE SAME THING.
- 18 Q OKAY. AND HOW OFTEN WERE YOU GIVEN THAT BLENDED
- 19 THING?
- 20 A WHEN -- BEFORE WE HAD -- BEFORE WE HAD THREE DATES,
- 21 WE HAD IT THREE TIMES.
- 22 **Q** THREE TIMES A DAY?
- 23 A YEAH. YES. AND THEN ONCE WE STARTED TO HAVE
- 24 ACCIDENTS, THEN IT GOT REDUCED DOWN TO TWO AND ONE. SOMETIMES
- 25 WE HAD AN ACCIDENT, THEN WE WOULDN'T EAT FOR A DAY.

- OKAY. UM -- WAS -- WHAT ABOUT WATER, WERE YOU
- 2 ALLOWED TO HAVE WATER WHENEVER YOU WANTED?
- 3 A WHEN THE NANNY WORKS THERE, WE WOULD HAVE WATER AND
- 4 WE GET A BATHROOM BREAK.
- 5 **Q** OKAY.
- 6 A AND THEN WE'D HAVE WITH IT OUR MEDICINE. WE
- 7 WEREN'T -- WE STARTED HAVING ACCIDENTS WE ONLY HAD IT WITH
- 8 YOUR MEDICINE.
- 9 Q OKAY. SO IF YOU -- YOU SAID THAT IF YOU HAD AN
- 10 ACCIDENT, THEN YOU WOULDN'T GET TO EAT THAT DAY.
- 11 A THE DAY -- WE WOULDN'T EAT FOR THE REST OF THE DAY.
- 12 Q OKAY. AND WHOSE RULE WAS THAT?
- 13 A MISS JANET'S.
- 14 Q OKAY. NOW, WOULD -- IF YOU HAD AN ACCIDENT, WOULD
- 15 MR. DWIGHT GIVE YOU FOOD?
- 16 **A** NO.
- 17 Q OKAY. SO IF YOU HAD AN ACCIDENT HE WOULDN'T ALLOW
- 18 YOU TO EAT, EITHER?
- 19 **A** MISS JANET TOLD -- DIDN'T LET -- IF MISS JANET
- 20 DIDN'T WANT US TO HAVE FOOD, SHE WOULD LET MR. DWIGHT KNOW SO
- 21 THAT HE WOULDN'T GIVE US FOOD.
- 22 **Q** OKAY. AND WHAT ABOUT THE WATER, WOULD MR. DWIGHT
- 23 LET YOU HAVE WATER?
- 24 **A** NO.
- 25 Q IF MISS JANET TOLD HIM NO?

- 1 A YES.
- 2 NOW, IF YOU HAD AN ACCIDENT IN YOUR -- IN YOUR
- 3 UNDERWEAR, DID YOU EVER HAVE TO PLACE YOUR UNDERWEAR ON ANY
- 4 OTHER PART OF YOUR BODY?
- 5 A YES.
- 6 **Q** WHERE?
- 7 A IN MY MOUTH.
- 8 Q OKAY. NOW, WAS THAT AN ACCIDENT WITH PEE OR POOP?
- 9 A IT WAS WITH PEE.
- 10 · Q OKAY. AND WHO MADE YOU PUT IT IN YOUR MOUTH?
- 11 A MISS JANET.
- 12 O AND WHY DID SHE MAKE YOU DO THAT?
- 13 A IT WAS LIKE BECAUSE I HAD AN ACCIDENT, SO IT WAS
- 14 LIKE ANOTHER PUNISHMENT. BUT NOT EVERY TIME I -- IT WASN'T
- 15 FOR EVERY TIME I HAD AN ACCIDENT.
- 16 Q OKAY. DID IT HAPPEN ONE TIME OR MORE THAN ONE TIME?
- 17 A I CAN ONLY REMEMBER ONE TIME THAT IT HAPPENED.
- 18 Q OKAY. AND WERE YOU ALLOWED TO TAKE IT OUT OR HOW
- 19 DID IT WORK?
- 20 **A** I WAS ALLOWED TO TAKE IT OUT.
- 21 **Q** OKAY.
- 22 A I WOULD HAVE TO GET IN THE SHOWER.
- 23 Q OKAY. SO HOW LONG WAS IT YOU HAD TO KEEP IT IN YOUR
- 24 MOUTH FOR?
- 25 **A** IT WOULD BE LIKE A MINUTE OR TWO.

- OKAY. NOW, YOU TALKED ABOUT GETTING IN THE SHOWER.
- 2 AFTER YOU HAD AN ACCIDENT, WOULD YOU ALWAYS GO IN THE SHOWER?
- 3 WOULD SHE ALWAYS PUT YOU IN THE SHOWER?
- A YES, UNLESS IT WAS LIKE AT NIGHT, WE WOULD GET
- 5 SPRAYED DOWN WITH THE HOSE OUTSIDE.
- 6 Q WHO WOULD SPRAY YOU WITH THE HOSE OUTSIDE?
- 7 A MISS JANET.
- 8 O WOULD YOU HAVE ANY CLOTHES ON?
- 9 A IF -- IF WE'RE AL -- IF WE HAD A SHIRT ON, WE WOULD
- 10 KEEP IT ON, BUT WE WOULD TAKE THE REST OF OUR -- THE REST OF
- 11 OUR CLOTHES OFF.
- 12 Q OKAY. SO THIS IS AT NIGHT?
- 13 **A** YES.
- 14 Q LIKE EVEN IF IT'S WINTERTIME?
- 15 **A** WE -- WE DIDN'T HAVE LIKE ACCIDENTS, SPRAY US DOWN
- 16 ON THE HOSE -- UM -- DURING WINTERTIME.
- 17 Q OKAY. ALL RIGHT. SO WHEN YOU -- UM -- WOULD
- 18 SHOWER, WERE YOU ALLOWED TO USE THE HOT WATER?
- 19 **A** NO.
- 20 **Q** WHAT WOULD YOU USE?
- 21 **A** COLD WATER.
- 22 Q AND WHOSE RULE WAS THAT?
- 23 A MISS JANET'S.
- 24 Q AND BESIDES COLD WATER, WAS ANYTHING ELSE PLACED ON
- 25 YOU?

- 1 A WE WOULD -- SHE WOULD GET A BUCKET OF ICE AND WATER
- 2 AND DUMP IT ON US.
- 3 Q DID YOU KNOW WHY SHE WAS DOING THAT?
- 4 A BECAUSE WE MADE HER UPSET OR MAD, WE HAD AN ACCIDENT
- 5 ON OURSELF.
- 6 O OKAY. WHAT DID THAT FEEL LIKE WHEN THE ICE WAS
- 7 BEING DUMPED ON YOU IN THE SHOWER?
- 8 A IT MADE ME MORE COLD.
- 9 Q AFTER YOU TOOK A SHOWER -- UM -- WHO CLEANED THE
- 10 SHOWER?
- 11 A UM -- IT WAS -- IT WAS EITHER ME OR AMAYA OR
- 12 ANASTASIA.
- 13 Q OKAY. WAS THE SHOWER -- DID ANYBODY EVER CHECK THE
- 14 SHOWER TO SEE IF YOU HAD HAD ANY ACCIDENTS IN THE SHOWER?
- 15 **A** YES.
- 16 **Q** WHO DID THAT?
- 17 A MISS JANET OR MR. DWIGHT.
- 18 Q OKAY. AND HOW WOULD THEY CHECK THE SHOWER?
- 19 A WITH THIS FLASHLIGHT THAT WAS ABLE TO -- UM -- IT
- 20 COULD SEE LIKE IF THE -- IF WE HAD HAD AN ACCIDENT IN THE TUB.
- 21 Q IS THAT WHAT THEY TOLD YOU?
- 22 **A** YES.
- 23 Q OKAY. AND SO WHAT HAPPENED IF THE LIGHT SHOWED YOU
- 24 HAD AN ACCIDENT?
- 25 A THEN WE WOULD GET IN TROUBLE.

- 1 Q WHAT DOES GETTING IN TROUBLE MEAN?
- 2 A WE GET A SPANKING -- UM -- WE WOULD HAVE A FAN ON
- 3 US.
- 4 Q WHAT DO YOU MEAN YOU'D HAVE THE FAN ON YOU?
- 5 A THEY HAD -- MISS JANET AND MR. DWIGHT HAD FANS THAT
- 6 HAD -- THE BUTTONS WERE HIGH, LOW AND --
- 7 THE REPORTER: I'M SORRY, HAD WHAT?
- 8 THE WITNESS: THEY WOULD HAVE LIKE THESE BUTTONS THAT HAD
- 9 TO PRESS IT FOR HIGH, MEDIUM OR LOW. AND THEY WOULD TURN IT
- 10 ON AND -- SO WE COULD DRY OFF.
- 11 BY MS. BLUTH:
- 12 Q AFTER YOU GOT OUT OF THE COLD SHOWER?
- 13 A WE WOULD STAY IN THE TUB AND DRY. WE WOULD STAY
- 14 BY -- IN THE TUB WITH THE FAN ON, LIKE IN OUR FACES.
- 15 Q OKAY. SO YOU DIDN'T USE TOWELS?
- 16 A BEFORE THAT WE DID. LIKE IF -- UM -- SHE HAD -- IF
- 17 MISS JANET WAS REALLY TIRED AND SHE HAD TO GO TO SLEEP LIKE
- 18 SHE HAD AN APPOINTMENT, AND SHE WOULD LET US USE A TOWEL.
- 19 Q BUT IF YOU HAD AN ACCIDENT AND YOU WERE BEING
- 20 PUNISHED, THEN YOU'D HAVE TO DRY OFF BY THE FAN?
- 21 A OR WE WOULD SHAKE -- UM -- OURSELF.
- 22 Q OKAY. UM -- WHERE DID YOU SLEEP AT THE WAKASHAN
- 23 HOUSE?
- 24 A WE SLEPT ON THIS BOARD THAT WAS GRAY. AND WHEN WE
- 25 HAD NANNIES, WE WOULD SLEEP ON THIS COT. THERE WAS LIKE A

- 1 COT, AND IT WAS BLACK, AND IT HAD A MATTRESS ON IT. AND
- 2 SOMETIMES WE WOULD SLEEP ON THE -- ON A TOWEL.
- 3 Q OKAY. SO WHEN THE NANNIES WERE THERE YOU GOT TO
- 4 SLEEP ON A COT WITH A MATTRESS?
- 5 A YES.
- 6 Q OKAY. SO LET'S TALK ABOUT WHEN THE NANNIES WEREN'T
- 7 THERE, YOU SAID YOU EITHER SLEPT ON A BOARD OR A TOWEL?
- 8 A AND A LITTLE BIT AFTER THAT, THE NANNIES LEFT, THEN
- 9 SHE WOULD -- MISS JANET WOULD LET US SLEEP ON IT STILL UNTIL
- 10 WE HAD AN ACCIDENT, THEN WE SLEPT ON THE BOARD.
- 11 Q OKAY. SO IF YOU HAD AN ACCIDENT, YOU SLEPT ON THE
- 12 BOARDS. DID YOU GET TO WEAR PAJAMAS?
- 13 A SOMETIMES SHE LET US WEAR PAJAMAS.
- 14 Q OKAY. WHAT ABOUT THE TIMES THAT SHE DIDN'T LET YOU
- 15 WEAR PAJAMAS, WHAT WERE YOU ALLOWED TO WEAR?
- 16 **A** OUR UNDERWEAR.
- 17 **Q** JUST UNDERWEAR?
- 18 **A** YES.
- 19 Q OKAY. WERE YOU ALLOWED TO HAVE SHEETS OR A BLANKET
- 20 OR ANYTHING AFTER YOU HAD AN ACCIDENT?
- 21 **A** NO.
- 22 Q OKAY. UM -- NOW, YOU TALKED ABOUT THE FAN DRYING
- 23 YOU OFF IN THE BATHROOM. WAS THERE A FAN IN THE ROOM WHERE
- 24 YOU SLEPT?
- 25 **A** YES.

- 1 Q AND WHEN -- WOULD THAT FAN EVER BE PUT ON?
- 2 A WHEN WE WERE GOING TO SLEEP.
- 3 Q OKAY. SO WHEN YOU WERE ON THE BOARD WITHOUT
- 4 CLOTHES?
- 5 A YES.
- 6 Q AND WHO DID THAT?
- 7 A MISS JANET.
- 8 Q NOW -- UM -- WAS MR. DWIGHT EVER HOME WHEN YOU SLEPT
- 9 ON THE BOARDS?
- 10 A WHEN HE CAME BACK FROM WORK HE -- UM -- HE WOULD SEE
- 11 US, BUT ALL THE OTHER TIMES, HE KNEW ABOUT IT, BUT ON THE
- 12 OTHER TIMES, HE WOULDN'T SEE BECAUSE HE WAS AT WORK.
- OKAY. BUT THE TIMES THAT HE WAS HOME, HE SAW YOU
- 14 SLEEPING ON THE BOARDS WITH JUST YOUR UNDERWEAR AND A FAN
- 15 BLOWING?
- 16 **A** YES.
- 17 Q DID HE EVER SAY ANYTHING TO YOU?
- 18 A LIKE WHEN HE JUST TOLD US TO WAKE UP, IT WAS TIME TO
- 19 GET UP.
- 20 Q OKAY. DID HE EVER TELL YOU WHY YOU WERE SLEEPING ON
- 21 THE BOARDS?
- 22 A I CAN'T REMEMBER.
- 23 Q OKAY. NOW, DID YOU GO TO A REGULAR SCHOOL OR WERE
- 24 YOU HOMESCHOOLED?
- 25 A WHEN -- WE WERE HOMESCHOOLED, BUT BEFORE THAT, WE

- 1 WERE IN REGULAR SCHOOL, AND THEN WE STARTED EATING BREAKFAST
- 2 THERE, MISS JANET SAID WE WERE STEALING, SO THEN WE GOT TOOKEN
- 3 OUT OF SCHOOL AND WE WERE HOMESCHOOLED.
- 4 Q OKAY. SO YOU WERE -- WHAT WAS YOUR ELEMENTARY
- 5 SCHOOL CALLED WHEN YOU WERE GOING TO SCHOOL?
- 6 A HECKETHORN.
- 7 Q OKAY. AND WHEN YOU SAID YOU STARTED GETTING
- 8 BREAKFAST THERE, WHAT DO YOU MEAN?
- 9 A WE ATE BREAKFAST, BUT WE HAD A CERTAIN AMOUNT OF
- 10 TIME. AND WE WEREN'T DONE, AND I WOULD STILL BE HUNGRY, SO I
- 11 WENT TO SCHOOL AND ATE BREAKFAST.
- 12 OKAY. SO WHEN YOU WERE -- BEFORE SCHOOL YOU WERE
- 13 GIVEN BREAKFAST?
- 14 **A** YES.
- 15 Q BUT YOU ONLY HAD A SPECIFIC AMOUNT OF TIME IN ORDER
- 16 TO EAT IT?
- 17 **A** YES.
- 18 Q AND SO WHAT HAPPENED IF YOU WEREN'T DONE AND THE
- 19 TIMER WENT OFF, OR WHATEVER -- HOWEVER THE TIME WAS MEASURED?
- 20 **A** WE HAD TO GET UP AND -- UM -- FINISH GETTING READY
- 21 FOR SCHOOL.
- 22 Q OKAY. SO YOU COULDN'T FINISH?
- 23 **A** NO.
- 24 Q UH -- SO WHEN YOU WENT TO SCHOOL, YOU WERE STILL
- 25 HUNGRY?

- 1 A YES.
- 2 O SO HOW DID YOU GET FOOD AT SCHOOL?
- 3 A I TOLD THEM -- I TOLD THE LADIES MY NAME, AND THEN
- 4 THEY FOUND MY NAME WAS -- UM -- PULLED UP OUT OF THE COMPUTER,
- 5 SO I WAS ABLE TO EAT BREAKFAST.
- 6 Q OKAY. AND DID MISS JANET FIND OUT ABOUT THAT?
- 7 **A** YES.
- 8 Q AND WHAT HAPPENED?
- 9 A I HAD -- SHE -- SHE FOUND OUT BECAUSE I HAD -- UM --
- 10 THE CINNAMON ROLL THAT I WAS EATING GOT STUCK IN THE BACK OF
- 11 MY THROAT, AND I WENT TO THE NURSE, AND MISS JANET AND
- 12 DANIELLE WERE WAITING THERE FOR ME, AND THEY WENT TO THE NURSE
- 13 AND ASKED HER WHAT IT WAS. SO THEN I WENT HOME, AND I WAS IN
- 14 TIMEOUT. I WENT IN TIMEOUT.
- 15 O AND THEN DID YOU GO BACK TO SCHOOL AFTER THAT?
- 16 **A** YES.
- 17 Q OKAY. AND THEN AFTER -- AT WHAT POINT DID YOU START
- 18 GETTING HOMESCHOOLED?
- 19 **A** I CAN'T REMEMBER THAT.
- 20 **Q** BUT SOMETIME AFTER THAT INCIDENT?
- 21 **A** YES.
- 22 **Q** OKAY. SO WHEN YOU WOULD BE HOMESCHOOLED, WOULD
- 23 SOMEONE STAY HOME AND TEACH YOU, OR HOW DID THAT WORK, THE
- 24 HOMESCHOOL SITUATION?
- 25 A MISS JANET AND MR. DWIGHT WENT TO A LEARNING CENTER

- 1 STORE AND THEY GOT -- FOUND SOME BOOKS -- UM -- LIKE ON
- 2 DIFFERENT SUBJECTS, AND THEY WOULD RIP THE PAGES OUT AND LET
- 3 US DO THE WORK, AND THEN THEY WOULD HAVE TO CHECK AND SEE --
- 4 CHECK IT TO SEE WHICH ONES WERE RIGHT AND WHICH ONES WERE
- 5 WRONG.
- 6 Q WOULD THEY STAY HOME WITH YOU WHILE YOU STAYED AT
- 7 THE HOUSE AND DID YOUR WORK?
- 8 **A** YES.
- 9 Q DID EITHER -- YOU ALREADY SAID THAT MR. DWIGHT
- 10 WORKED. UM -- DID MISS JANET WORK?
- 11 A WHEN SHE -- WHEN WE WERE AT THE JUBILEE GARDENS
- 12 AVENUE HOUSE, SHE WAS WORKING -- UM -- IN SOME PART OF THE
- 13 MILITARY.
- 14 Q OKAY. AND THEN WHEN YOU MOVED TO WAKASHAN, DID SHE
- 15 WORK?
- 16 **A** CAN'T REMEMBER.
- 17 O OKAY. THAT'S ALL RIGHT.
- 18 UM -- WHAT WOULD HAPPEN IF YOU GOT SOME OF THE
- 19 ANSWERS ON YOUR HOMEWORK WRONG?
- 20 A WE WOULD EITHER GET A SPANKING OR WE WOULD -- UM --
- 21 SHE WOULD TELL US TO READ -- SHE WOULD YELL AT US AND TELL US
- 22 TO READ IT CAREFULLY AND FOLLOW DIRECTIONS.
- 23 Q OKAY. WHEN YOU SAY YOU'D GET A SPANKING, IS THAT A
- 24 SPANKING WITH A HAND OR WITH A STICK?
- 25 **A** WITH A PAINT STICK.

- 1 Q WITH THE PAINT STICK.
- NOW, AT -- AT SOME POINT YOU MOVED FROM LAS VEGAS TO
- 3 FLORIDA AND WENT TO A SCHOOL CALLED -- I THINK IS IT CALLED
- 4 THE MARVELOUS GIRLS ACADEMY?
- 5 A MARVELOUS GRACE GIRLS ACADEMY.
- 6 Q MARVELOUS GRACE GIRLS ACADEMY.
- 7 BEFORE YOU WENT TO THAT ACADEMY, DID YOU HAVE AN
- 8 INJURY ON YOUR EYE?
- 9 A YES.
- 10 HOW DID YOU GET THAT?
- 11 A I HAD AN ACCIDENT. AND MISS JANET WAS TALKING TO
- 12 HER DAUGHTER ON THE PHONE, AND I HAD AN ACCIDENT, AND THEN SHE
- 13 HAD GOT -- GOTTEN MAD AT ME, AND THEN SHE HAD LIKE SLAMMED
- 14 IT -- MY -- THIS SIDE OF MY -- MY RIGHT SIDE FACE -- THE SIDE
- 15 OF MY FACE, ON THE COUNTER WHERE WE DID OUR HOMEWORK.
- 16 Q OKAY. MISS JANET DID THAT?
- 17 **A** YES.
- 18 Q OKAY. AND DID THAT HURT YOUR EYE?
- 19 **A** YES.
- 20 Q UM -- TELL ME ABOUT THE INJURY TO YOUR EYE. WHAT
- 21 DID IT LOOK LIKE, WHAT DID IT FEEL LIKE?
- 22 A IT WAS PURPLE, KIND OF LIKE PURPLISH AND -- AT FIRST
- 23 I THOUGHT IT WAS BECAUSE -- IT WAS BASICALLY IN PAIN, AND THEN
- 24 IT STARTED CLOSING, AND THEN -- BUT SHE STARTED PUTTING ICE ON
- 25 IT, AND THEN IT STARTED OPENING BACK UP.

- 1 Q OKAY. WHEN IT WAS CLOSING LIKE YOU SAY, WAS IT
- 2 SWELLING, IS THAT WHAT YOU MEAN BY CLOSING? LIKE SWELLING
- 3 SHUT?
- 4 A YES.

- 16 A IT HAD LIKE A BAG AND -- UH -- A CLEAR TUBE --
- 17 **Q** OKAY.
- 18 A -- TOGETHER.
- 19 Q AND HOW DO YOU KNOW WHAT A CATHETER IS?
- 20 A MISS JANET HAD -- MISS JANET -- ONE DAY MISS JANET
- 21 AND MR. DWIGHT ASKED ME IF I COULD USE THE BATHROOM, AND ME
- 22 AND ANASTASIA SAID NO, SO THEN MISS JANET HAD TOLD ME TO GET
- 23 UPSTAIRS SO I COULD GET A CATHETER PUT IN.

- 13 A I HAD TO LAY ON THE TOWEL, AND SHE -- I HAD TO WIPE
- 14 ME WITH SOME KIND OF WIPE THING.
- 15 **Q** OKAY.
- 16 A AND THEN SHE PUT -- UM -- PUT IT IN ME.
- 17 Q OKAY. WHEN YOU SAY SHE PUT IT IN YOU, WHAT DO YOU
- 18 MEAN?
- 19 A SHE PUT IT IN MY PRIVATE AREA.
- 20 Q OKAY. WHEN SHE PUT IT IN YOUR PRIVATE AREA, DID YOU
- 21 SEE ANYTHING COME OUT?

- 23 Q OKAY. WHAT HAPPENED WHEN SOMETHING CAME OUT?
- 24 A THEN THEY -- THEY HAD TO GO SOMEWHERE, SO WHEN SHE
- 25 CAME BACK, I CAN'T REMEMBER WHAT THEY DID, BUT WE STAYED IN

- 2 OKAY. UM -- BECAUSE YOU HAD TOLD MISS JANET THAT

- 25 **THE COURT:** SUSTAINED. REPHRASE.

- 20 **THE COURT:** OVERRULED.
- 21 BY MS. BLUTH:
- 22 Q DID YOU EVER SEE MISS JANET -- UM -- USE THE
- 23 CATHETER ON ANY OF YOUR SISTERS?
- 24 **A** NO.
- 25 Q UM -- AND I -- DO YOU KNOW WHO BOUGHT THE CATHETERS?

- 1 A IT WAS BETWEEN MR. DWIGHT AND MISS JANET.
- 2 OKAY. WHEN YOU SAY IT WAS BETWEEN THEM, WHAT DO YOU

- 20 Q OKAY. SO WOULD IT HELP -- WOULD YOU BE ABLE TO DRAW
- 21 IT FOR ME?
- 22 **A** YES.
- 23 MS. BLUTH: OKAY.
- 24 I'M JUST APPROACHING WITH A BLANK PIECE OF PAPER, YOUR
- 25 HONOR.

- 1 THE COURT: ALL RIGHT.
- 2 BY MS. BLUTH:
- 3 Q COULD YOU DRAW WHAT THE RAZOR LOOKED LIKE FOR ME,
- 4 AVA?
- 5 A YES.
- 6 KIND OF LIKE THAT.
- 7 Q OKAY. AND SO YOU SAID IT WAS GRAY?
- 8 A SILVER-ISH.
- 9 Q SILVER-ISH?
- 10 **A** YES.
- MS. BLUTH: AND, JUDGE, I'D ASK THAT THIS BE MARKED AS --
- 12 MR. MANN: CAN WE SEE IT?
- 13 THE COURT: AND I WANT HER TO WRITE HER NAME UNDER IT.
- 14 MS. BLUTH: SURE.

- 21 **A** CAN'T REMEMBER.
- 22 Q OKAY. UM -- LET'S TALK ABOUT THIS CATHETER. WHAT

- 24 A IT WAS -- IT WAS LIKE A BAG AND IT HAD A CLEAR TUBE.
- 25 Q OKAY. AND HOW BIG WAS THE BAG?

- 2 Q OKAY. WAS IT THE SIZE OF QUARTER?
- 3 A IT WAS MAYBE LIKE -- MAYBE MEDIUM SIZE.
- 4 Q CAN YOU GIVE ME SOMETHING THAT YOU WOULD COMPARE IT
- 5 TO?
- A MAYBE LIKE SMALLER THAN THE SIDE OF THAT DESK.
- 7 Q WHICH DESK ARE YOU TALKING ABOUT?
- 8 A THIS DESK.
- 9 MR. MANN: THIS DESK?
- 10 IF I MAY APPROACH, YOUR HONOR?
- 11 THE COURT: SURE.
- 12 BY MR. MANN:
- 13 Q WHAT SIDE OF THE DESK ARE YOU REFERRING TO?
- 14 A THE ONE YOU JUST TOUCHED.
- 15 **Q** THIS SIDE?
- 16 **A** YES. A LITTLE SMALLER.
- 17 Q JUST A LITTLE BIT SMALLER THAN THIS --
- 18 **A** YES.
- 19 **Q** -- SQUARE RIGHT HERE?
- 20 **A** YES.
- 21 Q ARE YOU TALKING ABOUT THIS PART OR JUST THIS PART?
- 22 **A** JUST THAT PART.
- 23 MR. MANN: JUST THIS PART.
- 24 UM -- AND FOR THE RECORD, THIS WOULD BE THE -- UM --
- 25 COURT REPORTER'S CORNER OF THE DESK -- UM -- I NEED HELP

- 1 DESCRIBING IT.
- THE COURT: I CAN'T EVEN SEE IT FROM HERE.
- 3 MR. MANN: IT'S -- IT'S JUST THIS WHOLE PANEL THAT YOU'RE

- 2 MR. MANN: UM -- I DON'T -- I DON'T KNOW WHAT LAW --
- 3 THE COURT: -- SING TO THE CHOIR UP NORTH.
- 4 MR. MANN: I DON'T KNOW WHAT LAW YOU'RE REFERRING TO, AND
- 5 MAYBE THAT'S MY IGNORANCE. BUT -- UM -- I DON'T REMEMBER
- 6 SOMETHING ON POINT SPECIFIC TO -- UM -- THAT A J.P. IS NOT
- 7 ALLOWED TO CONSIDER CREDIBILITY OF A WITNESS WHATSOEVER IN

- 12 A AROUND MAYBE FOUR MONTHS.
- 13 Q OKAY. WHILE HERE, DID YOU EVER GET INJURED?
- 14 **A** NO.
- 15 Q DID YOU EVER HAVE A COMPLAINT WHERE YOU HAD TO SEE
- 16 THE NURSE?
- 17 **A** NO.
- 18 Q WAS THERE A NURSE?
- 19 **A** NO.
- 20 Q DID YOU EVER SEE A DOCTOR?
- 21 A NO. THERE, NO.
- 22 Q SO WHILE YOU WERE THERE FOR FOUR MONTHS YOU WERE
- 23 NEVER TAKEN TO THE DOCTOR?
- 24 A YES, YOU'RE CORRECT.
- 25 Q OKAY. UM -- AND THE PEOPLE THAT RUN THE FLORIDA

- 1 SCHOOL ARE THE BLANKENSHIPS?
- 2 A YES.
- 3 OKAY. UM -- AND -- UH -- IS IT JUST THE
- 4 BLANKENSHIPS THAT RUN THE SCHOOL OR ARE THERE OTHER STAFF?
- 5 A THERE'S OTHER STAFF.
- 6 O AND -- UM -- HOW MANY OTHER STAFF?
- 7 A AROUND FIVE OR SEVEN.
- 8 Q OKAY. ALL RIGHT.
- 9 AND YOU LIKED IT IN FLORIDA, CORRECT?
- 10 **A** YES.
- 11 Q AND YOU DID NOT WANT TO COME BACK FROM FLORIDA,
- 12 CORRECT?
- 13 **A** YES.
- 14 **Q** THAT'S CORRECT?
- 15 **A** YES.
- 16 Q OKAY. AND -- UM -- YOU WERE -- UM -- AND AMAYA
- 17 LIKED IT IN FLORIDA, TOO, CORRECT?
- 18 **A** YES.
- 19 Q ANASTASIA LIKED IT IN FLORIDA?
- 20 **A** YES.
- 21 Q OKAY. AND YOU DID NOT WANT TO COME BACK TO NEVADA,
- 22 CORRECT?
- 23 **A** YES.
- 24 Q NOW, THESE -- UM -- ICE SHOWERS OR SHOWERS WHERE YOU
- 25 WERE, YOU SAID, DUMPED WITH BUCKETS OF ICE; IS THAT RIGHT?

- 1 A YES.
- 2 **Q** DO YOU KNOW WHEN THAT HAPPENED?
- 3 A I GOT IN TROUBLE AND I HAD AN ACCIDENT.
- 4 Q OKAY. AND SO YOU WERE GIVEN AN ICE SHOWER BECAUSE
- 5 YOU HAD AN ACCIDENT?
- 6 A I GOT A BUCKET OF ICE WATER DUMPED ON ME BECAUSE I
- 7 HAD AN ACCIDENT.
- 8 Q OKAY. WHAT WAS THE -- WHAT COLOR WAS THE BUCKET?
- 9 **A** CLEAR.
- 10 Q CLEAR?
- 11 AND -- UM -- WHERE DID -- WHO -- WHO DUMPED THE ICE
- 12 ON YOU?
- 13 A THE ONLY PERSON I CAN REMEMBER IS MISS JANET.
- 14 **Q** OKAY.
- 15 MR. RUE: WHAT DID YOU SAY?
- 16 THE WITNESS: THE ONLY PERSON I CAN REMEMBER WAS
- 17 MISS JANET.
- 18 **THE COURT:** OKAY, THANK YOU.
- 19 BY MR. MANN:
- 20 Q AND WHEN YOU GOT THIS -- THE ICE DUMPED ON YOU,
- 21 WHERE DID SHE GET THE ICE FROM?
- 22 A DOWNSTAIRS IN THE FREEZER.
- 23 **Q** IN THE WHAT?
- 24 **A** IN THE FREEZER.
- 25 O OKAY. AND WHEN YOU WENT -- AND WHILE YOU WERE

- 1 LIVING AT MISS JANET'S AND MR. DWIGHT'S HOUSE, YOU WERE GIVEN
- 2 SPECIFIC TOWELS TO USE, CORRECT? EACH GIRL HAD A DIFFERENT
- 3 COLOR TOWEL?
- 4 A YES.
- 5 Q OKAY. AND SO YOU WERE TOLD TO USE THESE TOWELS; IS
- 6 THAT RIGHT?
- 7 A WHAT -- WHICH HOME ARE YOU TALKING ABOUT?
- 8 **Q** UM -- WAKASHAN.
- 9 A WELL, WE WEREN'T TOLD TO USE THOSE SPECIFIC TOWELS.
- 10 WE HAD TO USE.
- 11 Q I'M SORRY?
- 12 A WE WEREN'T TOLD -- NO ONE TOLD US YOU NEED TO USE A
- 13 SPECIFIC TOWEL.
- 14 Q BUT YOU KNEW THAT WAS YOUR TOWEL?
- 15 **A** YES.
- 16 **Q** OKAY. WHAT COLOR WAS YOUR TOWEL?
- 17 A BLUE.
- 18 Q OKAY. AND SO YOU HAD A BLUE TOWEL TO USE TO DRY OFF
- 19 AFTER SHOWERS?
- 20 **A** YES.
- 21 Q AND THEN YOU WERE RESPONSIBLE FOR HANGING THAT TOWEL
- 22 UP?
- 23 **A** YES.
- 24 Q AND KEEPING THAT TOWEL CLEAN?
- 25 **A** YES.

- 1 Q OKAY. AND WHEN YOU WERE -- WHEN YOU WERE LIVING
- 2 WITH MISS JANET AND MR. DWIGHT AS A FOSTER CHILD, DID YOU LIKE
- 3 IT THERE?
- 4 **A** NO.
- 5 Q OKAY. WHY DIDN'T YOU LIKE IT THERE?
- 6 A I JUST -- I DON'T KNOW HOW TO EXPLAIN IT WITHOUT
- 7 SAYING OUT LOUD, BUT I JUST DIDN'T LIKE IT.
- 8 Q OKAY. DID YOU WANT TO BE ADOPTED BY MISS JANET?
- 9 **A** NO.
- 10 Q DID YOU EVER TELL ANYONE YOU DIDN'T WANT TO BE
- 11 ADOPTED BY MISS JANET?
- 12 A TOLD MY SISTERS.
- 13 Q OKAY. AND SO WHEN YOU WERE ADOPTED BY MISS JANET
- 14 YOU WERE UPSET, CORRECT?
- 15 A YES. I WAS UPSET, BUT I NEVER SHOWED IT.
- 16 Q I'M SORRY, I DIDN'T HEAR THE LAST PART.
- 17 **A** I WAS UPSET ON THE INSIDE, BUT NO ONE -- I NEVER
- 18 SHOWED IT SO NO ONE WOULD REALLY KNOW, EXCEPT FOR MY SISTERS.
- 19 O AND ACCORDING TO YOUR STATEMENTS TO MISS EBRIHAM,
- 20 WHEN YOU WERE A FOSTER CHILD, YOU'RE SAYING THAT NONE OF THESE
- 21 THINGS HAPPENED TO YOU AS A FOSTER CHILD, CORRECT?
- 22 **A** YES.
- 23 Q OKAY. AND YOU'RE NOW SAYING THAT WHEN YOU WERE
- 24 ADOPTED, THAT'S WHEN ALL THESE THINGS SUPPOSABLY HAPPENED,
- 25 CORRECT?

- 1 A YES.
- 2 Q OKAY. AND YOU'RE SAYING THAT -- YOU ALSO TOLD MISS
- 3 EBRIHAM THAT WHEN YOU WERE ADOPTED, THEY NO LONGER TREATED YOU
- 4 THE SAME AS WHEN YOU WERE A FOSTER CHILD; IS THAT RIGHT?
- 5 A YES.
- 6 Q BUT YOU ACTUALLY WENT ON A LOT OF VACATIONS WITH
- 7 MISS JANET --
- 8 MS. BLUTH: OBJECTION, RELEVANCE.
- 9 MR. MANN: -- AND MR. DWIGHT?
- 10 THE COURT: HOLD ON. HOLD ON ONE SECOND.
- 11 RELEVANCE?
- 12 MR. MANN: WELL, CONSIDERING NOTHING IS RELEVANT, YOUR
- 13 HONOR.
- 14 MS. BLUTH: UM -- I WOULD OBJECT TO THAT AS
- 15 ARGUMENTATIVE.
- 16 THE COURT: I THINK IT'S ARGUMENTATIVE. ARE YOU TRYING--
- 17 MR. MANN: WELL, I THINK -- I THINK THAT WAS CLEAR, I
- 18 WASN'T TRYING TO MASK THAT, I APOLOGIZE. UM --

- 23 THAT'S IT.
- 24 THE COURT: I THINK THE -- THE STATE'S POSITION IS MAYBE
- 25 THE SITUATION CHANGED IN A -- ON THE -- UM -- ON THE

- 1 DETRIMENTAL SIDE OF THINGS.
- 2 THEY DIDN'T EVEN GET INTO THE GOOD THINGS THAT WERE GOING
- 3 ON IN THE HOME DURING FOSTER STATUS VERSUS THE GOOD THINGS
- 4 GOING ON DURING -- UM -- ADOPTION STATUS, SO THERE'S -- I
- 5 MEAN, YOU COULD TALK ABOUT ALL DIFFERENT TYPES OF THINGS GOING
- 6 ON IN THE HOME, GOOD, BAD AND INDIFFERENT.
- 7 MR. MANN: WELL, LET ME REPHRASE, THEN, YOUR HONOR.
- 8 THE COURT: OKAY.
- 9 MR. MANN: I THINK IT GOES TO AVA'S STATE OF MIND WHILE
- 10 SHE'S ADOPTED, AND IT GOES TO HER STATE OF MIND, AS SHE HAD
- 11 INDICATED -- UM -- CAN WE APPROACH, PLEASE?
- 12 THE COURT: SURE.
- 13 (WHEREUPON ALL COUNSEL APPROACHED THE BENCH.)
- 14 THE COURT: OKAY, YOU CAN CONTINUE. I THINK YOU'RE GOING

- 16 MR. MANN: YES, I UNDERSTAND, YOUR HONOR.

- 20 Q WHAT IS ALL DAY? WHAT DOES THAT MEAN?
- 21 A TILL I WENT TO BED.
- 22 O FROM WHEN YOU WOKE UP UNTIL YOU WENT TO BED?
- 23 **A** YES.
- 24 Q OKAY. AND SO WHEN YOU WOKE UP, YOU'RE IMMEDIATELY
- 25 IN TROUBLE AND WERE FORCED TO SIT ON THESE BUCKETS?

- A WE WEREN'T IMMEDIATELY IN TROUBLE, UNLESS WE DECIDED
- 2 TO DO SOMETHING ELSE BESIDES NOT OPENING OUR MOUTH BECAUSE WE
- 3 WERE SCARED.
- 4 Q OKAY. SO AS SOON AS YOU OPENED YOUR MOUTH YOU HAD
- 5 TO SIT ON THESE BUCKETS?
- A WE HAD TO SIT ON THEM WHEN WE WOKE UP, BECAUSE
- 7 MISS JANET DIDN'T WANT TO DEAL WITH US HAVING ACCIDENTS, SO IT
- 8 WAS JUST A ROUTINE.
- 9 OKAY. NOW, THESE ACCIDENTS THAT YOU KEEP TALKING
- 10 ABOUT, YOU SAID DURING SCHOOL YOU WERE TOLD TO GO TO THE
- 11 BATHROOM EVERY HOUR ON THE HOUR, RIGHT?
- 12 **A** WE WERE ASKED.

- 20 A WE WEREN'T REMINDED. WE WERE ASKED IF EVERY HOUR,
- 21 FROM THE TIME WE WOKE UP IF WE HAD TO USE THE BATHROOM.
- 22 O OKAY. SO EVEN THOUGH YOU WERE ASKED EVERY HOUR TO
- 23 GO TO THE BATHROOM, YOU STILL HAD ACCIDENTS?
- 24 **A** YES.
- 25 O DO YOU KNOW WHY YOU STILL HAD ACCIDENTS?

- A BECAUSE I WAS HOLDING IT IN BECAUSE I WASN'T
- 2 GONNA -- I DIDN'T WANT TO GET IN TROUBLE WHILE I WAS --
- 3 WHILE -- I DIDN'T WANT TO GET IN TROUBLE.
- 4 O THEY WERE ASKING YOU TO GO TO THE BATHROOM, BUT YOU
- 5 DIDN'T WANT TO GO TO THE BATHROOM BECAUSE YOU'D GET IN
- 6 TROUBLE?
- 7 A WHEN I HAD A CHANCE TO TRY, I DIDN'T WANT TO GO
- 8 BECAUSE I KNEW I WAS GOING TO GET IN TROUBLE FOR NOT OPENING
- 9 MY MOUTH.
- 10 O WHY WOULD YOU GET IN TROUBLE FOR GOING TO THE
- 11 BATHROOM WHEN THEY ASKED YOU TO?
- 12 A I KNEW WE WOULD GET IN TROUBLE, BECAUSE EVERY -- NOT
- 13 EVERY TIME, BUT MOST OF THE TIME I ASKED, I GOT EITHER SLAPPED
- 14 OR SOMETHING ELSE HAD HAPPENED.
- 15 EVERY TIME YOU WERE -- YOU ASKED TO GO TO THE
- 16 BATHROOM YOU WOULD GET SLAPPED?
- 17 **A** SOMETIMES.
- 18 Q OKAY. BUT WHAT ABOUT THOSE TIMES WHEN THEY ASKED
- 19 YOU TO GO TO THE BATHROOM?
- 20 A WHEN THEY ASKED ME, I HELD IT IN, BECAUSE I KNEW I

- 3 ACTUALLY NEEDING TO GO TO THE BATHROOM?
- 4 A I WAS AFRAID BECAUSE I KNEW I WAS GOING TO GET IN
- 5 TROUBLE FOR NOT ASKING BEFORE THAT.
- 6 Q OKAY. SO ARE YOU SAYING THAT THEY ACTUALLY WANTED
- 7 YOU TO ASK THEM FOR YOU TO USE THE BATHROOM, AND THAT'S WHAT
- 8 THEY REALLY WANTED YOU TO DO?
- 9 A CAN YOU SAY THAT AGAIN, PLEASE?
- 10 Q SURE.
- 11 ARE YOU SAYING THAT MISS JANET AND MR. DWIGHT WANTED

- A SHE USED IT ON -- DANIELLE USED IT ON ANASTASIA.
- 2 Q ANASTASIA --
- 3 THE COURT: THAT YOU -- THAT YOU SAW?
- 4 THE WITNESS: YES.
- 5 THE COURT: OKAY.
- 6 MR. RUE: OKAY. THAT YOU SAW.
- 7 Q UM -- WHAT ABOUT AMAYA?
- 8 A NOT THAT I'VE SEEN.
- 9 Q OKAY. DO YOU REMEMBER WHEN YOU TALKED TO MISS -- IS
- 10 IT ABRAHAM?
- 11 MR. MANN: EBRIHAM.
- 12 MR. RUE: EBRIHAM?
- 13 EBRIHAM, DO YOU REMEMBER YOU -- I THOUGHT YOU SAID YOU

- 16 Q DO YOU REMEMBER TELLING MISS ABRAHAM [SIC] -- UM --
- 17 ON PAGE 40, "I KNOW DANIELLE DIDN'T DO ANYTHING TO ME, BUT I
- 18 DON'T KNOW ABOUT MY SISTERS."
- 19 UM -- IS THAT TRUE, DO YOU KNOW WHETHER SHE HIT YOUR
- 20 SISTERS, OR NOW YOU'RE TELLING US THERE IS A TIME WHEN SHE HIT
- 21 YOUR SISTER?
- 22 A SHE NEVER HIT THEM. LIKE ANASTASIA HAD AN ACCIDENT
- 23 WHEN DANIELLE WAS TAKING CARE OF US, AND -- UM -- ANASTASIA
- 24 HAD TO USE THE BATHROOM, DANIELLE WAS ON THE PHONE, AND
- 25 ANASTASIA COULDN'T HOLD IT, AND WE WERE EATING, SHE HAD AN

- 1 ACCIDENT ON THE FLOOR. AND THEN DANIELLE STEPPED ON

- 4 A YES.
- 5 Q OKAY. AND THAT'S THE ONLY TIME YOU CAN EVER
- 6 REMEMBER ANA -- OR DANIELLE USING THE PAINT STICK?
- 7 **A** YES.
- 8 O IS ONE TIME SPANKING ANASTASIA?
- 9 A YES.
- 10 Q OKAY. UM -- WERE THERE A LOT OF TIMES WHEN YOU

- 16 **A** I WOULDN'T HAVE -- I DIDN'T HAVE FUN LIKE THE OTHER
- 17 KIDS.
- 18 Q WHAT DO YOU MEAN?
- 19 A BECAUSE IT WAS -- WE WENT THERE -- THEY TOOK --
- 20 MISS JANET AND MR. DWIGHT TOOK US TO EITHER ARIZONA OR
- 21 CALIFORNIA. WE WERE PEEING ON OURSELVES, AND LIKE AUTUMN AND
- 22 IVY GOT -- WENT TO KNOTT'S BERRY FARM, AND WE DIDN'T BECAUSE
- 23 WE WERE ACTING UP.
- 24 Q SO THEY -- SO THEY TOOK THEIR FOSTER KIDS TO KNOTT'S
- 25 BERRY FARM, BUT THEY LEFT -- THEIR ADOPTED CHILDREN DIDN'T GET

- 1 TO GO?
- 2 A WE WENT -- WE WENT TO -- WE WENT THERE, BUT WE
- 3 DIDN'T DO ANYTHING. WE JUST -- WE DIDN'T DO ANYTHING. WE
- 4 WERE STILL WITH THEM, BUT WE DIDN'T DO ANYTHING.
- 5 Q WHAT DO YOU MEAN? YOU WENT TO KNOTT'S BERRY FARM
- 6 AND JUST WALKED AROUND AND LOOKED AT THE RIDES AND WATCHED
- 7 EVERYONE ELSE HAVE FUN?
- 8 A YEAH. RIGHT.
- 9 Q AND WHY WAS THAT?
- 10 A BECAUSE WE WERE ACTING UP.
- 11 Q ACTING UP.
- 12 A AND WHEN WE GOT TO GO TO DISNEYLAND THE FIRST
- 13 TIME -- I MEAN DISNEY WORLD, THE FIRST TIME, WE -- THEY GAVE
- 14 US ANOTHER CHANCE, AND WE GOT TO HAVE FUN. AND THEN THE NEXT
- 15 TIME I WENT BY MYSELF BECAUSE I WASN'T PEEING ON MYSELF AS
- 16 MUCH.
- 17 O SO WHEN YOU STOPPED PEEING ON YOURSELF YOU GOT MORE
- 18 PRIVILEGES?
- 19 A YES. AND THEN -- BUT ONCE I STARTED -- THEN WHEN --
- 20 THE FIRST NIGHT WE WENT THERE I HAD AN ACCIDENT, AND THEN THEY
- 21 DIDN'T WANT TO TAKE ME ANYMORE.
- 22 O NOW, WERE THEY USING THE TIMERS DOWN ON VACATION?
- 23 A I CAN'T REMEMBER THAT.
- 24 Q NOW, PUTTING ON THE -- BEING SAT ON THE BUCKET IS --
- 25 WAS A PUNISHMENT, CORRECT?

- 1 A YES.
- 2 O ALL RIGHT. NOW, DO YOU REMEMBER WHEN -- HOW MANY
- 3 TIMES DID YOU GET SET ON A BUCKET FOR PUNISHMENT?
- 4 A WE WERE SITTING ON IT ALL THE TIME.
- 5 Q ALL THE TIME.
- 6 NOW, WAS THE BUCKET SITTING NEXT TO THE TELEVISION,
- 7 BY ANY CHANCE?
- 8 A WE WERE SITTING ON IT, BUT WE WERE -- WE WENT IN THE
- 9 FAMILY ROOM, AND WE PLACED OUR BUCKETS LIKE BY THE TEL --
- 10 TELE -- TELEVISION, AND WE WERE SITTING ON THEM.
- 11 Q OKAY. SO YOU WERE ALLOWED TO MOVE THE BUCKET,
- 12 CORRECT?
- 13 **A** YES.
- 14 Q I THOUGHT YOU SAID IT WAS A PUNISHMENT?
- 15 A WE WERE STILL SITTING ON THE BUCKET.
- 16 Q RIGHT. BUT THE PUNISHMENT CONSISTED OF YOU BEING
- 17 ALLOWED TO MOVE THE BUCKET ANYWHERE YOU WANTED TO?
- 18 A THEY HAD TOLD US TO GO OVER THERE, SO WE COULDN'T
- 19 JUST DO IT BY OURSELVES.
- 20 Q ALL RIGHT. AND YOU SAT THE BUCKET NEXT TO A
- 21 TELEVISION?
- 22 A AND SAT ON IT.
- 23 Q AND SAT ON IT. AND WATCHED AS MUCH TELEVISION AS
- 24 YOU WANTED, CORRECT?
- A NO. THEY WERE TALKING TO US ABOUT -- WHAT, I CAN'T

- 1 REMEMBER.
- 2 Q WELL, HOW MANY TIMES DID YOU GET SAT ON THE BUCKET,
- 3 THEN?
- 4 MS. BLUTH: OBJECTION, ASKED AND ANSWERED, JUDGE. SHE
- 5 SAID ALL THE TIME WHEN HE ASKED THAT PREVIOUS, HER RESPONSE
- 6 WAS ALL THE TIME.
- 7 MR. MUELLER: IF -- UNFORTUNATELY IF IT WERE ANSWERED, I
- 8 WOULDN'T HAVE TO ASK IT AGAIN.
- 9 THE COURT: OVERRULED.
- 10 BY MR. MUELLER:
- 11 Q HOW MANY TIMES DID YOU GET SAT ON THE BUCKET?
- 12 A SAT ON IT ALL THE TIME. I NEVER GOT TO GET OFF IT,
- 13 EXCEPT FOR THAT TIME WHEN I TOLD YOU WE SAT ON -- ME AND AMAYA
- 14 SAT ON THE CHAIR.
- 15 AND BEFORE WE STARTED PEEING ON OURSELVES.
- 16 Q NOW, WHO MADE -- WHEN YOU WERE HOMESCHOOLED, WHO
- 17 MADE THE MEALS AT THE HOUSE?
- 18 A MISS JANET MADE THEM, MOST OF THE TIME.
- 19 Q NOW, DID YOU KNOW HOW TO MAKE THIS BLENDED MEAL THAT
- 20 THE DOCTOR WANTED YOU TO EAT?
- 21 **A** NO.
- 22 Q ALL RIGHT. SO SINCE YOU DIDN'T KNOW HOW TO MAKE IT
- 23 AND MISS JANET DIDN'T MAKE IT, YOU DIDN'T EAT?
- 24 A THE DOCTOR NEVER SAID HE WANTED ME TO EAT BLENDED
- 25 FOOD. BUT MISS JANET AND MR. DWIGHT THOUGHT IT WAS THE BEST

- 1 THING, SO THEY WANTED ME TO GET BETTER.
- 2 WELL, DO YOU KNOW WHAT CROHN'S DISEASE IS?
- A NO, BECAUSE I REALLY HAVEN'T BEEN HAVING STOMACH
- 4 ISSUES OR BLOOD IN MY BOWEL MOVEMENT.
- 5 O SO ONCE YOU STARTED TO EAT THE BLENDED MEALS, THE
- 6 PROBLEMS WENT AWAY?
- 7 A SOMETIMES I HAD STOMACHACHES, BUT -- EVEN NOW I'M
- 8 HAVING STOMACHACHES, BUT IT'S NOT BECAUSE I'M HAVING TROUBLE
- 9 USING THE BATHROOM, IT'S FOR OTHER THINGS.
- 10 **Q** UM-HUM. OKAY.
- 11 NOW, HAVE YOU HAD ANY FURTHER FOLLOW-UP EXAMINATIONS
- 12 BY A PHYSICIAN OR A DOCTOR REGARDING THE CROHN'S DISEASE?
- 13 A AM I GETTING TO READY -- AM I ABOUT TO HAVE A
- 14 FOLLOW-UP?
- 15 Q HAVE YOU EVER GONE BACK TO THE DOCTOR?
- 16 A NOT YET.
- 17 Q NOT YET.
- 18 NOW, DID MISS JANET WORK WHILE YOU GUYS WERE LIVING
- 19 WITH HER?
- 20 **A** YES.
- 21 Q ALL RIGHT. AND WHERE DID SHE WORK AT OR WHAT DID
- 22 SHE DO?
- 23 A I KNOW IT'S SOME PART OF THE MILITARY AND SHE WAS --
- 24 WHEN WE WERE LIVING IN THE JUBILEE GARDEN HOUSE.
- 25 Q ALL RIGHT. WAS SHE IN THE MILITARY OR WHAT WAS HER

- 1 JOB, DO YOU KNOW?
- 2 A I THINK SHE SAID SOMETHING LIKE ABOUT A NURSE.
- 3 Q SHE WAS A NURSE?
- 4 A NURSE.
- 5 Q AND DID YOU KNOW WHAT HOSPITAL OR WHAT FACILITY SHE
- 6 WORKED AT?
- 7 A SHE TOOK ME -- I THINK I DO.
- 8 Q OKAY. AND WHERE -- WHERE DID SHE TAKE YOU?
- 9 A SHE TOOK ME TO THIS OFFICE, AND SHE WAS -- I DON'T
- 10 KNOW WHAT SHE WAS DOING, BUT IT DIDN'T -- I KNOW SHE TOOK ME
- 11 TO A BUILDING THAT WAS ON THE BASE.
- 12 Q A BUILDING THAT WAS ON THE BASE?
- 13 **A** YES.
- 14 **Q** OKAY.
- 15 A BUT I DON'T KNOW IF THAT'S WHERE SHE ACTUALLY
- 16 WORKED.
- 17 Q ALL RIGHT. AND DID SHE INTRODUCE YOU TO HER
- 18 COWORKERS OR DID SHE INTRODUCE YOU TO ANYBODY?
- 19 **A** YES.
- 20 Q ALL RIGHT. AND WAS IT A PLACE WHERE SICK PEOPLE HAD
- 21 GONE? WAS IT A FACILITY OR A HOSPITAL?
- 22 A WHEN SHE TOOK ME TO THAT SORT OF OFFICE -- UM -- IT
- 23 WASN'T LIKE WHERE SICK PEOPLE WOULD GO.
- 24 Q IT WAS OR WAS NOT?
- 25 **A** IT WASN'T.

- 1 Q OKAY. SO YOU DIDN'T SEE ANYBODY LYING IN A HOSPITAL
- 2 BED THERE?
- 3 A YOU'RE CORRECT.
- 4 Q OKAY. NOW, DID YOU EVER GO OUT AND RUN ANY ERRANDS
- 5 WITH DWIGHT?
- A NOT THAT I CAN REMEMBER.
- 7 O HE DIDN'T PUT YOU IN THE TRUCK AND TAKE YOU TO A
- 8 SERVICE CALL OR TWO WITH YOU?
- 9 **A** TO WHAT?
- 10 Q HE DIDN'T TAKE YOU TO WORK WITH HIM ONCE OR TWICE?
- 11 A NO. HE TOOK ME TO MY DOCTOR'S APPOINTMENT.
- 12 **Q** OKAY.
- 13 A THAT'S IT, THAT I CAN REMEMBER.
- 14 Q WHICH DOCTOR WAS THAT?
- DR. BERNSTEIN, HEMATOLOGIST.
- 16 **Q** I'M SORRY?
- 17 A DR. BERNSTEIN, HE'S MY HEMATOLOGIST.
- 18 Q OKAY. NOW, DID DWIGHT COME BACK -- FREQUENTLY COME
- 19 BACK AFTER WORK AND AFTER YOU GUYS WERE ALREADY ASLEEP?
- 20 A HE WOULD COME BACK AFTER WORK -- HE -- SOMETIMES.
- 21 Q SOMETIMES. SO HE'D COME HOME AFTER WORK AND YOU
- 22 GUYS WERE ALREADY IN BED?
- 23 **A** YES.
- 24 Q NOW, AS A REGULAR COURSE DID DWIGHT MAKE FOOD FOR
- 25 YOU, OR IS THAT SOMETHING JANET MOSTLY DID?

- 1 A HE MADE IT SOMETIMES, BUT IT WAS SOMETHING
- 2 MISS JANET MOSTLY DID.
- 3 **Q** MOSTLY DID.
- 4 NOW, DO YOU RECALL ANY INSTANCES WHERE DWIGHT TOLD
- 5 YOU, YOU COULDN'T EAT ANYTHING?
- 6 A NO. HE DIDN'T -- HE NEVER SAID IT.
- 7 Q OKAY. DO YOU RECALL ANY INSTANCES WHERE HE SAID YOU
- 8 COULDN'T DRINK ANYTHING?
- 9 A NEVER SAID IT.
- 10 O NEVER SAID IT.
- 11 NOW, WHEN YOU WERE HOMESCHOOLED, DID DWIGHT EVER
- 12 TEACH YOU ANY LESSONS, OR WAS THAT MISS JANET?
- 13 A WELL, MISS JANET -- THE FIRST TIME WE STARTED DOING
- 14 IT, MISS JANET TAUGHT US HOW TO DO IT, AND THEN MR. DWIGHT
- 15 TAUGHT US -- UM -- ONE TIME BEFORE HE WENT TO WORK.
- 16 Q SO ONE TIME IN THREE YEARS HE TAUGHT THE HOMESCHOOL?
- 17 A WELL, HE HAD TO HELP US, AND KEEP SHOWING US --
- 18 WELL, NOT -- HE DIDN'T HAVE TO KEEP DOING IT TO ME, BUT HE
- 19 TAUGHT ME HOW TO DO -- HOW TO DO WHAT MY SISTERS WERE DOING,
- 20 SO I WOULDN'T HAVE TO GO UP TO HIM, AND HE WOULDN'T HAVE TO
- 21 TEACH IT AGAIN.
- 22 Q SO HE'D HELP YOU WITH THE HOMEWORK IN THE EVENING
- 23 HOURS?
- 24 **A** YES.
- 25 Q OKAY. AND WHERE WOULD YOU STUDY IN THE EVENING

- 1 HOURS?
- 2 A SOMETIMES WE DID MATH.
- 3 **Q** WHERE?
- 4 A DID CHARTS.
- 5 Q WERE YOU GUYS AT A DESK?
- 6 A WE HAD -- ON THE COUNTER, BUT THAT WAS WHERE I WAS
- 7 SITTING.
- 8 MR. MUELLER: IF I COULD HAVE THE COURT'S INDULGENCE FOR
- 9 JUST A MOMENT? I NEED SOME WORKSPACE HERE.
- 10 THE COURT: SURE.
- 11 (DISCUSSION BETWEEN MR. MUELLER AND DWIGHT SOLANDER.)
- 12 BY MR. MUELLER:
- 13 Q ALL RIGHT. SO DWIGHT WOULD HELP YOU WITH THE
- 14 SCHOOLWORK IN THE EVENINGS, CORRECT?
- 15 A WELL, IF -- ON THE WEEKENDS IF WE NEEDED HELP HE
- 16 WOULD HELP US. BUT THAT ONE TIME WHEN HE HELPED ME, IT WAS ON
- 17 MULTIPLICATION AND FRACTIONS, THAT TIME IT WAS RIGHT BEFORE HE
- 18 WENT TO WORK, SO IT WAS THE DAYTIME.
- 19 O SO HE DID HELP YOU IN THE DAYTIME OCCASIONALLY?
- 20 A IF HE WAS -- IF HE HAD TIME.
- 21 Q ALL RIGHT. SO MOST OF THE TIME IT WAS JANET, AND ON
- 22 OCCASION IT WOULD BE DWIGHT?
- 23 **A** YES.
- 24 Q ALL RIGHT. NOW, WHEN YOU HAD THE CATHETER INSERTED,
- 25 WHO WAS -- WAS THAT IN THE BATHROOM UPSTAIRS?

- 1 A YES.
- 2 Q ALL RIGHT. WAS THE DOOR CLOSED?
- 3 A YES.
- 4 Q OKAY. SO IT WAS JUST YOU AND JANET IN THE ROOM?
- 5 A YES.
- 6 Q OKAY. NOW, EARLIER ON DIRECT EXAMINATION, YOU
- 7 THOUGHT DWIGHT WAS HOME AT THAT TIME. DO YOU REMEMBER THAT?
- 8 A YES.
- 9 Q OKAY. YOU DON'T KNOW THAT HE WAS HOME, DO YOU?
- 10 A HE WAS HOME.
- 11 Q AND THAT WOULD BE BASED ON YOU BEING ALONE IN THE
- 12 BATHROOM WITH JANET, HOW DO YOU KNOW THAT?
- 13 A HE WAS DOWNSTAIRS. HE ASKED ME -- MR. DWIGHT ASKED
- 14 ME, SO HE WAS IN THE HOUSE, AND HE ASKED ME IF I HAD TO GO TO
- 15 THE BATHROOM.
- 16 Q OKAY. AND DID YOU HAVE TO GO TO THE BATHROOM?
- 17 A AND I WENT UPSTAIRS.
- 18 Q I WAS SUPPOSE TO STOP.
- 19 A I SAID NO.
- 20 Q SO HE ASKED YOU, DO YOU HAVE TO GO TO THE BATHROOM.
- 21 AND SO WAS THIS DURING A SCHOOLDAY?
- 22 A IT'S ALWAYS A SCHOOLDAY.
- 23 Q EVERY DAY IS A SCHOOLDAY?
- 24 **A** YES.
- 25 MS. BLUTH: ASKED AND ANSWERED, OBJECTION.

- 1 THE COURT: SUSTAINED.
- 2 BY MR. MUELLER:
- 3 Q ALL RIGHT. AND THEN WHAT HAPPENED?
- A AND I WENT TO THE BATHROOM.
- 5 Q HE ASKED YOU IF YOU HAD TO GO, DIDN'T YOU SAY YES?
- 6 A I SAID NO, AND THEN I WENT TO THE BATHROOM UPSTAIRS
- 7 TO GET -- SO MISS JANET COULD PUT THE CATHETER IN ME.
- 8 Q WHERE WERE THE CATHETERS KEPT?
- 9 A I DON'T KNOW WHERE THEY KEPT THEM.
- 10 **O** OKAY.
- 11 A BECAUSE I COULDN'T -- I COULDN'T GO IN THE ROOM -- I
- 12 COULDN'T GO WHERE I WANTED, SO...
- 13 WHAT DO YOU MEAN YOU COULDN'T GO WHERE YOU WANTED?
- 14 A I COULDN'T GO LIKE -- LIKE OTHER KIDS DO, IF THEY
- 15 WANT TO GO IN THEIR ROOM, THEY GO IN THEIR ROOM, I COULDN'T DO
- 16 THAT. OR SOMETHING LIKE THAT, I COULDN'T DO IT.
- 17 O ALL RIGHT. DWIGHT ASKED YOU IF YOU WANTED TO GO TO
- 18 THE BATHROOM, YOU SAID NO. THEN YOU URINATED ON YOURSELF,
- 19 CORRECT? AND THEN YOU WENT UPSTAIRS, CORRECT?
- 20 MS. BLUTH: OBJECTION, JUDGE, MISSTATES HER TESTIMONY.
- 21 SHE NEVER URINATED ON HERSELF. SHE WAS TAKEN UPSTAIRS SO MISS
- 22 JANET COULD USE THE CATHETER, WHICH IS HER TESTIMONY ON DIRECT
- 23 AND TO MR. MUELLER RIGHT BEFORE THEN.
- 24 MR. MUELLER: THAT'S NOT WHAT SHE --
- 25 THE COURT: I DIDN'T HEAR HER SAY THAT. I'M NOT SAYING

- 1 SHE DIDN'T, BUT CAN WE -- CAN YOU START OVER?
- 2 MR. MUELLER: CERTAINLY.
- 3 THE COURT: AND SO LISTEN TO HIS QUESTIONS, OKAY?
- 4 THE WITNESS: OKAY.
- 5 THE COURT: ALL RIGHT. GO AHEAD.
- 6 BY MR. MUELLER:
- 7 Q YOU WENT -- DWIGHT ASKED YOU -- IT'S YOUR
- 8 RECOLLECTION NOW THAT DWIGHT ASKED YOU IF YOU NEEDED TO USE TO
- 9 THE BATHROOM.
- 10 **A** YES.
- 11 Q AND THIS WAS ON A SCHOOLDAY WHEN HE WAS ACTUALLY
- 12 THERE, NOT WHEN HE WAS AT WORK?
- 13 **A** YES.
- 14 Q AND YOU SAID NO.
- 15 **A** YES.
- 16 **Q** WHAT HAPPENED THEN?
- 17 A MISS JANET TOLD ME TO GO UPSTAIRS SO SHE COULD PUT
- 18 THE CATHETER IN ME, AND THEN I --
- 19 Q YOU WENT -- DID YOU, IN FACT, GO UPSTAIRS?
- 20 **A** I WENT UPSTAIRS.
- 21 Q OKAY. AND DID DWIGHT GO UPSTAIRS, OR DID HE STAY
- 22 DOWNSTAIRS?
- 23 A HE STAYED DOWNSTAIRS AND DID WHATEVER HE NEEDED TO
- 24 DO.
- 25 **Q** SO HE'S DOWNSTAIRS. OKAY.

- 1 AND YOU WENT IN THE BATHROOM WAS THE DOOR CLOSED?
- 2 **A** IT WAS CLOSED.
- 3 Q IT WAS CLOSED.
- 4 NOW, DO YOU KNOW DID DWIGHT BUY THE CATHETERS OR DID
- 5 JANET GET THEM FROM WORK?
- 6 A I DON'T KNOW. IT WAS EITHER -- I KNOW IT WAS --
- 7 Q YOU DON'T KNOW?
- 8 A YEAH, I DON'T KNOW.
- 9 MR. MUELLER: OKAY. THANK YOU.
- 10 IF I COULD GET THE COURT'S INDULGENCE FOR JUST A MOMENT?
- 11 **THE COURT:** OKAY.
- 12 (DISCUSSION BETWEEN MR. MUELLER AND DWIGHT SOLANDER.)
- 13 MR. MUELLER: ALL RIGHT. YOUR HONOR, AT THIS TIME I HAVE
- 14 NO FURTHER QUESTIONS.
- 15 THE COURT: OKAY. BEFORE YOU REDIRECT I MIGHT HAVE A
- 16 QUESTION, HOLD ON.
- 17 OKAY. SO, AVA, THERE WAS -- YOU SAID WHEN MISS BLUTH WAS
- 18 ASKING YOU QUESTIONS THAT -- I THOUGHT YOU SAID THAT
- 19 MR. DWIGHT WAS NEAR THE BATHROOM DOOR, OUTSIDE THE DOOR
- 20 SOMEWHERE WHEN THE CATHETER WAS BEING USED.
- 21 THE WITNESS: THAT WAS ANOTHER TIME.
- THE COURT: THAT WAS A DIFFERENT TIME THAN WHAT
- 23 MR. MUELLER WAS JUST ASKING YOU?
- 24 **THE WITNESS:** YES.
- THE COURT: OKAY. SO THE TIME THAT MR. MUELLER WAS JUST

- 1 ASKING YOU ABOUT, IT'S -- IT'S YOUR TESTIMONY THAT MR. DWIGHT
- 2 WAS DOWNSTAIRS THE WHOLE TIME?
- 3 THE WITNESS: YES.
- 4 THE COURT: AND THE DOOR WAS CLOSED AND YOU WERE
- 5 UPSTAIRS?
- 6 THE WITNESS: YES.
- 7 THE COURT: IN THE BATHROOM UPSTAIRS?
- 8 THE WITNESS: YES.
- 9 THE COURT: AND THE DOOR WAS CLOSED?
- 10 THE WITNESS: YES.
- 11 THE COURT: AND ONLY MISS JANET WAS IN THERE WITH YOU?
- 12 **THE WITNESS:** YES.
- 13 THE COURT: BUT THEN -- SO THE TIME THAT MISS BLUTH WAS
- 14 ASKING YOU ABOUT WAS A -- WAS A DIFFERENT TIME?
- 15 THE WITNESS: YEAH. JUST MISS JANET PUT IT IN ME A
- 16 COUPLE DIFFERENT TIMES, SO THE ONES I CAN ONLY REMEMBER OF.
- 17 THE COURT: OKAY. AND YOU DID TESTIFY TO MISS BLUTH THAT
- 18 IT WAS MORE THAN ONE TIME AND YOU DIDN'T KNOW HOW MANY TIMES.
- 19 **THE WITNESS:** YES.
- 20 THE COURT: OKAY, MISS -- OKAY, CROSS-EXAMINATION. I
- 21 MEAN, I'M SORRY, REDIRECT?
- 22 MR. MUELLER: WELL --
- THE COURT: WELL, I'LL LET YOU FOLLOW-UP ON MY QUESTIONS,
- 24 LET HER REDIRECT RIGHT NOW.
- 25 MR. MUELLER: ALL RIGHT. THANK YOU.

- 1 THE COURT: I TRY TO GO IN ORDER.
- 2 MS. BLUTH: OKAY.

- 25 Q OKAY. AND THAT NANNY ONLY STAYED FOR A WEEK,

- 1 CORRECT?
- 2 A YES.
- 3 DECCA ENDED UP LEAVING BECAUSE SHE ACCUSED YOU OF
- 4 STEALING HER EARRINGS, CORRECT?
- A I DON'T KNOW IF SHE ACCUSED ME, BUT I DIDN'T STEAL
- 6 THE EARRINGS.
- 7 Q OKAY. BUT SOMEONE DID --
- 8 THE COURT: DID YOU SAY YOU DID OR YOU DID NOT?
- 9 THE WITNESS: I DID NOT.
- 10 **THE COURT:** OKAY.
- 11 MR. MANN: OKAY.
- 12 O DO YOU KNOW OF ANYONE THAT ACTUALLY DID TAKE THE
- . 13 EARRINGS?
  - 14 **A** NO.
  - MR. MANN: OKAY. AND, YOUR HONOR, BASED ON THAT RULING
  - 16 I'M GOING TO MOVE ON.
  - 17 THE COURT: OKAY, THANK YOU.
  - 18 BY MR. MANN:
  - 19 Q NOW, YOU SAID THAT -- UM -- YOU HAD SEEN WHEN
  - 20 ANASTASIA WAS BURNED; IS THAT RIGHT?
  - 21 A WHEN SHE CAME OUT, YES.
  - 22 Q WHEN SHE CAME OUT OF THE SHOWER YOU SAW HER BODY; IS
  - 23 THAT RIGHT?
  - 24 **A** THE BATHROOM.
  - 25 Q OKAY. AND DID YOU SEE HER BODY?

- 1 A HER EAR AND HER UPPER NECK, YES.
- 2 Q OKAY.
- 3 A AND HER BACK.
- 4 Q HER BACK?
- 5 A YEAH, UPPER BACK.
- 6 Q UPPER BACK.
- 7 AND WHAT WAS SHE WEARING?
- 8 A SHE WASN'T WEARING -- I REALLY CAN'T REMEMBER, SO I
- 9 CAN'T SAY IF SHE WAS WEARING SOMETHING OR NOT.
- 10 Q OKAY. UM -- HOW DO YOU REMEMBER SEEING HER EAR AND
- 11 BACK?
- 12 **A** SHE CAME OUT, I COULD SEE HER EAR AND I -- HER EAR
- 13 WAS BURNED, AND I KNOW IT WAS BURNED.
- 14 Q HOW DO YOU KNOW IT WAS BURNED?
- 15 A BECAUSE WHEN SHE CAME OUT THE BATHROOM THE WATER WAS
- 16 ON HOT.
- 17 Q HOW DO YOU KNOW THE WATER WAS ON HOT?
- 18 **A** CAN I TAKE A BREAK?
- 19 THE COURT: UM -- YEAH. YES. YES, YOU CAN.
- 20 (WHEREUPON THE WITNESS LEFT THE COURTROOM.)
- THE COURT: WHILE WE ARE ON THE RECORD AND SHE'S TAKING A

- 3 THE COURT: THANK YOU. I'M PUTTING IT ON THE CALENDAR.
- 4 MR. MANN: WHAT TIME WERE WE THINKING? YOU'LL GET BACK
- 5 TO US?
- 6 THE COURT: WE'RE PUTTING THEM ON THE 9:30 CALENDAR --
- 7 MR. MANN: OKAY.
- 8 THE COURT: -- BECAUSE I'M GOING TO TRY TO ALLEVIATE THE
- 9 IN CUSTODIES ON THE -- AT LEAST ONE OF THOSE DAYS.
- 10 MR. MANN: YOUR HONOR, COULD WE GET SOME TISSUES, PLEASE?
- 11 THE COURT: YEAH, THERE'S SOME, MR. MANN.
- 12 MR. MANN: OH. OKAY.
- 13 (OFF THE RECORD.)
- 14 THE COURT: OKAY. OKAY. ARE YOU OKAY AVA?
- 15 **THE WITNESS:** YES.
- 16 THE COURT: OKAY, GOOD.
- 17 GO AHEAD, MR. MANN.
- 18 BY MR. MANN:
- 19 Q HOW DID YOU KNOW IT WAS HOT WATER?
- 20 A BECAUSE MISS JANET TRIED TO DO IT TO ME, TOO, AND NO
- 21 ONE COULD JUST GET A BURN WITHOUT SOMETHING ELSE HAPPENING.
- 22 Q OKAY. SO YOU JUST FIGURED OUT THAT NO ONE COULD GET
- 23 OUT -- A BURN WITHOUT MISS JANET TURNING ON THE HOT WATER?
- 24 A YES. AND SHE'S TRIED TO DO IT TO ME, TOO.
- 25 Q OKAY. AND SO YOUR TESTIMONY NOW IS THAT SHE HAS NOW

- 1 TRIED TO DO IT TO YOU?
- 2 A SHE HAS.
- 3 Q OKAY. HOW DID YOU KNOW WHEN IT WENT TO ANASTASIA
- 4 THAT IT WAS HOT WATER?
- 5 MS. BLUTH: OBJECTION, ASKED AND ANSWERED.
- 6 MR. MANN: NO. SHE -- SHE -- HER ANSWER ORIGINALLY WAS,
- 7 I KNOW BECAUSE IT'S HAPPENED TO ME, NOT WHY SHE KNOWS THIS
- 8 PARTICULAR TIME.
- 9 **THE COURT:** OVERRULED.
- 10 BY MR. MANN:
- 11 Q SO HOW DID YOU KNOW THIS TIME?

- 17 Q SO IT'S JUST YOU MAKING THAT ASSUMPTION, THAT GUESS,
- 18 CORRECT?
- 19 A AND SHE'S JUST GONNA' SAY THE SAME THING.
- 20 Q DID YOU TALK TO ANASTASIA ABOUT THIS?
- 21 A SHE'S TOLD ME BEFORE.
- 22 Q OKAY. SO YOU AN ANASTASIA HAVE TALKED ABOUT ALL
- 23 THIS?
- 24 A YES, AND SHE'S GONNA' SAY THE SAME THING.
- 25 Q OKAY. BECAUSE YOU GUYS TALKED ABOUT HOW YOU'RE

- 1 GONNA' TESTIFY IN COURT, RIGHT?
- 2 **A** NO.
- 3 Q YOU GUYS TALKED WITH AMAYA ABOUT THESE STORIES,
- 4 RIGHT?
- A NO. IT WAS WAY BEFORE WE EVEN GOT OUT OF THE GIRLS
- 6 HOME.
- 7 Q OKAY. SO IN THE GIRLS HOME YOU TALKED ABOUT THIS?
- 8 A I SAID BEFORE WE ...
- 9 THE COURT: IT'S OKAY. AVA, JUST TELL THE TRUTH. IT'S
- 10 NOT A -- THERE'S NOT A RIGHT OR A WRONG ANSWER. THE TRUTH IS
- 11 THE RIGHT OR WRONG -- IS THE RIGHT ANSWER, OKAY? JUST TELL
- 12 THE TRUTH.
- 13 WHAT -- WHAT WAS YOUR QUESTION, WHEN, WHEN THEY TALKED
- 14 ABOUT?
- 15 THE WITNESS: BEFORE WE -- BEFORE THIS -- I EVEN KNEW I
- 16 WAS GOING TO GO TO COURT THERE.
- 17 BY MR. MANN:
- 18 Q OKAY. SO YOU GUYS TALKED ABOUT THIS, AND IT WAS AT
- 19 THE GIRLS HOME, CORRECT?
- 20 **A** YES.
- 21 O AND IT WAS YOU, ANASTASIA AND AMAYA THAT TALKED
- 22 ABOUT THIS?
- 23 A AMAYA DIDN'T TALK ABOUT IT.
- 24 **Q** BUT AMAYA WAS THERE?
- 25 **A** NO.

- 1 Q SO IT WAS JUST YOU AND ANASTASIA?
- 2 A YES. I ASKED HER -- BECAUSE SHE WAS --
- 3 Q YOU WENT --
- 4 A SHE WASN'T --
- 5 Q I'M SORRY, I DIDN'T MEAN TO INTERRUPT YOU. GO

- 16 A MISS JANET HAS DONE THE SAME THING TO ME, TRIED TO
- 17 DO IT. SHE --
- 18 Q HOW DO YOU KNOW THAT ANASTASIA GOT BURNT? YOU SAID
- 19 ORIGINALLY THAT YOU SAW ANASTASIA WALK OUT OF THE BATHROOM,
- 20 THAT'S HOW YOU SAW HER BURN.
- 21 **A** YES.
- 22 **Q** BUT YOU'RE NOW SAYING THAT SHE WAS BURNED BEFORE SHE
- 23 WAS EVEN IN THE SHOWER?

- 25 **Q** HOW DID YOU KNOW THAT SHE GOT BURNT?

- A WHEN SHE CAME OUT I SAW THE BURN. YOU CAN'T GET
- 2 BURNED WITH COLD WATER.

- 1 Q OKAY. AND WHILE SHE WAS IN THE BATHROOM SHE TOOK A
- 2 SHOWER?
- 3 **A** NO.
- 4 Q NO, SHE DIDN'T TAKE A SHOWER THIS TIME?
- 5 A BEFORE SHE TOOK A SHOWER THAT DAY I SAID THAT SHE
- 6 HAD -- I HAD SAW THE BURNS.
- 7 **Q** BEFORE SHE --
- 8 A THAT'S WHEN I --
- 9 TOOK A SHOWER?
- 10 A BEFORE SHE TOOK A SHOWER THAT DAY I HAD ALREADY SEEN
- 11 THE BURNS.
- 12 Q OKAY. WHEN DID YOU SEE THE BURNS?
- 13 A AFTER SHE CAME OUT THE BATHROOM.
- 14 Q OKAY. NOW, YOU SAID YOU -- THE BURNS WERE RED AND
- 15 YOU COULD SEE INSIDE HER SKIN?
- 16 **A** I NEVER SAID THEY WERE RED.
- 17 Q WHAT -- WHAT DID THEY LOOK LIKE?
- 18 A JUST LIKE -- JUST LIKE IT LOOKED IF YOU WERE TO PEAL
- 19 YOUR SKIN OFF IF IT GOT BURNED.
- 20 OKAY. AND SO WHEN YOU'RE TALKING A BURN, YOU MEAN
- 21 LIKE A SUNBURN? AVA, DO YOU MEAN A SUNBURN?
- 22 A I DON'T KNOW HOW TO EXPLAIN IT.
- 23 Q OKAY. BUT YOU SAID THAT YOU SAW SOME OF HER SKIN
- 24 PEELING OFF; IS THAT RIGHT?
- 25 A NO. I SAID THAT IT'S JUST LIKE WHEN YOU PEAL OFF

- 1 YOUR SKIN ONCE YOU GET BURNED. I NEVER SAID I SAW HER -- I
- 2 SAW HER SKIN PEELING OFF.
- OKAY. AND YOU ALSO SAID THAT YOU DIDN'T SEE HER
- 4 SKIN BEING RED; RIGHT?
- 5 A YES.
- 6 Q OKAY. NOW -- UM -- NOW, YOU HAD TOLD MR. MUELLER,
- 7 THAT GENTLEMAN OVER THERE, THAT -- UH -- YOU SAT ON THE
- 8 BUCKETS ALL DAY LONG.
- 9 **A** YES.
- 10 Q OKAY. DID YOU EVER GET OFF THE BUCKETS DURING THE
- 11 DAY?
- 12 A WHEN WE HAD TO MOVE IT, WHEN MR. DWIGHT -- THAT DAY
- 13 WHEN MR. DWIGHT OR MISS JANET TOLD US TO GET IN THE FAMILY
- 14 ROOM.
- 15 **Q** TO DO WHAT?
- 16 **A** TO GET IN THE FAMILY ROOM.
- 17 **Q** OKAY. WHERE THE TV WAS?
- 18 **A** YES.
- 19 Q OKAY. NOW, MR. DWIGHT AND MISS JANET ALSO TAUGHT
- 20 YOU TO RIDE YOUR BIKE, CORRECT?
- 21 MS. BLUTH: OBJECTION, RELEVANCE. BEYOND THE SCOPE OF --
- 22 MR. MANN: GOES TO HER INJURIES, YOUR HONOR.
- MS. BLUTH: WELL IT'S STILL BEYOND THE SCOPE.
- 24 **THE COURT:** WHAT INJURY?
- 25 MR. MANN: SHE'S TALKING ABOUT THE SCARING.

- 1 THE COURT: SUSTAINED. WE'RE NOT GOING TO REOPEN THAT
- 2 DOOR.
- 3 MR. MANN: OKAY.
- 4 O SO -- UM -- YOU ALSO SAID THAT YOU HAD TO ASK TO USE
- 5 THE BATHROOM; IS THAT RIGHT?
- 6 **A** YES.
- 7 O AND YOU ALSO INDICATED THAT IT WAS MISS JANET AND
- 8 MR. DWIGHT THAT SAID ALL YOU HAD TO DO -- OR THE BIGGEST
- 9 PROBLEM THAT YOU HAD WAS NOT OPENING YOUR MOUTH, CORRECT?
- 10 **A** YES.
- 11 Q SO THEY WANTED YOU TO OPEN YOUR MOUTH AND SAY THAT
- 12 YOU HAD TO USE THE BATHROOM, CORRECT?
- 13 **A** YES.
- 14 Q BUT YOU HAD ALSO SAID THAT YOU CHOSE NOT TO GO TO
- 15 THE BATHROOM WHEN YOU WERE ASKED TO GO TO THE BATHROOM,
- 16 CORRECT?
- 17 **A** YES.
- 18 THE COURT: HAVEN'T WE BEEN THROUGH ALL THIS? IS THIS --
- 19 IS THIS RECROSS OF SOMEBODY ELSE'S QUESTIONS?
- 20 **MR. MANN:** NO.
- 21 THE COURT: OKAY. BECAUSE I REMEMBER THIS --
- 22 MR. MANN: DURING --
- 23 THE COURT: -- EXACT LINE OF QUESTIONING --
- 24 MR. MANN: DURING --
- 25 THE COURT: -- FROM YOU MR. MANN.

- 1 MR. MANN: DURING DIRECT EXAM -- OR REDIRECT SHE HAD
- 2 ASKED -- UM -- MISS BLUTH HAD ASKED ABOUT --
- 3 THE COURT: THAT'S WHAT I'M ASKING, IF IT'S -- IF IT'S
- 4 RECROSS OF SOMEBODY'S --
- 5 MR. MANN: REDIRECT.
- 6 THE COURT: OKAY, REDIRECT OR -- GO AHEAD, WHAT -- POINT
- 7 TO IT.
- 8 MR. MANN: WELL --
- 9 THE COURT: BECAUSE -- I MEAN, I JUST SPECIFICALLY
- 10 REMEMBER THIS EXACT LINE OF QUESTIONING. SO WHAT DID
- 11 MISS BLUTH ASK, JUST REMIND ME. THERE'S A LOT GOING ON.
- 12 MR. MANN: I WROTE DOWN THAT SHE -- SHE ASKED, YOU KNOW,
- 13 DID YOU HAVE TO ASK TO USE THE BATHROOM.
- 14 THE COURT: OKAY. AND SO YOUR FOLLOW UP IS?
- 15 MR. MANN: IS A SERIES OF QUESTIONS ABOUT THAT PARTICULAR
- 16 QUESTION, ABOUT DID SHE HAVE TO ASK OR WAS THIS WHAT THEY
- 17 WANTED HER TO DO.
- 18 **MS. BLUTH:** MY --
- 19 MR. MANN: THEIR CONTENTION IS THAT IT'S CHILD ABUSE
- 20 BECAUSE SHE WAS FORCED TO HOLD HER BOWEL AND URINE. AND YET
- 21 WHAT I'M ASKING ABOUT, YOU KNOW, DID YOU HAVE TO ASK TO GO OR
- 22 DID THEY ASK YOU, HEY, GO AHEAD AND GO, I THINK THESE ARE VERY
- 23 RELEVANT QUESTIONS --
- 24 THE COURT: OKAY, HOLD ON.
- 25 MR. MANN: -- TO GET INTO.

- 1 THE COURT: CAN YOU TAKE AVA OUTSIDE?
- 2 MS. DASTRUP: UM-HUM.
- 3 THE COURT: SO THAT WAY WE DON'T -- WE CAN HAVE A BENCH
- 4 DISCUSSION WITHOUT ...
- 5 (WHEREUPON THE WITNESS LEFT THE COURTROOM.)
- 6 THE COURT: OKAY. LET'S -- WE'RE GOING TO KEEP A FEW
- 7 THINGS IN MIND. SHE'S 12.
- 8 MR. MANN: GOT IT.
- 9 THE COURT: THIS IS HOUR, I DON'T KNOW, FIVE OF
- 10 TESTIMONY. YOU HAD MUCH MORE LENGTHY CROSS-EXAMINATION THAN
- 11 EVEN DIRECT EXAMINATION YESTERDAY.
- 12 REDIRECT IS TRYING TO REDIRECT A WITNESS, WHICH
- 13 MISS BLUTH DID. I CAN AGREE THAT SHE HAS BEEN INCONSISTENT IN
- 14 HER STATEMENTS, BOTH ON DIRECT AND CROSS AND -- AND REDIRECT,
- 15 BUT I'M NOT GOING TO ALLOW YOU TO GO THROUGH THIS SAME LENGTHY
- 16 LINE OF QUESTIONING WITH HER. I THOUGHT SHE WAS VERY DETAILED
- 17 YESTERDAY. YOU HAVE SOME INCONSISTENT STATEMENTS, YOU DO, AND
- 18 YOU HAVE THAT TO RUN WITH AT TRIAL. BUT IT'S NOT -- IT --
- 19 IT'S -- I'M NOT GOING TO ALLOW THIS 12 YEAR OLD AT PRELIMINARY
- 20 HEARING, AND FRANKLY I KNOW YOU MIGHT DISAGREE WITH ME, BUT I
- 21 THINK I'VE GIVEN YOU A LOT OF LATITUDE. I'VE GIVEN YOU GUYS
- 22 MORE LATITUDE THAN I'VE GIVEN ANY TWEL -- THAT I'VE GIVEN THE
- 23 DEFENSE FOR A 12 YEAR OLD DURING A PRELIMINARY HEARING.
- 24 BUT AT THIS POINT I JUST FEEL IT'S CONTINUALLY ASKING HER
- 25 THE SAME QUESTIONS AND RECROSSING HER AND REDIRECTING HER OVER

- 1 THE SAME QUESTIONS. SO I JUST -- THESE EXACT QUESTIONS CAME
- 2 OUT ON CROSS-EXAMINATION, AND THEN MISS BLUTH REDIRECT, AND-
- 3 YOU DO HAVE SOME LIMITED ABILITY TO RECROSS, BUT YOU'RE NOT
- 4 GOING TO RECROSS HER ABOUT EVERYTHING THAT YOU CROSSED HER
- 5 ABOUT.
- 6 SO WHAT PART OF MISS BLUTH'S REDIRECT DO YOU WANT TO
- 7 ATTACK OR QUESTION?
- 8 MR. MANN: YOUR HONOR, YOU KNOW, I -- I THINK THERE IS
- 9 MORE THAN -- MISS BLUTH ASKED HER ABOUT -- BECAUSE WHEN I HAD
- 10 CROSSED HER, I HAD TALKED TO HER ABOUT THE TIMER --
- 11 **THE COURT:** UM-HUM.
- 12 MR. MANN: -- AND THOSE ISSUES THAT WOULD INDICATE A
- 13 NORMAL PATTERN OF WHEN SOMEONE WOULD HAVE TO GO TO THE
- 14 BATHROOM, AND SHE SPECIFICALLY SAID ON CROSS THAT SHE CHOSE

- 20 CUSTODY FOR TWO MONTHS.
- 21 MR. MUELLER: YOUR HONOR, I DON'T WANT TO SPLIT -- WELL,
- 22 I'LL SAVE THAT FOR CLOSING ARGUMENTS AND THE STATE OF THE
- 23 EVIDENCE.
- THE FACT OF THE MATTER IS, IS MR. SOLANDER IS SO
- 25 DEDICATED TO HIS CHILDREN HE WAS PAYING FOR PRIVATE BOARDING

- 1 SCHOOL. NOW, HE HAS THE ABILITY TO SUPPORT A FAMILY. HE'S
- 2 NOW NOT MAKING ANY INCOME, AND THERE'S GOING TO BE --
- 3 REGARDLESS OF WHEN HE GETS -- WHAT HAPPENS HERE, THE SOLANDER
- 4 FAMILY IS GOING TO BE DESTITUTE.
- 5 THE COURT: I WILL -- I WILL ALLOW YOU TO RENEW YOUR
- 6 MOTION. I'M NOT -- YOU KNOW, I DON'T WANT TO USE THE WORD
- 7 CONSIDER, BECAUSE SOMEBODY MIGHT TAKE THAT OUT OF CONTEXT, BUT
- 8 CERTAINLY GOING TO ALLOW YOU TO RENEW AND -- BY THE WAY, ANY
- 9 LAWYER -- ANY OF THE PARTIES, FOR THAT MATTER, AS I ALWAYS DO,
- 10 ALLOW TO RENEW A CUSTODY CHANGE MOTION AT ANY TIME, INCLUDING

- 21 I THINK WE WENT THROUGH THIS REGARDING THE DISCOVERY MOTIONS,
- 22 AND HOW THE STATE FAILED TO PROVIDE US, IN A TIMELY MANNER,
- 23 EVERYTHING UNDER 1965, NRS 171.1965 -- UH -- AND UNTIL VERY
- 24 RECENTLY DID WE ACTUALLY FINALLY RECEIVE THOSE ITEMS. I
- 25 BELIEVE IT WAS ABOUT TWO WEEKS AGO THAT WE FINALLY GOT ALL THE

- 1 ITEMS THAT WE HAD REQUESTED THAT WAS UNDER 1965.
- SO, FOR THE STATE TO SAY THAT IT WAS NEVER A STATE
- 3 CONTINUANCE IS NOT ACCURATE, BECAUSE WE WERE FORCED TO REQUEST
- 4 A CONTINUANCE BASED ON THE STATE FAILING TO GIVE US WHAT WE
- 5 ARE ORDERED TO GIVE -- ORDERED TO RECEIVE UNDER 1965.

- 18 MR. RUE: THANK YOU, YOUR HONOR.
