ORDER DENYING MOTION

Appellants have filed a motion requesting that this court order attorney Perry Fallick of The Morelli Law Firm to transmit a video to this court, and for the MGM to provide this court with security video footage. This court's rules allow a party to file a motion requesting that this court direct the district court clerk to transmit original court exhibits upon demonstration that the exhibits are relevant to the issues raised on appeal, and that this court's review of the exhibits is necessary to the determination of the issues. NRAP 30(d). Here, appellants erroneously seek transmittal of videos from a third party and a respondent. Further, appellants fail to demonstrate that the videos were considered by the district court, are part of the record on appeal, and are relevant and necessary to the determination of the issues. See id.; Carson Ready Mix v. First Nat'l Bank, 97 Nev. 474, 476, 635 P.2d 276, 277 (1981) (this court's review is limited to the record

made in and considered by the district court); NRAP 10. Accordingly, the motion is denied.

It is so ORDERED.
