DECLARATION OF BRAD D. LEVENSON

- I, Brad D. Levenson, declare as follows:
- 1. I am an attorney at law, admitted to practice before this

 Court and employed by the Capital Habeas Unit of the Federal Public

 Defender, District of Nevada. I am assigned to represent James Montell

 Chappell in this matter.
- 2. The Appellant's Opening Brief in this case is currently due on January 18, 2019. I am seeking an extension of time of ninety (90) days, up to and including April 18, 2019, within which to file and serve this Brief.
- 3. I am requesting a ninety-day extension because I have not had adequate time to prepare Mr. Chappell's Opening Brief. The majority of my time since October 2018 was dedicated to preparing a capital federal habeas petition in *Johnson v. Ryan*, 2:18-cv-00889-SPL, which had a federal statutory filing deadline of December 20, 2018. I also filed an opening brief in this Court in *Bejarano v. Gittere*, Case No. 76629, on December 6, 2018. On December 3, 2019, I was appointed to the federal trial case of *USA v. Schlesinger*, 4:18-cr-02719-RCC-BGM, a

death qualified case from the District of Arizona. To that end, I have made four trips to Tucson, Arizona, since December 3, including two court appearances. Due to these deadlines in other capital cases, I will be unable to meet the deadline in Mr. Chappell's case.

- 4. Further, during the next ninety days, I have a Ninth Circuit argument in San Francisco in *Floyd v. Filson*, Case No. 14-99012, scheduled for January 31, 2019; an opening Ninth Circuit brief in *Hogan v. Filson*, Case No. 18-99004, due on February 12, 2019; and various deadlines in *USA v. Schlesinger* during the month of February 2019.
- 5. Based upon the above, I believe that with a ninety-day extension, I will be able to complete the Opening Brief.
- 6. The additional time requested here is necessary for me to devote the attention required to competently represent Mr. Chappell.
- 7. This request is not made solely for the purpose of delay, or for any other improper purpose, but only to ensure that this office provides competent representation to Mr. Chappell. Nev. R. Prof. Conduct 1.1.
