This matter having come on for hearing on the 10th day of October, 2018, before the Honorable Judge Jerry Wiese, on Defendant R & O CONSTRUCTION, INC.'s ("R&O") MOTION TO DISMISS; Plaintiffs appearing by and through their counsel J. Colby Williams, Esq., and Philip R. Erwin, Esq., of Campbell & Williams; Defendant R&O appearing by and through its counsel Jeffrey S. Vail, Esq. and Brett M. Godfrey, Esq., of Godfrey | Johnson, P.C., and Defendants TOM WELCH, ORLUFF OPHEIKENS, CHET OPHEIKENS, AND SLADE OPHEIKENS (collectively "The Individual Defendants") appearing by and through their counsel Max E. Corrick, II, Esq. and John E. Gormley, Esq., of Olson, Cannon, Gormley, Angulo, and Stoberski, who also represent R&O in this matter.

The Court having considered the papers, pleadings, and oral arguments, orders as follows:

- Plaintiffs filed their Third Amended Complaint on July 30, 2018, which asserted in its
 Third Cause of Action a single claim for relief against R&O for Reverse Piercing of the
 Corporate Veil.
- 2. Defendant R&O has filed a Motion to Dismiss this sole claim for relief against R&O pursuant to NRCP 12(b)(5), asserting, *inter alia*, that Plaintiffs had failed to properly

state an *alter ego* claim under NRS § 78.747, and that a pre-judgment claim for relief for reverse piercing of the corporate veil is impermissible under the circumstances presented in this case. The Individual Defendants filed a timely joinder to R&O's Motion. An Opposition was timely filed by Plaintiffs, and R&O and The Individual Defendants filed their respective Replies.

- 3. Additionally, at oral argument, R&O's counsel moved for the Court to grant their pending Motion to Associate, and thereby to appear before this Court pro hac vice. Plaintiffs did not oppose that Motion. The Court grants the pending Motion to Associate.
- 4. Pursuant to LFC Marketing Group, Inc. v. Loomis, 116 Nev. 896, 8 P.3d 841 (2000), NRS 78.747, and because Plaintiffs' sole claim for relief against R&O does not allege negligence or any other wrongful conduct by R&O and will, therefore, confuse the jury, Plaintiffs are barred from asserting their claim of relief for reverse piercing of the corporate veil against R&O prior to an uncollectible judgment being entered in this case against Orluff Opheikens.
- 5. Accordingly, the Court finds that Plaintiffs have failed to state a claim against R&O upon which relief may be granted. The Court specifically notes that it has not considered any exhibit to any filing related to R&O's Motion in reaching its conclusion. Therefore, the Court grants R&O's Motion to Dismiss Plaintiffs' Third Cause of Action pursuant to NRCP 12(b)(5) without prejudice.

WHEREFORE, it is hereby ordered, adjudged and decreed that R & O Construction, Inc.'s Motion to Dismiss is granted without prejudice, and its Motion to Associate is granted. Furthermore, there being no just reason for delay, this Court determines, directs and certifies that final judgment is entered in favor of R&O pursuant to NRCP 54(b).

This case arises from the severe non-fatal drowning of six-year old Leland Gardner on May 27, 2015 in the wave pool at the Cowabunga Bay water park in Henderson, Nevada. The Gardners

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have asserted claims for negligence against Defendants Henderson Water Park, LLC, Orluff Opheikens, Slade Opheikens, Chet Opheikens, Tom Welch, Shane Huish, Scott Huish and Craig Huish (collectively referred to as the "Individual Defendants"). The Gardners have also asserted claims under the alter ego doctrine against Henderson Water Park, LLC, West Coast Water Parks, LLC, Double Ott Water Holdings, LLC, and the Individual Defendants.

On July 30, 2018, the Gardners filed their Third Amended Complaint and named R&O Construction, Inc. ("R&O") as an alter ego defendant only under a reverse veil-piercing theory premised on the Gardners' negligence claim against Orluff Opheikens. On October 23, 2018, the district court granted R&O's Motion to Dismiss on grounds that the Gardners are barred from asserting a reverse veil-piercing claim under the alter ego doctrine prior to the entry of an uncollectible judgment against Orluff Opheikens. As a result, the district court dismissed R&O as a defendant from the action. The district court granted NRCP 54(b) certification of its order and the Gardners commenced the instant appeal.

Gardner on Behalf of L.G. v. Eighth Judicial District Court, Supreme Court No. 70823

The Gardners filed an original writ proceeding in the Supreme Court regarding the denial of their motion for leave to amend in which the Gardners sought to assert direct claims for negligence against the Individual Defendants who served on Henderson Water Park, LLC's Management Committee and plead allegations related to the alter ego doctrine. The district court denied the Gardners' motion for leave to amend on grounds that the Individual Defendants were immune from any liability under NRS 86.371 and NRS 86.381. The district court also denied leave to amend to assert alter ego allegations on grounds that the alter ego doctrine does not apply to LLCs.

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The Supreme Court granted the Gardners' writ petition in its entirety. See Gardner on Behalf of L.G.
v. Eighth Judicial District Court, 405 P.3d 651 (Nev. 2017).

Following the district court's denial of the Gardners' motion for leave to amend to assert direct claims for negligence against the Individual Defendants, the district court granted Defendants' motion for summary judgment as to Defendants West Coast Water Parks, LLC and Double Ott Water Holdings, LLC on grounds that the member-LLCs of Henderson Water Park, LLC were immune from any liability under NRS 86.371 and NRS 86.381. The Gardners appealed the district court's ruling to the Supreme Court. Although the Supreme Court held that (contrary to the district court's ruling) NRS 86.371 and NRS 86.381 do not shield LLC members from liability for personal negligence, the Supreme Court denied the Gardners' appeal on grounds that they had not pleaded sufficient allegations that the member-LLCs of Henderson Water Park, LLC were personally negligent. *See Gardner v. Henderson Water Park, LLC*, 399 P.3d 350 (Nev. 2017).

This matter having come on for hearing on the 10th day of October, 2018, before the Honorable Judge Jerry Wiese, on Defendant R & O CONSTRUCTION, INC.'s ("R&O") MOTION TO DISMISS; Plaintiffs appearing by and through their counsel J. Colby Williams, Esq., and Philip R. Erwin, Esq., of Campbell & Williams; Defendant R&O appearing by and through its counsel Jeffrey S. Vail, Esq. and Brett M. Godfrey, Esq., of Godfrey | Johnson, P.C., and Defendants TOM WELCH, ORLUFF OPHEIKENS, CHET OPHEIKENS, AND SLADE OPHEIKENS (collectively "The Individual Defendants") appearing by and through their counsel Max E. Corrick, II, Esq. and John E. Gormley, Esq., of Olson, Cannon, Gormley, Angulo, and Stoberski, who also represent R&O in this matter.

The Court having considered the papers, pleadings, and oral arguments, orders as follows:

- Plaintiffs filed their Third Amended Complaint on July 30, 2018, which asserted in its
 Third Cause of Action a single claim for relief against R&O for Reverse Piercing of the
 Corporate Veil.
- 2. Defendant R&O has filed a Motion to Dismiss this sole claim for relief against R&O pursuant to NRCP 12(b)(5), asserting, *inter alia*, that Plaintiffs had failed to properly

state an *alter ego* claim under NRS § 78.747, and that a pre-judgment claim for relief for reverse piercing of the corporate veil is impermissible under the circumstances presented in this case. The Individual Defendants filed a timely joinder to R&O's Motion. An Opposition was timely filed by Plaintiffs, and R&O and The Individual Defendants filed their respective Replies.

- 3. Additionally, at oral argument, R&O's counsel moved for the Court to grant their pending Motion to Associate, and thereby to appear before this Court pro hac vice. Plaintiffs did not oppose that Motion. The Court grants the pending Motion to Associate.
- 4. Pursuant to LFC Marketing Group, Inc. v. Loomis, 116 Nev. 896, 8 P.3d 841 (2000), NRS 78.747, and because Plaintiffs' sole claim for relief against R&O does not allege negligence or any other wrongful conduct by R&O and will, therefore, confuse the jury, Plaintiffs are barred from asserting their claim of relief for reverse piercing of the corporate veil against R&O prior to an uncollectible judgment being entered in this case against Orluff Opheikens.
- 5. Accordingly, the Court finds that Plaintiffs have failed to state a claim against R&O upon which relief may be granted. The Court specifically notes that it has not considered any exhibit to any filing related to R&O's Motion in reaching its conclusion. Therefore, the Court grants R&O's Motion to Dismiss Plaintiffs' Third Cause of Action pursuant to NRCP 12(b)(5) without prejudice.

WHEREFORE, it is hereby ordered, adjudged and decreed that R & O Construction, Inc.'s Motion to Dismiss is granted without prejudice, and its Motion to Associate is granted. Furthermore, there being no just reason for delay, this Court determines, directs and certifies that final judgment is entered in favor of R&O pursuant to NRCP 54(b).

Mr. Eisinger explained the language inserted in the proposed order, noting page 49 of the transcript of the March 18th hearing. Mr. Mirkovich referred the Court to page 46, line 21. Plaintiff seeks to add various individuals, who make up the Defendant's Management Committee, as Defendants. Plaintiff argues that LLC protection applies to contractual claims, but not necessarily tort claims, and the claims that Plaintiff wants to assert against these new Defendants are strictly tort claims. Further, Plaintiff argues that the alter-ego doctrine should be applied to LLCs, based in part on the case of In re Giampetro, 317 B.R. 841, 845 (Bankr, D.Nev. 2004). In that case, the Bankruptcy Court believed it would be highly likely that the Nevada Courts would extend the alter ego doctrine to members of LLCs. This Court finds that the Nevada Revised Statutes protect members of an LLC, not only from debts incurred by an LLC, but also liabilities incurred by the LLC. NRS 86.371 indicates that . . . no member or manager of any limited-liability company formed under the laws of this State is individually liable for the debts or liabilities of the company. (emphasis added). Further, although the Nevada corporation statutes include an alter ego exception to the corporate protections, the LLC statutes do not contain a similar exception, creating a negative inference that the Nevada legislature did not intend for it to apply to LLCs. (Suing the Man Behind the Curtain: Can Nevada LLC Members be Liable Under the Alter Ego Doctrine? by Ryan Lower, Esq., Nevada Lawyer, November, 2014, pg. 16, citing to Dep t of Taxation v. DaimlerChrysler, 121 Nev. 541, 548, 119 P.3d 135, 139 [2005]). This Court concludes that the requested amendment and inclusion of the individuals who make up the Defendant's Management Committee would be futile, as such individuals are improper Defendants. Consequently, the Motion for Leave to Amend is hereby DENIED without prejudice. Defense counsel is to prepare an Order consistent with the foregoing, have it approved as to form and content by all counsel, and submit it to the Court within 10 days.;

The above-referenced matter came on for hearing before Judge Jerry A. Wiese II, on Tuesday, September 6, 2016, with regard to Plaintiffs Motion for Reconsideration of Order Affirming Discovery Commissioner's March 2, 2016 Report and Recommendations, or in the Alternative, for Order Setting Ribeiro Hearing. The parties were represented by counsel, and after reviewing all relevant pleadings and papers, the Court heard oral argument, and then reserved ruling. The Court now enters its ruling and finds and concludes the following: As a brief summary, Discovery Commissioner Bulla entered a Report and Recommendation following a March 2, 2016, hearing, with regard to a Motion to Quash and Motion for Protective Order. Commissioner Bulla recommended in detail exactly what information was discoverable and what information was not discoverable. Subsequently, on March 18, 2016, Judge Gonzalez, (as Acting Discovery Commissioner), heard argument with regard to a Motion to Compel, and Judge Gonzalez recommended that Defendant's objections to Plaintiffs Requests for Production were waived. On March 24, 2016, this Court held a hearing with regard to Plaintiff s Objection to the Discovery Commissioner s March 2, 2016, Report and Recommendation. This Court concluded that Commissioner Bulla analyzed the specific discovery dispute and came to a reasoned and rational decision. The Court further found that Acting Discovery Commissioner Gonzalez improperly sanctioned the Defendants by recommending that their objections to Requests for Production were waived, without a Ribeiro hearing. (Young v. Johnny Ribeiro, 106 Nev. 88, 787 P.2d 777 [1990]). The Plaintiff now argues that the Court erred in ruling that Acting Discovery Commissioner's March 2, 2016, ruling was improper without a Ribeiro hearing. Plaintiffs argue that the Court should reconsider its prior decision, or in the alternative, schedule a Ribeiro hearing. Having considered all of the papers and pleadings on file, and the oral arguments of counsel, this Court concludes that it did err in concluding that Acting Discovery Commissioner Gonzalez erred in failing to conduct a Ribeiro hearing. In fact, this Court agrees with Plaintiffs that a Ribeiro hearing is only required when the Court imposes a case-terminating sanction pursuant to NRCP 37. Because Acting Discovery Commissioner Gonzalez did not issue a case terminating sanction, but instead issued a sanction consisting of a waiver of discovery objections, a Ribeiro Hearing was not required. The Court notes that although NRCP 33 includes a waiver clause, (Any ground not stated in a timely objection is waived unless the party s failure to object is excused by the court for good cause shown NRCP 33[b][4]), NRCP 34 does not include a similar clause, and consequently, there is no mandatory waiver pursuant to NRCP 34. NRCP 34 indicates that The party upon whom the request is served shall serve a written response within 30 days after the service of the request. A shorter or longer time may be directed by the court. . . . (NRCP 34 [b]). When Acting Discovery Commissioner Gonzalez entered her Report and Recommendation, following the March 18, 2016, hearing, she impliedly overruled Discovery Commissioner Bulla s Report and Recommendation following the March 2, 2016, hearing. Such action was improper because Discovery Commissioners are not to overrule each other. This Court finds and concludes that Discovery Commissioner Bulla's Report and Recommendation following the March 2, 2016, hearing, was well reasoned, was based on substantial evidence, and was not an abuse of her discretion. The Court finds that Acting Discovery Commissioner Gonzalez s subsequent Report and Recommendation which impliedly overruled Commissioner Bulla's Report and Recommendation was improper, and an abuse of her discretion (as an Acting Discovery Commissioner). Consequently, this Court affirms Commissioner Bulla s Report following the March 2, 2016, hearing, and the findings and recommendations set forth at the March 2, 2016, hearing, and reiterated on April 20, 2016, are affirmed and adopted. Acting Discovery Commissioner Gonzalez's Report and Recommendation following the March 18, 2016 hearing, to the extent inconsistent with Commissioner Bulla's decisions, is hereby rejected or overruled. Based upon the foregoing, this Court hereby DENIES the Plaintiffs Motion for Reconsideration, as well as the alternative request for a Ribeiro hearing. The Court does, however, modify the basis for its denial, consistent with the rationale set forth in this Minute Order. 

This matter having come on for hearing on the 10th day of October, 2018, before the Honorable Judge Jerry Wiese, on Defendant R & O CONSTRUCTION, INC.'s ("R&O") MOTION TO DISMISS; Plaintiffs appearing by and through their counsel J. Colby Williams, Esq., and Philip R. Erwin, Esq., of Campbell & Williams; Defendant R&O appearing by and through its counsel Jeffrey S. Vail, Esq. and Brett M. Godfrey, Esq., of Godfrey | Johnson, P.C., and Defendants TOM WELCH, ORLUFF OPHEIKENS, CHET OPHEIKENS, AND SLADE OPHEIKENS (collectively "The Individual Defendants") appearing by and through their counsel Max E. Corrick, II, Esq. and John E. Gormley, Esq., of Olson, Cannon, Gormley, Angulo, and Stoberski, who also represent R&O in this matter.

The Court having considered the papers, pleadings, and oral arguments, orders as follows:

- Plaintiffs filed their Third Amended Complaint on July 30, 2018, which asserted in its Third Cause of Action a single claim for relief against R&O for Reverse Piercing of the Corporate Veil.
- 2. Defendant R&O has filed a Motion to Dismiss this sole claim for relief against R&O pursuant to NRCP 12(b)(5), asserting, *inter alia*, that Plaintiffs had failed to properly

state an *alter ego* claim under NRS § 78.747, and that a pre-judgment claim for relief for reverse piercing of the corporate veil is impermissible under the circumstances presented in this case. The Individual Defendants filed a timely joinder to R&O's Motion. An Opposition was timely filed by Plaintiffs, and R&O and The Individual Defendants filed their respective Replies.

- 3. Additionally, at oral argument, R&O's counsel moved for the Court to grant their pending Motion to Associate, and thereby to appear before this Court pro hac vice. Plaintiffs did not oppose that Motion. The Court grants the pending Motion to Associate.
- 4. Pursuant to *LFC Marketing Group, Inc. v. Loomis*, 116 Nev. 896, 8 P.3d 841 (2000), NRS 78.747, and because Plaintiffs' sole claim for relief against R&O does not allege negligence or any other wrongful conduct by R&O and will, therefore, confuse the jury, Plaintiffs are barred from asserting their claim of relief for reverse piercing of the corporate veil against R&O prior to an uncollectible judgment being entered in this case against Orluff Opheikens.
- 5. Accordingly, the Court finds that Plaintiffs have failed to state a claim against R&O upon which relief may be granted. The Court specifically notes that it has not considered any exhibit to any filing related to R&O's Motion in reaching its conclusion. Therefore, the Court grants R&O's Motion to Dismiss Plaintiffs' Third Cause of Action pursuant to NRCP 12(b)(5) without prejudice.

WHEREFORE, it is hereby ordered, adjudged and decreed that R & O Construction, Inc.'s Motion to Dismiss is granted without prejudice, and its Motion to Associate is granted. Furthermore, there being no just reason for delay, this Court determines, directs and certifies that final judgment is entered in favor of R&O pursuant to NRCP 54(b).

This matter having come on for hearing on the 10th day of October, 2018, before the Honorable Judge Jerry Wiese, on Defendant R & O CONSTRUCTION, INC.'s ("R&O") MOTION TO DISMISS; Plaintiffs appearing by and through their counsel J. Colby Williams, Esq., and Philip R. Erwin, Esq., of Campbell & Williams; Defendant R&O appearing by and through its counsel Jeffrey S. Vail, Esq. and Brett M. Godfrey, Esq., of Godfrey | Johnson, P.C., and Defendants TOM WELCH, ORLUFF OPHEIKENS, CHET OPHEIKENS, AND SLADE OPHEIKENS (collectively "The Individual Defendants") appearing by and through their counsel Max E. Corrick, II, Esq. and John E. Gormley, Esq., of Olson, Cannon, Gormley, Angulo, and Stoberski, who also represent R&O in this matter.

The Court having considered the papers, pleadings, and oral arguments, orders as follows:

- Plaintiffs filed their Third Amended Complaint on July 30, 2018, which asserted in its
 Third Cause of Action a single claim for relief against R&O for Reverse Piercing of the
 Corporate Veil.
- 2. Defendant R&O has filed a Motion to Dismiss this sole claim for relief against R&O pursuant to NRCP 12(b)(5), asserting, *inter alia*, that Plaintiffs had failed to properly

state an *alter ego* claim under NRS § 78.747, and that a pre-judgment claim for relief for reverse piercing of the corporate veil is impermissible under the circumstances presented in this case. The Individual Defendants filed a timely joinder to R&O's Motion. An Opposition was timely filed by Plaintiffs, and R&O and The Individual Defendants filed their respective Replies.

- 3. Additionally, at oral argument, R&O's counsel moved for the Court to grant their pending Motion to Associate, and thereby to appear before this Court pro hac vice. Plaintiffs did not oppose that Motion. The Court grants the pending Motion to Associate.
- 4. Pursuant to LFC Marketing Group, Inc. v. Loomis, 116 Nev. 896, 8 P.3d 841 (2000), NRS 78.747, and because Plaintiffs' sole claim for relief against R&O does not allege negligence or any other wrongful conduct by R&O and will, therefore, confuse the jury, Plaintiffs are barred from asserting their claim of relief for reverse piercing of the corporate veil against R&O prior to an uncollectible judgment being entered in this case against Orluff Opheikens.
- 5. Accordingly, the Court finds that Plaintiffs have failed to state a claim against R&O upon which relief may be granted. The Court specifically notes that it has not considered any exhibit to any filing related to R&O's Motion in reaching its conclusion. Therefore, the Court grants R&O's Motion to Dismiss Plaintiffs' Third Cause of Action pursuant to NRCP 12(b)(5) without prejudice.

WHEREFORE, it is hereby ordered, adjudged and decreed that R & O Construction, Inc.'s Motion to Dismiss is granted without prejudice, and its Motion to Associate is granted. Furthermore, there being no just reason for delay, this Court determines, directs and certifies that final judgment is entered in favor of R&O pursuant to NRCP 54(b).

Court understands there is a dispute on the Report and Recommendation and parties were referred by the Discovery Commissioner for clarification. Court acknowledged receipt of the proposed Report and Recommendation sent over by Mr. Eisinger; copy printed for Mr. Campbell. Mr. Eisinger explained the language inserted in the proposed order, noting page 49 of the transcript of the March 18th hearing. Mr. Mirkovich referred the Court to page 46, line 21. Court confirmed it had waived the objections that were, as Mr. Eisinger had stated, vague, ambiguous, overbroad, and compound, as they were identified in the answers. Court noted it had overruled all the objections to that particular one; Court understands counsel thinks those are confidential, but the Court does not believe a confidentiality clause by one of Defendant's representatives will preclude production of the information; counsel may submit an order requiring that be produced.

Mr. Eisinger further argued Commissioner Bulla ruled in the Defendants favor before parties came before this Court and there was no objection by the Plaintiff; an extension was later obtained for Plaintiff to do an objection to Judge Wiese; yesterday, Commissioner Bulla reaffirmed her position on the confidentiality of those documents; they have done a privilege log; he also does not recall any discussion with this Court on RFP no. 26.

Court noted the request relates to lifeguard training, the subject incident, and/or staffing. Mr. Eisinger explained the distinction with Commissioner Bulla's ruling is that those types of communications between the Defendant and Ms. Bradley, their publicist, are privileged. Court NOTED, it had previously made the determination in the CityCenter case regarding Sitrick & Bunting that the PR people who are available to assist were not privileged; a writ went up to the Supreme Court, and a writ did not issue from them; the request here relates to the subject incident, lifeguard training, and/or staffing, and they are relevant to the inquiry, which in this particular incident is narrowly tailored.

- The above-referenced matter came on for hearing before Judge Jerry Wiese on Thursday, June 16, 2016, with regard to Plaintiff's Motion for Leave to File Amended Complaint. Plaintiff seeks to add various individuals, who make up the Defendant's Management Committee, as Defendants. Plaintiff argues that LLC protection applies to contractual claims, but not necessarily tort claims, and the claims that Plaintiff wants to assert against these new Defendants are strictly tort claims. Further, Plaintiff argues that the alter-ego doctrine should be applied to LLCs, based in part on the case of In re Giampetro, 317 B.R. 841, 845 (Bankr.D.Nev. 2004). In that case, the Bankruptcy Court believed it would be highly likely that the Nevada Courts would extend the alter ego doctrine to members of LLCs.

This Court finds that the Nevada Revised Statutes protect members of an LLC, not only from debts incurred by an LLC, but also liabilities incurred by the LLC. NRS 86.371 indicates that . . . no member or manager of any limited-liability company formed under the laws of this State is individually liable for the debts or liabilities of the company. (emphasis added). Further, although the Nevada corporation statutes include an alter ego exception to the corporate protections, the LLC statutes do not contain a similar exception, creating a negative inference that the Nevada legislature

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did not intend for it to apply to LLCs. (Suing the Man Behind the Curtain: Can Nevada LLC Members be Liable Under the Alter Ego Doctrine? by Ryan Lower, Esq., Nevada Lawyer, November, 2014, pg. 16, citing to Dep t of Taxation v. DaimlerChrysler, 121 Nev. 541, 548, 119 P.3d 135, 139 [2005]).

This Court concludes that the requested amendment and inclusion of the individuals who make up the Defendant's Management Committee would be futile, as such individuals are improper Defendants. Consequently, the Motion for Leave to Amend is hereby DENIED without prejudice.

Defense counsel is to prepare an Order consistent with the foregoing, have it approved as to form and content by all counsel, and submit it to the Court within 10 days.

The above-referenced matter came on for hearing before Judge Jerry A. Wiese II, on Tuesday, September 6, 2016, with regard to Plaintiffs Motion for Reconsideration of Order Affirming Discovery Commissioner s March 2, 2016 Report and Recommendations, or in the Alternative, for Order Setting Ribeiro Hearing. The parties were represented by counsel, and after reviewing all relevant pleadings and papers, the Court heard oral argument, and then reserved ruling. The Court

As a brief summary, Discovery Commissioner Bulla entered a Report and Recommendation following a March 2, 2016, hearing, with regard to a Motion to Quash and Motion for Protective Order. Commissioner Bulla recommended in detail exactly what information was discoverable and what information was not discoverable. Subsequently, on March 18, 2016, Judge Gonzalez, (as Acting Discovery Commissioner), heard argument with regard to a Motion to Compel, and Judge Gonzalez recommended that Defendant's objections to Plaintiffs Requests for Production were waived. On March 24, 2016, this Court held a hearing with regard to Plaintiff's Objection to the Discovery Commissioner's March 2, 2016, Report and Recommendation. This Court concluded that Commissioner Bulla analyzed the specific discovery dispute and came to a reasoned and rational decision. The Court further found that Acting Discovery Commissioner Gonzalez improperly sanctioned the Defendants by recommending that their objections to Requests for Production were

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waived, without a Ribeiro hearing. (Young v. Johnny Ribeiro, 106 Nev. 88, 787 P.2d 777 [1990]). The Plaintiff now argues that the Court erred in ruling that Acting Discovery Commissioner's March 2, 2016, ruling was improper without a Ribeiro hearing. Plaintiffs argue that the Court should reconsider its prior decision, or in the alternative, schedule a Ribeiro hearing.

Having considered all of the papers and pleadings on file, and the oral arguments of counsel, this Court concludes that it did err in concluding that Acting Discovery Commissioner Gonzalez erred in failing to conduct a Ribeiro hearing. In fact, this Court agrees with Plaintiffs that a Ribeiro hearing is only required when the Court imposes a case-terminating sanction pursuant to NRCP 37. Because Acting Discovery Commissioner Gonzalez did not issue a case terminating sanction, but instead issued a sanction consisting of a waiver of discovery objections, a Ribeiro Hearing was not required.

The Court notes that although NRCP 33 includes a waiver clause, (Any ground not stated in a timely objection is waived unless the party s failure to object is excused by the court for good cause shown NRCP 33[b][4]), NRCP 34 does not include a similar clause, and consequently, there is no mandatory waiver pursuant to NRCP 34. NRCP 34 indicates that The party upon whom the request is served shall serve a written response within 30 days after the service of the request. A shorter or longer time may be directed by the court. . . . (NRCP 34[b]).

When Acting Discovery Commissioner Gonzalez entered her Report and Recommendation, following the March 18, 2016, hearing, she impliedly overruled Discovery Commissioner Bulla s Report and Recommendation following the March 2, 2016, hearing. Such action was improper because Discovery Commissioners are not to overrule each other. This Court finds and concludes that Discovery Commissioner Bulla s Report and Recommendation following the March 2, 2016, hearing, was well reasoned, was based on substantial evidence, and was not an abuse of her discretion. The Court finds that Acting Discovery Commissioner Gonzalez s subsequent Report and Recommendation which impliedly overruled Commissioner Bulla s Report and Recommendation was improper, and an abuse of her discretion (as an Acting Discovery Commissioner). Consequently, this Court affirms Commissioner Bulla s Report following the March 2, 2016, hearing, and the findings and recommendations set forth at the March 2, 2016, hearing, and reiterated on April 20, 2016, are affirmed and adopted. Acting Discovery Commissioner Gonzalez s Report and Recommendation following the March 18, 2016 hearing, to the extent inconsistent with Commissioner Bulla s decisions, is hereby rejected or overruled.

Based upon the foregoing, this Court hereby DENIES the Plaintiffs Motion for Reconsideration, as well as the alternative request for a Ribeiro hearing. The Court does, however, modify the basis for its denial, consistent with the rationale set forth in this Minute Order. If the Plaintiffs seek a sanction against the Defendant for its alleged untimely responses to Requests for Production, pursuant to NRCP 34, and/or NRCP 37, a Motion should be filed with Discovery Commissioner Bulla, as she would potentially be able to modify her own previous Report and Recommendation if she believes such modification would be appropriate.

Defense counsel is to prepare an Order consistent with this Minute Order, submit it to opposing counsel for approval as to form and content, and then submit it to this Court within 10 days for signature.
