REASON FOR REFERRAL:

Attorney Diefenbach requested an evaluation of Mr. Stanley in regards to criminal mitigation. An earlier referral was made regarding criminal responsibility.

CRIMINAL CHARGES:

Mr. Stanley is charged with two counts of robbery, one count of attempted robbery, two counts of burglary, one count of attempted murder with the use of a deadly weapon, one count of grand larceny auto, one count of larceny of a person, and one count of attempted grand larceny auto.

According to the police report on October 25, 2001, Mr. Billy Barber became the victim of robbery, larceny from a person, and grand larceny auto. Mr. Barber was at the gas station when Mr. Stanley approached him, grabbed his wallet, and took off running. Mr. Barber then followed Mr. Stanley in his vehicle. Mr. Cullinane also chased Mr. Stanley on foot. Mr. Barber eventually caught up to Mr. Stanley, whereby he requested his wallet. Mr. Stanley stated that he had given the wallet to the guy who was chasing him. Mr. Barber was getting out of his van when Mr. Stanley grabbed him by his right arm, pulled him out of the van, punched him, and left with the vehicle. Mr. Cullinane returned Mr. Barber's wallet, which had \$500.00 missing. Approximately four hours later, Dianne Baptist, manager of the High Hat Regency Motel, became the victim of attempted murder. She reported that Mr. Stanley had lived there several days prior. He wanted his property, and a verbal dispute ensued. Mr. Stanley squirted gasoline on Ms. Baptist and then lit her on fire. Mr. Stanley then left the area. Approximately one hour later Mr. Stanley went to the Budget Motel, where he had been a previous resident. He demanded money back from his deposit for the motel key. Mrs. Ball reported he had already had obtained his money back. Mr. Stanley became angry, kicked the door, punched the glass partition, and began to punch Mrs. Ball in the face and chest with a closed fist. Mr. Stanley then stole money from the register and ran. Several minutes later Mr. Carl Williams became the victim of an attempted robbery and attempted grand larceny auto. Mr. Stanley approached the vehicle and tried to pull Mr. Williams out of the vehicle. He was unsuccessful and Mr. Stanley then ran away. Mr. Stanley was taken into custody at Main and Freemont, in front of the Plaza hotel and Casino.
