They were wearing the gloves, same gloves, same color bandanas. Their movements, the way they moved were similar.

- Q In your time as a robbery detective on the robbery unit, about how many robbery series do you think you worked?
- A I would say four or five series as far as when they're multiple.

THE COURT: Okay. And then in cross by Ms. Lobo in the same area, the questioning was to the point where he indicated he was always willing to speak, but then her question was well, if that wasn't the information related to

them, it would have been incorrect information. So that's where that was left, and he said yes.

So I guess, what I'm -- what I've asked Mr. Cottner here for is to explain to the Court specifically what information you indicated to him or what you informed him or what you informed --

MR. COTTNER: Just lay it all out?

MR. COTTNER: All right. At one point, I believe, Lance and Mr. -- or Mr. Tanasi and Mr. Maningo reached out to me about would he be willing to, and I spoke to him, and he said he would be willing to.

We were trying to find a date to work on it, and the closer it got, the more I kind of realized, I mean, let's be honest here, his -- he wants to please the State with his testimony and being truthful and everything. And it was my choice and my advice to him that, hey, I don't think it is in your best interest with how you've aligned yourself to ever open yourself up to an interview like that. And that's what we discussed.

Before we bring the jury back in, did the parties want to make a record as to the objections that were made yesterday?

MR. MANINGO: We do, Your Honor.

MS. LOBO: Yeah, Your Honor, I'll handle it for us. There was an objection that was lodged by Mr. Maningo and I believe, Mr. Tanasi was joining in. There were a number of statements. I went through it in my notes and I looked at them.

The ones that I can pick out was that Brandon wore this particular jacket every day, the one that was depicted in the arrest photo. That the breaking -- the break happened in the sequence of robberies because it was stupid and that Brandon and Tony, he attributes, he doesn't know which one said the statement, that they got lucky every time he didn't go.

The next statement is that they started back because there was more money being taken, more money at the

restaurants. The next statement was that Brandon and Tony, one of them told him that Popeye's has the most money.

Brandon and Tony got a Ruger later on. And that now the most recent one was that Brandon was bleeding from a cut that he sustained through a breaking of one of the windows at one of the restaurants.

2.3

All of these statements had not been turned over to the defense. We inquired at the bench whether or not these were in writing, and if they were in writing, we would be entitled to them. If they weren't in writing, then necessarily they don't have to be turned over.

There was a discussion about whether or not this was Brady material. And at this point, it's our position that it's not necessarily -- it's not exculpatory because it's being presented by the State in the trial, but it definitely could have possibly led to exculpatory information, if handed over prior, or possibly to impeachment information. But we didn't know this until the testimony was unfolding.

At this point, for the record, we would be moving for a continuance, if there is a written statement, in fact. I understand we're not entitled to their notes, but if there is a written or recorded statement, that we would be entitled to it.

THE COURT: State, did you want to respond?

MR. PORTZ: And Your Honor, I think you addressed it at the bench yesterday that they haven't really cited to any sort of obligation by the State to hand over these statements. There was no recorded statement so I think that addresses their concern. There's no written statement, which I think addresses their concern as well.

And they were free to pretrial any and all witnesses noticed in this case, including Donte Johns. So the fact that he stated some things that -- in his testimony that were never written or recorded statements that would be obligated to hand it over and were not exculpatory are not a grounds for continuance nor is it a discovery violation of the statutes.
