Appellants, Superpumper, Inc.; Edward Bayuk, individually and as Trustee of the Edward Bayuk Living Trust; Salvatore Morabito; and Snowshoe Petroleum, Inc. (“Appellants”), by and through their counsel of record, Micah S. Echols, Esq. of Claggett & Sykes Law Firm, hereby supplement their prior motion for an extension to time to file their opening brief (fourth request). In the pending motion, Appellants asked this Court until July 10, 2020 to file their opening brief. Appellants supplement their motion to ask for one additional judicial day, until Monday, July 13.
