16	Pursuant to NRAP 26(b)(1)(A), Respondents Devin Chern Tang, M.D. ("Dr.

Although Respondents have been working diligently on their Answering Brief, more time is needed to complete it. This case involves two complex issues of first impression under Nevada Law: (1) whether a non-competition agreement is overbroad when it lacks any geographic limitation; and (2) whether NRS 613.195(5) operates retroactively to modify the terms of a non-competition agreement that was executed before the statute's enactment. The Court's disposition of these issues is likely to have lasting implications for future litigants, particularly with respect to the retroactivity of NRS 613.195(5). These issues are important, and Respondents are briefing them fully and thoroughly.

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Appellants' Opening Brief on these complex issues of first impression is substantively complete. However, the attorney with principal drafting responsibility for this Opening Brief had become ill on or around February 17, 2020. Appellant's counsel requested a telephonic extension on February 19, 2020, which the Court had graciously granted on February 20, 2020. Counsel has since recovered and has completed a substantive proposed final draft of the Opening Brief, and counsel has worked late into this evening in an effort to timely file the Opening Brief and appendix. However, Appellant will not be able to submit a completed brief by midnight. Appellant therefore requests a one-week extension to file the Opening Brief.

This is Appellants' first request for an extension of the time to file an Answering Brief. A full week-long extension will likely not be required; however Appellants are requesting a week in an abundance of caution. No further extensions will be necessary. Respondents respectfully request that the Court grant the requested extension.
