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Final judgment is entered in favor of the Farmers Entities with respect to the Second Claim

 reasons set forth in the Court's March 26, 2019 Decision and Order regarding the Farmers Entities' Motion
 for Summary Judgment.

Final judgment is entered in favor of Plaintiff with respect to Fourth Claim for Relief in the

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Mallin v. Farmers Ins. Exch., 106 Nev. 606, 610, 797 P.2d 978, 981 (1990), overruled on other grounds 1 by Matter of Estate of Sarge, 134 Nev. Adv. Op. 105, 432 P.3d 718 (2018)(holding "NRCP 54(b) clearly 2 3 contemplates certification of a judgment resolving a claim or removing a party.")¹ 4 5. Further proceedings on all remaining claims in this litigation shall be stayed with respect to 5 all parties to this action, pending the conclusion of all appeals in this case. This provision shall not preclude 6 an action to enforce any other orders entered by this Court.
