MEMORANDUM OF POINTS AND AUTHORITIES

Pursuant to NRAP 26(1)(b), this Court may extend any time prescribed by these rules or by its order to perform any act.

This Court previously granted Appellant's Petition for En Banc Reconsideration by an Order filed February 3, 2022. At that time, the Court ordered Appellant to submit Supplemental Briefing on specific issues.


Appellant sought an extension of time through April 19, 2022, for the filing of that Supplement¹. Appellant obtained an Extension of Time, granted in part, for that supplement to be filed through March 18, 2022.

Due to a clerical error made by Appellant's counsel's assistant, the partially granted extension deadline of May 25, 2022, did not make it to counsel's calendar, and counsel as a result did not file the Supplement by that date. Upon noticing this error, counsel is promptly moving for a brief extension of time. Counsel respectfully requests that this Court extend time for the filing of the Supplement through **May 27, 2022**.

¹ The first Extension of Time Request erroneously identified that document as being a "Third" request to extend time for the filing of the present Supplement; that was the First request, and this present filing is the Second request to extend time as to the Supplemental Brief.

Good cause and extraordinary circumstances or extreme need justify a Second extension of time for the filing of this Supplement. As identified by the Nevada Public Defender's Office in its *Amicus* filing, the issues to be briefed by supplement are important not only to this case, but to the cases of every other criminal defendant in the State, as it pertains to a (potentially radical) departure from existing law governing evidentiary considerations at preliminary hearings. Due to the importance of the issue, and due to the excusable clerical error identified above, this brief second extension of time is respectfully requested.


