ORDER DIRECTING ENTRY OF WRITTEN ORDER

This original petition for a writ of mandamus seeks relief from district court orders that: (1) require any cross-examination regarding the methodology of a company that mined data from petitioner's cellular phone to be outside the presence of the jury; (2) do not require the State to provide an expert witness in order to admit photographic evidence regarding whether partial bloody footprints found at the crime scene matched a pair of shoes recovered from petitioner's girlfriend's residence; and (3) only partially grant petitioner's request to obtain corrective action reports from the forensic laboratory that performed DNA analysis in petitioner's case—where he is charged with murder.

Although the district court orally ruled on both petitioner's motion to declare the court's prior order on the footprint/shoe evidence void and the State's request to hold a hearing on the cellular phone evidence outside the presence of the jury at the November 21, 2019, hearing, it appears the district court has not entered a written order. This court

normally will not consider a petition for extraordinary relief in the absence of such written order. See Rust v. Clark Cty. Sch. Dist., 103 Nev. 686, 689, 747 P.2d 1380, 1382 (1987) (noting that an oral pronouncement is ineffective in the absence of a written order).

Accordingly, petitioner shall obtain from the respondent district court judge a written order memorializing its oral ruling and, by 5 p.m. on Monday December 2, 2019, file and serve a supplemental appendix containing a copy of the district court's written order.
