



*ORDER DENYING MOTION TO DISMISS AND GRANTING  
EXTENSION OF TIME*

This is an appeal from a final judgment entered in a negligence action. Respondent has filed a motion to dismiss this appeal for lack of jurisdiction. Respondent explains that the final judgment was an order entered pursuant to a stipulation, dismissing defendant Desert Medical Equipment. Because appellant stipulated to the dismissal, respondent argues she is not aggrieved by that order, and cannot appeal from it. See NRAP 3A(a) (allowing an appeal by an aggrieved party); *Vinci v. Las Vegas Sands, Inc.*, 115 Nev. 243, 246, 984 P.2d 750, 752 (1999) (a party is not aggrieved where that party voluntarily stipulated to dismiss a claim). Appellant replies that she does not challenge the stipulated dismissal but only interlocutory orders, which she is aggrieved by. As this court determined in its February 14, 2020, order, appellant may challenge any interlocutory orders in this appeal from the final judgment. See *Consol. Generator-Nevada v. Cummins Engine Co.*, 114 Nev. 1304, 1312, 971 P.2d 1251, 1256 (1998). Thus, the motion to dismiss this appeal is denied.


Appellant's motion requesting a second extension of time to file the opening brief is granted. NRAP 31(b)(3)(B). Appellant shall have until

August 10, 2020, to file and serve the opening brief. No further extensions of time shall be permitted absent demonstration of extraordinary circumstances and extreme need. *Id.* Counsel's caseload normally will not be deemed such a circumstance. *Cf. Varnum v. Grady*, 90 Nev. 374, 528 P.2d 1027 (1974). Failure to timely file the opening brief may result in the imposition of sanctions, including the dismissal of this appeal. NRAP 31(d).
