## AFFIDAVIT & SECOND REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE TRANSCRIPTS

I, LARA CORCORAN, Court Recorder, Department XXXI, Eighth Judicial District Court, Las Vegas, Nevada, respectfully request of this Honorable Court that the due date for completion of any requested transcripts in the above matter to be extended once again for the reasons set forth below.

Upon receiving the Supreme Court order to file the transcripts and the certificate of service within 60 days of the filing of the first extension, I diligently began working on outsourcing the transcripts, as we have only 3 people to assist inhouse and 31 departments to be covered. Permission had to be given to have them outsourced to a vendor at the regular rate, as there was no one available to type them at the reduced rate that is associated with In Forma Pauperis requests. I was given permission to send out only the portions requested in the original request. This step alone took 10 days.

When I asked for only 60 days to file the certificate, I was unaware how difficult the request and the process for getting it typed would be. In conjunction with my department being in court for hearings and trial for significant portions of each day, due to the complexity of the request, as only portions of each day were requested, we had to locate and piece together those portions, which entailed going through an enormous amount of video to find what was needed. When this proved to be too difficult, we had to again seek permission to have more of the recordings transcribed by the vendor, as payment was only approved for a much smaller portion.

Once the vendor had finally received the audio-video needed, she began typing the transcripts, finding along the way that, again, what she received was not sufficient and more recordings had to be continually sent. In turn, due to the volume or her workload, the difficulty of this request, and medical issues in her family, she was unable to provide a small portion of the requested transcripts by the date they were due.

I apologize for this request coming beyond the aforementioned due date of the filing of the transcripts and the certificate of service. I am requesting one additional week beyond the filing of this request to complete the remaining transcripts. This request is made in good faith and not for purposes of delay.
