## ORDER PARTIALLY GRANTING MOTION TO SEAL

Appellants have filed an unopposed motion to file the opening brief and portions of the appendix under seal. The motion to file portions of the appendix under seal is granted. SRCR 3(4). The clerk shall file the volumes of the appendix received on October 23, 2020, under seal. However, appellants do not explain why redacting the opening brief will not adequately protect the confidential information. SRCR 3(5)(b) (redaction is preferred). Accordingly, the motion to file the opening brief under seal is denied without prejudice. Within 7 days of the date of this order, appellants may renew the motion to file the opening brief under seal provided that the motion demonstrates why sealing rather than redaction is warranted.
