## ORDER REGARDING FACE COVERINGS AND SOCIAL DISTANCING IN APPELLATE COURT FACILITIES

This order supplements AO-0008 and AO-0014, which restrict in-person access to Nevada's appellate court facilities during to the COVID-19 pandemic. The court has since issued internal guidelines that require all court employees to wear face coverings and follow CDC social-distancing and posted room-occupancy limits when in the appellate court buildings. Consistent with these guidelines and those issued by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), and in order to protect public and employee health and safety, it is hereby ORDERED that anyone in a public area of the Carson City or Las Vegas appellate courthouses shall wear a mask that covers his or her nose and mouth, except when necessary to remove the mask to be heard, and follow all CDC-compliant social-distancing and posted room-occupancy limit requirements.

This order shall remain in place until amended or withdrawn.
