As the Court may be aware, the Board of Law Examiners are having tremendous issues with administering the bar exam remotely, due to software issues. I understand that we're all under some challenging times with the onset of Covid-19, U.S. social tensions and the state of affairs in Nevada. I do appreciate the fact that Nevada decided to administer the exam. However, what's troubling is the software company, ILG, that is administering the exam and the waiver that I had to sign as a remote applicant.

The software company that Nevada is utilizing, has had software issues with bar exams in other states. In fact, the company is currently in litigation with Georgia bar applicants for software issues (link below). As a Nevada bar applicant, this is extremely troubling, as we are having software issues just days before the exam. In addition, applicants had to sign waivers with the Board of Law Examiners absolving them of any liability for software issues.

As of today, we took a practice exam to retest the software (after it was cancelled yesterday due to software issues). Yesterday, we didn't get word of the cancellation until after the exam was suppose to start. So after numerous re-installs And updates we took a practice run today. My experience today: it took close to 40 min to sign in, we were told it would take no more than 5 min. So I actually started late due to no fault of my own. Midway through my performance test, a times up screen popped up and the program shut off. That's just a few is the issues I experienced today.

As you can imagine, this has caused applicants undue stress in already stressful times. With Covid we have no choice but to take it remotely. I'm comfortable with this option but not at the cost of faulty software from a company who is currently in litigation for the same issue. I ask the Court to take this into consideration if another decision has to be made regarding this bar exam.
