ORDER GRANTING MOTION

The National Immigrant Women's Advocacy Project, Inc. (NIWAP), has filed a motion for leave to file an amicus brief in support of appellant. NRAP 29. NIWAP explains that it is a non-profit organization that develops, reforms, and promotes the implementation and use of laws and policies to provide services that improve rights, services, and assistance, including access to the courts, to immigrant women and children who are victims of domestic violence and other crimes. NIWAP proposes to inform this court regarding interpretation and analysis of the Immigration and Nationality Act and issues that affect visa-holding women and children, concerns that are directly at issue in this appeal.

The motion is granted. See NRAP 29; *Ryan v. Commodity Futures Trading Comm'n*, 125 F.3d 1062, 1063 (7th Cir. 1997) (an amicus brief is appropriate where "the amicus has unique information or perspective that can help the court beyond the help that the lawyers for the parties are able to provide"). The clerk of this court shall detach the proposed brief from the motion and shall file it separately.

It is so ORDERED.
