This matter involves the unlawful, erroneous entry of a Charging Order for payments due from third-parties to a non-party Detwiler. The entry of this Charging Order comes after the Court violated Detwiler's constitutional and due process rights in order to enter a criminal contempt judgment (which is the subject a pending writ proceeding before this Court - Docket No. 81220). Detwiler seeks appeal of the Charging Order due to its entry violating, without limitation, the Trial Court's stays, Governor Sisolak's Directive 017, NRCP 45, A.O. 20-17 and NRS 86.401(2)(a).

9. Issues on appeal. State concisely the principal issue(s) in this appeal (attach separate sheets as necessary):

The appeal of the Charging Order involves issues with the Charging Order violating, without limitation, the following: (1) The stays put in place by the Trial Court, the District Court's COVID-19 stay order and Governor Sisolak's Directive 017: At the time of filing of the Application for Charging Order, the Respondent was in violation of the aforementioned stays; (2) NRCP 45: The Charging Order includes a requirement for third-parties to turn over records related to Detwiler's business interests to the Respondent. Such order violates the requirements of NRCP 45, as no subpoenas were issued to these third-parties and Detwiler was not provided with the requisite notice prior to seeking these records; (3) Clark County District Court's Administrative Order # 20-17: With the COVID-19 pandemic, the District Court Chief Judge and the Chief Justice of the Nevada Supreme Court jointly issued Administrative Order # 20-17, which, among other things, requires "advance approval of the discovery commissioner to issue subpoenas under NRCP 45." The Respondent never sought approval from the discovery commissioner; and (4) NRS 86.401(2)(a): This statute provides that the trial court may provide no other remedy other than a Charging Order - the Charging Order includes additional remedies in direct violation of this statute.

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FINDINGS

1. For the reasons given in the Bank's papers, the Court finds that the Bank violated neither this Court's stay of execution imposed by its order of April 13, 2020, nor the pandemic-related emergency orders issued by the Governor and the Chief Judge of this Court.

The Bank did not procure a charging order before this Court's May 29, 2020 deadline; it merely filed an application. 6 7 The charging order will ultimately issue more than one month after the applicable stay deadline. 8 3. Likewise, Declaration 17 prohibits only "executions of all funds . . . pursuant to 9 NRS chapter 21" and "all writs of garnishment aiding in execution pursuant to NRS chapters 21 10 and 31 " See Nevada Governor Steve Sisolak, Declaration of Emergency Directive 017, at §§ 1–2.)¹ Likewise, Administrative Order #20-09 applies only to "writs of execution or writs of 11 garnishment."2 12

4. These directives, by their own explicit terms, do not apply to charging orders. A
charging order arises out of NRS Chapter 86. A charging order provides "the exclusive remedy by
which a judgment creditor of a member or an assignee of a member may satisfy a judgment out of
the member's interest of the judgment debtor, whether the limited-liability company has one
member or more than one member." NRS 86.401(2)(a). Therefore, the seeking and granting of a
charging order violates no emergency order.

19 5. The Court rejects the argument that counsel for the Bank acted unethically by
20 violating Nevada Rule of Professional Conduct 4.3. Mr. Detwiler has presented no persuasive or
21 credible evidence that the Bank's counsel violated any rule of professional conduct.

6. The Court permits the removal of the designation "a Washington corporation" from
the name of the Bank, as that reflects the true identity of the creditor, and the undisputed facts.
The name of the Bank in the captions in this case are hereby amended to conform to the proof.

1	7.	The Court, as it has done previously, overrules Mr. Detwiler's peremptory
2	challenge as u	untimely.
3	8.	The Court will issue a separate, simple charging order that the Bank will be
4	permitted to s	erve upon any Nevada limited liability company in which Mr. Detwiler has an
5	interest.	
6		CONCLUSIONS
7	1.	IT IS ORDERED that the Bank's motion for a charging order is GRANTED.
8	2.	IT IS ADDITIONALLY ORDERED that the counter-motion of Mr. Detwiler is
9	DENIED.
