

Eviction Projections in Nevada

In July 2020, the Guinn Center partnered with COVID-19 Eviction Defense Project (CEDP) to analyze and publish projections on Eviction Risk in Nevada. These projections provided estimates through the end of December 2020. As part of this analysis, the Guinn Center estimated that 272,000-327,000 Nevadans (or 118,000-142,000 households) were at risk of eviction by the end of September 2020.




In August 2020, CEDP partnered with the Aspen Institute and published an updated report, National Eviction Risk Projections. Analysts predicted that 181,966 households or 418,523 individuals in Nevada face eviction risk by the end of December 2020 (see below).

On September 1, 2020, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) issued an "order under Section 361 of the Public Health Service Act to temporarily halt residential evictions to prevent the further spread of COVID-19." In their official document, CDC cited the Aspen Institute-CEDP authored report and wrote, "In the absence of State and local protections, as many as 30-40 million people in America could be at risk of

The Aspen Institute and CEDP analysts also present a range of low and high estimates of the individuals and households that face eviction risk. They write:

"Current projections indicate that America is facing an urgent and unprecedented eviction crisis. In an updated analysis of the US Census Bureau's Pulse Survey, based on renter's perceptions of their ability to pay, the Aspen Institute Financial Security Program and the COVID-19 Eviction Defense Project currently estimate that 29 million renters in 12.6 million households may be at risk of eviction by the end of 2020. [The authors] anticipate that **up** to 40 million people in more than 17 million households may be at risk of eviction through the end of the year when considering a portion of survey respondents who have a "moderate" degree of confidence in the ability to pay rent (in addition to those with slight or no confidence). Both projections rely on renter perceptions of their ability to pay measured by the Pulse Survey." In Nevada, the low and high estimates of households that face eviction risk by the end of the year (December 2020) are 419,000 – 501,000 (see below).
