

APPELLANT'S MOTION TO EXTEND TIME IN WHICH TO FILE THE MOTION TO DISQUALIFY OR IN THE ALTERNATIVE ACCEPT A LATE FILING; AND PREMISSION TO EXCEED THE PAGE LIMIT

COMES NOW, Appellant, ALI SHAHROKHI ("ALI"), appearing in Proper Person, hereby moves this court to grant him an extension of time or in the alternative accept a late filing. Additionally, ALI requests within this same motion that he be granted permission to file his motion disqualifying Judge Jerome T. Tao, Judge Michael P. Gibbons and Judge Bonnie Bulla in excess of the 10 page limit.

Request for an Extension of Time/Accept a Late Filing

ALI is not an attorney and is before this court in proper person. In considering such, ALI is learning-as-he-goes on this appeal and is trying to mitigate mistakes as soon as he discovers them.



I.

ALI confused the parameters in calculating time to file a motion for judicial disqualification in this court. He understood that he had a timeline of 60 days from docketing, but ALI thought that docketing meant docketing statement, which was filed on 12/11/2020, just two weeks ago and in the middle of the holiday season.

Ultimately ALI confused which docketing started the clock to file this motion. There is the docketing which took place on 10/22/2020, the docketing statement filed on 12/11/2020 and then the case will have future docketing once the routing statement is reviewed. ALI now thinks he may have used the wrong "docketing" date in his calculations and that the time to file his motion to disqualify started on 10/22/2020, where the time limit to file the motion to disqualified would have expired on 12/22/2020, just prior to the Government holidays.

ALI is not filing this motion to delay proceedings and in good faith makes this request to extend the time for filing this motion for disqualification or in the alternate, accept a late filing. In such, please consider that only one judicial day has passed since the deadline, and ALI is trying to correct his mistakes as soon as possible. ALI appreciates the grace this court has given thus far in allowing him extended time to grieve and handle his late sister's affairs during these proceedings.

Importantly, ALI had formed arguments for disqualification and in his research found that the disqualification applied to all three judges who decided on his writs pending a final judgement. Immediately upon discovering that the Nevada Revised Code of Judicial Conduct Rule 2.11 was applicable to this case, he is filing the motion to disqualify, which is not bound to the timelines set forth in NRAP 35. Again, since ALI is not an attorney he wants to be sure file a motion for the Court to consider the exception to the timelines when disqualification is predicated under the

Nevada Revised Code of Judcial Conduct. Also informing the court of his inadvertent mistake in miscalculating the timeline directed under NRAP 35.

ALI does not waive his need to disqualify and in the instance that arguments made under NRS 1.225 and NRAP 35, have now expired and if this court will not consider the arguments; ALI asks that this court consider the motion to disqualify based on The Nevada Revised Code of Judicial Conduct, which is not bound to such timelines.

II. Additional Pages Requested

ALI asks that this court consider the motion to disqualify with additional seven pages as the motion is requesting disqualification of not one judge, but three. Furthermore, the underlying proceedings are vast both in the district court and the appellate court, as are the errors and reasons and arguments for disqualification. It is of the utmost importance that, moving forward, ALI's due process is upheld and that his case is reviewed under fair circumstances. It is of the utmost importance that there are no doubts as to the fairness of ALI's proceedings, as his due process has been found to have been violated already and his right to parent is protected by the fourteenth amendment.

Considering such, it is very important that the decisions be made on the merits, which is why the additional pages are necessary. ALI tried but
