ORDER GRANTING REQUEST FOR AN EXTESION OF TIME

On April 28, 2021, this court entered an order adopting standardized forms related to the protection of children from abuse and neglect. The order directed the use of the standardized forms to become mandatory in all child abuse and neglect cases in the Nevada on January 1, 2022. On December 10, 2021, the Clark County District Attorney's Office submitted a letter to the court requesting that the effective date for the mandatory use of the standardized forms be extended to January 1, 2023, for the Eighth Judicial District. The request for an extension was granted. On December 13, 2022, Clark County District Attorney's Office submitted a letter requesting that the effective date for the mandatory use of the standardized forms be extended to June 1, 2023, for the Eighth Judicial District. As cause for the request, the Clark County District Attorney's Office cites to staffing shortages that have made it impossible to comply with the January 1, 2023, deadline. Cause appearing, the request is granted. Accordingly, the use of the standardized forms will become mandatory in all child abuse and neglect cases in the Eighth Judicial
