





ORDER DENYING MOTION

On July 8, 2022, this court granted appellant's motion to stay issuance of the remittitur to allow appellant to file a petition for a writ of certiorari in the United States Supreme Court. This court received notice on November 28, 2022, from the U.S. Supreme Court clerk that the petition was denied. Accordingly, on November 29, 2022, this court issued the remittitur. On December 13, 2022, appellant filed a motion to stay the remittitur to allow him to file a petition for rehearing in the United States Supreme Court. This court elects to treat the motion as a motion to recall the remittitur. This court will recall the remittitur only when, inadvertence, mistake of fact, or an incomplete knowledge of the circumstances of the case on the part of the court or its officers, whether induced by fraud or otherwise, has resulted in an unjust decision. *Wood v. State*, 60 Nev. 139, 141, 104 P.2d 187, 188 (1940). Accordingly, the motion is denied.

It is so ORDERED.
